



ARIZONA CARDINALS NOTE CARDS

- 25** Passes defended for the Cardinals this season. Only Jacksonville (32) and Philadelphia (26) have more. Arizona has had 13 different players record at least one pass defended, including rookie **CBs WILL JOHNSON** (4 PD) and **DENZEL BURKE** (3 PD) who both rank in the top five of passes defended among rookies.
- 3** Career rushing touchdowns for **RB EMARI DEMERCADO** which have covered 113 total yards (53, 49, 11), an average of 37.7 yards per TD. From 2023-25, only Saquon Barkley (4 on 669 carries), Jonathan Taylor (4 on 549 carries), James Cook (3 on 519 carries), and De'Von Achane (3 on 356 carries) had more rushing TDs of 45+ yards than Demercado (2 on just 86 carries).
- 11** All-time made FGs of 57+ yards in Cardinals history. **K CHAD RYLAND** is responsible for three of those (57, 57 and 58 yards), all of which have come in his last 14 games played.
- 96** Rushing yards allowed per game by the Cardinals through the first four weeks of the season. This is tied for the eighth-best mark across the NFL.

MILESTONE WATCH

WITH A WIN...

- Arizona would earn its fourth consecutive victory over the Titans and improve to 7-2 all-time against AFC South teams at State Farm Stadium.
- The Cardinals would improve to 4-2 at home vs. Tennessee.
- The Cardinals would improve to 2-1 at home in 2025 and 7-2 in their last nine games at State Farm Stadium.

MILESTONES WITHIN REACH...

QB KYLER MURRAY

- With a rushing TD, Murray would tie Stump Mitchell (32) for sixth place on the franchise all-time list for career rushing TDs.
- With 3 TD passes, Murray would have 16 career outings with 3+ TD passes. That would pass Neil Lomax (15) for the most such outings in franchise history.

WR MARVIN HARRISON JR.

- With two receptions, Harrison (80 rec., 10 TD) would join Larry Fitzgerald (98 rec., 12 TD) as the only players in franchise history to record at least 80 receptions and 10 touchdowns in their first 22 career games.
- With a TD reception, it would give him four TD receptions in his last six games and a TD reception in back-to-back games for the third time in his career (Weeks 2-4 of 2024 and Week 18 of 2024 - Week 1 of 2025).

TE TREY MCBRIDE

- With 5+ receptions this week, McBride would have at least five receptions in seven consecutive games for the second time in his career. It would be the longest streak by an active TE and tied for the sixth-longest streak by a TE in NFL history. He would also join Travis Kelce, Tony Gonzalez and Jason Witten as the only TEs in NFL history to record multiple streaks of 7-or-more games with 5+ receptions.

DL CALAIS CAMPBELL

- With 1.0 sack, Campbell (114.5) would tie former Cardinals DE J.J. Watt (114.5) for 24th place on the NFL's all-time sacks list.
- With 1.0 sack of Titans QB Cam Ward, he would become the 57th different QB that Campbell has sacked during his career. Ward would also become the 13th former #1 overall pick he has sacked.
- With 2 QB hits, Campbell (8) would have the most QB hits in the first five games of a season during his 10 years (2008-16; '25) playing for the Cardinals. It would be tied for the second-most through the first five weeks of a season in his career.

LB JOSH SWEAT

- With 1.0 sack, Sweat would have at least 1.0 sack in four consecutive games for just the second time in his career: 5 straight (Games 11-15) in 2022. His current streak is tied for the second-longest active streak in the NFL behind Giants OLB Brian Burns and Rams OLB Byron Young (four games).

BIRDS' EYE VIEW

WILSON MAKING AN IMPACT

- LB MACK WILSON SR.** is off to a hot start in his second season in the desert, leading the team with 35 tackles, tied for 11th in the NFL. He is currently the only player in the NFL this season with at least 35 tackles and four passes defended.
- Wilson is on pace to record 140+ tackles this season which would be the most by a Cardinals LB since Ronald McKinnon had 144 tackles in 2001. He would also be the first linebacker to crack the 100-tackle mark since Jordan Hicks in 2021.



CALAIS CAN'T BE CONTAINED

Through four games, **DL CALAIS CAMPBELL** has recorded 14 tackles, 3.0 sacks, 4 tackles for loss and 6 QB hits. His 6 QB hits are a team high while his 3.0 sacks and 4 tackles for loss are both tied for the team lead. The 2025 campaign marks just the fourth time in Campbell's 18 NFL seasons – and first time since 2019 – he has had at least 3.0 sacks through the first four games: 3.0 in 2019; 3.0 in 2018; 5.5 in 2017. His 3.0 sacks are tied for the most among all NFL interior defensive linemen this season.



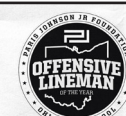
CARDS IN THE COMMUNITY

NEW TRAINING FACILITY ON THE WAY IN 2028



The Cardinals have updated their plans for a new training facility, announcing on Tuesday they will build their new headquarters at Paradise Ridge in north Phoenix, west of Scottsdale Road and north of the Loop 101.

The Cardinals new training facility and business operations will anchor the mixed-use development site, occupying 30 acres and over 250,000 square feet. It is scheduled to be completed in 2028.

It will feature three natural-grass outdoor practice fields and a fieldhouse with a full-size turf field indoors. Additional elements of the new, world-class training facility will include a greatly expanded and modern locker room and state-of-the-art team spaces for athletic training, sports medicine and strength and conditioning in addition to updated dining areas, meeting rooms, a player lounge and more.

The new headquarters are being designed by Rossetti, a leading sports architecture firm that has worked with a number of NFL teams on new facilities.
