# ARIZONA CARDINALS (3-11) VS. CHICAGO BEARS (5-9) Soldier Field | December 24, 2023 | 2:25 PM



### THIS WEEK'S PREVIEW

The Cardinals return to Chicago this week in a continuation of the NFL's oldest rivalry.

It is the penultimate road game of the season for Arizona, who finishes its '23 road slate in Week 17 at Philadelphia.

This Sunday's matchup between the Cardinals and Bears takes place exactly 103 years and 26 days after their inaugural meeting, which came on November 28, 1920 at Normal Park in Chicago.

The only two current NFL franchises with ties back to the league's inaugural season as the APFA in 1920, the Cardinals and Bears have faced each other 92

season as the APFA in 1920, the Cardinals and Bears have faced each other 92 times in the regular season.

Arizona is making its second regular season visit to Soldier Field in the last three seasons and enters the contest having won three straight at Chicago (2021, 2015, 2009). The Cardinals longest road winning streak in the series came between 1945-48 when they took down their then cross-town rivals in four straight.

The road has been a good place to be in this series of late. The visiting team has won the last six games in a streak that began in 2009.

In the Cards last trip to Chicago, the team's stars led the way as QB **Kyler Murray** threw a pair of TD passes (one to RB **James Conner**) and also rushed for two TDs. On defense, safeties **Budda Baker** and **Jalen Thompson** each had INTs.

Sunday's game will feature two of the NFL's top rushing attacks this season, with Arizona entering the contest ranked #7 averaging 131.8 yards per game and Chicago ranked #5 at 134.4 yards per game.

In a unique twist, the Cardinals rushing attack will be up against the NFL's top run defense for the second consecutive game. After piling up 234 yards against the previous #1 ranked run defense last week vs. San Francisco - knocking them out of the top spot - it is now the Bears (allowing an average of just 79.8 yards per game on the ground) who lay claim to the league's top run defense.

Following this week's game, Arizona is heading east to take on the Eagles in Philadelphia - as **Jonathan Gannon** takes on his former team for the first time as a head coach. Chicago stays home as they host the Atlanta Falcons.

## THE HIGHLIGHTS

• For the second time in three seasons (2021), Arizona is headed to Chicago for a December matchup with the Bears. Sunday's game marks the 93<sup>rd</sup> all-time meeting between the Cardinals and Bears.

• After playing on Christmas Day each of the last two seasons (2021-22), Arizona will play its first game on Christmas Eve since 2017 (23-0 win vs. NYG). The Cardinals are 4-1 in their last five games played on Christmas Eve.

• In the Cardinals last game at Chicago (33-22 win in Week 13 of 2021), safeties **Budda Baker** and **Jalen Thompson** combined for 16 tackles and 2 INTs (83 return yards). It is the only game in their careers in which both had an INT.

• <u>TE Trey McBride has 66 receptions in 2023, a franchise single-season record</u> for a TE. With 712 receiving yards, he joined Hall of Famer Jackie Smith (3x) as the only TEs in franchise history with 700+ receiving yards in a season.

• Facing the 49ers #1 ranked run defense (78.3 ypg) last week, Arizona rushed for a season-high 234 yards and two TDs on 30 attempts (7.8 avg.). This week, the Cardinals face the NFL's new #1 ranked run defense in the Chicago Bears, who are allowing just 79.8 rushing yards per game.

• The 49ers had gone 104 straight games without allowing 200+ rushing yards. It was the second-longest active streak in the NFL behind Baltimore (106).

• In the Cardinals first 101 seasons as an NFL franchise (1920-2020), there were six made FGs of 56+ yards. Matt Prater's 58-yard FG vs. the 49ers last week gives him seven made FGs of 56+ yards in just 44 games in Arizona.

• AZ's '23 rookie class has combined for 119 games played, an NFL-high 51 starts, 6 TDs, 49 receptions, 598 receiving yards, 274 rushing yards, 165 tackles, 7.5 sacks, 14 tackles for loss, 10 passes defensed, a fumble recovery and 1 INT.

### **CARDINALS-BEARS CONNECTIONS**

#### **BEARS CONNECTIONS**

Cardinals Asst. Head Coach/Special Teams Coordinator Jeff Rodgers came to Arizona in 2018 after serving as the Bears special teams coordinator for three seasons (2015-17).

Cardinals RBs coach **Autry Denson** played one season with the Bears in 2001, appearing in a career-high 16 games. That season, Denson had career highs in kickoff returns (23) and kickoff return yards (534) with Chicago.

Cardinals D-Line coach Derrick LeBlanc entered the NFL coaching ranks in 2004 with the Bears as a Bill Walsh Coaching Fellow.

Cardinals LB Josh Woods originally entered the NFL as a rookie free agent with the Bears in 2018. During his three seasons (2018-21) in Chicago, Woods ap-peared in 25 games with seven tackles on defense to go along with 12 tackles and a fumble recovery on special teams.

Cardinals Area Scout Zac Canty (2010-11) spent two seasons in Chicago's pro personnel department.

Cardinals Asst. Equipment Manager **Marcus Lukes** is a native of Skokie, IL and worked for the Bears from 2012-20.

#### **CARDINALS CONNECTIONS**

Bears TEs coach **Jim Dray** spent two seasons (2020-21) as an offensive quality control with the Cardinals following an NFL playing career that began - and ended - in Arizona. Dray was selected by the Cardinals in the seventh round (223<sup>rd</sup> overall) of the 2010 Draft and played his first four seasons (2010-13) in Verticola - approximation in ES grame (14 sector). He then returned to the Cardinals Arizona, appearing in 55 games (18 starts). He then returned to the Cardinals during his final season as a player in 2017, appearing in one game.

Bears Co-Director of Player Personnel Jeff King played his final two NFL seasons (2011-12) as a TE with the Cardinals. He appeared in all 32 games (22 starts) during that span and caught 44 passes for 400 yards and three TDs.

Bears Pass Game Cooordinator/WRs Tyke Tolbert spent one season in 2003 with the Cardinals coaching WRs.

Bears practice squad CB Christian Matthew was selected by the Cardinals in the seventh round (244th overall) in the 2022 Draft.

Bears practice squad OL Doug Kramer Jr. spent time on the Cardinals roster earlier this season.

