2018 INDIVIDUAL MILESTONES

WR Larry Fitzgerald

- Ended the 2018 season with 1,303 career receptions, passing Hall of Fame WR Jerry Rice (1,281 with SF) for most receptions in NFL history with a single team. Also finished the season with 16,279 career receiving yards, passing Hall of Fame WR Terrell Owens (15,934) for second place on the NFL's all-time list for career receiving yards. In the season finale at Seattle, appeared in his 234th career game with Arizona, tying K Jim Bakken for the most games played in franchise history.

CB Patrick Peterson

- Selected to his eighth consecutive Pro Bowl (7th as a CB), joining Hall of Famers Jim Brown and Barry Sanders as the only players in NFL history to be chosen to eight Pro Bowls before their 29th birthday.

DE Chandler Jones

- Recorded 13.0 sacks in 2018. Combined with his 11.0 sacks in 2016 and NFL-high 17.0 sacks in 2017, he became the first player in franchise history with 10+ sacks in three consecutive seasons. Leads the NFL with 41.0 sacks since joining the Cardinals in 2016.

P Andy Lee

- Led the NFL and established a franchise single-season record with a 48.6-yard punting average in 2018. Lee led the NFL in punting average for the second time in his career (2011) and he has now finished in the top-10 in punting average in 12 of his 15 NFL seasons. He has established a Cardinals single-season record for punting average in each of his first two years with Arizona: 47.3 in 2017 and 48.6 in 2018.

RB David Johnson

- Scored 10 TDs (7 rushing, 3 receiving) in 2018, marking the third time in his career he has reached double-digit TDs in a season (13 in 2015; 20 in 2016). Joins WR Larry Fitzgerald (5) as the only players in team history with 10+ TDs in at least three seasons.

S Antoine Bethea

- During his 13th NFL season, Bethea recorded a team-high 133 tackles in 2018. It marked his 10th season with 100+ tackles and his 133 stops in '18 represent the third-highest single-season total of his career (139 in 2011; 135 in 2016).

QB Josh Rosen

- Rallied the Cardinals from 12 points down in the fourth quarter vs. San Francisco in Week 8, becoming the youngest QB in the Super Bowl era to win a game after leading his team back from a double-digit deficit in the fourth quarter.

S Budda Baker

- Appeared in 14 games (13 starts) and totaled 107 tackles, eight tackles for loss, 2.0 sacks, three QB pressures, four QB hits, two passes defensed, a forced fumble and two fumble recoveries (one returned 36 yards for his first career TD). One of just three NFL safeties with 100+ tackles, 2.0+ sacks and 8+ tackles for loss in 2018.

Rookie LBs Zeke Turner and Dennis Gardeck

- Turner led the NFL with 13 solo special teams tackles in 2018 while Gardeck led all NFL rookies with 388 total snaps on special teams.

REDSKINS 24, CARDINALS 6

SEPTEMBER 9, 2018
STATE FARM STADIUM - (61,613)



In week 1 of the regular season, Washington came to AZ and spoiled the Cardinals first game in recently renamed State Farm Stadium as well as the debut of first-year head coach Steve Wilks. Behind new QB Alex Smith and running backs Adrian Peterson and Chris Thompson, Washington's offense hummed while Arizona's had difficulty establishing a rhythm. It all added up to a 24-6 season opening home loss for the Cardinals.

In the late first quarter and into the second, the Redskins offense launched three consecutive lengthy TD drives (80, 73, and 92 yards) to take a 21-0 halftime lead. Those drives helped Washington achieve a 22:57 to 7:03 time of possession advantage in a first half that saw Arizona's offense possess it just three times and run only 14 plays. On the opening play of the 2nd quarter, Thompson caught a 13-yard pass from Smith that capped an 11-play, 80-yard drive that made it 7-0. Their next series saw them go 73 yards in 15 plays and ended with Peterson's 1-yard TD run that made it 14-0. With 0:08 remaining before intermission, Washington faced a 3rd-n-goal from the AZ 4 when Smith hit TE Jordan Reed with a TD pass that made it 21-0.

Neither team scored in the third quarter but early in the fourth, Dustin Hopkins' 31-yard FG made it 24-0. The next drive was Arizona's most efficient of the afternoon; on it, new Cards QB Sam Bradford was 8 for 8 passing for 42 yards and rookie RB Chase Edmonds added 20 yards on 3 carries. It ended when David Johnson ran it in from 2 yards out. It was the 34th TD in 34 games for Johnson who saw his first action since suffering a season-ending wrist injury in the 2017 opener. About 20 hours earlier the talented Johnson signed an extension that keeps him under contract with the Cardinals thru the end of the 2021 season.

Starting season #15 with the Cardinals, WR Larry Fitzgerald led all receivers with 7 catches for 76 yards. He also extended his streak of games with a reception to 212 games, #2 in NFL history behind only Jerry Rice (274). Another 15th year player out of Pitt also had an exceptional day for the Cardinals: punter Andy Lee repeatedly helped the Cardinals flip the field on Washington and averaged 52.6 yards (46.2 net) on his 5 punts, three of which landed inside the 20.

In their first divisional match-up of the season, the Cards traveled to Los Angeles to take on the Rams at the Coliseum. On this day, it would be all LA as the hosts excelled in all three phases to drop the Cards to 0-2. After a scoreless opening quarter, the Rams scored 34 unanswered en route to a decisive victory that improved their mark to 2-0. RB Todd Gurley ran for 3 TDs while QB Jared Goff was 24-32 for 354 yards passing. WR Brandin Cooks led the way with 7 catches for 159 receiving yards. Defensively the Rams allowed just 5 first downs and 137 total yards while keeping the Cardinals off the scoreboard.

