# 2023 GAME SUMMARIES



## WEEK 1 Arizona Cardinals 16, Washington Commanders 20 64,693 ■ FedExField ■ Sep 10, 2023

The Cardinals traveled to Washington to not only open the 2023 regular season, but also usher in a new era in team history. It marked the first game under first-year head coach Jonathan Gannon and general manager Monti Ossenfort as well as the Cardinals debut for 22 players, most notably starting QB Joshua Dobbs in his first game action with the club. Playing at times in both brilliant sunshine and a driving rain, Arizona took advantage of six sacks and three takeaways to claim a 16-10 lead early in the third quarter. However, the Commanders converted two second half fumbles into points and emerged with a 20-16 week 1 victory.

Washington opened the scoring on the game's third series when Sam Howell's 8-yard TD pass to RB Brian Robinson put the hosts up 7-0; the drive was aided by two personal fouls flagged against AZ along with a 37-yard defensive pass interference penalty. The Cards answered with their own scoring drive as Dobbs completions to WRs Marquise Brown and Rondale Moore covered 29 and 31 yards, respectively and set-up Matt Prater's 28-yard FG. LB Zaven Collins halted the next Commanders' drive with an INT off Howell that set the AZ offense up at the Washington 37. The pick led to another Prater FG, this one from 54 yards that made it 7-6. The ensuing drive saw the Commanders reach the AZ19 before LB Victor Dimukeje forced an Antonio Gibson fumble that Collins recovered to kill the threat. Late in the first half, the Cardinals' third takeaway of the game put points directly on the scoreboard and put AZ up 13-7; LB Dennis Gardeck chased down Howell deep in Washington territory, forcing a fumble that LB Cameron Thomas scooped up at the 2 and took into the end zone with :55 left in the first half. That was enough time for Washington to move into position for a 30-yard Joey Slye FG that cut Arizona's lead to 13-10 on the last play before intermission.

Arizona got the ball first after halftime and Dobbs completed 7 of 9 passes for 50 yards to set up a 37-yard Prater FG that put AZ up 16-10 early in the third. It remained that way until 90 seconds remained in the quarter when the Cards faced a 3rd-n-15 at their own 35. DE Montez Sweat hit Dobbs as he was throwing, forcing a fumble that the Commanders recovered at the 29. Six plays later, they faced a 3rd-n-goal at the 6 when Howell scrambled for the go-ahead score. With 4:44 to go and down by one, the Cards had the ball at their own 40 but a mishandled center exchange turned it over to the Commanders, who took over at the AZ22 following an unsportsmanlike penalty. Slye's 33-yard FG put Washington up 20-16 with 2:23 to play. The Cards would get no closer as the ensuing drive ended with an incompletion on 4th down.

New York Giants 31, Arizona Cardinals 28

Making their regular season home debut, the Cardinals faced the Giants in week 2 at State Farm Stadium. It was truly a tale of two halves. Behind QB Joshua Dobbs and a tenacious defense down four starters (including all-pro S Budda Baker), Arizona scored 20 points in the opening two quarters while pitching a first half shutout. However, in quarters 3 & 4, the Giants outscored the hosts 31-8 enroute to a comeback victory that evened their record at 1-1 and dropped the Cards to 0-2. RB James Conner finished with 106 rushing yards on 23 carries and a TD for the Cardinals. Dobbs was 21 of 31 for 228 yards through the air with a passing TD and another rushing while playing turnover-free football.

The first half was all Arizona, who not only led 20-0 at intermission but held decisive statistical edges in first downs (16-5), total yards (241-81) and time of possession (19:09-10:51). The only Cards possession that didn't produce points was their first on which a deep Dobbs pass to TE Zach Ertz was just inches from a huge gain down the left sideline and Matt Prater's 55-yard FG try was just wide to the left. But after forcing a 3-n-out, RB James Conner capped a 9-play, 86-yard drive with his 4-yard TD run: one of the biggest plays on it was a 21-yard completion to rookie WR Michael Wilson on 3rd-n-7 from the NY39. A Dennis Gardeck 3rd down sack of Daniel Jones ended the next Giants possession and was followed by another lengthy AZ scoring drive. This one covered 80 yards in 7 plays and put AZ up 10-0 on the first play of the 2nd quarter when Dobbs scrambled 23 yards and bowled over a Giants defender to reach the end zone. The run was a career-long for Dobbs as well as his first career rushing TD. The ensuing Giants series reached the AZ36 but on 2nd-n-8 from there, Jones' pass attempt deflected off the hands of RB Saquon Barkley and was picked off by S Jalen Thompson. His 35-yard return took it to the NY34 and led to a 44-yard Prater FG that made it 20-0 with 1:09 remaining in the 2nd quarter. The Giants tried for points before intermission, but a Zaven Collins sack effectively ended the half.

The New York turnaround began on the 3rd quarter's first play from scrimmage when a deep Jones completion to WR Jalin Hyatt covered 58 yards to the AZ17. Two plays later, Jones kept around the left end and scored from 14 yards out. Arizona counterpunched immediately with a 22-yard Conner run on the ensuing drive's first play. In all on the possession, Conner ran for 53 of its 75 yards and Dobbs ended it with his 3-yard TD pass to WR Marquise Brown; a Dobbs run for a 2-point conversion made it 28-7 with 9:34 left in the third quarter. However, the Giants would storm back with consecutive TD drives of 75 and 80 yards, respectively. The first ended on a 1-yard Barkley TD run and he capped the second with his 9-yard catch of a Jones pass that trimmed Arizona's lead to 28-21 midway through the fourth. Following a 3-n-out by the Cards' offense, NY moved 64 yards in 6 plays and tied the game on a Jones TD pass of 11 yards to WR Isaiah Hodgins. Now tied at 28 with 4:25 remaining, the Giants again forced an Arizona punt. The ensuing drive started at their own 28 but moved to the AZ20 in 4 plays, setting up a 34-yard Graham Gano FG with 0:19 left that proved to be the game winner.

## WEEK 3

**Dallas Cowboys 16, Arizona Cardinals 28**  
**62,915** ■ **State Farm Stadium** ■ **Sep 24, 2023**

The Cardinals entered week 3 looking for their first win of the season. Standing in their way was a 2-0 Dallas team that had won its first two games by 60 combined points (40-0 and 30-10), boasted the league's #1 defense, had not committed a turnover and led the NFL in takeaways. But like they had in the season's first two games, Arizona would find itself with a double-digit lead in the second half. This time the Cardinals would not relinquish it. Led by QB Joshua Dobbs, the Cardinals offense scored on all five of its first half possessions and finished the day with 400 yards of offense, including 222 on the ground. RB James Conner accounted for 116 yards from scrimmage, including 98 on 14 rushes with a TD run. The defense allowed just one TD and three FGs and came up with a huge late takeaway to seal the 28-16 victory. It marked Arizona's first win under the leadership of new GM Monti Ossenfort and head coach Jonathan Gannon as well as the first career win as a starter for Dobbs.

