



VS. **ARIZONA CARDINALS (3-5)** State Farm Stadium | November 6, 2022 | 2:05 PM



THIS WEEK'S PREVIEW

The Cardinals begin what is perhaps the most crucial stretch of the 2022 season as they host the NFC Westleading Seahawks this week at State Farm Stadium.

This matchup is the first of three straight against division opponents as the Cardinals have the Rams waiting on deck in Week 10 followed by a Monday Night showdown with San Francisco in Mexico City in Week 11.

Arizona is the only team in the division that faces an NFC West rival each of the next three weeks. That provides the Cardinals with the opportunity to gain ground in a race that that is separated by just two games from top to bottom.

The Cardinals enter this week's game looking for their first division win of the season - and also looking to even things up with the Seahawks. Seattle earned a 19-9 home victory in Week 6 in a game that was controlled by the defenses. Led by QB Geno Smith, the Seahawks feature one of the NFL's most prolific of fenses in 2022, but Arizona was able to hold Seattle to just one TD while piling up a season-high five sacks of Smith.

A victory for the Cardinals this week would mean a split of the season series with Seattle. That would be in holding with the tradition of the rivalry between the two teams - particularly of late. An Arizona victory would mark a season split for the ninth time in the last 12 years (2011-22) and for the fourth consecutive seasons (2019-22).

Since the teams became NFC West rivals in 2002, Arizona has won the season series three times (2008-09, 2016), Seattle has taken the season series four times (2005, 2010, 2014, 2018) and they have split the series 13 times.

Missing from the Week 6 matchup was WR DeAndre Hopkins, who returned to the lineup the following week and has provided a major spark for Arizona's offense. In two games with Hopkins on the field, the Cardinals have piled up 68 points and eight TDs while the All-Pro wideout has totaled 22 receptions for 262 yards and a TD.

After facing the Seahawks on Sunday, Arizona will travel to Los Angeles next week to wrap up its regular season series with the Rams. Seattle will travel to Munich, Germany where they will face the Tampa Bay Buccaneers.

THIS WEEK'S HIGHLIGHTS

• Having squared off in Week 6, the Cardinals and Seahawks face each other for the second time in a span of 22 days as Arizona hosts Seattle at State Farm Stadium on Sunday.

• Sunday's contest against the division-leading Seahawks begins Arizona's three-game stretch vs. division opponents in Weeks 9-11. It marks the first time since 2017 (Games 7-9) the Cardinals will play three straight games against NFC West opponents.

• In Week 6 earlier this season, Arizona sacked Seahawks QB Geno Smith five times. It was the highest single-game sack total for the Cardinals this season and also the highest number of sacks allowed by Seattle in 2022.

· Beginning next week, the remainder of Arizona's 2022 campaign will be featured weekly on HBO's Hard Knocks. <u>The first epsiode premieres on Wednes-</u> day, November 9. Additional episodes will then air each Wednesday through the end of the Cardinals season.

• After catching 10 passes for 103 yards in his 2022 debut in Week 7 vs. New Orleans, WR DeAndre Hopkins finished with 12 receptions for 159 yards and a TD last week in Minnesota. In his first two games played this season Hopkins <u>joined Anquan Boldin (2005) as the only players in franchise history to have</u> 10+ receptions and 100+ receiving yards in back-to-back games.

 DL J.J. Watt finished last week's game with two tackles, 2.0 sacks, two tackles for loss and three QB hits. It was Watt's 27th career game with at least 2.0 sacks. That is four more than any other active defender.

Cardinals DBs coach Marcus Robertson played for the Seahawks from 2001-02. Cardinals Director, College Scouting **Josh Scobey** played for the Seahawks from 2005-07 and helped Seattle advance to Super Bowl XL.

Cardinals Western Regional Scout Chris Culmer is from West Richland, WA, graduated from Washington State University. He worked for the Seahawks for nine seasons prior to joining the Cardinals, first as a scouting assistant (2000-03) and then as a pro scout (2004-08).

Cardinals S Budda Baker was born and raised in Bellevue and played at the University of Washington from 2014-16 where he was a consensus All-American in 2016. At Bellevue High School, he won three consecutive 3A state championships and was the Associated Press and The Seattle Times State Player of the Year for 2013 and earned The Seattle Times Male Athlete of the Year in 2013-14.

Cardinals CB Byron Murphy Jr. played at the University of Washington from 2016-18 and was named a second-team All-American by the Associated Press, SI.com, USA Today and The Sporting News in 2018.

Cardinals S Jalen Thompson played for Washington State from 2016-18 and received first-team (AP) and second-team (coaches) All-Pac-12 Conference accolades in 2017.

Cardinals LB Ezekiel Turner played three seasons at the University of Washington (2015-17).

REMEMBER THE TIME CHANGE

Although Arizona stays on standard time throughout the year, the time change - or lack thereof - does affect the Cardinals local kickoff times. With daylight saving time ending this Sunday, that change will affect the Cardinals on Sunday.

In 2022, daylight saving time was observed on the second Sunday in March (3/13) and ends this Sunday (11/6). When daylight saving is in effect, Arizona is three hours behind the East Coast making a 4 p.m. kickoff in the East a 1 p.m. kickoff in Arizona.

Beginning with the Cards Week 9 matchup vs. the Seahawks this Sunday, Ari-zona will be only two hours behind the East Coast, making a 4 p.m. kickoff in the East a 2 p.m. kickoff in Arizona.

CARDS VS. SEAHAWKS - SERIES QUICK FACTS

THREE GET THEIR FIRST CAREER SACK IN WEEK 6 When Arizona and Seattle met in Week 6

earlier this season, three Cardinals players recorded their first career sack. That in-cludes a pair of LBs Arizona selected in the 3rd round of the 2022 NFL Draft: Cameron Thomas and Myjai Sanders. Thomas took down Seahawks QB Geno Smith in the first quarter while Sanders posted his sack in the third guarter.

LB Zaven Collins also recorded his first two career sacks in that Week 6 contest.

CARDS GET AFTER SEATTLE QBS

In seven games vs. Seattle under defensive coordinator Vance Joseph, Arizona's defense has recorded 24 sacks of Seahawks QBs. The Cardinals have posted 4+ sacks in four of those seven contests.

In Week 6 earlier this season, Arizona sacked Seahawks QB Geno Smith five times. It was the highest single-game sack total for the Cardinals this sea-son and also the highest number of sacks allowed by Seattle in 2022. The Seahawks haven't allowed more than three sacks in any other contest this year.

