- Signed a three-year contract with the Cardinals on 2/7/19.
- Selected by the Falcons in second round (60th overall) of the 2013 NFL Draft, Alford played 88 games (76 starts) in six seasons with Atlanta. He has 291 tackles (243 solo), 10 INTs, 85 passes defended, four tackles for loss, two fumble recoveries and a forced fumble in the regular season and 30 tackles, an INT and nine passes defended in five career postseason contests.
- Returned three INTs for TDs in his NFL career (two regular season and one postseason), including an INT off Tom Brady in Super Bowl LI that he returned 82 yards for a score.

PRO CAREER:

Entered the NFL as a second-round (60th overall) selection of the Atlanta Falcons in the 2013 NFL Draft. Placed on injured reserve (wrist) on 12/15/14. Re-signed with the Falcons on 12/8/16. Released on 2/5/19 and signed a three-year contract with the Cardinals on 2/7/19.

2018: Recorded 50 tackles and 11 passes defended in 15 games (all starts), playing most of the season on a high ankle sprain ... notched a tackle and deflected a Cam Newton pass on the final play of the game to preserve a seven-point win vs. Car (9/16) ... deflected two third down pass attempts vs. AZ (12/16).

2017: Started all 16 games for the second consecutive season, collecting one INT and posting career highs with 65 tackles and 20 passes defended ... tallied 11 tackles and three passes defended in two postseason contests (both starts) ... had three tackles and deflected three passes, including two on the Bears final offensive possession to help preserve a six-point win @ Chi (9/10) ... posted a career-high-tying nine tackles and tallied three passes defended, including two third down pass attempts @ Sea (11/20) ... had two tackles, registered a career-high four passes defended and intercepted a Cam Newton pass in the Falcons end zone on the Panthers final offensive play to seal a win and playoff berth vs. Car (12/31) ... posted three tackles and three passes defended in the Wild Card game @ LAR (1/6/18).

2016: Started all 16 games for the first time in his career and totaled 59 tackles, two INTs (one returned for a TD) and 19 passes defended ... started all three postseason contests and recorded 19 tackles, one INT (returned 82 yards for a TD), six passes defended and a fumble recovery ... sealed a Falcons victory and matched a career high with two INTs in the final two minutes vs. Car (10/2), returning one 30 yards for his second-career pick-six and his third-career multi-INT performance ... had a career-high 11 tackles, tallied three passes defended, recovered a LeGarrette Blount fumble and returned a Tom Brady INT 82 yards for his third-career TD in Super Bowl LI vs. NE (2/5/17); marked the second-longest INT-TD in Super Bowl history.

2015: Started 15 games and totaled 50 tackles, two INTs (one returned for a TD) and a team-high 15 passes defended ... registered one tackle and a season-high three passes defended vs. Hou (10/4) ... tallied two INTs, returning the second 59 yards for

a game-winning TD in OT vs. Was (10/11) ... notched a season-high seven tackles, recovered a fumble and had a pass defended in the season finale vs. NO (1/3/16).

2014: Collected 29 tackles, a career-high three INTs and 12 passes defended in 10 games (all starts) before being placed on injured reserve (wrist) on 12/15 ... intercepted Joe Flacco at the Falcons goal line and picked another deep ball from Flacco in the Falcons end zone, marking his first-career multi-INT performance @ Bal (10/19) ... had a season-high nine tackles, including a career-high eight solo stops @ TB (11/9).

2013: Played all 16 games (four starts) and recorded 38 tackles, two INTs, eight passes defended, a fumble recovery, a forced fumble and two special teams tackles ... intercepted a Drew Brees pass intended for Marques Colston in his NFL debut @ NO (9/8) ... intercepted a Cam Newton-to-Steve Smith pass at the Falcons goal line to stop a Panthers scoring threat before halftime @ Car (11/3) ... recovered a fumble on the second play from scrimmage in OT which led to a game-winning FG drive @ Buf (12/1) ... forced a DeAngelo Williams fumble at the Falcons 18-yard line after a 56-yard catch-and-run vs. Car (12/29).

COLLEGE:

Totaled 137 tackles, six tackles for loss, 10 INTs, 20 passes defended, three fumble recoveries and one forced fumble in 32 games (31 starts) ... named the NCAA Football Championship Subdivision National Defensive Player of the Year by the College Sports Journal and earned FCS All American honors from the NFL Draft Report and the Sports Network as a senior in 2012 ... also received first-team All-Southland Conference honors and was named a finalist for the Buck Buchanan Award ... earned second-team All-Southland Conference accolades with 52 tackles, five INTs, seven passes defended, one forced fumble and one fumble recovery as a junior in 2011.

PERSONAL:

Attended Hammond (LA) High School where he earned first-team All-District 7-5A honors after catching 10 TD passes as a senior in 2008 ... also ran track, placing second in the 400-meters at the 2007 Louisiana High School Athletic Association Track and Field Championships ... older brother, Fred Booker, was a CB at LSU and played in the Arena Football League and NFL Europe before appearing in 12 games with the New Orleans Saints in 2005.

CARDINALS SPECIALTY LICENSE PLATE RAISES MORE THAN \$1 MILLION FOR CARDINALS CHARITIES IN 2018

The Cardinals Charities received more than \$1 million from the sale of the team's specialty license plates in 2018, according to the Arizona Department of Transportation (ADOT). The Cardinals plate generated the most charitable proceeds of any professional or amateur sports team in the state with \$1,259,564, and in all, 74,092 Arizona Cardinals plates were issued in 2018, according to ADOT.

"Seeing so many vehicles on the road displaying their Cardinals plates is fantastic, and the display of support is incredibly gratifying," said Cardinals President Michael Bidwill. "But even more meaningful is knowing the type of impact that the project is having on Cardinals Charities and, in turn, so many worthy causes throughout the state. We appreciate the opportunity that ADOT has provided and are especially grateful to all of those fans who have stepped up to participate."

Founded in 1990, Cardinals Charities' mission is to support programs designed to improve the quality of life and enhance opportunities for children, women and minorities in Arizona. - Selected by the Cardinals in the third round (65th overall) of the 2019 NFL Draft, Allen became just the third BC player ever selected by Arizona in the NFL Draft and the first since the team took G Joe Wolf with the 17th overall pick in 1989.
- During his final season at Boston College, had eight passes defended, which ranked among the nation's top CBs in 2018. Georgia's Deandre Baker and LSU's Greedy Williams each had nine passes defended in '18.
- The highest-rated edge defender in the ACC last year and one of the top edge defenders in the 2019 NFL Draft, according to ProFootballFocus.com, who also had Allen as the #6 edge defender in the 2019 draft.

COLLEGE CAREER:

Appeared in 50 games in four seasons and totaled 199 tackles, 40.5 tackles for loss, 18.5 sacks, 16 passes defended, four fumble recoveries, two INTs and two blocked kicks ... over his final two seasons, had 161 tackles, 30.5 tackles for loss, 12.5 sacks, 12 passes defended, two INTs and two fumble recoveries.

2018: Started all 12 games he played and totaled 61 tackles, a career-high 6.5 sacks, 15 tackles for loss, and INT and a career-high eight passes defended ... an All-ACC second-team selection and Pro Football Focus second-team All-American selection ... member of the New England Football Writers All-New England Team and earned an All-ACC Academic Football Team selection.

2017: Started 13 games at DE and finished the year as one of two defensive linemen with 100+ tackles nationally ... recipient of the 79th annual George 'Bulger' Lowe Award (New England's Heisman Trophy and one of America's oldest college football awards) ... All-ACC honorable mention selection ... ranked second nationally among all defensive linemen with 100 tackles ... led BC with 6.0 sacks and tied for 10th in BC single-season history with 15.5 tackles for loss ... added four passes defended and his first career INT ... named ACC Defensive Lineman of the Week for the first time in his career after career-best 14 tackles and three tackles for loss against #16 Virginia Tech (10/7/17).

2016: Played all 13 games (one start) and had 36 tackles (19 solo) ... totaled 10 tackles for loss, 6.0 sacks, four pass breakups, three QB hurries and two fumble recoveries ... part of a defense that ranked top-10 nationally in eight categories, including ninth in total defense (314.2 yards/game), second in sacks (3.62 sacks/game), sixth in tackles for loss (8.2 TFL/game) and seventh in rushing defense (108.5 yards/game) ... BC defense twice

matched the single-season school record with eight sacks, posted 10+ tackles for loss four times and tied a school record set in 1994 with 47 sacks ... had two sacks in the Quick Lane Bowl victory over Maryland (12/26) ... part of the defensive line that was named the bowl MVP.

2015: Played all 12 games, primarily on special teams ... in the first game of his collegiate career, registered a tackle in the season-opener vs. Maine (9/5) ... earned the Athletic Director's Award for Academic Achievement.