Arizona got the ball first and on the game's second play, Dobbs kept it around the left end on a designed run, gaining 44 yards to the Dallas 29. That rush set-up a 39-yard Matt Prater FG that gave the Cards an early 3-0 lead and marked the first time the Cowboys trailed all season. After a Dallas 3-n-out, Arizona moved 82 yards in 7 plays and Conner ran it in from 5 yards out; a Cowboys penalty on the PAT try resulted in the Cards going for 2 but the run failed and the AZ lead was 9-0. Brandon Aubrey's 49-yard FG on the ensuing Cowboys drive made it 9-3 early in the opening quarter. Arizona then moved 30 yards to the Dallas 45 before hitting on another explosive play. This time WR Rondale Moore lined up in the backfield and took an inside handoff before rocketing down the middle of the field for a 45-yard TD run. Trailing 15-3, Dallas answered with 5:32 remaining in the 2nd quarter when RB Rico Dowdle scored on a 15-yard screen pass from Dak Prescott. But with 1:28 left in the half, Prater's 43-yard FG capped a 10-play, 45-yard drive that put AZ up 18-10. After the Cardinals defense forced a Dallas punt, AZ took over at its own 31 with :21 left and two timeouts. Dobbs quickly moved the Cards to the DAL44 in 4 plays and as the half expired, Prater tied his own franchise record with a 62-yard FG. The line-drive boot put Arizona up 21-10 at intermission.

Dallas opened the third quarter by driving to the AZ8 before the Cardinals defense forced them to settle for a 27-yard Aubrey FG. It was the first of four straight second half possessions that saw Dallas advance inside the Arizona 10, but they resulted in just six total points (two field goals, turnover on downs and an INT). The following Dallas drive reached the 4 but on 4th-n-3 from there, the Cards forced an incompletoion to halt the threat. The Cowboys then advanced to the Arizona 8 but no further and Aubrey's 26-yard FG cut the Cardinals lead to five (21-16) with 9:33 remaining in the 4th quarter. On the very next play from scrimmage, however, Dobbs found rookie WR Michael Wilson wide open downfield and that 69-yard catch-n-run quickly set the offense up at the Dallas 7. Two plays later, WR Marquise Brown hauled in a 2-yard TD pass from Dobbs on 3rd-n-goal and the Cards were up 28-16 with 7:22 left. The Cowboys responded by moving to Arizona 5 but Prescott's 3rd-n-goal pass into the middle of the end zone was intercepted by LB Kyzir White. The turnover was Dallas' first of the season and gave the ball back to the Arizona's offense with 3:00 to go. Three Conner runs and a pair of Dobbs QB keepers allowed Arizona to run out the remaining time and secure the upset win.

Arizona Cardinals 16, San Francisco 49ers 35

On a sunny week 4 afternoon in the Bay Area, the Cardinals faced an undefeated Niners team that was averaging 30 points a game on offense and allowing just 14 on defense. The hosts jumped out early and took a 21-3 lead with 5:22 to play in the second quarter. Arizona would battle back to trim the deficit to 5 at 21:16 late in the third quarter, but would pull no closer. The 49ers held just a 33-yard advantage in total net yards (395 to 362), 19 yards in net rushing (124 to 105) and 14 yards in net passing (271 to 257). But San Francisco RB Christian McCaffrey scored four TDs (three on the ground) while QB Brock Purdy completed 20 of 21 passes and recorded both a passing and rushing touchdown. It added up to a 35-16 Niners win that was their 14th consecutive in the regular season. Arizona was led by QB Joshua Dobbs who passed for 265 yards with two TDs and no interceptions. Rookie WR Michael Wilson finished with 76 yards on 7 catches and recorded his first two career TD receptions.

San Francisco staked a 14-0 lead with McCaffrey TDs on its first two possessions. The first was a 1-yard run that capped an 8-play, 62-yard drive; the other drive went 75 yards in 9 plays and McCaffrey ended by hauling in a backwards pass from Purdy and taking it 18 yards to the end zone. Arizona would draw to within 14-3 when its next drive ended with Matt Prater's 38-yard FG; the key play was Dobbs' 8-yard first down run when the Cards went for it on 4th-n-7 at their own 45. The next series saw San Fran WR Brandon Aiyuk haul in a 42-yard pass between two defenders and that set-up a 6-yard Purdy-to-McCaffrey TD pass that made it 21-3. Just before the half, the Cards moved 87 yards in 13 plays and pulled to within 21-10 when Dobbs and Wilson connected on a 16-yard TD pass with 0:23 left in the second quarter. The drive included another key 4th down conversion, this one on a fake punt on 4th-n-2 at the AZ21 when up-man Ezekiel Turner took a direct snap and picked up the first down.

After forcing a 49ers punt on the opening drive of the third quarter, the Cards took over inside their own 1-yard line. But Dobbs completed 4 of 4 passes for 61 yards and ran twice for 10 yards and capped the 99-yard drive with another TD pass to Wilson, this one from 8 yards away. After the two-point try was unsuccessful, San Fran's lead was just 5 with 4:12 to go in the third. The Niners would produce long TD drives on their next two possessions that combined to chew more than 12 minutes off the clock. Arizona's two fourth quarter drives would penetrate 49ers territory but neither produced points and the Cards fell by a final score of 35-16.

## WEEK 5

**Cincinnati Bengals 34, Arizona Cardinals 20**  
**62,651** ■ **State Farm Stadium** ■ **Oct 8, 2023**

In week 5, the Bengals made their second-ever visit to State Farm Stadium, facing the Cardinals in a match-up of 1-3 teams. The visitors jumped out to an early 10-0 advantage before Arizona stormed back to lead 14-10 midway through the second. But a huge momentum swing took place late in the second quarter and early in the third. Cincy took advantage of 3 takeaways to outscore AZ 24-6 the rest of the way to earn a 34-20 victory. The Bengals were led by their two best offensive players as WR Ja'Marr Chase had 15 catches for 192 yards and three TDs on passes from QB Joe Burrow who completed 36 of 46 attempts for 317 yards. A Cardinals team that had already been hit hard by injuries suffered two more key ones in the second quarter when both RB James Conner (knee) and S Jalen Thompson (hamstring) exited and did not return.

The Bengals opened the scoring and took a 10-0 lead after their first two offensive possessions. On the first, Burrow completed 7 of 7 passes for 56 yards and ended it when he found Chase in the back of the end zone on 3rd-n-goal from the 2. Cincy's next drive started at the AZ48 after a 28-yard Trenton Irwin punt return. It would advance to the AZ7 and the Bengals had it 1st-n-goal from there. But after a pair of stops, DL Kevin Strong sacked Burrow for a 15-yard loss on 3rd-n-goal and Evan McPherson's 40-yard FG put Cincinnati up 10-0 late in the first. Cards QB Joshua Dobbs then led the Cardinals 75 yards in 9 plays on the ensuing drive and pulled AZ to within 10-7 when he dropped a perfect pass right into the arms of WR Marquise Brown for a 25-yard TD down the right sideline. On that series, Dobbs was 4 for 5 for 67 yards and the only incompletion was an athletic throwaway to avoid a sack. Arizona's defense forced a 3-n-out on the next series when DL Dante Stills sacked Burrow on 3rd down, Greg Dortch's 16-yard punt return and an unnecessary roughness penalty allowed the Cards to start the next drive at the CIN49. On its 2nd play, Conner was initially bottled up before spinning out of trouble, reversing field and picking up 35 yards to the Bengals 14; unfortunately he injured his knee on the play and did not return. That Conner run set up a 2-yard Dobbs TD pass to TE Zach Ertz that put AZ up 14-10 with 8:28 to go in the 2nd quarter. With two minutes to play before halftime the teams traded huge momentum shifts. First, Burrow had moved his offense inside the AZ5 before the Cards turned Cincy away on both 3rd and 4th down Joe Mixon runs from the 1 thanks to tackles by CB Antonio Hamilton and S K'Von Wallace, respectively. But two plays later, Dobbs threw his first INT of the year (after a franchise record 137 attempts without one) when CB Cam Taylor-Britt snagged the ball at the 11 and returned it for a TD that put the Bengals up 17-14 at halftime.

