THIS WEEK'S PREVIEW

Both teams coming off their first victory of the season in Week 2, the Cardinals and Rams meet this week in the first divisional matchup for the two top seeds in the NFC West in 2021.

The Cardinals and Rams went about their Week 2 wins in entirely different ways. Arizona trailed 20-0 at halftime in Las Vegas before a historic comeback led to a walk-off 29-23 win in overtime. In its game vs. Atlanta, Los Angeles held a 21-3 lead at halftime that swelled to 28-3 early in the third quarter. But the Rams were forced to fend off a Falcons comeback that cut L.A.'s lead to 31-25 late in the fourth quarter.



Now the two teams who were mired in a season-long battle for the NFC West crown in 2021 face off for a chance at the top spot in the division early in the 2022 campaign.

After largely shutting down Raiders All-Pro WR Davante Adams last week (2 receptions for 12 yards on 7 targets), the Cardinals secondary faces another challenge this week in 2021 triple crown winner WR Cooper Kupp. After leading the NFL in receptions, receiving yards and receiving TDs last season, Kupp has 24 catches for 236 yards and three TDs through two games in 2022.

Following their red-hot finish to last week's game in which they scored 29 points in the second half/OT, the Cardinals will look to start fast against a Rams defense that has allowed just 13 total first half points so far this season.

One key to Sunday's game will be turnovers, or a lack thereof. The Rams defense already has an NFL-high seven takeaways this season, but now faces a Cardinals team that - under head coach **Kliff Kingsbury** - has done an excellent job of protecting the ball (just 55 turnovers in 51 games). Arizona has just one turnover so far this season, tied for the fewest in the NFL.

Next week the Cardinals embark on their longest road trip of the regular season when they travel to Carolina to face the Panthers. Los Angeles will have an extra day off when they travel to San Francisco for a Monday night showdown with the 49ers.

THIS WEEK'S HIGHLIGHTS

- For the third consecutive game to open the 2022 season, the Cardinals face a 2021 playoff team when they host the defending Super Bowl Champion Rams at State Farm Stadium.
- This week marks the beginning of a crucial two-month stretch for both the Cardinals and Rams, who will face off again in Week 10. The teams will each play four of their six regular season games vs. NFC West opponents in the next eight weeks.
- The Cardinals won last week's game against the Raiders after trailing 20-0 at halftime. The game marked just the fifth time in franchise history and first time since 1999 Arizona overcame a deficit of 20+ points to win a game. It was also the largest lead ever surrendered by the Raiders.
- In guiding the Cardinals to their comeback, QB **Kyler Murray** <u>became the</u> <u>first player in NFL history to have a passing TD, rushing TD, a two-point conversion pass and a two-point conversion run in the same game.</u>
- Second-year LB **Zaven Collins** made his eighth career start last Sunday and finished with career highs in tackles (8) and solo tackles (5) while also adding his first career forced fumble.
- During his first four seasons (2018-21) in the NFL, WR **Greg Dortch** spent time with five teams, was released six times and had just three receptions for 15 yards. Through two games in 2022, Dortch leads the team in both receptions (11) and receiving yards (118), has scored his first NFL TD and has 20 yards on three punt returns.

CONNER FEASTED ON THE NFC WEST IN 2021

In his first season with the Cardinals in 2021, RB James Conner scored an NFL-high 11 TDs (9 rushing, 2 receiv-ing) in six games against division opponents.

Dating back to division realignment in 2002, he became just the fourth NFL player to have 11+ TDs vs. division opponents in a single season.

In that same span, only Shaun Alexander (11 in 2005) and LaDainian Tomlinson (11) had more rushing TDs vs. division opponents in a single season than Conner had in 2021 (9).

Conner followed up his regular season performance vs. division opponents by scoring a TD against the Rams in the Wild Card matchup, giving him 12 total TDs in seven games vs. teams from the NFC West in 2021.

ALL EVEN AT 1-1 IN THE NFC WEST

The Cardinals, Rams and 49ers each earned their first win of the season in Week 2, and now the NFC West features four teams who bring 1-1 records into Week 3.

Sunday's matchup between the Cardinals and Rams is a showdown between the two teams who were in a season-long battle for the NFC West title in 2021.

The fight for the division crown came down to the regular season finale as the Rams eventually won it by a single game. Arizona and L.A. then went on to face each other in the Wild Card round.

BY THE NUMBERS

TDs (4 rushing, 1 receiving) for RB James Conner in three games against the Rams last season (including playoffs). Conner had four TDs in two regular season games vs. Los Angeles in 2021.

Turnovers for the Cardinals this season. That is tied for the fewest in the NFL. The Rams offfense has six turnovers through two games, tied for the most in the NFL in 2022.

Turnovers for the Cardinals in 51 games under head coach Kliff Kingsbury. Dating back to 2019, only two teams have fewer: Packers (40) and Saints (49).

Fumbles lost by the Cardinals under Kingsbury. That is the fewest in the NFL dating back to 2019.

Overtime victories for the Cardinals, including last week's come-from-behind 29-23 win at Las Vegas. Arizona's 28 OT victories are tied with Denver for the most in NFL history.

Cardinals all-time winning percentage in OT games (28-16-4). Arizona has the best OT winning percentage in NFL history. The Cardinals are 12-2-2 in their last 16 OT games and are unbeaten (5-0-2) in OT games dating back to 2013.

Cardinals record on the road dating back to 2021. Arizona has the best road record in the NFL during tha span.

Cardinals record on the road in the last three seasons (2020-22). Only Kansas City (.824) and Tampa Bay (.737) have a higher road winning percentage than Arizona (.722) during that span.

Halftime point deficit (down 20-0) for the Cardinals in last week's 29-23 OT victory at Las Vegas. Prior to the win last Sunday, Arizona had never won a game when trailing by 20+ points at halftime. Including playoffs, the Cards were 0-88-1 in games they faced a halftime deficit of at least 20 points prior to Sunday.

Total plays on the Cardinals TD drive that tied the game on the final play of regulation last week. It marked the first time in nearly 26 years (19 plays on 9/29/96 vs. the St. Louis Rams) the Cardinals had a TD drive of 18+ plays.

Distance, in yards, of the game-winning OT fumble return TD by CB Byron Murphy Jr. It was the longest OT fumble return TD in NFL history (regular season or postseason) and just the second-ever of 50+ yards.

Players in the NFL (Murphy, Darius Slay, Xavien Howard and Kevin Byard) who have both an INT return TD and fumble return TD over the last two seasons (2021-22).