ILLINOIS CONNECTIONS Cardinals LB Dennis Gardeck is a Lake in the Hills, IL native and attended Crystal Lake (IL) South High School where he earned All-Fox Valley Conference and All-Area honors as a senior LB. He also earned second-team allconference honors as a defenseman in lacrosse.

Cardinals DL **Naquan Jones** is an Evanston, IL native and attended Evanston Township (IL) High School where he was named to USA Today's All-USA Il-linois first team as a senior in 2015.

ARIZONA CONNECTIONS Bears Chairman George H. McCaskey attended Arizona State University, where he earned his bachelor's degree in Broadcasting in 1978, his law degree in 1981, and a Master of Laws degree in 2021. He also worked briefly in television news in Phoenix.

Bears President and CEO Kevin Warren is a Phoenix native who attended Marcos de Niza High School in Tempe before earning a bachelor's degree from Grand Canyon University. Warren then received a Master Of Business Administration degree from Arizona State.

College/PRO CONNECTIONS Cardinals Head Coach Jonathan Gannon (2018-20) and OL coach Klayton Adams (2019-22) spent time with Bears Head Coach Matt Eberflus (2018-21), LBs coach Dave Borgonzi (2018-21) and asst. DBs coach David Overstreet II (2018-21) in Indianapolis when Eberfluss served as defensive coordinator.

Bears LB T.J. Edwards was coached by Jonathan Gannon and Cardinals Defensive Coordinator Nick Rallis for two seasons (2021-22) in Philadelphia when Gannon served as defensive coordinator and Rallis coached LBs.

### NFL'S OLDEST RIVALRY RESUMES THIS WEEK

### Having met twice during the NFL's inaugural season in 1920, the Cardinals and Bears represent the oldest rivalry in league history.

The Cardinals and Packers - who joined the league in 1921 - are the NFL's second-oldest rivalry. The Packers were formed in 1919 by Earl (Curly) Lambeau and George Calhoun but did not gain entry into the APFA until 1921

The first meeting between the Cardinals and Packers (a 3-3 tie) occurred on November 20, 1921 at Normal Park in Chicago. The following

week (November 27, 1921), the Packers and Bears met for the first time when the Staleys defeated the visitor from Green Bay 20-0.

• The first-ever meeting between the Cardinals and Bears - then known as the Racine Cardinals and Decatur Staleys - occurred at Normal Park in Chicago on November 28<sup>th</sup>, 1920, exactly 72 days after the league was conceived as the APFA during a meeting in Canton, OH.

Sunday's matchup between the Cardinals and Bears takes place exactly 103 years and 26 days after their inaugural meeting.

### CARDS RETURN TO CITY OF THEIR BIRTH

As the United States' oldest professional football franchise still in existence, the Cardinals hold a unique place in league history.

That history began back in Chicago in 1898, when the team was founded as the Morgan Athletic Club, predating the formation of the NFL by over 20 years.



the charter members. When the Cards called Chicago home, the team was located at the corner of 61st and Racine. The street, along with the color of jerseys from the University of Chicago, provided a name for the team, the Racine Cardinals.

The Racine Cardinals became the Chicago Cardinals in 1922 when a team from Racine, WI joined the league. The same year the Cards would move into their new home in Comiskey Park, which they shared with baseball's White Sox for the next 37 years.

In 1932, Hall of Fame owner Charles W. Bidwill, Sr., then a vice president of the Bears, purchased the Cardinals. After divesting himself of his Bears' holdings, a period of family ownership began that continues today with Michael Bidwill. The Cardinals are the oldest continuously operated franchise in pro football.

### FRIENDSHIP OF THE HALL OF FAME OWNERS

Cardinals Hall of Fame owner Charles Bidwill and Bears Hall of Fame owner George Halas had a friendship that endured even as their team's were cross-town rivals during their shared time in Chicago.

As Halas recounted in a 20-part history of the Bears he wrote for the Chicago Tribune in 1967, during the Great Depression their friendship helped save Halas' ownership of the Bears.

In 1931, Halas' co-owner Edward "Dutch" Sternaman proposed being bought out of his stake in the Bears for \$38,000, which was to be paid in installments. After suffering \$18,000 in losses during the 1932 season, Halas was \$15,000 short when the final payment was due in 1933. Defaulting on the payment meant ownership would revert to Sternaman.

"It was a case of finding \$15,000 in a hurry, or losing everything I'd worked for since moving the Staleys from Decatur to Chicago in 1921," Halas wrote in a 1967 history of the Bears published in the Chicago Tribune. "From this desperate situation, I was rescued by the joint efforts of my mother and my good friend Charley Bidwill. Mother bought \$5,000 worth of stock from her savings. Bidwill purchased \$5,000 in stock and also arranged a bank loan for the remaining \$5,000 needed. But it was a mighty close call. As I remember, I finally got all the money together at 11:10 a.m. on the day the final note came due. Forfeit time was 12 o'clock noon.



## **BY THE NUMBERS**

#### 1920

Rushing yards for the Cardinals last week vs. San Francisco. Arizona became the first team to rush for 200+ yards against the 49ers since the Cowboys ran for 265 yards on 43 attempts on 10/22/17. Prior to last week, San Francisco had gone 104 consecutive games without allowing 200+ rushing yards. It was the second-longest active streak in the NFL behind Baltimore (106).

#### 131.8

Rushing yards per game for the Cardinals in 2023. Arizona ranks 7<sup>th</sup> in the NFL in rushing this season.

#### 4.95

Rushing average for the Cardinals in 2023 (373 carries for 1,845 yards). Arizona ranks third in the NFL in rushing average this season.

Players who have rushed for 150+ yards for the Cardinals this season: RB James Conner (717), RB Emari Demercado (274), QB Joshua Dobbs (258), WR Rondale Moore (159) and QB Kyler Murray (155). Arizona is the only team in the NFL this season to have at least five players with 150+ rushing yards.

#### 17

Consecutive games in which Conner has averaged at least 4.0 yards per rush attempt. That is the longest active streak in the NFL (min. 5 att/game).

#### 27

Rushing TDs for Conner during his time in Arizona. Despite having played in just 38 games with the Cards, only five players in franchise history have more career rushing TDs.