On the second half's third play from scrimmage, Burrow went deep to Chase and hit him with a 63-yard scoring pass that made it 24-15 just 81 seconds into the 3rd quarter. Midway through the stanza, the Cards moved 75 yards in 11 plays on a TD drive; its final 3 plays were runs by undrafted rookie RB Emari Demarcado - subbing for Conner - that covered 8, 9 and 11 yards, the last of which he took into the end zone for his first career TD. That cut the Cincy lead to 24-20 after the PAT kick failed. On the next drive, the Bengals reached the AZ45 and faced a 3rd-n-7 from there when Wallace intercepted Burrow to get the ball back for the Cardinals offense. On the next play from scrimmage, WR Rondale Moore took a direct snap and raced 41 yards around the left end for a 41-yard gain to the CIN25. Three plays later, AZ went for it on 4th-n-1 at the 16 but were turned away when Dobbs was stopped on a designed run. From there, Cincy moved 83 yards in 15 plays and went up 31-20 when Burrow connected with Chase on their 3rd TD of the game, a 3-yarder in the back of the end zone. On the next play from scrimmage, the Bengals sacked Dobbs forcing a fumble that they recovered at the AZ28. That set-up McPherson's 40-yard FG that provided the game's final points.

**Arizona Cardinals 9, Los Angeles Rams 26**

Facing the Rams in a week 6 divisional road game, an Arizona team that had grown accustomed to missing key players was down two more as RB James Conner and S Jalen Thompson were out with injuries. Nonetheless, the Cardinals led at halftime after dominating the opening two quarters. While they held significant statistical advantages in offensive plays (42-20), net rushing yards (103-5), first downs (11-4) and time of possession (20:58-9:02), the Cards only led 9-6 following the field goal-only first half. That was not enough cushion to hold off the host Rams, who scored on their first four drives after intermission (TD, FG, TD, FG) while keeping the Cardinals off the scoreboard and capitalizing on two fourth quarter takeaways. It all added up to a 26-9 win for Los Angeles, who improved to 3-3 while dropping AZ to 1-5.

The Cardinals got the ball to start the game and put the first points on the board thanks to a 55-yard Matt Prater field goal. The drive's key play came on the 3rd snap from scrimmage when QB Joshua Dobbs scrambled for 24 yards on 3rd-n-10 from the 25. The AZ defense forced a Rams punt on the ensuing series marking the first time all season LA hadn't scored on its opening possession. Arizona then drove from its own 7 to the LA40 but a sack on 3rd-n-2 from there pushed them out of field goal range. Austin Trammell returned the ensuing punt 30 yards to the LA41 and a play later, a Cooper Kupp catch gained 36 yards to the AZ16. The AZ defense held them to a FG try and Brett Maher's 29-yarder tied the game late in the first quarter. LA then forced a Cardinals punt but Trammell lost the ball on a hit by Joey Blount and Bobby Price recovered at the LA17. The takeaway set-up a 32-yard Prater FG that put the Cards up 6-3 with 12:35 left in the 2nd quarter. The Rams went 3-n-out on the next series thanks to a 3rd down sack from LB Kyzir White and AZ's offense took over at its own 41 after the punt. The Cards reached the LA36, but a sneak on 3rd-n-1 from there was stopped. They went for it on 4th-n-6 after an offensive offside penalty pushed it back 5 but came away empty when WR Marquise Brown couldn't get his feet down in bounds on a deep pass down the right sideline. LB Victor Dimukeje's 3rd down sack of Matthew Stafford ended the next LA possession. AZ took over at its own 28 with 5:01 in the half and on 3rd-n-13 at the 25, Dobbs again scrambled for a big gain – a 20 yarder to the AZ45. Another Prater FG, this one from 27 yards out, gave the Cards a 9-3 lead with 0:43 left before halftime. On the next play from scrimmage, Stafford hit Kupp with a deep pass down the middle for a gain of 49 yards to the AZ26. That set-up a 35-yard FG that trimmed Arizona's lead to 9-6 at intermission.

The Rams opened the second half with a ground-heavy drive, rushing on its first 10 plays to reach the AZ13; on 3rd-n-9 from there Stafford hit Kupp just inside the right pylon for a TD and LA took its first lead of the afternoon at 13-9. Following a 3-n-out from the Cardinals, the Rams again advanced deep into AZ territory and reached the AZ6 in 6 plays. They would get no further, however, and Maher's 25-yard FG extended the lead to 16-9. Down a TD, Dobbs led the Cards to the LA12 but disaster struck on the first play of the fourth quarter. His pass to Zach Ertz deflected off the TE's hand and was intercepted by LB Christian Rozeboom at the 12. The Rams proceeded to move 88 yards in 12 plays and Williams' 5-yard TD run put them up 14 with 8:19 remaining. Arizona's comeback hopes were effectively dashed on the next drive when Dobbs lost the ball while being sacked and LA recovered at the AZ33. That led to Maher's 43-yard FG that provided the game's final points.

Arizona Cardinals 10, Seattle Seahawks 20

The Cardinals (1-5) traveled to Seattle for a week 7 divisional game against the Seahawks (3-2). AZ was bolstered by the return of all-pro S Budda Baker, who had missed the previous five games with a hamstring injury, as well as the debut of rookie CB Garrett Williams, who hadn't played since suffering a knee injury the year before in college. Against a Seahawks team that had committed just 3 turnovers all season, Arizona enjoyed a 3-0 edge in takeaways (2 fumble recoveries and an INT). The Cards ran for 127 yards against Seattle's 5th-ranked run defense that had been allowing just 79.2 yards per game. That effort included 58 from undrafted rookie Emari Demercado, who started for the injured James Conner. Unfortunately, AZ would only score 3 points off those 3 takeaways and struggled to find an offensive rhythm in falling 20-10 to the Seahawks.

Seattle's opening drive penetrated Arizona territory thanks in part to a 31-yard completion from Geno Smith to WR Jake Bobo. However, a Zaven Collins sack of Smith pushed them back 10 and helped to force a punt. The next Seahawks series started at their own 39 but they moved 61 yards in 3 plays; an 8-yard completion, a 25-yard Kenneth Walker run and a 28-yard TD reception by rookie WR Jaxon Smith-Njigba for the game's first score. The Cards would then go 3-n-out but on the punt return, Arizona's Joey Blount forced a fumble for the second straight week. This time it was DeeJay Dallas who coughed it up and Dennis Gardeck recovered for the Cardinals at the Seattle 30. The takeaway led to a 44-yard Matt Prater FG that made it 7-3 late in the first quarter. The Cards defense then forced a Seattle punt and following the touchback, the offense took over at the 20. An 18-yard run from Demercado took it to the SEA49. On a 1st-n-10 play from the 20, a Joshua Dobbs pass into the end zone was intercepted by Seattle. However, it was wiped off by a roughing the passer penalty that was followed by a tussle involving multiple players from both teams. When the dust settled, there were offsetting personal foul penalties, LT D.J. Humphries was ejected for contact with a game official, and Arizona had it first-and-goal at the Seattle 25. On the next snap, Dobbs kept it around the left end and took it all the way to the end zone. That 25-yard scoring run gave AZ a 10-7 lead with 9:11 remaining in the second quarter. The ensuing Seattle drive reached the AZ18 in 8 plays and on first down from there, Bobo hauled in a Smith pass at the side of the end zone but was ruled out of bounds. However, it was reversed to a TD after a Seahawks challenge and Seattle led 14-10 with 4:41 to play before halftime. The Cards would move to the Seattle 27 in 10 plays but a holding penalty and sack kept them from getting points in the closing seconds of the first half.