Distance, in yards, covered by QB Kyler Murray on his remarkable two-point conversion run that lasted nearly 21 seconds last week in Las Vegas, according to NFL Next Gen Stats.

Total yards allowed (on 23 plays) by the Cardinals defense in the second half/OT vs. the Raiders. Las Vegas averaged just 2.9 yards per play in that span.

Sacks for DL J.J. Watt in his last three regular season games played. He also has four QB hits, eight tackles, two tackles for loss, two passes defensed and a forced fumble in that span.

Total net yards (270 passing; 143 rushing) for the Cardinals in their win over Las Vegas last week. It was the 18th time under Kingsbury that Arizona has had 400+ total yards and 100+ rushing yards in a game - and the Cardinals improved to 16-2 in those contests.

Rushing TDs for the Cardinals in four seasons under Kingsbury, including two last week against the Raiders. Over the last four seasons (2019-22), only Tennessee (71) and San Francisco (67) have more rushing TDs.

Receptions for Raiders WR Davante Adams last week (on seven targets). Entering last Sunday's matchup, Adams had at least three receptions in 65 consecutive games dating back to 2017, the longest such active streak in the NFL.

Games in which TE Zach Ertz has at least eight receptions since joining the Cardinals. That is tied with Hall of Famer Jackie Smith (3) for the most such outings by a TE in team history - despite Ertz having played in just 13 games with Arizona.

WITH A WIN THIS WEEK...

- Arizona would earn its first home win vs. the Rams since 2014.
- The Cardinals would improve to 5-2 vs. division opponents since last season.

MILESTONES WITHIN REACH

QB Kyler Murray • With a passer rating of 120.0+, Murray would have 10 such performances in his career. That would tie Neil Lomax (10 times in 108 games) for the most games with a passer rating of 120.0+ in franchise history.

• With 300+ passing yards, Murray would have 12 career 300-yard performances. Just 49 games into his career, that would tie for the fifth-best total in franchise history.

RB James Conner

- With two TDs (of any kind), Conner would have multiple TDs in all three regular season games vs. the Rams since joining the Cardinals last season.
- With two rushing TDs, Conner would have 18 rushing TDs in 18 regular season games with the Cardinals. In NFL history, only Jim Brown (23 w/ Browns), Eric Dickerson (19 w/ Rams) and Bill Paschal (19 w/ Giants) would have more in their first 19 games with a team.

TE Zach Ertz

• With five receptions, Ertz would reach 650 receptions for his career. At 31 years, 319 days old on Sunday he would become the third-youngest TE in NFL history to reach the milestone behind only Jason Witten (29 years, 170 days) and Tony Gonzalez (30 years, 195 days).

DL J.J. Watt

- With a sack, Watt would have 3.0 sacks in his last four regular season games played. It would also give him 4.0 career sacks of Rams QB Matthew Stafford.
- With 2.0 sacks, Watt would have 4.0 sacks in his last four regular season games played.

RB Darrel Williams

- With a TD (of any kind), Williams would have a TD in back-to-back games for just the second time in his career (Games 11-12 in 2019).
- With a rushing TD, Williams would have a rushing TD in back-to-back games for the first time in his career.

K Matt Prater

• With seven points, Prater would join Robbie Gould (1,843) and Mason Crosby (1,816) as the only active players with 1,600+ career points.

FROM 20 POINTS DOWN TO A WIN

The Cardinals evened their record at 1-1 after defeating the Las Vegas Raiders 29-23 in overtime last week in Arizona's first-ever visit to Allegiant Stadium.

The Cardinals trailed 20-0 at halftime and came from behind to earn the OT victory. It marked just the fifth time in franchise history - and first time since 1999 - Arizona overcame a deficit of 20+ points to win a game.

A LOOK AT HOW IMPROBABLE THE WIN WAS

- Prior to the victory over the Raiders last week, the Cardinals had never won a game when trailing by 20+ points at halftime.
- Including postseason, Arizona was 0-88-1 in games they faced a halftime deficit of at least 20 points prior to last week.
- The Cardinals (down 20-0) and Dolphins (down 28-7) each faced halftime deficits of 20+ points last week and came back to win. It is the first time in NFL history that two teams overcame 20-point halftime deficits to win on the same day.
- Down 16 points with just 12:07 remaining in regulation, the Cardinals scored TDs - and converted a pair of two-point attempts - on their final two drives. Those two drives combined for 26 plays, 127 net yards and 12 first downs.



- Last week's game marked the first time in franchise history the Cardinals had more than one successful two-point conversion attempt in a single game.
- The Cardinals sent the game into OT by virtue of an 18-play, 73-yard drive that resulted in QB Kyler Murray's 3-yard TD run. It marked the first time in nearly 26 years (19 plays on 9/29/96 vs. the St. Louis Rams) the Cardinals had a TD drive of 18+ plays.

GOING FOR 400 & 100 YET AGAIN

The Cardinals finished last week's game with 413 total yards, including 143 rushing yards. It was the 18th time under head coach Kliff Kingsbury that Arizona has had 400+ total yards and 100+ rushing yards in a game - and the Cardinals improved to 16-2 in those contests.

Dating back to 2019, only Baltimore (19) has more games with 400+ total yards and 100+ rushing yards than Arizona (18).

Dating back to 2007, the Cardinals are now 12-2-2 in 16 OT games – a win-ning percentage of .813. Arizona remains unbeaten in OT games (5-0-2) dating back to 2013.

KYLER DIRECTS THE COMEBACK

QB Kyler Murray put on a historic performance in leading the Cardinals second half comeback over the Raiders last week. In the second half/OT, he completed 25-of-40 pass attempts for 224 yards and a TD, while also rushing for 28 yards and a TD on five carries. He also ran for an unforgettable two-point conversion and threw for another.



It was an unprecedented performance for Murray, who became the first player

in NFL history to have a passing TD, rushing TD, a two-point conversion pass and a two-point conversion run in the same game.

On his remarkable two-point conversion run that lasted nearly 21 seconds, he ran a total distance of 84.9 yards according to NFL Next Gen Stats.

In the second half and OT, Murray accounted for 16 of the Cardinals 20 first downs. He threw for 11 first downs and all five of his rushing attempts resulted in first downs.

