• Among active pass-catchers, Mike Evans ranks second in yards per reception (min. 250 receptions).

• Since entering the league in 2014, Evans ranks third in receiving touchdowns with 50.

WASTING NO TIME

Outside linebacker **Jason Pierre-Paul** recorded sacks in each of the first two weeks of the 2020 season, taking his career total to 81.5.

Pierre-Paul has earned 23.0 sacks since joining the Buccaneers in 2018, which rank as the ninth-most in the NFL during that span.

He has now recorded a sack in four-consecutive games dating back to 2019, tying for the fourth-longest such streak among Buccaneers since sacks became an official statistic in 1982.

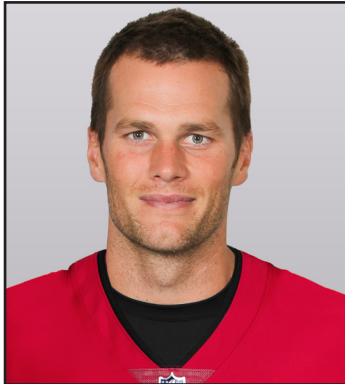

WHAT TO WATCH FOR

BUCCANEERS TEAM

- Quarterback **Tom Brady** and tight end **Rob Gronkowski** have connected for **78 touchdowns** in the regular season and need **1 more** to match Dan Marino and Mark Clayton (79) for the fourth-most touchdown connections in NFL history.
- Tampa Bay recorded four takeaways against Carolina in Week 2. With four or more takeaways at Denver it would mark the first time since 2007 that the team has recorded four-or-more takeaways in consecutive games (11/18/07 at Atlanta-11/25/07 vs. Washington).
- The Buccaneers had two interceptions against Carolina. With two or more interceptions against Denver, it will mark the first time since 2018 Tampa posted consecutive games with multiple interceptions (11/25/18 vs. San Francisco-12/2/18 vs. Carolina).
- Tampa Bay scored three rushing touchdowns against Carolina. With three-or-more rushing touchdowns at Denver, it will mark the first time in franchise history the team has posted consecutive games with at least three rushing touchdowns.
- The Buccaneers have rushed for four touchdowns through the first two weeks for the season, tied for the most through two weeks in franchise history. With one rushing touchdown at Denver, the team will tie for second-most (five in 2007) and with three rushing touchdowns the team will tie for the most rushing touchdowns (seven in 2000) through three games in team history.

TOM BRADY

- Brady has **544 regular season** passing touchdowns and needs **six** to tie Drew Brees (550 - active) for the most regular season passing touchdowns in NFL history. Including the postseason, Brady has thrown for 617 touchdowns, the most in NFL history (regular season and postseason combined).
- Brady has **220 regular season wins**, the second-most by a player in NFL history, trailing only Adam Vinatieri (221).
- Brady has **two career regular season games with at least six passing touchdowns** and needs **one more** such game to tie Peyton Manning (three) with the most such games in NFL history. Including the postseason, Brady has seven such games, tied with Ben Roethlisberger for the third-most in NFL history.
- Brady has **six career regular season games with at least five passing touchdowns** and needs **one more** such game to pass Dan Marino (six) and Roethlisberger (six) for the third-most such games in NFL history. Including the postseason, Brady is tied with Manning with three such games.
- Brady has **92 career regular season games with at least 300 passing yards** and needs **one more** such game to tie Peyton Manning (93) for the second-most such games in NFL history. Including the postseason, Brady has 108 games with at least 300 passing yards, trailing only Drew Brees (128).

SHAQUIL BARRETT

- Barrett recorded a **franchise-record 19.5 sacks** in 2019. **With 15.0 or more sacks** in 2020, he would be just the 11th player in NFL history to post consecutive seasons with at least 15.0 sacks.
- Barrett has **19.5 sacks as a Buccaneer**. He needs **6.5 more** to tie Greg Spies (26.0 from 2002-07) for 10th-most sacks in franchise history.

CAMERON BRATE

- Brate has **27 career touchdown catches**. He needs **one more** to pass Mark Carrier (27 from 1987-92) and tie Joey Galloway (28 from 2004-08) for the fourth-most touchdown receptions in team history.
- Brate has **three career games with multiple touchdown receptions**. He needs **one more** to tie Jimmie Giles for the most ever such games by a Buccaneers tight end and tie for the third-most such games in franchise history.



