- Selected by the Falcons in the second round (60th overall) of the 2013 NFL Draft, Alford played 88 games (76 starts) in six seasons with Atlanta. He has 291 tackles (243 solo), 10 INTs, 85 passes defended, four tackles for loss, two fumble recoveries and a forced fumble in the regular season and 30 tackles, an INT and nine passes defended in five career postseason contests.
- Returned three INTs for TDs in his NFL career (two regular season and one postseason), including an INT off Tom Brady in Super Bowl LI that he returned 82 yards for a score.

PRO CAREER:

Entered the NFL as a second round (60th overall) selection of Atlanta in the 2013 NFL Draft. Re-signed with the Falcons on 12/8/16. Released on 2/5/19 and signed a three-year contract with the Cardinals on 2/7/19. Released by Arizona on 3/10/21 and re-signed on 3/12/21.

2020: Suffered a season-ending chest injury during training camp and was placed on injured reserve on 8/21.

Totaled 137 tackles, six tackles for loss, 10 INTs, 20 passes defended, three fumble recoveries and one forced fumble in 32 games (31 starts) ... named the NCAA Football Championship Subdivision National Defensive Player of the Year by the College

Sports Journal and earned FCS All American honors from the NFL Draft Report and the Sports Network as a senior in 2012 ... also received first-team All-Southland Conference honors and was named a finalist for the Buck Buchanan Award ... earned second-team All-Southland Conference accolades with 52 tackles, five INTs, seven passes defended, one forced fumble and one fumble recovery as a junior in 2011.

Attended Hammond (LA) High School where he earned first-team all-district 7-5A honors after catching 10 TD passes as a senior in 2008 ... also ran track, placing second in the 400-meters at the 2007 Louisiana High School Athletic Association Track and Field Championships ... older brother, Fred Booker, was a CB at LSU and played in the Arena Football League and NFL Europe before appearing in 12 games with the New Orleans Saints in 2005.

- Selected by the Cardinals in the third round (65th overall) of the 2019 NFL Draft, Allen totaled 43 tackles, six tackles for loss, 2.0 sacks, nine QB hits and three passes defensed in 17 games (eight starts) during his first two seasons.
- Had the best performance of his young career in Week 15 of the 2020 season when he led the Cardinals with a career-high 11 tackles in addition to his second-career sack, a tackle for loss, a QB hit and a pass defensed in the win over Philadelphia.
- Became just the third BC player ever selected by Arizona in the NFL Draft and the first since the team took Joe Wolf with the 17th overall pick in 1989.

PRO CAREER:

Selected by the Cardinals in the third round (65th overall) of the 2019 NFL Draft, Allen appeared in 17 games (eight starts) during his first two seasons.

2020: Appeared in 13 games (seven starts) and tallied 35 tackles, five tackles for loss, 2.0 sacks, six QB hits and three passes defensed while missing three games on injured reserve ... recorded two tackles, his first-career sack, a tackle for loss and a QB hit in the season-opener @ SF (9/13); part of a defense that held the 49ers to just two conversions on 11 third down attempts (18%) ... had one tackle and a QB hit for a defense that limited the Jets to 162 net passing yards and four-of-13 on third down @ NYJ (10/11) ... part of a defense that held the NFL's #3-ranked offense to season lows in points (10) and TDs (one) on Monday Night Football @ Dal (10/19) ... placed on injured reserve (ankle) on 10/27, designated to return on 11/24 and activated on 11/28 ... started and had three tackles, including a tackle for loss in his return from injury @ NE (11/29) ... totaled three tackles, a QB hit and a pass defensed for a defense that allowed season lows in points (seven), total net yards (159) and first downs (10) @ NYG (12/13) ... started and led the Cardinals with a career-high 11 tackles to go along with his second-career sack, a tackle for loss, a QB hit and a pass defensed vs. Phi (12/20); brought down Jalen

Hurts for a 14-yard sack in the third quarter ... tallied five tackles, one tackle for loss and a pass defensed @ LAR (1/3/21).

COLLEGE:

Appeared in 50 games in four seasons and totaled 199 tackles, 40.5 tackles for loss, 18.5 sacks, 16 passes defensed, four fumble recoveries, two INTs and two blocked kicks ... over his final two seasons, had 161 tackles, 30.5 tackles for loss, 12.5 sacks, 12 passes defensed, two INTs and two fumble recoveries ... started all 12 games he played and totaled 61 tackles, a career-high 6.5 sacks, 15 tackles for loss, and INT and a career-high eight passes defensed as a senior in 2018 ... earned All-ACC second-team, Pro Football Focus second-team All-America and New England Football Writers All-New England Team honors ... started 13 games, led BC with 6.0 sacks, ranked 10th in school single-season history with 15.5 tackles for loss and finished the year as one of two defensive linemen with 100+ tackles nationally during his junior season in 2017 ... recipient of the 79th annual George 'Bulger' Lowe Award (New England's Heisman Trophy and one of America's oldest college football awards) and was an All-ACC honorable mention selection ... had 36 tackles, 10 tackles for loss, 6.0 sacks, four pass breakups, three QB hurries and two fumble recoveries in 13 games (one start) as a sophomore in 2016 ... played all 12 games, primarily on special teams, as a freshman in 2015.

Named the 2014 Connecticut Gatorade Player of the Year as a senior at New Canaan (CT) High School ... earned the NFF National High School Scholar-Athlete Award for the Northeast Region ... a three-year starter for the Rams, winning two state titles in 2013-14 ... named a captain as a senior ... set the school record for career sacks with 33.0, the single-season record with 13.5 in 2014 and tied the single-game record with four on Thanksgiving in 2014 ... named New Haven Register's Player of the Year, CHSCA Player of the Year and MSG Connecticut Varsity Player of the Year ... member of the Walter Camp All-Connecticut

High School Team and was a finalist for Player of the Year ... member of the USA Today All-USA Connecticut team ... had 102 tackles, 18 tackles for loss, two INTs, seven forced fumbles, one fumble recovery, 12 passes defended and scored one defensive TD in his senior season ... also scored three TDs as a TE with seven receptions for 75 yards ... also played basketball, earning All-FCIAC honorable mention ... National Football Foundation Scholar-Athlete, member of the National Honor Society and four-year high honor roll student ... Finance major in the Carroll School of Management and was the recipient of the Cecilia B. and Richard J. Canning Athletic Scholarship Fund.

