



ARIZONA CARDINALS NOTE CARDS

- 7** Consecutive games for RB **James Conner** with 80+ scrimmage yards and a TD dating back to his return to Pittsburgh in Week 13 last season. It marks the longest active streak of games with 80+ scrimmage yards and a TD in the NFL. Only Colts RB Jonathan Taylor (11 games in 2021) had a longer such streak over the last 15 seasons.
- 10** Tackles for S **Jalen Thompson** in his last meeting with the Lions (@ Det - 12/19/21). That total matched a career high.
- 3** Consecutive games with at least one tackle for loss for LB **Zaven Collins**. Only four NFL players have a longer streak of games with at least one tackle for loss than Collins (LV DL Maxx Crosby - 9 games, Cle DL Myles Garrett - 6, Det DL Aidan Hutchinson - 4, LAR LB Byron Young - 4). It marks Collins' third time having 3+ consecutive games with a tackle for loss in his career.
- 1.5** Sacks for DL **Justin Jones** when he last faced Detroit, his former division rival during his time in Chicago. Jones finished the game (vs. Det - 12/10/23) with six tackles and 1.5 sacks in a 28-13 Bears victory.

WITH A WIN...

- The Cardinals would improve to 6-2-1 at home vs. the Lions since beginning play at State Farm Stadium in 2006.
- The Cards would improve to 14-9-1 overall against Detroit since moving to Arizona in 1988.
- Arizona would improve to 2-0 in conference play in 2024.

MILESTONES WITHIN REACH...

QB KYLER MURRAY

- With 50+ rushing yards, Murray would have 50+ rushing yards in at least three consecutive games for just the second time in his career. He had a streak of four such outings (Games 6-9) in 2020.
- With a rushing TD, Murray would have 27 rushing TDs as a member of the Cardinals. That would tie Johnny Roland (1966-72) and Elmer Angsman (1946-52) for seventh place on the franchise all-time list for career rushing TDs.

RB JAMES CONNER

- With a TD (of any kind), Conner would have at least one TD in eight consecutive games dating back to last season. That would establish a new franchise record for consecutive games with a TD.
- With a rushing TD, Conner would have at least one rushing TD in five consecutive games dating back to last season. That would match the longest streak in franchise history for consecutive games with a rushing TD (currently held by seven others, including himself in 2021).
- With a rushing TD, Conner would have 32 rushing TDs with Arizona. That would tie Stump Mitchell for fifth place on the franchise all-time list for career rushing TDs.
- With a rushing TD, Conner would have 32 rushing TDs in 44 games played with the Cardinals. That would mark the most of any Cardinal in their first 44 games with the team.

LB DENNIS GARDECK

- With a sack, Gardeck would have 4.0 sacks through three games in 2024. Just once in franchise history has a player had more sacks through the first three games of a season (Chandler Jones - 5.0 sacks in 2021). Only three NFL players (Det DL Aidan Hutchinson - 5.5 sacks, NE DL Keion White - 4.0, Min LB Patrick Jones II - 4.0) have more sacks than Gardeck (3.0) this season.

TE TREY MCBRIDE

- With a reception, McBride would have at least one catch in 28 consecutive games. McBride and Elijah Higgins (nine) are the only TE duo in the NFL to each have an active streak of 9+ games with at least one catch.
- With 5+ receptions, McBride would have 5+ catches in three consecutive games and for the 11th time in his last 13 games.

K MATT PRATER

- With 1 point, Prater would become the only active player with 1,800+ points in his career.

WR MARVIN HARRISON JR.

- With a TD reception, Harrison would join John Brown (3 in 2014), Steve Lach (3 in 1942) and Gaynell Tinsley (3 in 1937) as the only rookies in Cardinals history with 3+ TD receptions through his first three career games.
- With 2 TD receptions, Harrison would join Larry Fitzgerald (Games 15-16 in 2004) as the only rookies in franchise history to have multiple TD catches in back-to-back games.
- With 100+ receiving yards, Harrison would become the first rookie in franchise history with 100+ receiving yards in back-to-back games.

LB KYZIR WHITE

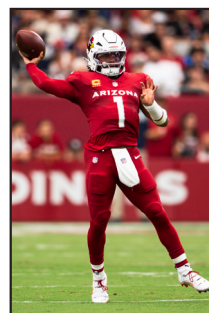
- With 4 tackles, White would reach 500 in his career.

FOR THE RECORD

Following a record-setting performance last Sunday vs. the Rams that **earned him FedEx Air NFL Player of the Week after he completed 17-of-21 passes for 266 yards, 3 TDs and a "perfect" passer rating of 158.3**, QB **Kyler Murray** has a chance to re-write team record books yet again.

With last week's performance, Murray joined Hall of Fame QB Kurt Warner as the only players in Cardinals history to finish a game with a "perfect" passer rating of 158.3. **With 266 passing yards on the day, Murray (16,075) also passed Warner (15,843) for the fifth-most passing yards in franchise history.**

With three touchdown passes on Sunday vs. Detroit, Murray would pass Warner (98) for the fifth-most passing touchdowns in franchise history. It would also mark the fourth time in his NFL career he had 3+ TD passes in consecutive games and match Neil Lomax (15) for the most games with 3+ passing TDs in franchise history.

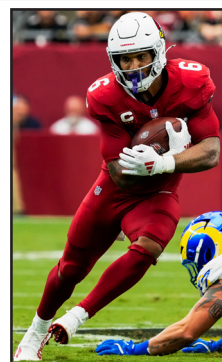
READY TO RUN

Following an incredibly successful season running the football in 2023 when the team ranked fourth in the NFL in rushing (2,365 yards) and second in rushing average (5.02), the Cardinals have continued to excel in the run game through the first two games of the 2024 season.

Following last Sunday's 231-rushing yard performance, the Cardinals rank in the top five in a number of run game categories dating back to the start of the 2023 season.

LIVING IN THE BACKFIELD

Last Sunday vs. the Rams, **the Cardinals had 12 tackles for loss which tied for the most by the team in a single game (12 vs. Sea - 1/1/12) since the NFL began tracking the statistic in 1999.**

Combined with Arizona's five tackles for loss in Week 1, the team currently leads the NFL in TFLs.
