



ARIZONA CARDINALS NOTE CARDS

- 1** Current NFL owners who served in the U.S. Military. Cardinals owner Bill Bidwill served in the U.S. Navy Reserves (1950-54) and U.S. Navy (1954-56), spending two years in the Atlantic on the U.S.S. Orion during and following the Korean War.
- 3** Spot at which the Cardinals drafted WR Larry Fitzgerald in the 2004 NFL Draft. Oakland drafted one spot ahead of Arizona at #2.
- 48.2** Punting average for Andy Lee in 2018. Should that number hold, he will break the franchise single-season record for punting average - which he himself established last season (47.3). Lee's 48.2-yard punt average is the second-best in the NFL this season behind only Philadelphia's Cameron Johnston (49.6).
- 4** Scoring drives of 12+ plays for the Cardinals offense in the last two games. Arizona had just two scoring drives of 12+ plays in the first seven games combined this season.

WITH A WIN...

- The Cardinals would improve their winning streak against the Raiders to three games and even up the all-time series at 5 games apiece.

MILESTONES WITHIN REACH...

WR LARRY FITZGERALD

- With a catch, Fitzgerald would have at least one reception in 221 consecutive games, the second-longest streak in NFL history (Jerry Rice - 274).
- With eight receptions, Fitzgerald would pass Hall of Fame WR Jerry Rice (1,281 with San Francisco) for the most receptions in NFL history with a single team.
- With a TD reception, Fitzgerald would have 113 TD catches in his career. It would also give him a TD catch in three straight games at State Farm Stadium.

RB DAVID JOHNSON

- With a TD (of any kind), Johnson would have 42 TDs in his career. Despite playing in just 43 games, Johnson would move into a tie for 10th place on the franchise all-time TDs list.
- With two TDs (of any kind), Johnson would have 10+ TDs in a season for the third time in his career. He would join WR Larry Fitzgerald (5) as the only players in franchise history with 10+ TDs in at least three different seasons.
- With two rushing TDs, Johnson would tie Stump Mitchell (32) for fourth place on the franchise all-time list for career rushing TDs.

DE CHANDLER JONES

- With a sack, Jones would have 37.5 sacks in 42 career games with Arizona. He would have at least one sack in 30 of 42 games with the Cardinals - and in 8 of 10 games this season.
- With a sack, Jones would tie Al Baker (37.5 from 1983-86) for ninth on the franchise all-time sacks list.
- With multiple sacks (1.5 or more), Jones would become the first player in franchise history to record 10+ sacks in three consecutive seasons. He has 8.5 sacks entering Sunday's game.
- With multiple sacks (1.5 or more), it would mark just the fourth time in franchise history a player had 10+ sacks through the first 10 games of a season - and Jones (10.0 in '17) would be responsible for two of those instances.

WR CHRISTIAN KIRK

- With seven receptions Kirk would have 40 catches in 2018. He would join Anquan Boldin (60 in 2013) as the only rookies in team history with 40+ receptions in their first 10 career games.

CB PATRICK PETERSON

- With an INT, Peterson would have 24 INTs in his career. Only six players in team history would have more. It would give Peterson three INTs this season, and two in the last four games.

S TRE BOSTON

- With an INT, Boston would have an INT in three of his last four games played this season (missed games 7-8). He would also have four INTs in his last six games played. Boston would have 12 career INTs, nine of which would have come in his last 24 games dating back to last season.

LB JOSH BYNES

- With a sack, Bynes would have twice as many sacks in 2018 (3.0) than he did in his first seven NFL seasons combined (1.5).

STARTING STREAKS

- Larry Fitzgerald will start his 62nd consecutive game on Sunday, which is the second-longest active streak among NFL WRs (Demaryius Thomas-105). Patrick Peterson will make his 122nd consecutive start, the second-longest active streak among NFL CBs (Brandon Carr-169).

EIGHT CATCHES FROM PASSING RICE

WR **Larry Fitzgerald** made history last week in Kansas City, passing Hall of Fame WR Terrell Owens for second place on the NFL's all-time list for career receiving yards. He could make history again this week when the Cardinals host the Raiders in what will be his 100th career regular season game at State Farm Stadium.

Fitzgerald (1,274) enters Sunday's game needing eight receptions to pass Hall of Fame WR Rice (1,281 with San Francisco) for the most receptions in NFL history with a single team.

Rice spent 16 seasons (1985-2000) with the 49ers, appearing in 238 games during that span. Fitzgerald is in his 15th season in Arizona in 2018 and will be appearing in his 228th game on Sunday vs. Oakland.

CHANDLER JOINS THE LEADERBOARD

It took less than three full seasons - just 41 games in total - for DE **Chandler Jones** to reach the top-10 among Cardinals all-time sack leaders. With his two-sack performance last week in Kansas City, Jones now has 36.5 sacks with Arizona.

Jones has not gone back-to-back games without a sack since Games 13-14 of the '16 season. That span covers 28 total games.

Over the last two seasons (2017-18), Jones has at least one sack in 20 of 25 games. He has at least one sack in 29 of 41 games played with Arizona.

SACKING THE QB AT A HISTORIC PACE

The Cardinals defense recorded 29 sacks through the first nine games this season. Since *team sacks* became an official statistic in 1963, there have only been two seasons in which the Cardinals posted more sacks through the first nine games, and neither was within the last 50 years.

--Arizona has posted multiple sacks in each of the first nine games of a season for the first time in team history.
--Arizona has had an NFL-high 10 different players post multiple sacks (1.5 or more) already this season.

With a sack against the Raiders on Sunday, the Cardinals would have 30 sacks in 2018. Since *team sacks* became an official statistic in 1963, it would mark just the sixth time - and first time since 1974 (32) - that the Cardinals recorded at least 30 sacks in the first 10 games of a season.