Played in 42 games (19 starts) at Georgia (2011-15), totaling 108 tackles, seven passes defended and 2.5 sacks ... started 10 of 13 games as a senior, finishing the year with 46 tackles, 2.0 tackles

- Selected by the Cardinals in the second round (36th overall) of the 2017 NFL Draft out of Washington; appeared in 30 games (20 starts) during his first two seasons with Arizona.
- In 2018, appeared in 14 games (13 starts) and totaled 107 tackles, eight tackles for loss, 2.0 sacks, three QB pressures, four QB hits, two passes defended, a forced fumble and two fumble recoveries (one returned 36 yards for his first career TD).
- According to league statistics, was one of just three NFL safeties with 100+ tackles, 2.0+ sacks and 8+ tackles for loss in 2018.
- Posted at least 10 tackles in a game five times in 2018, including a career-high 14 tackles in Week 5 at San Francisco.
- Named first-team All-Pro and was voted to the Pro Bowl for his work on special teams as a rookie in '17 after he led the Cardinals and ranked third in the NFL with 16 special teams tackles. Was one of just four rookies named to the Pro Bowl in '17 and became just the fifth Cardinals rookie since the 1970 merger to be named to the Pro Bowl.
- In his first career NFL start, recorded 12 tackles, a sack, two forced fumbles and a fumble recovery at Houston in Week 11 of the '17 season. Became the first rookie in 20 years and the first Cardinals player ever to register 10+ tackles, a sack and two forced fumbles in a game.
- During a remarkable prep career at Bellevue High School, won five team state titles (3 in football, 2 in track & field) and eight individual state titles in track & field. In football, he played on three consecutive 14-0 teams that won three consecutive 3A state championships.
- Given first name is Bishard. Nicknamed "Budda" by his mother and aunt when he was a child and the name stuck.

PRO CAREER:

The Cardinals acquired Baker in the second round (36th overall) of the 2017 NFL Draft after trading up nine spots (from 45th to 36th) to acquire the University of Washington product. Baker appeared in 30 games (20 starts) in his first two NFL seasons.

2018: Totaled 107 tackles, eight tackles for loss, 2.0 sacks, two passes defended, a forced fumble and two fumble recoveries (one returned for a TD) in 14 games (13 starts) during his first season as a full-time starter ... had a team-high 11 tackles in the season-opener vs. Was (9/9) ... led Arizona's DBs with 10 tackles, including two for loss and a half-sack that led to a missed FG attempt on the next play vs. Chi (9/23) ... notched six tackles for a unit that did not allow a third-down conversion vs. Sea (9/30); added two special teams tackles against the Seahawks ... recorded a career-high 14 tackles (12 solo), one for loss, a QB hit, a sack and a pass defended for a unit that forced five turnovers @ SF (10/7); sacked C.J. Beathard for a nine-yard loss in the fourth quarter ... returned a Kirk Cousins fumble 36 yards for his first-career TD to tie the game at 10 late in the second quarter @ Min (10/14); marked his first score on any level since a four-yard TD run in the state championship game for Bellevue High School vs. Eastside Catholic (12/6/13); had 11 tackles, including two for loss, against the Vikings ... totaled five tackles, two for loss, a QB hit, QB pressure and a half-sack for a unit that limited the 49ers to 160 net passing yards vs. SF (10/28); paired with Rodney Gunter to sack C.J. Beathard on third-and-six late in the fourth quarter to force a 49ers punt ... recorded six tackles, a QB hit and a pass defended for a unit that held the NFL's top-ranked scoring offense to a season-low 26 points @ KC (11/11) ... inactive (knee) vs. Oak (11/11) and @ LAC (11/25) ... collected seven tackles and a QB hit for a defense that held Aaron Rodgers to a 4.66 yards-per-pass-attempt average (233 yards on 50 attempts) and a 79.8 passer rating @ GB (12/2) ... halted the Lions first offensive possession by forcing and recovering a LeGarrette Blount fumble at the Cardinals 32-yard line vs. Det (12/9); added five tackles for a defense that limited the Lions to a season-low

96 net passing yards ... registered his fifth 10-tackle game of the season with a team-high 12 for a defense that held the Seahawks to 109 net passing yards @ Sea (12/30).

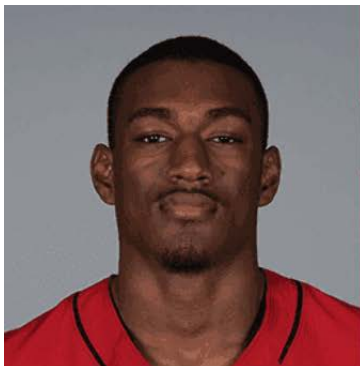

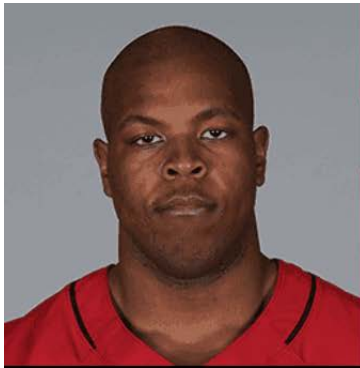

- Originally selected by the Cardinals in the first round (3rd overall) of the 2004 NFL Draft and has played his entire career in Arizona. Only players taken ahead of him were QB Eli Manning (No. 1 to San Diego; traded to NY Giants) and T Robert Gallery (No. 2 to Oakland).
- His 234 games played are tied with K Jim Bakken (1962-78) for the most in franchise history.
- Selected to a franchise-record 11 Pro Bowls. Fitzgerald (11) joins Hall of Famer Jerry Rice (13) as the only wide receivers in NFL history to be selected to the Pro Bowl at least 11 times.
- Named a co-winner (along with QB Eli Manning) of the 2016 Walter Payton NFL Man of the Year award. The award, which Fitzgerald was also one of three finalists for in 2012, is the only league award that recognizes a player's off-the-field community service as well as his playing excellence.
- Franchise career leader in receptions (1,303), receiving yards (16,279), receiving TDs (116), total TDs (116), 100-yard receiving games (47) and consecutive games with a reception (227).
- Ranks second in NFL history in career receiving yards (16,279), third in receptions (1,303) and is tied for sixth in NFL history with 116 career TD receptions.
- His 1,303 career receptions are the most for any player in NFL history with a single team, surpassing the previous record held by WR Jerry Rice (1,281 with SF).
- In NFL history, only six players (all in the Hall of Fame) have more TDs with a single team than Fitzgerald (116) has with Arizona: WR Jerry Rice (187 w/SF), RB Emmitt Smith (164 w/Dal), RB LaDainian Tomlinson (153 w/SD), WR Marvin Harrison (128 w/Ind), RB Jim Brown (126 w/Cle) and RB Walter Payton (125 w/Chi).
- Fitzgerald's streak of 227 consecutive games with a reception is the second-longest in NFL history. He has at least one catch in 233 of 234 career games played.
- Enters the 2019 season having started 68 consecutive games in a streak that dates back to 2014. That represents the longest active starts streak among NFL WRs.
- In Week 16 of the 2018 season vs. the Rams, threw his first career TD pass (32 yards to RB David Johnson). It was the first TD pass by a WR in team history. At 35 years, 114 days old he became the oldest WR in NFL history to throw a TD pass.
- Has led the NFL in receptions twice (2005, 2016) and in receiving TDs twice (2008, 2009).
- Has been named NFC Offensive Player of the Week four times in his career.
- Led the NFL in receptions with 107 in 2016. It marked the second time in his career (tied Steve Smith for NFL lead with 103 in 2005) he led the league in receptions. He became the first player in NFL history to lead the NFL in catches at least 11 years apart. Prior to Fitzgerald, the longest span between leading the league in receptions was six years by Jerry Rice (1990, 1996).
- Tied his own franchise record with 109 receptions in 2017, becoming the oldest player in NFL history to record 100+ receptions in a season. The '17 season marked the fifth of his career with 100+ receptions.
- In 13 seasons (102 games) at State Farm Stadium, has 598 receptions for 7,438 yards and 53 TDs on the Cardinals home field. In NFL history only Jerry Rice (646 at Candlestick Park) has more catches in a single venue.
- Has caught at least one pass in all 42 different stadiums he has played in during his NFL career and has at least one TD reception in 27 different stadiums.
- Has more career receptions against the Rams (185) than any player in NFL history against any single opponent.
- With 2,306 career receiving yards against the Rams, 2,098 against the 49ers and 2,022 against the Seahawks, joins Jerry Rice (Falcons, Rams, Saints) as the only players in NFL history with 2,000+ receiving yards against three different teams.
- Finished the 2015 season with 109 receptions for 1,215 yards and nine TDs. His 109 receptions set a franchise single-season record (tied that mark in 2017), surpassing his previous mark of 103, set in 2005.
- One of the best postseason performers in NFL history, Fitzgerald has 57 receptions for 942 yards and 10 TDs in just nine postseason contests. He is the only player in NFL history to average at least 100+ receiving yards and a TD in the postseason.
- Had one of the best postseasons of any player in NFL history during the Cardinals run to Super Bowl XLIII in 2008, shattering the NFL single postseason record for receptions (30), receiving yards (546) and receiving TDs (seven).
- In the Divisional matchup vs. Green Bay in 2015, caught eight passes for 176 yards and scored the game-winning TD in the 26-20 OT victory over the Packers. His 176 receiving yards set a new franchise postseason record.
- Has five 100-yard receiving performances in the postseason and is the only player in NFL history with at least three games of 150+ receiving yards in the playoffs.
- In February of 2018, joined PGA pro Kevin Streelman in winning the Pebble Beach Pro-Am golf tournament. Became the first African-American amateur to win the event – which dates back to 1937 – and the first professional athlete to win the title since Dan Marino in 1988.

In his 15 seasons with the Cardinals, has established franchise records for receptions (1,303), receiving yards (16,279), receiving TDs (116), total TDs (116), 100-yard receiving games (47) and 1,000-yard receiving seasons (nine). Has also been voted to the Pro Bowl a franchise-record 11 times.