In the first quarter, the Cardinals defense did an excellent job containing Gurley who rushed six times for minus-1 yard. However, Goff completed 8 of 9 passes for 100 yards to 4 different receivers and by the second play of the 2nd quarter, the Rams had advanced to the AZ11. On 2nd-n-1 from there Gurley took a handoff from Goff, bounced right, and outraced the Cardinals defenders to the pylon. Because veteran kicker Greg Zuerlein injured his groin in pre-game warm-ups, LA went for 2 and converted on a Gurley run that made it 8-0. After a Cards 3-n-out, the Rams moved 52 yards in 10 plays and faced a 3rd-n-goal from the 2. Goff had WR Cooper Kupp open in the end zone but DE Chandler Jones alertly got his hand up and knocked the pass down. Punter Johnny Hekker then came on to attempt his first career FG and knocked it thru to make it 11-0. Late in the 2nd quarter, AZ punted it back to the Rams and returner Jolo Natson took it 60 yards to the AZ32. On the last play of the opening half, Gurley punched it on 4th-n-goal from the 1; his run on the subsequent 2-point conversion made it 19-0 at intermission.

Up 19-0, the Rams opened the 2nd half with a 57-yard completion from Goff to Cooks down the deep middle on their first play from scrimmage which took it to the AZ 22. Three plays later on 3rd-n-9 from the 21, Goff was flushed out of the pocket and rolled to his right but his pass attempt was intercepted by CB Patrick Peterson at the 2 to halt the threat. It was the 22nd career INT for the All-Pro Peterson, moving him into 8th in team history. AZ would pick up one first down before being forced to punt, after which the Rams would take over at their own 44. Five plays and 56 yards later, Gurley scored his 3rd TD of the day on a 1-yard run and Goff's pass to RB Malcolm Brown on the 2-point try made it 27-0 with 3:39 remaining in the 3rd quarter. A Goff TD pass to TE Tyler Higbee with 3:17 remaining in the game provided the contest's final points.

The Bears (1-1) and Cardinals (0-2) met in week 3 at State Farm Stadium. Against a stout Chicago defense that had allowed just 6 total points in quarters 1-3 of their opening two games combined, the Cards jumped out to an early 14-0 lead after a pair of Sam Bradford TD passes. However the Bears chipped away and after a TD and three Cody Parkey FGs, they claimed their first lead of the day with 4:31 remaining. At that point, head coach Steve Wilks inserted rookie QB Josh Rosen in place of Bradford in hopes of creating a spark for a Cards offense that was held scoreless over the final three quarters. While it reached Chicago territory, the Rosen-led offense was not able to produce the points needed to pull it out.

As mentioned the game began in promising fashion for the Cards. On the game's 3rd play from scrimmage, AZ faced a 3rd-n-4 at its own 31. RB David Johnson picked up an A gap blitz allowing Bradford to find rookie WR Christian Kirk for a 30-yard completion to the CHI39 for the offense's biggest gain of the young season. Two snaps later, Bradford found TE Ricky Seals-Jones wide open across the field and their 35-yard TD connection put the Cards up 7-0. The Bears next drive saw them quickly move into AZ territory, but on 3rd-n-6 from the AZ13, DBs Budda Baker and Bené Benwikere came on a blitz and combined to drop Mitchell Trubisky for a 15-yard loss. The sack pushed the Bears back to the AZ28, forcing a 46-yard Parkey FG try that he missed wide right. Late in the 1st, the Bears faced a 3rd-n-7 at their own 27 when DT Robert Nkemdiche forced a Trubisky fumble that fellow DT Corey Peters recovered at the CHI21. On next play, Bradford lofted a 21-yard pass into the arms of RB David Johnson for a TD and 14-0 Cardinals lead. With a minute to go in the first half, AZ took over at the CHI24 after DE Chandler Jones tipped a Trubisky pass at the line and 3-ye Boston made a diving INT. The Cards, however, came away pointless as a Khalil Mack sack of Bradford pushed them out of FG range.

Early in the 2nd, Bradford's deep pass to WR JJ Nelson was INT'd by S Eddie Jackson at the CHI33. From there, the Bears moved 67 yards in 9 plays - the biggest of which was a 39-yard completion to Allen Robinson - and Jordan Howard's 1-yard run made it 14-10 with 6:16 left in the 3rd. The next AZ drive ended when Bradford's pass intended for WR Chad Williams was picked off by DB Sherrick McManis and set the Chicago offense up at the AZ44. Parkey's 41-yard FG narrowed the deficit to 1 at 14-13. AZ seemed poised to add to its lead on the ensuing drive when Bradford hit Kirk down the left sideline with a 32-yard gain to the CHI23. On 2nd-n-8 from the 21, Bradford scrambled up the middle but was hit by Mack forcing a fumble that LB Danny Trevathan recovered at the 16. Chicago then moved 55 yards in 13 plays and Parkey's 43-yard FG put Chicago up 16-14. After that, Rosen entered the game. He moved AZ to the CHI42 but a 3-yard loss on 3rd down led to a 4th-n-5 at the CHI45 with 1:16 left. CB Bryce Callahan's INT effectively snuffed out Arizona's last best hope.

In week 4 at State Farm Stadium, the big story entering the game was rookie QB Josh Rosen. The team's 1st round pick and 10th overall selection, Rosen - at 21 years, 232 days old - became the youngest player in Cards history to start at QB. Twice in the game the Cardinals found themselves trailing the Seahawks and twice Rosen led them back. That included in the fourth quarter when Seattle led 17-10 before the rookie led a 5-play, 80-yard drive that Rosen capped with his 1st career TD pass to tie the game midway through the quarter. Later in the 4th, he marched the Cards into Seattle territory to set-up a go-ahead FG try, but Phil Dawson's 45-yarder was wide right with 1:50 left. That was enough time for Seattle to get into position for Sebastian Janikowski's 52-yard boot as time expired that won the game for the Seahawks and dropped AZ to 0-4 in heart-breaking fashion.

