**Kansas City Chiefs 44, Arizona Cardinals 21**

The Cardinals opened the 2022 regular season against the Kansas City Chiefs at State Farm Stadium. The contest reunited AZ head coach Kliff Kingsbury with KC quarterback Patrick Mahomes, whom he recruited to Texas Tech and coached for three seasons there. On this particular afternoon, it was the pupil who led his team to victory with an impressive passing effort. The 2018 league MVP threw for 360 yards and 5 touchdowns with no INTs in steering the Chiefs to a 44-21 win. Kansas City jumped out early with TDs on their first three drives and never looked back. Playing without several regular starters – including DE JJ Watt, WR DeAndre Hopkins, G Justin Pugh – the Cards battled and late in the first half had opportunities to make it a one score game but could not take advantage of them. The victory gave the Chiefs their eight consecutive season with a week 1 win while the Cardinals fell in the regular season opener for the first time in four seasons under Kingsbury and QB Tyler Linderbaum.

Kansas City received the opening kickoff and proceeded to move 75 yards in 11 plays as Mahomes capped the drive with a 9-yard TD pass to TE Travis Kelce. The next Chiefs drive was equally effective, covering 86 yards in 7 plays. It ended on a Mahomes shovel pass to RB Clyde Edwards-Helaire for a 3-yard score that made it 14-0 late in the opening quarter. The Cards desperately needed a scoring drive and Murray delivered. He completed 4 of 5 pass attempts on the ensuing series, the biggest of which was a 24-yarder to WR Greg Dortch that moved it to the KC35. Shortly thereafter, Tyler Linderbaum scampers 21 yards up the middle to the 2, setting up James Conner's TD run that cut the lead in half at 14-7 two minutes into the second quarter. The next drive saw the Chiefs move 71 yards in 10 plays before facing a 4th-n-2 at the 4; KC went for it and Edwards-Helaire's 4-yard completion from Mahomes made it 20-7 after the PAT failed. With 1:05 to go in the half, the Chiefs continued to lead by 13 and took over at their own 20. On the first play from scrimmage, Mahomes connected with WR Juju Smith-Schuster before LB Dennis Gardeck forced a fumble that CB Byron Murphy recovered at the KC43 with :58 left. AZ soon faced a 4th-n-2 at the 34 but turned it over on downs when Murray's pass attempt was incomplete. The Chiefs quickly moved into position for a 54-yard FG try from Harrison Butker, who returned to action after exiting the game via cart in the first quarter. The kick was good and Kansas City took a 23-7 lead into the halftime locker room.

Kansas City's opening possession of the second half also resulted in a TD, this one a 1-yard pass from Mahomes to TE Jody Fortson. The Chiefs increased their lead to 37-7 late in the third on Mahomes' fifth TD pass of the day, this one a 2-yarder to WR Mecole Hardman. Early in the fourth, Murray's 2-yard TD pass to new Cardinals WR – and Murray's former Oklahoma teammate – Marquise Brown was followed by a successful two-point toss to TE Zach Ertz that made it 37-15. After a TD run by Chiefs RB Isiah Pacheco capped the next KC possession, Ertz's 6-yard TD catch from Murray provided the game's final score with 5:11 remaining.

## WEEK 2

### Arizona Cardinals 29, Las Vegas Raiders 23 (OT)

61,707 Allegiant Stadium Sep 18, 2022

The Cardinals made their first-ever appearance at Allegiant Field for a week 2 showdown with the Raiders and it was one for the ages. Vegas jumped out to a 20-0 halftime lead and led 23-7 after 3 quarters. But the gritty Cardinals battled back. And QB Kyle Murray engineered one of the greatest and most improbable comebacks in franchise history. Arizona would score the game's final 22 points, send the contest to overtime with a TD and 2-point conversion as regulation expired, and win it in the extra period with the longest OT return of a fumble in NFL history. It was the franchise's biggest comeback since 1999 and 5th largest ever; it was also the greatest comeback ever against the Raiders.

While the game ended in thrilling fashion for Arizona, its beginning was inauspicious. The Raiders took the opening kickoff, moved 75 yards in 15 plays and Derek Carr's 1-yard TD pass to WR Davante Adams made it 7-0. The next Vegas drive reached the AZ12 in 8 plays before Daniel Carlson's 32-yard FG made it 10-0. The Raiders increased it to 17-0 on their next possession when Carr capped a 7-play, 59-yard drive with his 3-yard scoring pass to TE Darren Waller. With just over 2 minutes to go in the first half, the Cards faced a 3rd-n-2 at the LV42 when Murray's pass attempt to Hollywood Brown was intercepted by CB Amik Robertson. The return set Vegas up at its own 27 with 1:51 to go. That was enough time to move into position for a 55-yard Carlson FG as the half expired that made it 20-0 at intermission. In their history, the Cardinals were 0-88-1 in games they trailed by 20+ points at halftime.

The AZ comeback began on its 2nd offensive series of the 3rd quarter. Murray completed 5 of 7 passes for 66 yards and ended the 79-yard drive with a scoring pass to WR Greg Dortch, a 5-yarder that was his first NFL TD catch. A 47-yard pass interference penalty on the ensuing Vegas possession led to a 25-yard Carlson FG that made it 23-7 late in the 3rd quarter. Two minutes into the 4th, the Cards trailed by 16 but were at the LV11 when they went for it on 4th-n-1. It ended there, though, as Murray's pass was just beyond the reach of TE Zach Ertz. However, 3 straight incompletions led to a punt and more importantly took just 9 seconds off the clock. An 18-yard Dortch punt return set AZ up at its own 46 with 12:07 to play. Murray marched the Cards to the LV25 where they faced a 4th-n-4 midway thru the 4th and down 16. They went for it and converted when Brown made a spectacular 1-handed grab at the 1. A play later, RB Darrel Williams punched it in and the Cards went for 2. What happened on that try was unforgettable and vintage Murray; the QB kept the pass play alive for 20 seconds, snaking around in the backfield for almost 85 total yards before finally outracing the defense to a successful conversion. After another Vegas punt, the Cards took over at their own 27, down 8 with 4:43 to play. Needing to cover 73 yards and another 2-point conversion to force OT, AZ soon faced a 4th-n-1 at the LV43. A Murray scramble picked it up. With :30 left it was 4th-n-4 at the 6 when a defensive holding foul kept the drive going. It set up a 1st-n-goal at the 3 but after 3 incompletions it was 4th-n-goal from there with time for one more shot. Murray again delivered, scrambling to his left and into the end zone to cap the incredible 18-play drive. AZ still needed a 2-point conversion to send the game to OT and a delay penalty pushed the try back to the 7. It didn't matter. Murray fired a dart to WR AJ Green in the back of the end zone and the game was tied.

