



# ARIZONA CARDINALS NOTE CARDS

- 8-0** **KYLER MURRAY's** record at AT&T Stadium dating back to his sophomore year at Allen (TX) High School, including 7-0 as a starter. After leading the Cardinals to a 38-10 win at Dallas last season, Murray has at least one win at AT&T Stadium at the high school (Allen HS), college (Oklahoma) and NFL levels.
- +17** Cardinals turnover differential on the road in 2021, the best in the NFL. After Arizona, the next-best total is +11 (Indianapolis). The Cardinals have committed just three turnovers in eight road games this season.
- 8** TDs (7 receiving, 1 kickoff return) for WR **CHRISTIAN KIRK** in four games played at AT&T Stadium dating back to his college career at Texas A&M. Three of those eight TDs covered 80+ yards (100-yard KOR, 81 and 80-yard receptions).
- 1** Cardinals rank in both rushing TDs scored (22, tied with Philadelphia) and rushing allowed (8, tied with Denver and New England). Arizona needs four rushing TDs over the final two games to establish a new franchise single-season record (current mark of 25 was set in 1948).

## WITH A WIN...

- Arizona would improve to 11-5 in 2021. It would mark just the sixth time in franchise history the Cardinals won at least 11 games in a season.
- Kliff Kingsbury would become the fifth head coach in team history to win 11+ games in a season, joining Bruce Arians (2014, '15), Don Coryell (1975), Jimmy Conzelman (1948) and Norm Barry (1925).
- The Cardinals would improve to 8-1 on the road in 2021. Arizona would establish a franchise record for road wins in a season and become just the 10th team in NFL history to win eight road games in a single season.
- Arizona would improve to 6-1 in its last seven games against the Cowboys. The Cardinals would also improve to 3-0 all-time at AT&T Stadium.
- QB **Kyler Murray** would improve to 8-0 as a starter (9-0 overall) at AT&T Stadium dating back to his sophomore year at Allen (TX) High School in 2012.

## MILESTONES WITHIN REACH...

### RB JAMES CONNER

- With 1 TD (of any kind), Conner would have 17 total TDs in 2021. In franchise history only RB David Johnson (20 in 2016) would have more.
- With 2 rushing TDs, Conner would have 16 rushing TDs in 2021. That would tie the franchise's all-time single-season record (David Johnson, 2016). He would also become the first player in franchise history to have multiple rushing TDs in at least six games in a single season.

### QB KYLER MURRAY

- With 23 passing yards, Murray would join Cam Newton (2011-13) as the only players in NFL history with 11,000+ passing yards and 1,500+ rushing yards in his first three seasons.
- With 3 TD passes, Murray would become the first player in NFL history with 70+ passing TDs and 20+ rushing TDs in his first three seasons.
- With a passer rating of 120.0+, Murray (6) would establish a new franchise record for the most such performances in a single season. He is currently tied with Kurt Warner (5 in 2009) for the franchise mark.
- With a completion percentage of 70.0+, Murray would establish a franchise career record with 16 such performances. He is currently tied with Kurt Warner (15) for the most in franchise history.

### TE ZACH ERTZ

- With 51 receiving yards, Ertz would become the first Cardinals TE since Freddie Jones in 2003 (517) to have 500+ receiving yards in a single season.
- With eight catches, Ertz would join Hall of Famer Jackie Smith (56 in 1967) and Freddie Jones (55 in 2003) as the only TEs in franchise history with 50+ receptions in a season.
- With a TD reception, Ertz would become just the fourth player in NFL history - and first since Randy Moss in 2010 - to catch a TD pass against a single opponent from two different teams in the same season. He had a 3-yard TD catch for Philly at Dallas on Monday Night Football in Week 3 (9/27/21).

### WR A.J. GREEN

- With 4 catches, Green would reach 700 receptions for his career. He would join teammate DeAndre Hopkins, Antonio Brown and Julio Jones as the only active players with 700+ receptions and 10,000+ receiving yards.

### LB CHANDLER JONES

- With a half-sack, Jones would have 10.0 sacks in 2021. It would mark his seventh season with 10.0+ sacks and his fifth in six years with Arizona. His seven career seasons with 10+ sacks would tie Von Miller for the most among active players.

### WR CHRISTIAN KIRK

- With a TD reception, Kirk would tie his career high (6 - 2020) for a single season.
- With a TD catch, Kirk would also have nine TDs in five games at AT&T Stadium dating back to his college days at Texas A&M. That would include three TDs in two games at the venue as a member of the Cardinals.

## ARIZONA GOES FOR RECORD 8TH ROAD WIN

**The Cardinals are 7-1 on the road this season, tied for the most road wins in a single season in franchise history.**

**Arizona can set a new franchise mark with a victory at Dallas on Sunday.**

## ERTZ FACES FORMER DIVISION RIVAL

On Sunday, TE **Zach Ertz** will play his 17th career game against the Cowboys - and his 10th career game at AT&T Stadium. Ertz enters the contest with 70 receptions for 694 yards and five TDs against Dallas.

**Ertz's 70 career receptions against the Cowboys are the most among active players.**

**His 70 catches are also the most ever by a TE against Dallas and rank ninth all-time against the Cowboys.**

Ertz has 28 receptions at AT&T Stadium, the fifth-most among opposing players at the venue. He needs eight receptions to pass the current leader (former Giants WR Hakeem Nicks).

**Sunday's game will mark Ertz's second against the Cowboys at AT&T Stadium this season. On Monday Night Football in Week 3 while with Philadelphia, Ertz had four receptions for 53 yards and a TD vs. Dallas.**

## CARDS FACE ANOTHER TAKEAWAY LEADER

In Week 16 vs. Indianapolis, the Cardinals faced a Colts team that entered the game tied for the NFL lead with 31 takeaways. **Arizona did not commit a turnover against Indianapolis, marking the first game this season the Colts went without a takeaway.**

On Sunday in Dallas, the Cardinals will face a Cowboys team that leads the NFL with 33 takeaways, including a league-leading 25 INTs. Dallas has at least one takeaway in 12-of-15 games this season, including 14 total takeaways in its last four games.

**The game against the Colts was Arizona's sixth without a turnover this season. Five of those games have come on the road. Should the Cardinals go without a turnover on Sunday, they will tie the NFL record for the most road games without a turnover in a single season: 6 by Saints (2019), Patriots (2016, 2010), and Seahawks (2005).**