After the teams traded punts to open the game, Seattle advanced to the AZ20 in 5 plays. From there, RB Mike Davis took a handoff and bounced outside before racing down the right sideline to give the Seahawks a 7-0 lead. On the next play from scrimmage, Cards RB David Johnson fumbled and Seattle recovered at the Cards 26. Suddenly staring down the barrel of an early double-digit deficit, the AZ defense stiffened and held the Seahawks to a 38-yard FG try that Janikowski pushed right. The Cards offense answered by driving into Seattle territory and appeared to tie the game on a 22-yard Rosen TD pass to WR Chad Williams. However, a replay review overturned it, saying that Williams did not get his 2nd foot down. That instead led to a 23-yard Dawson FG early in the 2nd quarter. With 5:30 to go before intermission, Seattle was threatening again but Janikowski's 52-yard FG try missed left giving the Cards great field position at their own 42. Thanks to a 21-yard David Johnson run and a 10-yard Larry Fitzgerald pass on 3rd-n-5, the Cards found themselves at the SEA18 at the 2:00 warning. A defensive pass interference penalty in the end zone then took it to the 1 where Johnson's TD run made it 10-7 AZ with 1:52 left. With just over :30 remaining, Seattle went for it on 4th-n-1 at the AZ44 but DE Chandler Jones sacked Russell Wilson for a 6-yard loss, turning it over to the Cards offense at midfield. Rosen moved the team into position for a FG try but Dawson's 50-yarder missed right as time expired.

Seattle's opening drive of the 3rd quarter resulted in a 40-yard Janikowski FG that tied it at 10. The Seahawks then went ahead 17-10 after Davis' 1-yard run capped a 5-play, 47-yard drive. The 3rd quarter was all Seattle, who doubled AZ in total plays (18-7) and time of possession (10:05-4:55). With 11:38 to play, the Cards found themselves at their own 20 and down 17-10. A 31-yard Rosen pass to TE Ricky Seals-Jones moved it to the SEA 49 and a 32-yard screen pass to Johnson moved it to the 19. Two plays later from the 22, Rosen hit Chad Williams in the end zone with the game-tying TD with 8:59 to go. After the defense sent Seattle 3-n-out, AZ began at its own 24 with 7:11 left. The Cards moved to the SEA27 at the 2:00 warning but Dawson missed from 45. With 1:50 left, the Seahawks took over at their own 25 and out of timeouts. But that was enough for Wilson to move into position for the game-winner.

The Cardinals recorded their first victory of 2018 and under head coach Steve Wilks thanks to a 10-point win over in San Francisco. The 49ers scored a TD on the opening drive of the afternoon and enjoyed a decisive edge in most statistical categories. However, the Cards hit on 75-yard TD pass on their first play from scrimmage and had a 5-0 turnover advantage (3 fumble recoveries and 2 INTs). Three of those takeaways led to touchdowns including a fumble LB Josh Byrnes returned himself for a 4th quarter TD. Arizona DE Chandler Jones was exceptional throughout the game, finishing with 6 tackles, 2 tackles for loss, a sack, forced fumble, fumble recovery and knockdown of a pass on a 4th quarter 2-point try that would have tied the game with 6:51 remaining.

The 49ers began the day by methodically moving the ball on the game's opening drive. Aided by completions of 16 and 25 yards to FB Kyle Juszczyk, San Fran capped the 8-play, 75-yard drive on CJ Beathard's 5-yard shovel pass to RB Matt Breida but led just 6-0 after mishandling the PAT. The Cards wasted no time striking back. On Arizona's 1st offensive snap, Josh Rosen threw it deep to WR Christian Kirk and the 75-yard connection between the rookies put AZ up 7-6. On the 2nd play of the ensuing SF drive, AZ safety Tre Boston made a diving INT to set the Cards up at the SF43 but they could not take advantage. Early in the 2nd quarter, the Niners trailed 7-6 but had advanced to the AZ40. On 1st down from there, RB Raheem Mostert fumbled on a hit by DT Rodney Gunter. CB Patrick Peterson scooped up the loose ball and raced 49 yards down the left sideline to the SF 18. After an 11-yard completion to TE Jermaine Gresham, David Johnson found the end zone on a 2-yard run to put AZ up 14-6.

Early in the 3rd, the 49ers trailed by 8 but had moved to the AZ39. On 1st down from there, Jones came off the edge to strip Beathard in the pocket and recovered the fumble himself. San Fran threatened again on its next series but after reaching the AZ27, the drive stalled and Robbie Gould's 45-yard FG was wide right. On the following possession, the 49ers again moved the ball deep into AZ territory and on 4th-n-goal from the 1, Beathard threw a TD pass to WR Trent Taylor that made it 14-12 with 6:51 left. A 2-point conversion would tie it but Jones snuffed out a screen pass and knocked it down at the line. With just under 5 minutes to play, AZ still led 14-12 but the Niners had it at their own 41. LB Haason Reddick then got to Beathard, forcing a fumble that Benjamins picked up and returned 23 yards for a TD that made it 21-12. A minute later, CB Bené Benwikere's INT and 21-yard return to the SF26 set up a 6-yard Johnson TD run 5 plays later that made it 28-12. The Niners then went 76 yards in 10 plays and narrowed the gap with Beathard's 1-yard TD run that made it 28-18 with 1:29 left. But after unsuccessfully executing both a 2-point try and an on-side kick, AZ was able to kneel down the game's remaining time.

In week 6 at Minnesota, the Cards & Vikings were tied at 10 in the final minute of the 1st half. But from there the hosts scored 17 straight points on 3 straight possessions (FG-TD) to take a lead that proved insurmountable. In the end, a 10-point Vikings win dropped AZ to 1-5 on the season. The loss came in spite of a strong defensive effort that saw the Cards consistently harass QB Kirk Cousins, knocking down 7 passes, sacking him 4 times, hurrying him on 7 other occasions and forcing a fumble that S Budda Baker returned for a defensive TD. DT Corey Peters had 2 of the sacks while DE Chandler Jones had 1.5.

On their opening series of the game, the Vikings took over at their own 31. They moved to the AZ42 but the Cards stopped them on both 3rd-n-2 and 4th-n-2 from there. On each play, the Cards knocked down Cousins passes at the line, first by DE Benson Mayowa and then by Peters. On the ensuing AZ drive, a 35-yard Josh Rosen to Christian Kirk pass moved it to the MN 11 and set up a 26-yard Phil Dawson FG that made it 3-0. The Vikings responded with a 6-play, 75-yard scoring drive that ended on Latavius Murray's 21-yard TD run to go up 7-3. On the next play from scrimmage, RB David Johnson fumbled and the Vikings recovered at the AZ31. A Peters sack for minus-7 and a Chandler Jones tackle for a 4-yard loss on consecutive plays forced Minnesota to settle for a 37-yard Dan Bailey FG that made it 10-3. Early in the 2nd, the Vikings faced a 3rd-n-1 at their own 40 when Mayowa pressured Cousins forcing a hurried pass that hit RB Trent Taylor at the MIN47. On the next play, Rosen connected deep down the left sideline with TE Ricky Seals-Jones on a 40-yard completion to the 7. After an incompletion on 3rd-n-goal from the 1, the Cards went for it but Johnson's run was stopped short of the goal line. On the next MN drive, Chandler Jones got to Cousins on a sack forcing a fumble that S Budda Baker scooped up and returned 36 yards for a TD that tied the game at 10. In the first half's final seconds, Bailey hit a 48-yard go-ahead FG to put the Vikes up 3 at intermission.

