



ARIZONA CARDINALS NOTE CARDS

146 Rushing yards for the Cardinals last week at New Orleans. It marked the 25th time in the last three seasons (2023-25) AZ rushed for 120+ yards. In that span, only Baltimore (30) has more such outings.

22 Total TDs allowed by the Cardinals defense since Week 7 of last season. That is the lowest total in the NFL during that span. Arizona's 10 passing TDs allowed since Week 7 of '24 are also the lowest total in the NFL (no other team has allowed fewer than 13).

5 FGs of 50+ yards made by **K Chad Ryland** in his first 14 games with Arizona. That is tied for the sixth-most in franchise history and tied with Neil Rackers for the second-most in a player's first 14 games with the Cardinals behind only Matt Prater (6).

45 TDs for **RB James Conner** in just 58 games as a member of the Cardinals. With his four-yard TD reception last week, Conner tied former All-Pro WR Anquan Boldin for the ninth-most TDs in franchise history. With a TD this week, he would tie Mel Gray (46) for the eighth-most in team history.

MILESTONE WATCH

QB KYLER MURRAY

- With a rushing TD, Murray would tie Stump Mitchell (32) for sixth place on the franchise all-time list for career rushing TDs.
- With 3 TD passes, Murray would have 16 career outings with 3+ TD passes. That would pass Neil Lomax (15) for the most such outings in franchise history.
- With 339 or more passing yards, Murray would join Jim Hart (34,639) and Neil Lomax (22,771) as the only players in franchise history with at least 20,000 career passing yards.

RB JAMES CONNER

- With a rushing TD, Conner (38) would sit alone in second place on the franchise all-time list for career rushing TDs behind only Ottis Anderson (46).
- With 100+ rushing yards, Conner would reach 100 yards in a game for the 20th time in his career and for the 12th time with Arizona. It would also give Conner 100+ rushing yards in three of his last five games played, including two vs. the Panthers (117 yards on 15 carries @ Carolina in Week 16 last season).
- With 34 or more scrimmage yards, Conner (59 games) would reach 5,000 as a member of the Cardinals. He would join RB David Johnson (54) and WR Anquan Boldin (59) as the only players in team history to reach 5,000 scrimmage yards in 59 games or fewer.

WR MARVIN HARRISON JR.

- With 1 TD reception, Harrison would become the first player in Cardinals history to have 10+ TD catches in his first 19 career games. It would also give him a TD reception in each of his last three games.
- With 44 receiving yards, Harrison would eclipse the 1,000-receiving yard mark in his career. He would join Frank Sanders, Anquan Boldin, Larry Fitzgerald and Christian Kirk as the only players in franchise history to accomplish the feat in their first 19 career games.

DL CALAIS CAMPBELL

- With 1.0 sack, Campbell (29.5) would pass OLB Chandler Jones (29.0) for the most career sacks at State Farm Stadium.
- With 1.0 sack, Campbell (111.5) would pass former Rams All-Pro DT Aaron Donald (110.5) for 28th place on the NFL's all-time sacks list.
- With 1.5 sacks, Campbell would tie LB Chandler Jones and LB Justin Houston (both with 112.0) for 26th place on the NFL's all-time sacks list.

S BUDDA BAKER

- With 7 tackles, Baker would reach 900 tackles for his career. He would join Vikings S Harrison Smith (1,117) as the only active DBs in the NFL with 900+ career tackles.
- With 10+ tackles, Baker would have double-digit tackles in each of the first two games of a season for the first time in his career.

LB BARON BROWNING

- With 1.0 sack, Browning would have a sack in back-to-back games for just the third time in his career and second time since he was acquired by Arizona last November: 1.0 vs. NE (Wk 15); 1.0 @ Car (Wk 16).
- With 1.0 sack, Browning would also have 4.0 sacks in his last six games.

K CHAD RYLAND

- With a FG of 50+ yards, Ryland would have six such FGs in just 15 games with the Cardinals. Only four players in franchise history - Matt Prater (22), Neil Rackers (16), Greg Davis (9) and Jay Feely (8) - would have more FGs of 50+ yards in their career.

DL DALVIN TOMLINSON

- With 1.0 sack, Tomlinson would reach 20.0 sacks for his career.

CARDINALS CLIMB INITIATIVE LAUNCHED

On Thursday, the **Arizona Cardinals Foundation** announced the launch of the first-ever **Cardinals Climb**, a community fundraising event dedicated to supporting the special needs community.

On Saturday, February 21, 2026, State Farm Stadium will transform into an immersive climbing and hiking experience, bringing together fans, families, corporate teams, and community groups to "climb" for a cause. The season-long fundraiser will raise critical funds for organizations leading innovative and transformative work to assist individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities (IDDs).



The Cardinals Climb will re-imagine the stadium as a trail-inspired adventure for participants of all ages and abilities. A variety of routes, ranging from accessible paths to more challenging climbs, will allow participants to experience the stadium in a completely new way. All trails will finish at the 50-yard line of State Farm Stadium and there will be a special post-climb celebration with activities for all ages, including a concert on the Great Lawn.

Individuals will have a number of ways to get involved:

- They can become Climb Leaders who will create teams, recruit others, and fundraise together.
- People may also join an existing team to support a friend, colleague, or local organization.
- For those unable to attend in person, the event offers an off-site participation option, allowing climbers from anywhere in the world to join the effort.
- Independent donations may also be made in support of the Climb without direct participation.

The Cardinals Climb registration is now open at www.cardinalsclimb.com. Once registered, participants will have access to a personalized fundraising portal, providing an easy way to share their story and raise support.

One hundred percent of the Climb's proceeds will support special needs organizations, including the Foundation's four Cornerstone Beneficiaries: **Barrow Neurological Foundation**, **SARCC** (Southwest Autism Research & Resource Center), **Special Olympics Arizona**, and **Treasure House**. Each of those four will receive a three-year funding commitment to expand services and promote inclusion across Arizona.

BIRDS' EYE VIEW

MURRAY ON THE VERGE OF MAKING HISTORY



Through 83 career games, **QB KYLER MURRAY** has recorded 19,661 passing yards and 3,058 rushing yards. He needs 339 passing yards to join Bills QB Josh Allen (84 games) as the only other player in NFL history to tally at least 20,000 passing yards and 3,000 rushing yards in 85 career games or fewer.

Murray would become the 12th quarterback in NFL history to accomplish the feat, a group that includes Hall of Famers John Elway and Steve Young.

SUB ZERO SETTING RECORDS

- After posting a tackle and three passes defended in the season opener in New Orleans last week, **CB Will Johnson** became the first Cardinals rookie since 2000 to have at least three passes defended in their NFL debut. Johnson earned a 90.2 overall defensive grade from PFF.com, the fourth-best among all NFL DBs and the highest among all rookie defenders in Week 1.
- With three passes defended this week, Johnson would pass Jaylon Johnson (5 w/Chicago, 2020) for the second-most by a player in their first two career games and join Marcus Peters (7 w/ Kansas City, 2015) as the only players to record consecutive games with 3+ passes defended to start their NFL careers dating back to 2000 when passes defended began being tracked.