SPLITTING THE SEASON SERIES HAS BEEN THE NORM

TWO IN A ROW WITH A RETURN TD VS. SEATTLE

TRYING - AGAIN - TO KEEP THE SEAHAWKS POINT TOTAL DOWN

In the last five games the Seahawks have put up a total of 163 points, an average of 32.6 points per game. <u>The only contest in that span dragging down that</u> average is the Week 6 game vs. Arizona, when the Cardinals held Seattle to just 19 points. In the other four games, the Seahawks averaged 36.0 points.

Arizona held Seattle - the NFL's #4 ranked scoring offense - to just one TD and 296 total yards in Week 6. That includes a season-low 160 net passing yards, a season-high six punts and just one TD on five trips to the red zone.



PAT TILLMAN'S LEGACY

THE TILLMAN MEMORIAL

On November 12, 2006, the Pat Tillman Memorial at State Farm Stadium was unveiled. Located on the northwest side of the plaza, the memorial includes a large bronze sculpture of Tillman and a circular reflection pond.

The sculpture is approximately eight-feet tall, weighs more than 500 pounds, and took nearly nine months to complete. After an extensive search, the Cardinals selected artists Omri Amrany and Gary Tillery to create the sculpture.

The sculptors consulted with the team and Pat's wife, Marie, who selected the image of Tillman that best conveys his character and spirit. Serving as a backdrop to the sculpture is a nine-foot concrete wall that measures 42 feet across, symbolic of Tillman's jersey number at Arizona State.

The brimming pool of water on the western side consists of a 60-foot circular pond made of black concrete and stainless steel. To the west of the memorial is a grove of 40 Oak trees that symbolizes the jersey number Tillman wore as an Arizona Cardinal, and the entire area is surrounded by a grove of Ash and Oak trees.

TILLMAN'S LOCKER On September 11, 2015, the 14th anniversa-ry of the 9/11 terrorist attacks, the Cardinals unveiled the locker of S Pat Tillman at the Dignity Health Arizona Cardinals Training Center.

A new locker room was built as part of a two-year, \$15 million renovation of the fa-cility, but Tillman's locker was preserved to display in a glass enclosure between the weight room and cafeteria. Included in the locker are Tillman's jersey, helmet, shoulder pads and draft card, along with a description of his life and career.

"We've decided to preserve Pat Tillman's locker, and tell his story," Cardinals Owner Michael Bidwill said at the unveiling cer-

the history, the history of our organization and the history of Pat Tillman.'

After a decorated career at ASU, Tillman was selected in the seventh round (226th overall) of the 1998 NFL Draft by the Cardinals. He played for Arizona from 1998-2001 before enlisting in the U.S. Army in 2002. Tillman's No. 40

The jersey was donated to the USO by the NFL and was proudly displayed at the Pat Tillman Memorial USO center at Bagram Airfield, Afghanistan from 2005-21. With the closing of the airfield, the USO trans-

ferred the jersey to the Pat Tillman Foundation in Arizona.



At Sunday's game, the Cardinals will host 10 members of the U.S.S. Tucson. All 10 serve on the Los Angeles Class submarine U.S.S. Tucson, and are docked in Pearl Harbor. The group will be on maneuvers from Nov. 7-11th in Tucson and were invited to attend the game as guests.

The Cardinals will host a group of veterans from MANA House, a local charity that provides vital health care, housing, transportation, childcare and job placement services for veterans

Cardinals coaches and staff will wear special NFL-issued *Salute to Service* branding and gameday apparel. Cardinals Cheerleaders, the drumline and flag teams will all be dressed in Salute to Service themed uniforms.

Each Cardinals player will wear a #40 sticker on his helmet to honor former Cardinals safety Pat Tillman and will also use camouflage towels, hats and gloves on the sideline's.

All proceeds from the NFL's Salute to Service campaign are donated to the NFL's military nonprofit partners: The *Bob Woodruff Foundation*, the *Pat Tillman Foundation*, *TAPS*, the *USO* and *Wounded Warrior Project*.

On Saturday, October 29, Cardinals staff, team Legends, mascot Big Red a group of Cardinals Cheerleaders teamed up with Packages from Home to package requested food, hygiene, and entertainment items to boost morale and the quality of life for activeduty military members stationed or deployed overseas (including military working dogs & military K-9 teams) as well as homeless, transitioning, and at-risk veterans.

On Tuesday (Nov. 1), the Cardinals par-

LBs Dennis Gardeck, Markus Golden, Cameron Thomas and Jesse Luketa, along with DL Zach Allen and QB Trace McSorley toured the F-35 Fighter Squadron/Flightline, visited with the Jet Maintenance crews, and held a meet-and-greet with everyone on base. Gardeck also participated in training and safety classes before taking a flight in an F-16.

CARDINALS WITH MILITARY TIES

OWNER MICHAEL BIDWILL: Joined the Pat Tillman Foundation board of diouver when when the bowlet is bowlet is a member of the arrange of the organization. Previously served as a member of the Air Force Chief of Staff Civic Leader Program. Michael's father, late owner **Bill Bidwill**, served in the U.S. Navy Reserves (1950-54) and was active U.S. Navy (1954-56).

HEAD COACH KLIFF KINGSBURY: Father, Tim Kingsbury, received a Purple Heart for his service in the Vietnam War while serving in the Marines. Tim survived being shot in the jaw while in Vietnam.

DL ZACH ALLEN: Great uncle, Major **William Anthony**, was an Air Force fight-er pilot. He flew B-17 bombers in WWII and jets in the Korean War. During the Korean War, he lost an arm trying to save his plane when his jet crashed while returning from a mission. He passed away in 2013 at the age of 92 and was buried with full military honors.

QB KYLER MURRAY: Grandfather, Carl W. Henderson Jr., spent 35 years in the Army and Navy as a Master Sergeant and was awarded a Purple Heart.

QB COLT McCOY: Hosts the Colt McCoy Pro Football Camp, which welcomes children of members of the military and underprivileged youth.

WR DEANDRE HOPKINS: Uncle, Larry Greenlee Sr., served in the military and is a Purple Heart recipient.

P ANDY LEE: Late grandfather, Walter Lee, served in the Army.

CB BYRON MURPHY, JR.: Stepfather, Terrell Barnes, served in the Navy.

Throughout the year, the BetMGM Sportsbook at State Farm Stadium also will serve as an outdoor music and comedy concert amphitheater, hosting events for audiences gathered on The Great Lawn.

HARD KNOCKS BEGINS NEXT WEEK

Arizona's appearance on the award-winning HBO series Hard Knocks series is just a week away.

<u>The first epsiode pre-</u> mieres on Wednesday, November 9. Additional episodes will then air each Wednesday through the end of the Cardinals season.



In May it was announced that the second half of the Cardinals 2022 season will be featured on television's most acclaimed sports reality franchise Hard Knocks, which last year expanded its programming platform with the introduction of a multi-episode, in-season edition.