AZ won the OT coin toss and advanced to the LV37. They went for it on 4th-n-1 from there but Brown could not hold onto a Murray pass down the left side and the Raiders took over. On the edge of FG range, they faced 2nd-n-10 at the AZ39 when Carr hit WR Hunter Renfrow with a short pass but LB Isaiah Simmons dislodged the ball with a devastating hit. CB Byron Murphy scooped the loose ball and returned it 59 yards down the sideline to clinch the amazing comeback victory.

**Los Angeles Rams 20, Arizona Cardinals 12**

In a match-up of 1-1 teams, the defending Super Bowl champion Rams came to State Farm Stadium and jumped out to an early 13-0 lead, thanks to a pair of field goals and a TD. The Cardinals would respond with the game's next three scores. They were lengthy drives of 19, 17 and 16 plays that produced FGs rather than TDs but it still got AZ to within 4 points late in the third quarter. However, LA's second TD of the day made it 20-9 and the Cards would only be able to close to within 8 before running out of time. QB Kyle Murray set career highs in completions (37) and attempts (58) and his favorite target was Marquise Brown. The WR racked up 140 yards on a career-best 14 receptions, a total that tied the 2nd most in franchise history.

The Rams forced a punt on the Cardinals' game opening drive and LA's Michael Hoecht got a hand on it to set the visitors up at the AZ35. Arizona's defense rose to the challenge and limited the Rams to a 22-yard Matt Gay FG that made it 3-0. Following a 3-n-out from the AZ offense, the Rams took over their own 42. Six plays later they had it at the AZ20 when WR Cooper Kupp went in motion, took a handoff from QB Matthew Stafford and raced around the left end for 20 yards and a TD that made it 10-0. Gay's 40-yard FG capped LA's next drive and put the Rams up 13-0 early in the 2nd quarter. With 11:21 left in the half, AZ took over at its own 30 and down 13-0. The Cards would move 65 yards in 19 plays, converting a pair of 4th downs on a much-needed drive. It would reach the 5 but no further and Matt Prater's 23-yard FG made it 13-3 with 1:51 before halftime. After forcing another 3-n-out by the LA offense, the Cards took over at their own 28 with :48 left in the first half. Murray moved them 47 yards, the biggest chunk of which came on a 30-yard completion to WR Greg Dortch on the last play before Prater's 45-yard FG made it 13-6 at intermission.

Arizona opened the 2nd half by forcing a 3-n-out that included a JJ Watt sack of Stafford. The Cards offense then took over at its own 11 and soon faced a 4th-n-1 at the 20; they went for it and RB James Conner converted. The drive would reach the LA31 and Prater's 3rd straight FG - this one from 49 - made it a 4-point game with 5:10 to go in the 3rd quarter. On the ensuing LA possession, the Rams soon faced a 3rd-n-11 from their own 24 when Stafford escaped a sack from LB Zaven Collins and hit Kupp for 11 and the first down. A screen to TE Tyler Higbee picked up 26 yards and Cam Akers' 14-yard TD run ended the drive to put LA up 20-9 with 16 minutes to play. With 11:30 remaining, the Cards had reached the LA26 where they went for it on 4th-n-4 but Murray's pass attempt to Brown was batted away. Up 11 with 7 minutes to go, the Rams advanced to AZ1 and poised to put the game away; however, S Budda Baker forced an Akers fumble that Jalen Thompson recovered to keep it a 2-possession game. Murray would move AZ to the LA13 in 16 plays - the longest of which was 14 yards - and Prater's 31-yard FG with 1:07 pulled the Cards to within 8. They would need an onside kick recovery to keep their hopes alive but the Rams dashed them by successfully corraling the kick.

Arizona Cardinals 26, Carolina Panthers 16

The Cardinals traveled to Carolina for a week 4 match-up of teams desperately trying to even their record at 2-2. Arizona had not won a regular season game there since 2002 and the Panthers had won 6 straight in the series. Through two quarters, it looked like they were on their way to making it 7 and took a 10-3 lead into halftime. But the Cards ran off 23 points in the second half as Kyle Murray threw two TDs and ran for another. The AZ defense, meanwhile, was exceptional throughout; it created three takeaways and generally harassed Panthers QB Baker Mayfield all afternoon while limiting RB Christian McCaffrey to 27 rushing yards on 8 attempts. Leading that effort was DE Zach Allen who had a career-day; he finished with 6 tackles, a sack, three knockdowns, two QB hits and a tackle for loss. All of it added up to a 26-16 win that continued Arizona's success on the road with 10 wins in its last 11 opportunities.

On their first possession of the game, the Panthers were stopped on a 3rd-n-1 Mayfield QB sneak and went for it on 4th-n-inches from their own 39; led by LB Zaven Collins, the Cards D stopped McCaffrey and the offense took over. The Cards reached the Carolina 10 where they faced a 4th-n-1 themselves but WR Rondale Moore was tackled behind the line of scrimmage and the threat was extinguished. The game remained scoreless into the 2nd quarter before the Panthers defense created its first points. On 3rd-n-6 from the AZ31, LB Frankie Luvu intercepted a Murray pass intended for Hollywood Brown and returned it 33 yards for a TD. The next series saw the Cards go for it again on 4th-n-1 - this time from their own 42 - but turned it over on downs when the snap went over Murray's head. That gave it back to the Panthers at the AZ42 with 9:02 to go before halftime but they would soon return it. A fumbled exchange between Mayfield and WR Rashard Higgins was recovered by Arizona LB Ben Niemann at the AZ35. The Cards offense then went 50 yards in 8 plays and pull to within 7-3 on Matt Prater's 33-yard FG with 3:34 left in the 2nd quarter. S Jalen Thompson's INT gave the offense the ball back at the AZ18 with 1:05 to go in the half. After a 3-n-out, Carolina took over at its own 35 with :21 left and advanced to the AZ36 on 4 completions before Eddy Pineiro's 54-yard FG as the half expired made it 10-3.

Carolina got the ball to start the 2nd half but on its 3rd play from scrimmage, Allen's 9-yard sack of Mayfield forced a punt. The Cards would then tie the game with a 9-play, 89-yard TD drive. Key plays were a 22-yard reception by TE Zach Ertz and a 37-yard defensive pass interference penalty drawn by WR Marquise Brown. Ertz ended it with a TD pass from Murray on 3rd-n-goal from the 2. After again forcing a Panther punt, the Cards embarked on another long drive, this one consuming 9:26 and extending into the 4th quarter. Matt Prater capped it with his 39-yard FG that gave AZ its first lead at 13-10. On the next play from scrimmage, DE J.J. Watt deflected a Mayfield pass into the air where LB Dennis Gardeck caught it and returned his first career INT 24 yards to the Carolina 5. A play later, Murray ran it in around the right side for a 4-yard TD that made it 20-10 with 10:26 left in the game. Carolina's ensuing series ended when Allen knocked down another Mayfield pass, this time on 4th-n-1 at the CAR 31. Two plays later on 3rd-n-3 from the 23, Murray hit Brown with an over-the-shoulder throw and the WR artfully tapped his toes just inside the end zone. The connection put AZ up 26-10 with 7:37 to play and the game's only other score came on a Mayfield-to-McCaffrey TD pass of 13 yards.