MURPHY WINS IT WITH A LONG RETURN

The score that won it in OT for the Cardinals last week was a 59-yard fumble return TD by CB Byron Murphy, Jr. On a 2nd-n-10 play from the AZ 39-yard line, Raiders WR Hunter Renfrow caught a one-yard pass when LB Isaiah Simmons laid a hard hit that forced the ball loose. Murphy picked up the fumble at the AZ 41-yard line and returned it for the gamewinning TD.

Murphy's 59-yard return is the longest OT fumble return TD in NFL history (regular season or postseason) - and just the second-ever of 50+ yards.

Murphy's TD was just the second OT fumble return TD in franchise history - and the first-ever during the regular season. The only other OT fumble return TD in franchise history was LB Karlos Dansby's 17-yarder off an Aaron Rodgers fumble in the ST 45 victory was Casen Powing the 2000 NEC Wild Condenses. fumble in the 51-45 victory vs. Green Bay in the 2009 NFC Wild Card matchup.

Murphy's game-winning TD against the Raiders was his second career TD. His first came on a 29-yard INT return at Jacksonville on 9/26/21. Murphy is now one of just four players in the NFL with both a INT return TD and fumble return TD over the last two seasons (2021-22), joining Darius Slay, Xavien Howard and Kevin Byard.

SUCCESS ON THE ROAD CONTINUES

After leading the NFL with a franchise single-season record eight road wins in 2021, the Cardinals started the 2022 road slate with a thrilling comeback victory over the Raiders last week.

Arizona now has an NFL-best 9-1 record on the road in the regular season dating back to 2021.

WATT MAKES IMPACTFUL RETURN

Playing his first regular season game since Week 7 of 2021, DL **J.J. Watt** tallied two tackles, a sack, a tackle for loss, a QB hit and pass defensed in the win over the Raiders last week.

He made a significant play in the team's fourth quarter comeback. Trailing 23-7, Arizona had just given the ball back to the Raiders on downs. Las Vegas took over at its own 11-yard line with 12:31 remaining. After a pair of incompletions, Watt batted down a Carr pass attempt on third down forcing a Raiders punt - on a possession that took just nine seconds off the clock. Arizona took over from there, scoring TDs on their final two possessions in regulation to force OT.

Watt sacked Raiders QB Derek Carr on the second offensive play of the game. Carr became the 42nd different QB Watt has sacked in his career.

DORTCH SCORES FIRST CAREER TOUCHDOWN - AND OTHER WEEK 2 NOTES

WR GREG DORTCH: Scored his first career TD in last Sunday's win over the Raiders, hauling in a five-yard catch in the third quarter. Prior to last week, Dortch's last TD came in his sophomore year at Wake Forest, when he had a 15-yard TD reception on 11/24/18 at Duke.

During his first four seasons (2018-21) in the NFL, Dortch spent time with five teams (Jets, Panthers, Rams, Falcons and Cardinals) and was released six different times. He appeared in just seven games with three receptions for 15 yards during that span. Through two games in 2022, he leads the team in both receptions (11) and receiving yards (118), has scored his first NFL TD and has 20 yards on three punt returns.

RB DARREL WILLIAMS: In his first season with the Cardinals after four years in Kansas City, Williams played a big role in the Cardinals historic comeback win after James Conner exited with an ankle injury. He led the team with 59 rushing yards on just eight attempts (7.4-yard avg) and scored his first TD of the season - all of it coming in the second half.

TE ZACH ERTZ: Led the Cardinals in receptions (8) and receiving yards (75) vs. Las Vegas, with five of his eight receptions resulting in first downs. It was Ertz's third game with at least eight receptions since joining the Cardinals. That is tied with Hall of Famer Jackie Smith (3) for the most such outings by a TE in franchise history – despite Ertz having played in just 13 games with Arizona.

LB ISAIAH SIMMONS: Did not start vs. the Raiders but came up with the game-winning forced fumble in OT. He forced the ball out with his huge hit on Raiders WR Hunter Renfrow - his former teammate at Clemson. It was the second time in his young career Simmons made a game-changing play in OT. In Week 7 of his rookie season in 2020, he intercepted Seahawks QB Russell Wilson in OT, leading to the game-winning FG on the ensuing possession.

LB ZAVEN COLLINS: The second-year LB made his eighth career start last Sunday and finished the contest with career highs in tackles (8) and solo tackles (5) while also adding his first career forced fumble.



ANOTHER GAME - ANOTHER 2021 PLAYOFF OPPONENT

After facing the Chiefs and Raiders in the first two weeks, the Cardinals return home to take on the defending Super Bowl LVI Champion Rams this week.

The Chiefs (AFC West title), Raiders (AFC Wild Card) and Rams (Super Bowl) all earned postseason berths in 2021.

The Cardinals are the only team in the NFL to start the 2022 campaign with three straight games against teams that made the playoffs last season.

CARDS DEBUT ALTERNATE HELMET

In their nationally televised preseason contest vs. the Baltimore Ravens, the Cardinals debuted their new alternate helmet, which was first unveiled in July. It was the first of three games this season in which the team will wear the alternate helmet.

For the Week 5 matchup vs. Philadelphia the alternate helmet will accompany the team's alternate black jersey. For the Week 7 clash with New Orleans, the Cardinals will wear the alternate helmet with their Color Rush uniform.

The alternate helmet has a shiny, gloss black shell with red flecks as well as a black facemask. It features iridescent chrome decals with a gradient screen of the team's Cardinal head logo as well as front and back bumpers displaying "ARIZONA" in black type.

CARDS EXTEND THEIR OWN IN 2022

The Cardinals gave out a number of high-profile contract extensions this offseason - beginning with head coach Kliff Kingsbury and GM Steve Keim in March, QB Kyler Murray in July, OL D.J. Humphries in August and S Jalen Thompson in September.

Murray (2019) and Humphries (2015) are former first-round draft picks by Arizona. The Cardinals selected Thompson in the 2019 Sup-plemental Draft. Keim has spent his entire professional career with the Cardinals and Kingsbury was made



an NFL head coach for the first time when he was hired by the team in 2019.

CARDINALS SIGNING CONTRACT EXTENSIONS IN 2022

<u>S Jalen Thompson:</u> On September 2nd, the Cardinals signed Thompson to a contract extension that keeps him in Arizona through the 2025 season.

Thompson set career highs last season in tackles (120), solo tackles (78), INTs (3), passes defensed (7) and tackles for loss (3). His 120 solo tackles led the team and were the second-most among all NFL defensive backs in 2021.