Played 48 games in four seasons (2016-19) at Washington where he totaled 107 receptions for 1,183 yards and five TDs ... added 10 carries for 119 yards and a TD ... played in four bowl games with the Huskies -- Las Vegas Bowl (2019), Rose Bowl (2018), Fiesta Bowl (2017) and Chick-fil-A Peach Bowl (2016) -- setting a UW bowl-game record with 12 receptions for 109 yards in the Rose Bowl vs. Ohio State ... appeared in 11 games and had 29 catches for 314 yards and a career-high four TDs as a senior in 2019 ... earned the Husky coaches' offensive player of the game with career-high eight receptions in the Pac-12 Championship

- Selected by the Cardinals in the second round (36th overall) of the 2017 NFL Draft out of Washington and appeared in 61 games (51 starts) during his first four seasons with Arizona.
- Named a team captain, earned first-team All-Pro honors and selected to his third Pro Bowl (second consecutive at safety) in 2020, joining CB Patrick Peterson (4) as the only players in Cardinals history to earn at least three Pro Bowl selections before their 25th birthday. Matched a team high and tied for the NFL lead among DBs with 118 tackles while adding seven tackles for loss, 2.0 sacks, three QB hits, two INTs, six passes defended and a forced fumble in 15 games (all starts).
- Earned his second Pro Bowl nod (first as a safety) in 2019, becoming the first player in franchise history selected to the Pro Bowl as a special teamer and as a position player. Started all 16 games and led all NFL DBs with a career-high 147 tackles, including a league-high 104 solo tackles, and posted seven tackles for loss, six passes defended, six QB hits, a half-sack, a forced fumble and a fumble recovery.
- In 2018, appeared in 14 games (13 starts) and totaled 107 tackles, eight tackles for loss, 2.0 sacks, three QB pressures, four QB hits, two passes defended, a forced fumble and two fumble recoveries (one returned 36 yards for his first career TD); one of just three NFL safeties with 100+ tackles, 2.0+ sacks and 8+ tackles for loss in 2018, according to league statistics.
- Named first-team All-Pro and was voted to the Pro Bowl for his work on special teams as a rookie in '17 after he led the Cardinals and ranked third in the NFL with 16 special teams tackles. One of just four rookies named to the Pro Bowl in '17 and became just the fifth Cardinals rookie since the 1970 merger to be named to the Pro Bowl.
- Became the fourth player in Cardinals history to be voted NFC Defensive Player of the Month (October, 2020) with 31 tackles, 2.0 sacks, two INTs (90 return yards), three tackles for loss, three QB hits, two passes defended and a forced fumble in three games.
- Named NFC Defensive Player of the Week (Week 6, 2020) after posting seven tackles, a sack, his first career INT, a tackle for loss, two QB hits, a pass defended and a forced fumble on Monday Night Football against the Cowboys.
- In his first career NFL start, recorded 12 tackles, a sack, two forced fumbles and a fumble recovery at Houston in Week 11 of the '17 season. Became the first rookie in 20 years and the first Cardinals player ever to register 10+ tackles, a sack and two forced fumbles in a game.
- During a remarkable prep career at Bellevue High School, won five team state titles (3 in football, 2 in track & field) and eight individual state titles in track & field. In football, he played on three consecutive 14-0 teams that won three consecutive 3A state championships.
- Given first name is Bishard. Nicknamed "Budda" by his mother and aunt when he was a child and the name stuck.

PRO CAREER:

The Cardinals acquired Baker in the second round (36th overall) of the 2017 NFL Draft after trading up nine spots (from 45th to 36th) to acquire the University of Washington product. Agreed to terms on a four-year extension that will keep him under contract with the Cardinals through the 2024 season.

2020: Named a team captain for the first time in his career, earned first-team All-Pro recognition and selected to his third Pro Bowl (second consecutive at safety), becoming just the seventh Cardinals player to earn at least three Pro Bowl selections in their first four seasons ... matched a team high and tied for the NFL lead among DBs with 118 tackles while adding seven tackles for loss, 2.0 sacks, three QB hits, two INTs, six passes defended and a forced fumble in 15 games (all starts) ... named NFC Defensive Player of the Month with 31 tackles, 2.0 sacks, two INTs (90 return yards), three tackles for loss, three QB hits, two passes defended and a forced fumble in October ... led the Cardinals with a career-high 15 tackles, including a game-high 10 solo stops in the season-opener @ SF (9/13); part of a defense that held the 49ers to just two conversions on 11 third down attempts (18%) ... totaled a team-high eight tackles, a tackle for loss and a pass defended while wearing a cast on his right hand vs. Det (9/27) ...

CARDINALS IN THE COMMUNITY

Offensive lineman Kelvin Beachum is in his second season with the Cardinals after previously playing in New York, Jacksonville and Pittsburgh. One common theme for Beachum throughout his NFL career has been the impact he has made in each community where he lived. That is in addition to the contributions he has made in his home state of Texas as well.

In December, Beachum wrote an op-ed for NFL.com where he talked about the need to close the digital divide. He expressed his concern that children of color and those from low-income families are not able to attend great schools and do not have access to laptops, tablets, and internet connections for their work. He called on the federal government to help end the digital divide.

Last year, in his first season with the Cardinals, Beachum made a \$15,000 donation through Donors Choose to fund 34 projects across Arizona school districts. The projects included STEAM education resources, diverse books for classroom libraries and clean water access.

He also took part in the NFL's My Cause My Cleats campaign to help draw attention to the Players Coalition. Beachum and his family hosted a food and Christmas tree donation for 100 families at Sirrine Elementary School in Chandler, AZ through a partnership with Lowe's and the United Food Bank.

Selected as the Jets 2018 Walter Payton NFL Man of the Year and an NFL Community MVP winner each year between 2016-19, Beachum currently serves as a task force member for the Players Coalition. He focuses his efforts on the education pillar, helping to bridge the technology and resource gap in low-income communities and to help provide access to equitable education opportunities for youth in under-resourced schools.

