Passing yards along with three passing TDs for QB **Kyler Murray** in his last meeting with the Vikings (@ Min - 10/30/22). In two career games against the Vikings, Murray has completed 60-of-80 passes (75%) for 726 yards, six TDs and a passer rating of 106.6. He also ran for 67 yards and a TD on 11 carries (6.1 avg.) in those contests.

Members of the Cardinals coaching staff who previously worked for the Vikings: Head Coach Jonathan Gannon, offensive coordinator Drew Petzing, defensive coordinator Nick Rallis, head strength and conditioning coach Evan Marcus, OLBs coach Rob Rodriguez, LBs coach Sam Siefkes and TEs coach Ben Steele all coached for Minnesota.

- The Cardinals would improve to 7-5 and maintain at least a tie for the top record in the NFC West.
- Arizona would have wins in six of its last eight games.
- QB Kyler Murray would improve to 2-1 in his career against the Vikings.

MILESTONES WITHIN REACH...

QB KYLER MURRAY

 With 2 passing TDs, Murray would tie Charley Johnson (108) for third place on the franchise all-time list for career passing TDs.

RB JAMES CONNER

- With 7 scrimmage yards, Conner would have 1,000 in 2024. He would become the first player in Cardinals history to have 1,000+ scrimmage yards in each of his first four seasons with the team.
- With 53 rushing yards, Conner (3,279) would pass Pro Football Hall of Famer Ollie Matson (3,331) for the 9th-most rushing yards in franchise history. With 97 rushing yards, he would also pass Wayne Morris (3,375) for 8th place.
- With 100+ rushing yards, Conner would have 10 games with 100+ rushing yards as a member of the Cardinals, the third-most in franchise history. It would also mark his seventh 100-yard rushing performance is his last 14 games and his fifth 100-yard outing in 2024.
- With a rushing TD, Conner would have 35 rushing TDs with Arizona, the third most in franchise history (Ottis Anderson - 46 and Wayne Morris - 37).

TE TREY MCBRIDE

- With 5 receptions, McBride would have at least five catches in each of his last 10 road games. He would join Travis Kelce (10 straight from 2019-20) as the only TEs in NFL history to have at least five receptions in 10 straight road games.
- With 15 receiving yards, McBride would have 700 in 2024. Combined with his 825 yards in 2023, he would join Hall of Famer Jackie Smith (3) as the only TEs in franchise history with multiple seasons of 700+ receiving yards.

WR MARVIN HARRISON JR.

- With a TD catch, Harrison would have seven TD receptions in 2024. He would become the first player in franchise history to have 7+ TD catches in his first 12 career games.
- With 2 TD receptions, Harrison would match Anquan Boldin (8 in 2003) and Larry Fitzgerald (8 in 2004) for the most TD receptions by a rookie in franchise history. He would also join Fitzgerald (2) and Boldin (2) as the only rookies in team history with at least 2 TD receptions in multiple games in a season.
- With 100+ receiving yards, Harrison would join Anguan Boldin (5 in 2003) and Gaynell Tinsley (3 in 1937) as the only rookies in franchise history with at least three 100-yard receiving performances.

S BUDDA BAKER

- With a sack, Baker would have at least 1.0 sack in three consecutive games. He would become the first Cardinals DB to do so since at least 1982 when individual sacks became an official statistic.
- With 10+ tackles, Baker would have double-digit tackles for the 32nd time in his career and in eight of his last 15 games played.

LB JESSE LUKETA

With 1.0 sack, Luketa would have a sack in four consecutive games. He would become the first Cardinals player to accomplish that feat since Chandler Jones (5 straight) in Weeks 3-7 of the 2018 season.

DL DANTE STILLS

With 1.0 sack, Stills would have 5.5 sacks in 2024, extending his career high. It would also give him 4.5 sacks in his last six games.

MONSTER GAME FOR MCBRIDE

Last Sunday in Seattle, TE **Trey McBride** had a franchise-record (among TEs) 12 receptions for 133 yards. Not only did the performance break team records, it was also one of the best games by an NFL TE this season.

McBride's 133 receiving yards are the second most by an NFL TE in a game this season. Paired with his 124-yard outing @ Miami in Week 8, he has two of the five highest single-game receiving yardage totals among TEs in 2024.

LUKETA GETTING TO THE QB

LB Jesse Luketa was one of five Cardinals to sack Seahawks QB Geno Smith last week in Seattle. It marked his 3rd straight game with a sack after going without one in the first 25 games of his career.

With a sack this Sunday, Luketa would become just the fourth Cardinal in the last 15 seasons to have at least 1.0 sack in 4+ consecutive games joining Chandler Jones (5 times from 2016-18), Markus Golden (5 games - Weeks 1-5 in 2016) and John Abraham (4 games - Weeks 7-11 in 2013).



Luketa's streak is tied for the longest active streak in the NFL (tied with four players). Only four players in the NFL have had longer such streaks this season.

Williams (19 games) is the fastest Cardinal to reach three career INTs since Patrick Peterson (18 games) in 2012. Only four Cardinals have reached three career INTs faster than Williams (19) since 1988 when the team moved to Arizona.