In his first three seasons with Arizona, Thompson appeared in 37 games (25 starts) and had 197 tackles, four interceptions, 11 passes defensed and three tackles for loss.

<u>**OL D.J. Humphries:**</u> On August 2nd, the Cardinals signed Humphries to a threeyear contract extension. It was the second contract extension Humphries signed with the Cardinals after previously agreeing to a three-year deal in 2020.

A captain each of the last three seasons, the 8th-year pro was selected to his first Pro Bowl in 2021 after starting all 16 games he appeared in at LT. He became the first Cards offensive tackle selected to the Pro Bowl since Lomas Brown in 1996.



 $\underline{\text{QB Kyler Murray:}}$ On July 21^{st} the Cardinals announced they had signed their signal-caller to the largest extension in franchise history.

The 25-year old Murray earned NFL Rookie of the Year honors (2019), is a two-time team captain and was named to the Pro Bowl twice (2020-21) in his first three seasons.

He became the first QB in franchise history to be named to the Pro Bowl twice in his first three seasons and joined Patrick Mahomes, Aaron Rodgers and Russell Wilson as the only NFL QBs named to the Pro Bowl in each of the last two seasons (2020-21).


GM Steve Keim & Head Coach Kliff Kingsbury: On March 2nd, the Cardinals signed both Keim and Kingsbury to contract extensions.

Now in his 24th season with Arizona and 10th as the team's GM, Keim has now signed three extensions since being promoted to his current post: February of 2015, February of 2018 and March of 2022.

This will mark the Cardinals first appearance as part of the Hard Knocks franchise, which originally launched in 2001

A REMATCH IN MEXICO CITY

Later this season the Cardinals will take on the San Francisco 49ers at Estadio Azteca in Mexico City on ESPN's Monday Night Football.

The Week 11 contest will serve as a rematch of the 2005 Cardinals-49ers game at Estadio Azteca which was the NFL's first regular season game held outside the United States.

The Cards earned a 31-14 win over the 49ers in that game in front of a then-record crowd of 103,467.

The Cardinals have a long history with international games and have participated in many global "firsts" for the league:



- The franchise played in the first NFL regular season game held outside the United States when they defeated the San Francisco 49ers 31-14 at Estadio Azteca in Mexico City on October 2, 2005.
- The team also played the first NFL game outside of North America on August 16, 1976 against the San Diego Chargers in Tokyo's Korakuen Stadium. The Cardinals won, 20-10.
- The first American football contest played on British soil was a tilt between the Cardinals and Minnesota Vikings in London's Wembley Stadium on August 6. 1983.







Located on The Great Lawn, the BetMGM Sportsbook at State Farm Stadium operates on both event and non-event days, offering guests a massive 265-square-foot video wall, 38 TVs and indoor-and-outdoor dining options.



"MR. B" ENTERS RING OF HONOR

In a halftime ceremony during the seasonopener vs. the Chiefs, the Cardinals in-ducted former owner **Bill Bidwill** into the team's Ring of Honor.

Bidwill, who passed away in October of 2019 at the age of 88, had a life-long association with the Cardinals which spanned eight decades. After his father, Hall of Fame owner Charles W. Bidwill, Sr. purchased the team, Bill worked as a ball boy when he was a child. Upon graduating from Georgetown University and serving proudly in the United States Navy, Bidwill took on a full-time role with the Cardinals in 1960.

While well-known for his understated



During his time as owner, Bidwill was also at the forefront of diversity in employment practices, which was evidenced by the hiring of the NFL's first African American female executive (Adele Harris), first African American contract negotiator (Bob Wallace) and first African American head coach/GM tandem (Dennis Green and Rod Graves). In 2015, the team established the Bill Bidwill Coaching Fellowship to increase diversity and provide opportunities to gain NFL coaching experience. At the 2010 annual NFL Combine in Indianapolis, Bidwill was honored with the Paul "Tank" Younger Award from the Fritz Pollard Alliance, whose purpose is to promote diversity and equality of job opportunity in the NFL.

SUPER BOWL RETURNS TO AZ

Valley Will Host 4th Super Bowl in February

The final game of the 2022 NFL season will take place in Arizona when State Farm Stadium plays host to Super Bowl LVII on Sunday, February 12, 2023.

It will be the fourth Super Bowl played in the state of Arizona and the third time the nation's most popular sporting event will be played at State Farm Stadium. The Cardinals home venue last staged the mega event when it hosted Su-

per Bowl XLIX following the 2014 season.

SUPER BOWL

Arizona joins South Florida, New Orleans, Los Angeles and Tampa Bay as the only sites selected to host the Super Bowl at least four times.

ECONOMIC IMPACT: The last time the game was staged in Arizona, it produced a record economic impact for the state. A 2015 study by the Seidman Research Institute, W.P. Carey School of Business at Arizona State University determined that Super Bowl XLIX, the 2015 Pro Bowl and related events produced a gross economic impact of \$719.4 million for the region. That was the largest economic impact of any special event ever held in Arizona. In addition to the games played in Glendale, more than 1 million people visited Verizon Super Bowl Central in downtown Phoenix and more than 500,000 people enjoyed events in downtown Scottsdale.

In a span of just over 26 months in 2015-17, State Farm Stadium hosted a Pro Bowl, Super Bowl, College Football National Championship Game and the NCAA Men's Final Four.


It was an unprecedented stretch for a stadium that generated \$1.3 billion in economic impact for the state during that 26-month span.

ELEVATING A FRANCHISE

The 2022 season marks the 16th with owner Michael Bidwill steering the organization. His leadership during that time has been instrumental in transforming the franchise both on and off the field.

- Highlights of Bidwill's tenure:

 Michael continues a tradition of Bidwill ownership of the Cardinals that dates back to his grandfather, Hall of Famer Charles Bidwill, who purchased the team in 1933.
- Of the franchise's seven all-time postseason wins, five have come during Michael's tenure leading the organization. Arizona has played in 10 postseason contests over the last 15 seasons, after having appeared in just seven total playoff games prior.



