



# ARIZONA CARDINALS NOTE CARDS

- 10** Tackles for S Budda Baker in each of his last two games. With 10 tackles this week in Houston, Baker would have 10+ tackles in three consecutive games for the first time in his career. He would be the first DB in the NFL with 10+ tackles in three or more consecutive games this season and the first Cardinals DB to do so since S Pat Tillman had four straight games with 10+ tackles in 2000 (Weeks 14-17).
- 16** Consecutive road games with 50+ scrimmage yards for RB James Conner, the longest active streak in the NFL. Conner has totaled 50+ scrimmage yards in every road game he has appeared in as a Cardinal.
- 63** Rushing yards needed for RB James Conner to reach 500 this season. It would mark Conner's fifth season with 500+ rushing yards in his career and his fourth consecutive year. He would join Derrick Henry, D'Andre Swift, Josh Jacobs and David Montgomery as the only NFL players to register 500+ rushing yards in each of the last four seasons (2020-23).
- 6** Years to the day between this Sunday's game and S Budda Baker's first career start. Baker had 12 tackles, two forced fumbles, one fumble recovery and 1.0 sack in his first NFL start at Houston on 11/19/17.

## WITH A WIN...

- The Cardinals would improve to 4-2 all-time vs. the Texans, including a 4-1 mark in the last five games.
- Arizona would earn its first-ever road win against the Texans.
- The Cards would improve to 14-7 vs. the AFC South since the division's inception in 2002.
- QB Kyler Murray would improve to 4-0 as a starter vs. NFL teams from his home state of Texas. He is currently 2-0 vs. the Cowboys and 1-0 vs. the Texans.

## MILESTONES WITHIN REACH...

### QB KYLER MURRAY

- With 3+ TD passes, Murray would have 3+ passing TDs in a game for the 13th time in his career. Only Neil Lomax (15 times in 108 games) and Charley Johnson (14 times in 87 games) would have more such performances.
- With a rushing TD, Murray would have 25 rushing TDs as a member of the Cardinals. That would tie Pat Harder (1946-50) for ninth place on the franchise all-time list for career rushing TDs.

### RB JAMES CONNER

- With a rushing TD, Conner would have a rushing TD in all three career games played vs. Houston.
- With a rushing TD, Conner would have 25 rushing TDs as a member of the Cardinals. That would tie Pat Harder (1946-50) for ninth place on the franchise all-time list for career rushing TDs.

### TE TREY McBRIDE

- With 100+ receiving yards, McBride would become the first Cardinals TE with 100+ receiving yards in back-to-back games since HOFer Jackie Smith (Games 9-10) in 1966.

### LB BJ OJULARI

- With 1.5 or more sacks, Ojulari would join Andre Wadsworth (Games 4-5 in 1998) as the only players in franchise history with multiple sacks in back-to-back games.
- With 1.5 or more sacks, Ojulari would become the first rookie in the NFL this season with at least two games of multiple sacks.

### LB KYZIR WHITE

- With 13 tackles, White would have 100+ tackles in a season for the third consecutive season with three different teams (LAC in '21 and Phi in '22).

### DL DANTE STILLS

- With 1.5 or more sacks, Stills would join Simeon Rice (3 in 1996) and Andre Wadsworth (2 in 1998) as the only players in franchise history with at least two games of multiple sacks in their rookie season.
- With 1.5 or more sacks, Stills would become the first rookie in the NFL this season with at least two games of multiple sacks.

### WR RONDALE MOORE

- With a rushing TD, Moore (1) would become the first Cardinals WR with multiple rushing TDs in a season since WR Bobby Joe Conrad (2) in 1959 and the only WR in the NFL with multiple rushing TDs this season.

### WR MICHAEL WILSON

- With two TD receptions, Wilson would join WRs Larry Fitzgerald and Anquan Boldin as the only rookies in franchise history to have multiple games with two TD catches.

### K MATT PRATER

- With two FGs, Prater would reach 393 field goals in his career and pass Stephen Gostkowski (392) for 14th place on the NFL's all-time list for career FGs.

## BIG PLAY TREY

TE **Trey McBride** had a career day last Sunday against the Falcons, catching eight passes for a career-high 131 yards.

**Not only did McBride's 131 receiving yards mark the first 100-yard game for a Cardinals TE in 34 years to the day (Rob Awalt vs. Dallas on 11/12/89), they were also the most receiving yards by a Cards TE in a single game in over 53 years (Jackie Smith - 149 yards vs. New Orleans on 10/11/70).**

Over the last three weeks, McBride has recorded 21 receptions for 248 yards and a TD. **In that span, his 21 receptions are tied for the second most in the NFL among TEs (T.J. Hockenson - 24) while his 248 receiving yards rank third (Hockenson - 291, George Kittle - 265).**

## ROOKIE RUSHERS

With 2.0 sacks last week vs. the Falcons, LB **BJ Ojulari** joined teammate DL **Dante Stills** among the six rookies in the NFL this season to have multiple sacks in a game.

**Ojulari and Stills are the only pair of Cardinals rookies to each have a multi-sack game in the same season since at least 1982** when sacks became an official individual statistic (excluding the 1987 season which featured strike replacement players).

Along with a sack of Lamar Jackson in Week 8 against the Ravens, Ojulari has 3.0 sacks in the last three games. **That not only leads all rookies in Weeks 8-10, it is also tied for the fourth most in the NFL during that span (Dayo Odeyingbo - 4.0, Myles Garrett - 3.5, Joey Bosa - 3.5, Jonathan Greenard - 3.5).**



## NO FLY ZONE

The Cardinals defense held the Falcons offense to 70 net passing yards last Sunday.

**It marked just the fourth time in the last 22 seasons that the team allowed 70 or fewer net passing yards in a game.**

**Arizona ranks 11th in the NFL in pass defense, allowing just 208.4 yards per game.** The Cards will try to temper the Texans surging passing attack on Sunday. Houston currently ranks second in the league in passing yards per game (274.3).
