- Rushing TDs for Cardinals QB Kyler Murray and Patriots QB Cam Newton in 2020. Prior to this season, the last time a QB had at least four rushing TDs through the first three games of a season was in 1972 (Terry
- Different Cardinals players who have at least 1.0 sack this season. That is tied with Buffalo, Pittsburgh, Tampa Bay and Washington for the most players with a sack in 2020.
- Sacks for Cardinals defensive linemen **Corey Peters** (2.0), **Jordan Phillips** (2.0), **Angelo Blackson** (1.0) and **Zach Allen** (1.0) this season. Arizona's defensive line has nearly as many sacks in three games this season (6.0) as it had in 16 games in 2019 (7.0).
- Receiving yards for second-year WR **Andy Isabella** in the last two games. Isabella has six receptions for 114 yards and two TDs on seven targets the last two weeks after posting nine receptions for 189 yards and one TD in his first 16 career games.

WITH A WIN.

- Arizona would earn victories in its first two road games in a season for the first time since 2015 and for just the third time (2015, 2009) in the last 29 years.
- The Cardinals would earn their first regular season road win at Carolina since 2002.
- Arizona would improve to 3-2 playing East Coast games with a 10:00 AM kickoff (AZ time) under head coach ${\bf Kliff~Kingsbury}$.

MILESTONES WITHIN REACH...

WR LARRY FITZGERALD

- With a reception, Fitzgerald would have at least one catch in 247 consecutive games, extending the second-longest streak in NFL history (Jerry Rice - 274).
- With 100 receiving yards, Fitz would have 50 career 100-yard games during the regular season to extend his franchise record. He would have more 100-yard receiving performances than the players in second and third place on the franchise all-time list combined (49).

LB CHANDLER JONES

- With a sack, Jones would have 4.0 sacks in four career games against Carolina.
- With two sacks, Jones would have 99.0 sacks for his career and would have 63.0 sacks in just 68 games played with the Cardinals since the team acquired him in a trade in 2016.

WR DEANDRE HOPKINS

- With a reception, Hopkins would extend his streak to 114 consecutive games with at least one catch. He would have at least one reception in every game played in his NFL career.
- With five receptions, Hopkins would have 5+ catches in 22 consecutive games, the second-longest streak in NFL history behind Antonio Brown (36 straight).
- With five catches, Hopkins (37) would set an NFL record for most receptions in a player's <u>first four games with a team</u>. He would also establish a franchise record for the most receptions in the first four games of a season.
- With 10 receptions, Hopkins (42) would tie the NFL record for catches in the first four games of a season (Saints WR Michael Thomas in 2018).
- With a TD reception, Hopkins would have 56 career TD catches. It would be his first career TD reception against the Panthers and give him at least one TD catch against 23 different teams in his NFL career.

QB KYLER MURRAY

- With a rushing TD, Murray would become the first QB in the Super Bowl era to rush for a TD in each of the first four games of a season. He would become the first Cardinals player in history - regardless of position - with a rushing TD in each of the first four games of a season
- With a rushing TD, Murray (5) would surpass the number of rushing TDs he had in 16 games last season.
- With a rushing and passing TD, Murray would tie the NFL record (4 straight) for consecutive games with both a passing and rushing TD. He would join Michael Vick (4 straight in 2010) as the only players in the last 52 seasons to accom-
- With two rushing TDs, Murray would tie the franchise single-season record for rushing TDs by a QB. The record is currently held by Jim Hart (6 in 1968).

RB KENYAN DRAKE

With a rushing TD, Drake would have more rushing TDs in 12 games with Arizona (10) than he had in 54 total games with Miami (9).

COREY PETERS AND JORDAN PHILLIPS

With a sack, Peters/Phillips would have at least one sack in three consecutive games for the first time in their career. Peters/Phillips would become the first Cardinals DT with a sack in three consecutive games since Darnell Dockett had one in four straight (Games 8-11) in 2009.

THE NFL'S #1 RECEIVER

WR DeAndre Hopkins has been better than advertised since Arizona acquired him in a trade with Houston this offseason.

In his first three games with the Cardinals, Hopkins has 32 receptions for 356 yards and a TD. Hopkins entered Week 4 leading the NFL in receptions (32), receiving yards (356) and 1st down catches (21).

QB Kyler Murray has thrown for 786 yards and four TDs while rushing for 187 yards and four TDs. He has thrown and rushed for a TD in all three games in 2020, putting him one game from an NFL milestone.

With both a rushing TD and passing TD this week he would become just the sixth player in NFL history - and second Car-<u>dinals player - with both a rushing and passing TD in four</u> consecutive games