### Philadelphia Eagles 20, Arizona Cardinals 17

In week 5, the NFL's only remaining undefeated team came to State Farm Stadium when the 2-2 Cardinals hosted the 4-0 Philadelphia Eagles. The visitors took an early 14-0 but the Cards battled back to tie it at 17 in the 4th. After Philly went up 3 on a go-ahead FG with 1:45 to play, Arizona had a chance to send the game into OT but a 43-yard FG try in the closing seconds was wide right. The Cardinals defense was exceptional holding Philadelphia to a season-low 20 points and just 6 in the second half. Marquise Brown led the Cards with 78 receiving yards on 8 catches with a TD.

The Eagles drew first blood with a TD on their opening offensive possession. Completions of 14 & 10 yards to TE Dallas Goedert were followed by two to WR AJ Brown (15 & 11) that kept the 11-play, 64-yard drive going. QB Jalen Hurts capped it with his 1-yard QB keeper and Philly led 7-0. On the next play from scrimmage, Tyler Murray's pass down the deep middle intended for Brown was intercepted by S CJ Gardner-Johnson, setting the Eagles up at their own 35. However, they would not capitalize as Arizona's defense sent them 3-n-out. Late in the opening quarter, Philly faced a 3rd-n-12 at its own 11 but Hurts found DeVonta Smith for 22 to the 33. A 20-yard connection between those 2 followed and the 16-play, 87-yard drive ultimately concluded with another 1-yard TD sneak. AZ seemed to seize some momentum on the opening play of the next Philly drive when S Jalen Thompson picked a Hurts pass across the middle but replay overturned it. The Cards still sent the Eagles 3-n-out and following the punt took over at their own 43 for their best field position of the day. A 13-yard James Conner run moved it to the 44 and was followed by a 14-yard Brown catch to the PHI32. On 3rd-n-2 from the 25, Murray found Brown in the middle of the field and the speedy WR slipped a tackle before racing into the end zone. AZ forced another Eagles punt and took over at its own 7 with 3:22 to go in the half. Stopped on 3rd down at their own 28, the Cards lined up to punt but ran a fake instead; the snap went to the up-back, RB Darrell Williams, who ran for 7 and picked up the first down. The very lengthy drive (16 plays, 91 yards) took 9:38 off the clock and Matt Amendola's 20-yard FG as the half expired trimmed Philly's lead to 14-10. Amendola was signed during the week as a replacement for the team's regular kicker, Matt Prater (hip).

Philly increased its lead to 17-10 on the opening drive of the 3rd quarter when Cameron Dicker's 42-yard FG capped a 10-play, 51-yard drive. After the teams traded punts, AZ took over at its own 10 in the final minute of the 3rd quarter. Injuries to starting RB James Conner as well as back-ups Darrell Williams and Jonathan Ward, left Eno Benjamin as the Cardinals only available RB. Thanks largely to Murray completing all 6 of his pass attempts on the drive (for 58 yards), AZ reached the PHI11 in 11 plays; from there Benjamin ran it in to tie the game with 9:43 to go in the game. Hurts then led the Eagles into AZ territory and with 4:28 left, they faced 3rd-n-12 at the Cards 36; they picked it up thanks to a 16-yard Hurts-to-Goedert completion. The drive would reach the AZ5 and Dicker's 23-yard FG put Philly up 20-17. After the kickoff, the Cards took over at their own 25 with 1:45 to go and no timeouts. A 15-yard Murray run and 4 completions covered 31 yards, taking the Cards to the PHI34 with :36 left. A Murray burst up the middle appeared to gain 10+ yards on 2nd-n-10 and the Cards stopped the clock with a spike with :22 left. However, officials spotted it as just a 9-yard gain and after the spike it was 4th-n-1 at the 25. AZ sent out the FG unit to tie it but Amendola's 43-yard attempt sailed right.

On a warm, sunny week 6 afternoon in Seattle, the Cardinals faced the Seahawks in a match-up of 2-3 teams that were playing for a share of the division lead. Each team would produce just one touchdown but Seattle complemented theirs with 4 Jason Myers FGs while the Cardinals turned it over on downs 3 times when going for it on 4th-n-short situations inside the SEA 30. After losing 3 RBs to injury the week before, the Cardinals offense started the game without C Rodney Hudson and soon lost G Justin Pugh to injury. Arizona's defense was again exceptional, limiting Seattle to 19 points and just one touchdown. But that one TD and the 4 FGs were enough for Seattle to secure a 19-9 win on this day to secure the win.

Arizona opened the game by taking the opening kickoff and marching deep into Seattle territory thanks to a pair of big gains on 3rd down. The first came when Tyler Murray converted a 3rd-n-4 from the AZ25 with his 42-yard run to the SEA33. Then on 3rd-6 from the SEA26, a 23-yard catch-and-run by WR Rondale Moore took it to the 3. That set-up Matt Amendola's 23-yard FG that gave Arizona a 3-0 lead and its first opening quarter points of the season. Seattle responded with a FG drive of its own and Jason Myers' 39-yard kick tied the game with 6:41 left in the first quarter; 47 of the drive's 54 yards came on consecutive Kenneth Walker runs of 17 and 34 yards. On the first play of the 2nd quarter, the Cards went for it on 4th-n-4 from the SEA20 but turned it over on downs when Murray's pass was incomplete. Midway thru the 2nd quarter, Seattle marched to the AZ7 and faced a 3rd-n-2. DT Rashard Lawrence tackled Walker in the backfield for a 2-yard loss and Myers' 27-yard FG put the Seahawks up 6-3. With 0:55 left in the first half, Seattle took over at its own 32 with one timeout. A 22-yard Marquise Goodwin reception on the drive's first play was followed by Smith's 24-yard scramble to the AZ22. The Seahawks would reach the 15 but no further and Myers' 3rd FG of the game – this one a 34-yarder – made it 9-3 at intermission.