- Arizona has appeared in the NFC Championship Game twice since 2008 including a victory in the 2008 conference title game that led to the franchise's first-ever Super Bowl appearance (Super Bowl XLIII).
- With an 11-6 record in 2021, the Cardinals reached 11+ wins in a season for the sixth time in franchise history. Three of those six 11-win campaigns came with Michael leading the team: 13 in 2015, 11 in 2014, 11 in 2021.
- Among Bidwill's most substantial accomplishments with the Cardinals is the creation of State Farm Stadium. The world-class venue has proved a critical turning point for the franchise, an economic engine for the state of Arizona, and a crucial resource in the battle against the COVID-19 pandemic.
- At the conclusion of the 2022 season, State Farm Stadium will host Super Bowl LVII – the third Super Bowl held at the venue since it opened in 2006. State Farm Stadium also hosted Super Bowls XLII (following 2007 season) and XLIX (following 2014 season).
- In addition to his role in helping Arizona land three Super Bowls, Michael was also instrumental in getting the 2015 Pro Bowl moved to State Farm Stadium; played a week before Super Bowl XLIX, the two events combined to deliver a record economic impact of \$720 million to the region.
- Since State Farm Stadium opened in 2006, the Cardinals have sold out 155 games at the venue (which is every non-pandemic game played there).
- During the 2022 season, the Cardinals will make their first-ever appearance on *Hard Knocks*, television's most acclaimed sports reality franchise. Arizona will be the second team to be featured on *Hard Knocks In Season*, which will document the second half of the Cardinals season in real time.
- In January of 2016, the National Football Foundation (NFF) and College Hall of Fame inducted Bidwill and Governor Doug Ducey into the NFF Leadership

75TH ANNIVERSARY OF HISTORIC SEASON

The 2022 season marks the 75th anniversary of the Cardinals historic 1947 season. It was a year in which Violet Bidwill made league history and one that ultimately ended in the team winning an NFL Championship.

The Cardinals suffered a big loss after team owner **Charles Bidwill** - having just recently put the finishing touches on his "Dream Backfield" with the un-precedented signing of All-American running back Charley Trippi - passed away in April. He had run the franchisé since purchasing it in 1933 and

was credited with pulling the team - and on a larger scale the NFL - through the Great Depression.

With the passing of Charles, his wife, Violet Bidwill, took over as team owner. It was a historic moment, as she became the first female owner in NFL history and one of the first females to serve as a primary owner in professional sports.

She was a wonderful person and was in a tough situation with losing her husband at a young age," Violet's grandson, current Cardinals owner **Michael Bidwill**, said. "She decided she would take over the family businesses."

"Things worked out well," then-team president Ray Benningsen said of the front office under Violet. "I ran the business end of it, (head coach) Jimmy (Conzelman) ran the team on the field and we both appreciated Vi's (Violet) counsel. I'll tell you one thing. She knew her football and she was a shrewd businesswoman.

"She didn't suffer fools, and she was right there in the meetings with the rest of the owners and held her own," said Michael Bidwill.

Violet Bidwill's first year of ownership saw the franchise win the NFL Champion-ship after defeating the Philadelphia Eagles 28-21 in the Championship Game.

Violet Bidwill served as Cardinals owner from 1947 through her death in 1962, having engineered the team's move to St. Louis in 1960.

KEIM HAS BUILT SOME OF THE BEST

After 14 seasons working within the Cardinals personnel department, Steve Keim was elevated to GM on January 8, 2013.

AMONG THE NFL'S BEST IN 2021

In 2021, the Cardinals posted an 11-6 record and secured their first playoff berth since 2015.

In addition to winning 11 games during the regular season, the Cardinals also ranked in the top 10 in both offensive points scored and defensive points allowed per game.

CARDINALS HIGHLIGHTS IN KEIM'S TENURE

- The 2021 season marked the fourth time in his tenure the Cardinals have won 10+ games. That includes the 2015 season when Arizona won a franchise record 13 games and earned its first-ever postseason bye.
- During Keim's tenure, Arizona has established franchise records for wins in a season (13 in 2015), points in a season (489 in 2015), led the NFL in total offense for the first time in team history (#1 in 2015) and led the NFL in sacks for the second time ever (48.0 in 2016).
- Arizona has featured a top-10 defense four times and a top-10 offense four times dating back to Keim's first season as GM. The Cardinals had a top-10 defense in three consecutive seasons (2015-17) for the first time since the 1970 merger. In 2021, Arizona ranked 10th in the NFL in offensive points scored (435) and eighth in defensive points allowed (349).
- Selected QB Kyler Murray with the #1 overall pick in the 2019 NFL Draft. Murray was named the 2019 NFL Offensive Rookie of the Year and followed up with Pro Bowl selections in each of the last two years (2020-21), becoming the first QB in team history to earn multiple Pro Bowls in his first three seasons.
- The 2021 free agency period was one of Keim's busiest as GM. The players the Cardinals acquired have a combined 20 Pro Bowl selections and 11 All-Pro nods. Arizona brought in five different Pro Bowlers in the offseason: DL J.J. Watt, WR A.J. Green, OL Rodney Hudson, K Matt Prater and RB James Conner. Conner was selected to the Pro Bowl in 2021.
- Named Sporting News 2014 NFL Executive of the Year and earned backto-back NFL Executive of the Year honors from Pro Football Talk (2013-14).



CARDS COMING OFF 11-WIN SEASON IN '21

The Cardinals finished the 2021 regular season with an 11-6 record.

It marked just the sixth time in franchise history Arizona won at least 11 games in a season, with half of those coming during Michael Bidwill's 15 seasons [2007-21] running the team.

Kliff Kingsbury became the fifth coach in franchise history to win 11+ games in a season.

The Cardinals scored 30+ points in a game AND allowed 20 points or less in the same game six times last season, tied for the most in the NFL. Arizona, Buffalo and Tampa Bay were the only teams in the NFL in 2021 that had six games in which the team did both.

The Cardinals scored 30+ points in a game nine times in 2021, tied for the second-highest total in the NFL behind only Tampa Bay (10). Arizona allowed 20 points or fewer eight times, tied for eighth in the NFL.

A REMARKABLE TURNAROUND IN THE DESERT

When he took over the Cardinals in 2019, head coach **Kliff Kingsbury** inherited a team with the league's worst record and one of the NFL's least-productive offenses.

The Cardinals had an NFL-low three wins and were ranked last in nearly every offensive category in 2018. In 2021, Arizona secured a playoff spot, posted 11 wins in the regular season and ranked in the top-10 in total offense, passing offense and rushing offense.



On the first day of the 2022 NEL Draft. the Cardinals sent their first-round pick (#23 overall) to the Baltimore Ravens in exchange for WR Marquise "Hollywood" **Brown** and the Ravens '22 third-round pick (#100 overall)

Baltimore's first round pick (25th overall) in the 2019 NFL Draft, Brown has 205 receptions for 2,472 yards and 22 TDs in 48 games (43 starts) in his career. The 25-year old set career highs with 91 receptions for 1,008 yards last season while starting all 16 games in which he played.

