ARIZONA CARDINALS NOTE CARDS

- Completions for QB Jacoby Brissett last week vs. San Francisco. That is the highest single-game total in NFL history, surpassing the previous record of 45. His 82.5 completion percentange (47-of-57) was also the highest in NFL history for a player with 50+ attempts in a game.
 - Tackles for loss for rookie DL Walter Nolen III this season. He is the first Cardinals player since at least 1999 (when the stat was first tracked) to have at least 4 tackles for loss in his first three career games.
 - Players in NFL history who rank in the top 5 in career sacks for two different franchises: Calais Campbell (Cardinals/Jaguars), Reggie White (Packers/Eagles), Trace Armstrong (Bears/Dolphins), Simeon Rice (Cardinals/Buccaneers) and John Abraham (Falcons/Jets).

Sacks for LB **Josh Sweat** so far this season which is tied for the fourth-most in the NFL. He also has posted 11 tackles for loss which is the sixth-highest total across the league.

MILESTONE WATCH

WITH A WIN...

- Arizona would improve to 5-2 in its all time series with the Jaguars and increase its winning streak vs. Jacksonville to five straight.
- Head coach Jonathan Gannon would improve to 3-0 in three games this season vs. first-year head coaches after beating the Saints (Kellen Moore) and Cowboys (Brian Schottenheimer).

MILESTONES WITHIN REACH...

LB JOSH SWEAT

- With 1.0 sack, Sweat would have 10.0 sacks in 2025. He would become just the 14th different player in franchise history and first since J.J. Watt in 2022 (12.5) to have 10.0+ sacks in a single season.
- With 1.0 sack, Sweat would have at least 1.0 sack in four consecutive games for the third time in his career and second time this season (Games 2-5).
- With 2.0+ sacks on Sunday, Sweat will pass Curtis Greer (10.5) for the most sacks by a player in his first 11 games with the Cardinals.

TE TREY McBRIDE

- With 10 receptions, McBride (302) would pass Jimmy Graham (301 from 2010-13) for the most receptions by a TE in his first four seasons in NFL history.
- With 5 receptions, McBride would have 5+ catches for the 13th consecutive game. In NFL history, only Travis Kelce (15 in 2018) would have a longer streak among TEs.
- With 1 TD reception, McBride would have a TD catch in six consecutive games. He would join Mark Andrews (6 straight in 2024) as the only NFL TEs in the last five seasons (2021-25) to have a TD catch in at least six straight games. He would also tie Anquan Boldin (6 straight in 2008) for the longest such streak in franchise history.
- With 100+ receiving yards, McBride would become the first TE in Cardinals history with 100+ receiving yards in three consecutive games. He would become the first Arizona player at any position to accomplish the feat since WR Larry Fitzgerald (3 straight) in 2008.

QB JACOBY BRISSETT

- With 2 passing TDs, Brissett would have multiple TD passes in six straight games which would tie for the third-longest streak in franchise history behind only Kurt Warner (8 straight in 2007; 8 straight in 2008).
- With 250+ passing yards and 2+ passing TDs, Brissett would have those numbers in six straight games. He would pass Carson Palmer (5 straight in 2013-14) for the longest streak of such games in franchise history.
- With 175+ passing yards, Brissett (1,675) would pass Kurt Warner (1,674 in 2005) for the most passing yards by a Cardinals QB in his first six starts with the team.
- With 1+ passing TDs, Brissett (11) would pass Gary Hogeboom (10 in 1989) for the most passing touchdowns in a player's first six starts with the Cardinals.

S BUDDA BAKER

 With 5+ tackles, it would be Baker's 29th consecutive game with 5-or-more tackles, the third-longest streak in NFL history. He would pass Broncos LB Alex Singleton (28 games) for the second-longest active streak in the NFL behind only Commanders LB Bobby Wagner (40 games).

DL CALAIS CAMPBELL

With 1.0 sack, Campbell would have 6.0 sacks in 2025. He would surpass his sack total from all of last season (5.0 in 17 games with Miami).

CR DENZEL BURKE

 With an INT, Burke (3) would become the first Cardinals rookie with at least three INTs in a season since CB Patrick Peterson (4) in 2011.

LB CODY SIMON

 With 10+ tackles, Simon would become the first Cardinals rookie since at least 1991 with 10+ tackles in back-to-back games.

BIRDS' EYE VIEW

BLOWING OUT RECORDS BEFORE THE BDAY CANDLES

TE **Trey McBride** will celebrate his 26th birthday on Saturday. Just 4 TES in NFL history have had more catches before turning 26: Jason Witten (348), Tony Gonzalez (334), Rob Gronkowski (308) and Kellen Winslow Sr. (300). With 5 receptions on Sunday, it would be McBride's 13th consecutive game with 5+ receptions, tied with Larry Fitzgerald (13 games in 2008) for the longest such streak in franchise history.

Last week vs. SF, McBride posted 10 receptions for 115 yards and a TD. It was his fifth-consecutive game with 5+ receptions, 50+ receiving yards and 1+ TDs. He is tied with Antonio Gates (5 games in 2010) for the 3rd-longest such streak in NFL history by a TE behind Travis Kelce (6 games in 2020-21) and Tony Gonzalez (6 games in 2008-09). He also became the first Cardinals TE in 59 years to have 100+ receiving yards in back-to-back games joining Hall of Famer Jackie Smith (Games 9-10) in 1966.



The Cardinals 2025 rookie class has stepped up in a big way as six defenders have combined for 47 games played, 81 tackles, 5 TFLs, 2 INTs, 16 PDs, 3 QB hits, 2 FFs, 1.0 sack, 18 special teams tackles and a blocked PAT. First-round DL **Walter Nolen III** became the first Cardinals player since at least 1999 (when the stat was first tracked) to have at least 4 tackles for loss in his first three career games. Fourth-round LB **Cody Simon** made his second career start in Week 11 and finished with 12 tackles, the highest single-game total for a Cardinals rookie since S Budda Baker (13) in Week 16 of the 2017 season.

MICHAEL MAKES HISTORY

WR Michael Wilson had a historic game in Week 11 as he set career-highs in receptions (15) and receiving yards (185) against the 49ers. His 15 receptions are the second-best single-game total in franchise history behind only Sonny Randle's 16 receptions in Week 8 of 1962 at NYG. It is also 7 more than his previous career high (8 vs. Detroit in Week 3 of 2024).

Wilson's 185 receiving yards are the most in a single game in the NFL this season. It's also 90 yards higher than his previous career best (95 vs. Seattle in Week 18 of 2023) and the most he has posted in a game since his junior year at Chaminade HS when he recorded 220 yards vs. Oaks Christian HS in 2016.

Wilson and McBride became just the second duo in franchise history to have 10+ receptions and 100+ receiving yards in a single game. They did so exactly 17 years to the day (11/16/25 and 11/16/08) since Anguan Boldin (13 rec. - 186 yds) and Larry Fitzgerald (10 rec. - 151 yds) accomplished that feat.

The Cardinals will represent nearly <u>15 percent</u> of that total number as the team <u>has set a record for the most participants by a single team</u> in the <u>10-year history of the campaign with <u>270 players, coaches and staff</u> set to participate this weekend.</u>

In support of the Cardinals Foundation, the franchise this year introduced the *Our Cause, Our Kicks* initiative to align with *My Cause My Cleats*. More than 200 staff members used the opportunity to support the inaugural *Cardinals Climb* with custom Nike Air Force 1's and Nike