66 Receptions for TE Trey McBride in 2023. That is a franchise single-season record for receptions by a TE, surpassing the previous mark of 56 (Zach Ertz in 2021 and Jackie Smith in 1967).

#### 712

Receiving yards for McBride in 2023. He joins Hall of Famer Jackie Smith (3x) as the only TEs in franchise history with 700+ receiving yards in a season.

#### 58

Distance - in yards - of Matt Prater's second quarter FG vs. San Francisco last week. It is the fifth-longest FG in franchise history. In the Cardinals first 101 seasons as an NFL franchise (1920-2020), there were six made FGs of 56+ yards. Prater's 58-yard FG vs. San Francisco last week gives him seven made FGs of 56+ yards in just 44 games in Arizona.

FGs of 50+ yards for Prater this season, a franchise record. He surpassed his own previous record of seven in 2021.

#### 51

Combined starts for the 12 rookies on the Cardinals roster in 2023. That is the most in the NFL. AZ's rookie class has combined for 119 games played, 6 TDs, 49 receptions, 598 receiving yards, 274 rushing yards, 165 tackles, 7.5 sacks, 14 tackles for loss, 10 passes defensed, a fumble recovery and 1 INT.

#### 10

Rookies that have started at least one game for the Cardinals this season. That is the highest total in the NFL.

#### 274

Rushing yards for undrafted rookie RB Emari Demercado in 2023. Excluding the 1987 season which featured replacement players, Demercado's 274 rushing yards are the most in franchise history by an undrafted rookie.

#### 50.4

Punting average for Blake Gillikin this season. That ranks fourth in the NFL. Gillikin has averaged 50.0+ yards per punt in seven of 10 games played in 2023. Only Ryan Stonehouse (9), Jake Camara (9), A.J. Cole (8) and Bryan Anger (8) have more gamès äveraging 50.0+ ýards per pùnt than Gillikin.

Successful onside kick recoveries - on 30 tries - in the NFL this season. Arizona is responsible for the only successful recovery (Week 8 vs. Baltimore).

### WHAT TO LOOK FOR IN WEEK 16

#### WITH A WIN...

• Arizona would earn its fourth consecutive win on the road in Chicago. That would tie the Cardinals longest road winning streak vs. the Bears in the history of the series (won 4 straight between 1945-48).

Arizona would improve to 3-1 in its last four games vs. Chicago.

#### **MILESTONES WITHIN REACH**

#### **TE Trey McBride**

 With 88 receiving yards, McBride would join Hall of Famer Jackie Smith (2x) as the only TEs in franchise history with 800+ receiving yards in a season. Smith had 1,205 yards in 1967 and 810 in 1966.

• With 100+ receiving yards, McBride (3) would join Smith (4 in 1967; 3 in 1970 and 3 in 1966) as the only TEs in franchise history with at least three 100-yard receiving performances in a single season.

 With 100+ receiving yards, McBride would become the first Cardinals TE in 57 years to have 100+ receiving yards in back-to-back games (Smith in Games 9-10 in 1966).

#### **RB James Conner**

• With a rushing TD, Conner (50) would join Derrick Henry (88), Ezekiel Elliott (70), Latavius Murray (59), Melvin Gordon III (55), Alvin Kamara (54) and Chris-tian McCaffrey (51) as the only active players with 50+ career rushing TDs.

• With 83 rushing yards, Conner would reach 800+ rushing yards in a season for just the second time in his career (973 in 2018).

• With 100+ rushing yards, Conner would be the first Cardinals player with at least three 100-yard outings in a season since Kenyan Drake (3) in 2019.

#### **QB Kyler Murray**

• With a rushing TD, Murray would have 27 career rushing TDs. That would tie James Conner, Elmer Angsman and Johnny Roland for sixth place on the franchise all-time list for career rushing TDs.

 With 77 passing yards, Murray would reach 15,000 passing yards for his career. He would join Russell Wilson, Josh Allen and Cam Newton as the only players in NFL history with 15,000+ passing yards and 2,000+ rushing yards in their first five seasons.

#### K Matt Prater

• With a FG of 50+ yards, Prater would have nine FGs of 50+ in 2023. It would also give him 80 career FGs of 50+ yards in his career - 22 more than any other player in NFL history.

### **BIG GAINS IN THE RUN GAME**

The Cardinals have 17 runs of 20+ yards so far in 2023. Only Baltimore (18) has more.

Arizona's 17 runs of 20+ yards in 2023 are nearly equal to the team's total in the previous two seasons (2021-22) combined (19). ### **RUNNING IT UP ON NFL'S #1 RUN DEFENSE**

The Cardinals rushed for a season high 234 yards and two TDs on 30 carries (7.8 avg.) last week vs. San Francisco's #1 ranked run defense.

#### Arizona became the first team to rush for 200+ vards against the 49ers since the Cowboys ran for 265 yards on 43 attempts on 10/22/17.

Prior to last week, San Francisco had gone 104 <u>consecutive games without allowing 200+ rush-</u> ing yards. It was the second-longest active streak in the NFL behind Baltimore (106).

Of the four games this season in which the 49ers allowed 100+ rushing yards, two have come vs. the Cardinals.

## A DOMINANT RUN SINCE WEEK 8

McBride's record-setting season in 2023 has been sparked by a seven-game stretch in which he has been one of the most dominant TEs in the NFL

In his last seven games, McBride has 51 receptions for 542 yards and two TDs. Dating back to Week 8, McBride's 51 receptions lead all NFL TEs while his 542 receiving yards rank 2<sup>nd</sup>.



#### After having just one game of 40+ receiving yards through his first seven games played this season, McBride has 40+ receiving yards in six of his last seven games.

Two weeks after he became the first TE in franchise history with 10+ receptions in a game, McBride caught eight passes for 131 yards against the Falcons in Week 10.

The performance came 34 years to the day since the last 100-yard outing by a Cardinals TE: Rob Awalt, 105 yards vs. Dallas on 11/12/89.

After going 34 years between 100 yard games by a TE, McBride hit the mark again just four games later - finishing with 10 receptions for 102 yards last week vs. San Francisco.

McBride (2) has now joined Jackie Smith (who accomplished the feat six times) as the only TEs in Cardinals history to have multiple 100-yard receivina performances in a sinale season.

