



ARIZONA CARDINALS NOTE CARDS



642 Carson Palmer's winning percentage (38-21-1) in his 60 career starts for Arizona. That is the best winning percentage for a starting QB in team history.

36 Tackles for LB Jordan Hicks through the first three games in 2019. That is tied with Carolina LB Luke Kuechly for the most in the NFL. Both Hicks (36) and Seattle All-Pro LB Bobby Wagner (34, tied for 3rd) rank in the top five in tackles this season.

5 Forced fumbles for the Cardinals defense this season. That is tied with Dallas, Houston and Green Bay for the most in the NFL. Four of those five forced fumbles have come via strip-sacks by LBs Chandler Jones (3) and Terrell Suggs (1).

916 Total yards (830 passing; 86 rushing) for rookie QB Kyler Murray in his first three career games. Murray has 916 total yards and four TDs (all passing) through three games. Seahawks QB Russell Wilson had 500 total yards (434 passing; 66 rushing) and four TDs (all passing) in his first three career games in 2012.

WITH A WIN...

- The Cardinals would snap a six-game home winless streak against the Seahawks and earn their first victory over Seattle at State Farm Stadium since 2012.

MILESTONES WITHIN REACH...

WR LARRY FITZGERALD

- With a reception, Fitzgerald would have at least one catch in 231 consecutive games, extending the second-longest streak in NFL history (HOF WR Jerry Rice - 274).
- With five receptions Fitzgerald would pass Hall of Fame TE Tony Gonzalez (1,325) for second place on the NFL's all-time receptions list behind only HOF WR Jerry Rice (1,549).
- With a TD reception, Fitzgerald would have seven TD catches in his last eight games at State Farm Stadium, including all three games this season.
- With 100 receiving yards, Fitzgerald would have 50 career 100-yard games during the regular season. The 2019 season would also mark just the second time in his career (2008) that he had 100+ yards in three of the first four games.

LB CHANDLER JONES

- With a sack, Jones would have 45.0 sacks in 52 games with the Cardinals. It would also give him at least one sack in 35 of 52 games played with Arizona since joining the team in 2016.
- With a sack, Jones would have at least one sack in all eight career games against the Seahawks. It will also give him 10.5 career sacks against the Seahawks and QB Russell Wilson, who he has sacked more than any other QB.
- With 2.0 sacks, Jones would have 46.0 sacks as a member of the Cardinals, passing Eric Swann (45.5) for sixth place on the franchise all-time sacks list.

QB KYLER MURRAY

- With two TD passes, Murray would have more TDs through his first four career games (6) than any other player in franchise history.
- With 300+ passing yards, Murray would join Cam Newton (3 in 2011) and Andrew Luck (3 in 2012) as the only players in NFL history with three 300-yard outings in their first four career games.
- With 25 completions, Murray (4) would join Kurt Warner (6 straight in 2005) as the only players in franchise history with 25+ completions in at least four consecutive games. Murray was the first player in NFL history with 25+ completions in his first two career games and could extend that record to four games this week.

RB DAVID JOHNSON

- With a TD (of any kind), Johnson would become just the third player in franchise history with at least one TD in each of the first four games of a season, joining RBs John David Crow (1960) and Steve Lach (1942).
- With a TD (of any kind), Johnson (47) would establish a new franchise record for TDs in a player's first five seasons, surpassing the previous high of 46 by WR Larry Fitzgerald (2004-08).
- With a rushing TD, Johnson would tie John David Crow (33) for third place on the franchise all-time list for career rushing TDs.

LB TERRELL SUGGS

- With a sack, Seahawks QB Russell Wilson would become the 74th different QB Suggs has sacked in his career. Suggs will face Wilson for the first time on Sunday, which will also marks his first game against Seattle since 2011.

LB JORDAN HICKS

- With 10+ tackles, Hicks would have at least 10 tackles in four consecutive games for the first time in his career. According to official league statistics, dating back to 1999 no Cardinals defender had 10+ tackles in each of the first three games of a season prior to Hicks, who could extend that record to four straight on Sunday.

FITZ JUST 5 CATCHES FROM #2 ALL-TIME

WR **Larry Fitzgerald** enters Sunday's game with 1,321 career receptions. *He needs five more catches to pass Hall of Fame TE Tony Gonzalez (1,325) for second place on the NFL's all-time receptions list behind only Hall of Fame WR Jerry Rice (1,549).*

PALMER ENTERS THE RING OF HONOR

The Cardinals will induct QB Carson Palmer into its Ring of Honor at halftime of Sunday's game vs. Seattle.

Palmer will become the 18th member of the Cardinals Ring of Honor, the creation of which coincided with the opening of State Farm Stadium in 2006. He will join Jim Hart and Hall of Famer Kurt Warner as the only QBs in the Ring of Honor.

JONES ON RECORD PACE

Jones is one forced fumble away from tying his career high for a single season. He had four forced fumbles in 2015 and matched that total in 2016.

SACKING THE SEAHAWKS

If history is any indicator, Jones should add to his sack total on Sunday. In seven career games against the Seahawks, Jones has tallied 9.5 sacks - all of which have come against Seattle All-Pro QB Russell Wilson. Jones has at least one sack in all seven career games against the Seahawks.
