



ARIZONA CARDINALS NOTE CARDS

9 Combined wins for the four teams in the NFC West this season. No other division in the NFL has more than seven.

6-1 Cardinals record in their last seven games at State Farm Stadium, including a win vs. Carolina in the Week 2 home opener. That run began with Arizona's come-from-behind 17-15 victory over the L.A. Chargers on Monday Night Football in Week 7 of 2024.

1 Turnovers for the Cardinals this season. Only three teams have fewer: Buffalo, Indianapolis and Tampa Bay (each with 0). In Week 4, Arizona faces a Seahawks team that has forced five takeaways this season. Only three teams have more: Jacksonville (9), Pittsburgh (8) and Minnesota (7).

6.0 Yards per rush for **RB TREY BENSON** in his first three games this season (125 yards on 21 carries). Only Lions RB David Montgomery (6.85) has a higher rushing average among players with 20+ rushing attempts in 2015. His 52-yard run in Week 1 remains among the five longest runs of the 2025 season.

MILESTONE WATCH

WITH A WIN...

- Arizona would earn its second consecutive victory on Thursday Night Football (42-34 win vs. NO in 2022).
- The Cardinals will be 4-1 in their last five games dating back to last season.
- The Cardinals would improve to 2-0 at home in 2025 and 7-1 in their last eight games at State Farm Stadium.

MILESTONES WITHIN REACH...

QB KYLER MURRAY

- With a rushing TD, Murray would tie Stump Mitchell (32) for sixth place on the franchise all-time list for career rushing TDs.
- With 3 TD passes, Murray would have 16 career outings with 3+ TD passes. That would pass Neil Lomax (15) for the most such outings in franchise history.

WR MARVIN HARRISON JR.

- With 1 TD reception, Harrison (10) would join Sonny Randle (12), Larry Fitzgerald (11), John David Crow (10) and Mal Kunter (10) as the only players in Cardinals history to have 10+ TD catches in their first 21 career games. It would also give him three TD receptions in his last five games.

TE TREY McBRIDE

- With a TD reception, McBride would have a TD catch in consecutive weeks for the second time in his career with both occurrences coming in the last six games (Weeks 17-18 in 2024).
- With a TD reception, McBride would have a TD reception in each of his last four games played vs. division opponents.

DL CALAIS CAMPBELL

- With 1.0 sack, Campbell (113.5) would pass former All-Pro DE Sean Jones (113.0) for 25th place on the NFL's all-time sacks list.
- With 1.0 sack, Campbell would have 53.5 sacks vs. division opponents in his career. It would give him 13.5 career sacks vs. the Seahawks.
- With 2.0 sacks, Campbell would tie former Cardinals DE J.J. Watt (114.5) for 24th place on the NFL's all-time sacks list.
- With 2 QB hits, Campbell (7) would have the most in the first four games of a season during his 10 years (2008-16; '25) playing for the Cardinals.

LB JOSH SWEAT

- With 1.0 sack, Sweat would have at least 1.0 sack in three consecutive games for just the third time in his career: 5 straight (Games 11-15) in 2022 and 3 straight (Games 4-6) in 2024.

S DADRION TAYLOR-DEMERSON

- With an INT, he would record back-to-back games with a pick and become the first Cardinal to accomplish that feat since teammate S Jalen Thompson in Weeks 11 and 12 of 2023.

LS AARON BREWER

- Brewer will be playing in his 200th career game this week. He will also be playing in his 136th game as a member of the Cardinals.

BIRDS' EYE VIEW

MCBRIDE RISES IN RIVALRY GAMES

Last week at San Francisco, **TE TREY McBRIDE** recorded his first TD of the season and the seventh of his career. This season, McBride has posted 17 receptions for 182 yards and one score. Among tight ends, he ranks third in receptions and receiving yards and fourth in yards after the catch (102).

Of McBride's seven career TD receptions, four have come vs. division opponents. McBride now has at least one TD reception in three straight games vs. teams from the NFC West: Week 3 of 2025 @ SF, Week 18 of 2024 vs. SF and Week 17 of 2024 @ LAR.



CAMPBELL TURNING BACK THE CLOCK



DL CALAIS CAMPBELL has posted 11 tackles, 2.0 sacks, 2 tackles for loss and is tied for the team lead with 5 QB hits through three games this season. Among players 35-and-older, he is tied for first in sacks, second in pressures (seven), tied for fourth in tackles for loss and fifth in tackles.

As Campbell prepares to face the Seahawks and his former defensive coordinator Mike Macdonald, his 12.5 sacks vs. SEA are the most he has against any other team in his career.

BUDDA KEEPS BRINGING THE HEAT

In his last outing vs. Seattle in Week 14 of 2024, **S BUDDA BAKER** recorded a career-high 18 tackles. That ranks as the highest single-game total by any player in the NFL over the last two seasons (2024-25). He totaled 25 tackles in the two Seattle meetings last season.

So far this season, Baker has recorded 24 tackles, tied for the fifth-most among DBs. In Week 2, he had eight tackles en route to becoming the second active defensive back to reach 900 tackles for his career. Baker accomplished the feat in 124 games, the fastest DB to reach 900 career tackles in NFL history.



MACK ATTACK IN SAN FRANCISCO



LB MACK WILSON SR. recorded the first double-digit tackle game of his career last week in San Francisco where he posted 12 tackles, one tackle for loss and two passes defended. Wilson is one of two LBs in the NFL this season to record at least 12 tackles and two passes defended in the same game (Bears LB Tremaine Edmunds).

His 28 total tackles are tied for the ninth most in the league and he is the only defender in the NFL this season with 25+ tackles and 4+ passes defended.

RIVALRIES RETURN BUT IN NEW FASHION

In this week's Thursday Night Football divisional showdown between the Cardinals and Seahawks, Arizona will become the **first NFL team** to wear its Rivalries uniform that was unveiled in August.

Rivalries is the new and exciting program developed by Nike and the NFL that gives athletes and fans an opportunity to connect like never before. The goal of Rivalries is to celebrate traditions and unite communities with unique and elevated product designs.

Arizona and Seattle were among the eight teams - four in the NFC West and four in the AFC East - selected to debut Rivalries uniform in 2025 as part a program that will elevate over the next four seasons.
