



ARIZONA CARDINALS NOTE CARDS

11 Career blocked kicks for DL **Calais Campbell** (10 FG, 1 PAT), two of which have come in the last two games. In NFL history only Shaun Rogers (17), Denico Autry (14) and Julius Peppers (13) blocked more total kicks in their career.

3 TEs in NFL history who have posted 100+ receptions, 1,000+ receiving yards and 10+ TDs in a season. TE **Trey McBride** (109 catches for 1,098 yards and 10 TDs) joined Travis Kelce (2018, '20, '22) & Dallas Clark (2009) as the only ones to accomplish the feat.

80 Players who have appeared in at least one game for the Cardinals this season. That is the most in the NFL and the Cardinals are one of five teams to have 75+ players appear in a game this season.

6 Former Ohio State Buckeyes on Arizona's roster (OL **Paris Johnson Jr.**, WR **Marvin Harrison Jr.**, LB **Baron Browning**, LB **Cody Simon**, CB **Denzel Burke** and OL **Josh Fryar**) that will make their return to the state of Ohio this week to take on the Bengals.

MILESTONE WATCH

WITH A WIN...

- Arizona would improve to 5-2 in its last seven games vs. the Bengals.
- Arizona would improve to 3-1 in its last four road games at Cincinnati.

MILESTONES WITHIN REACH...

TE TREY McBRIDE

- With 5 receptions, McBride would have 5+ catches in his 9th consecutive road game. In NFL history there would be just two longer streaks by a TE: McBride (10 straight in 2023-24) and Travis Kelce (10 straight in 2019-20).
- With 1 reception, McBride (331) would pass Larry Fitzgerald (330) for the second-most catches by a Cardinal in his first four seasons. He needs 13 receptions to pass Anquan Boldin (342) for the top spot.
- With 3 receptions, McBride would have 112 receptions in 2025. That would break his own franchise single-season record for receptions by a TE (111 in 2024).
- With 107 receiving yards, McBride (1,206) would break the franchise single-season record for receiving yards by a TE. The current record of 1,205 was set by Hall of Famer Jackie Smith in 1967.
- With 1 TD reception, McBride would have 11 TD catches in 2025. He would become the first Cardinals player since Larry Fitzgerald in 2009 (13) to have at least 11 TD catches in a season.

QB JACOBY BRISSETT

- With 225+ passing yards and 2+ TDs, he would become the first Cardinals QB since Carson Palmer (9 in 2015) to have 9+ games with at least 225 yards and 2 TDs in a season.
- With 104 passing yards, Brissett (3,015) would pass Kurt Warner (3,014 in 2005-06) for the most passing yards by a Cardinals QB in his first 10 starts with the team.
- With 89 passing yards and 1 TD pass, Brissett would join Kyler Murray (4x), Carson Palmer (3x), Kurt Warner (3x), Neil Lomax (3x) and Charley Johnson (2) as the only players in franchise history with 3,000+ passing yards and 20+ TD passes in a season.
- With 1 TD pass, Brissett (20) would extend his career high for TD passes in a season (previous was 18 in 2019 w/ Indy).

LB JOSH SWEAT

- With 1.0 sack, Sweat would have 12.0 sacks in 2025. That would establish a new career high for the 8th-year pro (11.0 in 2022 w/ Eagles). It would also give him at least 1.0 sack in 9 of 16 games this season.
- With 2.0 sacks, Sweat (4) would join Simeon Rice (6 in 1999; 4 in 1998), Chandler Jones (4 in 2017 & 2019) and Curtis Greer (4 in 1983) as the only players in franchise history to have at least four games with 2.0+ sacks in a single season.

WR MICHAEL WILSON

- With 1 TD reception, Wilson would have at least one TD catch in four consecutive games, becoming the first Cardinals WR to have four straight games with a TD catch since J.J. Nelson in 2016 (Games 12-15).

WR MARVIN HARRISON JR.

- With 1 TD catch, Harrison would have 13 career TD receptions. In franchise history only Larry Fitzgerald (18) and Sonny Randle (16) would have more in their first two career seasons.

