BIDWILL RECEIVES "IN THE ARENA AWARD" FROM THE MCCAIN INSTITUTE

In May, Cardinals owner Michael Bidwill received the 2025 "In The Arena Award" from the McCain Institute at the organization's signature annual event, the Sedona Forum, at the Enchantment Resort in Sedona, AZ.

Now in its fourth year, Civics Matters Arizona is the Cardinals civic education program that annually provides a life-changing experience for more than 275 students from Arizona high schools. The students meet with elected officials, experience historical sites and get a behind-the-scenes look at how government works in a way that is both educational and fun.

- Has started 62-of-75 games (61 regular season; 1 postseason) he has appeared in during his five seasons (2020-24) with the Cardinals after joining the team as a free agent in 2020.
- His 161 starts during the regular season have come at left tackle (99), right tackle (60), eligible offensive lineman (one) and tight end (one). Of his 63 starts with Arizona (including postseason), 56 have come at right tackle, six at left tackle and one as an eligible offensive lineman.
- Helped block for the Cardinals offense to run for 2,451 yards and 18 TDs on 463 carries (5.3 avg.) in 2024, the third-most rushing yards and the highest rushing average in team history. Also part of an offense line that allowed just 30 sacks, the fifth-fewest in the NFL in 2024.

Also helped Cardinals offense post the second-most total net yards (6,352) and score the second-most points (449) in franchise history.
- Named the Week 10 NFLPA Community MVP in 2022 after donating \$5,000 to the United Food Bank so he and his fellow linemen could host a drive-thru food distrubtion event that fed 200 families in need at Eisenhower Center for Innovation in Mesa, AZ. It was the fifth time that Beachum has been named NFLPA Community MVP since the NFLPA launched the program in 2014, the most for any player since the award's inception.
- Selected as the Arizona Cardinals/Walter Payton NFL Man of the Year in 2021 after previously being named the New York Jets/Walter Payton NFL Man of the Year in 2018. The 2018 United Way Hometown Hero, Beachum currently serves as a task force member for the Players Coalition.

2012 graduates of Annette Caldwell Simmons School of Education and Human Development ... started all 12 games during his senior season, blocking for an offense that ranked third in the league in passing ... served as SMU's Student-Athlete Advisory Committee (SAAC) President ... as a junior in 2010, started all 14 games and was named first-team Conference USA after blocking for an offense that totaled a school-record 3,861 passing yards and added 1,943 yards on the ground ... as a sophomore in 2009, started all 13 games and blocked for an SMU offense that passed for a then school-record 3,666 yards, scored a school-record 380 points and rolled up a school-record 5,093 yards of total offense ... one of 12 student-athletes to receive the fall C-USA Spirit of Service Award ... named to Dave Campbell's Texas

Football's All-Texas Team ... as a freshman in 2008, started all 12 games at left tackle and blocked for an offense that threw for a school record-tying 29 TDs and ranked 17th in the nation in passing offense ... redshirted in 2007.

Attended Mexia (TX) High School where he was named first-team All-District 19-3A as a senior and second-team all-district as a junior ... also a Super Cen-Tex player and All-Academic pick ... allowed only one sack in 2006 as a senior ... also starred on the basketball team, where he averaged a double-double in his hoops career ... earned undergraduate degree in Economics and a master's in Liberal Studies.

CARDINALS IN THE COMMUNITY

Offensive Lineman **Kelvin Beachum** is in his sixth season with the Cardinals after previously playing in New York, Jacksonville and Pittsburgh. One common theme for Beachum throughout his NFL career has been his community impact across the globe.

Beachum is a two-time Walter Payton NFL Man of the Year nominee after he was honored by the Cardinals in 2021 following his first selection with the Jets in 2018. He was the first and only five-time NFLPA Community MVP winner (2016-2019, 2022) and the 2018 United Way Hometown Hero. Beachum also currently serves as a task force member for the Players Coalition where he focuses on education equity.

Closing the "digital divide" is of particular significance to Beachum and was the topic of an NFL.com op-ed that he penned where he expressed concern for minority students in underserved communities lacking access to the Internet and technology resources. During the 2021 season, he donated over 40 laptops and tablets to Arizona schools to address those concerns and help bridge that divide.

In October of 2021, he announced the NFL's Player Coalition's donation of \$50,000 to help install new internet access points for 25 school campuses in the Ector County Independent School District in West Texas, and in 2020, he made a \$15,000 donation through Donors Choose to fund 34 projects across Arizona school districts to support STEM education resources, diverse books for classroom libraries and clean water access.

Providing access to clean water has long been an important cause to Beachum as well. Last season, he supported World Vision and the organization's goal to ensure access to clean water for all through the NFL's My Cause, My Cleats initiative. The collaboration was especially meaningful as the cleats were designed by a student at the Mesa Youth Creative Agency, a nonprofit organization that provides teens with part-time employment and helps fuel their passion for arts.



During the 2024 offseason, Beachum personally donated \$30,000 and fundraised another \$15,000 to build three water wells in Africa through World Vision to provide clean water access. In March of last year, he and his wife traveled to Zambia to see the functioning water wells and their impact in the community.

During his time with the New York Jets, he donated \$10,000 to the United Way of Newark to provide 100,000 water bottles to residents in need following the Newark Water Crisis in 2019. During a November game at MetLife Stadium, he organized a 1-for-1 match challenge. For every water bottle sold, one would be donated to the United Way of Greater Newark. The initiative generated a donation of 26,000 water bottles to families with compromised water.

Beachum is also passionate about ending hunger and addressing food insecurity. A monthly volunteer at the United Food Bank, he has ensured that the Cardinals rookie class has gotten involved with the Phoenix community each of the last two seasons. Last November, he and Paris Johnson Jr. lead the 2024 rookie class in handing out turkeys, fresh produce and other food items to over 250 Phoenix area families. Beachum also personally donated \$5,000 towards the cause. The year prior he hosted a food packing event at the United Food Bank in September where rookies and players in their first season with the team helped him serve their new home. In November of 2023, he again partnered with the United Food Bank for a holiday turkey drive that provided over 230 Arizona families with Thanksgiving dinner.

Beachum hosted an event in May of 2022 with some of his teammates where he partnered with Safeway/Albertsons to pack meals and donate 200,000 meals in Mesa. During the 2023 offseason, he hosted a food distribution for 500 families in his hometown (Mexia, TX) with the Central Texas Food Bank and HEB with each household receiving 75 pounds of food.

Working as Ambassador at Large for the Central Texas Food Bank, Beachum created a monthly mobile food pantry to feed families in his hometown of Mexia, and in 2017, helped raise \$100,000 while matching that contribution. In 2019, he hosted a large scale, drive-thru food distribution in Mexia in partnership with HEB and the Central Texas Food Bank that fed over 3,000 families. Beachum has contributed his time and financial resources to the Houston Food Bank, Pittsburgh Food Bank, Feeding Northeast Florida Food Bank and the Food Bank of New York City (Harlem) in addition to his current work with United Food Bank in Arizona.

Beachum celebrated World Food Day 2018 with a fan match initiative that raised \$75,000 for the above food banks, which helped serve more than 327,000 meals in his home state and every market he's played in. In 2015, he also partnered with the Bread for the

World organization with the goal of ending hunger in the U.S. and around the world by lobbying Congress to improve summer food programs for school children and pass the Global Food Security Act in 2016.

In 2016, Beachum created "Kelvin Konnects," a STEAM initiative and program designed to increase minority access to careers within the Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts and Mathematics disciplines. As part of that program, Beachum adopted the Barack Obama Male Leadership Academy in Dallas. This adoption included hosting a speaker series with industry leaders, local and federally elected officials, providing STEAM programming and curriculum support, funding field trips and college visits, and providing teacher development opportunities.

In 2020, the Beachum family hosted a food and Christmas tree donation for 100 families at Sirrine Elementary School in Chandler, AZ through a partnership with Lowe's and the United Food Bank. In 2021, he partnered with World Vision to provide 500 backpacks filled with school supplies to Sun Valley Academy in Phoenix. In 2023, Beachum again supported students going back to school by donating backpacks, books and other school supplies to the Mesa Public Schools District.