In 2016, Beachum created "Kelvin Connects," a STEAM initiative and program designed to increase minority access to careers within the Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts and Mathematics disciplines. "Kelvin Connects" works to bridge the gap of access and opportunity for minority students. As part of that program, "Kelvin Connects" works with students of the Barack Obama Male Leadership Academy in Dallas and pairs them with industry leaders, local and federal elected officials and offers the opportunity for the students to immerse themselves in the world of STEAM.

Another aspect of Beachum's community giving is through his work with food banks to help bring more attention to the issues of hunger and malnutrition. Throughout his career, he has been a regular volunteer at food banks in the city where he lives and in Texas during the offseason. Working with the Central Texas Food Bank, Beachum created a monthly mobile food pantry to feed families in his hometown of Mexia, Texas. In 2017, he was named Ambassador at Large for the Central Texas Food Bank and helped raise \$100,000 while also providing a matching gift of \$100,000 for the food bank. Beachum has also worked and donated his time and financial resources to the Houston Food Bank, Pittsburgh Food Bank, Feeding Northeast Florida Food Bank and the Food Bank of New York City (Harlem).

Beachum celebrated World Food Day in 2018 with a fan match initiative that raised \$75,000 to all the food banks he has worked with in his career, helping to serve more than 327,000 meals. He also partnered with the Bread for the World organization in 2015 to work towards the goal of ending hunger in the U.S. and around the world. Beachum partnered with Bread for the World to lobby Congress to improve summer food programs for school children and pass the Global Food Security Act in 2016.

He hosts an annual football camp for 500 youth in Mexia, Texas. Beachum is joined each year by current and former NFL players to help lead position drills and coach camp participants on the game of football. The camp also provides each child with a backpack full of school supplies.

During his time with the Jets, Beachum was honored and recognized in 2018 for his efforts in the community by being named the United Way Hometown Hero. In 2017, Beachum partnered with the United Way and World Vision to bring holiday cheer to 100 families in Harlem with a toy distribution. In 2019 in response to the Newark Water Crisis, Beachum donated \$10,000 to the United Way of Newark to provide 100,000 water bottles to residents in need.

Malcom Butler is in his first season with the Cardinals after previously playing with Tennessee and New England. The Pro Bowl cornerback has shown his passion for the community during his seven years in the NFL by giving back to his hometown of Vicksburg, MS and contributing to the cities where he has played.

In Week 11 of the 2020 season, Butler earned NFLPA Community MVP honors for his contributions during the COVID-19 pandemic. In honor of the award, the NFLPA contributed \$10,000 to the United Way of Central Mississippi, the charity of his choice.

In an effort to provide relief during the pandemic, Butler partnered with Meharry Medical College, the nation's largest private, independent historically black institution to fund the purchase of protective equipment and medical materials for health care workers and first responders. Additionally, Butler paid for meals for Tennessee's first responders in coordination with a local, minority-owned small business. He also provided \$5,000 in Kroger gift cards to the Nashville YMCA to buy meals for local residents. Back in his hometown of Vicksburg, Butler also donated to the United Way to provide meals for more than 600 senior citizens.

Named a United Way Champion in March of 2021, Butler was recognized for his 2020 contributions to the community after donating \$10,000 to its Central Mississippi chapter and \$5,000 in Kroger gift cards to both Central Mississippi and to the YMCA of the North for providing meals to senior citizens. As an alumni of the University of West Alabama, he also donated \$5,000 to the UWA hunger/pandemic relief fund, which supplied 200 meals for those in need and for students unable to go home for Thanksgiving. In a separate event in Vicksburg, he also provided school supplies for 300 students in need.

In 2014, Butler hosted his first annual Football Camp. Free for children, the event is held each summer in his hometown of Vicksburg and features football drills and team-building activities.

In May, the Cardinals agreed to terms with CB **Malcolm Butler**, a two-time Pro Bowl selection (2015-16) and second-team All-Pro honoree (2016) who is entering his eighth year in the NFL.

The West Alabama product entered the league as an undrafted rookie free agent with New England, where he won two Super Bowls (2014, '16) with the Patriots.

As a rookie in 2014, Butler made one of the most iconic plays in Super Bowl history in Super Bowl XLIX at State Farm Stadium when he intercepted Russell Wilson's pass at the goal line with under a minute to play to clinch the Patriots championship victory.

In the six seasons following that goal line interception, Butler has accumulated 79 passes defensed, which ranks sixth in the NFL during that span (2015-20).

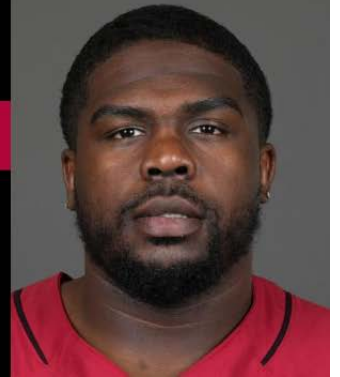

He also partnered with fellow teammates Cameron Heyward, Maurkice Pouncey and JuJu Smith-Schuster to provide local agencies with turkeys and Thanksgiving meals, serving more than 950 families in Pittsburgh, Erie and Long Beach, CA.

In honor of World Cancer Day, Conner visited patients at UMPC Hillman Cancer Center in February of 2020. His goal was a simple one, to encourage and bring hope to patients battling cancer.

In October of 2019, as a frequent participant in the Make-A-Wish Foundation, Conner surprised Andre Jenkins, a 19-year-old undergoing treatment for leukemia with tickets to the Steelers Monday Night Football game.

That same month, Conner was a recipient of the 2019 Ed Block Courage Award, an award voted on by teammates and given to a player who has shown courage either coming back from an injury or a life-altering situation.