The Vikings opened the 3rd quarter with TDs on their first two drives. First, Cousins capped a 10-play, 75-yard drive with a 13-yard TD pass to WR Adam Thielen. The Vikings started their next drive at the AZ43 and on the first play, Murray rushed 34 yards to the 9. A play later, Cousins ran it around the right end of a 7-yard TD that made it 27-10. Thielen finished the game with 11 catches for 123 yards while Murray gained 155 rushing yards on 24 attempts. The Cards would add a TD in the 4th when Johnson's 1-yard run ended a 7-play, 69-yard drive. On it, Rosen was 5-5 for 68 yards and Seals-Jones and Larry Fitzgerald each had a pair of catches. Arizona could get no closer and would fall by that 27-17 margin.

STATE FARM STADIUM (62,359)



In a Thursday night match-up in AZ, the Broncos started fast and never looked back. They recorded five takeaways and six different Denver players scored touchdowns. That included a pair of defenders who returned 1st quarter INTs for TDs that contributed to a 35-point 1st half for Denver. The 45-10 victory upheld the Broncos record to 3-4 while the loss dropped the Cards to 1-6 on the season.

The Cardinals' difficulties began almost immediately. On the game's 2nd play from scrimmage, QB Josh Rosen's pass was batted into the air at the line of scrimmage by Denver DE Derek Wolfe; LB Todd Davis hauled it in and returned the INT 20 yards for a TD. Following an Arizona punt, the Broncos offense took the field for the first time and moved from their own 23 to the AZ28 in 5 plays. On a 1st down play from there, WR Emmanuel Sanders took the ball on a reverse and ran to his right before lofting a pass into the end zone that WR Courtland Sutton dove to secure for a TD. Down 14-0, the Cards next drive advanced to the DEN25 thanks to Rosen completions to RB David Johnson, WR Larry Fitzgerald and TE Ricky Seals-Jones. They were stopped on 3rd-n-4 from there and came away with a 43-yard Phil Dawson FG that made it 14-3 with 5:23 in the opening quarter. That was as close as the Cards would get on this night. With just over 2 minutes left in the 1st quarter, the Cards faced a 3rd-n-1 at their own 46. Rosen targeted WR J Nelson who was knocked off his route and the ball was instead intercepted by Denver CB Chris Harris who took it 53 yards for a score. Up 21-3, Denver started its next drive on its own 35 early in the 2nd quarter. On the first play, Case Keenum found a wide-open Sanders deep downfield for a 64-yard TD pass that made it 28-3. The only other points of the 1st half came in the final minute when RB Royce Freeman capped a 15-play, 70-yard drive with his 1-yard run that made it 35-3 at intermission.

The Broncos got the ball to start the 2nd half but CB Patrick Peterson snuffed out that drive with an INT off Keenum, the all-pro CB's 23rd career theft. On the ensuing series, the Cards turned in their best drive of the evening, an 11-play, 63-yard effort that ended when Rosen hit WR Larry Fitzgerald with a 4-yard TD pass. Trailing 35-10, the Cards had another chance to cut into the deficit after forcing a Denver 3-n-out. However, when AZ got the ball back, LB Von Miller forced a Rosen fumble that DE DeMarcus Walker recovered at the AZ43. Two plays later, RB Phillip Lindsay ran 28 yards for a TD that made it 42-10 with 3:23 left in the third. The game's final points came via a 41-yard Brandon McManus FG with 5:35 left in the game that made the final tally 45-10.

CARDINALS 18, 49ERS 15

OCTOBER 28, 2018
STATE FARM STADIUM - (61,923)



The Cardinals closed the first half of the season at home against the 49ers and trailed by 12 in the 4th quarter. But behind rookie QB Josh Rosen and on the shoulders of 15-year vet Larry Fitzgerald, they would rally to score 15 unanswered including the go-ahead TD with 3:4 left. It was Arizona's 8th straight win in the series vs San Fran and made for a successful debut for Byron Leftwich in his first game as offensive coordinator. It marked the first time since 1999 that the Cards overcame a 4th quarter deficit of 12+ points and upheld the team's 2018 record to 6-6. Rosen became the NFL's first rookie QB to overcome a double-digit 4th quarter deficit since Andrew Luck and Russell Wilson both did it in 2012. In the pivotal final quarter Rosen was 12-18 for 150 yards with 2 TDs and 0 INTs (129.4 rating) while Fitzgerald caught 4 passes for 81 yards and a TD, adding another catch on a successful 2-point conversion.

While the game's finish was thrilling, its start was inauspicious for the Cards. Three plays after beginning their 2nd offensive series at their own 5, Rosen was flagged for intentional grounding in the end zone resulting in a safety. Later in the 1st half, AZ embarked on a long drive into San Fran territory. Rosen was 5-7 for 46 yards on the possession that would reach the SF8 and Phil Dawson's 31-yard FG ended the 12-play, 78-yard drive that made it 3-3. With 6:30 to go before halftime, Rosen was intercepted by San Fran S Jaquiski Tartt and the 23-yard return took it to the AZ12. A critical stand by the Cardinal defense ensued. S Budda Baker had a 5-yard tackle for loss on 1st down and DT Robert Nkemdiye tipped a pass at the line on 3rd down to force a 27-yard Robbie Gould FG that put the 49ers back up 5-3 at the half.