Through 15 NFL seasons, Fitzgerald has accumulated 16,279 career receiving yards.

15 SEASONS IN, FITZ THROWS 1ST TD PASS

In Week 16 of the 2018 season vs. the Rams - playing in his 233rd career game - Fitzgerald threw his first career TD pass on a 32-yard strike to RB David Johnson.

It was the first TD pass by a WR in franchise history and the first TD pass by a non-QB for the Cards since RB Emmitt Smith's 21-yard TD pass on 10/3/04 vs. NO.

Fitzgerald was 35 years, 114 days old playing against the Rams in Week 16. He became the oldest WR in NFL history to throw a TD pass. Prior to Fitzgerald, the record was held by Philadelphia's Harold Carmichael (34 years, 38 days old).

breaking his own mark of 166 yards on 1/10/09 at Carolina; marked fifth career 100-yard game in the playoffs, tied for third-most in NFL history, and his third game of 150+ yards, the most ever; accounted for all 80 yards on game-winning OT drive with a 75-yard catch-and-run on the first play and a five-yard TD on a shovel pass two plays later; marked his 10th career postseason TD catch, tied for third all-time ... had four catches for 30 yards in NFC Championship Game @ Car (1/24/16).

2014: Played in 14 games (13 starts) and led the team with 63 receptions, ranked second on the team with 784 yards and had two TD receptions ... named a Pro Bowl alternate ... extended his streak of consecutive games with a catch to 163, the longest active streak in the NFL ... moved up to 19th all-time with 909 career receptions and to 21st with 12,151 yards ... ended season ranked ninth in franchise history in games played with 170 ... recorded a reception for the 150th consecutive game vs. SD (9/8); his catch was a 22-yarder on the game-winning drive in the fourth quarter to help set up the go-ahead TD four plays later ... posted a team-leading 98 yards on six catches and caught his first TD of the season with a 24-yard catch-and-run in the second quarter vs. Was (10/12); marked the 88th TD

for 12th all-time with 87 career TD catches; gave him 16 career TD receptions against the Rams, more than any other active player has against an individual opponent; marked his fourth straight game with a TD catch ... led the team with 113 yards on six catches vs. SF (12/29); marked his second 100-yard receiving game this season (both against San Francisco) and the 36th of his career, extending his own franchise record.

2012: After being selected as an offensive captain by his teammates for the fourth consecutive year, started all 16 games and earned his sixth straight (seventh overall) Pro Bowl selection ... led the team with 71 receptions and 798 receiving yards and finished second on the team with four TD catches ... became the franchise record holder for consecutive games with a reception (133) ... also became the youngest player in NFL history to reach

FAR AND AWAY, FITZ IS ON TOP

During his 15 NFL seasons, **Fitzgerald** has not only surpassed virtually every single franchise receiving record - he has added to those totals to the point of making them nearly untouchable.

Fitzgerald broke the franchise record for receptions in 2010 and since then has more than doubled the previous record. With 1,303 career receptions, Fitzgerald has over 700 more than any other player in team history.

Fitzgerald would hold the franchise record for receptions with all 31 other NFL franchises. He would hold the record for receiving yards with 30 of the 31 other teams, with the lone exception being Jerry Rice (19,247) in San Francisco.



Fitzgerald's 16,279 career receiving yards eclipse the second-highest total in franchise history by nearly 8,000 yards. The difference between first place and fifth place is over 9,200 yards.

FITZGERALD OFF THE FIELD

During his 15 seasons in the NFL, Fitzgerald has used his platform as a professional athlete to promote countless causes in communities throughout the United States and internationally. He has taken part in international humanitarian efforts with highly-respected aid organizations, hosts numerous annual fundraising events to support his two foundations, visits local children's hospitals and homeless shelters, holds kids camps for disadvantaged youth around the country and for the children of military members and used his play on the field to support breast cancer awareness and prevention efforts.

Most of Fitzgerald's humanitarian work is done through his two foundations — the Larry Fitzgerald First Down Fund and the Carol Fitzgerald Memorial Fund. He has also teamed with a number of international aid foundations such as Oxfam America and the Starkey Hearing Foundation. Fitzgerald also works alongside countless foundations around the country such as the Semper Fi Fund, Plano Child Development Center, Make-A-Wish, Big Brothers-Big Sisters, the Boys & Girls Club and many others.



The primary goals of Fitzgerald's humanitarian efforts include:

- Promoting reading proficiency and technology access for K-12 youth as cornerstones to success at school and in life.
- Building youth football initiatives to give kids access to updated facilities and equipment.
- Raising awareness for breast cancer research and prevention.
- Supporting members of the United States Armed Forces and their families.
- Providing much needed medical supplies and food/water sources to people in impoverished countries around the world who have no way to afford them.
- Get vision and hearing care to disadvantaged children around the world.

The results of Fitzgerald's community efforts have been profound. In 2018 alone, the First Down Fund provided grants totaling over \$600,00. In the Arizona and Minnesota communities, Fitzgerald:

- Has helped tens of thousands of kids through the First Down Fund, donating hundreds of thousands of dollars (including \$300,000 in grants last year alone) to schools and organizations with demonstrated success closing the reading and technology gaps for underserved children.
- Has served as a regular donor to both the Phoenix Children's Hospital and the Phoenix Children's Hospital Rainbow Camp.
- Teamed up with Riddell to donate state of the art youth football helmets to outfit the entire Minneapolis Parks and Recreation youth football program where Larry first played football as a young child.
- In 2018, partnered with Microsoft to donate tablet computers to Minnehaha Academies in Minneapolis. The school utilizes the tablets in the classroom and also as a virtual lending library for students to be able to take books home to read.
- Last year, the First Down Fund also made grants to America's Foundation for Chess, Big Brothers Big Sisters of Arizona, Phoenix Children's hospital, Rev Dr. Martin Luther King Jr Park of the Minneapolis Parks system, Plano Child Development Center in Chicago, the Carol Fitzgerald Memorial Fund, and the African American Breast Cancer Alliance for support services for breast cancer survivors.
- Donated a computer lab to Horizons Youth program, which was leveraged by the organization to establish a computer lab open to the entire community.
- Previous grants also included the St. Paul Promise initiative of Wilder Foundation which successfully serves homeless youth pursuing their education without permanent housing. A grant to Stansfield school in Arizona to purchase a robotics classroom curriculum, Pillsbury House in Minneapolis to support their Reading for Success Program, and a grant to Reading Partners for their Take Reading Home program to provide books to 450 students and their family members.

International Aid Work

Fitzgerald has done extensive work with the Starkey Hearing Foundation, helping fit hundreds of hearing aids for those in need all over Africa, working alongside President Bill Clinton and his daughter Chelsea. In July 2019, he received the Foundation's Caring Award for his work with the organization.

He has also traveled to Ethiopia with good friend Anquan Boldin on behalf of Oxfam America, helping work on irrigation systems and digging wells in local communities.

Breast Cancer Research & Awareness

The Carol Fitzgerald Memorial Fund was established to honor Larry's late mother, Carol, and Fitzgerald is heavily involved in furthering breast cancer research. He has long served as a spokesman for the NFL's A Crucial Catch campaign, donating funds for each reception, TD reception and Cardinals victory during the month of October. He has donated hundreds of thousands of dollars based on his on-the-field performance.

Youth Football Initiatives

Fitzgerald with Riddell to donate 1,000 state of the art youth football helmets, as well as training, to outfit the entire Minneapolis Parks and Recreation youth football program where Larry first played football as a young child. The First Down Fund refurbished a basketball court at the park in Minneapolis where Larry first played football and basketball. He has previously donated football equipment and holiday gifts to the park.

Fitzgerald has also hosted a youth football camp in Minnesota and in Arizona for several years. Every year scholarship slots are funded by Larry so that underprivileged youth can attend. The camps provided boys and girls ages 7-14 the opportunity to learn fundamentals from Fitzgerald and other NFL players and coaches.

RECOGNITION FOR FITZGERALD'S HUMANITARIAN EFFORTS

Walter Payton NFL Man of the Year

Fitzgerald joined Giants QB Eli Manning as co-winners of the 2016 Walter Payton NFL Man of the Year award, the only league award that recognizes a player's off-the-field community service as well as his playing excellence.

PFWA Good Guy Award

In June of 2017, Fitzgerald was named the recipient of the Pro Football Writers of America (PFWA) Good Guy Award, given annually to an NFL player for his "qualities and professional style in helping pro football writers do their jobs."

Art Rooney Sportsmanship Award

In the lead up to Super Bowl XLIX following the 2014 season, Fitzgerald was named the inaugural winner of the Art Rooney NFL Sportsmanship Award, given to the player who best represents the important role that sportsmanship plays in the game and how NFL players that demonstrate integrity and honor on the field serve as role models for other players at all levels.

Georgetown Lombardi Award

Fitzgerald was the 2013 recipient of the NFL Players Association Georgetown Lombardi Award, which was established to honor a leader in the sports industry whose life and family have been touched by cancer, and who encourages cancer research, prevention and treatment through awareness and philanthropy.

Arthur S. Arkush Humanitarian Award

In 2012, Fitzgerald was named the recipient of the 14th Annual Arthur S. Arkush Humanitarian Award by Pro Football Weekly, which is given to the NFL player whose contributions to the community and charitable organizations are especially outstanding.