After forcing a Seattle 3-n-out to open the 3rd quarter, Arizona again advanced deep into Seahawks territory. The biggest plays were a 14-yard Moore reception and a 15-yard Murray run. The Cards faced 4th-n-2 at the 27 and again went for it but under pressure, Murray was forced into an incompleton. Seattle took over from there and received the benefit of a roughing the passer call as well as a defensive holding flag that wiped out a 3rd down stop. Myers' 4th FG of the day (32 yards) would end the drive and put the Seahawks up 12-3 with 4:11 left in the 3rd quarter. On the first play of the next drive, Murray hit Zach Ertz for a 21-yard gain to the SEA43. On 3rd-n-6 from the SEA39, Murray scrambled for the first down but fumbled at the end of the run and Seattle recovered at its own 19. AZ's defense sent the Seahawks 3-n-out, including a sack by rookie LB Myjai Sanders that backed it up to the 10 and forced a Seattle punt from its own end zone. On a frenetic play, LB Ezekiel Turner hit punter Michael Dickson forcing a fumble that S Chris Banjo recovered for a TD. After the PAT kick failed, the Cards trailed 12-9 in the final minute of the 3rd quarter. The Seahawks responded by moving 75 yards in 7 plays and capped it with their first and only TD of the day, an 11-yard Walker run around the left end. Trailing by 10 early in the 4th, the Cards would again advance deep into Seattle territory and again went for it on a 4th-n-short; this time it was 4th-n-2 at the 23 and SEA ended the threat with a sack. The AZ defense would force 3-n-outs on the next two Seattle possessions but the offense could not take advantage and the game ended in a 19-9 Seahawks win.

**New Orleans Saints 34, Arizona Cardinals 42**

In a Thursday night match-up vs. New Orleans, the Cardinals improved to 3-4 on the season with a 42-34 victory. They trailed 14-6 with 2:30 to play in the 2nd quarter but exploded for 22 points before halftime in a frenetic, game-changing sequence. Two of the three scores came 62 seconds apart on INT return TDs off Andy Dalton, first by CB Marco Wilson and then by LB Isaiah Simmons. Overall the Cards enjoyed a 3-0 advantage in turnovers. The team was also bolstered tremendously by the return of WR DeAndre Hopkins who had 10 receptions for 103 yards in his first action after missing the first 6 games due to suspension. RB Eno Benjamin had the best game of his career, rushing 12 times for 92 yards with a TD as well as a 2-point conversion. QB Kyle Murray was 20-10 passing for 204 yards and ran for 30 yards on 7 carries while playing turnover-free football.

The high-scoring game's point production began early. On the 4th play from scrimmage, Dalton connected down the deep middle with WR Rashid Shaheed for a 53-yard TD. On the ensuing AZ drive, a 31-yard completion to WR Rondale Moore moved it to the N037. That set-up a 50-yard FG by Rodrigo Blankenship in his first attempt while filling in for the injured Matt Prater. Leading 7-3, the Saints advanced to the AZ10 on their next drive but on 3rd-n-8 from there, Dalton's pass was picked off in the end zone by CB Antonio Hamilton. A 17-yard Murray run was followed by a 45-yarder from Benjamin, setting up Blankenship's 28-yard FG that made it 7-6 early in the 2nd quarter. The Saints responded with a drive that ended on a 3-yard Dalton TD pass to Taysom Hill; it was set-up on a 64-yard catch-n-run from WR Kevin White. Thanks to 6-for-6 passing by Murray, the Cards would move deep into Saints territory on their next drive and went for it on 4th-n-1 at the 4. Murray ran for 2 to the 2 and a play later, rookie RB Keontay Ingram punched it in; that score and Benjamin's run on the 2-point try tied the game at 14 with 2:28 left in the half. On the 2nd play of the ensuing series, Dalton's pass across the middle deflected off the hands WR Marquez Callaway and into the arms of Wilson who raced 38 yards before a leaping dive into the end zone. Now trailing 20-14, the Saints faced a 3rd-n-10 at their own 47. Dalton was pressured by rookie LB Cameron Thomas and his pass down the middle of the field was snared with one hand by Simmons. He returned it 56 yards down the right sideline to complete the pick 6 and the Cards led 28-14 at intermission.

The Saints cut the lead to 28-17 with Will Lutz's FG (25) on their opening possession of the 2nd half. Later in the quarter, the Cards moved 85 yards in 12 plays and took 6:31 off the clock; Murray was 7-8 for 85 yards on the drive and ended it with his 5-yard TD pass to WR Greg Dortch. After Juwan Johnson's 17-yard TD catch from Dalton made it 35-24 with 11:14 to go, the Cards produced another TD drive. The key play was a 15-yard run from Benjamin on 3rd-n-8 from the N020 and set-up his own 5-yard TD run that made it 42-24 with 6:22 remaining. The Saints would add a late TD and FG but AZ recovered two on-side attempts to seal the win.

Arizona Cardinals 26, Minnesota Vikings 34

The 3-4 Cardinals traveled to the Twin Cities to face a 5-1 Vikings team that had won 4 straight and sat comfortably atop the NFC North. Despite at least five key players missing the game with injuries and spotting the hosts an early lead, Arizona came back to take the lead in the second half. However, three turnovers proved costly and the Vikings would emerge with a 34-26 win. WR DeAndre Hopkins was again outstanding, with 12 catches for 159 yards and a remarkable 1-handed TD catch. QB Kyler Murray threw for 326 yards and 3 TDs while WR Rondale Moore gained 92 yards on his 7 receptions that included a 38-yard TD catch. Minnesota was led by RB Dalvin Cook's 111 rushing yards and QB Kirk Cousins threw for a pair of TDs and ran for one.

The Vikings opened the scoring on the game's first drive, marching to the AZ17. On 3rd-n-4 from here, Cousins eluded the rush and scrambled 17 yards for a TD that put the Vikings up 7-0. The Cards quickly made it 7-3 on the next series when Matt Prater's 44-yard FG capped an 8-play, 49-yard drive. The ensuing possession saw Minnesota advance to the AZ38 where they faced a 4rd-n-2; the Vikes went for it but turned it over on downs with an incompleting. They did, however, go up 14-3 the next time they got the ball on an 83-yard drive that Cousins ended with his 1-yard TD pass to TE Johnny Mundt. Down 11 with 3:39 to go in the half, the Cards took over at their own 28 and in 9 plays moved to the MIN6. On 3rd-n-2 from there, Murray fired to Hopkins in the end zone and the all-pro WR snared it with just his left hand to make it 14-10 with :47 left in the half. Minnesota would advance to the AZ38 where Greg Joseph attempted a 56-yard FG as time expired but it was blocked by Cards DT Leki Fotu.