## MURRAY CLUTCH IN COMEBACK WIN

Making his season debut - and se for the first time in 335 days - QB Kyler Murray completed 19-of-32 pass attempts for 249 yards and rushed for 33 yards and a TD to lead the Cardinals to a 25-23 comeback win over the Falcons in Week 10.

Murray orchestrated the 11-play, 70-yard game-winning drive to secure the win. He made two critical plays in the drive

• 3<sup>rd</sup>-n-10 on AZ 42-yard line (1:50 remain-ing): Murray evaded heavy pressure in the backfield and eventually scrambled 13 yards

for a crucial first down. <u>According to NFL</u> NextGen Stats, Murray covered a total of 74 yards on the scramble and hit a top speed of 20.17 mph (his fastest since 2021).

2<sup>nd</sup>-n-7 on ATL 42-yard line (0:57 remaining): Murray hit TE Trey McBride for a 33-yard completion to the ATL 9-yard line that set up the game-winning FG four plays later.



### **111 GAMES MISSED TO INJURY...AND COUNTING**

Injuries have hit the Cardinals hard in all three phases so far this season, forcing a large number of players to miss games and also force a lot of different players into action.

The most recent significant injuries were to LB **Kyzir White** - a team captain and one of the NFL's leading tacklers in 2023 - and DL **Leki Fotu**. Both were lost to IR following injuries suffered in Week 11 at Houston.

It took just one game for the Cardinals to lose one of their starting defensive lineman - as DL L.J. Collier suffered a biceps injury that has kept him out of the last 13 games.

In game two - after he had recorded seven tackles, a sack, a QB hit, a tackle for loss and a pass defensed in his first game-plus - AZ lost starting DL Carlos Watkins to his own biceps injury that has kept him out of the last 12 games.

Defensive line has been the hardest hit with injuries this season - as the team now has three of the six linemen from its Week 1 roster currently on IR (Leki Fotu is the third). Only three of those six (Jonathan Ledbetter, Kevin Strong and Dante Stills) played vs. the 49ers in Week 15.

#### PLAYING THE GAME THE RIGHT WAY

Baker has always balanced his relentless and physical playing style with a respect for the game and his opponents. Consider the numbers:

• Over the last five seasons (2019-23), Baker leads all NFL DBs (and ranks 10<sup>th</sup> overall) with 537 total tackles. *Despite that production and playing* 4,906 total snaps in that span, he has been penalized just four times.

 Entering Week 16 of 2023, Baker has a streak of 34 games played without a penalty - a streak that dates back to Week 5 of the 2021 season.

• In 1,622 snaps over the last two seasons (2022-23), Baker has 174 total tackles and has not been called for a single penalty.

• In five of his seven seasons he has been charged with one penalty or fewer and just once (4 in 2018) has he been flagged more than twice.

### LEDBETTER IS ARIZONA'S MAN OF THE YEAR

Earlier this month, the Cards announced that DL Jonathan Ledbetter was named the "Cardinals/Walter Payton NFL Man of the Year.

The award is in recognition of outstanding community service activities off the field as well as excellence on the field. As a nominee, Ledbetter will receive up to a \$55,000 donation to the charity of his choice and wear a Walter Payton NFL Man of the Year helmet deca through the end of the season in recognition of his accomplishments on and off the field.

"It's bigger than us," Ledbetter said of being one of the 32 player to receiving the honor. "It's big-People love this game because of what we can do on the field, but we have so much to offer off the field as well. I want

people to know that we're regular humans too and we want to be able to help and give back and be there for people who need the help.

Ledbetter is one of 32 NFL "Man of the Year" recipients to qualify for the league's national 2023 "Walter Payton NFL Man of the Year" award. For the sixth consecutive year, all 32 team winners will be highlighted as finalists and recognized for their important work during the week leading up to Super Bowl LVIII. The 2023 "Walter Payton NFL Man of the Year" will be announced during NFL Honors before Super Bowl LVIII. The winner will receive a \$250,000 donation to the charity of his choice.

### OJULARI AND STILLS SEASON HIGHLIGHTS

## **BLOUNT A FORCE ON SPECIAL TEAMS**

Despite having played in just eight games for Arizona this season - he was elevated from the practice squad to the active roster in early October and missed two games due to injury - S Joey Blount has made a big impact on special teams for the Cardinals.



He forced a fumble - recovered both times by Arizona - on punt coverage in consecutive games against the Rams (Week 6) and Seahawks (Week 7). He has also added four tackles on special teams.

Despite having played in just eight games, Blount is the only player in the NFL this season with multiple forced fumbles on special teams. He was the first Cardinals player in at least 20 years to have a forced fumble on special teams in back-to-back games.

### GILLIKIN AMONG NFL PUNTING LEADERS

Since being signed by the Cardinals in early October, P Blake Gillikin has appeared in 10 games and punted 42 times for 2,115 yards. <u>He is averaging 50.4 yards per</u> punt in 2023, which ranks fourth in the NFL.

LB Dennis Gardeck - a four-time team captain and two-time Pro Bowl alternate who has been with the Cardinals since signing with the team as a rookie free agent out of Sioux Falls in 2018 - *finished the Week 10 win over the Falcons* with five tackles, a sack, a tackle for loss, a QB hit and a pass defensed.

### A NEW GM IN THE DESERT

On January 16, the Cardinals announced the hiring of **Monti Ossenfort** as the team's general manager.

Ossenfort came to Arizona with 21 years of NFL experience (2002-22). That includes 15 with the New England Patriots and the past three as Director of Player Personnel with the Tennessee Titans.

During his time in New England, Ossenfort helped the Patriots win four Super Bowl titles and earn seven Super Bowl appearances overall. In 21 total NFL seasons, his teams earned postseason berths 16 times.

"It was critically-important for us to find the right person to lead us as General Manager and there is no doubt in my mind that we have that in Monti Ossenfort," said Cardinals owner Michael Bidwill. "He possesses every attribute of a successful GM – passion, leadership, intelligence, work ethic – and his extensive experience has clearly prepared him for this role. We could not be more thrilled to have Monti and his family joining the Cardinals.

Over the course of his 15 seasons with New England, Ossenfort served as the Director of College Scouting (2014-19), Assistant Director of College Scouting (2011-13), National Scout (2008-10), Area Scout (2006-07) and a Personnel Assistant (2003).