Eight minutes into the 3rd quarter, San Fran faced a 3rd-n-6 from its own 45 when C.J. Beathard hit Marquise Goodwin with a short crossing pass that the speedy WR took 55 yards for a TD. At the start of the 4th, the 49ers were threatening inside the 10 but the defense again held them to a short FG. Down 15-3 with 13:33 remaining, the Cards needed a spark. As usual, they got it from Fitzgerald whose 37-yard catch combined with a roughing the passer penalty quickly took it from the AZ27 to the SF13. Two plays later Fitz hauled in career TD #112 with a 13-yarder from Rosen that cut the deficit to 5. After forcing a 49ers punt, AZ took over at its own 17 with 6:52 remaining. That drive would end two minutes later when TE Jermaine Gresham fumbled at the end of a catch and run into SF territory; the Niners recovered at their own 30 with 4:44 to play and up 5. But a 3rd down sack split between Baker and DT Rodney Gunter forced a SF punt, after which the Cards took over at their own 27 with 2:16 left and one timeout. Rosen completed consecutive passes to Fitzgerald (11 & 20 yards) and a 19-yarder to Kirk moved it to the SF23 with 1:30 remaining. With 39 left, AZ faced a 3rd-n-goal from the 9 when Rosen fired to the back of the end zone. Kirk snared it at the end line, absorbed a huge hit, and held on for the go-ahead TD. Fitzgerald's grab on the 2-point try made it 18-15 and was punctuated by his 1st career celebratory spike. The 49ers would advance to the AZ45 before both time and their comeback hopes expired simultaneously.

CHIEFS 26, CARDINALS 14

ARROWHEAD STADIUM - (76,712)



The Cardinals traveled to Kansas City in week 10 to face a formidable Chiefs team that owned the NFL's best record (8-1) and #1 scoring unit (36.3 points/game). They would lead the KC offense 10 points and 103 yards beneath its season averages while limiting QB Patrick Mahomes to his lowest passing yardage total of the year. Early in the 4th, AZ was within 6 points and had the ball at its own 40. However, Chiefs LB Justin Houston sniffed out a Josh Rosen screen pass to David Johnson and his interception set up KC at the AZ31. Four plays later, RB Spencer Ware ran it in from 3 yards out to give the Chiefs a 12-point lead with 10 minutes remaining and the Cards would get no closer. For AZ, Johnson enjoyed his best game of the year with 98 rushing yards and 85 receiving along with a TD in each category. DE Chandler Jones had 2 of Arizona's 5 sacks of Mahomes who had not been taken down more than twice in any game previously. Larry Fitzgerald recorded all 50 of his receiving yards in the 2nd half, enabling him to pass Terrell Owens and move into 2nd place on the NFL's all-time receiving yardage list.

The Chiefs came out of the blocks blazing; on the game's first play, Mahomes hit WR Tyreek Hill with a 38-yard pass down the left sideline that took it to the AZ37. A play later, the two connected on a 37-yard strike down the middle that put KC up 7-0 just 56 seconds into the contest. The Cardinals shook that off and responded with a 12-play, 75-yard drive on which Johnson almost exclusively led the way; he ran 6 times for 24 yards and caught 2 passes for 20 including a TD grab on 3rd-n-goal from the 9. AZ also converted three 3rd downs on the drive and finished the game at 50% (7-14). After that game-tying TD, the Cards attempted a surprise on-side kick but could not corral the ball before it went out of bounds. Despite giving the potent Chiefs offense possession at the AZ 38, the AZ defense was able to limit KC to 3 with a 45-yard Harrison Butker FG. On the next Chiefs drive, Butker added another from 46 yards to put them up 13-7 early in the 2nd. The Chiefs threatened again on their next offensive series. After advancing to the AZ28, the defense pushed them back and they faced a 3rd-n-goal from the 14. On that play, however, Mahomes found Hill with a 14-yard strike in the middle of the end zone that put KC up 20-7 at intermission.

The Cards offense got the ball first coming out of the locker room and they took advantage. After returner T.J. Logan took the 2nd half-opening kickoff 36 yards to the AZ39, Rosen led a 12-play, 61-yard drive on which Johnson touched it 7 times (6 rushes, 1 reception) and the Cards converted on 3rd down three times. The last Johnson carry was a 1-yard TD run that made it 20-14. That 6-point difference remained until the Houston INT of the screen pass in the 4th that led to the subsequent Chiefs TD. Arizona's offense would get the ball back three more times but could not find the end zone.

In a week 11 home game against Oakland, the Cardinals trailed by 6 heading into the final quarter but took the lead with 5:02 remaining thanks to Larry Fitzgerald's 2nd TD catch of the day from Josh Rosen. They could not hold that lead, however, as the Raiders went 63 yards in the final 1:53 and Daniel Carlson's 35-yard game-winner as time expired dropped the Cards to 2-8 on the season.

The Raiders benefited from two 1st half interceptions, each of which they converted into a TD. On the 2nd snap of the game, Oakland CB Gareon Conley intercepted a Rosen pass and returned it 28 yards to the AZ32. Three plays later, Derek Carr found TE Jared Cook open on the right side for a 23-yard TD that made it 7-0. Cards returner T.J. Logan took the ensuing kickoff 32 yards to the AZ36 before the Cards launched a ground-heavy 9-play drive, 7 of which were runs (David Johnson 5-19, Chase Edmonds 2-14). The last play, however, was an 18-yard pass from Rosen to Fitzgerald that tied the game. The next Oakland drive went 3-n-out thanks to a Chandler Jones sack and the Cards then started at their own 35. Two plays later, they faced a 3rd-n-5 from their 41 when Rosen hit Kirk with a pass near the line of scrimmage; Kirk, who was celebrating his 22nd birthday, slipped a tackle and turned the short completion into a 59-yard score down the left sideline, making it 14-7. The 2nd play of the next AZ drive again saw the Raiders record an INT, this one when S Karl Joseph gathered a deflected pass and returned it to midfield. Seven plays later on 3rd-n-3 from the 5, Carr hit WR Brandon LaFell with a TD pass just inside the near pylon that tied the game at 14 midway thru the 2nd quarter. Each offense would possess the ball 3 more times but neither would put points on the board before halftime.

