- Consecutive starts in which QB **Jacoby Brissett** has at least one TD pass this season. He is the only QB in franchise history to begin his career with at least one TD pass in each of his first 11 starts with
- Consecutive games in which WR Michael Wilson has at least one TD reception. Prior to his current four-game stretch, Wilson last had a TD reception in four straight games during his senior year at Chaminade High School in West Hills, CA (Games 2-5 of 2017).
- Players who have appeared in at least one game for the Cardinals this season. That is the most in the NFL while facing the NFL's toughest schedule based on opponent winning percentage (.577%).
- Tackles for S **Budda Baker** this season. The 2025 season marks his sixth 100-tackle campaign, his second in a row and his third in the last four years. Baker's 111 tackles also rank 3rd among all NFL DBs in 2025 behind only Raiders S Jeremy Chinn and Colts S Nick Cross (both with 114).

MILESTONES WITHIN REACH...

TE TREY McBRIDE

- With 5 receptions, McBride would have 5+ catches in his 10th consecutive road game. That would tie the longest streak in NFL history by a TE: McBride (10 straight in 2023-24) and Travis Kelce (10 straight in 2019-20).
- With 3 receptions, McBride (343) would pass WR Anquan Boldin (342) for the most catches by a Cardinals player in his first four seasons.
- With 32 receiving yards, McBride (1,206) would break the franchise single-season record for receiving yards by a TE. The current record of 1,205 was set by Hall of Famer Jackie Smith in 1967.
- With 1 TD reception, McBride would have 12 TD catches in 2025. That would quadruple his previous career high for a single season (3 in 2023) and double his TD reception total from his first three seasons (6 from 2022-24) combined.

QB JACOBY BRISSETT

- With 200+ passing yards and 2+ TDs, he would become the first Cardinals QB in Franchise history to have 10+ games with at least 200 yards and 2 TDs in a season. He would also tie Hall of Famers Kurt Warner (1999 with STL) and Peyton Manning (2012 with Den) for the most such games in a player's first 12 starts with a team.
- With 123 passing yards, Brissett (3,246) would pass Kurt Warner (3,245 in 2005-06) for the most passing yards by a Cardinals QB in his first 12 starts with the team.
- With 2 TD passes, Brissett would have his 10th outing with multiple TD passes this season. In franchise history only Carson Palmer (11 in 2015) would have more such games in a single season.

LB JOSH SWEAT

- With 1.0 sack, Sweat would have 12.0 sacks in 2025. That would establish a new career high for the 8th-year pro (11.0 in 2022 w/ Eagles).
- With 2.0 sacks, Sweat (4) would join Simeon Rice (6 in 1999; 4 in 1998), Chander Jones (4 in 2017 & 2019) and Curtis Greer (4 in 1983) as the only players in franchise history to have at least four games with 2.0+ sacks in a single season.

WR MICHAEL WILSON

- With 1 TD reception, Wilson would have at least one TD catch in five consecutive games. That would tie for the second-longest streak in franchise history behind only Anquan Boldin (6 straight in 2008).
- With 97 receiving yards, Wilson would become just the 16th different player in Cardinals history to have 1,000+ receiving yards in a season. Combined with TE Trey McBride (enters Week 18 with 1,174 yards) it would mark just the sixth time in franchise history - and the first time since 2015 (Larry Fitzgerald; John Brown) - Arizona had multiple 1,000-yard receivers in a single season.

S BUDDA BAKER

- With 6 tackles, Baker (1,000) would join Vikings S Harrison Smith (1,168) as the only active DBs in the NFL with 1,000+ career tackles. He would become just the 15th DB in NFL history to reach 1,000 tackles and the fastest to accomplish the feat (138 games) ahead of Lawyer Milloy (150 games).
- With 5 tackles on Sunday, he would tie Yeremiah Bell (34 games in 2008-10) for the second-longest streak of games with 5+ tackles by a DB in NFL history. He has the second-longest active streak in the NFL behind Commanders LB Bobby Wagner (44 games)

DL CALAIS CAMPBELL

- With 1.0 sack, Campbell would have 7.5 sacks in 2025. That would mark his highest single-season total since he had 10.5 sacks with the Jaguars in 2018.
- With 1.5 sacks, Campbell would have 13.5 sacks vs. the Rams. That would tie the Seahawks for the most against any single opponent in his career.

CB DENZEL BURKE

With an INT, Burke would have four INTs in 2025. He would join CBs Patrick Peterson (4 in 2011), Dominique Rodgers-Cromartie (4 in 2008) and HOFer Aeneas Williams (6 in 1991) as the only Cardinals rookies since 1988 (when the team moved to AZ) to have 4+ INTs in a season.

RE-WRITING THE RECORD BOOK

TE **Trey McBride** will ring in the new year by wrapping up his historic 2025 season this week in Los Angeles near the top of the league in every major receiving statistical category. Entering Week 18, he is tied for 1st in receptions (119), tied for 2nd in TD receptions (11) and 6th in receiving yards Notable records from this season include...

Broke the single-season reception record by a TE with 119 through 16 games, surpassing Zach Ertz's previous record of 116 in 2018.

Became the first TE in NFL history to have back-to-hark seasons with 100 back-to-back seasons with 100+ receptions. Recorded the longest streak of games with

at least five receptions by a TE in NFL history with 16 such games, surpassing Travis Kelce's previous record of 15 set in 2018.

His 340 career receptions are the most by an NFL tight end in his first four seasons.

Became the first TE in NFL history to reach 100+ receptions, 1,000+ receiving yards and 10+TD receptions in 14 games or fewer.

Set the franchise single-season record for receptions (119) passing DeAndre Hopkins (115 in 2020).

Became the first Cardinals player to have 110+ receptions, 1,150+ yds and 10+ TDs in a season.

Broke the franchise single-season record for TD receptions by a TE (11) ahead of Jackie Smith's 9 TDs in 1967

Joined WR Larry Fitzgerald (2015-17) as the only Cardinals players ever with 100+ receptions & 1,000+ receiving vards in consecutive seasons.

One of two players (Fitzgerald - 4 in 2017) in franchise history with 4+ games of 10+ receptions in a single season.

FITZGERALD ON CANTON WATCH



This week, the Pro Football Hall of Fame released the list of 15 Modern Era players who advanced to the Finalist stage for the Hall of Fame's Class of 2026. Among the four players who made it in their first year of eligibilty was Cardinals WR Larry Fitzgerald

Over the course of his 17-year career with the Cardinals, he was an 11-time Pro Bowl selection, 10-time team captain and was a co-recipient of the 2016 Walter Payton NFL Man of the Year award. He joined Jerry Rice (13) as the only WRs in NFL history selected to the Pro Bowl at least 11 times.

He ranks 2nd in NFL history in receptions (1,432) and receiving yards (17,492) behind Rice and 6th in TD receptions (121). His 1,432 career receptions are the most for any player in NFL history with a single team. He ended his career with at least one reception in 256 consecutive games dating back to his rookie season, the second-longest streak in NFL history (Jerry Rice - 274) and posted a catch in 262 of 263 career games.