In his capacity as a professional speaker, Beachum has delivered keynote addresses at the IT Senior Management Forum Conference, Walsh Hunger Summit at the Pro Football Hall of Fame in Canton and Texas Project Lead the Way Summit. He has also contributed to numerous speaker series and panels on topics such as leadership, diversity and inclusion, web3 and crypto and technology. He also currently sits on the Advisory Board Committee for the U.S. Olympic and Paralympic Foundation.

Beachum and his wife, Jessica, are avid art collectors. Their "Beachum Family Collection" has loaned pieces to museums across the country. In February 2022 and May 2023, they opened two exhibitions featuring selections from their collection at SMU and Baylor, respectively. The two campuses are the alma maters of Kelvin and Jessica Beachum. In May 2023, he was awarded the "In the Arena award" from the McCain Institute at the Sedona Forum for his humanitarian work worldwide.





CARDINALS IN THE COMMUNITY

Quarterback **Jacoby Brissett** enters his first season with the Cardinals in 2025. He has played for five other NFL franchises during his career, each of which he left a lasting impact on.

In March of 2023, Brissett on behalf of the Players Coalition donated \$30,000 to elementary schools throughout his home state of Florida. The donation provided support to over 100 qualifying low-income families and provided students with free computers and two years of tech support.

Brissett's character and charitable efforts earned him the Colts Walter Payton NFL Man of the Year nomination in 2020. Leading up to his selection, he attended every Colts Community Monday event in addition to promoting voting advocacy and societal change on

his own. His community work resulted in 100% of the team registering to vote for the 2020 elections. He also again collaborated with the Players Coalition to donate \$100,000 to public schools in Palm Beach and Indianapolis for Internet hotspots for students utilizing virtual educational methods at home during the COVID-19 pandemic.

Brissett also helped lead the way for the Colts Breaking Barriers initiative — which supports organizations and efforts that battle systemic racism and reduce barriers to opportunity with a focus on racial equity, economic and educational mobility, community/police relations, voter education and criminal justice reform.

As part of his own social change efforts, Brissett annually organizes a community bicycle ride called "Start the Cycle" in his hometown of West Palm Beach, FL in hopes to unify and create open dialogue between community members and local law enforcement. The event first began in 2020 and features hundreds of bicycles, backpacks and meals donated to local children.

In addition to his regular weekly community service with the Colts on Mondays, Brissett was a regular at the team's tentpole community events during his time in Indianapolis. In October of 2019, he hosted the team's first ever "haunted runway" where Colts players modeled different costumes for and celebrated Halloween with kids who are living with a life-threatening condition. Each December, he would partake in caroling at Riley Hospital for Children to spread holiday cheer to patients.

Throughout his NFL career, the two-time team captain has served as a leader both on the field and in the communities he lived in. From meal distributions to police relations to cancer awareness, Brissett has shared the love and used his platform to champion an array of deserving causes.

COLLEGE CAREER:

In 2024, RB James Conner, S Budda Baker and WR Michael Wilson were honored by the Arizona Chapter of the Pro Football Writers of America. Conner and Baker were co-winners of the Lloyd Herberg MVP Award for their outstanding performance last year and Wilson earned the Steve Schoenfeld Good Guy Award for his cooperation and insight in dealing with the media.

The MVP award was named after Lloyd Herberg, former Cardinals beat writer for the Arizona Republic. Herberg covered the Cardinals from 1988, when the team moved to Arizona, until his death in May of 1994. Herberg fought a courageous battle with cancer. The good guy award is named after another former Arizona Republic writer. Schoenfeld covered the Cardinals and the NFL for the Republic from 1988 to 2000. A former national president of the PFWA, Schoenfeld was killed by hit-and-run driver in October of 2000.

Played nine seasons (2008-16) in Arizona before spending the previous eight seasons with the Jaguars (2017-19), Ravens (2020-22), Falcons (2023) and Dolphins (2024). Returned to Arizona when he signed a one-year contract on 4/10/25.
- À six-time Pro Bowl (2014-15; 2017-20) selection, Campbell was named to the NFL All-Decade Team of the 2010s by the Pro Football Hall of Fame. He was named first-team All-Pro as a defensive end and second-team All-Pro as a defensive tackle in 2017 and has been selected as a team captain five times in his career (2014-15, 2018-19, 2024) with three different teams.
- Has won numerous community and off-the-field awards during his career, including the 2019 NFL Walter Payton Man of the Year, the 2023 NFLPA Alan Page Community Award, the 2022 Art Rooney Sportsmanship Award and the 2019 Bart Starr Award. He was the Cardinals Walter Payton NFL Man of the Year nominee in both 2011 and 2014.
- In his first 17 NFL seasons (2008-2024), he appeared in 261 games (242 starts) during the regular season with 908 tackles (643 solo), 110.5 sacks, 266 QB hits, 187 tackles for loss, 63 passes defensed, 18 forced fumbles, 13 fumble recoveries (three returned for TDs), three INTs and nine blocked FGs. He has also appeared in 15 postseason contests (10 starts) and totaled 35 tackles, nine QB hits and three passes defensed.
- Entering 2025, his 242 career starts are the most among active NFL players and his 261 career games played are the second-most among active players (TE Marcedes Lewis-285).
- Campbell's 110.5 sacks are third-most among active NFL players behind only Von Miller (129.5) and Cameron Jordan (121.5) while his 266 QB hits and 187 tackles for loss lead all active players. Campbell's 908 career tackles easily lead all active NFL defensive linemen.
- Has earned Defensive Player of the Week honors four times (2012-Wk 2; 2017-Wk 1; 2019-Wk 3; 2020-Wk 6) and Special Teams Player of the Week twice (2009-Wk 2; 2022-Wk 14).
- In his initial nine-year run with the Cardinals (2008-16), played 138 games (120 starts) during the regular season and totaled 501 tackles, 56.5 sacks, 124 QB hits, 107 tackles for loss, eight forced fumbles, eight fumble recoveries (one returned for a TD), three INTs and 42 passes defensed.
- His 56.5 sacks with the Cardinals rank third on the franchise all-time list behind only Chandler Jones (71.5) and Freddie Joe Nunn (66.5).
- With the Cardinals from 2009-14, he established a franchise record with six consecutive seasons of at least 50 tackles and 6.0 sacks. He remains the only defensive lineman in franchise history to record at least 6.0 sacks in seven different seasons.
- Campbell (63) joins Saints DE Cameron Jordan (65) as the only active defensive linemen with 60+ career passes defensed. His nine blocked FG attempts lead all active players and are tied for the third-most in the NFL dating back to the 1970 merger.
- He has played at least 16 games in a season 11 times in his career and has never played fewer than 12 games during any season.
- Between 2009-19, he had 40+ tackles and 5.0+ sacks in 11 consecutive seasons. The 2024 season marked the 14th time in his career and third straight year with at least 5.0 sacks in a season.
- He has recorded double-digit quarterback hits in 15 seasons, including in each of the last 14 years. Campbell has also posted 10+ tackles for loss in a season 12 times in his career.
- Started all 17 games at DT with the Dolphins last season and totaled 52 tackles, 5.0 sacks, 12 QB hits, 12 tackles for loss, five passes defensed and a forced fumble. He started all 17 games for the Falcons in 2023 and had 56 tackles, 6.5 sacks, one forced fumble and one fumble recovery.

Played 36 career games at Miami (25 starts) before entering the NFL Draft following his junior season ... finished his career with 158 tackles, 19.5 sacks, 39 tackles for a loss and 30 QB pressures ... two-time All-ACC selection ... started all 12 games at right DE as a junior, finishing the season with 50 tackles and a team-high 12 tackles for a loss; recorded 6.0 sacks and 19 QB pressures while forcing two fumbles, recovering two fumbles and recording

his first career INT ... started 12 of 13 games at right DE as a sophomore and was named the team's MVP; ranked second on the team with 10.5 sacks, led the ACC with 20 tackles for loss (fourth best in the nation) and added a team-high 16 QB pressures and three fumble recoveries, while totaling 80 tackles, six behind team leader Brandon Meriweather; had a streak of seven consecutive games with at least one sack, the second-longest streak in school history ... appeared in all 12 games with one start as a freshman, totaling 35 tackles, 2.5 sacks, eight QB pressures and 5.5 tackles for a loss.

