ARIZONA CARDINALS NOTE CARDS

- Career INT percentage (25 INTs on 1,917 pass attempts) for QB Jacoby Brissett. He has the fewest INTs per attempt in NFL history (min. 1,500 career attempts) just ahead of Steelers QB Aaron Rodgers (1.4).
 - 2 Runs of 50+ yards for RB Emari Demercado this season (on just 26 carries). Demercado joins Indy's Jonathan Taylor (3 on 189 carries) and New England's TreVeyon Henderson (2 in 100 carries) as the only players in the NFL with multiple runs of 50+ yards in 2025.
 - Takeways for the Cardinals defense over the last two weeks (two interceptions and four fumble recoveries). Arizona is tied with Baltimore and Pittsburgh for the most in the NFL over that span.
- 43 Made field goals for K **Chad Ryland** since making his Cardinals debut in Week 5 last season at SF. He ranks 5th in the NFL in made FGs (43) and 7th in total points (176) in that span.

MILESTONE WATCH

WITH A WIN..

- The Cardinals would improve to 8-4 in their last 12 home games vs. the 49ers.
- The Cardinals would improve to 3-1 in their last four matchups against San Francisco.
- Head coach Jonathan Gannon would improve to 2-1 at home vs. San Francisco.

MILESTONES WITHIN REACH...

LB JOSH SWEAT

- With 1.0 sack, Sweat would have 9.0 sacks in 2025. That would surpass his sack output from all of last season with Philadelphia (8.0 in 16 games). Just once in his career would Sweat have more sacks in an entire season: 11.0 in 2022 with the Eagles.
- With 1.0 sack, Sweat would have at least 1.0 sack in three consecutive games for the second time this season (Games 2-5).
- With 1.5+ sacks on Sunday, Sweat will pass Bertrand Berry (9.0) for the most sacks by a player in his first 10 games with the Cardinals.
- With 2.0+ sacks, Sweat would become just the 14th different player in franchise history - and first since J.J. Watt in 2022 (12.5) - to have 10.0+ sacks in a single season.

TE TREY McBRIDE

- With 5 receptions, McBride would have 5+ catches for the 12th consecutive game. In NFL history, only Travis Kelce (15 in 2018) and Tony Gonzalez (13 in 2008-09) would have longer streaks among TEs.
- With 1 TD reception, McBride would have a TD catch in five consecutive games.
 He would become the first Cardinals TE in the Super Bowl era to have a TD reception in at least five straight games.
- With 1 TD reception, McBride (7) would join Jackie Smith (9 in 1967) and Doug Marsh (8 in 1983) as the only TEs in franchise history with 7+ TD catches in a season.

QB JACOBY BRISSETT

- With 2 passing TDs, Brissett would have multiple TD passes in five straight games for the first time in his career.
- With 250+ passing yards and 2+ passing TDs, Brissett would have those numbers in five straight games. He would join Carson Palmer (5 straight in 2013-14) as the only players in franchise history with 250+ passing yards and 2+ TD passes in at least five consecutive games.
- With 272+ passing yards, Brissett (1,390) would pass Kurt Warner (1,389 in 2005) for the most passing yards by a Cardinals QB in their first five games with the team.
- With 3+ passing TDs, Brissett (11) would pass Gary Hogeboom (10 in 1989) for the most passing touchdowns in a player's first five games with the Cardinals.

DL CALAIS CAMPBELL

• With 1.0 sack, Campbell would have 6.0 sacks in 2025. He would surpass his sack total from all of last season (5.0 in 17 games with Miami).

S BUDDA BAKER

 With 5+ tackles, it would be Baker's 28th consecutive game with 5-or-more tackles, the third-longest streak in NFL history by a DB passing Victor Green (27 games in 1995-96). Only two DBs (Landon Collins - 36 in 2015-17 and Yeremiah Bell - 34 in 2008-10) have had longer streaks.

CB DENZEL BURKE

 With an INT, Burke would join Lionel Washington (3 straight in 1983) as the only Cardinals rookies since at least 1970 with an INT in three straight games.

RB EMARI DEMERCADO

 With 60+ rushing yards, Demercado would have three straight games with 60+ yards for the first time since Games 10-12 of the 2021 season when he was at TCU.

BIRDS' EYE VIEW

BURKE GOES BACK-TO-BACK

In his last two games, rookie CB **Denzel Burke** has posted 11 tackles (9 solo), one tackle for loss, three passes defensed and two interceptions. Burke is the first Cardinals rookie to have an INT in back-to-back games since Corey Chavous (Games 12-13) in 1998. He is also the first Cardinals rookie since Tyrann Mathieu in 2013 to record 2+ interceptions in his rookie season.

Burke is the only rookie in the NFL this season with 6+ passes defensed and 2+ INTs. Both his 6 passes defensed and 2 INTs are tied for the NFL lead among rookies in 2025.



LB Josh Sweat had 2 tackles, 2.0 sacks, 2 tackles for loss, a careerhigh 5 QB hits and a pass defensed in the win over Dallas in Week 9. Last week in Seattle, he followed up with a tackle, 1.0 sack, a forced fumble and a fumble recovery. According to Pro Football Focus, he has the second-highest pass rush grade (85.5) and fourth-highest defensive grade (84.8) among edge defenders in the NFL over the last two weeks.

Sweat's 8.0 sacks this season are tied for the 5th-most in the NFL and his three "strip-sacks" are tied with Lions DL Aidan Hutchinson for the league-lead.

MCBRIDE CONTINUES TO MAKE HISTORY

TE **Trey McBride's** historic season continued in Week 10 at Seattle after he posted a season-high 127 yards on nine catches including a touchdown. It marked his fourth-consecutive game with a TD reception as he joined Jackie Smith (4 in 1967) as the only Cardinals TEs in the Super Bowl era to have at least one TD catch in four consecutive games.

Last week's game was also McBride's 23rd outing with 5+ receptions and 50+ receiving yards dating back to his second NFL season in 2023. That total leads all TEs during that span.

In 2025, McBride ranks near the top of all major statistical categories among TEs: first in receptions (61) and second in receiving yards (603) and touchdown receptions (6).

CARDINALS SALUTE TO SERVICE

On Monday, the Cardinals hosted a special event as part of the NFL's Salute to Service initiative for families from the Tragedy Assistance Program for Survivors (TAPS) and Pat Tillman Scholars at Benihana.

QB Jacoby Brissett (pictured right), TES Trey McBride and Elijah Higgins, WR Greg Dortch, OL Paris Johnson Jr., LB BJ Ojulari, LS Aaron Brewer, K Chad Ryland, and P Pat O'Donnell and P Blake Gillikin teamed up with chefs at Benihana to prepare tableside meals for representatives from the Pat Tillman Foundation and TAPS families. It was a vibrant night of service, food, and entertainment designed to strengthen civic pride and honor those who serve.

That afternoon, Cardinals players along with assistance from Tillman Scholars and civics educators around the Arizona community built benches to be placed outside of the Hardy Police Substation in Tempe.