LAVONTE DAVID

- David has **started 123 career games** for Tampa Bay. With **one more** start, David will surpass Gerald McCoy (213) for the eighth-most starts in franchise history.
- David has **22.5 career sacks**. He needs **3.5 more** to tie Greg Spies (26.0 from 2002-07) for 10th-most and **4.0 more** to pass Broderick Thomas (26.5 from 1989-93) for the ninth-most sacks in franchise history. Thomas holds the record for the most sacks by a linebacker in franchise history.
- David has **1,026 career tackles** and needs **three more** to tie Hardy Nickerson for the third-most in franchise history (1,028).
- David has **three career defensive touchdowns** and needs **one more** to tie for the third-most in franchise history (David Logan, 1979-96; Mike Washington, 1976-84).



WHAT TO WATCH FOR



MIKE EVANS

- Dating back to last season, Evans has recorded a **receiving touchdown in each of the past three games** he has played in. With **one receiving touchdown** at Denver, Evans will match the franchise record for consecutive games with a receiving touchdown (four), done eight times, including once by Evans. Last done by Chris Godwin (12/31/17 vs. New Orleans-9/24/18 vs. Pittsburgh).
- Evans has **surpassed 1,000 receiving yards in each of his first six seasons** and, with **1,000 or more receiving yards in 2020**, will become the only player in NFL history to record 1,000 or more receiving yards in each of their first seven seasons. Evans would extend his team record for 1,000-yard receiving seasons and consecutive 1,000 yard receiving seasons. He would tie Lance Alworth (1963-69), Brandon Marshall (2007-13), Jimmy Smith (1996-2002) and Reggie Wayne (2004-10) for the sixth-longest streak of 1,000-yard receiving seasons.

LEONARD FOURNETTE

- Fournette rushed for over 100 yards and two touchdowns against Carolina. With over **100 yards and at least two touchdowns** at Denver, Fournette will join Warrick Dunn (11/26/00 vs. Buffalo-12/3/00 vs. Dallas) as the only players in franchise history to post consecutive games with at least 100 rushing yards and multiple rushing touchdowns. Dunn is the only player in franchise history to post consecutive multi-touchdown games.
- With at least **100 rushing yards** at Denver, Fournette will be the first Buccaneers player to post consecutive 100-yard rushing games since 2016 (Jacquizz Rodgers, 10/10/16 at Carolina-10/23/16 at San Francisco).

CHRIS GODWIN

- Godwin has **2,779 career receiving yards**. He needs **169 more** to pass Mike Williams (2,947 from 2010-13) for 10th-most receiving yards in franchise history.
- Godwin has **17 career touchdown receptions**. He needs **three more** to tie Vincent Jackson (20 from 2012-16) for 10th-most receiving touchdowns in Buccaneers history.
- Godwin had **1,333 receiving yards in 2019**. If he **surpasses 1,300 yards receiving in 2020**, he would be the first player in team history to record 1,300-or-more yards in consecutive seasons.

ROB GRONKOWSKI

- Gronkowski has **7,872 regular season receiving yards** and needs **37 more** to pass Jimmy Graham (7,908 - active) for the fifth-most receiving yards by a tight end in NFL history. Including the postseason, Gronkowski has **9,035 receiving yards** and needs **65 more** to pass Greg Olson (9,099 - active) for the fourth-most receiving yards by a tight end in NFL history (regular season and postseason combined).
- Gronkowski has **79 regular season receiving touchdowns**. He needs **one more** to pass Harold Carmichael (79) and Charley Taylor (79) for 27th-most, **two more** to tie Art Powell and Steve Smith (81) for 25th-most and **three more** to tie Anquan Boldin and Reggie Wayne (82) for the 23rd-most touchdown receptions in NFL history. Including the postseason, Gronkowski has **91 receiving touchdowns** and needs **one more** to pass Reggie Wayne (91) for the 14th-most receiving touchdowns in NFL history (regular season and postseason combined).
- Gronkowski has **604 career receptions** (regular season and postseason combined) and needs **six more** to tie Vernon Davis (610) for the seventh-most receptions by a tight end in NFL history.