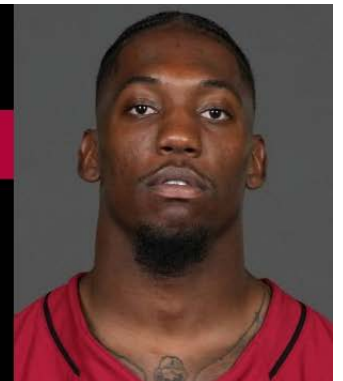

With all of his success on the field, he has been just as active in the Valley community, rarely missing an opportunity to participate in school trips, kids camps and hospital visits. His improbable path to the NFL brought him to Arizona in 2018, and since then, he has supported his community with the same passion he brings to the field.

He is currently hosting a book club in Arizona with students from the Fowler and Madison school districts. As part of the book club, Gardeck conducts Zoom events to discuss the various books with the students.

March is National Reading Month, and this year Gardeck participated in the virtual "Read Across America Campaign" with Arizona schools. The presentation involved nearly 750,000 students between the ages of 4-11 in more than 1,800 Arizona elementary schools. Gardeck along with head coach Kliff Kingsbury and other teammates read books by beloved children's author Dr. Seuss. The annual nationwide campaign, aimed to promote literacy among children, coincided with what would have been Dr. Seuss' 117th birthday.

Last January, Gardeck participated in a drive-by birthday party held for a patient at Phoenix Children's Hospital. In November, he hosted a virtual birthday party for patients at PCH and provided Cardinals gear for the participants.

In December of 2018 and 2019, Gardeck delivered stuffed toy dogs to children in the pediatric units throughout Phoenix Children's Hospital as part of the team's annual "Paw Express" event to help spread holiday cheer. He has also participated in team's "Feed the Hungry" program at the Phoenix Rescue Mission, joining team owner Michael Bidwill and Cardinals teammates to serve Thanksgiving dinner to the less fortunate.

Gardeck has displayed consistent support and appreciation for military veterans throughout his community service. During the 2019 off-season, he took part in "Operation Sleep," a military appreciation event hosted by Cardinals Charities and Brooklyn Bedding at MANA (Marines, Army, Navy and Air Force) House in Phoenix. He and team representatives delivered 76 beds to the residents of MANA House, a peer-support organization that helps rebuild the lives of military veterans affected by homelessness.

He joined teammates and Cardinals Cheerleaders to host and honor eight active servicewomen with a day of relaxation and dinner provided by Ocean 44 as part of the USO Salute to Service Dinner in December of 2019. Later that month, Gardeck and teammates joined Cardinals Cheerleaders and team mascot Big Red for the Pro vs. GI Joe program at the team's facility. In conjunction with the Joint Forces Initiative, the program had players and military personnel, home and abroad, playing video games and communicating through a webcam on Xbox Live.

He joined Nicole Bidwill, Big Red, Cardinals Cheerleaders and teammates in December of 2018 for the team's annual "Light the House" party hosted by the Cardinals Women's Club to help spread holiday cheer at the Ronald McDonald House. In November of 2019, he returned to the Ronald McDonald House with Big Red and Cardinals Cheerleaders for a "Feed the Families" event hosted by the Cardinals Women's Club.

Along with teammates, the Cardinals Women's Club, Big Red and Cardinals Cheerleaders, Gardeck celebrated a birthday party in the Kids Zone at Phoenix Children's Hospital in November of 2019. Each month, PCH holds a party for all patients with a birthday that month, and the Cardinals Women's Club sponsored the November birthday party that year.

That same month Gardeck joined several teammates to show off their culinary skills during "A Night Out with the Arizona Cardinals" at Sakana Sushi & Grill in Phoenix, an annual event that honors cancer survivors. As part of the NFL's "My Cause, My Cleats" campaign, Gardeck's customized cleats supported the American Cancer Society for two seasons (2018-19) and Phoenix Children's Hospital in 2020.

He has been a regular participant in the team's "Milk and Cookies" program, visiting elementary schools throughout the Valley to promote literacy by reading to children. He also takes part in team kids camps, helping to promote the NFL's "Play 60" campaign to encourage kids get at least 60 minutes of exercise every day.

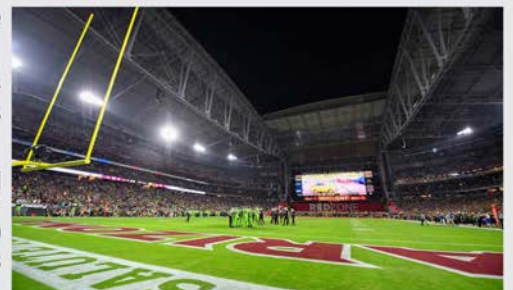
ARIZONA AND DAYLIGHT SAVING TIME

Every year people across the country turn their clocks ahead in the spring and back in the fall, except in Arizona.

Although Arizona stays on standard time throughout the year, never changing its clock forward or back, the time change, or lack thereof, does affect the Cardinals local kickoff times during the season.

In 2021, daylight saving time was observed on the second Sunday in March (March 14) and ends on the first Sunday in November (November 7). When daylight saving time is in effect, Arizona is three hours behind the east coast, making a 4:00 p.m. kickoff in New York a 1:00 p.m. kickoff in Arizona. However, when daylight saving time ends, Arizona is only two hours behind the east coast, making a 4:00 p.m. kickoff in New York a 2:00 p.m. kickoff in Arizona.

In 1967, the Uniform Time Act was instituted, putting the entire country on daylight saving time. After one year, states could opt out, and Arizona went back to standard time and stayed there. Residents and lawmakers of Arizona knew there was an abundance of sunshine and did not see the need to move their clocks ahead in order to save any. The only other state that does not observe Daylight Saving Time is Hawaii.

In 2020, Hicks a former Texas Longhorn, along with his wife Ivana, partnered with Austin Pets Alive, a foundation whose mission is to shelter animals and give them the chance they deserve. Hicks provided care packages for local families that adopted animals from the shelter. The care packages included a crate, pet food, treats, a leash, a toy, litter for cats along with a gift card.

In his efforts to provide support during the COVID-19 pandemic, Hicks partnered with Impact Church in Scottsdale, AZ. The church held a Covid testing drive thru and Hicks matched donations up to \$100,000 to the church's relief fund for those needing help. The fund provided assistance for single moms, provided meals, helped with rent and mortgages in addition to more outreach.