Oakland would score FGs on each of its two 3rd quarter drives. The first was a 49-yarder from Carlson that capped a 7-play, 44-yard drive and put the Raiders up 17-14. Late in the 3rd, they advanced inside the Cards 5 but were thrown for a loss on 3rd-n-goal at the 1; Carlson's 21-yarder put Oakland up 6 heading into the 4th quarter. With 7:39 to play, AZ took over at its own 20. A 10-yard Johnson run on the 1st play was immediately followed by his 53-yard burst down the left sideline to the OAK17. On 3rd-n-10 from there, Rosen threaded it to Kirk who tapped his toes at the 5; on the next snap, Rosen found Fitzgerald for the TD. The AZ defense forced a Raiders 3-n-out but the Cards responded with one of their own. A superb Andy Lee punt forced Oakland to start its own 2 and the Raiders again went 3-n-out. With 2:39 left, AZ took over at the OAK4 but an unnecessary roughness call against TE Jermaine Gresham was very costly and holding penalty by TE Ricky Seals-Jones negated a 57-yard Johnson TD run. The result was a punt, after which the Raiders took over at their own 20 with 1:53 left and no timeouts. On 2nd-n-10 from the OAK31, Carr found WR Marcell Ateman with a 32-yard completion to the AZ27. Two plays later, a 20-yarder to WR Seth Roberts moved it to the 17 setting up Carlson's 35-yard game-winner.

Chargers QB Philip Rivers set an NFL record with 25 consecutive completions to start the game and finished 28-29 for 259 yards and 3 TDs. His 96.8 completion percentage was also an NFL record. After missing the previous 2 games with a calf injury, Cards OT Robert Nkemdiche turned in his best game as a pro, finishing with 2.5 sacks and 8 tackles including 4 for loss. WR Larry Fitzgerald caught his 115th career TD and StubHub Center became the 41st NFL venue in which he recorded a regular season catch.

Arizona received the opening kickoff and marched right down the field. David Johnson ran the ball 4 times for 20 yards and Josh Rosen completed 4 of 4 passes for 56 yards. WR Christian Kirk's 17-yard reception moved it to the LA47 and Fitzgerald ended the game-opening drive with a 25-yard TD catch from Rosen. The Cards defense then forced the LA offense to go 3-n-out when defensive linemen Chandler Jones and Nkemdiche combined on 3rd down sack of Rivers. Kirk returned the ensuing punt 26 yards to the LA44 and that field position led to a 30-yard Phil Dawson FG that made it 10-0. On the 2nd play of the 2nd quarter, Rivers capped an 8-play, 58-yard drive with his 9-yard TD pass to WR Mike Williams that trimmed the AZ lead to 10-7. The next Chargers drive ended when DT Rodney Gunter forced a Rivers fumble that fellow D-lineman Benson Mayowa recovered at the LA35. The Cards failed to convert the takeaway into points as the drive stalled at the 28 and Dawson's 46-yard FG try missed to the left. From there, the Chargers moved 64 yards in 7 plays and Melvin Gordon's 28-yard TD run put them up 14-10 with 6:59 remaining in the half. On Arizona's next play from scrimmage, Rosen's pass to Kirk was picked off by LA safety Derwin James giving the ball to the Chargers at the AZ31. Four plays later, Gordon ran it in from 5 yards out to put LA up 21-10 with 4:16 remaining. Following a Cards three-run-out, LA took over at its own 20 with 1:45 remaining and 3 timeouts. That was just enough time for the Chargers to move 80 yards in 10 plays and with :08 left, Williams caught his 2nd TD pass of the game — this one a 2-yard toe tapper that made it 28-10 at intermission.

The 3rd quarter was controlled almost entirely by the Chargers. They had the ball only twice but each drive consisted of 10+ plays and 70+ yards and together combined 13:03. The first ended with Keenan Allen's 3-yard TD catch, the other a 2-yard run from RB Austin Ekeler's on the quarter's final play. Up 42-10 after 3, Rivers was removed and the game's only remaining score came via Badgley's 31-yard FG with 3:25 left. With the win, Los Angeles improved to 8-3 while the Cardinals fell to 2-9 on the season.

CARDINALS 20, PACKERS 17

DECEMBER 2, 2018
LAMBEAU FIELD - (77,234)



On a cold, windy and snowy December afternoon in Green Bay, few gave AZ a chance of upsetting a Packers team that had not lost at home in 2018 and was fighting to remain in the playoff picture. The Cards entered with a decimated offensive line and had not won in Green Bay since 1949 while Aaron Rodgers entered the game with a 16-1 December home record. But thanks to key contributions from multiple young players and a game-changing grab from a future Hall of Famer, the Cards pulled off the improbable victory.

The game's first six possessions ended in punts but early in the 2nd quarter, Jaire Alexander's 24-yard punt return set the Packers up at the AZ35. Five plays later, they went for it on 4th-n-4 at the AZ13 and Rodgers found Davante Adams in the back of the end zone for the game's first score. The Cards offense needed to answer and it did. Josh Rosen led an 11-play, 75-yard drive that rookie RB Chase Edmonds ended with his first career TD, a 6-yard run that came a play after an apparent Edmonds TD run was reversed by replay. Twice on the drive, AZ converted key 3rd-n-7 plays, first with a 12-yarder to Larry Fitzgerald and then a 21-yard completion to rookie WR Trent Sherfield. With the game tied at 7, the Packers took over at their own 31 with 4:35 to go in the half. They proceeded to go 55 yards in 14 plays and Mason Crosby's 32-yard FG with 0:15 remaining put Green Bay up 10-7.

The 2nd half started much like the 1st as the teams traded punts on the initial 4:25. Midway thru the 3rd quarter, the Cards took over at their own 13 before back-to-back plays from rookie WR Christian Kirk moved it to the GB27; first he took a jet sweep 23 yards and then hauled in a pass down the right sideline for 37. That helped set-up a 44-yard FG from Zane Gonzalez in his Cardinals debut. After a 3-n-out from the GB offense, AZ's next drive started at its own 35 with the game tied at 10. On the 1st play, Rosen scrambled for a 33-yard pick-up to the GB32 and on the next play, Edmonds' 29-yard run took it to the 3. AZ then went up 17-10 when Edmonds ran it in from 8 yards out. GB would tie it with 5:26 remaining as RB Aaron Jones capped an 11-play, 95-yard drive with his 8-yard TD run. After that game-tying score, AZ took over at its own 25 with just over 5 minutes remaining. A sack on 1st down, a fumbled snap and near INT on 2nd and a delay penalty, resulted in AZ facing a 3rd-n-23 at its own 12. On that play, Rosen took a shotgun snap, was flushed to his right and while running to escape the rush, lofted it downfield where Fitzgerald made an incredible, diving grab in front of the Packers bench to pick up 32 yards. Five David Johnson runs picked up 25 yards and after advancing to the GB26, Gonzalez drilled a 44-yarder to put AZ up 20-17 with 1:41 left. The ensuing GB drive started at its own 25. Rodgers completed 5-10 passes for 33 yards and scrambled for 11 to set up a 49-yard FG try that Crosby pushed right as time expired.