PERSONAL:

First name pronounced "cuh-LAY-us" ... attended South (Aurora, CO) High School and was a two-time All-State pick as a DE as a junior and senior while also playing TE as a senior ... established a state record with 58.0 sacks over his four seasons with 38.0 sacks coming in his final two seasons ... as a senior, recorded 19.0 sacks, 188 tackles and two INTs on defense and added 38 receptions for 412 yards and four TDs as a TE ... as a junior, recorded five TDs off of blocked kicks and fumble recoveries ... an all-around athlete, also garnered All-State accolades in basketball as a junior and competed in track and field, qualifying for the state meet in both discus and shot put in 2003 ... while in seventh grade, both his parents lost their jobs as accountants and the family lived out of a homeless shelter for eight months ... younger brother, Jared, was a safety at Miami (FL) and spent time with the Cardinals in training camp in 2011 ... his older brother, Ciare, was a DB at Colorado State from 2004-05 and his other brother, Raj, played football at Butte and Orange County Junior Colleges and was a receiver at Adams State ... he majored in Sociology.

CARDINALS IN THE COMMUNITY

Defensive lineman **Calais Campbell** returns to Arizona for his 18th NFL season and 10th with the Cardinals. During his time in the NFL, Campbell has established himself as one of the league's leading philanthropists through his work with the franchises he played for as well as through his "CRC Foundation."

In 2019 with Jacksonville, Campbell was named the Walter Payton NFL Man of the Year. He was nominated for the award twice previously by the Cardinals in 2011 and 2014. Campbell also won the Alan Page Community Award in 2023, the Art Rooney Sportsmanship award in 2022 and the Bart Starr Award in 2019.

Calais founded the "CRC Foundation" in 2010, named after his late father, Charles Richard Campbell. The foundation aims to help their communities reach their full potential by investing in youth mentorship and education and providing resources to help every person with the opportunity to live out their dreams.

In December of 2024, he hosted the 16th annual "Christmas with Calais" holiday shopping event, sharing a meal and giving 50 Boys & Girls Club youth a shopping spree.

Earlier last year, he joined Dolphins teammates Terron Armstead and Jaylen Waddle in cohosting and funding a holiday shopping event for local youth from Big Brothers Big Sisters and other South Florida nonprofits.

After recording his 100th career sack in 2023 with the Falcons, Campbell launched the "100 Sack Give Back" initiative, where he donated \$100,000 across 100 teachers, 25 in each of the cities he played professional football in at the time – Phoenix, Jacksonville, Baltimore and Atlanta. Each teacher received \$500 worth of school supplies and \$500 to purchase additional resources for their classroom. In addition to his initial donation, Campbell donated a total of \$20,000 to teachers in Denver, where he went to high school, and Miami, where he went to college.

In May of 2022 through his CRC Foundation, Campbell donated \$20,000 during Mental Health Awareness Month to provide 12 Baltimore teens with three months of therapy sessions as part of strategic initiatives to expand access to mental health care.



While with Baltimore in 2021, Campbell joined multiple team initiatives including a campaign against opioid addition, voting advocacy and fundraising for COVID-19 relief. He also donated \$30,000 to his alma mater – South High School in Denver – to fund the process of switching its nickname from the "Rebels" to the "Ravens" from new uniforms, gym flooring and school signage.

In 2020, Campbell led multiple initiatives addressing racism including a virtual discussion with a Baltimore area high school as well



as partnering with Old Spice to host a discussion on the film "Black Boys" with local students. That November, he launched the "Charles Richard Campbell Lend-A-Hand Fund" to assist select Baltimore County households with emergency bill assistance.

He instituted "Campbell's Season of Giving" in 2019 during which he donated \$1,000 for every Jaguars win, \$5,000 for each of his sacks and \$2,000 for every tackle for loss. Campbell finished the 2019 season with 6.5 sacks and 10 tackles for loss amassing a total donation of over \$50,000.

In June 2019, he hosted 250 children at the Calais Campbell JaxPAL Youth Football STEM Camp. At the camp, Campbell served as an on-field instructor and helped promote the importance of STEM education.

Upon joining Jacksonville in 2017, he established the "CRC Book Club" through his foundation. As part of the program he made semi-weekly youth mentorship trips to local middle schools. Campbell also partnered with the Kids Hope Alliance to make appearances at Northeast Florida schools to discuss social justice issues.

Campbell took home the NFLPA Community MVP award for the first time in October of 2016 after passing out 300 turkeys and Thanksgiving dinners to those in need at South Pointe Elementary in Phoenix. Afterwards, he participated in the school's turkey trot at a local park.

In 2015, Campbell donated \$1.6 million to his alma mater, the University of Miami, to establish the Calais Campbell Football Defensive Lineman Endowment and provide a full scholarship for a defensive lineman.

Campbell has hosted a variety of events through his foundation, including an annual golf tournament and Thanksgiving turkey drive that feeds approximately 500 families. Campbell also represented the Cardinals in 2014 and 2015 as part of the NFL's "PLAY 60" movement at the White House for the annual Easter Egg Roll on the South Lawn that was hosted by First Lady Michelle Obama. As one of eight children, Calais has continued to award two college scholarships each year to students from large families through his foundation.

During his first stint with the Cardinals, Campbell led a wide range of community events. In partnership with the Valley of the Sun United Way, 2015 was the first year of "Calais' Book Club," a month-long reading program for seventh graders at Long View Elementary School.

In 2015, Calais was named the Byron Whizzer White nominee from the Cardinals, the highest community service honor presented by the NFLPA. That followed up him being presented the Pop Warner Football Humanitarian Award in May of 2015 for his athletic achievements and work in the community.

Calais established the "Cheer for a Cause" program. At every Cardinals home game in 2013-15, CRC Foundation representatives selected one fan wearing a Campbell jersey as a winner. Winners received a donation to a charity of their choice from Calais, with the amount dependent on his game performance. (The CRC Foundation donated \$500 for a team win, \$1,000 for a one-sack game, and culminates with \$15,000 for a five-sack game).

Campbell also partnered with United Way and the NFL as the Cardinals spokesperson to promote reading and the importance of education. In addition to helping to recruit volunteer readers, tutors and mentors, Campbell took part in the United Way's Great Phoenix Literacy Fair to promote the importance of literacy of elementary school students. In March of 2013, he was the keynote speaker to a group of college students at Deloitte and United Way's Alternate Spring Break. In February of 2014, he was the keynote speaker at a Generation United event for the Valley of the Sun United Way where he spoke to 200 young professionals about the importance of community service.

While in Arizona, Campbell made it his mission to empower local youth. He joined Cardinals teammates for a Christmas party in 2014 at the Mary Black Family and Child Services Agency. In 2013, Campbell and the CRC Foundation launched "Right Track," a daily afterschool program that served students from the Roosevelt School District in South Phoenix. He also represented the team at Jefferson Elementary School in 2011 and led students in fitness activities as part of the NFL's PLAY 60 program. Jefferson was selected as a Super School and won a \$10,000 grant from the NFL for health and wellness programming and equipment.

Previously, Campbell joined representatives from the Cardinals and Albertsons and distributed 50 meals to current and former residents of the Chicanos Por La Causa shelter during Thanksgiving of 2010. The CLPC shelter provides safe, temporary housing for women and their children who have been forced to leave their homes due to domestic violence. He also distributed 40 turkey dinners to families in the Chandler School District at Hamilton High School and Hancock Elementary to help brighten the holidays of those in need that same year.





- With a career-best 1,508 scrimmage yards in 2024, it marked his fourth straight season with 1,000+ scrimmage yards in Arizona. He became the first player in Cardinals history to have 1,000+ scrimmage yards in each of their first four seasons with the team.
- Has scored 18 total TDs vs. division opponents since joining the Cardinals in 2021, the most by any NFL player against their own division during that span.
- Had at least one TD (rushing or receiving) in seven consecutive games (Games 13-17 in 2023 and Games 1-2 in 2024) which tied for the longest streak in franchise history. Also accomplished the feat in 2021 (Games 7-13) and included in that stretch was a
- streak of five straight games with a rushing TD, tying the longest such streak in team history.