The 44-year old Ossenfort started his tenure in the NFL with Minnesota as a training camp intern in 2001 and worked with the Texans as a pro personnel intern in 2002. After spending 2003 with the Patriots, Ossenfort returned to Houston where he spent two seasons (2004-05) with the Texans as a pro and college scouting assistant. He rejoined the Patriots in 2006 where remained through the 2019 season.

Ossenfort was a four-year letterman and two-year starter at quarterback for the University of Minnesóta-Morris and graduated from the school in 2000 with a degree in Economics and Management. He later earned a master's degree in Business Administration and Sports Management from Ohio University.

A native of Luverne, MN, Ossenfort and his wife, Shannon, have three daughters, Emery, Finley and Landry.

## TRADES HIGHLIGHT OSSENFORT'S FIRST OFFSEASON

**Ossenfort** has kept busy in his first offseason as the Cardinals GM, particularly when it comes to trades. Dating back to the 2023 NFL Draft, he has executed eight trades: four draft-day trades three more during training camp/preseason and one during the season.

Arizona entered the draft with eight selections and the team used only three of those original picks (#168, #180, #213) - including one (#168) - that was traded to Detroit in round one only to be acquired back by Arizona in day two.

• OL D.J. Humphries (2015) and LS Aaron Brewer (2016) are the most tenured players on the Cardinals active roster.

• The Cardinals oldest player is K **Matt Prater** (39 years old) and the team's youngest player is rookie LB **BJ Ojulari** (21). <u>At 39 years old (born 8/10/84), the only active players older than Prater are Jets QB Aaron Rodgers (39 - born 12/2/83), Bears TE Marcedes Lewis (39 - born 5/19/84) and Seahawks OL Jason Peters (41 - born 1/22/82).</u>

The average age on the Cardinals Week 1 roster was 26.9 years old. Arizona's Week 1 roster featured just five players age 30+, compared to 12 such players on the Week 1 roster in 2022

• Arizona's roster features the only active player in the NFL who entered the league through the Supplemental Draft (S Jalen Thompson) and 20 players who entered the NFL as undrafted free agents.

Of the Cardinals six captains, five served in the role with Arizona last season: Murray, Humphries, Baker, Conner and Gardeck.

Murray, Baker and Gardeck are all serving as team captains for the fourth consecutive season.

Conner earned the honor for the second time in his career (2022) while White was named a team captain for the first time in his career.



### FLAG FOOTBALL INCLUDED IN 2028 OLYMPIC GAMES



The International Olympic Committee (IOC) voted in favor of the inclusion of flag football at the 2028 Summer Olympics in Los Angeles. It marks the first time in history that the game of football will be a part of the Olympic Games.

An estimated 20 million people in more than 100 countries currently participate in flag football. This year will see 65 national teams participate in the International Federation of American Football (IFAF) Continental Flag Football Competition.

Throughout the fall, the Cardinals are celebrating the inaugural season of sanctioned High School Girls Flag Football in the state of Arizona by highlighting a weekly game. Each week Valley football fans vote to select the Girls Flag Football Game of the Week that representatives from the Cardinals will attend.

Arizona is one of eight states to offer high school girls flag football as a sanctioned sport, while 20 states have adopted the sport as a pilot program. In 2023, 57 Arizona high schools are offering sanctioned girls flag football. The NFL and Cardinals are continuing to emphasize outreach to promote girls flag football and help further grow the game.

### **GANNON TAKES THE REINS**

 On Tuesday, February 14, the Cardinals announced Jonathan Gannon as the team's new head coach.

• The 40-year old Gannon came to the Cardinals after spending the past two seasons (2021-22) as the defensive coordinator for the Philadelphia Eagles.

 Under Gannon, the Eagles boasted a top-10 defense in each of the past two seasons, ranking 2<sup>nd</sup> in total defense in 2022 (301.5 ypg) and 10<sup>th</sup> in the NFL in 2021 (328.8 ypg). Last season the Eagles also featured the NFL's top-ranked pass defense (179.8 ypg) and the league's 8<sup>th</sup> ranked scoring defense (20.2 ppg).

• Just two days prior to being hired in Arizona, Philadelphia played in Super Bowl LVII at State Farm Stadium after finishing the regular season as the #1 seed in the NFC with a 14-3 record. The Eagles made the postseason in each year Gannon was the defensive coordinator.

Has coached with three different teams (Eagles, Colts, Vikings) who have combined for six playoff berths in the last eight seasons.

#### MORE HIGHLIGHTS FROM PHILADELPHIA

• In 2022, the Eagles easily led the NFL with a franchise single-season record 70 sacks in the regular season. No other team in the NFL had more than 55.

• Philadelphia's 70 sacks in 2022 were the most by any team in a single season since the 1989 Minnesota Vikings (71). Combined with their eight sacks in the postseason, the Eagles 78 total sacks in 2022 were the third-most in NFL history behind only the 1984 (82 sacks) and 1985 Chicago Bears (80 sacks).

Since individual sacks became an official stat in 1982

Philadelphia became the first team ever to have four different players with 10.0+ sacks in a single season when they did so in 2022 Haason Reddick (16.0), Brandon Graham (11.0), Javon Hargrave (11.0) and Josh Sweat (11.0).

• Between 2021-22, the Eagles defense led the NFL with 99 sacks, ranked 3<sup>rd</sup> in total defense (315.1 ypg), 3<sup>rd</sup> in pass defense (200.4 ypg), 6<sup>th</sup> in tackles for loss (168), tied for 4<sup>th</sup> in total return TDs (7) and interception return TDs (4) and tied for 10<sup>th</sup> in interceptions (29).

• In his first season with the Eagles in 2021, directed the NFL's 10<sup>th</sup>-ranked defense (328.8 ypg). Philadelphia had the 2<sup>nd</sup>-most defensive TDs (5) and allowed the 5<sup>th</sup>-fewest explosive plays (117) in the league, also finished 9<sup>th</sup> in opponent rushing yards per game (107.9) and opponent three-and-out percentage (33.1%).

GANNON'S BACKGROUND • A Cleveland, OH native, Gannon has 15 years of experience in the NFL. Prior to working with the Eagles, he was the DBs/CBs coach with the Colts (2018-20) and the assistant DBs/quality control coach with the Vikings (2014-17) after working as a defensive assistant with the Titans (2012-13).

