RDINALS

Passer rating for Kyler Murray in the Cardinals matchup against San Francisco in Week 9. That is nearly 40 points higher than the next-closest QB posted against the 49ers this season (Case Keenum, 91.3 rating). It's also the highest for a Cards QB in 56 all-time matchups vs. the Niners.

Career games played for OL A.Q. Shipley, who will appear in game #100 on Sunday in San Francisco. A seventh-round pick by Pittsburgh in the 2009 draft, Shipley spent his first two NFL seasons on practice squads (Steelers, Eagles) and was out of football in 2011 before signing with Indy in 2012.

Times WR Andy Isabella has been targeted in the last three contests - after not being targeted at all in the season's first seven games. On those six targets, the rookie wideout has six receptions for 174 yards (29.0 avg.) and a TD. The TD was an 88-yarder in Week 9 against the 49ers. D

Arizona scoring drives in Week 9 vs. SF that covered 80+ yards (85, 88, 90). In their eight other games this season, the 49ers allowed one total scoring drive of 80+ yards (Week 3 vs. Pittsburgh, 82 yards).

WITH A WIN.

- The Cardinals would improve to 9-1 in their last 10 games against the Niners.
- Arizona would run its winning streak at Levi's Stadium to five in a row and improve to 5-1 all-time at the venue.
- Kyler Murray would tie the franchise record for wins by a rookie QB (4) and become the first rookie QB in team history to win three road games in a season.

MILESTONES WITHIN REACH...

WR LARRY FITZGERALD

- With a reception, Fitzgerald would have at least one catch in 238 consecutive games, extending the second-longest streak in NFL history (Jerry Rice - 274).
- With a TD reception, Fitzgerald would have 19 career TD catches against the 49ers. In NFL history, only Jerry Rice (25 vs. Falcons and 20 vs. Rams) would have more TD receptions against a single opponent.
- With 100 receiving yards, Fitz would have 50 career 100-yard games during the regular season. It would also give him 12 career 100-yard outings against the 49ers, the most by a player against a single opponent in NFL history.

QB KYLER MURRAY

- With two TD passes, Murray would have as many TD passes in the last three games (7) as he had in his first eight career games (7). He would also become the first rookie QB in team history with multiple TD passes in three consecutive games.
- With three TD passes, Murray would tie the franchise record for TD passes by a rookie. The current record of 15 was set by Jake Plummer in 1997.
- With 300 passing yards, Murray (5) would join Andrew Luck (6 in 2012) as the only two players in NFL history with at least five 300-yard passing performances during their rookie season.

LB TERRELL SUGGS

- With a sack, Suggs would have 139.0 career sacks and pass DeMarcus Ware (138.5) for eighth place on the NFL's all-time sacks list.
- A sack of 49ers QB Jimmy Garoppolo would make him the 77th different QB Suggs has sacked in his career. Suggs would the Hall of Famer Reggie White (77) and Julius Pepper (77) for the most QBs sacked in a career.

LB CHANDLER JONES

- With a sack, Jones would tie Simeon Rice (53.5) for third place on the franchise all-time sacks list.
- With a sack, Jones would have 12.5 sacks in 2019. That would represent the highest total in franchise history through the first 11 games of a season.
- With 1.5 sacks, Jones would have 13.0+ sacks for the third consecutive season. In NFL history, only Reggie White (4 straight) would have had 13.0+ sacks in more consecutive seasons than Jones.

RB DAVID JOHNSON

With a receiving TD, Johnson would become just the fifth player in NFL history with at least 30 rushing TDs and 15 receiving TDs in his first five seasons. He would join Marcus Allen, Thurman Thomas, Chuck Foreman and Abner Haynes as the only players to accomplish the feat.

<u>WR CHRISTIAN KIRK</u>

- With a TD reception, Kirk would have three TD catches in four career games against the 49ers.
- With a TD reception, Kirk would have more TD catches in the last two games (4) than he had in his first 18 career games (3).

LB JORDAN HICKS

With one tackle, Hicks would reach 100 tackles in a season for the first time in his career.

But he has been performing at an elite level since entering the the NFL in 2012 as a first-round pick of the Patriots. Since entering the league, Jones leads the NFL in forced fumbles (24) and ranks third in sacks (88.5).

JONES CONTINUES QUIET DOMINATION • Dating back to his final year with the Patriots in 2015, Jones is the only player in the NFL with double-digit sacks in each of the last five seasons (2015-19).

• The 2019 season is Jones' sixth with 11.0+ sacks. In NFL history, only Reggie White (8) and DeMarcus Ware (7) had more years with 11.0+ sacks in their first eight seasons.

• With 1.5 more, Jones will have 13.0 sacks in 2019. It will mark the third consecutive year he has posted at least 13.0 sacks. In NFL history, only Reggie White (4) would have have 13.0+ sacks in more consecutive seasons than Jones.

• With one more forced fumble this year, Jones would become the first Cardinals de-fender with at least six forced fumbles in a season since Clyde Simmons (6) in 1995.

KYLER MAKES HALL OF FAME DEBUT

The Pro Football Hall of Fame in Canton, OH is honoring QB Kyler Murray for establishing a new NFL record for the most consecutive pass attempts by a rookie without an INT (211). Murray broke the previous rookie record of 176, set by Derek

A BREAKOUT PERFORMANCE IN WEEK 10

WR Christian Kirk set career highs in receiving yards (138) and TD receptions (3) against the Buccaneers last week. That included TD receptions of 33 and 69 yards.

Kirk became one of just five players in the NFL who had 130+ receiving yards and three or more receiving TDs in a game in '19.