 In 2023, led the NFL in runs of 20+ yards (11), ranked 2nd in rushing yards/game (80.0), 3rd in runs of 10+ yards (31), 6th in rushing yards (1,040), 7th in rushing average (5.00) and tied for 3rd with four games of 100+ rushing yards.
- Finished the 2022 season with 1,082 scrimmage yards and eight TDs in 13 games.
- Earned Pro Bowl honors in 2021 after playing in 15 games (6 starts) during the regular season, finishing the year with 752 yards and 15 rushing TDs on 202 rushing attempts while adding 37 receptions for 375 yards and three TDs. Also scored the Cardinals lone TD in the Wild Card matchup.
- Became just the fifth Cardinals RB to receive Pro Bowl honors during his first season with the team: Ollie Matson (1952), Johnny Roland (1966), Ottis Anderson (1979) and Johnny Johnson (1990).
- His 18 total TDs in 2021 marked the second-highest single-season total in Cardinals history and ranked third in the NFL that year. His 15 rushing TDs also represented the second-highest single-season total in team annals and ranked second in the NFL.
- All 18 of his TDs during the 2021 regular season came in his final 13 games played. Had six games with multiple TDs in '21, joining RB David Johnson (8 in 2016) as the only players in franchise history to have at least six such performances in a single season.
- Earned his first career Pro Bowl selection with the Steelers in 2018, when he rushed for 12 TDs (third in the NFL) and 973 yards while catching 55 passes for 497 yards a TD in just 13 games.
- After tearing his MCL during the first game of his junior year at the University of Pittsburgh (2015), attended rehab and began experiencing excessive fatigue and other symptoms, leading doctors to perform a chest x-ray that revealed Hodgkin's Lymphoma. He endured 12 rounds of chemotherapy and completed his last chemo appointment on May 9, 2016. On May 23, 2016, he announced that he was cancer free.

CARDINALS IN THE COMMUNITY

Running back **James Conner** began his journey in Arizona in 2021 after spending eight years in the city of Pittsburgh as a Pittsburgh Panther and Pittsburgh Steeler. A published author, Conner's moving story as a cancer survivor has inspired many and created a significant impact in the community.

Last December, Conner took part in a bike donation event that provided 100 underserved children from Boys and Girls Clubs of the Valley with brand-new bicycles in celebration of the holiday season.

In May of 2024, he served on the Cardinals Leadership & Mental Health Awareness discussion panel in celebration of Mental Health Awareness month. The discussion gave 75 Arizona high school football coaches and administrators the knowledge and skills to improve their football programs, including how to help student-athletes take care of their mental health.

In August of 2023, Conner attended the Eastmark High School football team's home opener in support of Eastmark senior Kevin Winegar. Just weeks after winning the Arizona 3A State Championship last fall with the Firebirds, Winegar was diagnosed with Acute Lymphoblastic Leukemia. To raise awareness and funds, the school hosted a special "Winegar Strong" night at the game benefiting the Children's Cancer Network and the Winegar Strong athletic scholarship. Having gone through a similar experience, Conner and Winegar quickly formed a bond. The two survivors re-connected at State Farm Stadium prior to the Cardinals-Bengals Week 5 matchup in October of 2023.



In 2022, he represented the Cardinals and participated in "Giving Tuesday" at Phoenix Children's Hospital. On the Tuesday following Thanksgiving each year, people can bring positive changes to their communities through charitable donations to their favorite nonprofit organizations. Conner helped raise money for Phoenix Children's as the Cardinals triple matched all donations that day.

In 2021 during training camp, Conner participated in a zoom meeting with members of the Cardinals and NFL Flag Football Girls program and shared his advice and experience as a professional athlete.

In November of 2020, he donated 200 turkeys to the Second Harvest Food Bank of Northwestern Pennsylvania in his hometown of Erie, PA. He also partnered with Steelers teammates Cameron Heyward, Maurkice Pouncey and JuJu Smith-Schuster to provide local agencies with turkeys and Thanksgiving meals, serving more than 950 families in Pittsburgh, Erie and Long Beach, CA.

In honor of World Cancer Day, Conner visited patients at UMPC Hillman Cancer Center in February of 2020. His goal was a simple one, to encourage and bring hope to patients battling cancer.

In January of 2020, he teamed up with USAA and the Air Force Sergeants Association to award Command Chief Master Sergeant Louis Boykin with a trip to Miami to watch Super Bowl LIV. Conner then met Boykin and other military members in the USAA Salute to Service Lounge during Super Bowl Weekend.

In October of 2019, as a frequent participant in the Make-A-Wish Foundation, Conner surprised Andre Jenkins, a 19-year-old undergoing treatment for leukemia with tickets to the Steelers Monday Night Football game.

That same month, Conner was named a recipient of the 2019 Ed Block Courage Award, an award voted on by teammates and given to a player who has shown courage either coming back from an injury or a life-altering situation.

Since its inception, the DeeJay Dallas Foundation has been very active in the communities that DeeJay has lived and played in, primarily Brunswick, GA and Seattle, WA.

Events the foundation has hosted include a Charity Bowling Tournament, Silent Auction, Youth Football Camp, Winter Coat Drive, Health and Wellness Expo, Fundraising Gala, Scholarship Luncheon, Charity Golf Tournament and Mentoring Events, all of which Dallas hopes to host on an annual basis.





CARDINALS SEND HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS TO WASHINGTON D.C. ON TEAM PLANE

In June of 2025, the Cardinals joined forces with presenting partner Desert Financial Credit Union as well as Arizona Governor **Katie Hobbs** and the Close Up Foundation for the fourth annual "Civics Matters Arizona" trip to our nation's capital.

Through this highly-successful program, 275 high school students from across the state participated in an all-expenses-paid visit to Washington D.C. on the Cardinals team plane. The four-day, three-night trip took place from June 4-7.

The once-in-a-lifetime experience featured a red coat tour of the United States Capitol and private tour of the Supreme Court. The itinerary also included meetings with Supreme Court Justice Brett Kavanaugh and elected officials including Arizona Congressman Juan Ciscomani as well as issue deliberations and instructor-led visits to monuments, memorials, museums, and government institutions, providing students an opportunity to learn about civics in a way that is both educational and fun.



The Civics Matters Arizona program is a civic engagement initiative for high school students across the state. The program targets a diverse group of high schools and organizations serving Title I communities. Civics Matters Arizona engages students with their peers as well as their government and gives educators the tools and training to build positive dialogue in the classroom.

This year, 275 high school students from across the state were selected by their teachers to travel to Washington, D.C. The students who participated in Civics Matters Arizona represent 35 schools, 14 school districts, 9 cities, and 6 of the 15 counties across Arizona.

Ahead of the D.C. program, teachers worked with 10th and 11th grade students in a series of non-partisan lessons designed by Close Up. The lessons culminated in an essay contest in which students could write about (1) how young people can be engaged participants in their community even without the right to vote, (2) the importance of civic engagement by everyday people to the health of our democracy, or (3) how young people can contribute to creating positive community change.

CARDINALS IN THE COMMUNITY

Tackle **Paris Johnson Jr.** was the Cardinals first-round pick (6th overall) in the 2023 NFL Draft. Despite his age, Johnson has served the communities he's lived in for many years.

As a sophomore in high school in 2017, Johnson along with his mother, Monica, created his foundation - The Paris Johnson Jr. Foundation - with a focus on empowering and serving disabled veterans and disadvantaged student-athletes with dignity and respect.



Johnson took a leadership role in the locker room and in the community during his second NFL season. He had a prominent presence in two community events, the first of which was the team's Salute to Service STEM Day last October where approximately 650 students enjoyed a variety of demonstrations led by players, members of the military and first responders that pertained to careers in STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics).

Last November, he and teammate Kelvin Beachum helped ensure that the Cardinals rookie class was getting involved with the Phoenix community. The veteran offensive linemen led the 2024 rookie class in handing out turkeys, fresh produce and other food items to over 250 Phoenix area families. Johnson also personally donated \$5,000 towards the cause.