Pairing his on-field performance with his charitable giving, in 2018 Hicks donated \$500 to the Justice Mission for every point scored during the Eagles game against Washington. Justice Mission is a charity that provides rescue and freedom to people trapped in slavery and human trafficking.

That same year, Hicks served as team captain in Carson Wentz's inaugural charity softball game benefitting Wentz's foundation AO1. The event raised more than \$850,000 with 25,000 fans in attendance.

Also during the 2018 offseason, Hicks served as a dignitary for the "AAA 400 Drive for Autism" Monster Energy NASCAR Cup Series race at Dover International Speedway. Hicks served as the honorary starter waving the green flag to get the race going. The Eagles followed up after the event with an organization-wide effort that included cycling along with a 5K Run/Walk to raise funds for innovative autism research and programs.

- Has now finished a season ranked in the NFL's top-3 in receptions four times (2020, 2019, 2018, 2015) and receiving yards three times (2020, 2018, 2015).
- In the 2020 finale against the Rams, surpassed 10,000 career receiving yards. At 28 years, 211 days old he became the youngest player in NFL history to reach 10,000 career receiving yards.
- One of three players in NFL history with at least 700 receptions, 10,000 yards and 60 TDs in his first eight seasons (Marvin Harrison; Torry Holt).
- In NFL history, only Marvin Harrison (759) had more receptions in his first eight NFL seasons than Hopkins (747).
- Has been top-20 on the NFL Network Top 100 Players in four of the last five seasons and earned his highest-ever rating (#8) in 2020.
- Since entering the league in 2013, ranks first in receptions (747), second in receiving yards (10,009) and fourth in TD receptions (60).

CARDINALS IN THE COMMUNITY

Since entering the NFL in 2013, wide receiver DeAndre Hopkins has served as a tireless advocate for those in need and has participated in a host of events to support local communities – from his hometown in Central, SC to Houston, TX and now in the Valley.

In May, Hopkins announced the creation of “DeAndre’s HOP BOX,” a cereal that is sold online and in local Fry’s grocery stores in Arizona. The proceeds from the cereal are going towards Hopkins’ nonprofit SMOOOTH (Speaking Mentally, Outwardly Opening Opportunities Toward Healing) Foundation, which assists survivors of domestic violence.

This past January, Hopkins toured Luke Air Force base in support of the United States Air Force. He received an up-close look at the fighter jets, tried on an 80-pound explosion-proof suit and received an inside look at the technological projects at the base.



In March of 2020 – just a week after being acquired by the Cardinals – Hopkins announced a \$150,000 donation to the Arizona Coronavirus Relief Fund, which was established to provide financial support to multiple organizations dealing with the impact of COVID-19. Money raised by Arizona Relief Fund helped purchase personal protective equipment for medical personnel working with the coronavirus patients; support non-profits that aid the most vulnerable such as food banks, homeless shelters and domestic violence facilities; and provide technology for disadvantaged students needed for online learning.

Having experienced firsthand its devastating effects while growing up in South Carolina, Hopkins has used his platform as an NFL star to serve as an advocate for the victims of domestic violence.

Much of Hopkins advocacy is done through the SMOOOTH Foundation, established by his mother, Sabrina Greenlee, in 2013. Left blind by a 2002 incident of domestic violence, Greenlee started SMOOOTH to assist survivors of domestic violence. In addition to providing financial assistance to the foundation, Hopkins also spends time meeting with women his mother mentors and speaking to high school students about his past experiences.

During his time in Houston, Hopkins was a consistent presence at community events with the Texans, making visits to the Texas Children’s Hospital to deliver teddy bears, joining teammate J.J. Watt for the J.J. Watt Charity Softball Classic, taking part in the Texans Champions of Youth Dinner at Steak 48, hosting numerous visits with children through the Make-A-Wish Foundation and working closely with the Boys & Girls Club.

In January of 2019, Hopkins donated his \$29,000 game check from the Texans Wild Card matchup to the family of Jazmine Barnes, a seven-year-old girl who was killed in a drive-by shooting in Houston. Hopkins donation covered the funeral costs and helped bring the perpetrator to justice. In August of that year, Hopkins purchased new football helmets and chinstraps for all the kids playing for youth football teams in Central, SC.

Hopkins joined former teammate Andre Johnson in 2018 to host a special holiday evening for the Madge Bush Transitional Living Center. The pair handed out gifts, interacted with fans and hosted dinner at the Living Center, a charity that provides housing for up to 24 months to sufferers of homelessness or domestic violence, with a focus on single mothers and their children.

Pairing his on-field performance with his charitable giving in 2016, Hopkins donated \$1,000 for every TD scored during the month of October to AVDA-Aid, a charity that assists the victims of domestic violence.

In 2015, Hopkins teamed up with former Daniel (SC) High School and Clemson University teammate Jarvis Jenkins to host the DeAndre Hopkins & Jarvis Jenkins Football Camp. Free for children ages 6-18, the event was held in Central, SC and featured football drills and team-building activities. That was the first in a series of summer camps hosted by Hopkins during his time in the NFL.

In 2014, Hopkins took part in the Texans Care initiative, serving as the spokesman for the Houston Food Bank and Souper Bowl of Caring. Through the initiative, he raised awareness for hunger relief through volunteer activities and nutrition education. Hopkins also visited the Food Bank to meet with children and families and spoke at events to raise awareness for the issue.

A former national president of the PFWA, Schoenfeld was killed by hit-and-run driver in October of 2000.