On its second series of the 3rd quarter, AZ's offense took over at its own 48 following a Vikings 3-n-out. A 33-yard Hopkins completion from Murray moved it to the 8 and from there a Zach Ertz TD catch-n-run would put the Cards up 17-14 with 9:01 left in the third quarter. The Vikings responded with an 8-play, 75-yard TD drive and went ahead 21-17 following Alexander Mattison's 7-yard scoring run. On the next play from scrimmage, Murray's pass down the deep middle was INT'd by S Harrison Smith, setting MIN up at the AZ31. Four plays later, Cook's 4-yard TD run made it 28-17 with 4:07 to go in the third. Murray then completed 4 of 4 passes on the next drive for 70 yards; the biggest play was the final one, a 38-yard catch-n-run by Moore pulled the Cards to within 5 at 28-23 after the 2-point try failed. Three plays later, the Vikings faced a 3rd-n-5 from their own 30 when LB Isaiah Simmons stripped Cousins and recovered the fumble himself. That led to a 34-yard Prater FG early in the 4th that pulled AZ to within 2. The Cards D again forced a Vikings punt on the ensuing possession but returner Greg Dortch muffed it and MIN recovered at the AZ25. On 3rd-n-2 from the AZ5, Cousins hit WR KJ Osborn with a TD pass that made it 34-26 with 8:36 left after the PAT kick failed. Down 8, the Cards would possess the ball three more times. On the first, they reached the MIN44 but Murray's pass attempt to Ertz was INT'd by S Camryn Bynum. The next also reached the MIN44 before turning it over on downs. And the final one reached the MIN37 in the final minute but a pair of sacks ended the comeback hopes.

The NFC West-leading Seahawks (5-3) came to Arizona for a showdown with the Cardinals (3-5), who were playing the first of 3 straight division games. It was a back-and-forth contest but after surrendering a pick-6 that put AZ up by 4 in the 3rd quarter, the Seahawks scored TDs on each of their final 3 possessions. That finish allowed them to leave town with a 31-21 victory, their 4th straight victory on the season.

Seattle got on the board on the game's first series when Jason Myers' 49-yard FG capped an 8-play, 34-yard drive. The Cardinals answered with their first 1st quarter TD of the season; Tyler Murray ran for 21 on 3rd-n-5 and completed 4 of 4 passes, the last of which was a 22-yard TD completion to WR DeAndre Hopkins down the right sideline. The teams exchanged 3-n-outs before Seattle re-claimed the lead at 10-7 when DK Metcalf's 4-yard TD catch from Geno Smith ended a 12-play, 79-yard possession. The next time the Seahawks got the ball, they advanced to the AZ36 where they went for it on 4th-n-2; there DT Zach Allen snuffed out a Seattle shovel pass and snuffed out the play for a 4-yard loss. Down 3 late in the half, the Cards were threatening at the SEA40 and they went for it on 4th-n-4. Murray scrambled up the middle for 9 but the Seahawks forced the ball out at the end of the run and they recovered at the SEA23. The takeaway allowed Seattle to head to the halftime locker room with a 10-7 lead.

On their 2nd drive of the 3rd quarter, Seattle took over at its own 40. On the first play of that drive, Smith tried to loop a pass into the flat over AZ's Zaven Collins. However, the 2nd year LB stabbed it from the air and returned his first NFL interception 30 yards for a score that put the Cards up 14-10 with 9:18 left in the 3rd. Seattle responded with a 13-play, 75-yard drive and went back ahead when Smith's 3rd-n-6 pass from the 9 found WR Tyler Lockett in the end zone. After forcing an AZ punt, the Seahawks produced another 13-play drive, this one covering 81 yards and ending on Kenneth Walker's 1-yard TD run that made it 24-14 midway through the 4th. The Cards needed a scoring drive and they got it, moving 75 yards in 14 plays. Murray's 6-yard TD pass to TE Zach Ertz made it a 3-point game with 3:32 left. After the kickoff, Seattle took over at its own 15 up 3 with 3:30 to play and AZ holding 3 timeouts. On the first play, though, Smith rolled to his right and found TE Noah Fant with a short pass that he took 51 yards to the AZ31. Four plays later, Walker's 5-yard touchdown run made it 31-21 and effectively put the game out of reach.

## WEEK 10

Arizona Cardinals 27, Los Angeles Rams 17  
71,752 ■ SoFi Stadium ■ Nov 13, 2022

In a week 10 divisional match-up of banged-up squads in LA, the 3-6 Cardinals took on the 3-5 Rams. Both teams were without their starting QBs – Tyler Murray (hamstring) and Matthew Stafford (concussion) – and Arizona was also without several key other contributors like CB Byron Murphy and K Matt Prater. The absence of LT DJ Humphries meant the Cards also fielded an offensive line with just one starter remaining from its original unit. Back-up Colt McCoy filled in more than capably at QB, completing 26 of 37 passes for 238 yards with a TD and no INTs. His top two receivers were DeAndre Hopkins (10-98) and Rondale Moore (9-94) while RB James Conner ran for 2 TDs, amassing for 86 total yards (21-69 rushing). S Budda Baker was expected to miss the game with an ankle injury suffered the week before but played and contributed to a stellar overall defensive effort, clinching the game with a key 4th quarter INT. Arizona also neutralized two Rams who rank among the NFL's best players: DT Aaron Donald recorded to just one QB hit and no sacks while WR Cooper Kupp was limited to minus-1 yard on 3 catches before exiting in the 4th quarter (ankle).

Each offense produced 36-yard FGs on their opening possessions after identical 14-play, 57-yard drives. First it was LA's Matt Gay on the Rams' initial series that gave them a 3-0 lead. But Arizona responded when it got the ball, passing on the drive's first 11 plays. The Cards converted a 4th-n-2 at the LA37 on an AJ Green completion from McCoy. They also converted on a pair of key 3rd downs, the second of which was a 12-yard completion to TE Zach Ertz on 3rd-n-4 at the LA 37; unfortunately Ertz exited the game with a knee injury suffered on the play. The pick-up did extend the drive that culminated with a game-tying FG from kicker Tristan Vizcaino, who was signed the day before to fill in for the ill Prater.

After that game-opening FG, the AZ defense forced three consecutive 3-n-outs and the offense took over at its own 36 with 8:27 left in the 2nd quarter. McCoy completed 4 straight passes to Hopkins covering 38 yards and the Cards reached the LA6 where they faced a 4th-n-1. They went for it and McCoy picked it up with a 2-yard run to the 4. One play later, RB James Conner ran straight up the middle and AZ led 10-3 with 1:56 left before halftime. About 20 seconds later on 2nd-n-10 at the LA44, LB Myjai Sanders got to QB John Wolford, forcing a loose ball that DE JJ Watt scooped and was taking to the end zone but referee Clete Blakeman blew it dead as an incompletion rather than a sack/fumble. Replay review was able to correct the mistake by giving AZ possession at the 30 but the officiating error denied Watt's TD. However, a 5-yard Conner run sandwiched between Moore catches of 13 and 6 yards soon made it 1st-n-goal at the 6 with :39 left. Two plays later, WR AJ Green made a toe-tapping catch of a McCoy pass in the back corner of the end zone to put AZ up 17-3 going into intermission.

