



ARIZONA CARDINALS NOTE CARDS

- 30+** Completions for QB **Kyler Murray** in each of his last two meetings with the Rams. Murray completed 37-of-58 passing attempts for 314 yards in his last meeting with the Rams (9/25/22) and went 32-of-49 for 383 yards in the meeting prior (12/13/21).
- 3** Games against NFC West opponents to end the 2023 home schedule for the Cardinals. It marks the first time that Arizona faces a divisional opponent in each of its final three home games since 1996 when the team was a member of the NFC East.
- 14** Receptions for WR **Marquise Brown** in his last home game against the Rams. In just Brown's third game with the Cardinals (Week 3 of 2022), he had a career-high 14 receptions for 140 receiving yards. It remains the second-highest single-game receiving yardage total of his career.
- 6.5** Sacks for rookies LB **BJ Ojulari** and DL **Dante Stills** in the last five games. The duo also combined for 35 tackles, seven tackles for loss and eight QB hits during that stretch. Ojulari (4.0) and Stills (3.5) are both among the top six rookie sack leaders in 2023.

MILESTONES WITHIN REACH...

QB KYLER MURRAY

- With 3+ TD passes, Murray would have 3+ passing TDs in a game for the 13th time in his career. Only Neil Lomax (15 times in 108 games) and Charley Johnson (14 times in 87 games) would have more such performances.
- With a rushing TD, Murray would have 26 rushing TDs as a member of the Cardinals. That would tie Ernie Nevers (1929-31) for eighth place on the franchise all-time list for career rushing TDs.
- With a rushing and passing TD, Murray would have both a passing and rushing TD for the 18th time in his career. That would tie Daunte Culpepper for third most in NFL history in a player's first five seasons.

RB JAMES CONNER

- With a rushing TD, Conner would have seven rushing TDs in five career games played vs. the Rams. Only seven players in NFL history would have more rushing TDs against the Rams.
- With a rushing TD, Conner would have 25 rushing TDs as a member of the Cardinals. That would tie Kyler Murray and Pat Harder (1946-50) for ninth place on the franchise all-time list for career rushing TDs.

TE TREY McBRIDE

- With eight receptions, McBride would have eight or more receptions for his third consecutive home game. He would be the first Cardinals TE to accomplish that feat and just the 11th NFL TE to do so since at least 1970.
- With 39 receiving yards, McBride would become just the eighth different TE in franchise history with 500+ receiving yards in a season.
- With 100+ receiving yards, McBride would join Hall of Famer Jackie Smith (who accomplished the feat six times) as the only TEs in franchise history with multiple 100-yard outings in a single season.

LB BJ OJULARI

- With 1.0 sack, Ojulari would have 5.0 sacks in his last five games. It would also make him the sixth rookie in franchise history - and first since Sam Acho (3) in 2011 - to have at least 1.0 sack in three consecutive games.
- With 1.5 or more sacks, Ojulari would join Simeon Rice (3 in 1996) and Andre Wadsworth (2 in 1998) as the only players in franchise history with at least two games of multiple sacks in their rookie season.
- With 1.5 or more sacks, Ojulari would become the first rookie in the NFL this season with at least two games of multiple sacks.

WR MARQUISE BROWN

- With five receptions, Brown would have 50 receptions for the fourth consecutive season.
- With 14 receiving yards, Brown would have 500 receiving yards for the fourth consecutive season.

K MATT PRATER

- With a FG, Prater would reach 393 field goals in his career and pass Stephen Gostkowski (392) for 14th place on the NFL's all-time list for career FGs.
- With a FG of 50+, Prater would have seven FGs of 50+ yards in 2023 tying his own franchise record (also had seven in 2021).

WR RONDALE MOORE

- With a rushing TD, Moore would have two rushing TDs this season and join Bobby Joe Conrad (two in 1959) as the only Cardinals WRs with multiple rushing TDs in a season.

DL DANTE STILLS

- With 1.5 or more sacks, Stills would join Simeon Rice (3 in 1996) and Andre Wadsworth (2 in 1998) as the only players in franchise history with at least two games of multiple sacks in their rookie season.

CONNER CAN SCORE

RB **James Conner** has rushed for 135 yards on 30 carries (4.5 avg.) in his two games since returning from injured reserve, but has yet to find the end zone. That could very well change on Sunday when the Cardinals host the Rams.

In four career games against the Rams, Conner has six rushing TDs. In three of those four games, he rushed for multiple scores. **Despite playing just four games against the division rival, only Frank Gore (four games with 2+ rushing TDs in 19 career games played vs. LAR), has more games with multiple rushing TDs against the Rams since 1970.**

Since 2021, a player has rushed for 2+ TDs against the Rams five times and three of those outings belong to Conner. **Although he missed Week 6's game against the Rams, Conner's six rushing TDs vs. LAR are the most in the NFL since he entered the league in 2017.**



TAKE YOUR PICK

Last Sunday in Houston, the Cardinals defense forced Texans QB C.J. Stroud into three INTs. **Heading into the game, Stroud had thrown two INTs in his first nine games combined.**

Arizona also totaled four sacks of Stroud for a loss of 30 yards. **It marked the first time in over 10 years that the team had three or more INTs and four or more sacks in a game.**

LB **Krys Barnes**, CB **Antonio Hamilton Sr.** and S **Jalen Thompson** were responsible for the three INTs.

Barnes returned his INT 46 yards, becoming just the fourth Cardinals LB since 2000 to return an INT 45+ yards.

Thompson led the team with eight tackles and had a nine-yard sack of Stroud in addition to his red zone INT. **He joined S Budda Baker (1.0 sack and 1 INT in Week 6 of 2020) as the only Cardinals DBs in the last 13 seasons to have a sack and an INT in a game.**



BAKER NAMED ROONEY AWARD NOMINEE

On Wednesday, Cardinals S **Budda Baker** was named the team's nominee for the 2023 Art Rooney Sportsmanship Award. Created in 2014, the award recognizes players around the league who exemplify outstanding sportsmanship on the field in honor of the late founding owner of the Pittsburgh Steelers and Pro Football Hall of Famer Art Rooney Sr.

"When you look at how he plays the game and the position, what we ask him to do and how he plays the position; extremely aggressive, violent, fast and playing within the rules and also respecting teammates. I think that's why he's up for that award," said Head Coach Jonathan Gannon on Baker's nomination. "You're kind of in awe with how he can operate and play the game the way that he does on a week to week basis. That showed up before we got here, that's shown up since we've been here and I'm grateful for him."

Baker has been penalized just one time for five yards (defensive offsides) in 2,509 snaps over the last three years. He will appear in his 100th career game on Sunday and join LS Aaron Brewer as the only current Cardinals to appear in 100+ games with the team.