Seattle got the ball first after intermission and in 10 plays reached the AZ 1-yard line where they had it first-and-goal. However, the Arizona D stopped two Walker runs and a short completion on third down forced Seattle to settle for a FG that increased its lead to 7. It appeared they would add to it on the next series when they reached the AZ16 but on 3rd-n-4 from there, the rookie CB Williams intercepted Smith at the 1. After an Arizona punt, Seattle took over at its own 30 early in the 4th quarter but on the 2nd play of the drive, Smith fumbled a snap and DL Kevin Strong recovered at the SEA34. A high shotgun snap led to a loss of 14 yards on the ensuing drive's second play and the Cards came away without points when Prater's 34-yard FG try was wide left. The Cards defense again stepped up, forcing a 3-n-out thanks in part to a 2nd down sack for minus-6 shared by Strong and Jonathan Ledbetter. After the punt, AZ took over at its own 33 with 9:31 to play and trailing by 7. The drive reached the SEA49 but when a 3rd-n-9 pass was incomplete, AZ sent out its punting unit. Instead of kicking, though, the Cards ran a fake but were unsuccessful when back-up QB Clayton Tune's completion to Michael Wilson only picked up 4 yards. As a result, the Seahawks took over at their own 45 with 4:58 left. They would pick up two first downs and force Arizona to use its remaining timeouts before Jason Myers' 48-yard FG made it a 10-point lead with 2:17 left to effectively seal the game.

### Baltimore Ravens 31, Arizona Cardinals 24

In week 8, Baltimore traveled to Arizona for just its second-ever visit to State Farm Stadium. The 5-2 Ravens were coming off a decisive 38-6 win over Detroit in which they scored TDs on 4 of their first 5 drives. The Cardinals were every bit their equal for most of the afternoon and it was a 7-7 game at the two-minute warning of the first half. But a pair of Baltimore interceptions led to TDs and a 21-7 Ravens lead late in the third quarter. Arizona continued to fight and cut the deficit to 7 with a pair of 4th quarter TDs. But the Cards could not complete the comeback and fell to 1-7 on the season.

The Cardinals got the ball to start the game and made it count. They moved 75 yards in 12 plays (9 runs and 3 passes) and QB Joshua Dobbs punched it in for a touchdown from a yard away to make it 7-0. It was the first opening drive TD allowed by Baltimore in 16 games. The Ravens offense answered with its own 75-yard drive and Scottsdale native and Ravens TE Mark Andrews tied the game when he hauled in a 5-yard TD catch from Lamar Jackson. The ensuing drive saw AZ move to the BAL44 but on both 3rd-n-1 and 4th-n-1 from there, Dobbs' pass attempts were incomplete and the Cards turned it over on downs. The Ravens took over at that spot and moved to the AZ35. On 3rd-n-5 from there, LB Zaven Collins sacked Jackson forcing a fumble that S Budda Baker recovered at the AZ42. However, the call was changed to an incompletion after replay review and the Ravens sent out their FG unit. They came away without points, though, as Justin Tucker's 53-yard FG clanked off the left upright giving AZ the ball at its own 43. The Cards advanced to the BAL36 and on 4th-n-1 went for it with an Emari Demercado run that was close to a first down. As the sticks approached to measure, an official moved the ball half a yard back and the chain gang retreated as the late, revised ruling resulted in a turnover on downs. The Cards defense forced 3-n-outs on the next two Baltimore drives and at the 2:00 warning of the first half, AZ faced a 2nd-n-3 from its own 31. Dobbs' pass intended for WR Michael Wilson instead was intercepted by Ravens CB Brandon Stephens, giving Baltimore possession at the AZ43 with 1:52 left in the half. Five plays later, RB Gus Edwards ran it in from a yard out and the Ravens led 14-7 at intermission.

The first five drives of the 3rd quarter ended with punts and neither team crossed midfield. After AZ's defense forced Baltimore's 3rd straight punt, the offense took over at its own 10. But on the next play, Dobbs' pass intended for TE Trey McBride was intercepted along the near sideline by S Geno Stone setting the Ravens up at the AZ23. Three plays later, Edwards scored his second rushing TD of the day, this one a 7-yarder that increased Baltimore's lead to 21-7 with :40 to play in the 3rd quarter. The Ravens increased their lead to 24-7 when Tucker ended their next possession with his 48-yard FG. The Cardinals would not go quietly. Dobbs moved the team 75 yards in 10 plays; he was 5-6 passing for 61 yards and ended it with a 17-yard TD pass to McBride on 3rd-n-15. When Dobbs ran the 2-point conversion in himself, the Cards pulled to within 24-15 with 6:32 left. The Ravens would push it back up to 16 points on the next series when Edwards' 3rd TD of the afternoon capped a 9-play, 75-yard drive. With 1:14 remaining, Dobbs hit former Ravens WR Marquise Brown with a 1-yard touchdown at the end of a 10-play, 75-yard drive and it was 31-21 after the 2-point try failed. A perfect Matt Prater onside kick led to a Cardinal recovery and with :26 left, Prater's 47-yard FG cut the deficit to 6. However, Baltimore recovered the onside kick attempt this time and the Ravens escaped with the win.

In week 9 at Cleveland, the Cardinals faced a Browns team featuring the NFL's #1 defense and the return of starting QB Deshaun Watson who was back in the lineup following a shoulder injury. Arizona, meanwhile, was without top RBs James Conner and Emari Demercado as well as starting WR Michael Wilson. And at QB, rookie Clayton Tune made his first career start as the Cardinals waited for the return of Tyler Murray from his major knee injury and had traded Joshua Dobbs earlier in the week. The totality of those circumstances led to a challenging afternoon for the Cardinals. The Arizona defense kept the team in striking distance for much of the afternoon, forcing 3-n-outs on 6 of Cleveland's 14 drives. But the offense struggled to get untracked and the end result was a 27-0 Browns win that improved Cleveland to 5-3 and dropped Arizona to 1-8 for the year.