With 4:24 left in the 3rd quarter, Rams RB Darrell Henderson's 4-yard TD run cut Arizona's lead 17-10 and it remained that way into the 4th. With 8:45 left, AZ went for it on 4th-n-3 at the LA41 in one of the game's pivotal plays. McCoy lofted it deep down the left sideline where Moore made an amazing grab that covered 26 yards to the LA15. Two plays later, Conner ran it from 9 yards around the left end and the Cards led 24-10 with 7:41 remaining. A couple minutes later, Wolford's pass down the deep middle was deflected by LB Isaiah Simmons and INT'd by Baker who returned it 53 yards to the LA25. That set-up a 46-yard Vizcaino FG that made it 27-10 and the only remaining score was a Rams TD with :07 left.

In week 11, the Cardinals (4-6) took on the 49ers (5-4) on Monday Night Football at Estadio Azteca in Mexico City. It was the NFL's fifth all-time regular season game in Mexico and a reprise of the first one played between the same two teams in 2005. A close game throughout the first half, the Niners led by 7 after two quarters. However, they pulled away after halftime by scoring 21 unanswered and earning the 38-10 victory. QB Colt McCoy started his second straight game for the Cardinals in place of the injured Kyle Murray (hamstring) and completed nine passes each to WRs DeAndre Hopkins (91 yards) and Greg Dortch (103). The latter was pressed into extensive action when starter Rondale Moore was lost for the game on its first series with a groin injury.

After the teams traded 3-n-outs to start the game, Arizona produced the first points with a 40-yard Matt Prater FG. Instrumental on that 11-play, 58-yard drive were a pair of 17-yard completions to Hopkins. Early in the 2nd quarter, San Francisco went ahead thanks to a 9-play, 82-yard drive that ended on a 7-yard completion on 3rd-n-5 from Jimmy Garoppolo to WR Brandon Aiyuk. On the ensuing drive, the Cardinals reached SF territory but were backed up. On 2nd-n-11 at the AZ 44, McCoy's pass glanced off the hands of RB James Conner and was intercepted by DB Jimmie Ward. Two snaps after taking over at the AZ44, the 49ers faced a 3rd-n-3 and Garoppolo tossed it over the middle to TE George Kittle who took it 39 yards for a TD. Down 14-3, the Cards needed a jolt and got it from Dortch. On 3rd-n-6 at the AZ 40, McCoy found him on a free play and that catch-n-run covered 47 yards to the SF 13. Conner ended the drive with a 2-yard TD run that cut the deficit to 14-10 with 4:19 to go in the half. San Francisco would respond by driving to the AZ21 in 9 plays but had to settle for a 39-yard Robbie Gould FG that made it 17-10 at intermission.

The Niners doubled their lead on the opening drive of the 3rd quarter. They moved to the AZ39 in 7 plays before WR Deebo Samuel took an end around 39 yards for a TD that made it 24-10. Arizona responded by advancing to the SF41 and faced a 4th-n-3 from there. The Cards came away empty, however, when McCoy's pass attempt to Dortch was incomplete. Late in the 3rd quarter, the Niners benefitted from a short field after taking over at the AZ47 following a punt. Six plays later, Aiyuk caught his 2nd TD of the night on a 13-yard pass from Garoppolo that made it 31-10 with :28 remaining in the 3rd. On the next drive the Cards faced 4th-n-4 at midfield and went for it but an incomplection again turned it over on downs. Kittle's second TD of the night - this one a 32-yarder from Garoppolo with 10:08 remaining - provided the game's final points.

## WEEK 12

Los Angeles Chargers 25, Arizona Cardinals 24

In a back-and-forth week 12 game, the host Cardinals led the Chargers early by 10 points and late by 7. But the visitors from Los Angeles delivered the Hollywood ending with a TD in the closing seconds followed by a successful two-point conversion that handed the Cards a heartbreaking 25-24 defeat. QB Kyle Murray returned from a two-game absence (hamstring) and threw for a pair of TDs while running for another. RB James Conner topped the century mark for the first time as a Cardinal, finishing with 120 rushing yards on 25 carries. But Arizona was snake-bitten by two replay reversals of key takeaways and could not salt the game away after taking the lead in the fourth quarter. The defeat dropped the Cards to 4-8 while LA improved to 6-5.

DE JJ Watt ended the game's opening drive with his 3rd-n-7 sack of Justin Herbert that forced a Chargers punt. The Cardinals first 2 offensive plays from scrimmage were an 11-yard Marquise Brown catch and 18-yard run by Conner. On the next play, though, a Conner fumble turned it over to LA at the AZ47. But the Cards defense rose to the challenge, sending the Chargers 3-n-out thanks to rookie OLB Cameron Thomas' sack on 3rd-n-4 from the AZ41. After the punt, Arizona took over at its own 18 and was backed up by a holding penalty on the first snap. After that, Murray completed 5 of 5 passes for 60 yards and ran twice for 18 yards in leading the Cards on a 10-play, 82-yard TD drive. It ended when DeAndre Hopkins hauled in a 3rd-n-5 pass at the 20 before spinning out of a tackle there and completing the 33-yard scoring play. Up 7-0, the Cards defense forced another 3-n-out and after a 15-yard return of the ensuing punt by Pharoah Cooper, the offense took over at the LA44. Seven plays later, Matt Prater's 43-yard FG put the Cards up 10-0. AZ's defense appeared to get the ball back for the offense on the 5th play of the next possession when CB Travon Mullen forced a Joshua Palmer fumble and it was ruled that he recovered it himself at the AZ38. However, replay reversed it to a Chargers recovery and they maintained possession. Six plays later, Herbert and Keenan Allen connected on a 2-yard TD pass that cut AZ's lead to 10-7. On the next series, Arizona faced a 4th-n-1 at its own 34 and went for it but Murray's pass down the left sideline was intercepted by S Derwin James. LA took over at its own 44. Five plays later, Herbert found WR DeAndre Carter down the left sideline for a 33-yard TD that would put the Chargers up 14-10 with 4:28 to go in the second quarter. Arizona closed the half and re-claimed the lead with a 14-play, 75-yard TD drive on which Murray was again clutch. He completed 4 of 6 passes and ran 3 times for 20 yards. Six of those yards came on 3rd-n-6 from the 28 with :40 left and three plays later he zipped into the end zone on 2nd-n-3 from the 5 to give AZ a 17-10 lead with :12 remaining in the half.

The Cards got the ball first after intermission and advanced to the LA37 but came away empty when Prater's 49-yard FG try was wide left. From there the Chargers moved to the AZ8 in 13 plays and Cameron Dicker's 26-yard FG tied the game at 17 with 4:28 to go in the third quarter. The next play from scrimmage saw Murray hit Hopkins for 29 yards to the LA46 and 10 plays later he hit Conner with a TD pass on 2nd-n-goal from the 6. That score gave Arizona a 24-17 with 13:31 to play. With 7:35 left, on-field officials ruled LB Zaven Collins made a diving interception of Herbert at the LA35 but administrators in New York again reversed the takeaway. The Cards would still get the ball back via punt but could not pick up a first down and booted it back to the Chargers who took over at their own 22 with 6:07 left. A key third down sack by LB Isaiah Simmons forced another LA punt but after another Cards three-n-out, punt and penalty, the Chargers got the ball at the AZ38 with 1:48 left. Herbert would move them to the 1 in 6 plays before hitting Austin Ekeler with a 1-yard touchdown with :15 to play, pulling LA to within 1. They chose to go for 2 and took the lead when Gerald Everett hauled in the conversion.