LESEAN MCCOY

- McCoy has **11,066 career rushing yards**. He needs **176 more** to pass O.J. Simpson (11,236) for 21st-most and **176 more** to pass Corey Dillon (11,241) for the 20th-most regular season rushing yards in NFL history.
- McCoy has **73 career rushing touchdowns**. He needs **one more** to tie Earl Campbell and Leroy Kelly (74) for 26th-most, **two more** to tie Clinton Portis (75) for 25th-most and **three more** to tie Pete Johnson (76) for the 24th-most regular season rushing touchdowns in NFL history.
- McCoy has **14,891 career yards from scrimmage**. He needs **1 more** to pass Ricky Watters (14,891) for 26th-most, **221 more** to pass Jerome Bettis (15,111) for 25th-most, **227 more** to pass Steve Smith (15,118) for 24th-most, **230 more** to pass Steven Jackson (15,121) for 23rd-most, **234 more** to pass Tim Brown (15,124) for 22nd-most and **251 more** to pass Tony Gonzalez (15,141) for the 21st-most regular season yards from scrimmage in NFL history.

JASON PIERRE-PAUL

- Dating back to last season, Pierre-Paul has recorded at least 1.0 sack in each of the past four games. With **1.0 sack** at Denver, would tie Simeon Rice (five consecutive games: 12/2/01 at Cincinnati-12/29/01 vs. Baltimore) for the third-longest streak in franchise history.
- Pierre-Paul has **23.0 sacks** as a Buccaneer. He needs **3.0 more** to tie Greg Spires (26.0 from 2002-07) for 10th-most and **3.5 more** to tie Broderick Thomas (26.5 from 1989-93) for ninth-most in franchise history.

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS

- X Arians is a two-time Associated Press NFL Coach of the Year, earning the award in 2012 (Indianapolis Colts) and in 2014 (Arizona Cardinals).
- X He is the only coach in NFL history to earn the award multiple times in a three-year span with different teams and is one of only 12 coaches in NFL history to win the award multiple times.
- X Prior to his time with the Colts, Arians spent eight seasons with the Steelers, five as offensive coordinator (2007-11) and three as the wide receivers coach (2004-06). During his tenure as the offensive coordinator, the Steelers had a 55-25 record, tying Green Bay for the second-best mark in the NFL during that span.
- X Pittsburgh won three AFC North Division titles, two AFC Championships and earned a victory in Super Bowl XLIII over the Cardinals. Arians was also part of the Steelers' Super Bowl XL win as the team's wide receivers coach.

TAMPA BAY BUCCANEERS

- X Bruce Arians was named the 12th head coach in franchise history on January 8, 2019.
- X In his first season with the Buccaneers in 2019, Arians led Tampa Bay to a two-win improvement over the previous season, guiding the team to a 5-3 record over the last eight games to finish 7-9. The team's seven wins were its most since 2016. In addition, the Buccaneers 5-3 record on the road matched the third-best road mark in team history.
- X Under Arians' direction, Tampa Bay's offense set franchise records for both points scored (458) and touchdowns (54), while leading the league in passing offense at 302.8 yards per game and ranking third in the NFL in total offense at 397.9 yards per game. On the defensive side of the ball, the Buccaneers boasted the NFL's best run defense, limiting opponents to 1,181 rushing yards over 16 games (73.8 avg.), the lowest total allowed in a 16-game season in franchise history.

ARIZONA CARDINALS

- X During his time in Arizona, Arians compiled a 49-30-1 regular season record (.619 winning percentage). The Cardinals' 49 wins during that span were the seventh-most in the NFL and the third-most in the NFC. Arians won 50 total games in Arizona (49 regular season, one postseason), finishing as the winningest coach in franchise history. His 49 regular season wins are also the most by any coach in Cardinals history.
- X In 2015, Arians led the Cardinals to a franchise record 13 wins, which also featured the team's first-ever postseason bye and second-ever appearance in the NFC Championship Game.
- X Under Arians, the Cardinals offense set several single-season team records, including points scored (489 in 2015), total touchdowns (59 in 2015), total net yards (6,533 in 2015) and first downs (373 in 2015).

