



ARIZONA CARDINALS NOTE CARDS



- 4** TDs (3 rushing; 1 receiving) for RB **James Conner** in two games vs. the 49ers last season. In Week 9 at San Francisco last year, Conner had one of the best games of his career, rushing for 96 yards and two TDs on 21 carries (4.6 avg.) while adding 77 yards and a TD on five receptions.
- 94** Receiving yards for WR **Rondale Moore** last week vs. the Rams. Of Moore's three career outings with 90+ receiving yards, two have come in his last three games played.
- 79** Combined receptions for WRs **Marquise Brown** (43) and **DeAndre Hopkins** (36) in 2022. They have played in a combined 10 games, putting up 881 yards and 5 TDs in those contests. The Cardinals MNF matchup vs. San Francisco could potentially be the first game they play together this season.
- 76** Different players who have appeared in at least one game for Arizona in 2022. That total leads the NFL, and no other team has more than 70. Of the Cardinals 11 offensive starters to begin the season, 6 were unavailable last week in L.A., and a 7th - TE **Zach Ertz** - left in the first quarter with a knee injury.

WITH A WIN...

- The Cardinals would improve to 2-0 in regular season games held in Mexico, with both wins coming against the 49ers. The Cards would become the first team with multiple regular season wins in Mexico.
- Arizona would improve to 12-3 in its last 15 games against San Francisco and would have three consecutive wins over the 49ers dating back to last season.
- The Cardinals would improve to 5-2 in their last seven appearances on Monday Night Football. Arizona would have more wins in its last seven MNF appearances (5) than it had in its previous 20 (4).

MILESTONES WITHIN REACH...

WR DEANDRE HOPKINS

- With 1 reception, Hopkins would have at least one catch in 141 consecutive games. That would extend the longest active streak in the NFL.
- With 23 receiving yards, Hopkins would have 11,000 receiving yards for his career. At 30 years, 168 days old he would become the fourth-youngest player in NFL history to reach the milestone behind only Calvin Johnson (30 years, 33 days), Larry Fitzgerald (30 years, 85 days) and Antonio Brown (30 years, 159 days). He would also join Julio Jones and DeSean Jackson as the only active players with 11,000+ receiving yards in their career.
- With 10 receptions, Hopkins would have 10+ receptions in four of five games played this season. He would join Larry Fitzgerald (4 in 2017) as the only players in franchise history with at least four games of 10+ receptions in a season.
- With 1 TD reception, Hopkins would have 11 TD catches in 15 games played dating back to the beginning of last season.

QB KYLER MURRAY

- With 3+ TD passes, Murray would have 3+ passing TDs in a game for the 13th time in his career. Only Neil Lomax (15 times in 108 games) and Charley Johnson (14 times in 87 games) would have more such performances.
- With 41 rushing yards, Murray would join Josh Allen, Lamar Jackson, Russell Wilson and Cam Newton as the only QBs in NFL history with 400+ rushing yards in each of their first four seasons.

DE J.J. WATT

- With 1.0 sack, Watt would have 6.5 sacks in 2022. He would have more sacks in 10 games played this season (6.5) than he had in the previous two seasons (2020-21) combined (6.0 in 23 games played).
- With a sack, Watt would have his first career sack vs. the 49ers. That would leave the Bears, Texans and Patriots as the only teams he does not have a sack against during the regular season. He will face the Patriots in Week 14 on MNF.
- A sack of 49ers QB Jimmy Garoppolo would make him the 46th different QB Watt has sacked in his career.

RB JAMES CONNER

- With a TD (of any kind), Conner would have 22 TDs in 23 games with Arizona. That would set a franchise record for TDs in a player's first 23 games with the team.
- With a TD (of any kind), Conner would have five total TDs in three games vs. the 49ers since joining the Cardinals last season.

DL ZACH ALLEN

- With 1.0 sack, Allen would have 4.5 sacks in 2022. That would be a new career high (current mark is 4.0 in 2021).

S BUDDA BAKER

- With an INT, Baker would have an INT in consecutive games this season and in each of his last three games played vs. the 49ers. Baker had an INT in both games vs. SF last season.

WR A.J. GREEN

- With 1 TD catch, Green would have 70 TD receptions in his career. He would join Davante Adams (81), Mike Evans (78) and teammate DeAndre Hopkins (70) as the only active players with 70+ career TD receptions.

CARDS-49ERS REMATCH IN MEXICO CITY

The Cardinals are back in primetime this week as they take on the division-rival San Francisco 49ers at Estadio Azteca in Mexico City on Monday Night Football.



The contest will serve as a rematch of the 2005 Cardinals-49ers game at Estadio Azteca which was the NFL's first regular season game held outside the United States. The Cardinals earned a 31-14 win over the 49ers in that game in front of a then-record crowd of 103,467.

The Cardinals have a long history with international games and have participated in many global "firsts" for the league:

- The franchise played in the first NFL regular season game held outside the United States when they faced San Francisco in Mexico City in 2005.
- The team also played the first NFL game outside of North America on August 16, 1976 against the Chargers in Tokyo's Korakuen Stadium. The Cardinals won, 20-10.
- The first American football contest played on British soil was between the Cardinals and Vikings in London's Wembley Stadium on August 6, 1983.

A WATT OF HITS ON THE QB

Last week in Los Angeles, DE **J.J. Watt** had two tackles, a sack, a tackle for loss, a season-high five QB hits and a fumble recovery. **It was Watt's 17th career game with at least five QB hits. No other active player in the NFL has more than five.**

WATT'S OUTSIZED IMPACT: In nine games played in '22 he has 18 tackles, a team-high 5.5 sacks, 13 QB hits, 7 tackles for loss, 3 passes defensed and a fumble recovery.

RETURNING TO MEXICO TO FACE THEIR FORMER TEAM

On Monday, it will have been exactly 6,260 days since P **Andy Lee** - then a 23-year old with the 49ers appearing in his 20th career game - last played in Mexico City. He was San Francisco's punter in Arizona's 31-14 victory at Estadio Azteca in Week 4 of the 2005 season.



Much has changed since then. **This week Lee (40) returns to the venue to appear in his 291st career game as one of just three active players still playing in their 40s: QB Tom Brady (45) and OL Jason Peters (40). SF K Robbie Gould will join that list alongside Lee, Brady and Peters when he turns 40 on Dec. 6.**

In addition to Lee, three current Cardinals coaches were members of the 49ers staff in 2005. Assistant Head Coach/Special Teams Coordinator **Jeff Rodgers** was an assistant special teams coach, Defensive Coordinator **Vance Joseph** was the assistant DBS coach and Linebackers Coach **Bill Davis** was the 49ers defensive coordinator.