On the 3rd play from scrimmage, a pall was cast over the evening when Arizona starting QB Kyler Murray left the game with a serious knee injury. Veteran back-up Colt McCoy took over and helped the Cards build a 13-7 lead with just under three minutes to go in the first half. But untimely mistakes, penalties and turnovers would contribute to New England scoring 20 unanswered points and emerging with the victory. RB James Conner had a game-high 85 rushing yards and a TD for Arizona and McCoy completed 27 of 40 passes for 246 yards in the effort.

The game-opening drive on which Murray was injured reached the NE31 but the Cards came away without points when Matt Prater's 50-yard FG try was just wide left. Later in the first quarter, the defense got the ball back with a takeaway. Rookie DLB Cameron Thomas hit the arm of QB Mac Jones, sending the ball into the air and LB Isaiah Simmons snatched it for an INT at the NE36. That led to a 33-yard Prater FG that made it 3-0 eight seconds into the second quarter. The Pats responded by moving 75 yards in 8 plays and went up 7-3 on Kevin Harris' 14-yard touchdown run. The ensuing Cardinals possession was aided by a 39-yard defensive pass interference that moved it to the NE27 and led to a 32-yard Prater FG. That kick pulled AZ to within 7-6 with 9:35 to go in the half and after a NE punt, the Cards took over at their own 37. McCoy completed 5 of 5 passes for 51 yards and RB James Conner put AZ up 13-7 with his 10-yard TD run. Zach Allen's 3rd down sack of Jones resulted in a quick 3-n-out by NE after which the Cards took over at the NE41 with 1:42 before halftime. They soon faced a 4th-n-1 at the 32 but turned it over on downs when McCoy's pass to TE Trey McBride was tipped incomplete. The Pats took over at that spot with 0:32 left and moved into position for a 51-yard FG from Nick Folk that pulled NE to within 13-10 at halftime.

The Pats tied the game at 13 on the opening drive of the 3rd quarter on Folk's 23-yard FG that capped an 8-play, 71-yard drive. The big play was a 44-yard Pierre Strong run to the AZ12. Arizona's next possession again reached NE territory where they went for it on 4th-n-5 at the 40; but Marquis Brown could not come up with a diving catch of a McCoy pass and the Patriots took over on downs. The next Cardinals' next possession came after a NE punt and they took over at their own 6. On the 3rd play, DeAndre Hopkins fumbled at the end of a pass play and LB Raekwon McMillan returned it 23 yards for a TD. That defensive score put NE up 20-13 with 5:32 to go in the 3rd quarter. The Cards next drive had them at the NE40 but on 2nd-n-13 from there, McCoy was hit while passing leading to an INT by CB Marcus Jones. The next play from scrimmage saw Cards LB Zaven Collins come up with what was initially ruled as an INT returned for a TD but subsequently reversed to an incompletion. A short time later, Jones hit TE Hunter Henry down the seam with a 39-yard completion to the AZ3. A play later, Pierre Strong punched it in for a TD that made it 27-13 with 14:09 to play. The Cards offense would get the ball back three more times but never found its way into New England territory.

### Arizona Cardinals 15, Denver Broncos 24

The Cardinals traveled to play the Broncos in week looking for their first-ever win in Denver. Both teams were without their starting QBs who suffered injuries the week before. For Denver, Brett Rypien started in place of Russell Wilson (concussion) while Arizona's Colt McCoy stepped in for Kyle Murray who was lost for the season with a knee injury six days earlier. Despite missing their top 3 cornerbacks due to injury, the Cards defense dominated the first half, holding Denver to 126 total yards (55 rushing, 71 passing) and recording 6.0 sacks, including 3.0 from defensive lineman J.J. Watt. As a result, Arizona led 6-3 at halftime and 9-3 after the opening drive of the third quarter. But on that same series, the Cards lost McCoy for the rest of the game with a concussion and the Broncos scored touchdowns on three of their next four possessions on their way to a 24-15 win.

The Broncos struck first in the game when Brandon McManus' 52-yard FG capped a game-opening drive of 10 plays and 41 yards. Their next possession reached Arizona's 44-yard line but were then forced to punt thanks to two sacks in three plays, first by Watt and then by fellow D-lineman Trysten Hill. On the ensuing series, the Cards offense faced a 3rd-n-5 at their own 27 when McCoy's pass down the middle was intercepted by S Justin Simmons and returned 20 yards to the AZ24. The Cards defense rose to the occasion, allowing just 4 yards in 3 plays and forcing a 38-yard McManus FG attempt that missed to the left. McCoy then engineered an 11-play, 45-yard drive that former Bronco Matt Prater ended with a 45-yard FG that tied the game at 3 early in the second quarter. The defenses stiffened and the next 6 possessions ended in punts before Denver took over at its own 25 with 1:22 left in the half. Watt ended that one when he stripped Rypien and rookie LB Myjai Sanders recovered at the AZ49 with 0:38 left. That takeaway led to Prater's 50-yard FG as the half expired and Arizona led 6-3 at intermission.

On the 3rd play of the 3rd quarter, injury misfortune again hit the Cardinals when McCoy suffered a concussion after rushing for a first down on 3rd-n-1. Trace McSorley came in at QB and got the offense in position for another long Prater FG; this one was successful from 55 yards and put the Cardinals up 9-3. On the next snap from scrimmage, Latavius Murray raced 35 yards to the AZ45 and 6 plays later fellow RB Marlon Mack punched it in from 3 yards out. Now up 10-9, the Broncos subsequent possession saw them with a 1st-n-10 at the AZ25 when S Budda Baker intercepted Rypien's pass at the goal-line to halt the threat on the final play of the 3rd quarter. Following an Arizona 3-n-out, Denver took over at its own 44 and moved 56 yards in 6 plays; Murray's 10-yard TD run and the ensuing PAT made it 17-9 with 11:00 to play. The next series saw Simmons record his second INT of the game, after which the Broncos offense took over at the AZ5. Two plays later, Rypien found TE Eric Tomlinson in the end zone for a TD that made it 24-9 with 9:29 remaining. McSorley then completed 4 of 5 passes for 68 yards which set up a 1-yard TD run by James Conner. The Cards went for 2 but came away empty when officials didn't call defensive pass interference on a pass to WR DeAndre Hopkins. That score made it 24-15 and proved to be the game's final margin as Arizona's last possession ended on a Patrick Surtain INT. Both teams moved to 4-10 based on the outcome.