• Spent three seasons (2009-11) as a scout with the St. Louis Rams after begin-ning his NFL coaching career as a defensive assistant with the Atlanta Falcons in 2007.

• Played collegiately as a safety at Louisville and appeared in nine games as a red-shirt freshman in 2002 before suffering a career-ending hip injury in his first career start at Cincinnati.

### PHILLY "D" AMONG NFL'S BEST UNDER GANNON

One of the main factors in the Eagles reaching the Super Bowl last season was the performance of the team's defense under then-second year coordinator Jonathan Gannon.

### **ARIZONA'S COORDINATORS**

### PETZING LEADS THE OFFENSE

**Drew Petzing** is in his first season with the Cardinals and 10<sup>th</sup> in the NFL after being hired as Arizona's of-fensive coordinator in February. Prior to coming to AZ, Petzing spent three seasons (2020-22) with Cleveland, including last year as QBs coach.

• With the Browns in 2022, QB Jacoby Brissett started 11 games and completed 236-of-369 passes for 2,608 yards, 12 TDs and an 88.9 QB rating. Brissett's 63.9 completion percentage and 88.9 passer rating were both career highs.

 Prior to Cleveland, he spent six seasons (2014-19) in 2019, WR Stefon Diggs set a then career-high with 1,130 receiving yards and finished 4<sup>th</sup> in the league that season with a 17.9-yard

average on 63 receptions.

• Working with Kirk Cousins in 2018, the Vikings QB set a team record for completions (425), threw for the third-most passing yards (4,298), had the secondhighest completion percentage (70.1) and recorded the fourth-highest passer rating (99.7) by a Viking in team history.

### **RALLIS TAKES THE REINS ON DEFENSE**

Nick Rallis (RAW-liss) was hired as Arizona's defensive coordinator in February after spending the past two seasons (2021-22) coaching LBs in Philadelphia. Prior to working with the Eagles, Rallis spent three seasons (2018-20) with the Minnesota Vikings as defensive quality control/assistant linebackers coach.

• Having turned 30 on July 13<sup>th</sup>, he is the youngest coordinator in the NFL.

• Helped Eagles LB T.J. Edwards to a career season in 2022 as he finished with 159 tackles, 2.0 sacks, seven passes defensed, 10 tackles for loss and a fumble recovery. His 159 tackles ranked 7th in the NFL in 2022 and represented the highest single-season total for an Eagles defender since Byron Evans (175) in 1992.



 With the Vikings, Rallis coached LB Eric Kendricks who was selected to his first Pro Bowl and was named first-team All-Pro in 2019 after having a career-high and team-leading 110 tackles to go along with 12 passes defensed, tied for the most among NFL linebackers.

### **RODGERS STILL IN CHARGE OF SPECIAL TEAMS**

Jeff Rodgers is in his sixth season with the Cardinals and fifth as the team's assistant head coach/special teams coordinator. He came to Arizona in January, 2018 as the team's special teams coordinator and add ed the title of assistant head coach in 2019.

• Rodgers is in his 20th NFL season after previously coaching special teams with Chicago (2015-17), Denver (2011-14), Carolina (2009-10) and San Francisco (2003-07).



• K Matt Prater had 137 points in 2021, the second-highest total in franchise history and tied for the fourth-highest total in the NFL that season. In just 30

games over two seasons (2021-22) under Rodgers, Prater connected on 12 FGs of 50+ yards, the second-most for any player in team history.

• P Andy Lee finished in the top-five in the NFL in punting average three times over the past five seasons (2018-22), including leading the league with a 48.6vard average in 2018.

### **TERRELL COORDINATES PASS GAME**

Drew Terrell is in his sixth season in the NFL and first with the Cardinals as passing game coordinator/WRs. He came to AZ after coaching WRs in Washington the past three years (2020-22).

• During his three-year (2020-22) tenure coaching receivers with the Commanders, guided WR Terry McLaurin to three consecutive 1,000+ yard receiving seasons and his first Pro Bowl selection in 2022.

• A Chandler, AZ native, Terrell attended Hamilton High School and received All-State honors as both a WR and punt returner. He helped the Huskies win three regional championships and two 5A Division I state titles.

### CARDINALS HAVE NEW UNIFORMS IN 2023



In April, the Cardinals unveiled new uniforms that the team is wearing this season.

The new uniforms were designed in collaboration with Nike in a process that spanned over three years. It began in late 2019 before being interrupted by COVID-19 a short time later and then re-starting. The end result is a product that is world-class in terms of both performance and aesthetics.

The Nike Vapor Field Utility Special Edition (F.U.S.E.) uniforms combine leading edge fabric technology with a precision fit. The stretch woven body fabric of Nike Vapor F.U.S.E. is made with at least 85% recycled nylon. Lightweight with superior breathability and mobility, it is also the first football uniform to meet Nike Dri-FIT standards for thermal regulation and airflow.

In terms of appearance, the sleek, new Cardinals uniforms feature three different styles:

### HOME UNIFORM

The team's home uniform consists of red jerseys with matching red pants. The jersey features white, perforated twill numbers accented by silver, kiss cut framis material.

Sewn-in twill lettering spells out the "Arizona" wordmark that spans the front and a white thermoplastic polyurethane (TPU) Cardinals birdhead adorns the upper back. Embroidered in white lettering on the inside back of the red jersey's neckline is the phrase "Protect the Nest."





### ALTERNATE BLACK UNIFORM

Also unveiled were the team's alternate uniforms that closely resemble the design of the road ones except that they are black from head to toe rather than white.

Like the white road uniform, the alternate black one also features red perforated numerals - though outlined in silver material – and its sleeves are also adorned with the same red and silver stripes and Cardinals wordmark. Similarly the black pants feature red and silver framis stripes down each side, identical to the white ones.





### AWAY UNIFORM

On the road, the Cardinals will sport an allwhite look from head to toe. Red perforated twill numerals outlined in black pop from the white jersey. In an homage to past Cardinals uniforms, its sleeves feature a pair of red framis stripes surrounding a single silver one with the Cardinals wordmark printed on it.

