



ARIZONA CARDINALS NOTE CARDS

60 Percent-or-higher completion percentage for QB **Kyler Murray** in all six games this season. He is one of just six NFL QBs this season to have completed 60%-or-more of his passes in six games in 2024 joining Lamar Jackson, C.J. Stroud, Joe Burrow, Kirk Cousins and Baker Mayfield.

3.83 Yards per play for Arizona in the red zone. That is the second-highest rate in the NFL trailing only Baltimore (3.88). The Cards 4.94 yards per pass play in the red zone also ranks second in the league behind only the Ravens (4.96).

3 Meetings between the Cardinals and Chargers on *Monday Night Football*, including Monday's game. AZ will have faced only two teams on MNF more times than LAC (Dal - 8 times, SF - 7). The last matchup between the two teams on a Monday night resulted in a 18-17 Cardinals win (9/8/14).

15 Tackles for LB **Kyzir White** in his final MNF appearance as a member of the Chargers. That total remains a career high. Monday night will mark White's first game against his former team who he was drafted by in 2018 and spent the first four seasons of his NFL career with (2018-21).

WITH A WIN...

- The Cardinals would have more wins in their last nine MNF appearances (5) than they had in their previous 20 (4).
- Combined with their Week 2 win vs. the Rams, the Cardinals would have wins vs. both L.A.-based teams in the same season for the first time.

MILESTONES WITHIN REACH...

QB KYLER MURRAY

- With 3 passing TDs, Murray would tie Neil Lomax (15 games) for the most games with 3+ passing TDs in franchise history.
- With 3 passing TDs, Murray would tie Carson Palmer (105) for fourth place on the franchise all-time list for career passing TDs.

RB JAMES CONNER

- With a TD (of any kind), Conner would have seven TDs in seven career starts on Monday Night Football.
- With a rushing TD, Conner would have 33 rushing TDs with Arizona. That would tie David Johnson and John David Crow for third place on the franchise all-time list for career rushing TDs. At 48 games, he would also become the quickest Cardinal ever to reach 33 rushing TDs with the team.
- With 100+ rushing yards, Conner would have eight 100-yard outings as a member of the Cardinals, matching Edgerrin James (2006-08) for the fourth-most games with 100+ rushing yards in franchise history. It would also mark his fifth 100-yard rushing performance in his last nine games.
- With 2 rushing TDs, Conner would have eight games with multiple rushing TDs as a member of the Cardinals. That would tie David Johnson (2015-19) for the most such outings in franchise history.

WR MARVIN HARRISON JR.

- With a TD reception, Harrison would become the first rookie in franchise history with at least five TD receptions in his seven career games.
- With 2 TD receptions, Harrison would join Larry Fitzgerald (2 in 2004) and Anquan Boldin (2 in 2003) as the only rookies in team history with at least two TD receptions in multiple games in a season.
- With 100+ receiving yards, Harrison would become just the eighth rookie in franchise history with multiple 100-yard receiving games in a season and the first since Anquan Boldin (5) in 2003.

WR GREG DORTCH

- With two receptions, Dortch would have 100 receptions in his career.

WR MICHAEL WILSON

- With a TD reception, Wilson would have a TD catch in back-to-back games.
- With a TD reception, three of Wilson's six career TD catches will have come against teams from his home state of California.

S BUDDA BAKER

- With 10+ tackles, Baker would have double-digit tackles for the 30th time in his career and in six of his last 10 games played.

CB SEAN MURPHY-BUNTING

- With an INT, Murphy-Bunting would have an INT in back-to-back games for the first time in his career. He would also be the first Cardinal to do so since S Jalen Thompson in Weeks 11-12 last season.
- With an INT, Murphy-Bunting would have 10 INTs in his career.

20 PLAYERS

- With an appearance, would make their primetime debut on Monday night. That is 38.5% of Arizona's 52-man active roster.

MCBRIDE IN THE TOP 5

TE **Trey McBride** had eight catches for 96 yards last week in Green Bay, leading the Cardinals in both categories. McBride has had 5+ catches in seven consecutive road games dating back to Week 11 of 2023. **Only Chiefs TE Travis Kelce (10 games in 2019-20) and Hall of Fame TE Tony Gonzalez (nine games in 2004-05) have achieved longer such streaks since at least 1970.**

Coming off a record-breaking 2023 campaign, McBride has picked up right where he left off. **Through six games in 2024, he ranks in the top five among NFL TEs in several receiving categories including receptions (t-2nd w/ 28), receiving yards (5th w/ 271) and receptions for a first down (t-5th w/ 11).**

DEEJAY SPINS PAST DEFENDERS

In his first six games as a Cardinal, RB **DeeJay Dallas** has proven himself to be one of the NFL's best kick returners. After last week at Green Bay where he returned three kickoffs for 79 yards (26.3 avg.), **Dallas ranks at the top of league leaders in the return game:**

- t-1st in the NFL in special teams TDs (1)
- 2nd in the NFL in kickoff return average (32.3)
- 2nd longest kickoff return in the NFL (96 yards)
- 3rd in the NFL in kickoff return yards (355)
- t-3rd in the NFL in total kickoff returns (11)



Dallas is just the third Cardinal since at least 1970 to have a kickoff return average of 30.0-or-higher and at least 10 kickoff returns through the first six games of a season joining Terry Metcalf (38.7 in 1974) and David Johnson (32.7 in 2015).

In addition to Dallas' contributions in the return game, he also has three special teams tackles in 2024.

GETTING HANDS ON THE BALL

After having five passes defended and one INT through the first three games in 2024, **the Cardinals defense has totaled 16 passes defended and four INTs in the last three games. Those totals are tied for ninth and tied for third in the NFL during that span, respectively.**

The team's four INTs over the last three weeks have come from different players (CB **Sean Murphy-Bunting**, LB **Mack Wilson Sr.**, LB **Kyzir White** and CB **Garrett Williams**). Ten different Cardinals contributed to the team's 16 passes defended during that span.