With the win, AZ improved to 3-9 and snapped a 3-game losing streak. The Packers fell to 4-7-1 and shortly after the game announced they had relieved head coach Mike McCarthy of his duties.

Points were at a premium when the Lions and Cardinals met in week 14 in Arizona. Just 3 were scored in the 1st half and the game's only offensive TD came with 4 minutes remaining in the 4th quarter. But Detroit came up with a defensive score late in the 3rd quarter that was pivotal in the outcome. Arizona's defense limited the Lions to 218 total net yards and just 96 net passing yards; however, a 75-yard Detroit TD drive after the Cardinals had cut it to 7 midway thru the 4th quarter proved to be the back-breaker. Cards WR Larry Fitzgerald was held without a reception in the 1st half but tallied 5 for 55 yards in the 2nd. The first of those moved him past Jerry Rice and gave him more catches with one team than any player in NFL history.

On the game's opening drive, the Lions advanced to the AZ34. On 1st down from there, a pass play to RB LeGarrette Blount ended when he was tackled by Cards S Budda Baker who also stripped him of the ball and recovered it himself at the AZ30. After that drive, neither team crossed midfield again in the 1st quarter but the Lions threatened early in the 2nd. After reaching the AZ36, Matt Prater's 47-yard FG put them up 3-0. On the next drive, the Cardinals faced a 3rd-n-9 from their own 36 when Rosen hit rookie WR Trent Sherfield with a 19-yard completion to the DET45 and a 15-yard facemask penalty tagged on at the end of the play took it to the 30. However, AZ came away with no points as Zane Gonzalez's 54-yard FG attempt hit off the left upright and the Lions led 3-0 at intermission.

On its 2nd drive of the 3rd quarter, the Cardinals offense got some momentum going. On consecutive plays, Rosen completed passes to Sherfield (12 yards), Fitzgerald (14) and JJ Nelson (16) to move the ball to the DET40. On 3rd-n-14 at the 44, Rosen attempted a pass to Sherfield on an out route at the right sideline but CB Darius Slay stepped in front of it at the 33 and took it back for a TD. Rosen and the Cards shook that off quickly. On the ensuing drive, they moved 62 yards to the DET4 but could not put it in the end zone and Gonzalez's 22-yard FG trimmed the Lions lead to 10-3 with 8:14 left. That was as close as the Cards would get. On the next drive, the Lions went 75 yards in 7 plays; 33 of the yards came on penalties while 42 came on seven Zach Zenner runs, the last of which was a 1-yard TD. Down 17-3, the Cards offense would get the ball back two more times but was not able to produce points on either.

The victory improved the Lions season record to 5-8 while the Cardinals fell to 3-10. After two more starting offensive linemen went on IR earlier in the week, the Cardinals started their 9th different offensive line combination of the year and 7th in as many weeks. Injuries at WR also forced the Cards to go with two undrafted rookie free agents among the 4 they dressed for the game. Sherfield was one of them and recorded a game-high 77 yards on 5 catches.

In week 15 at Atlanta, the Cardinals jumped to an early lead with a TD on their first drive. But after that it was all Falcons who went to score 40 unanswered points en route to a 40-14 victory. With it, the Falcons improved to 5-9 while Arizona fell to 3-11 on the season. Both offenses ran 65 plays but Atlanta outgained the Cards in total net yards, 435-253. WR Larry Fitzgerald led all receivers with 7 catches for 82 yards.

The Cardinals struck first in the game with a TD on their initial offensive possession. On that drive's 3rd play, QB Josh Rosen hit RB David Johnson deep down the right sideline for a 40-yard completion to the ATL12. On 3rd-n-15 at the ATL17, a 15-yard Johnson reception picked up the first down and a play later he punched it in from a yard out to make it 7-0. After Arizona's defense forced a Falcons 3-n-out, the offense took over at its own 43 but on the 2nd play of that drive, the game's momentum shifted dramatically. Rosen's screen pass attempt to Johnson was tipped into the air in the line of scrimmage by DE Vic Beasley and grabbed by LB Deion Jones who returned it 41 yards for a game-tying TD. On the 1st play of Atlanta's next offensive possession, RB Tevin Coleman ran 65 yards to the AZ27 but the defense forced them to settle for a 22-yard Matt Bryant FG that gave ATL a 10-7 lead. On their next drive, the Cards faced a 3rd-n-8 at their own 40 when DT Grady Jarrett hit Rosen's arm as he headed to throw, forcing a fumble that CB Brian Poole recovered at the AZ34. On the next snap, WR Julio Jones took a Matt Ryan pass 22 yards to the 2. That led to a 1-yard Ryan TD on a QB sneak that made it 17-7 early in the 2nd quarter. Later in the quarter, Bryant's 33-yarder capped an 11-play, 65-yard Falcons drive and made it 20-7. With just over a minute before halftime, a Poole interception gave ATL possession at its own 29. Six plays later, Jones made a diving TD grab in the end zone that made it 26-7 at intermission.

The Falcons increased their lead to 33-7 with 5:39 to go in the 3rd quarter on Coleman's 43-yard TD run. Early in the 4th, Ryan capped a 12-play, 76-yard scoring drive with his 5-yard TD pass to WR Justin Hardy that made it 40-7. Shortly thereafter, back-up QB Mike Glennon came in relief of Rosen and in his first series, led a 13-play, 64-yard drive he ended with a 7-yard scoring pass to Trent Sherfield, the first career TD catch for the Cards undrafted rookie free agent WR.