- One of six NFL defenders to earn multiple first-team All-Pro selections from 2017-19 and became the fifth defender – and first LB – in Cardinals history to be named a first-team All-Pro multiple times.
- Leads the NFL in sacks (97.0) and forced fumbles (27 - tied) since entering the league in 2012, and just 10 players in NFL history had more sacks in their first nine seasons than Jones. His 61.0 sacks during his first five seasons with the Cardinals (2016-20) rank second in the NFL during that span and second all-time in franchise history.
- Had 13.0+ sacks in each of his last three full seasons (2017-19), trailing only Pro Football Hall of Famer Reggie White (four) for the most consecutive 13.0-sack campaigns in NFL history.
- Had 10.0+ sacks in five consecutive seasons (2015-19) before a season-ending injury in 2020, joining Von Miller (2014-18) as the only active NFL players to accomplish the feat. Also became the first player in Cardinals history with at least four 10.0+ sack campaigns (2016-19).
- Earned Pro Bowl, first-team All-Pro (AP, PFWA, Sporting News) and NFC Defensive Player of the Year (NFL Committee of 101) honors after establishing a single-season franchise record with 19.0 sacks (second in the NFL) and setting career highs with eight forced fumbles (tied for first) and seven strip-sacks (first) in 2019. Also finished second in Defensive Player of the Year voting and became the third NFL player – first since Reggie White (1986) – to post 4.0+ sacks in multiple games in a season.
- Earned a Pro Bowl selection and first-team All-Pro (AP, PFWA, Sporting News) honors after leading the NFL with 17.0 sacks in 2017. CARDINALS IN THE COMMUNITY

Pro Bowler Chandler Jones came to the Cardinals in a trade from New England in 2016. While dominating on the field the past five years, he has also been active in the Arizona community.

In March of 2020, Jones donated more than 150,000 meals to food banks in both Arizona and his hometown of Endicott, NY to assist families affected by the COVID-19 pandemic. He provided meals to St. Mary's Food Bank and Midwest Food Bank of Arizona while also donating to Mother Teresa's Cupboard through the Catholic Charities of Broome County in New York.

In December of 2018, Jones donated \$40,000 to Phoenix Children's Hospital after pledging \$20,000 to PCH for every sack he collected in the Cardinals final two games of the season. He recorded one in the team's season finale at Seattle but opted to double the donation to \$40,000.

During the 2019 offseason, he joined representatives from the Cardinals and the Be Kind Crew to participate in an anti-bullying assembly in Phoenix. Jones passed along a message about kindness and what to do instead of what not to do when it comes to bullying.

Prior to the 2019 season, he hosted his second football camp for 75 kids at the Dignity Health Cardinals Training Center. The kids had the opportunity to learn proper technique and training tips while also taking part in a Q&A with Jones.



NEARLY UNSTOPPABLE IN ARIZONA

The 2020 season – in which he missed the final 11 games due to a biceps injury – proved an injury is the only thing that can slow down LB **Chandler Jones**.

In just 69 games with the Cardinals, the All-Pro has recorded 61.0 sacks. He enters the 2021 season needing just 6.0 sacks to pass Freddie Joe Nunn as the franchise all-time leader.

CARDINALS IN THE COMMUNITY

Arizona native and Desert Vista High School product Devon Kennard joined the Cardinals during the 2020 offseason to continue his NFL career in his hometown of Phoenix. Since entering the league with the Giants as a fifth-round pick in 2014, he has been distinguished for both his on-field performance and community service.

To recognize his playing excellence and charitable efforts, Kennard was selected as Detroit's 2019 Walter Payton NFL Man of The Year. As a nominee, Kennard received a \$50,000 donation in his name to the charity of his choice and two Super Bowl tickets for a community recipient of his choice.

This past February, Kennard and his father, Derek Kennard Sr., who played five seasons (1986-90) for the Cardinals, participated in a virtual event, "The Power of Mentoring," that was hosted by Big Brothers Big Sisters of Central Arizona in honor of Black History Month.

Last December, Kennard surprised 10 students with the ICAN program with \$500 Target gift cards. ICAN is a free, family-centered youth service in the East Valley providing a full complement of programs proven effective in equipping youth to achieve person and academic success by tackling substance abuse, gang involvement and juvenile delinquency. He talked with each student individually via FaceTime to talk about their progress in and out of the classroom. During the pandemic, ICAN was open during school hours for students who did not have WiFi access at home.

In May of 2020, as part of the Cardinals Carryout campaign to support local restaurants during the COVID-19 pandemic, Kennard gave back to frontline workers by personally delivering meals to four fire departments in the Valley.

Kennard spent the majority of the 2019 offseason in Phoenix, where he volunteered at the first-annual "Hogs and Dawgs" Lineman Academy. The camp provided high school student athletes from Arizona the opportunity to receive offensive and defensive line coaching from Kennard and his father Derek.

During his time in Detroit, Kennard worked closely with the Midnight Golf Program, which helps underserved youth transition from high school to college and professional careers through mentorship and skill building. In 2019, he established the Devon Kennard Scholarship Fund to help students involved with the Midnight Golf Program advance their education.

In 2019 he was also elected as a representative of the Lions Fuel Up To Play 60 program, and as part of the campaign, Kennard participated in several youth camps to help educate kids on the importance of maintaining healthy eating habits and establishing a positive lifestyle.

Following the 2018 season, Kennard was instrumental in launching Detroit Lions Inspire Change, the team's player-driven social justice initiative. Along with his teammates, Kennard participated in Talk It Up Thursday, an event hosted by the Detroit Police Department and the Men of Courage organization that featured a panel of Lions players and male students to discuss social resiliency and how to succeed.

During the 2017 offseason, Kennard started his first #ReadingWithDK challenge to motivate kids to pick up a book throughout their summer break. He selected a book – starting with *To Kill A Mockingbird* and *The Alchemist* – and engaged children with discussion and questions on his social media accounts. All who participated in the #ReadingWithDK challenge were entered to win autographed gear from Kennard.

He also partnered with Arizona PBS for an eight-part series and nationwide campaign in which Kennard – among other notable figures – encourage people to read by discussing books that have inspired and shaped them.

While with the Giants, Kennard was an active volunteer and generous donor for New City Kids, an after-school program for low-income youth who get the chance to explore academics and music in a creative environment. Kennard helped mentor children through the challenges of urban life while developing their skills in the classroom and extracurricular talents. In 2017, he also teamed up with We Are DREAM and visited local New York schools to help kids recognize their potential and realize their dreams.

While attending USC, Kennard began his philanthropic efforts by volunteering to feed the homeless and visiting cancer patients at the children's hospital in LA. In 2012, Kennard and 12 of his USC teammates traveled to Haiti to build homes for families devastated by earthquakes.

A skilled public speaker, Kennard has also delivered keynote addresses at several events on a variety of topics including athletics, work ethic, networking, faith and education. For more information on Kennard's community work, visit www.devonkennard.com.