In December of 2023, Johnson helped honor a veteran, Sara Kerner, by providing her tickets to the Cardinals-Steelers game in partnership with the NFL's Salute to Service initiative. He spent time with Kerner and her family prior to the Cardinals, 24-10, victory. Johnson partnered with The Foster Alliance to help support the annual Cardinals Toy Drive a few weeks later prior to the Cardinals Week 15 matchup with the 49ers.

Johnson has joined forces with Coca-Cola each of the past three summers to host a Summer Water Drive benefiting UMOM New Day Centers, a provider of shelter, housing and services for those experiencing homelessness in Phoenix. In 2024, he was able to help donate 10,000 bottles of water.

In June of 2023, Johnson teamed up with Wilson Sporting Goods and the NFL to donate footballs, gear bags and apparel to two Cincinnati area high schools, including his alma mater Princeton (OH) High School.

Johnson's foundation was selected as the recipient of the 2022 Armed Forces Merit Award presented by the Football Writers Association of America for the assistance it provided to veterans. The award is presented annually to an individual or group within the realm of college football that has a military background or makes an impact on the military community. Prior to winning the award, Johnson and his foundation made regular visits to and helped raise money for the Cincinnati VA Hospital.

Johnson, inspired by his Ohio State teammate Harry Miller who has gone on a yearly mission to Nicaragua since he was a teenager, helped provide 100 beds for Nicaraguan children in need in February of 2022. The foundation also hosts several annual initiatives including youth football camps as well as holiday toy, coat and food drives.





- McBride (5) joins Jackie Smith (22) as the only TEs in Cards history with 5+ games of 100+ receiving yards. Also joins Smith as the only Cardinals TEs to have multiple games with 100+ receiving yards in multiple seasons.
- Finished the 2024 season with 111 receptions for 1,146 yards and two TDs to go along with a rushing TD and a fumble recovery TD. Shattered his own franchise single-season record for receptions by a TE (previous record was 81 in 2023) while his 1,146 receiving yards marked the second most in team history by a TE (Jackie Smith - 1,205 in 1967).
- His 111 receptions in '24 were the second-most in franchise history by a player at any position (WR DeAndre Hopkins 115 in 2020) and are the fourth-most in NFL history by a TE.
- Set the franchise record for receptions in a game by a TE with 12 catches for 133 yards @ Seattle in Week 12 of the '24 season. Followed up with 12 receptions for 96 yards the following week @ Minnesota, becoming the first Cardinal ever and the first TE
- in NFL history to have 12+ catches in back-to-back games.

 Added another 12-reception performance in Week 17 at Los Angeles, becoming the first TE in NFL history to have three games with 12+ receptions in a single season. - After taking over as the Cardinals full-time starter at TE in Week 8 of 2023, hauled in 66 receptions for 665 yards and three TDs. He ranked second among NFL TEs in receptions and second in receiving yards during that span (Weeks 8-18).
- Had his first career 100-yard outing in Week 10 vs. Atlanta (11/12/23) when he caught eight passes for 131 yards. The performance came 34 years to the day since the last 100-yard outing by a Cardinals TE: Rob Awalt, 105 yards vs. Dallas on
- Winner of the 2021 John Mackey Award as the nation's top tight end and earned unanimous first-team All-America honors as a senior at Colorado State. Also named the Mountain West 2021-22 Male Athlete of the Year.

PRO CAREER:

Selected by the Cardinals in the second round (55th overall) of the 2022 NFL Draft out of Colorado State. Agreed to terms on a four-year extension on 4/3/25 that will keep him under contract with the Cardinals through the 2029 season.

2024: Selected to his first career Pro Bowl, becoming the first Cards TE since 1970 (HOFer Jackie Smith) to earn Pro Bowl honors ... started in all 16 games games played and finished the season with 111 receptions for 1,146 yards and two TDs as well as a rushing TD and a fumble recovery TD ... his 111 receptions shattered his own franchise single-season record for receptions by a TE (81 in 2023) and are the second-most in a season in team history regardless of position (DeAndre Hopkins - 115 in 2020); also marked the fourth-best single-season reception total by a TE in NFL history ... his 1,146 receiving yards are the second most in team history by a TE, trailing only HOFer Jackie Smith (1,205), he joined Smith as the only TEs in Cardinals history to have 1,000+ receiving yards in a season ... had at least one catch in all 16 games, running his streak to 41 consecutive games with a reception ... started in the season opener @ Buf (9/8), and had five receptions for 30 yards ... started vs. LAR (9/15) and recovered a fumble in the Cardinals endzone for a TD, becoming the first Cardinals offensive player to score a TD on a fumble recovery since 2010; added a game-high six receptions for 67 yards ... inactive (concussion) vs. Was (9/29) ... had a team-high eight receptions for 96 yards @ GB (10/13) \dots finished with a game-high nine catches for 124 yards in the win @ Mia (10/27); joined Jackie Smith (22) as the only TEs in Cards history with 3+ games with 100+ receiving yards ... had three receptions for 35 yards and a two-yard rushing TD vs. Chi



(11/3); became the first Cardinals TE since Jackie Smith in 1968 to run for a TD; the performance marked his fourth consecutive week leading or sharing the team lead in both receptions and receiving yards ... totaled 12 receptions for 133 yards @ Sea (11/24); his 12 receptions marked the most by a TE in a single game in franchise history ... tallied a team-high 12 catches for 96 yards @ Min (12/1), marking back-to-back games with 12+ catches and 95+ receiving yards; became the first TE in NFL history and first Cardinals player ever to have 12+ receptions in consecutive games; became the first Cards TE since 1987 (Rob Awalt in Weeks 8-9) to have 95+ receiving yards in back-to-back games ... had a team-high seven receptions for 70 yards vs. Sea (12/8); marked his fourth straight game with 70+ receiving yards, the longest streak among NFL TEs in '24 and the longest streak by a Cardinals TE since at least 1970 ... had a game-high nine receptions for 87 yards in the win vs. NE (12/15); with eight catches broke his own franchise single-season record for receptions by a TE with 89 (had 81 in 2023); passed 2,000 career receiving yards (2,028) ... totaled 12 receptions for 123 yards and a TD @ LAR (12/28); the TD catch was his first of the season and fifth of his career; joined Larry Fitzgerald (5x), Anquan Boldin (2x) and DeAndre Hopkins (1x) and Larry Centers (1x) as the only players in francise history with 100+ receptions in a season; also joined HOF Jackie Smith (1,205 in 1967) as the only TEs in franchise history with 1,000+ receiving yards in a season; with 12 receptions, became the first TE in NFL history to have three games with 12+ receptions ... had seven receptions for 65 yards and a TD in the win vs. SF (1/5/25); the TD marked his second of the season and sixth of his career, and gave him a receiving TD in back-to-back games for the first time in his career; marked his eighth game of the season with 7+ receptions, only Ja'Marr Chase and Malik Nabers had more such games in '24 (nine each).

COLLEGE:

In four seasons (2018-21) at Colorado State, was a two-time All-American and three-time All-Mountain West Conference selection who appeared in 40 games (32 starts) and had 164 receptions for 2,100 yards and 10 TDs ... 2021 John Mackey Award winner who

established school career and single-season records for receptions, receiving yards and 100-yard receiving performances (8) by a tight end ... as a senior in 2021, named the John Mackey Award winner, the second top individual honor in program history, joining Greg Myers (Thorpe Award-1995) ... named a team captain for the second consecutive season ... became the first unanimous first-team All-American selection in program history ... started all 12 games and led all FBS TEs in receptions (90), yards (1,121) and yards per game (93.4) ... his 1,121 receiving yards were the fifth-most in a single season in FBS history by a TE and the most in Mountain West Conference history ... final play of his career was a 69-yard TD run vs. Nevada on a fake punt ... as a junior in 2020, named one of two team captains and started all four games on his way to earning second-team All-Mountain West honors ... led the team in receptions (22), receiving yards (330), TD receptions (4) and total points (24) ... as a sophomore in 2019, started 11-of-12 games played and earned first-team All-Mountain West honors after totaling 45 receptions for 560 yards and four TDs ... played in all 12 games (five starts) as a true freshman in 2018 and caught seven passes for 89 yards (12.7) and a TD.