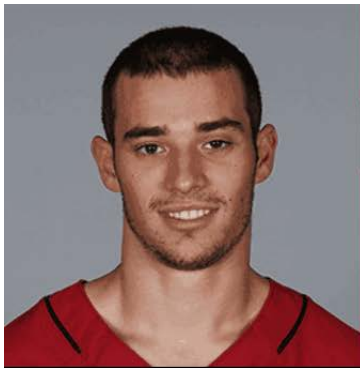

- Second of the Cardinals second-round picks (62nd overall) in the 2019 NFL Draft out of Massachusetts, Isbella became the first UMass player ever drafted by the Cardinals. Just the second player in Cardinals history to come from UMass, joining RB Marcel Shipp (2001-07).
- Named a Biletnikoff Award Finalist and consensus first-team All-American in 2018 after leading the FBS with a single-season program-record 1,698 receiving yards, which were 288 more than the second-ranked player. Ranked second in the country with 102 receptions and tied for fifth with 13 TD catches.

FROM A FAN TO TEAMMATE OF FITZGERALD

Arizona's 2019 second-round (62nd overall) selection, WR **Andy Isabella**, is one of several rookie wideouts now sharing a meeting room with Cardinals all-time leading receiver **Larry Fitzgerald**.

Shortly after being drafted, a photo (right) of an 12-year-old Isabella wearing a muddied Fitzgerald jersey after a pickup football game on Thanksgiving day in 2009 surfaced.

"I saw that (picture)," Fitzgerald said during the team's offseason program. "That makes you feel old, you see some of the young guys coming in now and they're like in grade school when you were playing (in the NFL). That's not a good feeling."

On the day the photo was taken, Isabella's future teammate Fitzgerald was preparing for a road game against the Titans, a game in which Fitzgerald had four catches for 34 yards. He totaled 97 catches for 1,092 yards and 13 TDs in a 10-win campaign that season, while Isabella was a seventh grader.



"He's all football all day long," Fitzgerald said of Isabella. "He knows his playbook, he works his tail off every day."

JERSEY NO. 89

It's customary for rookies to select from the available jersey numbers in the order they were drafted, and after QB **Kyler Murray** took No. 1 and CB **Byron Murphy** claimed No. 33, Isabella grabbed No. 19. However, sixth-round pick WR **KeeSean Johnson** was the 19th wide receiver taken in the draft, and Johnson was hoping to get that number.

Isabella "didn't really care," so he gave his teammate No. 19 and settled on No. 89, the only option left (receivers must wear Nos. 10-19 or 80-89).

The 5-foot-9 Isabella likes that 89 was worn by a smaller star in former Panthers and Ravens WR **Steve Smith**. "When I picked it, I thought, 'Maybe I can be like Steve Smith,'" Isabella said. "He was someone I looked up to. That was a pretty special moment."

Unless he switches jersey numbers before the start of the season, Isabella would be the first Cardinals WR on the 53-man roster to wear a jersey number in the 80s since **Early Doucet**, who wore No. 85 in the 2012 season.

- The Cardinals third-round selection (86th overall) in the 2015 NFL Draft, Johnson signed a three-year extension with Arizona on 9/8/18 that will keep the All-Pro RB with the Cardinals through the 2021 season.
- Has played 49 games (38 starts) during his first four NFL seasons and accumulated 5,230 all-purpose yards (2,783 rushing; 1,849 receiving; 598 KOR) and 43 total TDs (31 rushing; 11 receiving; 1 KOR).
- Despite missing nearly the entire 2017 season due to a wrist injury, his 43 career TDs are nine more than any other player in franchise history through their first four seasons.
- His 43 career TDs are tied for the ninth-most in franchise history, despite playing in 20 fewer games than any other player in the top-10.
- Owns franchise single-season records for total TDs (20 in 2016), rushing TDs (16 in 2016) and TDs by a rookie (13 in 2015).

- Has been named NFC Offensive Player of the Week twice (Weeks 5 & 13 in 2016); NFC Special Teams Player of the Week once (Week 2 in 2015); NFC Offensive Player of the Month once (October of 2016); NFL Offensive Rookie of the Month once (Dec./Jan. of 2015).
- Became the first Cardinals RB selected to the Pro Bowl since Johnny Johnson in 1990. Also became the first Northern Iowa player selected to the Pro Bowl since former Cardinals QB Kurt Warner in 2008 and just the third Pro Bowler ever from that school (LB Bryce Paup).
- In 2015, he totaled 1,636 all-purpose yards (581 rushing yards, 457 receiving yards, 598 kickoff return yards), becoming just the fourth player in NFL history to post 500+ rushing yards, 400+ receiving yards, 500+ kickoff return yards and 13+ TDs in a season, joining Timmy Brown (1962), Gale Sayers (1965) and Maurice Jones-Drew (2006).
- Only player in NFL history with a rushing TD, receiving TD and kickoff return TD in his first two career games. A PRODUCTIVE FOUR SEASONS

Although he was in his fourth NFL season in 2018 – Johnson has only played 49 career games – which equals out to just over three full 16 game seasons.

Despite that fact, Johnson has already accumulated 4,632 career yards from scrimmage (2,783 rushing, 1,849 receiving). That represents the third-best total in franchise history through player's first four seasons.

CARDINALS IN THE COMMUNITY

On his way to becoming a record-setting running back and one of the league's top offensive weapons, David Johnson has also made a big impact off the field, taking part in a significant number of the team's charitable programs and continuing his efforts to help combat childhood bullying.

In 2017, Johnson, along with his wife, Meghan, created the "Mission 31" Foundation, which was developed to provide opportunities, support and resources to seriously ill children and their families by offering daily support and life changing experiences. One of the first programs undertaken by the "Mission 31" Foundation was "David's Lockers." These technology centers provide school children, patients and their family members access to electronics that serve as a source of entertainment, a portal for communication and education, and a diversion during treatment and recovery.



David and Meghan unveiled their inaugural David's Locker at Phoenix Children's Hospital in April 2018. It was designed to be mobile in order to fit the hospital's needs for technology on an isolation floor. The second David's Locker was unveiled at Cardon Children's Medical Center in September 2018. It serves a variety of needs for many children as the hospital sees children from birth to age 18, treating 60,000 children annually. The third locker – and the first to be installed in a Title I school, was unveiled in April of 2019 at Emerson Elementary School in Phoenix. Filled with iPads, noise-canceling headphones and more, it was designed to further support and enhance the choice-based and student-centered education offered at Emerson.

David and Meghan host numerous events throughout the year to help raise funds+ for their work through the Mission 31 Foundation. In April of 2019, the two held the second-annual "An Evening with David & Meghan" event at Sanctuary Resort in Scottsdale. The event featured a pleasant evening of cocktails, catered hors d'oeuvres and an extensive silent auction for the 40 guests in attendance. Each guest spent one-on-one time with David and Meghan, pledging support for the Foundation's next David's Lockers that will be unveiled in the Greater Phoenix area.

In June of 2019, Johnson hosted the second-annual David Johnson Youth Football Camp in at the Reach 11 Sports Complex in Phoenix. The camp hosted 250 area kids ages six to 16 and focused on football as well as being a positive role model and good leader.

In October of 2018, David and Meghan hosted the "Johnson Family: Agents of Change" event at Mountain Shadows Resort, in which the Johnson family was joined by Cardinals teammates and the members of the community for a reception followed by a live and silent auction. In December of 2017, Johnson hosted the inaugural "Mission 31: Possible" fundraiser at Mountain Shadows Resort. Over 200 guests helped raise nearly \$200,000 during the event, which features food, wine and auctions.

Johnson has long been open about his struggles being bullied as a child, and in 2016 wrote a piece for The Players' Tribune website titled Let's Talk About Bullying in which he shared his experiences with bullying while growing up in Clinton, IA. He also detailed his work with STOMP Out Bullying to help other kids going through the same experiences. In the NFL's inaugural My Cause, My Cleats campaign in 2016, Johnson wore custom STOMP cleats in support of efforts to eliminate bullying. In 2017 Johnson teamed up with Cox Communications for the "Run Thru Bullying" campaign, in which nearly 500 children from four school districts around the Valley participated in an anti-bullying program and wrote essays about their experiences. Two winning essayists were named co-winners after detailing how bullying has affected them and how they implemented the "Run Thru Bullying" program at Sunnyslope Elementary.

Johnson has also been a regular volunteer at various team and player community events during his time in Arizona. During the 2016 Christmas season, along with a number of his Cardinals teammates, Johnson participated in the Cardinals "Teddy Bear Express" event at Phoenix Children's Hospital. The players delivered white personalized Cardinals teddy bears to children in the pediatric units throughout the hospital. He also visited Boys Hope Girls Hope for the team's annual Christmas party. Boys Hope Girls Hope helps academically capable and motivated children by providing family-like homes, opportunities and education through college.

During the 2017 offseason, Johnson served as the honorary starter at Pat's Run. Honoring former Cardinals safety Pat Tillman, the annual Pat's Run event is one of the main events of the Tillman Foundation. Last season Johnson also participated in the seventh annual "Pro Vs. G.I. Joe" program, a video game competition with military personnel from bases all over Arizona that has Cardinals players joining troops, both home and abroad, competing in an assortment of games on Xbox.

In July of 2017, Johnson hosted the Hyundai NFL Youth Camp at the Arizona Sports Complex in Glendale, AZ. The skills camp played host to 400 kids ages seven to 13 from the Valley. At the event, Hyundai's non-profit organization, Hyundai Hope on Wheels, announced it would donate \$15 million to children's hospitals across the country.