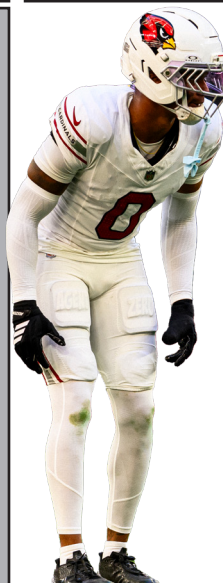
CB DENZEL BURKE

- With an INT, Burke would have four INTs in 2025. He would join CBs Patrick Peterson (4 in 2011), Dominique Rodgers-Cromartie (4 in 2008) and HOFer Aeneas Williams (6 in 1991) as the only Cardinals rookies since 1988 (when the team moved to AZ) to have 4+ INTs in a season.

DL CALAIS CAMPBELL

- With 1.0 sack, Campbell would have his first sack at Paycor Stadium in his career. It would be the 29th different stadium he has recorded a sack at during his 18-year career.

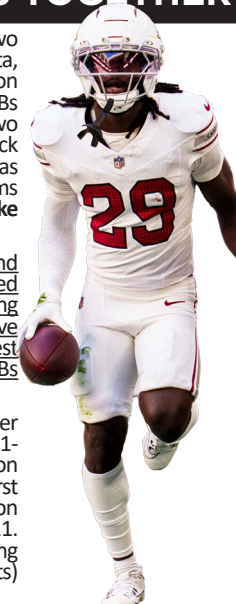
RIVALS BEFORE, RELENTLESS TOGETHER



CB **Will Johnson** led the Cardinals with two passes defended on Sunday vs. Atlanta, marking his second game this season with 2+. He is one of just five rookie DBs to have multiple games with at least two passes defended joining Seahawks S Nick Emmanwori (3 games), Saints S Jonas Sanker (2 games), Chiefs CB Nahl Williams (2 games) and teammate CB **Denzel Burke** (2 games).

Johnson (10) and Burke (9) rank second and third respectively in passes defended among all rookies this season. According to PFF, Johnson has the highest defensive grade (67.0) and Burke has the highest coverage grade (71.1) among rookie CBs (min. 50% snaps played).

Burke returns to Ohio this week after playing four seasons at Ohio State (2021-24). He recorded his third INT of the season in last week's game and became the first Cardinals rookie with 3+ INTs in a season since Patrick Peterson had four INTs in 2011. His 3 INTs are tied for the most among rookies this season (Falcons S Xavier Watts) and are the most on the team.

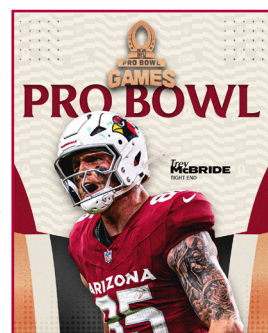


PRO BOWLERS

S **Budda Baker** and TE **Trey McBride** were each named to the NFC squad for the 2026 Pro Bowl. It is the second consecutive year both Baker and McBride were selected to the Pro Bowl. In addition, LB **Josh Sweat** was selected as an alternate.

TE TREY McBRIDE

- McBride was named to his second-consecutive Pro Bowl and joins TE Jackie Smith (5 straight from 1966-70) as the only TEs in franchise history to earn Pro Bowl honors in consecutive seasons.
- Joins George Kittle (49ers), Brock Bowers (Raiders) and Travis Kelce (Chiefs) as the only tight ends selected to consecutive Pro Bowls (2025-26).
- Ranks third in the NFL in receptions (109), is tied for third in TD receptions (10) and sixth in receiving yards (1,098) in 2025.
- McBride became the 1st TE in NFL history with 100+ receptions in back-to-back seasons (111 in 2024; 105 in 2025).



S BUDDA BAKER

- Named to his eighth Pro Bowl and seventh consecutive selection at safety after being chosen as a special teamer as a rookie in 2017.
- Baker (8) joins CB Patrick Peterson (8) as the only players in Cardinals history to receive at least eight Pro Bowl selections in his first nine NFL seasons.
- Baker (7) and Hall of Famer Larry Wilson (8) are the only players in franchise history named to the Pro Bowl as a safety at least seven times.
- Joins Peterson (8) and Fitzgerald (7) as the only players in Cardinals history named to the Pro Bowl in at least 7 consecutive seasons.
- Only NFL safety named to the Pro Bowl each of the last 7 seasons (2019-25).