Attended Fort Morgan (CO) High School where he had 89 receptions for 1,737 yards and 23 TDs as a TE ... also had 361 rushing yards and three TDs, 310 tackles (60 for loss) with 14 sacks, seven INTs and six blocked punts ... earned first-team 3A All-State honors as both a junior and senior ... earned all-conference honors all four years ... named team MVP in 2017 and 2018 ... also played basketball and baseball, setting school records for most career points in basketball and most home runs and RBIs in baseball ... brother, Toby, was a defensive lineman at CSU and the two played together during all four of Trey's seasons (2018-21) with the team ... named a 2017 National Football Foundation Colorado Chapter Scholar-Athlete ... in July of 2023, will host his inaugural youth football camp at Fort Morgan Legion Field in Fort Morgan, CO; the free camp provided instruction to 300 kids ranging from 3rd to 8th grades.

CARDINALS IN THE COMMUNITY

Tight end **Trey McBride** enjoyed a record-setting season on the field in 2024. As he became one of Kyler Murray's favorite targets, McBride also found time to give back to the local community in a big way, earning the Cardinals/NFL Walter Payton Man of the Year nomination in 2024.

McBride recently established his own foundation, "McBride's Bridge." To kick off the nonprofit, he surprised two members of the Boys and Girls Club of Metro Louisiana with tickets to Super Bowl LIX in February during Super Bowl week.

Last November, he participated in the team's 22nd annual Feed the Hungry event which provided Thanksgiving dinner to hundreds of Arizonans who are escaping homelessness, addiction and poverty. The month before, McBride was also a part of a Salute to Service STEM event at Tillman Middle School where he taught students about inertia and gravity through the lens of film study.

He has also contributed to the Cardinals on-going pursuit to grow the game of girls flag football. In June of 2024, McBride hosted and helped instruct approximately 100 girls from four Arizona high school girls flag football programs during a series of agility drills and competition periods. In September of 2024, he had the honor of conducting the coin toss for the first-ever Cardinals Girls High School Flag Football Game of the Week that aired live across the state on Arizona's Family Sports.



During the 2024 offseason, McBride stayed engaged in the Phoenix community as well as the community that raised him. He returned to his hometown of Fort Morgan, CO to host his second annual free youth camp. Through the yearly camp, McBride provides mentorship and skills training to his hometown's next generation of players.

In March of 2024, McBride joined teammate DeeJay Dallas in Poland on an NFL-USO trip. The visit spanned four days. McBride visited six different military bases and hundreds of troops where he observed military equipment demonstrations, participated in an Army combat fitness test, and joined in on a Madden gaming tournament – all while conducting meet and greets and sharing meals with service members. A special moment of the trip came when McBride met with service members from the Arizona National Guard, who were all die-hard Cardinals fans.

PLAYERS

Earlier that month, McBride joined Cardinals Cheerleaders in hosting the team's eighth annual "Tackle Reading Day". McBride read a book by beloved children's author Dr. Seuss to over 650 Valley elementary school students at Canyon Breeze Elementary School on what would have been the author's 120th birthday. The group from the Cardinals also donated books to individual students and the school's library. The events aim to inspire children at underserved schools to fall in love with reading.

In December of 2023, he hosted "A Catch For The Holidays", where 10 students from Bernard Black Elementary School in Phoenix were treated to a shopping spree at SCHEELS. Each child received a \$1,000 gift card to spend at the store. McBride was joined by a dozen of his Cardinals teammates at the event, making it a truly memorable moment for all the students.

McBride's charitable efforts also centered around the holiday season in November that year when he attended the Annual Teen Thanksgiving Dinner at the Boys & Girls Club of Greater Scottsdale. McBride first served as a guest speaker and then served Thanksgiving dinner before sitting down and breaking bread with the group of underserved teens.

McBride is also a staple of team community events. He took part in an event at Hunkapi Horse Farm in November of 2023 when the Cardinals hosted 30 survivors from the Tragedy Assistance Program for Survivors (TAPS) for a night of equine therapy and fun as part of the NFL's Salute to Service initiative. The players and participants rode and groomed horses and enjoyed a meal together.

In September of 2023, he attended a Phoenix Children's Hospital Birthday Party. All patients born in September were invited to join McBride and some of his teammates to celebrate their birthdays, play games and enjoy dessert in the hospital's child life zone. The visit to Phoenix Children's was McBride's second in a three-month span as he made bedside visits with pediatric patients in June of 2023.



- Selected #1 overall by the Cardinals in the 2019 NFL Draft, earned NFL Offensive Rookie of the Year honors (2019), has twice been named to the Pro Bowl (2020-21) and was named team captain each of the last five seasons (2020-24).
- In July of 2022, signed a contract exténsion that will keep him with the Cardinals through the 2028 season.

- In 2024, threw for 3,851 yards and 21 TDs. It marked his fourth season with 20+ TD passes and also his fourth with 3,000+ passing yards. He tied Neil Lomax for the most seasons in franchise history with 3,000+ passing yards and most seasons with 20+ TD passes.
- In 2024, became the second fastest to 1,500 completions in NFL history in terms of fewest career pass attempts (2,248) trailing only Justin Herbert (2,240).
- One of just four players in NFL history (Josh Allen, Russell Wilson, and Cam Newton) with 19,000+ passing yards and 3,000+ rushing yards in his first six seasons. Murray (82 games) was the third fastest and third youngest (27 years, 151 days) player in NFL history to reach the milestone.
- Joined Josh Allen and Cam Newton as the only QBs in NFL history with 100+ passing TDs and 30+ rushing TDs in their first six seasons.
- His 67.1 completion percentage ranks 3rd in NFL history in a player's first six seasons (min. 1,500 attempts) and 5th overall. Owns the top two single-season completion percentages in franchise history (69.2 in 2021; 67.2 in 2020).
- His 31 rushing TDs are the most ever by a Cardinals QB and rank seventh on the franchise all-time list for career rushing TDs.

Attended Allen (TX) High School where he ranked as one of most accomplished Texas high school players ever after leading Allen to three straight state titles while never losing a game as a starting QB (43-0) ... had 14,515 total yards (10,386 passing; 4,129 rushing) and 186 total TDs (117 passing, 69 rushing) ... named the 'Best Texas High School Football Player of All-Time' in a fan poll by Texas High School Football magazine ... as a senior in 2014, earned National Player of the Year honors from Gatorade, Parade and USA Today after completing 278-of-433 pass attempts (64.2%) for 4,713 yards and 54 TDs while rushing for 1,485 yards and 25 TDs ... named Mr. Texas Football Player of the Year in 2014 by Dave Campbell's Texas Football magazine ... completed 207-of-325 passes (63.7%) for 3,669 yards and 46 TDs as a junior while adding another 1,274 yards and 19 scores on ground ... rushed for 1,370 yards and 25 TDs as a sophomore while passing for 2,004 yards and 17 TDs ... also starred on Allen's baseball team and was first player ever selected to play in Under Armour All-American games for both football and baseball ... an outfielder on the Oklahoma baseball team, started 50 of his 51 games for the Sooners in 2018 and hit .296 with 10 home runs, 13 doubles, 47 RBI, 46 runs and 10 stolen bases ... father, Kevin, lettered at Texas A&M from 1983-86 and finished career holding virtually every season and career passing record ... Kevin was also inducted into Texas A&M Athletic Hall of Fame in 1999 and the Cotton Bowl Hall of Fame in 2012 ... Human Relations major ... when the Cardinals selected him the #1 overall pick in the 2019 NFL Draft, Murray became the first Asian-American ever selected #1 overall; Murray is one quarter Korean; his father is African American and his mother, Missy, is half Korean; Kyler's maternal grandmother is from South Korea ... an avid gamer, in 2021 Murray became a member of the FaZe Clan, one of the largest esports gaming organizations in the world; members of the FaZe Clan - which included Kyler - were featured on the cover of Sports Illustrated in 2021 ... also has a passion for playing chess, a game he picked up in fourth grade; was a member of the chess club at Degan Elementary School in Lewisville, TX and in fifth grade, in just his second year playing, Murray became the Degan Elementary chess champion.