SUPER BOWL RETURNS TO AZ

Valley Will Host 4th Super Bowl in February

<u>The final game of the 2022 NFL</u> season will take place in Ari-<u>zona when State Farm Stadium</u> plays host to Super Bowl LVII on Sunday, February 12, 2023.

It will be the fourth Super Bowl played in the state of Arizona and the third time the nation's most popular sporting event will be played at State Farm Stadium. The Cardinals home venue last staged the mega event when it



hosted Super Bowl XLIX following the 2014 season.

Arizona joins South Florida, New Orleans, Los Angeles and Tampa Bay as the only sites selected to host the Super Bowl at least four times.



ECONOMIC IMPACT: The last time the game was staged in Arizona, it produced a record economic impact for the state. A 2015 study by the Seidman Research Institute, W.P. Carey School of Business at Arizona State University determined that Super Bowl XLIX, the 2015 Pro Bowl and related events produced a gross economic impact of \$719.4 million for the region. That was the largest economic impact of any special event ever held in Arizona. In addition to the games played in Glendale, more than 1 million people visited Verizon Super Bowl Central in downtown Phoenix and more than 500,000 people enjoyed events in downtown Scottsdale.

In a span of just over 26 months in 2015-17, State Farm Stadium hosted a Pro Bowl, Super Bowl, College Football National Championship Game and the NCAA Men's Final Four.

It was an unprecedented stretch for a stadium that generated \$1.3 billion in economic impact for the state during that 26-month span.

THE SAFETY DUO CONTINUES TO PRODUCE

WILSON WINS PLAYER OF THE WEEK

CB Marco Wilson was named the "NFC Defen-sive Player of the Week" for his performance in the 42-34 victory over the New Orleans Saints in Week 7.

It was Wilson's first career "Defensive Player of the Week" selection and he became the 35th different player in team history to be named "NFC Defensive Player of the Week."

Wilson recorded his first career INT and first career TD on the same play in the primetime win over New Orleans. With the game tied 14-14 late in the second quarter, Wilson picked off a deflect-ed pass and returned it 38 yards for a TD. That score gave Arizona a 20-14 lead and the Cardinals never trailed again in the game.

Wilson had the only go-ahead defensive TD in the NFL in Week 7.

He finished the game with three tackles, an INT (returned for a TD) and tied his career high with two passes defensed.

Wilson and teammate LB Isaiah Simmons each returned INTs for TDs in the win over the Saints. It was the first time since 2015 that the Cardinals had multiple INT returns for TDs in the same game.

In eight games this season (7 starts), Wilson has recorded 33 tackles, an INT (returned for a TD), five passes defensed, a tackle for loss, a QB hit and a fumble recovery.

ALLEN CONTINUES HIS RAPID ASCENT

Following a promising 2021 campaign, fourth-year DL Zach Allen is having a breakout season for the Cardinals in 2022.

Through eight games, Allen has totaled 31 tackles, 2.0 sacks, a career-high six passes defensed, 10 QB hits and five tackles for loss. Allen's six passes defensed are tied for the most among D-Linemen this season while his 31 are tied for 11

ARIZONA'S SWISS ARMY KNIFE

RB Eno Benjamin's third NFL season has been a breakout one for the former ASU standout. It is also one that has seen him do a little of everything for the Cardinals.

Through eight games Benjamin has:

- 287 rushing yards and two TDs on 66 carries (4.3 avg.)
- 23 receptions for 169 yards
 7 kickoff returns for 170 yards
 3 kickoffs for 158 yards (52.7 avg.)

In his second consecutive - and second career - start in place of injured RB James Conner, Benjamin had the most productive game of his career in the Cardinals win over New Orleans in Week 7.

He established career highs for scrimmage yards (113) and rushing yards (92), scored his third career TD and also broke the longest run of his career (45 yards).

BECOMING A VITAL PIECE: A 7th round (222nd overall) selection by the Cardinals in the 2020 NFL Draft, Benjamin's first two NFL seasons (2020-21) consisted of: 9 games



played, 116 rushing yards, 1 rushing TD and 160 total scrimmage yards. His 2022 season has consisted of 8 games played, 287 rushing yards, 2 rushing TDs and 456 scrimmage yards.

The Week 7 matchup vs. the Saints was Benjamin's 16th career game played. Below is a look at how his performance compared to his first 15 games:

• His 92 rushing yards more than doubled his previous high (39 @ SF, 11/7/21).

• His second carry of the game covered more yards (45) than he had ever rushed for in an entire game (39 yards).

His 113 scrimmage yards were 48 more than his previous high (65 @ Sea, 10/16/21).

 After posting just one rushing TD in his first 13 career games, Benjamin now has two rushing TDs in his last four games.

ENO'S FOOT LEADS TO A RARE FEAT IN CAROLINA

<u>After K Matt Prater was forced from the game in the fourth quarter due to a hip injury, Benjamin added kickoffs to his job duties in Carolina. He kicked off</u> following all three of the Cardinals fourth quarter scoring drives.

Benjamin became the first Cards player in the Super Bowl era to have a rush attempt, reception, a kickoff return and a kickoff in the same game. Prior to Benjamin, the last non-specialist to kick off for the Cardinals was S Pat Till-man on 12/15/01 at the N.Y. Giants. Benjamin and Tillman are the last two <u>Arizona State players drafted by the Cardinals.</u>

ARIZONA IS HIGHLY PRODUCTIVE ON THE GROUND

Arizona finished its Week 7 win against the Saints with 137 rushing yards and two TDs on 29 attempts (4.7 avg.). *It was the Cardinals* 41st game with 100+ rushing yards under Kliff Kingsbury (2019-22). In that span, only Balti-more (53), Philadelphia (44), Tennessee (42) and Cleveland have more games with 100+ rushina vards.

UP NEXT IN PRIMETIME: MEXICO CITY

The Cardinals will next play in primetime in Week 11 vs. San Francisco. On Nov. 21, the Cardinals will take on the Niners at Estadio Azteca in Mexico City on Monday Night Football.

The contest will serve as a rematch of the 2005 Cardinals-49ers game at Estadio Azteca which was the NFL's first regular season game held outside the United States. The Cardinals earned a 31-14 win over the 49ers in that game in front of a crowd of 103.467.



The Cards have a long history with international games and have participated in many global "firsts" for the league:

WIN IN VEGAS WAS A WILD ONE

Arizona's Week 2 win at Las Vegas resulted in one of the biggest comeback wins in franchise history.

The Cardinals trailed 20-0 at halftime and came from behind to earn the OT victory. It marked just the fifth time in franchise history - and first time since 1999 - Arizona over-came a deficit of 20+ points to win a game.

The Cards 20-point comeback is the largest lead surrendered in Raiders history.