Has also played in three postseason games and totaled 18 receptions for 322 yards.



Since he entered the league in 2019, only two players in the NFL have more TD receptions of 20+ yards (11) and 40+ yards than Brown (7).

- BROWN'S TD CONNECTIONS

 Dating back to his two seasons (2017-18) at Oklahoma, Brown has 39 TD receptions, 38 of which have come from three different Heisman Trophy winning QBs (Kyler Murray, Baker Mayfield, Lamar Jackson) and the other coming from QB **Trace McSorley** - his former teammate in Baltimore and current teammate with the Cardinals.
- Of his 17 TD receptions at Oklahoma, 11 came from Murray including Brown's first TD with the Sooners (87-yarder from Kyler on 9/16/17 vs. Tulane)
- Brown's 11 TD catches from Murray at Oklahoma averaged 51.0 yards. Only one covered fewer than 20 yards and seven covered 50+ yards.

THE RELATIONSHIP RUNS DEEP

WR Marquise Brown received his nickname "Hollywood" during his time at the University of Oklahoma. It was with the Sooners that Brown met - and became best friends with - Cardinals QB Kyler Murray.

Brown and Murray played together with the Sooners for two seasons (2017-18), including in 2018 when Brown had 75 receptions for 1,318 yards and 10 TDs. That season, Brown led the nation in receptions of 40+ yards (11), 50+ yards (7) and 60+ yards (4) and Murray won the Heisman Trophy.



They were both selected in the first round of the 2019 NFL Draft - Murray #1 overall to Arizona and Brown #25 overall to Baltimore. Even though they were not playing together, the two continued to work out together in the offseason.

"In college you go through more with your quarterback than in the NFL," Brown said of the tight bond. "Me and Kyler, we got in together, we were on the 'B' squad against the starting defense (at Oklahoma) to all the way to both of us playing.

MOORE READY FOR BIG LEAP IN YEAR TWO

Despite playing just 14 games in a limited role as a rookie last season, WR Ron-

dale Moore totaled 973 all-purpose yards: 435 receiving; 76 rushing; 171 punt return; 291 kickoff return. That tied for eighth among NFL rookies in 2021.

Despite his success last season - including a franchise single-game rookie record 11 catches at Seattle in Week 11 and scoring the Cardinals longest TD of the year in Week 2 vs. Minnesota (77-yard TD catch) - much is being expected of the second-year pro in 2022.

"We utilized him in different ways than we will this year," head coach Kliff Kingsbury said this offseason. "But he's a dynamic route runner. I think that's what people are going to see. He's really good getting out of his cuts, good at the top of routes, so I think people are going to see a different side of him.

Originally set a goal of \$200,000 but within 19 days, more than 200,000 individuals collectively donated \$37 million to the cause. Contributions continued, and the final tally reached \$41.6 million.

SIMMONS LOOKS FOR STARRING ROLE

Following a standout season in 2021, third-year LB Isaiah Simmons - the Cardinals first round (8th overall) pick in the 2020 NFL Draft - is expected to make another big leap this season.

A rare athlete for his position, Simmons is one of the fastest players on the team - having run a 4.39 40yard dash at the 2020 NFL Combine.

He will continue to be used all over the field in 2022. seeing action at LB, nickel and safety according to de-fensive coordinator Vance Joseph.

"He's a big man who can tackle, run and chase, he can blitz, he could play that edge," Jospeh said at the start of training camp. "But also he's covered guys in the slot like CeeDee Lamb and those guys and he likes it. That's different from most linebackers. Right now

he is our STAR: star linebacker or safety, whatever you want to call him."

In 2021 Simmons proved to be the versatile defensive weapon the Cardinals hoped he would be. <u>He finished the regular season with 103 tackles</u>, <u>7 passes</u> defensed, an INT, 4 forced fumbles, 4 tackles for loss, 4 QB hits and 1.5 sacks.

Simmons become the first Cardinals defender since Tim McDonald in 1988 to have 100+ tackles and 4+ forced fumbles in a season.

He also joined Colts All-Pro LB Darius Leonard as the only players in the NFL last season with 100+ tackles, 4+ forced fumbles and 7+ passes defensed.

ALLEN BECOMES A PLAYMAKER ON "D"

Like LB Isaiah Simmons - DL **Zach Allen** is a young defender who had a breakout season for the Cardinals in 2021. Selected in the third round (65th overall) of the 2019 NFL Draft, Allen emerged as a playmaker last season.

In 15 games (14 starts) last season, Allen established career highs in tackles (48), sacks (4.0), tackles for loss (5), QB hits (14), passes defensed (4), fumble recoveries (3) and also recorded his first career INT. Allen had twice as many sacks in 2021 (4.0) as he had in his first two years combined (2.0) while also more than doubling his previous career high for QB hits (from 6 in 2020 to 13 in 2021). Sean Harlow – Atlanta's fourth round (136th overall) selection of the 2017 NFL Draft and has appeared in 18 games (six starts) for the Falcons (2019) and Cardinals (2021-2022).

Will Hernandez – New York Giants 2018 second round (34th overall) draft choice, started 58 of the 64 games he has appeared in for the Giants and Cardinals. SIgned with Arizona as a free agent in March 2022.

Rodney Hudson – A 12-year NFL veteran, three-time Pro Bowler (2016-17,'19) and 2019 second-team All-Pro selection was acquired by the Cardinals in a trade with the Las Vegas Raiders in March of 2021.

D.J. Humphries – Cardinals first-round pick (24th overall) in the 2015 NFL Draft out of Florida, has started all 77 NFL games played, including all 67 at LT since 2019.

Josh Jones – Arizona's 2020 third-round pick (72nd overall) out of Houston where he started all 45 games he played at LT in four seasons (2016-19) for the Cougars. Has played 32 games (12 starts) for the Cardinals during his first three NFL seasons.

Justin Pugh – Has started 115-of-116 games played with the Giants (2013-17) and Cardinals (2018-22) since entering the league as a first-round pick (19th overall) in the 2013 NFL Draft. His 115 starts have come at left guard (69), right tackle (38), right guard (7) and left tackle (1).

Lecitus Smith – Arizona's second pick in the sixth-round (215th overall) of the 2022 NFL Draft out of Virginia Tech, where he appeared in 45 games at guard and left tackle. Was originally recruited to play tight end.