CARDINALS IN THE COMMUNITY

Not one to seek recognition for his work in the community, Cardinals Pro Bowl quarterback **Kyler Murray** has quietly given back and supported those in need in Arizona, his home state of Texas and beyond during his career in the NFL.

In November of 2024, Murray established the Kyler Murray Foundation with a mission to inspire and support youth by providing educational resources and athletic opportunities, fostering a foundation for success in life. The KMF commitment to service also extends beyond youth empowerment with a deep dedication to supporting veterans.

To kick off the foundation's launch, Murray hosted seven Phoenix-based veterans at the Cardinals-Jets game on November 10 and met with the group on the field after the decisive win that earned him NFC Offensive Player of the Week honors.

Through a partnership with Call of Duty's charitable arm "Endowment," Murray has helped veterans' transition back into the workforce by securing high-quality job opportunities. His efforts included a \$75,000 donation, which will create an estimated 125 job placements and an economic impact of \$8.9 million through veterans' first-year salaries. His dedication to veterans embodies his belief in honoring those who have sacrificed for our freedom.

Though many of his community efforts have taken place behind the scenes, Murray brought together his teammates, fellow NFL stars and professional athletes and the phoenix community in May of 2025 when he hosted the first annual Kyler Murray Foundation Celebrity Softball Game at Salt River Fields. The star-studded event was attended by thousands of fans and helped raise money for a host of causes Murray supports through his foundation. In the lead up to the game, Murray visited the United Food Bank and helped pack meals for those in need.



Last March, Murray – whose maternal grandmother is from South Korea – gave back to his ancestral home through a pair of events put on by the KMF. In his first ever visit to Seoul, Murray visited a local children's hospital where he spent time with pediatric patients. Murray then held a youth football camp where he personally coached Korean QBs, WRs and DBs in an effort to spread the game he loves.

Later that month, Murray visited the Pacific Palisades Fire Department. In the aftermath of the L.A. Fires, he spent time with the fire fighters, signed autographs and toured the station all in appreciation of their service and sacrifices.

In December of 2023, he participated in the team's annual 'Shop with a Jock' event. Murray and a dozen of his Cardinals teammates partnered with Desert Financial Credit Union to treat 30 underserved youth from South Phoenix to a Holiday shopping spree. Each child received \$1,000 to spend how they chose at a local Walmart prior to a pizza party.

In August of 2023, Murray participated in the opening coin toss at Mountain View High School in Mesa, AZ to commemorate one of the first Arizona Interscholastic Association (AIA) sanctioned girls flag football games in state history. In conjunction with the Cardinals, Nike provided a \$100,000 check for Arizona high school girls flag football teams to purchase jerseys and turn what was once a dream into a reality.

In the final days before starting training camp in 2023, Murray surprised a group of four kids from A Permanent Voice with a back-to-school shopping spree at Dick's Sporting Goods. Founded in 2018, the organization is dedicated to giving underserved youth an opportunity to find their voice. The children Murray surprised were all being raised by their grandparents.

Particularly important to Murray is making special connections with his fans. During the 2020 season, he developed a friendship with 12-year-old Hector Nahle. Nahle, a youth quarterback from Mexico, was in the middle of getting treatment for cancer when the pair connected over Instagram. Murray sent him a special message over social media which started their relationship. The two stayed in touch over the past three years and when the Cardinals traveled to Mexico City to play the 49ers in 2022, Murray flew Hector as well as his father, mother and sister to the game and got them tickets and field passes.

Although he has lived in Arizona since being drafted by the Cardinals in 2019, Murray remains close to his hometown of Allen, TX. That was evident during the 2023 offseason following the tragic mass shooting in Allen. He donated \$15,000 to one of the young survivors who lost his family in the shooting while also giving \$10,000 to the general fund of the victims.

In February of 2021, Murray donated 60,000 meals to the North Texas Food Bank after that region's devastating winter storm that caused widespread power outages which resulted in residents not having heat or running water.

During the 2022 offseason, Murray took part in a \$10,000 check presentation to the Arizona Educational Foundation on behalf of Kretschmar and Albertsons/Safeway. He also visited the Boys & Girls Clubs of the Valley for a youth skills camp and another \$10,000 check presentation in support of the Boys & Girls Club's mission to provide a safe, positive and fun environment for kids during their time away from school.

Murray also actively served his community during the COVID-19 pandemic. With schools closing due to the outbreak, he pledged \$25,000 to GENYOUth's COVID-19 Emergency School Nutrition Fund in April of 2020. He also participated in the NFL's Draft-a-Thon along with country music star Blake Shelton and NFL Network host Rich Eisen to help raise money for the fund. His generous contributions helped combat hunger by feeding children who depend on school meals, which were able to continue for thousands of students during the pandemic.

In January of 2020, Murray participated in the Twitch Rivals Streamer Bowl along with other NFL players. He finished second in the event and was awarded \$80,000 to the charity of his choice - the Colon Cancer Coalition. Murray also joined Chase Edmonds and Christian Kirk for Twitch Stream Aid 2020 to raise money for charity and support COVID-19 relief efforts in March of 2021.

PATRICK PETERSON RETIRES A CARDINAL

In April, All-Pro CB **Patrick Peterson** announced his retirement from the NFL with the Cardinals at a press conference held in Arizona.

Peterson spent 10 seasons (2011-20) with the Cardinals after joining the team as a first-round selection (5th overall) in the 2011 NFL Draft out of LSU. An eight-time Pro Bowler and three-time first-team All-Pro selection — all with Arizona - Peterson was named to the 2010-19 All-Decade Team by the Pro Football Hall of Fame's selection committee.

- In 13 NFL seasons with the Cardinals (2011-20), Vikings (2021-22) and Steelers (2023), Peterson started 200-of-201 regular season games played and totaled 652 tackles, 36 interceptions, 122 passes defensed, 4.0 sacks, 15 tackles for loss, two forced fumbles and three fumble recoveries.
- He also had 195 punt returns for 1,816 yards, four kickoff returns for 75 yards, seven carries for 34 yards, 10 receptions for 64 yards and completed his lone career pass attempt for 17 yards.
- Peterson finished his NFL career with six total TDs -- four punt return TDs to go along with a pair of interception return TDs.
- In his 10 seasons in Arizona, the Pompano Beach, FL native was a five-time team captain (2013, 2015-18) and started all 154 games played, totaling 499 tackles, 28 interceptions, 91 passes defensed, 4.0 sacks, 2 forced fumbles, 10 tackles for loss and scored five TDs (4 punt return, 1 interception return).
- A two-time (2015 and '17) "Cardinals/Walter Payton NFL Man of the Year", Peterson established the "Patrick Peterson Foundation for Success" alongside his wife, Antonique. The foundation was created to provide low-income and inner-city youth with opportunities and resources to reach their full potential. In addition to his foundation work, he was also a regular participant in team community events, visiting the Phoenix Children's Hospital, Boys Hope Girls Hope, Phoenix Ronald McDonald House and countless local schools.
- He had multiple interceptions in nine of his 10 seasons in Arizona and joins Hall of Famers Larry Wilson and Aeneas Williams as the only players in team history that had multiple interceptions in each of his first six seasons.
- Peterson was selected to the Pro Bowl in each of his first eight NFL seasons (2011-18), becoming the first player in team history to accomplish that feat. His eight consecutive Pro Bowl selections are also a franchise record. Peterson joins wide receiver Larry Fitzgerald (11) and Hall of Fame safety Larry Wilson (8) as the only players in Cardinals history to be named to the Pro Bowl at least eight times.
- He was named first-team All-Pro three times during his Cardinals tenure, with two selections at cornerback (2023. 2015) and one as a punt returner (2011).
- Peterson started all 128 games during his first eight seasons in Arizona, becoming the first Cardinal since at least the 1970 NFL-AFL merger to start 100+ consecutive games to begin his career.
- As a rookie in 2011, he tied an NFL record and became just the fourth player in league history to return four punts for TDs during a single season. He remains the lone player in NFL history with four punt return TDs of 80+ yards in a single season (80, 82, 89 and 90 yards).



That year he was named an Under Armour All-American after compiling 93 tackles, 33.0 tackles for loss, 27 QB hurries, 17.0 sacks, six forced fumbles, three pass breakups and two fumble recoveries as he led Powell to a 13-2 record and a Class 5A state championship.