After the game began with the teams trading punts on the first three possessions, the fourth one saw the Browns reach the AZ36 where they faced a 4th-n-3. They went for it but turned it over on downs when Watson's pass was incomplete. Following an Arizona 3-n-out, Cleveland took over at its own 28 and on the first play of the drive, Watson went deep down the left sideline to WR Amari Cooper for a gain of 58 yards to the AZ14. They would get little more and, thanks in part to a sack of minus-10 by DT Leki Fotu, Cleveland settled for a 30-yard field goal from Dustin Hopkins. Leading 3-0, the Browns then came up with the game's first takeaway on the 3rd play of the next drive when CB Denzel Ward INT'd a Tune pass to give Cleveland possession at the AZ49. Ten plays later — all of them rushes — the Browns faced a 2nd-n-9 at the AZ11. Watson's pass was deflected in the backfield by DE Dante Stills but the ball ricocheted high in the air and some 20 yards downfield where it serendipitously found Cooper in the end zone for a TD. Arizona's biggest play of the half came on the next drive when Tune hit WR Rondale Moore for a 26-yard gain on 3rd-n-5; however side judge Eugene Hall claimed to see offensive pass interference and his flag wiped out the gain. The Browns increased their lead to 13-0 at intermission when Hopkins hit a 45-yard FG as the second quarter expired.

The AZ defense forced a 3-n-out to open the second half but the ensuing Browns punt was downed at the Cards 1. Cleveland would send them 3-n-out but AZ survived the flipping of the field and the offense would get the ball back at its own 20 with 9:38 left in the third, trailing 13-0. On the first snap, Tune was sacked by DT Shelby Harris forcing a fumble that DE Myles Garrett recovered at the AZ11. Two plays later, Watson found TE David Njoku with a 5-yard TD that put the hosts up 20-0. Later in the quarter, the AZ offense advanced to the CLE40 but again turned it over, this time on an INT by LB Stone Takitaki. Cleveland had a chance to extend the lead on the ensuing drive, but Hopkins' 48-yard FG try was wide left. However, the Cardinals offense was unable to threaten the rest of the way and Kareem Hunt's 3-yard TD run midway through the 4th provided the game's final points.

## WEEK 10

### Atlanta Falcons 23, Arizona Cardinals 25

The Falcons came to Arizona in week 10 with the chance to move to 5-5 and into a first place tie in the AFC South. They faced a 1-8 Cardinals team that was looking to end a 6-game losing streak but was energized by one player's return. QB Kyler Murray was back 335 days after suffering a torn ACL exactly 11 months earlier and was outstanding. He completed 19 of 32 passes for 249 yards and ran 6 times for 33 yards and a TD. Nine of his completions went to TE Trey McBride who gained 131 yards and became the first Cardinals TE in exactly 34 years to top the century mark. In a game where every point mattered, kicker Matt Prater scored 13 of them; he went 4 for 4 on field goals including 51 and 56 yarders by the NFL's all-time leader in 50+ yard FGs. The contest featured 7 total lead changes - 5 in the second half - and a Falcons TD put ATL up 1 with 2:33 to play. But thanks to a dazzling Murray scramble and a deep completion to McBride, the Cardinals were able to win on a Prater walk-off game-winner.

After the teams exchanged 3-n-out drives to open the game, the Cardinals moved into ATL territory on their 2nd possession. A 4-yard James Conner run on 4th-n-1 from the ATL 30 and a diving 19-yard catch by McBride were pivotal but a couple penalties backed them up. However, they came away with points and a 3-0 lead thanks to Prater's 51-yard boot. The AZ defense then appeared to stop the Falcons with a knocked down pass on 3rd-n-8 from the ATL 42 but a roughing the passer call by referee Craig Wolstad extended the drive. Shortly thereafter, QB Taylor Heinicke hit WR Scotty Miller with a 2-yard TD pass on 3rd-n-goal that put ATL up 7-3. On the next play from scrimmage, Murray connected with McBride on a 28-yard pass to start a drive that would reach the ATL28 before Prater's 46-yard FG made it 7-6. The Falcons answered with a 13-play, 75-yard drive that ended on a 5-yard TD run by rookie RB Bijan Robinson. Down 14-6 with 4:07 left in the first half, the Cards took over at their own 25. Consecutive completions of 12 and 28 yards to Rondale Moore and Marquise Brown quickly moved it to the ATL29. With 0:14 left and no timeouts, AZ faced a 3rd-n-1 at the ATL6 when Murray ran it in for a TD; when the 2-point try was unsuccessful, the Cards trailed 14-12 at intermission.

After forcing a Falcons 3-n-out to open the 3rd quarter, Arizona moved into position for Prater's 56-yard FG that split the uprights to give the Cards a 15-14 lead. A sack from rookie LB BJ Ojulari helped send the Atlanta offense off the field on another 3-n-out. But on the first play after the punt, LB Nate Landman intercepted a Murray pass across the middle and returned it 25 yards to the AZ14. The Cards defense rose to the occasion, stopping Atlanta on successive runs before Dennis Gardeck's 3rd down sack forced the Falcons to settle for a 36-yard Younghoe Koo FG. Down 17-15, the Cards got a huge boost from its special teams late in the third when Greg Dortch's 49-yard punt return set the offense up at the ATL21. Murray connected with rookie WR Michael Wilson on a 14-yard completion to the 1 on a play that was initially ruled a TD. No matter, because on the next play back-up QB Clayton Tune came in to sneak it across the goal line and put AZ up 22-17 in the closing seconds of the 3rd quarter. On the ensuing Falcons drive, Heinicke exited with a hamstring injury and Desmond Ridder came on in relief. He led them to the AZ21 where they faced a 4th-n-1 but the AZ defense sent them away by stopping Ridder on a sneak attempt. Atlanta's next possession began at its own 30 with 5:43 to go. After crossing midfield, side judge Frank Steratore gave the Falcons a 32-yard gain to the AZ15 with his defensive pass interference call. Three plays later, Ridder ran it around the left end on 3rd-n-4 from the 9 for a TD. When the 2-point try was unsuccessful, the Falcons led by 1 and the Cards soon took possession at their own 25 with 2:39 left. Murray then took over. On 3rd-n-10 from the AZ42, the QB was pressured in the backfield before circling, dodging and escaping on a sprint that picked up 13 officially but actually covered some 74 total yards and reached a top speed of 20.17 mph. One snap later, he and McBride connected for the 8th and final time of the afternoon and it was a big one - a 33-yard completion to ATL 9. Three runs forced Atlanta to burn its final timeouts and allowed Prater to hit the 23-yard game-winner as time expired.

## WEEK 11

Arizona Cardinals 16, Houston Texans 21

In week 11 at Houston, the Cardinals faced a 5-4 Texans team coming off back-to-back wins and fighting to reach the top spot in the AFC South. The hosts built a 21-10 halftime lead on the strength of three TD passes from QB C.J. Stroud. But the talented rookie signal caller – who entered the game with just two INTs on the season – was picked off three times by the Arizona defense, including twice in the fourth quarter. Cards QB Tyler Murray played his second game after returning from the knee injury that had sidelined him for a year and threw one TD pass while running for another. But despite late opportunities, the Cards could not complete the comeback and Houston would emerge with the 21-16 victory.