The upper back of the jersey features a three-color TPU Cardinals birdhead while the inner back neckline is embroidered with "Bird Gang" in red. The uniform's all-white pants are interrupted only by red and silver framis stripes down each side that mimic the stripes on the jersey's sleeves.





### **HELMET RE-DESIGN**

Capping off the new look for the Cardinals is a re-designed helmet. Its white shell gets a subtle silver sparkle from Large Texas Flakes. This complements a new silver facemask that replaces the previous gray one. The helmets front and rear "bumpers" feature rubberized, 3-D Cardinals wordmarks in red.

The Cardinals logo on each side of the helmet is now larger and updated with digital shading and a metallic sheen. The white helmet accompanies the home and paired with the alternate black unif



helmet accompanies the home and road uniforms while a black helmet is paired with the alternate black uniform.



## **ELEVATING A FRANCHISE**

Owner Michael Bidwill has been steering the Cardinals organization for nearly two decades. His leadership during that time has been instrumental in transforming the franchise both on and off the field.

#### Highlights of Bidwill's tenure:

 Michael continues a tradition of Bidwill ownership of the Cardinals that dates back to his grandfather, Hall of Famer Charles Bidwill, who purchased the team in 1933.

• Of the franchise's seven all-time postseason wins, five have come during Michael's tenure leading the organization. Arizona has played in 10 postseason contests over the last 16 seasons, after having appeared in just seven total playoff games prior.

• Arizona has appeared in the NFC Championship Game twice since 2008 including a victory in the 2008 conference title game that led to the franchise's first-ever Super Bowl appearance (Super Bowl XLIII).

• With an 11-6 record in 2021, the Cardinals reached 11+ wins in a season for the sixth time in franchise history. Three of those six 11-win campaigns came with Michael leading the team: 13 in 2015, 11 in 2014, 11 in 2021.

• Among Bidwill's most substantial accomplishments with the Cardinals is the creation of State Farm Stadium. The world-class venue has not only been critical for the franchise but has also resulted in over \$5 billion in economic impact for the state of Arizona.

• On February 12, 2023, State Farm Stadium hosted its third Super Bowl when a record 115 million viewers watched Super Bowl LVII. State Farm Stadium also hosted Super Bowls XLII (following 2007 season) and XLIX (following 2014 season).

• In addition to his role in helping Arizona land three Super Bowls, Michael was also instrumental in getting the 2015 Pro Bowl moved to State Farm Stadium; played a week before Super Bowl XLIX, the two events combined to deliver a record economic impact of \$720 million to the region.

• Since State Farm Stadium opened in 2006, the Cardinals have sold out 171 games at the venue (every non-pandemic game played there).

• In 2022, the Cardinals made their first-ever appearance on Hard Knocks, television's most acclaimed sports reality franchise. Arizona was the second team to be featured on Hard Knocks In Season, which documented the second half of the Cardinals 2022 campaign in real time.

• In January of 2016, the National Football Foundation (NFF) and College Hall of Fame inducted Bidwill and Governor Doug Ducey into the NFF Leadership Hall of Fame.

### **GAUTIER IS 6TH BIDWILL FELLOWSHIP HIRE**

In March, the Cardinals announced the addition of Blaine Gautier (GO-chay) to the coaching staff as the newest participant in the **Bill Bidwill Coaching Fellow**ship program.

ABOUT THE BILL BIDWILL COACHING FELLOWSHIP: The Cardinals established the Bill Bidwill Coaching Fellowship prior to the 2015 season. Gautier is the sixth individual to participate in the program, which is designed to increase diversity and create additional opportunities for coaching experience at the highest lev-el. The three most recent participants advanced from the fellowship to full-time Assistant coach positions – two on the Cardinals coaching staff and one - Jordan Hogan - is a member of the 49ers staff.

Long-time Cardinals owner **Bill Bidwill**, who passed away in 2019, was at the forefront of providing opportunities to individuals regardless of race or gender. In 2010, he was honored with the Fritz Pollard Alliance's Paul "Tank" Younger Award for promoting diversity in the NFL. In 1978, Adele Harris became the first African American female executive in the NFL when she was hired as the Cardinals director of community relations. In 1981, Bidwill hired attorney Bob Wallace, making him the first African American to handle contract negotiations for an NFL club. In 2004, the Cardinals became the first NFL team to have an African American general manager/head coach duo in Graves and Dennis Green.



## **18TH SEASON AT STATE FARM STADIUM**

The Cardinals are in their 18<sup>th</sup> regular season at State Farm Stadium. Arizona earned its second home win of the 2023 season with their come-from-behind 25-23 victory over the Atlanta Falcons in Week 10. Arizona will go for its third home win in the regular season finale vs. the Seattle Seahawks.

### BETMGM SPORTSBOOK AT STATE FARM STADIUM

Last year, the Cardinals and BetMGM debuted the first sportsbook at an NFL stadium. The BetMGM Sportsbook at State Farm Stadium is a two-story, 17,000-square-foot entertainment destination featuring state-of-the-art sports wagering amenities, concert-hosting facilities, a gourmet grille and bar and a variety of screens to watch games.

"We are proud and thrilled to be the NFL's first team to offer its fans this type of unprecedented amenity and innovativé experience," Cardinals owner Mi-chael Bidwill said at



the opening. "The BetMGM Sportsbook at State Farm Stadium gives us a chance to engage current and potential fans on a year-round basis in a fun, entertaining and responsible way.

Located on The Great Lawn, the BetMGM Sportsbook at State Farm Stadium operates on both event and non-event days, offering guests a massive 265-square-foot video wall, 38 TVs and indoor-and-outdoor dining options.

Throughout the year, the BetMGM Sportsbook at State Farm Stadium serves as an outdoor music and comedy concert amphitheater, hosting events for audiences gathered on The Great Lawn.

Selected by the Cardinals in the second round (36th overall) of the 2017 NFL Draft out of Washington, Baker has appeared in 102 games (92 starts) during the regular season.

• A five-time Pro Bowl selection, three-time All-Pro honoree, one-time NFC Defensive Player of the Month (Oct. 2020) and one-time NFC Defensive Player of the Week (Week 6 in 2020).

#### **NFL LEADER**

 The 2022 season marked his fourth season with 100+ tackles. Dating back to his first season as a starter in 2018, Baker is the only DB in the NFL with at least four seasons of 100+ tackles.