CARDINALS HOST GIRLS FLAG FOOTBALL SKILLS AND EDUCATION CAMP

In June, the Cardinals hosted the team's annual Girls Flag Football Skills & Education Camp presented by Dignity Health at the Dignity Health Arizona Cardinals Training Center.

The Cardinals 2025 rookie class helped instruct approximately 100 girls from four Arizona high school girls flag football programs (Hamilton High School, Basha High School, Highland High School and Casa Grande Union High School) during a series of agility drills and competition periods.

Prior to the on-field activities, participants took part in an education session to promote healthy eating habits and lifestyle choices.

CARDINALS GIRLS FLAG FOOTBALL: Supporting girls flag football is a well-established priority for the Cardinals. The team impacts thousands of high school and youth girls flag football players across the state of Arizona annually through a variety of introductory programs, camps, showcases, tournaments and equipment donations. The Cardinals were the first NFL team to broadcast and fully produce a Girls High School Flag Football Game of the Week through a partnership with Arizona's Family. The Cardinals established a partnership with the Positive Coaching Alliance that pledged \$70,000 to help support girls flag football in the state of Arizona and eliminate gender inequity in youth sports. The team has also held girls flag football games at State Farm Stadium during halftime of the Cardinals games each of the past three seasons.



GIRLS FLAG FOOTBALL IN ARIZONA: Arizona is one of 15 states to offer high school girls flag football as a sanctioned sport. In 2024, over 100 Arizona high schools offered girls flag football.

GROWTH OF FLAG FOOTBALL: Flag football is the most accessible and inclusive version of American football and is contributing to worldwide participation growth of the sport, particularly among women and girls. An estimated 20 million people in more than 100 countries currently participate in flag football. Flag football will be included in the 2028 Summer Olympics in Los Angeles marking the first time that the game of football in any capacity will be a part of the Olympic Games.



DEVLIN THE NEWEST RECIPIENT OF ROD GRAVES COLLEGE SCOUTING AWARD

In 2021 the Cardinals established the Rod Graves College Scouting Award. Named in honor of former Cardinals general manager, Rod Graves, and given annually to the team's top scout, the award is based on multiple years of analytical research and prospect grade accuracy.

Area Scout Zach Devlin, who has been with the Cardinals since 2017, received the award during the 2025 NFL Draft. Now in his ninth season with Arizona, and fifth as an area scout, Devlin originally joined the team's scouting department as a scouting assistant in 2017. He was then promoted and spent three years (2018-20) as the team's representative with the National Football Scouting service.

The Rod Graves College Scouting Awarde goes to the scout who most exhibits what it means to do such a job with the Cardinals, including passion and drive, hustle, competency in evaluations, and putting the team first.



After receiving the award, Cardinals GM Monti Ossenfort allowed Knight to make the phone call to inform UAB WR Tejhaun Palmer that the team was selecting him in the sixth round of this year's draft.

Graves spent 16 of his 31 NFL seasons with the Cardinals as the team's Assistant to the President (1997-2002), Vice President of Football Operations (2003-2006) and General Manager (2007-2012). Particularly successful at building rosters through the draft, Graves help lead the Cardinals to back-to-back NFC West titles and a Super Bowl XLIII appearance in his first two years as GM.

CARDINALS IN THE COMMUNITY

Defensive lineman **Dalvin Tomlinson** joined the Cardinals this past March and came to the Valley with a bevy of experience both on the gridiron and in the community. Tomlinson was nominated for the Walter Payton NFL Man of the Year award with the Giants in 2020 for his dedication to community service.

He also won the NFLPA Community MVP award in Week 9 of 2022 with Minnesota after hosting six families from the Brighter Days Family Grief Center, an organization that provides support to kids and young adults who are grieving the death or terminal diagnosis of a family member, at a Vikings home game. The families had a special meetand-greet on the field pre-game with Tomlinson, who took pictures, signed autographs and shared words of encouragement.

Tomlinson has a personal connection to that cause as he lost his father to cancer when he was five years old and his mother to complications from diabetes during his senior year in high school. He has connected with and served as a positive outlet for hundreds of grieving families in his home state of Georgia (Kate's Club) and the states in which he has played in his career: New Jersey (Good Grief) and Minnesota (Brighter Days).



Tomlinson has found ways to incorporate his passions into his service efforts. He is an avid gamer and in November of 2022, Tomlinson used video games to connect with veterans in celebration of Salute to Service month. He led veterans from the Wounded Warrior Project on a tour of the Vikings facility before playing video games with the group. While with the Giants, Tomlinson, a

talented musician who plays piano, trumpet and the drums, participated in a virtual band class for students from Belleville (NJ) Middle School.

Leading up to his WPMOY nomination, Tomlinson served as the "team captain" of a group of ten players and three coaches focused on establishing relationships and programming in the borough of Queens, N.Y. Under his leadership with help from the New York City Police Department, an after-school academic tutoring and flag football program was established in an area that needed it most. Tomlinson regularly checked in with the kids participating in the program and helped find ways to provide resources and financial support for the cause.

Following his selection as the Giants WPMOY nominee, Tomlinson chose to support two organizations near and dear to his heart specifically to honor his late parents. For his mother, Tomlinson served as a member of American Diabetes Association's MTeam Tackle Initiative, a group of current and retired NFL players who raise support for diabetes funding and supported the American Cancer Society as a Mcrucial Catch Ambassador in memory of his dad. He was also nominated by the Giants for the 2019 Art Rooney Sportsmanship Award.

Tomlinson has supported a litary of causes during his time in the NFL both on his own and with the franchises he played for. From mental health to cancer awareness to youth development, the defensive tackle has cast a wide charitable net, filling several holes in the communities he called home.



CARDINALS IN THE COMMUNITY

Linebacker Mack Wilson Sr. came to the Valley in 2024 after spending time in New England (2022-23) and Cleveland (2019-21) to begin his NFL career. Wilson is no stranger to giving back, especially when it comes to Autism, a cause that is near-and-dear to his heart.

Wilson's godson and nephew are both impacted by autism. Upon entering the NFL in 2019 he immediately knew he wanted to get involved. While searching for an organization that worked with children on the spectrum, Wilson was directed to "KultureCity" by Basketball Hall of Famer Dominique Wilkins who currently serves as the non-profit's board chairman. KultureCity strives to "make the nevers possible" by creating sensory accessibility and inclusion for those with "invisible disabilities."

Wilson has supported the organization since his rookie season, representing KultureCity through the NFL's My Cause, My Cleats initiative as he wears customized cleats promoting the nonprofit annually. Each year, Wilson sends one of his game-worn cleats to his nephew and the other to his godson.



Wilson has held charity celebrity sporting events in his hometown of Montgomery, AL and in Phoenix each of the last three summers. Wilson held a softball game in 2021 and 2022 prior to switching the event to a basketball game in 2023. He brought the celebrity basketball game to Phoenix in May of 2025. The event was accompanied by a community day featuring youth activities, face painting, food and more.

In May of 2024, Wilson held his first celebrity basketball game where he provided youth in attendance with free food, giveaways and fun activities including bouncy houses and face painting. Wilson was joined by some of his former teammates from his time in the NFL and at Alabama as well as Pro Football Hall of Famer Terrell Owens at the game. Last year's game was the main event of the Montgomery Health & Wellness City Fest.



All proceeds from his annual celebrity sporting events go to the Make a Difference Foundation, which was founded by Wilson's godfather, Todd Dowell. The Make a Difference Foundation strives to help youth achieve excellence by emphasizing character development, team building and leadership skills. The foundation pushes young athletes to compete in a safe nurturing environment. An environment that Wilson cites helping get him to where he is today.

Wilson also participated in several Cardinals community events during his first season with the team, including Youth Training Camps in September and December. Youth Training Camps are designed to teach football-related skills in a non-contact environment. The program conveys a message of teamwork and personal best while reinforcing the importance of education and physical activity. In

Prior to coming to the Cardinals, Wilson was an active member of the community during his time with the Patriots and Browns. He frequently volunteered at food banks, hospitals and schools with the teams and on his own.