CARDS HISTORICALLY GOOD IN OVERTIME

ELEVATING A FRANCHISE

The 2022 season is the 16th with owner **Michael Bidwill** steering the organization. His leadership during that time has been instrumental in transforming the franchise both on and off the field.

Highlights of Bidwill's tenure: • Michael continues a tradition of Bidwill ownership of the Cardinals that dates back to his grandfather, Hall of Famer Charles Bidwill, who purchased the team in 1933.

• Of the franchise's seven all-time postseason wins, five have come during Michael's tenure leading the organization. Arizona has played in 10 postseason contests over the last 15 seasons, after having appeared in just seven total playoff games prior.

• Arizona has appeared in the NFC Championship Game twice since 2008 including a victory in the 2008 conference title game that led to the franchise's first-ever Super Bowl appearance (Super Bowl XLIII).

 With an 11-6 record in 2021, the Cardinals reached 11+ wins in a season for the sixth time in franchise history. Three of those six 11-win campaigns came with Michael leading the team: 13 in 2015, 11 in 2014, 11 in 2021.

• Among Bidwill's most substantial accomplishments with the Cardinals is the creation of State Farm Stadium. The world-class venue has proved a critical turning point for the franchise, an economic engine for the state of Arizona, and a crucial resource in the battle against the COVID-19 pandemic.

• At the conclusion of the 2022 season, State Farm Stadium will host Super Bowl LVII – the third Super Bowl held at the venue since it opened in 2006. State Farm Stadium also hosted Super Bowls XLII (following 2007 season) and XLIX (following 2014 season).

• In addition to his role in helping Arizona land three Super Bowls, Michael was also instrumental in getting the 2015 Pro Bowl moved to State Farm Stadium; played a week before Super Bowl XLIX, the two events combined to deliver a record economic impact of \$720 million to the region.

• Since State Farm Stadium opened in 2006, the Cardinals have sold out 158 games at the venue (which is every non-pandemic game played there).

 Beginning next week, the Cardinals will make their first-ever appearance on Hard Knocks, television's most acclaimed sports reality franchise. Arizona will be the second team to be featured on Hard Knocks In Season, which will document the second half of the Cardinals season in real time.

• In January of 2016, the National Football Foundation (NFF) and College Hall of Fame inducted Bidwill and Governor Doug Ducey into the NFF Leadership Hall of Fame.

REMEMBERING VIOLET BIDWILL

The 2022 season marks the 75th anniversary of the Cardinals historic 1947 season. It was a year in which Violet Bidwill made league history and one that ultimately ended in the team winning an NFL Championship over the Philadelphia Eagles.

The Cardinals suffered a big loss when team owner **Charles W. Bidwill** - having just recently assembled his "Dream Backfield" with the unprecedented signing of All-American running back Charley Trippi - passed away in April. He had run the franchise since purchasing it in 1933 and was credited with pulling the team - and on a larger scale the NFL - through the Great Depression.

THE NFL'S FIRST FEMALE OWNER

With the passing of Charles, his wife, Violet Bidwill - while raising the couple's two teen-age sons Stormy (18) and William (16) - took



over as team owner. It was a historic moment, as she became the first female owner in NFL history and one of the first females to serve as a primary owner in professional sports.

"She was a wonderful person and was in a tough situation with losing her hus-band at a young age," Violet's grandson, current Cardinals owner **Michael Bid-will**, said. "She decided she would take over the family businesses."

"Things worked out well," then-team president Ray Benningsen said of the front office under Violet. "I ran the business end of it, (head coach) Jimmy (Conzelman) ran the team on the field and we both appreciated Vi's (Violet) counsel. I'll tell you one thing. She knew her football and she was a shrewd businesswoman.

"She didn't suffer fools, and she was right there in the meetings with the rest of the owners and held her own," said Michael Bidwill.

Violet Bidwill's first year of ownership saw the franchise win the NFL Champion-ship after defeating the Philadelphia Eagles 28-21 in the Championship Game.

KEIM HAS BUILT SOME OF THE BEST

After 14 seasons working within the Cardinals personnel department, Steve Keim was elevated to GM on January 8, 2013.

AMONG THE NFL'S BEST IN 2021

In 2021, the Cardinals posted an 11-6 record and secured their first playoff berth since 2015.

In addition to winning 11 games during the regular season, the Cardinals also ranked in the top 10 in both offensive points scored and defensive points allowed per game.

Arizona brought in five different Pro Bowlers in the offseason: DL J.J. Watt, WR A.J. Green, OL Rodney Hudson, K Matt Prater and RB James Conner. Conner was selected to the Pro Bowl in 2021.





The Cardinals drafted a pair of LBs in the 3rd round of the 2022 NFL Draft, taking San Diego State's Cameron Thomas at 87th overall and Cincinnati's Myjai Sanders at 100th overall.

In the Week 6 contest at Seattle, both rookies re-corded their first career sack. Thomas took down <u>Seahawks QB Geno Smith in the first quarter</u> while Sanders posted his sack in the third quarter.

AMONG THE BEST IN THE COLLEGE RANKS Both Thomas (2021) and Sanders (2020) were semifinalists for the Bednarik Award as the best defensive player in college football.

As a junior in 2021, Thomas was named the Mountain West Defensive Player of the Year after post-ing 71 tackles, 20.5 tackles for loss, 11.5 sacks and 21 QB hurries. His 20.5 tackles for loss tied the Mountain West single-season record. According to ProFootballFocus.com, in 2021 Thomas ranked 2nd among all FBS edge defenders with 77 total QB pressures.

A two-time 1st-team American Athletic Conference selection (2020-21), Sanders finished the 2021 season with 62 total pressures, which led the AAC.

Trayvon Mullen Jr. – Las Vegas' second round (40th overall) selection of the 2019 NFL Draft and has appeared in 40 games (31 starts) since entering the NFL. Was teammates with Isaiah Simmons at Clemson.


Byron Murphy Jr. –Scottsdale native and Arizona's 2019 second-round pick (33rd overall) out of Washington. Has recorded 223 tackles, five INTs and 33 passes defensed in 54 games (46 starts) during his first four NFL seasons.

Jalen Thompson – Selected by Arizona in the fifth-round of the 2019 NFL Supplemental Draft out of Washington State. Signed a three-year contract extension in September 2022.

Marco Wilson – Selected by Arizona in the fourth-round (136th overall) of the 2021 NFL Draft out of Florida. Has started 21 of 22 games played so far in his NFL career. Posted his first career INT and first career TD last week vs. New Orleans when he picked off a tipped pass at the Saints 38-yard line and returned it for the score.