### Arizona Cardinals 19, Atlanta Falcons 20

On New Year's Day in Atlanta, the Cardinals (4-11) and Falcons (5-10) met a week after being eliminated from playoff contention. The Cards started their 4th different QB in as many weeks when David Blough got the unexpected nod on Friday due to the return of concussion symptoms for Colt McCoy. Ravaged by injuries all season, Arizona was without several others such as star S Budda Baker - who suffered a season-ending shoulder injury the week before - and WR DeAndre Hopkins (knee); in addition, the Cards were also without their 3 top cornerbacks and regular long snapper. Despite all that, they battled the Falcons in a back-and-forth game with seven lead changes and Arizona went up 19-17 with 5 minutes to go on a 57-yard Matt Prater FG. But Younghoe Koo's 21-yarder as time expired would win it for Atlanta and hand AZ its 6th straight defeat. Blough was impressive, passing for 222 yards with a TD and no turnovers. RB James Conner topped 100 yards from scrimmage - 79 rushing & 31 receiving - before exiting early in the 2nd half with a leg injury. And rookie TE Trey McBride had his best game with 78 yards on 7 catches including his first career TD. The contest also marked the penultimate game in the brilliant career of JJ Watt, who announced on Tuesday he was retiring after 12 years.

On the game's opening drive, Blough completed his first 5 passes and helped move AZ into position for Prater's 38-yard FG that gave the Cards an early lead. The Falcons answered with an almost 10-minute drive that stretched into the 2nd quarter and Tyler Allgeier's 4-yard scoring run put Atlanta up 7-3 after going 75 yards in 16 plays. The next Cards series crossed midfield before ending on an Andy Lee punt that pushed ATL back to its own 11 to start its next possession. On the first play of it, the Falcons mishandled the snap and Arizona DT Leki Fotu recovered at the ATL8. Two plays later, McBride scored his first career TD with a 4-yard catch from Blough. Atlanta responded by moving to the AZ9 and decided to go for it when faced with a 4th-n-2 from there but an incompletion turned it over on downs. The Cards could not pick up a first down and Atlanta's Richie Grant blocked the ensuing punt to give ATL possession at the AZ5. On the next play, RB Cordarrelle Patterson ran it in to put the Falcons up 14-10 with 1:47 remaining in the half. That was enough time for the Cardinals offense. Blough completed 5 of 5 passes for 41 yards and Prater's 36-yard FG with 0:02 left pulled Arizona to within 1 at halftime.

A Watt sack on 3rd down ended Atlanta's opening possession of the 3rd quarter but the ensuing punt forced Arizona to take over inside its own 1. A 26-yard completion to McBride gave the Cards some breathing room and a 40-yard defensive pass interference penalty would move it to the ATL 20. Prater's 3rd FG of the game - this one from 36 yards away - allowed Arizona to re-claim the lead at 16-14. It remained that way into the 4th when AZ faced a 4th-n-2 at the ATL44 but the Cards were turned away when back-up RB Corey Clement was stopped for no gain. The Falcons would re-take the lead on the next possession when Koo connected from 27 yards out, making it 17-16 Atlanta with 9:36 remaining. The Cards then drove into ATL territory but were backed up by consecutive penalties. However, Prater connected from 57 yards out to salvage the possession and put AZ back up with 4:57 remaining. The Falcons then engineered the game-winning drive, going 72 yards in 12 plays and setting up Koo's chip shot as time expired.

Arizona Cardinals 13, San Francisco 49ers 38

The Cardinals (4-12) closed the regular season at Levi's Stadium against a 12-4 Niners team playing for playoff positioning and the potential to jump into the #1 seed. Ravaged by injuries all season, Arizona was especially short-handed for this one as eight players were ruled out on Friday, all of them starters. Despite those absences, the Cards battled like they had all season and it was a 1-point game late in the first half. But four turnovers - three interceptions and a fumble - and no takeaways proved too much to overcome as the 49ers scored 24 unanswered to earn the 38-13 victory. It was their 10th straight win while Arizona dropped its 7th in a row. The game also marked the final one in the outstanding career of first-ballot Hall of Famer JJ Watt, for whom Levi's Stadium was the only venue in which he had not played. He marked the occasion with 2.0 sacks - giving him 12.5 for the season and 10 in his last 10 games - and received a standing ovation from the Bay Area crowd when he exited in the 4th quarter.

The Cards began the afternoon with some trickery on the game's second play from scrimmage. QB David Blough pitched it to WR Pharoah Cooper who ran to his right before throwing it back to Blough; the QB then launched it deep downfield to AJ Green who caught it between two defenders at the 38 and outraced them to the end zone for a 77-yard TD. The Cards led 6-0 after the PAT try failed. San Francisco responded by going 75 yards in 6 plays and went up 7-6 when Christian McCaffrey caught a short pass on 3rd-and-4 and took it for a 21-yard TD. The next 49er possession was stymied by a Watt sack of Brock Purdy and loss of 6. Immediately thereafter, AZ went for it on 4th-and-1 from its own 39 but Blough was stopped for no gain on a sneak to turn it over on downs. The defense then stepped up, first with a 2-yard tackle for loss by DT Michael Dogbe, then a pass knockdown from Watt and finally a 17-yard sack by LB Isaiah Simmons to force a punt. The next SF possession reached the AZ44 but an 8-yard sack by rookie LB Myjai Sanders was key to forcing another punt. However on the next play from scrimmage, Blough's pass down the left sideline for Marquise Brown was INT'd by S Tashaun Gipson and returned to the AZ18. Two plays later, RB Elijah Mitchell ran it in from 5 yards out to put SF up 14-6 with 12:07 to go in the 2nd quarter. Blough and the Cardinals bounced back from the turnover with an impressive TD drive that covered 75 yards in 12 plays. On it Blough was 3 for 3 for 51 yards and the Cards were 3 for 3 on 3rd downs before back-up RB Corey Clement's 1-yard TD run made it a 1-point game with 4:41 left in the 2nd quarter. But with :19 before intermission, Purdy found TE George Kittle crossing along the back of the end zone and that 4-yard score made it 21-13 going into the halftime locker room.

The 49ers extended that lead to 28-13 on the opening drive of the 2nd half when Mitchell's 2nd TD run of the day - this one from 6 yards out - capped a 7-play, 75-yard TD drive. On the 3rd play of the ensuing drive, Blough's deep pass attempt was INT'd again by Gipson and returned to the AZ34. That led to a 27-yard Robbie Gould FG and 31-13 lead for San Fran. A minute later, Blough was sacked by DL Jordan Willis forcing a fumble that Michael Dwumfour recovered at the AZ28. A 1-yard Kittle TD catch soon followed and extended the lead to 38-13 late in the third. Blough then exited with a concussion and Trace McSorley took over for the remainder of the game. There was no further scoring by either team and San Fran clinched the NFC's #2 seed with the victory.
