



ARIZONA CARDINALS NOTE CARDS

- 3** Seasons with 3,000+ passing yards and 400+ rushing yards for QB **Kyler Murray**. With 138+ passing yards on Sunday, Murray would have 3,000+ passing yards and 400+ rushing yards in a season for the fourth time in his career and for the first time since 2021. Only Josh Allen, Cam Newton and Russell Wilson (five each) would have more such seasons in their first six years in the NFL.
- 57** Receiving yards, including a 41-yard TD catch, for WR **Michael Wilson** last week vs. Seattle. The performance gave him 1,000 receiving yards in his career. At 26 games, Wilson became the quickest Cardinal to reach 1,000 career receiving yards since WR Christian Kirk (19 games) in 2018.
- 6** Runs of 10+ yards for the Cardinals last week vs. Seattle. Only the Eagles (8) had more runs of 10+ yards in Week 14. Arizona (61) has the third-most runs of 10+ yards in the NFL this season.
- 38** Plays of 20+ yards by Cardinals opponents this season. Only the 49ers (33) and Eagles (34) have allowed fewer plays of 20+ yards than the Cardinals defense. Only six teams (NYJ - 1, Buf - 3, GB - 3, Phi - 4, Pit - 4, Ind - 4) have allowed fewer TDs than Arizona (5) on big plays in 2024.

WITH A WIN...

- Arizona would improve to 7-7 entering the final 3 weeks of the regular season.
- The Cardinals would have at least one home win vs. all 31 other NFL teams since beginning play at State Farm Stadium in 2006.
- The Cards would improve to 4-1 in their last five home games.

MILESTONES WITHIN REACH...

QB KYLER MURRAY

- With 138 passing yards, Murray would reach 3,000 passing yards in 2024 and join Neil Lomax (4) as the only QBs in franchise history to have 3,000+ passing yards in 4+ seasons.
- With 250 passing yards, Murray would have 250+ passing yards in five consecutive games. That would be the longest such streak of his career. He would also join HOFer Kurt Warner, Carson Palmer and Neil Lomax (twice each) as the only Cardinals since 1970 to throw for 250+ yards in 5+ consecutive games.
- With 56 rushing yards, Murray would reach 500 rushing yards in a season for the third time in his career - and first time since 2020 (819).

RB JAMES CONNER

- With 2 rushing yards, Conner (3,347) would pass Terry Metcalf (3,438) for the 7th-most rushing yards in franchise history. With 53 rushing yards, he would pass John David Crow (3,489) for 6th place. With 70 rushing yards, he would move into 5th place, passing Hall of Famer Charley Trippi (3,506).
- With 100+ rushing yards, Conner would have 10 games with 100+ rushing yards as a member of the Cardinals, the third-most in franchise history. It would also mark his seventh 100-yard rushing performance in his last 16 games and his fifth 100-yard outing in 2024.
- With a rushing TD, Conner would have 35 rushing TDs with Arizona, the third most in franchise history (Ottis Anderson - 46 and Wayne Morris - 37).

TE TREY MCBRIDE

- With two receptions, McBride would break his own franchise single-season record for receptions by a TE (81 in 2023).
- With 49 receiving yards, McBride would have 900 in 2024. He would join Hall of Famer Jackie Smith (1,205 in 1967) as the only TEs in franchise history with 900+ receiving yards in a season.
- With 59 receiving yards, McBride would reach 2,000 in his career.

WR MARVIN HARRISON JR.

- With a TD catch, Harrison would tie Larry Fitzgerald (8 in 2004) and Anquan Boldin (8 in 2003) for the most TD catches in franchise history by a rookie.
- With 45 receiving yards, Harrison would join Anquan Boldin (1,377 in 2003), Frank Sanders (883 in 1995), Ricky Proehl (802 in 1990) and Larry Fitzgerald (780 in 2004) as the only rookies in franchise history with 700+ receiving yards.
- With 100+ receiving yards, Harrison would join Anquan Boldin (5 in 2003) and Gaynell Tinsley (3 in 1937) as the only rookies in franchise history with at least three 100-yard receiving performances.

S BUDDA BAKER

- With 10+ tackles, Baker would have double-digit tackles for the 33rd time in his career, in nine of his last 17 games played and in back-to-back games.

LB KYZIR WHITE

- With a tackle, White would have 100 tackles in 2024. It would mark his third season with 100+ tackles and first since 2022.
- With 10+ tackles, White would have double-digit tackles for the 19th time in his career and his fifth time this season.

CB MAX MELTON

- With a pass defended, Melton would have a pass defended in five straight home games.

BUDDA ACHIEVES AN ELITE FEAT

S Budda Baker racked up 18 tackles, including one for loss, last week vs. Seattle. Not only were his 18 tackles a career high and tied for the most by an NFL player - regardless of position - in a single game this season, **it also marked the second-most tackles in a single game by a Cardinal since at least 1994 when the stat first became trackable (LB Eric Hill - 19 tackles @ Car on 11/19/95).**

Baker enters Sunday's game vs. New England with 132 tackles this season. With four games remaining, he is just 16 tackles away from setting a new career high for tackles in a season (147 in 2019).



TREY CONTINUES HIS HOT STREAK

Last Sunday vs. Seattle, TE **Trey McBride** led the team in both receptions (seven) and receiving yards (70). It marked the seventh time this season that he has led or shared the team lead in both categories. **His seven catches gave him 7+ receptions in three straight games.**

With 7+ catches this week, McBride would match Bengals WR Ja'Marr Chase (4 games from Week 8-11) for the longest such streak this season. Only three Cardinals - regardless of position - since at least 1970 would have 7+ catches in more consecutive games.

McBride also has 70+ receiving yards in each of his last four games. No Cardinals TE since at least 1970 has had 70+ receiving yards in more than two straight games. **With 70 receiving yards this Sunday, only five Cardinals - regardless of position - since at least 1970 would have longer such streaks.**