INDIANAPOLIS COLTS

- X Arians went to Arizona after spending the 2012 season with Indianapolis. Hired as the team's offensive coordinator, he also served as the team's interim head coach for 12 games while head coach Chuck Pagano was treated for leukemia. He led the Colts to a 9-3 record and was selected as the 2012 AP NFL Coach of the Year. Indianapolis' nine-win improvement (2-14 to 11-5) matched the third-largest single-season turnaround in NFL history.
- X Arians helped the Colts' offense rank 10th in the NFL in yards (362.4 ypg) and seventh in passing yards (258.0 ypg). Rookie quarterback Andrew Luck - the first overall pick in the 2012 NFL Draft - made the Pro Bowl and set rookie records for passing yards (4,374) and 300-yard passing games (six). He also established the NFL single-game rookie record for passing yards (433, 11/4 vs. Miami). Luck finished with the then-third-most passing touchdowns by a rookie in NFL history, with 23.

VIC FANGIO



Vic Fangio enters his second season with the Denver Broncos in 2020 after being named the 17th head coach in franchise history on Jan. 10, 2019.

A 41-year coaching veteran with 33 seasons of NFL experience, Fangio was a defensive coordinator for 20 of the last 24 seasons at the NFL or college level before becoming the Broncos' head coach. He served as the Bears' defensive coordinator from 2015-18 after leading the defenses for San Francisco (2011-14), Stanford University (2010), Houston (2002-05), Indianapolis (1999-2001) and Carolina (1995-98).

His defenses have ranked in the league's top five in yards allowed in eight of the last 13 years while placing in the NFL's top five in fewest points allowed seven times over that span.

During his 33 years coaching in the NFL, Fangio has helped 14 different teams to the playoffs across six different organizations.

Fangio's defense with the Bears in 2018 led the NFL in scoring defense (17.7 ppg), rushing defense (80.0 ypg), yards per play (4.8), takeaways (35), interceptions (27), three-and-outs (26.8%) and 20+yard plays (46). The Bears, who finished 12-4 and won the NFC North Division for the team's first playoff berth in eight seasons, also ranked third in total defense (299.7 ypg) and sacks (50) while limiting opponents to the fourth-worst third-down percentage (34.2) in the NFL.

Fangio joined the Bears after working as defensive coordinator for San Francisco from 2011-14 under Head Coach Jim Harbaugh. During his four seasons in the Bay Area, the 49ers made three playoff appearances, won two NFC West titles and advanced to Super Bowl XLVII.

In that four-year span under Fangio, San Francisco's defense ranked second in the NFL in points (17.4 ppg) and third in yards (310.2 ypg) allowed. Fangio's unit also boasted the league's top run defense (92.0 ypg) and tied for the third-most takeaways in the league from 2011-14.

Fangio spent the 2010 season with Jim Harbaugh as Stanford University's defensive coordinator. Inheriting the nation's 69th-ranked scoring defense (26.5 ppg), Fangio led the team to a No. 10 ranking (17.4 ppg) in 2010 while posting three conference shutouts.

Before working at the college level, Fangio spent four seasons with the Baltimore Ravens under Head Coaches Brian Billick (2006-07) and John Harbaugh (2008-09). Prior to joining the Ravens, Fangio spent 12 seasons as an NFL defensive coordinator—four years each with expansion teams Carolina (1995-98) and Houston (2002-05) under Head Coach Dom Capers as well as three years with Indianapolis (1999-2001) under Head Coach Jim Mora Sr. Before his three-year tenure with the Colts, Fangio was Capers' choice to lead the expansion-Panthers' defense from 1995-98. Fangio began his NFL career with New Orleans as the team's linebackers coach from 1986-1994.

Before entering the NFL coaching ranks, Fangio was a defensive assistant for Mora Sr. with the USFL's Philadelphia/Baltimore Stars from 1984-85, where he was a part of back-to-back USFL Championships. He also worked as a graduate assistant at the University of North Carolina in 1983.

Fangio began his career in 1979 coaching linebackers at his alma mater, Dunmore (Pa.) High School, under legendary football coach Jack Henzes.

Fangio, who graduated from East Stroudsburg University with a health and physical education degree, was inducted into the Northeast Pennsylvania Hall of Fame in 1993.