In 2016, Johnson was part of a Cardinals contingent that took part in the "Feed the Families" event at the Phoenix Ronald McDonald House, providing the children and their families at the house with dinner, drinks and dessert. Johnson was back at the Ronald McDonald House in 2017 as part of the "Light the House" party in December, in which all of the houses were lit with holiday lights and children received dinner, drinks and stockings for the holidays. The Ronald McDonald House Charities of Phoenix provides a welcoming "home away from home" for children and their families who travel to Phoenix to receive treatment for serious, often life-threatening illnesses and injuries.

Johnson also joined teammates and Cardinals President Michael Bidwill at the team's annual "Help Feed the Hungry" event in 2016, serving Thanksgiving dinner to over 500 of those less fortunate at the Phoenix Rescue Mission.

Joining a number of teammates and groups from the Cardinals Women's Club, Johnson has also visited Phoenix Children's Hospital for birthday parties in the Kids Zone. Each month, the Kids Zone at PCH holds a party for all patients who have a birthday in that month. The Arizona Cardinals Women's Club sponsors the event, which featured games with the patients as well as pizza and cake.

- Acquired by the Cardinals in a trade with the New England Patriots on 3/15/16. Cardinals sent Jonathan Cooper and their 2016 second-round pick (#61) to the Patriots. Jones received the franchise tag on 2/27/17 and signed a new five-year contract on 3/10/17.
- A two-time Pro Bowl selection (2015, '17), has played in 103 games (100 starts) and recorded 396 tackles, 77.0 sacks, 19 forced fumbles, five fumble recoveries, one INT and 19 passes defended. Also has 18 tackles, 2.0 sacks and a forced fumble in nine postseason games (eight starts), including the Patriots Super Bowl XLIX victory at State Farm Stadium.
- Recorded 179 tackles, 57 tackles for loss, 41.0 sacks (seventh in Cardinals history), 81 QB hits, 49 QB pressures, nine forced fumbles, three fumble recoveries and 11 passes defended during his three seasons in Arizona.
- Leads the NFL in sacks (41.0) and tied for the league lead in tackles for loss (57) since joining the Cardinals in 2016. One of only two NFL defenders (Aaron Donald) in the top-five in each category during that span (2016-18).
- Leads the NFL with 53.5 sacks since his final year with New England in 2015. One of only two NFL players (Ryan Kerrigan) with 11.0+ sacks in each of the last four seasons (12.5 in 2015; 11.0 in 2016; 17.0 in 2017; 13.0 in 2018).
- Became the first Cardinal to record 10.0+ sacks in three consecutive seasons and the first player in team history with at least 11.0 sacks in three different seasons. Joined Curtis Greer (two) as the only players in Cardinals history with multiple seasons with 13.0+ sacks.
- Has at least 1.0 sack in 32 of 48 games since joining the Cardinals in 2016. No other player in the NFL has a sack in more than 26 games during that span.
- Since 2013, only Houston's J.J. Watt (21) has more games with multiple sacks (1.5+) than Jones (19).
- Has been named NFC Defensive Player of the Month (December, 2017), AFC Defensive Player of the Month (November, 2013), NFL Rookie of the Month (September, 2012), AFC Defensive Player of the Week (Week 2, 2014) and NFC Defensive Player of the Week (Week 5, 2018). Became the third player in franchise history to be named Defensive Player of the Month after totaling 16 tackles, 5.0 sacks, 8 TFL, 12 QB hits and a forced fumble in December, 2017.
- Donated \$40,000 to Phoenix Children's Hospital after pledging \$20,000 for each of his sacks during the final two games of the 2018 season.
- Named a Pro Bowl alternate after starting all 16 games and totaling 54 tackles, 14 tackles for loss, a team-high 13.0 sacks, a career-high six passes defended, three forced fumbles and a fumble recovery in 2018.
- Tied for the sixth-highest single-season total in franchise history with 13.0 sacks in 2018 and passed DT Darnell Dockett (40.5) for seventh place on the franchise all-time sacks list with 41.0 in his first 48 games with Arizona.
- Earned a Pro Bowl selection and first-team All-Pro (AP, PFWA, Sporting News) honors after leading the NFL with a franchise single-season record 17.0 sacks in 2017. Jones, who became the first Cardinal to ever lead the league in sacks, also led the NFL in tackles for loss (28) and QB hits (38) that season. Named the Deacon Jones Award winner for leading the NFL in sacks.
- One of four players to lead the NFL in both sacks and tackles for loss in a season since STATS, Inc. began tracking tackles for loss in 2008: Demarcus Ware (2008 and 2010), J.J. Watt (2012 and 2015) and Aaron Donald (2018).
- Had at least 1.0 sack in 13 of 16 games in 2017, becoming the first player in franchise history with a sack in at least 13 games in a single season. Since individual sacks became an official statistic in 1982, only Ware (14 in 2008) had a sack in more games in a season.
- Named a Pro Bowl alternate after starting all 16 games and collecting 57 tackles, 15 tackles for loss, 11.0 sacks, four forced fumbles, two fumble recoveries, 14 QB pressures and 22 QB hits during his first season with Arizona in 2016.
- Combined with Markus Golden's 12.5 sacks, the 2016 season marked just the third season in franchise history (1983, 1984) the Cardinals had multiple players with double-digit sacks.
- In his first season with the Cardinals, Arizona led the NFL in sacks (48.0) for just the second time in franchise history (1983).
- Named to his first Pro Bowl with New England in 2015 after collecting 12.5 sacks, fifth most in the NFL that season.
- Has two brothers: Arthur, a Super Bowl-champion defensive tackle, and Jon "Bones" Jones, a two-time UFC Light Heavyweight champion.

PRO CAREER:

Originally entered the NFL as a first-round pick (21st overall) of New England in the 2012 NFL Draft. Traded to the Cardinals in exchange for G Jonathan Cooper and Arizona's 2016 second-round pick (#61) on 3/15/16. Received "non-exclusive" franchise tag on 2/27/17 and signed a new five-year contract with Cardinals on 3/10/17.

2018: Voted a team captain for the first time in his career and played all 16 games (all starts) at defensive end for the third consecutive season and fourth time overall, totaling 54 tackles, 14 tackles for loss, a team-high 13.0 sacks, a career-high six passes defended, three forced fumbles and a fumble recovery ... named the Lloyd Herberg team MVP by the local PFWA chapter for the second consecutive season ... donated \$40,000 to Phoenix



Children's Hospital after pledging \$20,000 for each of his sacks during the final two games of the season ... had three tackles, one for loss, two QB hits, a QB pressure and a strip-sack of Alex Smith in the season-opener vs. Was (9/9) ... sacked Mitchell Trubisky for a five-yard loss on third down and tipped a Trubisky pass that was intercepted by Tre Boston vs. Chi (9/23); became the fastest player in franchise history to collect 30.0 sacks with the team (35 games) ... sacked Russell Wilson for a six-yard loss on fourth-and-one with 34 seconds remaining in the first half vs. Sea (9/30) ... had six tackles, recovered his own strip-sack of C.J. Beathard and matched a career high with two passes defended, including a batted pass on a failed two-point conversion @ SF (10/7); earned NFC Defensive Player of the Week honors for his performance ... had a strip-sack of Kirk Cousins, which was recovered and returned 36 yards for a TD by Budda Baker to tie the game at 10 late in the second quarter @ Min (10/14); finished the game with five tackles, one for loss, 1.5 sacks, two QB hits, one pass defended and a forced fumble ... dropped Case Keenum in the second quarter vs. Den (10/18), notching his fifth consecutive game with a sack, tying the second-longest streak in franchise history ... recorded six tackles, two for loss, two QB hits, two QB pressures and two sacks for a unit that held the NFL's top-ranked scoring offense to a season-low 26 points @ KC (11/11) ... collected four tackles, one for loss, two QB hits, two QB pressures and two sacks vs. Oak (11/18); trailed only Freddie Joe Nunn (11.0 in 1988) for the most sacks through 10 games in franchise history with 10.5 ... totaled three tackles, two for loss, two QB hits, three QB pressures, a sack and a pass defended for a defense that held Aaron Rodgers to a 4.66 yards-per-pass-attempt average (233 yards on 50 attempts) and a 79.8 passer rating @ GB (12/2); became the fastest player in franchise history to reach 40.0 sacks (43 games) with his first-career sack of Rodgers ... sacked Wilson for a seven-yard loss on third-and-three to force one of Seattle's eight punts @ Sea (12/30); notched a strip-sack of Wilson late in the third quarter, which was returned for a TD by Patrick Peterson, but the play was nullified by a questionable defensive holding penalty.

2017: Started all 16 games and set a single-season franchise record with an NFL-leading 17.0 sacks; the previous record was set by Simeon Rice (16.5) in 1999 ... finished his second season in Arizona with 68 tackles, 17.0 sacks, 28 tackles for loss, 38 QB hits, two forced fumbles and 15 QB pressures, earning first-team All-Pro honors for the first time in his career and his second career Pro Bowl bid (first as a Cardinal and first as a LB) ... became the first player in team history to lead the NFL in sacks, while also pacing the league in tackles for loss (28) and QB

hits (38) ... had seven more tackles for loss than any other player in the NFL, the biggest gap between first and second place since 2012 when J.J. Watt (39) topped Von Miller (28) ... had four tackles and sacked Matthew Stafford for a seven-yard loss @ Det (9/10) ... totaled a season-high seven tackles, 2.0 sacks, two tackles for loss, two QB hits and a forced fumble @ Ind (9/17) ... tallied three tackles, one for loss and a sack vs. Dal (9/25) ... recorded five tackles, one for loss, 1.0 sack and two QB hits @ Phi (10/8) ... notched four tackles and two sacks vs. TB (10/15) ... collected five tackles and one sack @ LAR (10/22) ... posted two tackles, one sack, one tackle for loss and two QB hits @ SF (11/5); dropped C.J. Jones recorded his 40th sack as a member of the Cardinals when he took down Packers QB Aaron Rodgers in Week 13. Jones reached 40 sacks with the Cardinals in just his 44th game with the team. He reached the career milestone in fewer games than any other player in franchise history.