Aaron Brewer – Entered the league with the Broncos as a rookie free agent and has played 148 regular season and eight playoff games with Denver (2012-15) and Arizona (2016-22).

Andy Lee – The four-time All-Pro joined Arizona in 2017 after playing for the 49ers (2004-14), Browns (2015) and Panthers (2016). Ranks third in NFL history in career punting yards (65,248).

Matt Prater – Two-time Pro Bowler (2013, '16) and NFL record-holder for FGs of 50+ yards (66). Joined Arizona in 2021 after 14 seasons with the Lions, Broncos and Falcons.

Michael Dogbe – Selected by Arizona with its second pick in the seventh round (249th overall) of the 2019 NFL Draft out of Temple. Has appeared in 29 games (two starts) in his NFL career.

Leki Fotu – Cardinals first pick in the fourth round (114th overall) of the 2020 NFL Draft. Has appeared in 30 games (three starts) for the Cardinals during his first three NFL seasons. Family hails from the island of Tonga.

Rashard Lawrence – Arizona's second pick in the fourth-round (131st overall) of the 2020 NFL Draft out of LSU, where he was a three-time team captain including for LSU's 2019 National Championshp team.

Jonathan Ledbetter – Originally sigend with Miami as an undrafted free agent in 2019, has played in three NFL games with the Dolphins and Cardinals.

J.J. Watt – Five-time first-team All-Pro, five-time Pro Bowl selection, three-time NFL Defensive Player of the Year and 2017 Walter Payton NFL Man of the Year. Signed a two-year contract with Arizona in 2021 after 10 years in Houston.

LINEBACKERS

Zaven Collins – Selected by the Cardinals in the first round (16th overall) of the 2021 NFL Draft out of Tulsa where he received the Bronko Nagurski Trophy, the Chuck Bednarik Award and the Lombardi Award.

Victor Dimukeje – Selected by Arizona with their first pick of the sixth round (210th overall) of the 2021 NFL Draft out of Duke. Earned All-ACC honors as a junior and senior and named a semifinalist for the 2020 Lott IMPACT Trophy.

Dennis Gardeck – Named a Pro Bowl alternate on special teams in 2019 and selected as a team captain each of the last three seasons (2020-22). Signed by Arizona as a rookie free agent out of Sioux Falls in 2018 and has played 60 games in five seasons.

Markus Golden – Arizona's 2015 second-round pick (58th overall) out of Missouri has appeared in 96 games for the Cardinals (2015-18; 2020-22) and Giants (2019-20). Led the Arizona defense with 11.0 total sacks during the 2021 season.

Devon Kennard – Nine-year NFL veteran and Phoenix native has played 113 games (72 starts) with the Giants (2014-17), Lions (2018-19) and Cardinals (2020-22) after being selected by New York in the fifth-round (174th overall) of the 2014 NFL Draft.

Ben Niemann – Undrafted free agent out of Iowa, signed with Kansas City in 2018 and appeared in 64 games with the Chiefs (2018-21) and Cardinals (2022) and was a member of the Super Bowl LIV championship team.

Myjai Sanders – Selected by Arizona with its second pick in the third round (100th overall) of the 2022 NFL Draft out of Cincinnati. Finished 2021 leading the AAC with 62 total QB pressures and was a two-time first-team AAC selection (2020-21).

Isaiah Simmons – Named to the 2020 PFWAAII-Rookie team after being selected eighth by the Cardinals out of Clemson. One of two NFL players with 100+ tackles, 4+ forced fumbles and 7+ passes defensed last season.

Cameron Thomas – Arizona's first pick in the third-round (87th overall) of the 2022 NFL Draft out of San Diego State. Last season he led the conference with 11.5 sacks, 21 QB hurries and tied the conference record with 20.5 tackles for loss.

Ezekiel Turner – Signed with Arizona as an undrafted rookie free agent out of Washington in 2018. Has blocked two punts and has 44 special teams tackles in 51 career games.

Tanner Vallejo – Buffalo's 2017 sixth-round (195th overall) pick out of Boise State has played 67 games with Buffalo (2017), Cleveland (2018), Washington (2019) and Arizona (2019-22).

Nick Vigil – Signed a one-year contract with Arizona in the offseason. Spent first six seasons with the Vikings (2021), Chargers (2020) and Bengals (2016-19).

DEFENSIVE BACKS

Budda Baker – Arizona's 2017 second-round pick (36th overall) out of Washington is a four-time Pro Bowler (2017, '19-21), three-time team captain (2020-22) and a 2020 first-team All-Pro honors.

Christian Matthew – Arizona's first pick in the seventh-round (244th overall) of the 2022 NFL Draft out of Valdosta State becoming the sixth player to be drafted in school history.

Trayvon Mullen Jr. – Las Vegas' second round (40th overall) selection of the 2019 NFL Draft and has appeared in 37 games (31 starts) since entering the NFL. Was teammates with Isaiah Simmons at Clemson.

Byron Murphy Jr. –Scottsdale native and Arizona's 2019 second-round pick (33rd overall) out of Washington. Has recorded 198 tackles, five INTs and 30 passes defensed in 49 games (41 starts) during his first four NFL seasons.

Deionte Thompson – Arizona's 2019 fifth-round pick (139th overall) out of Alabama where he was a consensus first-team All-American. Has 49 tackles (34 solo) and three passes defensed in 43 games (six starts) during his first four seasons.

Jalen Thompson – Selected by Arizona in the fifth-round of the 2019 NFL Supplemental Draft out of Washington State. Signed a three-year contract extension in September 2022.

Marco Wilson – Selected by Arizona in the fourth-round (136th overall) of the 2021 NFL Draft out of Florida. Has started 15 of 16 games played so far in his NFL career.

Kansas City Chiefs 14 Arizona Cardinals 0

The Cardinals opened the 2022 regular season against the Kansas City Chiefs at State Farm Stadium. The contest reunited AZ head coach Kliff Kingsbury with KC quarterback Patrick Mahomes, whom he recruited to Texas Tech and coached for three seasons there. On this particular afternoon, it was the pupil who led his team to victory with an impressive passing effort. The 2018 league MVP threw for 360 yards and 5 touchdowns with no INTs in steering the Chiefs to a 44-21 win. Kansas City jumped out early with TDs on their first three drives and never looked back. Playing without several regular starters – including DE JJ Watt, WR DeAndre Hopkins, G Justin Pugh – the Cards battled and late in the first half had opportunities to make it a one score game but could not take advantage of them. The victory gave the Chiefs their eight consecutive season with a week 1 win while the Cardinals fell in the regular season opener for the first time in four seasons under Kingsbury and QB Kyler Murray.

