ROTE CARDS

- QBs who led their team in rushing yards between 1970-2018: Cam Newton (Car), Russell Wilson (Sea), Josh Allen (Buf), Donovan McNabb (Phi), Randall Cunningham (Phi) and Bobby Douglass (Chi). Three QBs currently lead their team in rushing in 2019: Kyler Murray (AZ), Lamar Jackson (Bal) and Ryan Fitzpatrick (Mia).
- NFC Player of the Week selections for CB Patrick Peterson (3 Defensive; 2 Special Teams). That is tied with former QB Kurt Warner for the most POW selections in team history. Peterson was named Defensive Player of the Week for his performances vs. Cleveland in Week 15 (7 tackles, 1 INT, 3 PD).
- 15 Total point differential in the last four games between the Cardinals and Seahawks at CenturyLink Field, all of which were decided by seven points or fewer: 3 (2018), 2 (2017), 3 (2016) and 7 (2015).
- Rushing yards for RB Kenyan Drake since he was acquired by Arizona in a trade in Week 9. Drake is one of just four players in the NFL with 400+ rushing yards and at least five rushing TDs during that stretch, joining Tennessee's Derrick Henry, Carolina's Christian McCaffrey and Dallas' Ezekiel Elliott.

WITH A WIN...

- Arizona would have four wins in its last five games at CenturyLink Field. The Cardinals would have twice as many wins at CenturyLink Field (8) than any other visiting team since the venue opened in 2002.
- QB Kyler Murray (5) would establish a franchise record for wins by a rookie QB.

MILESTONES WITHIN REACH...

WR LARRY FITZGERALD

- With a reception, Fitzgerald would have at least one catch in 242 consecutive games, extending the second-longest streak in NFL history (Jerry Rice - 274). He would also have more receptions at CenturyLink Field (79) than he has at any other road stadium.
- With six receptions, Fitzgerald (84 at CenturyLink Field) would pass Reggie Wayne (83 at Jacksonville's TIAA Bank Field) for the most receptions in NFL history in a single road venue.
- With 10 receiving yards, Fitzgerald would reach 17,000 receiving yards for his career.

LB CHANDLER JONES

- With a sack, Jones would have <u>16.0</u> sacks in 2019, leaving him one shy of tying his own franchise record for sacks in a season (17.0 in 2017).
- With a sack, Jones would have 57.0 sacks in 63 games with the Cardinals. He would pass Calais Campbell (56.5 in 138 games) for second place on the franchise all-time sacks list.
- With a sack, Jones would have 10.5 sacks in nine career games against the Seahawks. All 10.5 sacks would be of Seattle QB Russell Wilson, who he has sacked more than any other QB in his career.

QB KYLER MURRAY

- With two TD passes, Murray would have multiple TD passes in eight games this season, extending his franchise rookie record. In NFL history the only QB to have more such performances during their rookie season would be the Browns Baker Mayfield (9 in 2018).
- With a rushing TD, Murray would have five rushing TDs in 2019. Among Cardinals QBs, only Jim Hart (6 in 1968) would have more in a single season.
- With 221 passing yards, Murray would become just the sixth different QB in NFL history with 3,500+ passing yards and 500+ rushing yards in a season. He would join Carolina's Cam Newton (2011) as the only rookies in NFL history to accomplish that feat.
- With 300 passing yards, Murray (5) would join Andrew Luck (6 in 2012) as the only two players in NFL history with at least five 300-yard passing performances during their rookie season.

RB KENYAN DRAKE

 With 100 yards rushing, Drake would have more 100-yard outings in seven games with the Cardinals (3) than he had in 54 games with Miami (2).

LB JORDAN HICKS

- With an INT, Hicks would become just the fifth LB in franchise history with at least four INTs in a season. He would join Karlos Dansby (4 in 2013), Ronald McKinnon (5 in 1998), E.J. Junior (5 in 1985) and Leon Sanford (5 in 1956) as the only LBs to accomplish the feat.
- With 10 tackles, Hicks would become the first NFL defender with nine games of 10+ tackles in a season since Seattle's Bobby Wagner (10) in 2016.

K ZANE GONZALEZ

- With two FGs (no misses), Gonzalez would join Neil Rackers (31 in 2005) as the only players in franchise history to make at least 20 consecutive FG attempts.
- With two FGs, Gonzalez would also become just the fifth player in franchise history with at least 30 FGs in a season.

NFL 100: SPOTLIGHT ON THE RECEIVERS

Earlier this week, the 24 finalists at wide receiver for the NFL 100 All-NFL Team were announced. The group included 22 players who have been inducted into the Pro Football Hall of Fame. Also included was Arizona WR Larry Fitzgerald - the only active player to be named a finalst.

RECORD-BREAKING SEASON AT A GLANCE

With two games remaining, below is a look at the record-breaking season rookie QB **Kyler Murray** has put together in 2019:

- Holds franchise rookie records for passing yards (3,279), TD passes (17), completions (312), attempts (482), and games with multiple TD passes (7).
- His 504 rushing yards are the most by a QB in team history.
- Only player in the NFL with 3,000+ passing yards and 500+ rushing yards in 2019.
- First QB in team history to throw for 3,000+ yards and run for 500+ yards in a season.
- Joins Cam Newton and Robert Griffin III as the only rookies in NFL history with 3,000+ passing yards and 500+ rushing yards in a season.
- One of four rookies in NFL history with at least four 300-yard passing performances.
- Between Weeks 4-10, set an NFL rookie record with 211 consecutive pass attempts without an INT.
- His four rushing TDs are the most by a rookie QB in franchise history.
- Joins Carson Palmer and Kurt Warner as the only QBs in franchise history to have a passer rating of 90+ in at least six games in a single season.

JONES AND BAKER HEADED TO PRO BOWL

On Tuesday (12/17), Cardinals S **Budda Baker** and LB **Chandler Jones** were selected as starters for the NFC squad at the 2020 Pro Bowl.

In addition, special teamer **Dennis Gardeck**, K **Zane Gonzalez**, and QB **Kyler Murray** were selected as alternates.

S Budda Baker

• Earned his second Pro Bowl selection and first at safety after being chosen as a special teamer during his rookie campaign in 2017.

Became the eighth safety in Cardinals history to be selected to the Pro Bowl and the first since Adrian Wilson in 2011.

- First player in franchise history selected to the Pro Bowl as a special teamer and as a position player.
- as a position player.

 Became the 15th player in franchise history to be selected to at least two Pro Bowls in his first three seasons in the NFL.

LB Chandler Jones

- Earned his third career Pro Bowl selection, second with the Cardinals and second as a LB. He was previously selected to the Pro Bowl as a DE with the Patriots in 2015 and as a LB with the Cardinals in 2017.
- Became the fourth LB in franchise history to earn multiple Pro Bowl selections and the first since E.J. Junior (1984-85).