Each year, Madelyn's fund hosts a celebrity golf tournament in Charlotte and a Pink Bow Gala to raise money for NICU patients and their families. Lee also has worn custom-designed cleats in support of Madelyn's Fund as part of the NFL's My Cause, My Cleats campaign.



Since joining the team in 2017, Andy has also been active in the Phoenix community. He joined the Cardinals Women's Club, front office personnel and several teammates in 2019 to deliver stuffed toy dogs to children in the pediatric units throughout Phoenix Children's Hospital as part of the team's annual "Paw Express" event to help spread holiday cheer.

CARDINALS IN THE COMMUNITY

Not one to seek recognition for his work in the community, Cardinals Pro Bowl quarterback Kyler Murray has given back and supported those in need discreetly during his time in the NFL.

Last February, Murray donated 60,000 meals to the North Texas Food Bank after that region's devastating winter storm that caused widespread power outages that resulted in residents not having heat or running water.

During the 2020 season, Murray made a special connection with 12-year old Hector Nahle. Nahle, a youth quarterback from Mexico, was in the middle of being treated for cancer when the pair connected over Instagram with Murray sending a special message that included an autographed game jersey along with the promise to fly Hector and his family to Texas following his recovery.

Murray also served as an active participant during the COVID-19 pandemic of 2020. With schools closing due to the outbreak, he pledged \$25,000 to GENYOUth's COVID-19 Emergency School Nutrition Fund in April of 2020. He also participated in the NFL's Draft-a-Thon along with country music star Blake Shelton and NFL Network host Rich Eisen to raise money for the fund. His generous contributions helped combat hunger by feeding children who depend on school meals, which were able to continue for thousands of students during the pandemic.

In January of 2020, Murray participated in the Twitch Rivals Streamer Bowl along with other NFL players. He finished second in the event and was awarded \$80,000 for the charity of his choice – the Colon Cancer Coalition. Murray also joined teammates Chase Edmonds and Christian Kirk for Twitch Stream Aid 2020 to raise money for charity and support COVID-19 relief efforts in March of last year.

In 2020, Murray became the first player in NFL history to throw for 2,000+ yards and rush for 500+ yards in the first eight games of a season, and after missing most of the season finale due to injury, he fell just 29 passing yards shy of becoming the first player in history with 4,000+ passing yards and 800+ rushing yards in a season.

Murray did, however, join Cam Newton (2011-12) as the only players in NFL history with 3,500+ passing yards and 500+ rushing yards in each of a player's first two seasons in the league. The feat has never been accomplished three consecutive seasons to start a career.

Since entering the league with the Giants in the first round of the 2013 NFL Draft, offensive lineman Justin Pugh has used his platform to become a positive influence in the community and he has stayed busy in the Arizona community since coming to town in 2018.

The award is given to a player who provides year-round effort to honor, empower and connect with the nation's service members, veterans and their families. Pugh not only donated to the organization but honored them by wearing MVP themed shoes as a part of the NFL's "My Cause, My Cleats" campaign for the fourth consecutive season in 2020. His involvement with the military continued when he joined Cardinals teammates to visit Luke Air Force base as part of the NFL's Salute to Service month in November of 2018. The group from the Cardinals got an up-close look at F-35s and F-16s from the 61st Fight Squadron and visited various personnel stationed on the base.

In 2019, Pugh hosted his second annual holiday party for 100 local youth for a private, advance screening of Spies in Disguise. The group of kids came from Heart for the City AZ, a Phoenix-based nonprofit that works with underprivileged youth to provide wholistic academic, physical, mental and professional programming. In addition to the screening, Pugh provided concessions and surprised the kids with holiday gifts.

During the 2017 NFL Draft, Pugh visited Joint Base McGuire-Dix-Lakehurst in New Jersey to thank members of the military for their service, host a youth football event for their kids and announce the Giants fifth-round pick on television with his brother Michael, who was stationed at the base.

Pugh has also participated in a Pro vs. GI Joe event where players competed in video games against military veterans through the Wounded Warrior Project which works to provide services and programs for wounded service members. On the 15th anniversary of 9/11, Pugh honored first responders by joining firefighters from Engine 34 Ladder 21 for a BBQ dinner at their firehouse in Hell's Kitchen.

Beyond the causes, campaigns and charitable organizations with which Pugh is associated, he hasn't missed the opportunity to impact lives through simple kindness.

While living in Jersey City, he befriended his elderly neighbor, Bill, who had lost his wife, suffered a back injury and fallen behind on his rent. The two developed a special bond, and Pugh's financial assistance prevented Bill from being evicted from his home of more than 30 years. Despite moving to Arizona, Pugh continues to speak with Bill and his son.

Since 2015 he has hosted the annual Pugh Crew Summer Kickoff, a free football camp in his hometown of Bucks County, PA. The camp allows 250 local boys and girls the opportunity to receive instruction from Pugh, other NFL and college players and professional coaches while also developing teambuilding skills, learning how to set goals and building confidence.

During his time in New York, Pugh served as the national spokesperson for Shriners Hospitals for Children and their Game Day for LOVE campaign which supports the life-saving and life-changing care to kids in need of specialized medical care. As part of the campaign, Pugh hosted a viewing party, featuring a raffle and silent auction, in New York City when his alma mater, Syracuse, took on Clemson in 2014. In Week 17 the 2014 season, Pugh hosted three Shriners patients at the Giants home game against the Eagles. The patients and their families were treated to a VIP tour of the stadium and received pregame field passes. Pugh also supported Shriners on the gameshow "Who Wants to be a Millionaire" during their charity week in 2015 and won \$10,000 for the organization, in addition to a \$10,000 check from Pugh directly.

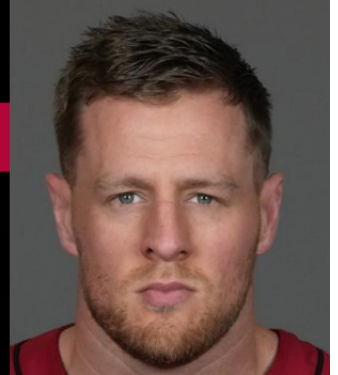

CARDINALS IN THE COMMUNITY

J.J. Watt's personal motto – "Dream Big, Work Hard" – serves as the mission that drives the All-Pro's charitable work in communities throughout the United States. Key among those efforts is supporting under-funded after-school and youth sports programs, to which Watt attributes much of his success.

