



# ARIZONA CARDINALS NOTE CARDS

- 32.0** Sacks for DE Chandler Jones during his time with Arizona. Since being acquired by the Cardinals in a trade with New England in 2016, Jones leads the NFL in both sacks (32.0) and tackles for loss (48).
- 5** Takeaways for the Cardinals defense last week in San Francisco (2 INTs, 3 FR), a season high. In not committing a turnover against the 49ers, the Cardinals (+5) joined the Browns (+5 vs. Pittsburgh, 9/9) as the only teams with a +5 turnover margin in a game this season.
- 19** Receptions for WR Christian Kirk this season. That is tied with Atlanta's Calvin Ridley for the most among rookie WRs in 2018. Kirk's 234 receiving yards trail only Ridley's 302 yards among rookie WRs.
- 7** Age of both QB Josh Rosen and WR Christian Kirk when Larry Fitzgerald's active streak of 216 consecutive games with a reception began on 11/7/04 at Miami. Fitzgerald has at least one reception in 222 of 223 career games played.

## WITH A WIN...

- The Cardinals would snap an eight-game winless streak on the road at Minnesota and earn their first road win against the Vikings since 1977.
- QB Josh Rosen would become the first Cardinals rookie to win on the road in consecutive weeks since Neil Lomax (Games 10-11) in 1981.

## MILESTONES WITHIN REACH...

### WR LARRY FITZGERALD

- With a catch, Fitzgerald would have at least one reception in 217 consecutive games, the second-longest streak in NFL history behind only Jerry Rice (274). He would have at least one catch in 223 of 224 career games.
- With a TD reception, Fitzgerald would have 111 TD catches in his career. That would tie Tony Gonzalez for seventh place on the NFL's all-time list for career receiving TDs.
- With a TD reception, U.S. Bank Stadium would become the 27th NFL venue in which Fitzgerald has at least one TD catch.
- With a TD reception from Rosen, Fitzgerald would have at least one TD catch from 15 different QBs in his NFL career.

### RB DAVID JOHNSON

- With a TD (of any kind), Johnson would have 39 TDs in 39 career games played. That total would include 33 TDs in his last 30 games. Only eight players in NFL history (including five Hall of Famers) would have more TDs in their first 39 career games than Johnson.
- With a TD (of any kind), Johnson would have three TDs in his last two games vs. the Vikings.
- With a rushing TD, Johnson would have 29 career rushing TDs. It would also give Johnson 21 rushing TDs in his last 23 games.
- With two TDs (of any kind), Johnson would have 40 career TDs. He would reach 40 TDs in 14 fewer games than any other player in franchise history. The current record is 53 games by John David Crow.

### DE CHANDLER JONES

- With a sack, Jones would have at least one sack in 27 of 38 games with the Cardinals. Jones would have at least one sack in each of the last four games, and in five of six games this season.
- With a sack, Jones would have four sacks in three career games against the Vikings. He would have at least one sack in all three contests.

### CB PATRICK PETERSON

- With an INT, Peterson would have 23 INTs in his career. Only seven players in team history would have more.

### WR CHRISTIAN KIRK

- With six receptions, Kirk would become just the fourth rookie in franchise history with 25+ receptions through their first six career games, joining Anquan Boldin (39 in 2003), Larry Fitzgerald (26 in 2004) and Gern Nagler (29 in 1953).

### TE RICKY SEALS-JONES

- With a TD reception, Jones would have five TD catches in his career. Only two TEs in franchise history would have more in their first two NFL seasons: Rob Awalt (10, 1987-88) and Jackie Smith (6, 1963-64).

### S TRE BOSTON

- With an INT, Boston would have 11 career INTs, eight of which would have come in his last 22 games played dating back to last season. Boston would have an INT in three of the last four games this season.

### LB HAASON REDDICK

- With a sack, Reddick would have a sack in three consecutive games for the first time in his career. Reddick would have 3.0 sacks in six games this season, surpassing his total (2.5) in 16 games as a rookie in 2017.

## CHANDLER NAMED PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Cardinals DE **Chandler Jones** was named the "NFC Defensive Player of the Week" for his performance in last Sunday's 28-18 victory over the 49ers.

It is the second time in his career that Jones has been named "Defensive Player of the Week" and his first with the Cardinals. Jones previously was named "AFC Defensive Player of the Week" in 2014 with the Patriots.

Jones had six tackles, a sack, two tackles for loss, two QB hits, a forced fumble, a fumble recovery and two passes defensed in the Cardinals win. He sacked 49ers QB C.J. Beathard in the third quarter, forcing a fumble that he recovered himself. Following a San Francisco TD to pull the 49ers within two points in the fourth quarter, Jones batted down Beathard's pass on the 49ers two-point conversion attempt.



## FITZGERALD'S 6TH HOMETOWN REUNION

All-Pro WR **Larry Fitzgerald** is a native of Minneapolis and grew up around the Vikings organization, serving as a ball boy for the team during the tenure of Dennis Green. Growing up, Fitzgerald learned the tricks of the receiving trade from Vikings Hall of Fame wide receivers Cris Carter and Randy Moss.

Fitzgerald attended Academy of the Holy Angels High School in Minneapolis where he was a two-time All-State and prep All-America receiver, recording 73 receptions for 1,254 yards and 17 touchdowns as a senior. As a junior, Fitzgerald had a string of 10 consecutive 100-yard games and finished with 54 receptions for 1,347 yards and 12 TDs.

*Sunday's game will mark the sixth time Fitzgerald has played against the Vikings in Minnesota during the regular season. That is the most road games against any non-division opponent in his NFL career.* His 172 receiving yards at Minnesota on 11/26/06 remains his career high for receiving yards.



## WHY STOP AT ONE?

Last week's game against the 49ers marked RB **David Johnson**'s 12th career multi-TD performance. Despite missing the final 15 games last season, no player in the NFL has more games with multiple TDs than Johnson dating back to his rookie season in 2015.

*In Arizona's last visit to Minnesota (2016), Johnson had 160 total yards and two TDs (1 rushing, 1 receiving).*

Prior to Johnson's 12 multi-TD performances, the franchise record for multi-TD outings in a player's first four seasons was seven (Ottis Anderson and Sonny Randle). In franchise history, only WR Larry Fitzgerald (18) has more career multi-TD outings than Johnson.

Johnson's 11 multi-TD performances between 2015-16 tied Eric Dickerson (1983-84) and Edgerrin James (1999-00) for the most in NFL history in a player's first two seasons.