The Cardinals opened the 2022 regular season against the Kansas City Chiefs at State Farm Stadium. The contest reunited AZ head coach Kliff Kingsbury with KC quarterback Patrick Mahomes, whom he recruited to Texas Tech and coached for three seasons there. On this particular afternoon, it was the pupil who led his team to victory with an impressive passing effort. The 2018 league MVP threw for 360 yards and 5 touchdowns with no INTs in steering the Chiefs to a 44-21 win. Kansas City jumped out early with TDs on their first three drives and never looked back. Playing without several regular starters – including DE JJ Watt, WR DeAndre Hopkins, G Justin Pugh – the Cards battled and late in the first half had opportunities to make it a one score game but could not take advantage of them. The victory gave the Chiefs their eight consecutive season with a week 1 win while the Cardinals fell in the regular season opener for the first time in four seasons under Kingsbury and QB Kyler Murray.

Kansas City received the opening kickoff and proceeded to move 75 yards in 11 plays as Mahomes capped the drive with a 9-yard TD pass to TE Travis Kelce. The next Chiefs drive was equally effective, covering 86 yards in 7 plays. It ended on a Mahomes shovel pass to RB Clyde Edwards-Helaire for a 3-yard score that made it 14-0 late in the opening quarter. The Cards desperately needed a scoring drive and Murray delivered. He completed 4 of 5 pass attempts on the ensuing series, the biggest of which was a 24-yarder to WR Greg Dortch that moved it to the KC35. Shortly thereafter, Kyler scampered 21 yards up the middle to the 2, setting up James Conner's TD run that cut the lead in half at 14-7 two minutes into the second quarter. The next drive saw the Chiefs move 71 yards in 10 plays before facing a 4th-n-2 at the 4; KC went for it and Edwards-Helaire's 4-yard completion from Mahomes made it 20-7 after the PAT failed. With 1:05 to go in the half, the Chiefs continued to lead by 13 and took over at their own 20. On the first play from scrimmage, Mahomes connected with WR Juju Smith-Schuster before LB Dennis Gardeck forced a fumble that CB Byron Murphy recovered at the KC43 with :58 left. AZ soon faced a 4th-n-2 at the 43 with turned it over on downs when Murray's pass attempt was incomplete. The Chiefs quickly moved into position for a 54-yard FG try from Harrison Butker, who returned to action after exiting the game via cart in the first quarter. The kick was good and Kansas City took a 23-7 lead into the halftime locker room.

Kansas City's opening possession of the second half also resulted in a TD, this one a 1-yard pass from Mahomes to TE Jody Fortson. The Chiefs increased their lead to 37-7 late in the third on Mahomes' fifth TD pass of the day, this one a 2-yarder to WR Mecole Hardman. Early in the fourth, Murray's 2-yard TD pass to new Cardinals WR – and Murray's former Oklahoma teammate – Marquise Brown was followed by a successful two-point toss to TE Zach Ertz that made it 37-15. After a TD run by Chiefs RB Isiah Pacheco capped the next KC possession, Ertz's 6-yard TD catch from Murray provided the game's final score with 5:11 remaining.

The Cardinals made their first-ever appearance at Allegiant Field for a week 2 showdown with the Raiders and it was one for the ages. Vegas jumped out to a 20-0 halftime lead and led 23-7 after 3 quarters. But the gritty Cardinals battled back. And QB Kyler Murray engineered one of the greatest and most improbable comebacks in franchise history. Arizona would score the game's final 22 points, send the contest to overtime with a TD and 2-point conversion as regulation expired, and win it in the extra period with the longest OT return of a fumble in NFL history. It was the franchise's biggest comeback since 1999 and 5th largest ever; it was also the greatest comeback ever against the Raiders.

While the game ended in thrilling fashion for Arizona, its beginning was inauspicious. The Raiders took the opening kickoff, moved 75 yards in 15 plays and Derek Carr's 1-yard TD pass to WR Davante Adams made it 7-0. The next Vegas drive reached the AZ12 in 8 plays before Daniel Carlson's 32-yard FG made it 10-0. The Raiders increased it to 17-0 on their next possession when Carr capped a 7-play, 59-yard drive with his 3-yard scoring pass to TE Darren Waller. With just over 2 minutes to go in the first half, the Cards faced a 3rd-n-2 at the LV42 when Murray's pass attempt to Hollywood Brown was intercepted by CB Amik Robertson. The return set Vegas up it its own 27 with 1:51 to go. That was enough time to move into position for a 55-yard Carlson FG as the half expired that made it 20-0 at intermission. In their history, the Cardinals were 0-88-1 in games they trailed by 20+ points at halftime.


The AZ comeback began on its 2nd offensive series of the 3rd quarter. Murray completed 5 of 7 passes for 66 yards and ended the 79-yard drive with a scoring pass to WR Greg Dortch, a 5-yarder that was his first NFL TD catch. A 47-yard pass interference penalty on the ensuing Vegas possession led to a 25-yard Carlson FG that made it 23-7 late in the 3rd quarter. Two minutes into the 4th, the Cards trailed by 16 but were at the LV11 when they went for it on 4th-n-1. It ended there, though, as Murray's pass was just beyond the reach of TE Zach Ertz. However, 3 straight incompletions led to a punt and more 4th and down 16. They went for it and converted when Brown made a spectacular 1-handed grab at the 1. A play later. RB Darrel Williams punched it in and the Cards went for 2. What happened on that try was unforgettable and vintage Murray; the 08 kept the pass play alive for 20 seconds, snaking around in the backfield for almost 85 total yards before finally outracing the defense to the pylon for a successful conversion. After another Vegas punt, the Cards tothe vegas the 4th-n-1 at the 6 when a defensive holding foul kept the drive going. It set up a 11s-n-goal at the 3 but after 3 incompletions it was 4th-n-4 at the 6 when a defensive holding foul kept the drive going. It set up a 15-n-goal at the 3 but after 3 incompletions it was 4th-n-4 at the Game to 0T and a delay penalty pushed the try back to the 7. It didn't matter. Murray fired a dart to WR AJ Green in the back of the end zone and the game was tied.

AZ won the OT coin toss and advanced to the LV37. They went for it on 4th-n-1 from there but Brown could not hold onto a Murray pass down the left side and the Raiders took over. On the edge of FG range, they faced 2nd-n-10 at the AZ39 when Carr hit WR Hunter Renfrow with a short pass but LB Isaiah Simmons dislodged the ball with a devastating hit. CB Byron Murphy scooped the loose ball and returned it 59 yards down the sideline to clinch the amazing comeback victory.

In a match-up of 1-1 teams, the defending Super Bowl champion Rams came to State Farm Stadium and jumped out to an early 13-0 lead, thanks to a pair of field goals and a TD. The Cardinals would respond with the game's next three scores. They were lengthy drives of 19, 17 and 16 plays that produced FGs rather than TDs but it still got AZ to within 4 points late in the third quarter. However, LA's second TD of the day made it 20-9 and the Cards would only be able to close to within 8 before running out of time. QB Kyler Murray set career highs in completions (37) and attempts (58) and his favorite target was Marquise Brown. The WR racked up 140 yards on a career-best 14 receptions, a total that tied the 2nd most in franchise history.