In addition to his foundation's extensive work, the 2017 NFL Walter Payton NFL Man of the Year award winner is well-known for supporting worthy causes such as food banks, children's hospitals, women's shelters and, most notably, Hurricane Harvey relief.

JUSTIN J WATT FOUNDATION

While still a student-athlete at the University of Wisconsin in 2010, Watt established the Justin J Watt Foundation to provide after-school opportunities to underserved children. Using athletics as a conduit for development, students learn the value of accountability, teamwork, leadership, work ethic and perseverance in a safe and supervised environment with their peers.

The foundation has donated more than \$6.3 million to after-school athletics programs in 38 states and D.C., including eight schools in Arizona – Arizona City Elementary, ASU Prep Academy, Cactus Canyon Junior High, Canon Elementary, Cheatham Elementary, Paseo Pointe Middle School, Pensar Academy and Santa Fe Elementary.

The J.J. Watt Softball Charity Classic, the foundation's flagship event, has raised more than \$4 million in just six games. Most recently held at Houston's Minute Maid Park in 2019, the event pitted Texans offensive players against its defenders.

HURRICANE HARVEY RELIEF

While the Texans were on the road for a preseason game in 2017, Hurricane Harvey made landfall in Houston. As the storm wreaked havoc and destruction began to mount, Watt announced a fundraising campaign in a social media video that he posted from a Dallas hotel room.

He set an ambitious goal of \$200,000 and pledged to match the first \$100,000, but within 19 days, more than 200,000 individuals collectively donated \$37 million to the cause, making it the largest crowd-sourced fundraiser in history. Contributions continued, and the final tally reached \$41.6 million, which significantly benefited a large variety of relief efforts throughout the months following the storm.

In the year after Hurricane Harvey, Watt's fundraising supported:

- The cleanup, repair and rebuilding of more than **600 homes**.
- The recovery and rebuilding of more than **420 childcare centers and after-school programs**, serving more than **16,000 children**.
- The distribution of more than **26 million meals** to those impacted.
- Physical and mental health services to more than **6,500 individuals**.
- The distribution of medicine to more than **10,000 patients**.

OTHER NOTABLE COMMUNITY EFFORTS

- **Pat Tillman Foundation:** A long-time fan of Cardinals legend Pat Tillman, Watt had already begun collaborating with the Pat Tillman Foundation before signing with Arizona, and prior to the annual Pat's Run in 2021, Watt held a meet-and-greet with a lucky participant via Zoom. In May, Watt honored Tillman with the JJ IV Valor, his signature shoe from Reebok, which he began designing before he signed with the Cardinals. Reebok pledged \$10 to the Pat Tillman Foundation for each pair of shoes sold up to \$10,000, and Watt announced he would donate all his personal proceeds to the Pat Tillman Foundation.





CARDINALS IN THE COMMUNITY

- **Make-A-Wish:** Watt has become a frequent participant in the Make-A-Wish program, helping grant more than a dozen wishes throughout his career.
- **Houston Food Bank:** Watt and his wife, Kealia, donated \$350,000 to the Houston Food Bank in March of 2020 to assist relief efforts during the COVID-19 pandemic.
- **Hospital Visits:** Throughout his NFL career, Watt has been a regular visitor to children's hospitals in Texas and his home state of Wisconsin. In 2012, he delivered Christmas gifts and caroled with kids at Texas Children's Hospital, and in 2015, he returned dressed as Batman to surprise the young patients. After a 2018 shooting at Santa Fe (TX) High School, Watt met with victims at Clear Lake Regional Medical Center, and after delivering the commencement address at the University of Wisconsin in 2019, he visited children at a hospital in Madison, WI.
- **Mission of the Yahweh:** In December of 2019, the Watt couple delivered iPads, robes, slippers and dinner to Mission of Yahweh, a faith-based shelter that empowers, enriches and restores the lives of homeless women and children while providing outreach services to low-income communities.



RECOGNITION FOR WATT'S COMMUNITY EFFORTS

Walter Payton NFL Man of the Year

Watt was honored with the 2017 Walter Payton NFL Man of the Year award, the only league award that recognizes a player's off-the-field community service as well as his playing excellence.

SI Sportsperson of the Year

Watt joined Astros second baseman José Altuve as co-winners of the 2017 SI Sportsperson of the Year for uplifting the city of Houston after immense devastation caused by Hurricane Harvey. The award is given annually to the athlete or team whose performance that year most embodies the spirit of sportsmanship and achievement.

Honorary Doctorate from the Baylor College of Medicine

In February of 2018, Watt received a Doctor of Humanities in Medicine degree from the Baylor College of Medicine for his role in organizing relief efforts in the wake of Hurricane Harvey.

Big Ten Dungy-Thompson Humanitarian Award

The former Wisconsin Badger earned the 2019 Big Ten Dungy-Thompson Humanitarian Award, which recognizes Big Ten students who have achieved humanitarian success following their academic and athletic careers at a Big Ten university.

Spirit of Bull Community Award

In 2014, Watt received the Spirit of the Bull Community Award, given annually to a Houston Texans player in recognition of his work in the community.

NFLPA Byron "Whizzer" White Community MVP Finalist

Watt was recognized as a finalist for the 2018 Byron "Whizzer" White Community MVP award, given annually by the NFLPA to a player who goes above and beyond to perform community service in their team cities and hometowns.

A WATT OF ACCOMPLISHMENTS

In 10 NFL seasons, DL **J.J. Watt** has accumulated 531 tackles, 101.0 sacks, 25 forced fumbles, 16 fumble recoveries, 282 QB hits, 172 tackles for loss, 61 passes defended and two INTs during the regular season.

His list of accomplishments is long. Those accolades include being one of just three players in league history to be named AP NFL Defensive Player of the Year at least three times.