In their week 16 home finale, the Cardinals fell to the Rams, 31-9. Los Angeles led 21-9 at halftime after producing lengthy touchdown drives on three consecutive possessions. The Cardinals 1st half was highlighted by WR Larry Fitzgerald who did what he has so often done, catching 5 passes for 41 yards. He also did something he had never done in his 15-year career: threw a TD pass. The Rams accumulated 269 rushing yards on 41 attempts on the afternoon. That effort was led by RB C.J. Anderson who had signed with the team just 5 days earlier. Starting in place of an injured Todd Gurley, Anderson rushed 26 times for 167 yards and a TD. With the victory, LA improved to 12-3 on the season and snapped a 2-game losing streak while the Cardinals fell to 3-12.

The Rams offense got the ball to start the game and advanced to the AZ40. However, the drive ended there when DE Benson Mayowa pressured and stripped QB Jared Goff, forcing a fumble that SLB Deone Bucannon recovered and returned to the LA41. That turnover led to a 36-yard Zane Gonzalez FG 8 plays later that put AZ up 3-0. That lead was short-lived as LA embarked upon a 7-play, 75-yard drive that ended with a 4-yard TD run on an end-around by WR Robert Woods. On their next possession, the Rams went 84 yards in 11 plays and Goff ended it with his scoring run from a yard out. On the ensuing possession, the Cards were aided by the legs of QB Josh Rosen whose runs of 14 and 16 yards twice moved the chains and were part of a 4-49 rushing 1st half for the rookie signal-caller. That helped Arizona advance from its own 25 to the LA35. On 1st down from there, Fitzgerald stepped off the line to receive a backwards pass from Rosen. He then rolled to his right before lofting a perfect pass that RB David Johnson hauled in for a 32-yard touchdown. It was Fitzgerald's 2nd career completion and first TD pass as well as the first-ever by a Cardinals WR. He also became the oldest WR in NFL history to complete a TD pass. That score narrowed the deficit to 14-9 after the PAT was unsuccessful but LA would soon change that. The Rams' next drive saw them go 75 yards in 12 plays and Anderson's 4-yard TD run made it 21-9. In the final minute of the half, each team missed a lengthy FG - Gonzalez from 54 yards and Greg Zuerlein from 57 - and LA went into the halftime locker room leading 21-9.

Zuerlein's 21-yard FG early in the 3rd made it 24-9. The Rams then appeared to lengthen their lead with a 27-yard fumble return TD by CB Nickell Robey-Coleman but instant replay reversed the call from a fumble to an incomplete pass. The game's only remaining points came with 9:19 to play when Woods scored his second TD of the day on a 39-yard TD pass from Goff.

In the 2018 regular season finale, AZ tied the game at 24 on Zane Gonzalez's 55-yard FG with 1:49 remaining but Sebastian Janikowski's 33-yarder as time expired won for Seattle. The Seahawks had clinched a playoff spot the week before and secured the #5 seed with the win while the Cards fell to 3-13.

On their opening drive of the game, the Seattle offense advanced to the AZ49 but on 3rd-3 from there, AZ CB David Amerson stepped in front of a Russell Wilson pass and returned the INT 25 yards to the SEA28. That takeaway led to a 36-yard Zane Gonzalez FG that put the Cards up 3-0. After a Seattle 3-n-out, the Cards faced a 4th-1-n at their own 48 on their next possession. However, they turned it over on downs when Rosen's pass fell incomplete. Six plays later, on 3rd-3 from the 29, Wilson found WR Tyler Lockett open down the right side for a TD completion that put the hosts up 7-3. On the 6th play of the next Cardinals drive, they faced 3rd-5 at their 41 when LB Jacob Martin sacked Rosen forcing a fumble that DE Frank Clark recovered at the AZ34. Four plays later, RB Chris Carson ran it in from 7 yards out to make it 14-3 Seattle. Momentum then shifted as the Cards defense sent the Seahawks 3-n-out on their next 3 drives, each of which ended with 3rd down sacks. An Antoine Bethea 3rd down takedown of Wilson forced a Seahawks punt from deep in their own territory. LB Dennis Gardeck deflected the ensuing punt, which traveled just 21 yards and gave AZ possession at the SEA27. Three plays later, Rosen threw a 15-yard TD pass to Larry Fitzgerald, the 116th of the star WR's career. The next SEA drive ended similarly as DT Rodney Gunter's 3rd down sack of Wilson forced another punt. This one was returned by Pharoah Cooper 45 yards to the SEA21. The ensuing AZ drive lost yardage but Zane Gonzalez salvaged it by hitting a 50-yard FG that cut the lead to 14-13. DE Chandler Jones sacked Wilson on the next 3rd down allowing the AZ offense another scoring chance before the half. Two catches by AZ TE John Phillips picked up 29 yards and helped take it to the SEA 30, but a Seahawks sack with under :10 remaining, and the Cards out of timeouts, resulted in time expiring.

The second half opened with the teams trading punts on the first four possessions. Midway through the 3rd, Seattle extended its lead following a 98-yard drive that was capped by a 17-yard Mike Davis TD run. AZ appeared to have given the Cards the lead on the drive when Jones sacked Wilson at the SEA3 and forced a fumble that was recovered by CB Patrick Peterson and returned 3 yards for a TD. However, a curious defensive holding penalty negated the score and Carson burst through the right side on the very next play for a 61-yard run. After AZ punted on its ensuing possession, the special teams unit came up with another big play on the next SEA drive. A 3-n-out resulted in a Seahawks punt that was blocked by AZ DE Cameron Malveaux and recovered in the endzone for a TD by Gardeck. A successful 2-point conversion run by RB David Johnson tied the game at 21 as the 3rd quarter came to a close. With just under 9:00 remaining in the 4th, SEA retook the lead on a 32-yard Janikowski FG. AZ responded with a 9-play drive that reached the SEA37 but a Rosen sack forced a long FG attempt. Gonzalez connected on the 55-yarder, the longest FG of his career, once again tying the game. SEA began its final drive with 1:49 remaining in the 4th and drove 60 yards on 8 plays to set up Janikowski's game-winning 33-yard FG.