The Rams forced a punt on the Cardinals' game opening drive and LA's Michael Hoecht got a hand on it to set the visitors up at the AZ35. Arizona's defense rose to the challenge and limited the Rams to a 22yard Matt Gay FG that made it 3-0. Following a 3-n-out from the AZ offense, the Rams took over their own 42. Six plays later they had it at the AZ20 when WR Cooper Kupp went in motion, took a handoff from QB Matthew Stafford and raced around the left end for 20 yards and a TD that made it 10-0. Gay's 40-yard FG capped LA's next drive and put the Rams up 13-0 early in the 2nd quarter. With 11:21 left in the Alf, AZ took over at its own 30 and down 13-0. The Cards would move 65 yards in 19 plays, converting a pair of 4th downs on a much-needed drive. It would reach the 5 but no further and Matt Prater's 23yard FG made it 13-3 with 1:51 before halftime. After forcing another 3-n-out by the LA offense, the Cards took over at their own 28 with :48 left in the first half. Murray moved them 47 yards, the biggest chunk of which came on a 30-yard completion to WR Greg Dortch on the last play before Prater's 45-yard FG made it 13-65 at intermission.

Arizona opened the 2nd half by forcing a 3-n-out that included a JJ Watt sack of Stafford. The Cards offense then took over at its own 11 and soon faced a 4th-n-1 at the 20; they went for it and RB James Conner converted. The drive would reach the LA31 and Prater's 3rd straight FG – this one from 49 – made it a 4-point game with 5:10 to go in the 3rd quarter. On the ensuing LA possession, the Rams soon faced a 3rd-n-11 from their own 24 when Stafford escaped a sack from LB Zaven Collins and hit Cupp for 11 and the first down. A screen to TE Tyler Highee picked up 26 yards and Cam Akers' 14-yard TD run ended the drive to put LA up 20-9 with 16 minutes to play. With 11:30 remaining, the Cards had reached the LA26 where they went for it on 4th-n-4 but Murray's pass attempt to Brown was batted away. Up 11 with 7 minutes to go, the Rams advanced to AZ1 and poised to put the game away; however, S Budda Baker forced an Akers fumble that Jalen Thompson recovered to keep it a 2-possesion game. Murray would move AZ to the LA13 in 16 plays – the longest of which was 14 yards – and Prater's 31-yard FG with 1:07 pulled the Cards to within 8. They would need an onside kick recovery to keep their hopes alive but the Rams dashed them by successfully corraling the kick.

WEEK 4 Arizona Cardinals 26, Carolina Panthers 16 69,810 Bank of America Stadium Oct 2, 2022

The Cardinals traveled to Carolina for a week 4 match-up of teams desperately trying to even their record at 2-2. Arizona had not won a regular season game there since 2002 and the Panthers had won 6 straight in the series. Through two quarters, it looked like they were on their way to making it 7 and took a 10-3 lead into halftime. But the Cards ran off 23 points in the second half as Kyler Murray threw two TDs and ran for another. The AZ defense, meanwhile, was exceptional throughout; it created three takeaways and generally harassed Panthers QB Baker Mayfield all afternoon while limiting RB Christian McCaffrey to 27 rushing yards on 8 attempts. Leading that effort was DE Zach Allen who had a career-day; he finished with 6 tackles, a sack, three knockdowns, two QB hits and a tackle for loss. All of it added up to a 26-16 win that continued Arizona's success on the road with 10 wins in its last 11 opportunities.

On their first possession of the game, the Panthers were stopped on a 3rd-n-1 Mayfield QB sneak and went for it on 4th-n-inches from their own 39; led by LB Zaven Collins, the Cards D stopped McCaffrey and the offense took over. The Cards reached the Carolina 10 where they faced a 4th-n-1 themselves but WR Rondale Moore was tackled behind the line of scrimmage and the threat was extinguished. The game remained scoreless into the 2nd quarter before the Panthers defense created its first points. On 3rd-n-6 from the AZ31, LB Frankle Luvi intercepted a Murray pass intended for Hollywood Brown and returned it 33 yards for a TD. The next series saw the Cards go for it again on 4th-n-1 - this time from their own 42 - but turned it over on downs when the snap went over Murray's head. That gave it back to the Panthers at the AZ42 with 9:02 to go before halftime but they would scon return it. A fumbled exchange between Mayfield and WR Rashard Higgins was recovered by Arizona LB Ben Niemann at the AZ35. The Cards offense then went 50 yards in 8 plays and pull to within 7-3 on Matt Prater's 33-yard FG with 3:34 left in the 2nd quarter. 5 Jalen Thompson's INT gave the offense the ball back at the AZ18 with 1:05 to go in the half. After a 3-n-out, Carolina took over at its own 35 with :21 left and advanced to the AZ36 on 4 completions before Eddy Pineiro's 54-yard FG as the half expired made it 10-3.

Carolina got the ball to start the 2nd half but on its 3rd play from scrimmage, Allen's 9-yard sack of Mayfield forced a punt. The Cards would then tie the game with a 9-play, 89-yard TD drive. Key plays were a 22-yard reception by TE Zach Ertz and a 37-yard defensive pass interference penalty drawn by WR Marquise Brown. Ertz ended it with a TD pass from Murray on 3rd-n-goal from the 2. After again forcing a Panther punt, the Cards embarked on another long drive, this one consuming 9:26 and extending into the 4th quarter. Matt Prater capped it with his 39-yard FG that gave AZ its first lead at 13-10. On the next play from scrimmage, DE J.J. Watt deflected a Mayfield pass into the air where LB Dennis Gardeck caught it and returned his first career INT 24 yards to the Carolina 5. A play later, Murray ran it in around the right side for a 4-yard TD that made it 20-10 with 10:26 left in the game. Carolina's ensuing series ended when Allen knocked down another Mayfield pass, this time on 4th-n-1 at the CAR 31. Two plays later on 3rd-n-3 from the 23, Murray hit Brown with an over-the-shoulder throw and the WR artfully tapped his toes just inside the end zone. The connection put AZ up 26-10 with 7:37 to play and the game's only other score came on a Mayfield-to-McCaffrey TD pass of 13 yards.



In week 5, the NFL's only remaining undefeated team came to State Farm Stadium when the 2-2 Cardinals hosted the 4-0 Philadelphia Eagles. The visitors took an early 14-0 but the Cards battled back to tie it at 17 in the 4th. After Philly went up 3 on a go-ahead FG with 1:45 to play, Arizona had a chance to send the game into 0T but a 43-yard FG try in the closing seconds was wide right. The Cardinals defense was exceptional holding Philadelphia to a season-low 20 points and just 6 in the second half. Marquise Brown led the Cards with 78 receiving yards on 8 catches with a TD.