Cardinals All-Pro **Chandler Jones** recorded 13.0 sacks in 2018. Combined with his 11.0 sacks in 2016 and 17.0 sacks in 2017, he became the first player in franchise history with 10+ sacks in three consecutive seasons.

Jones is the only player in franchise history with at least 11.0+ sacks in three different seasons. He joined Washington's Ryan Kerrigan also the only players in the NFL with 11.0+ sacks in each of the last three seasons.

Pro Bowler Chandler Jones leads the NFL with 41 sacks since coming to the Cardinals in 2016. While dominating on the field, he has also been active in the Arizona community.

Last season, Jones donated \$40,000 to Phoenix Children's Hospital in December. He originally pledged \$20,000 to PCH for every sack he collected in the Cardinals final two games of the season. He recorded one in the team's season finale at Seattle, but opted to double the donation to \$40,000.

In the offseason, he joined representatives from the Cardinals and the Be Kind Crew to participate in an anti-bullying assembly in Phoenix. Jones passed along a message about kindness and what to do instead of what not to do when it comes to bullying.

He also hosted his second annual football camp last June for 75 kids at the Dignity Health Cardinals Training Center. The kids had the opportunity to learn proper technique and training tips while also taking part in a Q&A with Jones.

In the offseason, he teamed with the Stabler Foundation to provide backpacks for the Sunshine Pack Drive to benefit the Arizona Children's Cancer Foundation. Kirk donated 400 backpacks and took part in an event to help collect arts and crafts, books, journals, games, headphones and other small goods to include in the packs for children.

To honor their daughter's memory, the Lee's established Madelyn's Fund, a non-profit designed to support NICU (Neonatal Intensive Care Unit) families through the process, including those who experience the trauma of losing a child. The average NICU daily cost is \$3,500 per infant, so for many, the grief is compounded by financial stress.

Each year, Madelyn's fund hosts a celebrity golf tournament in Charlotte and a Pink Bow Gala to raise money for NICU patients and their families.

Since joining the team in 2017, Andy has also been active in the Phoenix community. Last year, he attended the Cardinals annual "Teddy Bear Express" event to deliver teddy bears to children in the pediatric units at Phoenix Children's Hospital.

CARDINALS IN THE COMMUNITY

Ever since defensive lineman Corey Peters signed with the Cardinals as a free agent in 2015, he has displayed his commitment to the Arizona community through his various charitable appearances.

This past offseason, Peters and team mascot Big Red participated in a Gatorade Jr. Training Camp in Gilbert for 150 special needs students. For the second time as a Cardinal, Peters and Nicole Bidwill took part in the team's annual "Pink Game" to support Breast Cancer Awareness. Last season, the group from the Cardinals recognized Breast Cancer survivors at the Mesa High School game against Westwood High School in October. In 2016, Peters visited Greenway High School for the Cardinals annual "Pink Game" and participated in a special halftime presentation to honor breast cancer survivors.



Peters was also selected as the Cardinals 2018 nominee for the Art Rooney Sportsmanship Award. Established in 2014 in honor of the late founding owner of the Pittsburgh Steelers and Pro Football Hall of Famer Art Rooney, Sr., the annual award recognizes players who demonstrate qualities of on-field sportsmanship, including fair play, respect for the game and opponents and integrity in competition.

In 2017, Peters joined a number of teammates and a group from the Cardinals Women's Club to visit Phoenix Children's Hospital for a birthday party in the Kids Zone. Each month, the Kids Zone at PCH holds a party for all patients who have a birthday in that month. The Arizona Cardinals Women's Club sponsored the event, which featured games with the patients as well as pizza and cake. Peters also hosted 20 families from the Arizona Cardinals Preparatory Academy for a Holiday Kids Camp. Peters and his teammates adopted the students and families at the Preparatory Academy so they could have a happy holiday season. In addition to the Kids Camp, the students got presents from the Cardinals and each family received a free mattress donated by Brooklyn Bedding.

During the holiday season, Peters and Cardinals teammates visited Boys Hope Girls Hope for the team's annual Christmas Party. Boys Hope Girls Hope helps academically capable and motivated children by providing family like homes, opportunities and education through college.

In the 2017 offseason, Peters was part of a group of Cardinals players that joined Arizona Governor Doug Ducey to participate in the annual "Read Across America" program at the Phoenix Salvation Army KROC Center. The event took place on Dr. Seuss' birthday (March 2) and helps motivate children to read and focuses the country's attention on the importance of reading. He was back at the KROC Center and partnered with teammates for the "Team Smile" event to provide 300 kids free dental care while participating in an Easter Egg hunt.

In 2016, he was part of a group from the Cardinals that took part in a field ribbon cutting ceremony at Thew Elementary School in Tempe, AZ to create a lighted football field for the school's physical education program and for the city. 2011: Started all 16 games at CB and had a record-setting season as a punt returner, scoring four TDs and totaling 699 yards on 44 returns ... tied the NFL single-season record and set the franchise all-time record with four punt return TDs ... established an NFL rookie record with 699 punt return yards, which is also a franchise single-season record and ranks as the second-highest single-season total in NFL history (Desmond Howard, 875, 1996) ... led the league with four punt return TDs and 699 punt return yards and ranked second with a 15.9-yard return average ... selected to the Pro Bowl as a kick returner, becoming the first Cardinal rookie since Anquan Boldin (2003) to earn Pro Bowl honors; joined Johnny Bailey (1992) and Vai Sikahema (1986-87) as the only players in franchise history to be named to the Pro Bowl as a kick returner ... named to the AP All-Pro team as a kick returner, the only rookie named to the team ... on defense, totaled 63 tackles and one sack, and tied for second on the team with two INTs and 13 passes defended ... blocked two FGs, helping the Cardinals lead the NFL with five blocked FGs on the season ... started at CB in first career NFL game vs. Car (9/11); scored the game-winning TD with an 89-yard punt return in the fourth quarter, which marked the second-longest punt return in franchise history at the time (95 yards, Frank Bernardi, 10/14/56 at Washington); became the first player in Cardinals history to return a punt for a TD in the season opener and it was the third-longest play on opening weekend in team history; became the fifth Cardinals rookie to return a punt for a TD; also recorded three solo tackles on defense ... recorded his first career INT @ Sea (9/25) ... returned a punt 82 yards for a TD in the second quarter @ Bal (10/30); marked his second punt return TD of the season, becoming the eighth player in franchise history to have at least two punt returns for TDs in a season; became the first player in team history with two career punt returns of 80+ yards ... scored the game-winning TD with a franchise-record 99-yard punt return in overtime vs. StL (11/6); became the first player in NFL history with three punt return TDs in his first eight career games; marked just the second game-winning punt return in overtime in NFL history (Kansas City's Tamarick Vanover, 86 yards vs. San Diego, 10/9/95); was the second-longest punt return in NFL history, behind only L.A. Rams Robert Bailey's 103-yard TD return vs. New Orleans on 10/23/94; became the first player in franchise history with three punt return TDs in a season and tied Ollie Matson and Vai Sikahema for the franchise career record; became the first player in Cardinals history and just the eighth player in the NFL since 1970 with a punt return TD in consecutive games; also had his second INT of the season, picking off Sam

Bradford on a flea flicker in the first quarter, and collected four tackles and a career-high three passes defended; named NFC Special Teams Player of the Week ... blocked David Akers 30-yard FG attempt in the second quarter @ SF (11/20); also had four unassisted tackles on defense and returned two punts for 22 yards ... returned a punt 80 yards for a TD in the third quarter @ StL (11/27); fourth punt return TD gave him the most of any player in franchise history, breaking a tie with Ollie Matson and Vai Sikahema; tied the NFL single-season record with four punt return TDs in a season and was just the second rookie to do so (Jack Christiansen, Detroit, 1951); became the first player in NFL history with four punt return TDs of 80+ yards in a season; combined with his 99-yard punt return TD against the Rams in week nine, joined Vai Sikahema (two against Tampa Bay on 12/21/96) as the only Cardinals with multiple punt return TDs against a single opponent in the same season; also led the DBs with five tackles; named NFL Special Teams Player of the Week; became the first player in team history to win Player of the Week twice in the same season against the same team; won NFC Special Teams Player of the Month for November ... recorded his first career sack vs. SF (12/11), helping the Cardinals total five sacks for the second straight game; totaled five tackles and had one QB pressure ... had a 32-yard punt return in OT that helped lead to the game-winning FG vs. Cle (12/18); collected two tackles on defense ... posted one tackle for loss and two passes defended @ Cin (12/24); also had his first career pass reception on offense ... returned four punts for 63 yards vs. Sea (1/1/12), setting a new rookie record with 699 punt return yards on the season; surpassed previous record-holder Louis Lipps (656, 1984) with a 42-yard return in the second quarter; blocked Steven Hauschka's 24-yard FG attempt in the third quarter, his second FG block of the season and fifth overall by the Cardinals; added four tackles on defense.