The Cardinals struck first in the game – and struck quickly. After advancing past midfield in two plays and a penalty, Murray threw it deep down the middle where WR Rondale Moore hauled it in for a 48-yard touchdown. The ensuing drive saw the Texans move to the AZ15 where they went for it on 4th-n-2; however, LB Kyzir White stopped the Houston run for no gain, resulting in a turnover on downs. The next time the Texans offense took the field they did produce points when Stroud's 3rd-n-6 pass down the middle found TE Dalton Schultz for a 20-yard game-tying TD. The Cards would soon untie it on the next series when Matt Prater's 57-yard FG capped a 9-play, 36-yard drive and put AZ up 10-7 with 1:21 to go in the opening quarter. The Texans would take their first lead of the game on the next drive by moving 75 yards in 10 plays and ending it with RB Devin Singletary's 11-yard TD run. The very next play from scrimmage saw Murray launch it deep down the middle for WR Marquise Brown but Texans LB Derek Stingley intercepted it and Houston's offense took over at its own 25. Stroud then led them deep into AZ territory but on 2nd-n-11 from the 12, his pass into the end zone was picked off by S Jalen Thompson. The Texans would increase the lead to 21-10 the next time they got the ball; this time Stroud ended the 6-play, 74-yard drive with his 40-yard TD pass to fellow rookie Tank Dell, who made a leaping grab at the right side of the end zone with 0:26 left before intermission.

Leading 21-10, the Texans opened the second half by marching well into AZ territory but they came away pointless when Matt Ammendola's 48-yard FG try missed wide to the left. From there, the Cardinals offense went the length of the field and they faced a 4th-n-goal at the 1. On that play, Murray called his own number and outraced defenders to the pylon for the score; the two-point try was unsuccessful, the Cardinals trailed by 5 with 2:52 remaining in the 3rd quarter. A Dante Stills sack of Stroud on first down was key to forcing a 3-n-out on the next drive after which the Cards took possession at their own 32. They would advance to the HOU23 and went for it on 4th-n-3 but a Murray completion to Greg Dortch was just short of the sticks. However, the AZ defense again held and produced a 3-n-out that preceded a bizarre sequence. On the forced punt, officials ruled the ball hit a Cardinals player and Houston recovered. Replays, however, seemed so clearly to show it actually hit a Texan that the AZ offense and HOU defense were on the field waiting for play to resume. To their surprise, referee Alex Kemp emerged to say that the initial ruling of a turnover would stand and the Texans took over at the AZ21. Four plays later, the Cardinals would indisputably gain possession when LB Krys Barnes INT'd a tipped Stroud pass and returned it 46 yards to midfield. Shortly thereafter, the Cards went for it on 4th-n-4 at the HOU45 but turned it over on an incomplection. The Texans would then advance to the AZ26 but CB Antonio Hamilton stepped in front of a Stroud pass near the sideline. The 3rd Arizona INT of the day gave the offense the ball at its own 19 with 4:58 remaining and down 5. By the 2:00 warning, the Cards had a first down at the HOU29 but incomplections on both third and fourth downs ended the threat and clinched the game for Houston.

On the Sunday after Thanksgiving, the Cardinals hosted a Rams team that had won 8 straight games in Arizona and was looking for a season sweep. After one quarter, the Cardinals led 8-7 but Los Angeles would score 30 points en route to a 37-14 victory that improved its record to 5-6 while dropping AZ to 2-10. Rams QB Matthew Stafford threw for 4 touchdowns and RB Kyren Williams returned from a 4-week absence to gain 204 total yards and score a pair of TDs.

The Rams came up with the game's first explosive play on its third snap from scrimmage, a 3rd-n-8 from the LA27. On it Stafford hit WR Tutu Atwell deep down the right side with a 42-yard completion to the AZ31. The drive ended four plays later when Stafford found TE Tyler Higbee with a 7-yard touchdown pass. The Cards answered by moving 75 yards in 12 plays, the majority of which were completions by Kyle Murray who was 5 for 7 for 50 yards on the drive. He ended it with a 2-yard run into the end zone, his third consecutive game with a rushing TD after returning from his year-long absence due to a knee injury. A Rams penalty on the PAT led to the Cards going for 2 and they converted on a sneak by backup QB Clayton Tune. After the teams traded punts, LA took over at its own 48 and moved to the AZ5 before Stafford found Higbee for another TD that made it 14-8 Rams. The Rams next possession saw the visitors move into position for a 50-yard FG try but kicker Lucas Havrisik pushed it right and the Cards took over. At the 2:00 warning they faced a 4th-n-2 at the AZ48 and went for it but Murray's pass attempt fell incomplete. The Rams made them pay, moving to the 15 before Stafford's screen pass to Williams resulted in a TD that made it a 21-8 game at halftime.

On LA's first offensive play of the second half, Williams ran for 56 yards to the AZ22 and that led to a 24-yard Havrisik FG that made it 24-8. The Cards had a chance to add points on the next series but Matt Prater's FG try from 56 yards was a rare miss. The Rams took over at their own 46 and went 54 yards in 13 plays; Williams' 3-yard TD catch from Stafford early in the fourth quarter extended the LA lead to 31-8. RB Royce Freeman ended the next series with a 23-yard TD run to make it 37-8 with 8:19 remaining. With 5:12 left, Murray's 6-yard TD pass to WR Greg Dortch would make it 37-14 and provided the game's final score.

## WEEK 13

**Arizona Cardinals 24, Pittsburgh Steelers 10**  
**66,436** ■ Acrisure Stadium ■ **Dec 3, 2023**

A game that started on a sunny, 57-degree December afternoon in the Steel City was interrupted twice by lengthy weather-related delays. But in between them, the Cardinals made plays in all three phases to earn a 14-point victory over a Steelers team that entered the day with a 7-4 record and had won 3 of its previous 4. Playing against his former squad for the first time, Cardinals RB James Conner ran for 105 yards and a pair of TDs. The Arizona defense kept Pittsburgh out of the end zone for more than 3.5 quarters, allowing just 10 total points on an early field goal and late TD. QB Tyler Murray improved to 2-2 in his four games since returning from injury and again played turnover-free football; 8 of his 13 completions went to TE Trey McBride who finished with 89 yards and a TD. The Cardinals converted on 10 of 17 third downs while limiting Pittsburgh to 4 of 11. It all added up to a 24-10 road win that upped Arizona's record to 3-10 on the season. At four hours, 18 minutes in duration, it was the longest Cardinals game since at least the Super Bowl era began.

The Steelers got the ball first and opened the game by moving to the AZ11 in 4 plays. However, the Cardinals defense allowed them no further and Chris Boswell's 29-yard field goal made it 3-0. A couple series later, Arizona would tie it thanks to a long kick from Matt Prater, the NFL's all-time leader in FGs of 50+ yards. This one was a 51-yarder that knotted the game at 3. Later, with 12:33 to go in the 2nd quarter, the Steelers took over at their own 20 and chewed 8 minutes off the clock while marching to the AZ3 where they faced 3rd-n-goal. On that play, starting QB Kenny Pickett scrambled to the 1 but injured his ankle and was forced from the game. Backup Mitch Trubisky entered as the Steelers went for it on 4th-n-goal at the 1. However, RB Najee Harris was stopped by a group led by NT Kevin Strong and the Cards took over at their own 1 with 4:51 remaining in the half. The drive that followed was one to remember. The AZ offense was 0-4 on third downs to that point but would convert all 5 third down chances on this drive. The first was on 3rd-n-3 from the 8 when Murray hit TE Elijah Higgins for a 21-yard completion to the 29. Right before the 2:00 warning, RB Michael Carter converted a 3rd-n-6 from the AZ33 with his 19-yard run into Steeler territory. Two plays later on 3rd-n-6 from the PIT44, Murray hit McBride for a 21-yard and then again for 15 yards on 3rd-n-5 at the 21. On 2nd-n-goal from the 5, Murray found McBride for a TD but the on-field call was surprisingly reversed by replay. No matter because the pair connected again on the next play and this time the TD stood. With 0:15 left in the 2nd quarter, Arizona led 10-3 thanks to the 99-yard TD drive on which Murray was 6-8 for 71 yards including 4 completions to McBride for 49 yards and a TD.