The Eagles drew first blood with a TD on their opening offensive possession. Completions of 14 & 10 yards to TE Dallas Goedert were followed by two to WR AJ Brown (15 & 11) that kept the 11-play, 64-yard drive going. QB Jalen Hurts capped it with his 1-yard QB keeper and Philly led 7-0. On the next play from scrimmage, Kyler Murray's pass down the deep middle intended for Brown was intercepted by SC J Gardner-Johnson, setting the Eagles up at their own 35. However, they would not capitalize as Arizona's defense sent them 3-n-out. Late in the opening quarter, Philly faced a 3rd-n-12 at its own 11 but Hurts found DeVonta Smith for 22 to the 33. A 20-yard connection between those 2 followed and the 16-play, 87-yard drive ultimately concluded with another 1-yard TD sneak. AZ seemed to seize some momentum on the opening play of the next Philly drive when S Jalen Thompson picked a Hurts pass across the middle but replay overturned it. The Cards still sent the Eagles 3-n-out and following the punt took over at their own 43 for their best field position of the day. A 13-yard James Conner run moved it to the 44 and was followed by a 14-yard Brown catch to the PHI32. On 3rd-n-2 from the 25, Murray found Brown in the middle of the field and the speedy WR slipped a tackle before racing into the end zone. AZ forced another Eagles punt and took over at its own 1 but ran a fake instead; the snap went to the up-back, RB Darrell Williams, who ran for 7 and picked up the first down. The very lengthy drive (16 plays, 91 yards) took 9:38 off the clock and Matt Amendola's 20-yard FG as the half expired trimmed Philly's lead to 14-10. Amendola was signed during the week as a replacement for the team's regular kicker, Matt Prater (hip).

Philly increased its lead to 17-10 on the opening drive of the 3rd quarter when Cameron Dicker's 42-yard FG capped a 10-play, 51-yard drive. After the teams traded punts, AZ took over at its own 10 in the final minute of the 3rd quarter. Injuries to starting RB James Conner as well as back-ups Darrell Williams and Jonathan Ward, left Eno Benjamin as the Cardinals only available RB. Thanks largely to Murray completing all 6 of his pass attempts on the drive (for 58 yards), AZ reached the PHI11 in 11 plays; from there Benjamin ran it in to tie the game with 9:43 to go in the game. Hurts then led the Eagles into AZ territory and with 4:28 left, they faced 3rd-n-12 at the Cards 36; they picked it up thanks to a 16-yard Hurts-to-Goedert completion. The drive would reach the AZ5 and Dicker's 23-yard FG put Philly up 20-17. After the kickoff, the Cards took over at their own 25 with 1:45 to go and no timeouts. A 15-yard Murray run and 4 completions covered 31 yards, taking the Cards to the PHI24 with :36 left. A Murray burst up the middle appeared to gain 10+ yards on 2nd-n-10 and the Cards stopped the clock with a spike with :22 left. However, officials spotted it as just a 9-yard gain and after the spike it was 4th-n-1 at the 25. AZ sent out the FG unit to tie it but Amendola's 43-yard attempt sailed right.

WEEK 6 Arizona Cardinals 9, Seattle Seahawks 19 68,867 Lumen Field Oct 16, 2022



On a warm, sunny week 6 afternoon in Seattle, the Cardinals faced the Seahawks in a match-up of 2-3 teams that were playing for a share of the division lead. Each team would produce just one touchdown but Seattle complemented theirs with 4 Jason Meyers FGs while the Cardinals turned it over on downs 3 times when going for it on 4th-n-short situations inside the SEA 30. After losing 3 RBs to injury the week before, the Cardinals offense started the game without C Rodney Hudson and soon lost G Justin Pugh to injury. Arizona's defense was again exceptional, limiting Seattle to 19 points and just one touchdown. But that one TD and the 4 FGs were enough for Seattle to secure a 19-9 win on this day to secure the win.

Arizona opened the game by taking the opening kickoff and marching deep into Seattle territory thanks to a pair of big gains on 3rd down. The first came when Kyler Murray converted a 3rd-n-4 from the AZ25 with his 42-yard run to the SEA33. Then on 3rd-6 from the SEA26, a 23-yard catch-and-run by WR Rondale Moore took it to the 3. That set-up Matt Amendola's 23-yard FG that gave Arizona a 3-0 lead and its first opening quarter points of the season. Seattle responded with a FG drive of its own and Jason Myers' 39-yard kick tied the game with 6:41 left in the first quarter; 47 of the drive's 54 yards came on consecutive Kenneth Walker runs of 17 and 34 yards. On the first play of the 2nd quarter, the Cards went for it on 4th-n-4 from the SEA20 but turned it over on downs when Murray's pass was incomplete. Midway thru the 2nd quarter, Seattle marched to the AZ7 and faced a 3rd-n-2. DT Rashard Lawrence tackled Walker in the backfield for a 2-yard loss and Myers' 27-yard FG put the Seahawks up 6-3. With 0:55 left in the first half, Seattle took over at its own 32 with one timeout. A 22-yard Marquise Goodwin reception on the drive's first play was followed by Smith's 24-yard scramble to the AZ22 . The Seahawks would reach the 15 but no further and Myers' 3rd FG of the game – this one a 34-yarder – made it 9-3 at intermission.

After forcing a Seattle 3-n-out to open the 3rd quarter, Arizona again advanced deep into Seahawks territory. The biggest plays were a 14-yard Moore reception and a 15-yard Murray run. The Cards faced 4thn-2 at the 27 and again went for it but under pressure, Murray was forced into an incompletion. Seattle took over from there and received the benefit of a roughing the passer call as well as a defensive holding flag that wiped out a 3rd down stop. Myers' 4th FG of the day (32 yards) would end the drive and put the Seahawks up 12-3 with 4:11 left in the 3rd quarter. On the first play of the next drive, Murray hit Zach Ertz for a 21-yard gain to the SEA43. On 3rd-n-6 from the SEA39, Murray scrambled for the first down but fumbled at the end of the run and Seattle recovered at its own 19. AZ's defense sent the Seahawks 3-n-out, including a sack by rookie LB Myjai Sanders that backed it up to the 10 and forced a Seattle punt from its own end zone. On a frenetic play, LB Ezkiel Turrer hit punter Michael Dickson forcing a fumble that S Chris Banjo recovered for a TD. After the PAT kick failed, the Cards trailed 12-9 in the final minute of the 3rd quarter. The Seahawks responded by moving 75 yards in 7 plays and capped it with their first and only TD of the day, an 11-yard Walker run around the left end. Trailing by 10 early in the 4th, the Cards would again advance deep into Seattle territory and again went for it on a the game ended in a 19-9 Seahawks win.