Kansas City received the opening kickoff and proceeded to move 75 yards in 11 plays as Mahomes capped the drive with a 9-yard TD pass to TE Travis Kelce. The next Chiefs drive was equally effective, covering 86 yards in 7 plays. It ended on a Mahomes shovel pass to RB Clyde Edwards-Helaire for a 3-yard score that made it 14-0 late in the opening quarter. The Cards desperately needed a scoring drive and Murray delivered. He completed 4 of 5 pass attempts on the ensuing series, the biggest of which was a 24-yarder to WR Greg Dortch that moved it to the KC35. Shortly thereafter, Kyler scampered 21 yards up the middle to the 2, setting up James Conner's TD run that cut the lead in half at 14-7 two minutes into the second quarter. The next drive saw the Chiefs move 71 yards in 10 plays before facing a 4th-n-2 at the 4; KC went for it and Edwards-Helaire's 4-yard completion from Mahomes made it 20-7 after the PAT failed. With 1:05 to go in the half, the Chiefs continued to lead by 13 and took over at their own 20. On the first play from scrimmage, Mahomes connected with WR Juju Smith-Schuster before LB Dennis Gardeck forced a fumble that CB Byron Murphy recovered at the KC43 with :58 left. AZ soon faced a 4th-n-2 at the 34 but turned it over on downs when Murray's pass attempt was incomplete. The Chiefs quickly moved into position for a 54-yard FG try from Harrison Butker, who returned to action after exiting the game via cart in the first quarter. The kick was good and Kansas City took a 23-7 lead into the halftime locker room.

Kansas City's opening possession of the second half also resulted in a TD, this one a 1-yard pass from Mahomes to TE Jody Fortson. The Chiefs increased their lead to 37-7 late in the third on Mahomes' fifth TD pass of the day, this one a 2-yarder to WR Mecole Hardman. Early in the fourth, Murray's 2-yard TD pass to new Cardinals WR – and Murray's former Oklahoma teammate – Marquise Brown was followed by a successful two-point toss to TE Zach Ertz that made it 37-15. After a TD run by Chiefs RB Isiah Pacheco capped the next KC possession, Ertz's 6-yard TD catch from Murray provided the game's final score with

WEEK 2 Arizona Cardinals 29, Las Vegas Raiders 23 (OT) 61,707 Allegiant Stadium Sep 18, 2022

The Cardinals made their first-ever appearance at Allegiant Field for a week 2 showdown with the Raiders and it was one for the ages. Vegas jumped out to a 20-0 halftime lead and led 23-7 after 3 quarters. But the gritty Cardinals battled back. And QB Kyler Murray engineered one of the greatest and most improbable comebacks in franchise history. Arizona would score the game's final 22 points, send the contest to overtime with a TD and 2-point conversion as regulation expired, and win it in the extra period with the longest OT return of a fumble in NFL history. It was the franchise's biggest comeback since 1999 and 5th largest ever; it was also the greatest comeback ever against the Raiders.

While the game ended in thrilling fashion for Arizona, its beginning was inauspicious. The Raiders took the opening kickoff, moved 75 yards in 15 plays and Derek Carr's 1-yard TD pass to WR Davante Adams made it 7-0. The next Vegas drive reached the AZ12 in 8 plays before Daniel Carlson's 32-yard FG made it 10-0. The Raiders increased it to 17-0 on their next possession when Carr capped a 7-play, 59-yard drive with his 3-yard scoring pass to TE Darren Waller. With just over 2 minutes to go in the first half, the Cards faced a 3rd-n-2 at the LV42 when Murray's pass attempt to Hollywood Brown was intercepted by CB Amik Robertson. The return set Vegas up at its own 27 with 1:51 to go. That was enough time to move into position for a 55-yard Carlson FG as the half expired that made it 20-0 at intermission. In their history, the Cardinals were 0-88-1 in games they trailed by 20+ points at halftime.

The AZ comeback began on its 2nd offensive series of the 3rd quarter. Murray completed 5 of 7 passes for 66 yards and ended the 79-yard drive with a scoring pass to WR Greg Dortch, a 5-yarder that was his first NFL TD catch. A 47-yard pass interference penalty on the ensuing Vegas possession led to a 25-yard Carlson FG that made it 23-7 late in the 3rd quarter. Two minutes into the 4th, the Cards trailed by 16 but were at the LV11 when they went for it on 4th-n-1. It ended there, though, as Murray's pass was just beyond the reach of TE Zach Ertz. However, 3 straight incompletions led to a punt and more importantly took just 9 seconds off the clock. An 18-yard Dortch punt return set AZ up at its own 46 with 12:07 to play. Murray marched the Cards to the LV25 where they faced a 4th-n-4 midway thru the 4th and down 16. They went for it and converted when Brown made a spectacular 1-handed grab at the 1. A play later, RB Darrel Williams punched it in and the Cards went for 2. What happened on that try was unforgettable and vintage Murray: the 0B kept the pass play alive for 20 seconds, snaking around in the backfield for almost 85 total yards before finally outracing the defense to the pylon for a successful conversion. After another Vegas punt, the Cards took over at their own 27, down 8 with 4:43 to play. Needing to cover 73 yards and another 2-point conversion to force OT, AZ soon faced a 4th-n-1 at the LV43. A Murray scramble picked it up. With :30 left it was 4th-n-4 at the 6 when a defensive holding foul kept the drive going. It set up a 1st-n-goal at the 3 but after 3 incompletions it was 4th-n-goal from there with time for one more shot. Murray again delivered, scrambling to his left and into the end zone to cap the incredible 18-play drive. AZ still needed a 2-point conversion to send the game to OT and a delay penalty pushed the try back to the 7. It didn't matter. Murray fired a dart to WR AJ Green in the back of the end zone and the game was tied.

AZ won the OT coin toss and advanced to the LV37. They went for it on 4th-n-1 from there but Brown could not hold onto a Murray pass down the left side and the Raiders took over. On the edge of FG range, they faced 2nd-n-10 at the AZ39 when Carr hit WR Hunter Renfrow with a short pass but LB Isaiah Simmons dislodged the ball with a devastating hit. CB Byron Murphy scooped the loose ball and returned it 59 yards down the sideline to clinch the amazing comeback victory.