After a lengthy rain and lightning delay that extended halftime by more than 30 minutes, Arizona's initial drive ended in a punt on which Blake Gillikin pinned the Steelers at their own 7. Shortly thereafter, the Steelers' first possession ended when Arizona DE Dante Stills recovered a Trubisky fumble at the Pittsburgh 21. The turnover led to a 1-yard TD run by Conner that gave the Cards a 17-3 lead with 7:18 to play in the third quarter. After the PAT, rain and lightning again caused another lengthy delay of about 50 minutes. When play resumed, Pittsburgh would move into position for a 45-yard FG but Boswell missed for just the second time on the season when his attempt was wide to the right. The Cardinals ensuing drive penetrated Pittsburgh territory but Arizona was again forced to punt. And Gillikin again backed up the Steelers offense, this time to the 4. Following a 3-n-out and a Pittsburgh penalty on the AZ punt return, Arizona took over at the PIT33 with 10:36 remaining. A completion of 16 yards to McBride was followed by three straight Conner runs, the last of which was a 9-yard TD jaunt that made it 24-3 midway through the fourth quarter. A late Steelers TD made it 24-10 with 4:25 left. But on the next drive, six straight Conner runs gained 50 yards and chewed off enough clock that the Cardinals could kneel down three times to end the game.

**San Francisco 49ers 45, Arizona Cardinals 29**

The Cardinals returned from their bye with a 3-10 record and hosted the NFC's #1 seed, the 10-3 San Francisco 49ers. Arizona outgained the guests in total yards (436 to 406) and time of possession (34:11 to 25:49) while rushing for a season-high 234 yards against the NFL's #1 run defense. And while San Fran edged the Cards in total scores by just one, 6 of the 7 Niners scores were TDs while AZ's 6 came in the form of 3 FGs and 3 TDs. Cards TE Trey McBride had a game-high 10 catches for 102 yards; it marked the 2nd time he eclipsed the century mark on the season and his first catch of the afternoon gave him the franchise's single-season record for receptions by a tight end. AZ native Brock Purdy returned to his hometown for the first time as Niners QB and threw for 4 TDs with no INTs. It all added up to a 45-29 win that clinched the NFC West title for San Francisco while eliminating Arizona from postseason consideration.

The Cardinals got the ball to open the game and made it count. Back-to-back Kyle Murray passes to McBride covered 11 and 38 yards and moved the ball to the SF21. That led to a 2-yard James Conner TD run that capped the 7-play, 75-yard drive. The 49ers responded with their own 75-yard drive, this one consuming 4:07 in 8 plays and ending with Purdy's 12-yard touchdown pass to WR Deebo Samuel that tied it at 7. The ensuing Cardinals drive saw them move to the SF42 where they faced a 4th-n-3, on that play, 49ers CB Charvarius Ward picked off a Murray pass attempt across the middle and he returned it 66 yards for a score. It snapped a streak of 96 straight attempts without an INT for Murray. Early in the second quarter, Matt Prater's 58-yard FG pulled AZ to within 4 points at 14-10. Eight minutes later, his 43-yarder made it a one point game with 6:14 remaining in the first half. But with 1:14 to go, RB Christian McCaffrey's 5-yard TD connection with Purdy made it 21-13. While the San Francisco D then forced a 3-n-out from the Cardinals, momentum appeared to swing to AZ in a huge way when 49ers returner Ronnie Bell fumbled the ensuing punt and AZ's Joey Blount returned it 12 yards for a TD. However, a replay review negated the score and fumble, ruling Bell's forearm was down. As a result, San Fran entered halftime with a 21-13 lead.

On the 3rd play of the 3rd quarter, San Fran faced a 3rd-n-11 at the SF24 when Purdy hit TE George Kittle on a 35-yard gain to the AZ41. A play later, he found McCaffrey open down the left sideline for a 41-yard touchdown reception and the Niners led 28-13. Arizona's next drive reached the SF10 but the Cards had to settle for another Prater FG, this one a 28-yarder that made it 28-16. McCaffrey's 3rd TD of the day – a 1-yard run – ended the next SF possession which covered 60 yards in 6 plays, making it 35-16 with 1:08 to play in the third. Emari Demercado's 49-yard TD run gave AZ a jolt with 11:30 left and made it 35-22. But a 19-yard Samuel TD catch from Purdy and a 43-yard Jake Moody FG on the next two drives pushed San Fran further ahead and Murray's 8-yard TD pass to TE Elijah Higgins in the last minute provided the game's final margin of 45-29.

## WEEK 16

Arizona Cardinals 16, Chicago Bears 27

On an unseasonably warm Christmas eve in the Windy City, the only two remaining charter members of the NFL rekindled the league's oldest rivalry. The host Bears jumped out to a 21-0 first half lead with touchdowns on three consecutive drives. However, as they have all season, the Cardinals fought back allowing just two Chicago field goals the rest of the way. They cut it to a one score game and got the ball back with 4:21 to play and a chance to tie. Arizona could not complete the comeback though and fell to 3-12 on the season while Chicago improved to 6-9.

The Bears produced the game's initial points on their second offensive possession. The first play of it was a 53-yard completion from Justin Fields to TE Cole Kmet that moved it to the AZ21. The Cards defense appeared to force a FG with a 3rd down sack of Fields but a defensive holding penalty wiped it away. On the next snap, the QB ran it in from 3 yards out and Chicago led 7-0. The next Bears drive started at their own 10 and saw them move 90 yards in 11 plays; RB Khalil Herbert ended it with his 11-yard TD run. Up 14-0 early in the 2nd quarter, Chicago took over at its own 46 after a Cardinals punt and Fields moved the offense 54 yards in 8 plays, capping the series when he found veteran TE Marcedes Lewis in the back of the end zone on 3rd-n-goal from the 1. Trailing 21-0 with 7:12 to go before halftime, the Cardinals took over at their own 25. In 8 plays, they moved 59 yards to the 16 and on 3rd-n-3 from there, Tyler Murray lofted a pass to James Conner out of the backfield and the AZ RB outraced the Bears defenders to the pylon. That made it 21-7 with 2:27 to play in the second quarter and it remained that way heading into the halftime locker room.

Arizona return man Greg Dortch returned the second half's opening kickoff 40 yards to the AZ43 and that led to a 55-yard FG from Matt Prater, the NFL's all-time leader in FGs of 50+ yards. That boot drew AZ to within 21-10 early in the 3rd. In that quarter's final minute, Cairo Santos hit a 49-yarder to end a 10-play, 49-yard drive and put Chicago back up 14 at 24-10. With 11 minutes to play, Chicago reached the AZ20 when Fields lofted a first down pass into the end zone but it was intercepted there by S Jalen Thompson. After the touchback, Murray led the Cardinals 80 yards in 8 plays and ended the drive with a touchdown pass to Dortch on 3rd-n-5 from the CHI38; the speedy WR caught it crossing the middle before twisting, turning, and zig-zagging as he took it the distance for a TD. When the 2-point attempt was unsuccessful, the Cards trailed by 8 with 6:37 to play. The Arizona defense then forced a 3-n-out and after the punt, the Cards offense took over at their own 9 with 4:21 to play. Murray moved them 18 yards to the 27 but on 4th-n-6 from there, his pass down the right sideline intended for Dortch fell incomplete and the Cardinals turned it over on downs. Chicago took over with 2:57 to play and picked up one first down before Santos' 29-yard FG sealed the game with 1:02 to go.

