



ARIZONA CARDINALS NOTE CARDS

- 11** Seasons that Browns head coach Freddie Kitchens spent as an assistant with Arizona (2007-17). Kitchens spent more seasons with the Cardinals than any other assistant coach in franchise history. He served as a TE's coach, QB's coach and RB's coach during his time in Arizona.
- 102** Total TDs (passing and rushing) for **Kyler Murray** (54 in 2018) and **Baker Mayfield** (48 in 2017) in their Heisman-winning seasons at the University of Oklahoma. Both QBs led the Sooners to 12-2 records, Big 12 Championship Game victories and CFP appearances in their final season.
- 5** Players in NFL history that had 30+ rushing TDs and 15+ receiving TDs in their first five NFL seasons: RBs **David Johnson**, **Thurman Thomas**, **Marcus Allen**, **Chuck Foreman** and **Abner Haynes**. Johnson hauled in his 15th career TD reception last week vs. Pittsburgh.
- 17** Consecutive FG attempts **K Zane Gonzalez** has made dating back to Week 5 at Cincinnati. That is the longest active streak in the NFL (Saints **K Wil Lutz** is second with 13 in a row).

MILESTONES WITHIN REACH...

WR LARRY FITZGERALD

- With a reception, Fitzgerald would have at least one catch in 241 consecutive games, extending the second-longest streak in NFL history (**Jerry Rice** - 274).
- With 31 receiving yards, Fitzgerald would reach 700 receiving yards in 2019. It would give him at least 700 yards in all 16 seasons he has been in the league, extending the longest streak in NFL history.
- With 52 receiving yards, Fitzgerald would reach 17,000 for his career.

LB CHANDLER JONES

- With a sack, Jones would have 15.0 sacks in 2019 and 56.0 sacks in 62 games with the Cardinals. His 15.0 sacks would rank fourth on the franchise single-season sacks list and would also tie his own franchise record for sacks through 14 games, a mark he set in 2017 when he went on to lead the NFL with a Cardinals single-season record 17.0 sacks.
- With a sack, Jones would have at least a partial sack in 11 of 14 games this season, including in each of the last six games.
- With two sacks, Jones (57.0 in 62 games) would pass **Calais Campbell** (56.5 in 138 games) and move into second place on the franchise all-time sack list behind only **Freddie Joe Nunn** (66.5). It was also give him 16.0 sacks in 2019, just one shy of tying his own franchise record for sacks in a season (17.0 in 2017).

QB KYLER MURRAY

- With a win, Murray would tie the franchise record for wins by a rookie QB (4).
- With two TD passes, Murray would have multiple TD passes in eight games this season, extending his franchise record. In NFL history the only QB to have more such performances during their rookie season would be the Browns **Baker Mayfield** (9 in 2018).
- With a rushing TD, Murray would have five rushing TDs in 2019. Among Cardinals QBs, only **Jim Hart** (6 in 1968) would have more in a single season.
- With 54 rushing yards, Murray would establish a new franchise record for rushing yards by a QB. The current record of 501 was set by Hall of Famer **Charley Trippi** in 1951.
- With 300 passing yards, Murray (5) would join **Andrew Luck** (6 in 2012) as the only two players in NFL history with at least five 300-yard passing performances during their rookie season.

RB DAVID JOHNSON

- With a TD (of any kind), Johnson would have 50 career TDs. He would reach 50 TDs in fewer games (61) than any other player in franchise history. The current record is held by John David Crow (66 games).
- With a TD (of any kind), Johnson would tie Hall of Famer **Ollie Matson** for sixth place on the franchise all-time list for career TDs (50).
- With two TDs (of any kind), Johnson would tie **Ottis Anderson** and **John David Crow** for fourth place on the franchise all-time list for career TDs (51).

LB JORDAN HICKS

- With an INT, Hicks would become just the fifth LB in franchise history with at least four INTs in a season. He would join **Karlos Dansby** (4 in 2013), **Ronald McKinnon** (5 in 1998), **E.J. Junior** (5 in 1985) and **Leon Sanford** (5 in 1956) as the only LBs to accomplish the feat.
- With 10 tackles, Hicks would become the first Cardinals defender to post 10+ tackles in at least eight games in a season since both **Ronald McKinnon** and **Pat Tillman** each had eight such performances in 2000.

K ZANE GONZALEZ

- With three FGs (no misses), Gonzalez would join **Neil Rackers** (31 in 2005) as the only players in franchise history to make at least 20 consecutive FG attempts.
- With three FGs, Gonzalez would also become just the fifth player in franchise history with at least 30 FGs in a season.

JOHNSON NAMED MAN OF THE YEAR

On Thursday (12/12), the Cardinals named RB **David Johnson** the "Arizona Cardinals/Walter Payton NFL Man of the Year."

The award is in recognition of outstanding community service activities off the field as well as excellence on the field. Johnson will receive a donation of up to \$50,000 in his name to a charity of his choice, and as a nominee, he will also receive two Super Bowl LIV tickets to give to community recipients of his choice.



Johnson is one of 32 NFL "Man of the Year" recipients to qualify for the league's national 2019 "Walter Payton NFL Man of the Year" award. For the second consecutive year, all 32 team winners will be highlighted as finalists and recognized for their important work during the week leading up to Super Bowl LIV. The 2019 Walter Payton NFL "Man of the Year" will be announced during NFL Honors on February 1, the eve of Super Bowl LIV, on FOX. The winner will receive a \$250,000 donation to the charity of his choice.

In 2017, Johnson and his wife, **Meghan**, established the "Johnson Family's Mission 31 Foundation" to provide opportunities and resources to seriously ill children and their families by offering daily support and life changing experiences. David, who attended school to be a physical education teacher, and Meghan, who studied nursing with the goal of working in child oncology, both carry out the mission of their foundation with a longstanding motivation to impact the lives of children.

GAME #110 AT STATE FARM STADIUM FOR #11

Sunday's game vs. Cleveland will mark WR **Larry Fitzgerald**'s 110th career game at State Farm Stadium (he also played 15 home games at Sun Devil Stadium). In his first 109 games at State Farm Stadium, Fitzgerald caught 635 passes for 7,817 yards and 55 TDs.

In NFL history, only WR **Jerry Rice** had more receptions in a single stadium. Fitzgerald needs just 12 receptions to pass Rice for the most receptions in NFL history at a single venue, despite playing his home games at Sun Devil Stadium from 2004-05. Fitzgerald had 64 additional catches at Sun Devil Stadium.

Fitzgerald's 7,817 career receiving yards at State Farm Stadium rank second in NFL history for a single venue behind Rice (9,403 at Candlestick Park).

A CLOSE RACE FOR THE SACK TITLE

LB **Chandler Jones** - who led the NFL with 17.0 sacks in 2018 - currently ranks second in the NFL with 14.0 sacks this season.

In addition to ranking #1 and #2 in sacks this season, Jones and Shaquil Barrett are tied for the NFL lead in forced fumbles (6) and strip-sacks (6) in 2019.



On Sunday, Jones will face the Browns for just the second time in his career. Cleveland joins Baltimore and Houston as the only teams he does not have at least a partial sack against during his career.