In a Thursday night match-up vs. New Orleans, the Cardinals improved to 3-4 on the season with a 42-34 victory. They trailed 14-6 with 2:30 to play in the 2nd quarter but exploded for 22 points before halftime in a frenetic, game-changing sequence. Two of the three scores came 62 seconds apart on INT return TDs off Andy Dalton, first by CB Marco Wilson and then by LB Isaiah Simmons. Overall the Cards enjoyed a 3-0 advantage in turnovers. The team was also bolstered tremendously by the return of WR DeAndre Hopkins who had 10 receptions for 103 yards in his first action after missing the first 6 games due to suspension. RB Eno Benjamin had the best game of his career, rushing 12 times for 92 yards with a TD as well as a 2-point conversion. QB Kyler Murray was 20-10 passing for 204 yards and ran for 30 yards on 7 carries while playing turnover-free football.

The high-scoring game's point production began early. On the 4th play from scrimmage, Dalton connected down the deep middle with WR Rashid Shaheed for a 53-yard TD. On the ensuing AZ drive, a 31-yard completion to WR Rondale Moore moved it to the N037. That set-up a 50-yard FG by Rodrigo Blankenship in his first attempt while filling in for the injured Matt Prater. Leading 7-3, the Saints advanced to the AZ10 on their next drive but on 3rd-n-8 from there, Dalton's pass was picked off in the end zone by CB Antonio Hamilton. A 17-yard Murray run was followed by a 45-yarder from Benjamin, setting up Blankenship's 28-yard FG that made it 7-6 early in the 2nd quarter. The Saints responded with a drive that ended on a 3-yard Dalton TD pass to Taysom Hill; it was set-up by a 64-yard catch-n-run from WR Kevin White. Thanks to 6-for-6 passing by Murray, the Cards would move deep into Saints territory on their next drive and went for it on 4th-n-1 at the 4. Murray ran for 2 to the 2 and a play later, rookie RB Keontay Ingram punched it in; that score and Benjamin's run on the 2-point try tied the game at 14 with 2:28 left in the half. On the 2nd play of the ensuing series, Dalton's pass across the middle deflected off the hands WR Marquez Callaway and into the arms of Wilson who raced 38 yards before a leaping dive into the end zone. Now trailing 20-14, the Saints faced a 3rd-n-10 at their own 47. Dalton was pressured by rookie LB Cameron Thomas and his pass down the middle of the field was snared with one hand by Simmons. He returned it 56 yards down the right sideline to complete the pick 6 and the Cards lead 28-14 at intermission.

The Saints cut the lead to 28-17 with Will Lutz's FG (25) on their opening possession of the 2nd half. Later in the quarter, the Cards moved 85 yards in 12 plays and took 6:31 off the clock; Murray was 7-8 for 85 yards on the drive and ended it with his 5-yard TD pass to WR Greg Dortch. After Juwan Johnson's 17-yard TD catch from Dalton made it 35-24 with 11:14 to go, the Cards produced another TD drive. The key play was a 15-yard run from Benjamin on 3rd-n-8 from the NO20 and set-up his own 5-yard TD run that made it 42-24 with 6:22 remaining. The Saints would add a late TD and FG but AZ recovered two onside attempts to seal the win.

The 3-4 Cardinals traveled to the Twin Cities to face a 5-1 Vikings team that had won 4 straight and sat comfortably atop the NFC North. Despite at least five key players missing the game with injuries and spotting the hosts an early lead, Arizona came back to take the lead in the second half. However, three turnovers proved costly and the Vikings would emerge with a 34-26 win. WR DeAndre Hopkins was again outstanding, with 12 catches for 159 yards and a remarkable 1-handed TD catch. QB Kyler Murray threw for 326 yards and 3 TDs while WR Rondale Moore gained 92 yards on his 7 receptions that included a 38-yard TD catch. Minnesota was led by RB Dalvin Cook's 111 rushing yards and QB Kirk Cousins threw for a pair of TDs and ran for one.

The Vikings opened the scoring on the game's first drive, marching to the AZ17. On 3rd-n-4 from here, Cousins eluded the rush and scrambled 17 yards for a TD that put the Vikings up 7-0. The Cards quickly made it 7-3 on the next series when Matt Prater's 44-yard FG capped an 8-play, 49-yard drive. The ensuing possession saw Minnesota advance to the AZ38 where they faced a 4rd-n-2; the Vikes went for it but turned it over on downs with an incompletion. They did, however, go up 14-3 the next time they got the ball on an 83-yard drive that Cousins ended with his 1-yard TD pass to 4rd-n-2; the Vikes went for it but 3:39 to go in the half, the Cards took over at their own 28 and in 9 plays moved to the MIN6. On 3rd-n-2 from there, Murray fired to Hopkins in the end zone and the all-pro WR snared it with just his left hand to make it 14-10 with :47 left in the half. Minnesota would advance to the AZ38 where Greg Joseph attempted a 56-yard FG as time expired but it was blocked by Cards DT Leki Fotu.

On its second series of the 3rd quarter, AZ's offense took over at its own 48 following a Vikings 3-n-out. A 33-yard Hopkins completion from Murray moved it to the 8 and from there a Zach Ertz TD catch-n-run would put the Cards up 17-14 with 9:01 left in the third quarter. The Vikings responded with an 8-play, 75-yard TD drive and went ahead 21-17 following Alexander Mattison's 7-yard scoring run. On the next play from scrimmage, Murray's pass down the deep middle was INT'd by S Harrison Smith, setting MIN up at the AZ31. Four plays later, Cook's 4-yard TD run made it 28-17 with 4:07 to go in the third. Murray then completed 4 of 4 passes on the next drive for 70 yards; the biggest play was the final one, a 38-yard catch-n-run by Moore pulled the Cards to within 5 at 28-23 after the 2-point try failed. Three plays later, the Vikings faced a 3rd-n-5 from their own 30 when LB Isaiah Simmons stripped Cousins and recovered the fumble himself. That led to a 34-yard Prater FG early in the 4 Ath that pulled AZ to within 2. The Cards D again forced a Vikings punt on the ensuing possession but returner Greg Dortch muffed it and MIN recovered at the AZ5. On 3rd-n-2 from the AZ5, Cousins hit WR XJ Osborn with a TD pass that made it 34-26 with 8:36 left after the PAT kick failed. Down 8, the Cards would possess the ball three more times. On the first, they reached the MIN44 before turning it over on downs. And the final one reached the MIN37 in the final minute but a pair of sacks ended the comeback hopes.
