ARIZONA CARDINALS

NOTE CARDS

Cardinals rookies who have had at least 10 tackles and two passes defensed in a game in the last 25 seasons. CB Kei'Trel Clark had 10 tackles and two passes defensed vs. Dallas last week, joining S Budda Baker, who had 13 tackles and two passes defensed in Week 11 of 2017, as the only Arizona rookies to accomplish that feat since at least 1999.

Receiving yards through three games for rookie WR Michael Wilson, which leads the team and ranks seventh in the NFL among rookies. Wilson is the first Cardinals rookie WR to start each of the first three games of his debut season since Larry Fitzgerald in 2004.

Interceptions thrown by the Cardinals through three games, marking the second time in team history that the team has done so (2014). Arizona is one of four teams to have not thrown an interception in 2023 (49ers, Chargers and Texans).

2 Yards per carry by RB James Conner in 2023, which is the second-highest average in the NFL this season among players with 50+ attempts, trailing only Christian McCaffrey (5.9 avg.).

WITH A WIN...

- The Cardinals would improve to 7-3 all-time at Levi's Stadium. Arizona would have more road wins at Levi's Stadium than any other team since the venue opened in 2014.
- Arizona would improve to 13-6 overall in the last 10 years against the 49ers.
- The Cardinals would improve to 17-11 on the road against NFC West opponents in the last 10 seasons.

MILESTONES WITHIN REACH...

RB JAMES CONNER

- With a rushing TD, Conner would have 25 rushing TDs as a member of the Cardinals. That would tie Pat Harder (1946-50) for ninth place on the franchise all-time list for career rushing TDs.
- With a rushing TD, Conner would have a rushing TD in at least three consecutive games for the fourth time with Arizona and the seventh time in his career.
- With a TD (of any kind), Conner would have six TDs in four games vs. the 49ers since joining the Cardinals in 2021. He would also have 15 TDs in 11 games vs. NFC West opponents during that span.
- With a TD (of any kind), Conner would have 29 TDs in 32 games with the Cardinals. In franchise history, only RB David Johnson (33) would have more TDs in his first 32 games with the team.
- With 50 scrimmage yards, Conner would have at least 50 scrimmage yards in 24 straight games, which would trail only Austin Ekeler (40 games) for the longest active streak in the NFL.

WR MARQUISE BROWN

With a TD reception, Brown would have a receiving TD in three straight games in a single season for the first time with Arizona and second time in his career (Weeks 12-14 in 2020).

<u>TE ZACH ERTZ</u>

- With a reception, Ertz would have at least one catch in 120 consecutive games. Only three NFL players have longer active streaks. Ertz has been held without a catch in just three of his 147 career regular season games.
- With four catches, Ertz would reach 700 career receptions, becoming just the eighth TE in NFL history to achieve the feat. In NFL history only Travis Kelce (126) and Jason Witten (145) would have reached the milestone in fewer games than Ertz (148).
- With 71 receiving yards, Ertz (1,063) would move into fifth place on the Cardinals all-time list for receiving yards by a TE.

LB VICTOR DIMUKEJE

 With a sack, Dimukeje at least a partial sack in all four games this season after going without a sack in his first two years in the NFL.

LB KYZIR WHITE

■ With an INT, White would have an INT in back-to-back games for the first time in his career. White would also match his INT total (two) from the last three seasons (45 games) combined.

LB DENNIS GARDECK

■ With a sack, Gardeck would tie LB Ronald McKinnon for the franchise career record for sacks by an undrafted free agent (12.0).

K MATT PRATER

- With 10 points, Prater would reach 1,712 points in his career and pass Nick Lowery (1,711) for 18th place on the NFL's all-time list for career points.
- With three field goals, Prater would reach 384 field goals in his career and pass Nick Lowery (383) for 16th place on the NFL's all-time list for career FGs made.

PRECISE PASSER

QB Joshua Dobbs completed 17-of-21 pass attempts (81.0%) for 189 yards, a TD and a passer rating of 120.0 in last Sunday's win over the Cowboys. In just his third game with the team, Dobbs' 81.0% completion percentage is the seventh-highest in a single game in franchise history (minimum 20 attempts).

PRATER OF THE WEEK

K Matt Prater earned NFC Special Teams Player of the Week honors for Week 3 after connecting on all four of his kicks (3 FGs, 1 PAT) in last Sunday's win over Dallas.

It is Prater's 15th career "Special Teams Player of the Week" selection. In NFL history, only Adam Vinatieri [19] has claimed the honor more.

Prater is the only player to win the award three times with three different teams (Arizona - 3, Detroit - 5, Denver - 7).

Prater's three awards with the Cardinals matches the most by a kicker in franchise history (Chandler Catanzaro, Chris Jacke, Bill Gramatica).

He split the uprights as time expired in the first half from 62 yards out to give the Cardinals a 21-10 lead. The FG tied his own franchise record for longest FG in

ranchise history and is the longest FG in the NFL this season. It marked the third FG of 62+ and 73rd FG of 50+ in his career. Prater is one of two players in NFL history to make three FGs of 62+ (Brett Maher - 3), while his 73 FGs of 50+ are the most in NFL history.

Prater also surpassed 1,700 points for his career, moving past Hall of Famer Jan Stenerud (1,699) for 19th place on the NFL's all-time scoring list during last Sunday's game.



- Over the last two games, the Cardinals offensive line has allowed just two sacks on 52 pass attempts and helped pave the way for 373 rushing yards and four TDs. Only two teams had more rushing yards in Weeks 2-3.
- The Cardinals defense has 23 passes defensed through Week 3, which is the second-most in the NFL this season and the most by Arizona through the first three games of a season since at least 1999.