Played in 39 games (30 starts) and totaled 135 tackles, seven INTs, 22 passes defended, a forced fumble and a fumble recovery in three seasons before leaving for the NFL following his junior season ... one of the nation's most decorated collegiate players in 2010, winning both the Bednarik Award (nation's top defender) and the Thorpe Award (nation's top defensive back) ... the first LSU player to win either award and became the first defensive back to win the Bednarik Award since Michigan's Charles Woodson in 1997 ... scored four TDs during his Tigers career, returning two punts, an INT and a blocked FG for TDs ... a unanimous All-American selection as a junior in '10 ... also became the first player in LSU history to win the Thorpe Award as the nation's top DB ... earned SEC Defensive Player of the Year and Special Teams Player of the Year honors from the league's coaches ... All-SEC first-team selection as a CB and return specialist ... a defensive captain, started all 13 games at right CB and totaled 42 tackles (29 solos), four INTs and six passes defended ... added 1.5 tackles for loss, one QB hurry and blocked a FGA for a defense that ranked in the top 12 nationally in three categories (scoring defense, pass defense and total defense) ... returned two punts for TDs ... established school records with 32 kickoffs for 932 yards, ranking first in the SEC and ninth in the country with an average of 29.1 yards per return ... 932 kick return yards ranked as the fifth-best total in SEC history and shattered the previous school record of 618 yards (Domanick Davis-1999) ... returned 26 punts for 418 yards and two TDs, placing first in the SEC and fourth in the country with an average of 16.1 yards per return ... All-SEC second-team choice by the league's coaches and media and co-recipient of LSU's Percy E. Roberts Award as the team's most outstanding defensive player during his sophomore season in '09 ... earned second-team All-American honors from the Sporting News ... started all 13 games at right CB and tallied a career-high 52 tackles (43 solos), two INTs (one of which he returned for a TD) and 13 passes defended ... also recovered one fumble ... picked up a blocked FGA and raced 53 yards for a TD in the first quarter at Ole Miss ... played in 13 games with four starts as a freshman in '08, starting the final four contests of the



CARDINALS IN THE COMMUNITY

Pro Bowler Patrick Peterson's play on the field has made him one of the NFL's brightest stars. The Cardinals two-time (2015 and '17) "Walter Payton NFL Man of the Year" has used his status to give back to the community through the development of his own foundation, the Patrick Peterson Foundation for Success.

Being selected as the Cardinals "Walter Payton NFL Man of the Year" helps recognize a player's off-the-field community service as well as his playing excellence. As part of the award in 2017, Peterson received a \$50,000 donation to the Patrick Peterson Foundation for Success and an additional \$50,000 donation in his name to expand Arizona's United Way Character Playbook program. He also received two Super Bowl LII tickets to give to a community hero. In 2015, the NFL provided \$5,000 to Peterson's foundation and Nationwide offered an additional \$10,000 for receiving the honor.

Peterson was also selected as the Cardinals 2017 nominee for the Art Rooney Sportsmanship Award. Established in 2014 in honor of the late founding owner of the Pittsburgh Steelers and Pro Football Hall of Famer Art Rooney, Sr., the annual award recognizes players who demonstrate qualities of on-field sportsmanship, including fair play, respect for the game and opponents and integrity in competition.

Established in 2013, the Patrick Peterson Foundation for Success aims to provide low-income and inner-city youth with opportunities and resources to reach their full potential. The foundation hopes to implement an excellent balance for community development through a variety of programs, events and charitable initiatives held throughout the year. The foundation's signature program is "Patrick's Corner" – a literacy program that places libraries in schools and inner-city community center. All 14 Patrick's Corners are furnished with bookshelves, beanbag chairs, a reading module, audio library, and a stereo listening center—providing at-risk students with access to 1,200 age-appropriate books. Each corner serves as a dedicated area where students and their families can read, learn and explore together.

In collaboration with "Patrick's Corner," Peterson launched the "Pick Up a Book" initiative within the Phoenix community which is designed to bring families, schools and communities together to support children's literacy development.

The program works to:

- Help families foster the skills, attitudes and behaviors that support children's literacy development
- Help schools engage families through fun, literacy-based events
- Better prepare children for reading and learning
- Support schools with their family engagement goals

In September of 2017, Peterson expanded upon the foundation's signature program through a community partnership with Arizona non-profit, Furnishing Dignity. Through the partnership, mini Patrick's Corners have been implemented into the homes of families who need furnishings and other essential household items.

In May of 2017, Peterson and his wife, Antonique, visited Haiti as guests of Mission of Hope. They visited schools, helped children read and write, and played soccer and kickball. Antonique, who is a doctor, assisted at medical centers. The pair also collected fresh water from local spring wells for villages without clean water.

Last December, Peterson hosted his sixth annual "Shop with a Jock" event at Walmart. Peterson, with the help of Santa and his teammates, hosts the holiday event each year for 50 low-income and at-risk inner-city families and provides the children with a unique holiday shopping experience. He has also hosted an annual "Show and Tell" car show in the offseason the last six years in Mesa to benefit his foundation.

He hosted his fourth annual Patrick Peterson "Celebrity Golf Tournament" in May of 2019. The two-day event included a red-carpet VIP welcome party and a golf tournament at Superstition Mountain Golf and Country Club in Gold Canyon. Peterson has also hosted "Celebrity Golf Challenge" events at Topgolf in Arizona to benefit his foundation and his "Celebs and Steaks" fundraising dinner featuring celebrities as waiters.

His commitment to helping people isn't exclusive to Arizona. When devastating floods ravaged Baton Rouge, LA in 2016, Peterson and his former LSU and Cardinals teammate Tyrann Mathieu stepped up to help. They joined forces and purchased school supplies and clothing for 700 children, including 100 kids from the Boys & Girls Club of Baton Rouge. In addition, Peterson helped raise more than \$40,000 for the Baton Rouge Area Foundation through a fantasy football-based charity tournament with the winners getting the opportunity to attend the LSU-Alabama game as Peterson's guests. Peterson plans to expand the Patrick's Corner initiative to his home state of Florida in the future.

In addition to his foundation work, Peterson is also very active at Cardinals team community events. He has visited Boys Hope Girls Hope for the team's annual Christmas party. Boys Hope Girls Hope helps academically capable and motivated children-in-need to meet their full potential by providing value-centered, family-like homes, opportunities and education through college. He also made a special trip to Dignity Health Chandler Regional Medical Center in 2017 to visit families in the birth center, congratulate new parents and deliver Cardinals teddy bears.

In 2016, he joined Cardinals teammates for the annual "Light the House" party to help spread holiday cheer at the Phoenix Ronald McDonald House. The group provided the families at the house with dinner, drinks and dessert while also passing out stockings to the children.

Peterson has also participated in the team's annual "Teddy Bear Express" event at Phoenix Children's Hospital. The players delivered personalized Cardinals teddy bears to children in the pediatric units throughout the hospital. This past November, Peterson and the Cardinals took part at Phoenix Children Hospital's annual Giving Tuesday fundraiser, helping to raise over \$200,000 for the hospital.

As part of Breast Cancer Awareness Month in 2014, Peterson visited Red Mountain High School in Mesa for a special pregame presentation for 10 breast cancer survivors prior to a high school football game against Desert Mountain. He joined Nicole Bidwill and presented each survivor with a commemorative football while the Cardinals provided both teams with pink gloves, wrist bands, socks and shoelaces.

This past Thanksgiving, Peterson hosted his second annual "Thanksgiving Giveaway" where he partnered with the United Food Bank of Arizona to provide Thanksgiving meals to 221 Arizona families in need. He also previously took part at the team's "Feed the Hungry" program at the Phoenix Rescue Mission during Thanksgiving. Peterson joined team President Michael Bidwill and Cardinals teammates and served Thanksgiving dinner for the less fortunate.

In January of 2015, Peterson joined Bidwill and Cardinals teammates at the NFL's Super Bowl Legacy Grant event leading up to Super Bowl XLIX in Arizona by participating at a press conference that was followed up by a Heads Up Football Clinic at ASU Preparatory Academy. In the spring of 2013, Peterson joined Cardinals teammates, Bidwill, former Cardinals head coach Bruce Arians and General Manager Steve Keim and took part in a tweetup hosted by NBC's Peter King at Tom's Tavern the night before Pat's Run to benefit the Tillman Foundation.

CARDINALS IN THE COMMUNITY

Since entering the league with the Giants in the first round of the 2013 NFL Draft, offensive lineman **Justin Pugh** has used the platform provided to him to become a positive influence in the community. He stayed busy in the Arizona community during his first season with the Cardinals in 2018.

As the brother of an active duty United State Air Force servicemember, supporting the military and first responders has always been close to Pugh's heart. He joined Cardinals teammates to visit Luke Air Force base in November as part of the NFL's Salute to Service month. The group from the Cardinals got an up-close look at F-35's and F-16's from the 61st Fight Squadron and visited various personnel stationed on the base.



As part of the NFL's "My Cause, My Cleats" campaign the past three years he has partnered with Merging Vets and Players, a program that was designed to address the challenge of transitioning from the battlefield to home by creating an environment where veterans and athletes can share their strength and experience.