**Arizona Cardinals 35, Philadelphia Eagles 31**

On New Year's Eve in Philadelphia, the Cardinals (3-12) took on the Eagles (11-4), a team for which first-year AZ head coach Jonathan Gannon had served as defensive coordinator for the previous two seasons. Philly entered the season's penultimate contest in first place in the NFC East and as the conference's #2 seed with a shot at snatching #1. The Cards trailed 21-6 at intermission despite outgaining the hosts in a first half that saw AZ earn a time of possession advantage of more than 13 minutes. However, the Cardinals wiped out that deficit in a near flawless second half that saw them score TDs on all four possessions, each of which was 70+ yards. Tyler Murray was outstanding throughout, but especially in the final two quarters when he completed 13 of 14 passes for 133 yards, 3 TDs and a passer rating of 145.8. RB James Conner was also dominant, rushing for 128 yards and scoring two TDs; one came on a one-handed reception late in the 3rd quarter while the other was on the ground and put AZ up by 4 with 0:32 left. That TD proved to be the game-winner in a contest that saw the Cards gain 449 total yards (221 on the ground), amass 32 first downs and not punt once.

After forcing a Philly 3-n-out on the game's opening drive, the Cards offense moved to the PHI3 before settling for a 28-yard Matt Prater FG. The Eagles went ahead on the ensuing drive that covered 75 yards in 9 plays and ended with Jalen Hurts' 12-yard TD pass to WR Julio Jones. Down 7-3 early in the 2nd quarter, the Cards offense again marched into Philly territory. However, a QB-WR miscommunication on 3rd-n-7 from the 24 resulted in an INT that Sydney Brown hauled in at the 1 and took 99 yards for a TD that made it 14-3. AZ bounced back by moving 59 yards in 16 plays and Prater's 34-yard FG made it 14-6 with 1:50 left in the first half. That was enough time for the Eagles offense to go 75 yards in 9 plays and Jones' second TD catch of the day came with 0:16 left and made it 21-6.

AZ got the ball to open the 2nd half and made it count. Murray moved the Cards 75 yards in 10 plays and his 6-yard touchdown pass to RB Michael Carter made it 21-13. After a quick 3-n-out forced by the defense, AZ took over at its own 23 midway through the 3rd. What followed was a 77-yard drive that ended with a gorgeous one-handed Conner grab of a Murray pass in the end zone; a Murray completion to WR Michael Wilson converted the 2-point try and suddenly AZ had tied it at 21 with 2:01 remaining in the 3rd quarter. The Eagles responded with their own lengthy drive. It covered 75 yards in 13 plays - 11 of them runs - and concluded with a 9-yard TD throw from Hurts to TE Dallas Goedert that made it 28-21. On the first play of the next drive, Murray went deep down the right sideline to WR Greg Dortch which drew a defensive pass interference penalty that covered 29 yards to the PHI48. Eight plays later, the Cards faced a 4th down at the 5 with 5:30 to go when Murray tied the game at 28 by hitting Wilson in the end zone. After an unsuccessful surprise onside attempt by the Cards, Philly took over at the AZ39 with 5:25 to play. The Eagles got one first down, but the AZ defense stiffened and forced them to settle for a 43-yard Jake Elliott FG that put Philly up 31-28 with 2:33 to go. The Cards got the ball back and in four plays moved to midfield with 1:26 to go before Murray hit Dortch with a pass 10 yards downfield; the speedy WR caught it at the sideline, cut it back inside and completed the 36-yard gain to the 5. Two plays later, Conner punched it in from the 2 and AZ led 35-31 with 0:32 left on the clock. Philly would reach its own 49 in the closing seconds, but Hurts' Hall Mary pass on the game's final play was picked off in the end zone by 5 Joey Blount.

## WEEK 18

Seattle Seahawks 21, Arizona Cardinals 20

The Cardinals closed the regular season at home against an 8-8 Seattle team still fighting for a playoff spot. To secure a wild card berth, the Seahawks needed a win plus a Packers home loss vs. the Bears in a game kicking off at the same time. While Green Bay's win that eliminated Seattle was known well before the end of the Cards-Seahawks contest, both teams fought to the final whistle in a game decided on the final play. Arizona came back from a 7-point halftime deficit to take a 7-point lead midway through the 4th. Seattle would score a TD and go-ahead two-point conversion with 1:54 to go, but the Cards did not quit. Tyler Murray led the team into position for a 51-yard FG try on the game's final play but Matt Prater's attempt was just wide to the right. The loss dropped AZ to 4-13 on the season and secured the 4th overall selection in the 2024 draft. RB James Conner was sensational in the effort, racking up a career-high 150 rushing yards and a TD and another 54 yards on 4 receptions. It helped Conner eclipse 1,000 rushing yards for the first time in his career.

The game's opening drive ended with an AZ punt that pinned Seattle at its own 7. The Seahawks moved 78 yards in 10 plays to the AZ15, but Geno's Smith's 3rd-n-4 pass from there was incomplete. That led to a 33-yard Jason Myers FG that made it 3-0. Early in the 2nd quarter, the Cards moved from their own 15 to the SEA 5 thanks to a Conner 18-yard catch and 20-yard run as well as Murray's 33-yard run. However, the AZ offense could not get it into the end zone and Prater's 23-yard FG made it 3-3. Seattle answered right back with a 7-play, 75-yard drive that ended on Geno Smith's 19-yard TD pass to TE Will Dissly. The ensuing possession saw AZ again move deep into Seattle territory, but the Cards again only came away with 3 on Prater's 34-yard FG that made it 10-6 with 1:57 to go before intermission. The Seahawks then made it 14-6 on Myers' 29-yard FG as the half expired.

After AZ's defense forced a Seahawks 3-n-out to open the 3rd quarter, the offense took over at its own 13 and proceeded to go 87 yards in 4 plays. Conner's 34-yard catch-n-run was followed by a 25-yard reception to TE Elijah Higgins that took it to SEA29. On the next snap, Conner raced 29 yards for the game-tying TD. With just under 10 minutes left in the 4th, AZ had reached the SEA8 but was stopped short on 3rd down and appeared poised for a go-ahead FG try. However, the Cards caught the Seahawks off guard, subbing in only the kicker and holder while the other 9 were offensive players from the previous 3rd down play. Murray took the snap and found TE Trey McBride for a TD that made it 20-13 with 9:48 to go. After forcing its third 3-n-out of the 2nd half, Arizona took over at its own 22 with 8:20 to go. With 2:56 to go, Prater attempted a 43-yard FG that would have made it a 10-point game but the try was wide right. Seattle took over at its own 33 and moved to the AZ34 in three plays. Smith then hit Tyler Lockett with a TD strike for 6 and the two then connected on the 2-point try that put the Seahawks up 21-20 with 1:54 remaining. Two Murray passes to WR Michael Wilson covered 21 and 12 yards and were instrumental into moving AZ into position for a game-winning FG, but Prater's 51-yard attempt as time expired was unsuccessful.