Last December, Pugh hosted 50 local youth for a private, advance screening of Spider-Man: Into the Spider-Verse. The group of kids came from Heart for the City AZ, a Phoenix-based nonprofit that works with underprivileged youth to provide wholistic academic, physical, mental and professional programming. In addition to the screening, Pugh provided concessions and surprised the kids with holiday gifts.

During the 2017 NFL Draft, Pugh visited Joint Base McGuire-Dix-Lakehurst in New Jersey to thank members of the military for their service, host a youth football event for their kids and announce the Giants fifth-round pick on television with his brother Michael, who was stationed at the base.

Pugh has also participated in a Pro vs. GI Joe event where players competed in video games against military veterans through the Wounded Warrior Project which works to provide services and programs for wounded service members. On the 15th anniversary of 9/11, Pugh honored first responders by joining firefighters from Engine 34 Ladder 21 for a BBQ dinner at their firehouse in Hell's Kitchen.

Beyond the causes, campaigns and charitable organizations with which Pugh is associated, he hasn't missed the opportunity to impact lives through simple kindness.

While living in Jersey City, he befriended his elderly neighbor, Bill, who had lost his wife, suffered a back injury and fallen behind on his rent. The two developed a special bond, and Pugh's financial assistance prevented Bill from being evicted from his home of more than 30 years. Despite the move to Arizona, Pugh continues to speak with Bill and his son weekly.

Each summer since 2015 he hosts the Pugh Crew Summer Kickoff, a free football camp in his hometown of Bucks County, PA. The camp allows 250 local boys and girls the opportunity to receive instruction from Pugh, other NFL and college players and professional coaches while also developing teambuilding skills, learning how to set goals and building confidence.

During his time in New York, Pugh served as the national spokesperson for Shriners Hospitals for Children and their Game Day for LOVE campaign which supports the life-saving and life-changing care to kids in need of specialized medical care. As part of the campaign, Pugh hosted a viewing party, featuring a raffle and silent auction, in New York City when his alma mater, Syracuse, took on Clemson in 2014. In Week 17 the 2014 season, Pugh hosted three Shriners patients at the Giants home game against the Eagles. The patients and their families were treated to a VIP tour of the stadium and received pregame field passes. Pugh also supported Shriners on the gameshow "Who Wants to be a Millionaire" during their charity week in 2015 and won \$10,000 for the organization, in addition to a \$10,000 check from Pugh directly.

Since entering the league in 2013, Pugh has hosted and supported many other charitable causes and events including the following:

- Play 60 clinic at the NFL Experience during Super Bowl LI
- Co-host for the 2017 NBC4 and Telemundo Health and Fitness Expo Presented by Quest Diagnostics at MetLife Stadium
- Attended the Tom Coughlin Jay Fund's Champions for Children Gala which raises money to support the families of children with cancer
- Attended The Children's Hospital of Philadelphia's annual fundraising gala

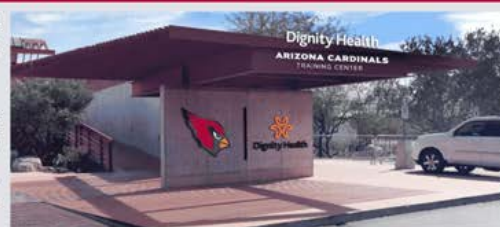

ARIZONA AND DAYLIGHT SAVING TIME

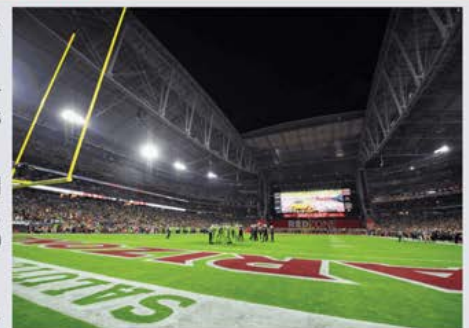
Every year people across the country turn their clocks ahead in the spring and back in the fall, except in Arizona.

Although Arizona stays on standard time throughout the year, never changing its clock forward or back, the time change, or lack thereof, does affect the Cardinals local kickoff times during the season.

In 2019, daylight saving time was observed on the second Sunday in March (March 10) and ends on the first Sunday in November (November 3). When daylight saving time is in effect, Arizona is three hours behind the east coast, making a 4:00 p.m. kickoff in New York a 1:00 p.m. kickoff in Arizona.

However, when daylight saving time ends, Arizona is only two hours behind the east coast, making a 4:00 p.m. kickoff in New York a 2:00 p.m. kickoff in Arizona.

In 1967 the Uniform Time Act was instituted, putting the entire country on daylight saving time. After one year, states could opt out, and Arizona went back to standard time and stayed there. Residents and lawmakers of Arizona knew there was an abundance of sunshine and did not see the need to move their clocks ahead in order to save any. The only other state that does not observe Daylight Saving Time is Hawaii.

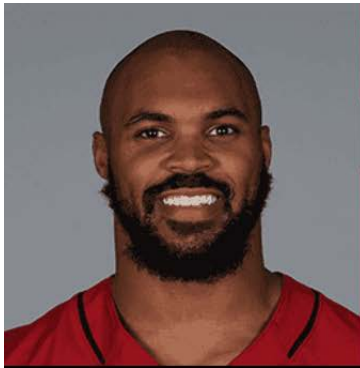

NFL CELEBRATES ITS 100TH YEAR IN 2019

The NFL is celebrating its 100th season in 2019. As the United States' oldest professional football franchise still in existence, the Cardinals hold a unique place in league history.

The Cardinals were founded in 1898 as the Morgan Athletic Club, predating the formation of the NFL by over 20 years. By the time the NFL was founded in 1920 as the American Professional Football Association (APFA), the team was known as the Chicago Cardinals when it became one of the 14 charter members of the upstart league after paying a \$100 franchise fee. Today, the Cardinals and Chicago Bears remain the only two charter members of the NFL still in existence.

In 1933, Hall of Fame owner Charles W. Bidwill, Sr., then a vice president of the Bears, purchased the Cardinals. After divesting himself of his Bears' holdings, that began a period of family ownership that continues today with current owner **William V. Bidwill** and team president **Michael Bidwill**.

In 2019, the Cardinals will join the NFL in celebrating 100 years of play with a year-long series of "NFL 100" events, initiatives and programs celebrating fans, players and communities.

"For nearly 100 years, the NFL has been part of the fabric of America, unifying communities and bringing fans together to support their favorite teams and players," said NFL Commissioner **Roger Goodell**. "We have the greatest fans in the world and we will join them in celebrating what this incredible game means to each of us."

The historic and unprecedented celebration is a salute to the millions of fans who love the game; highlighting the unifying nature of football and its positive impact in communities; bringing together generations of past, present and future players; and looking ahead to the NFL's next 100 years. 100 Footballs Hidden Throughout Arizona Celebrate 100 Seasons Of The NFL

To celebrate "NFL 100" the Cardinals participated in a fan-centered "Surprise and Delight" campaign that involved 100 customized NFL footballs hidden in various locations across the state of Arizona for fans to find. Among the 100 balls were three exclusive golden footballs that earned fans the chance to win Cardinals season tickets for the 2019 season.

Cardinals vs. Bears and Cardinals vs. Packers - The NFL's Two Oldest Rivalries

Having met twice during the NFL's inaugural season in 1920, the Cardinals and Bears hold the oldest rivalry in league history. The Cardinals and Packers – who joined the league in 1921 – represents the NFL's second-oldest rivalry. The Packers were formed in 1919 by Earl (Curly) Lambeau and George Calhoun but did not gain entry into the APFA until 1921.

- The Cardinals and Bears have faced each other 90 times during the regular season, dating back to 1920.
- The first-ever meeting between the Cardinals and Bears – then known as the Racine Cardinals and Decatur Staleys – occurred at Normal Park in Chicago on November 28th, 1920, exactly 72 days after the league was conceived as the APFA during a meeting in Canton, OH. In that game, the Cardinals defeated the Staleys 7-6 at Normal Park.

• Having been lured to the Cardinals by owner Chris O'Brien shortly after the team joined the APFA with a then-unheard of \$3,000-a-year contract, future Hall of Fame HB John "Paddy" Driscoll scored on the game's only TD in the Cardinals first meeting against the Bears.

• The first meeting between the Cardinals and Packers (a 3-3 tie) occurred on November 20, 1921 at Normal Park in Chicago. The following week (November 27, 1921), the Packers and Bears met for the first time when the Staleys defeated the visitor from Green Bay 20-0.

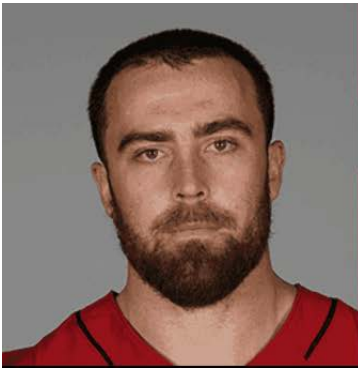

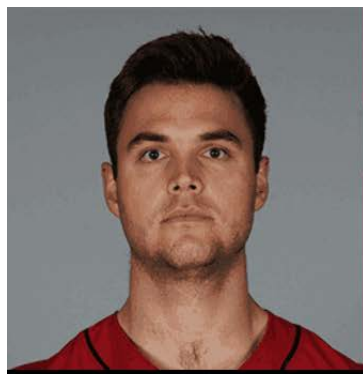