• Since entering the league in 2017, leads all NFL DBs in total tackles (695) and solo tackles (495) which are 39 and 47 more than the players who rank second in both categories (Kevin Byard - 656 and Harrison Smith - 448).

#### **CARDINALS HISTORY**

• Voted a team captain for the fourth consecutive year (2020-23) and earned his fifth Pro Bowl selection as a starter (fourth consecutive at safety) in 2022.

 Became just the third player in Cardinals history to receive at least five Pro Bowl selections in his first six NFL seasons joining Patrick Peterson (6) and Ollie Matson (6).

• Has made 396-of-474 FG attempts (83.5%) and 571-of-587 PATs (97.3%) in his 247 career games after entering the league as an undrafted rookie free agent with Detroit in 2006.

• Ranks first among active NFL players with 1,759 career points. In 2023, he became just the 19th player in NFL history – and the second active player – to reach 1,700 career points.

• Holds NFL records for career FGs of 50+ yards (79), most PATs in a single season (75), consecu-tive made FGs of 50+ yards (14), consecutive FGs conversions of 55+ yards (seven) and previously held the league record for the longest FG made (64 yards). • In Cardinals history, a player has had at least five made FGs of 50+ yards in a season five times, and Prater is responsible for three of those campaigns (7 in 2021, 5 in '22 & 8 in '23).

• In his first season with Arizona in 2021, established a franchise record and tied his then career high with seven made FGs of 50+ yards during the regular season (broke his own record with eight in 2023), including a franchise record 62-yarder in Week 2 vs. Minnesota (tied his own re-cord Week 3 of 2023 vs. Dallas). **Kyler Murray** – Won the 2018 Heisman Trophy, selected ninth overall in the 2018 MLB Draft and first overall in the 2019 NFL Draft, earned 2019 AP NFL Offensive Rookie of the Year, is a two-time Pro Bowler and four-time team captain.

**Clayton Tune** – Scored his first career TD, a one-yard run, in Week 10 vs. Atlanta. Made his first NFL start in Week 9 at Cleveland. Arizona's fifth-round (139th overall) draft choice out of Houston. Played 47 games and completed 956-of-1,497 passes for 11,994 yards and 104 TDs with the Cougars.

### **RUNNING BACKS**

**Michael Carter** – Claimed off waivers by Arizona from the Jets on 11/15/23. Three-year NFL veteran who has totaled 1,856 career scrimmage yards (1,150 rushing and 706 receiving).

**James Conner** – Two-time Pro Bowler (2018, 2021) who signed with Arizona in 2021 after four seasons (2017-20) with Pittsburgh. Has scored 31 TDs in 38 games with the Cardinals.

**Emari Demercado** – Led the team with 78 rushing yards in Week 8 vs. Baltimore and 58 rushing yards in Week 7 at Seattle. Ranks third in rushing yards (274) and first in rushing TDs (2) among undrafted rookies this season. Rushed for 1,615 yards and 10 TDs on 338 career carries at TCU.

### TIGHT ENDS

**Elijah Higgins** – Claimed off waivers from Miami on 8/30/23. Caught his first career TD last week vs. San Francisco and finished with four catches for 44 yards. Played WR at Stanford and led the team in receptions (59) and receiving yards (704) in 2022.

**Trey McBride** – With 10 receptions last Sunday vs. San Francisco, he has 66 this season which is the most by a TE in a season in franchise history. The 10 catches also matched the single-game franchise record for TEs, which he set in Week 8. Ranks sixth among NFL TEs in catches (66) and receiving yards (712) in 2023. Originally a second-round draft pick by Arizona in 2022 out of Colorado State.

**Geoff Swaim** – Signed with AZ on 7/25/23. A nine-year NFL veteran who has played 100 career games (65 starts) with the Cowboys (2015-18), Jaguars (2019), Titans (2020-22) and Cardinals (2023). Has 110 career catches for 846 yards.

**Blake Whiteheart** – Made NFL debut in Week 11 at Hou. Signed with AZ as an undrafted rookie free agent out of Wake Forest where he spent five years (2018-22) and appeared in 50 games with 44 receptions for 541 yards and six TDs.

### WIDE RECEIVERS

**Marquise Brown** – Acquired by Arizona from the Ravens in a draft-day trade in 2022. Ranks second on the team in receptions (51), receiving yards (574) and leads the Cardinals in TD catches (four) in 2023. Has caught 28 TD passes in his career, only two 2019 draft picks have more TD catches (A.J. Brown - 42, DK Metcalf - 42).

**Greg Dortch** – Scored his first TD of the season, a sixyard catch, in Week 12 vs. LAR. Set season highs with six receptions for 76 yards in Week 11 in Houston. Had a careerlong 49-yard punt return in Week 10 vs. Atlanta, the longest by a Cardinal since 2014. Joined AZ as a free agent in 2021.

**Rondale Moore** – Has 159 rushing yards this season and 230 in his career, both of which are the second-most by a WR in franchise history. Originally a second-round pick (49th overall) by Arizona in 2021 out of Purdue.

**Zach Pascal** – Has 169 receptions for 2,047 yards and 16 TDs over 92 games played (47 starts) with Indianapolis (2018-21), Philadelphia (2022) and Arizona (2023).

**Michael Wilson** – Had seven catches for 76 yards and two TDs in Week 4 at SF becoming just the third Cardinals rookie in the last 20 years to have multiple TD catches in a game. His 15.5 yards per catch are the second most among rookies. Selected by AZ in the third round in 2023 out of Stanford.

### OFFENSIVE LINE

**Kelvin Beachum** – Selected by Pittsburgh in the seventh round (248th overall) in 2012 and has started 148 of 160 games played with the Steelers (2012-15), Jaguars (2016), Jets (2017-19) and Cardinals (2020-23). Only player to start every game on offense for Arizona in 2022.

**Trystan Colon** – Claimed off waivers by Arizona from the Jets on 8/30/23. Made his Cardinals debut 11 days later at Washington. Has appeared in 11 games (four starts) this season. Spent first three NFL seasons with Baltimore (2020-22) where he appeared in 20 games (four starts).

**Dennis Daley** – Joined the Cardinals as a free agent after four seasons with the Panthers (2019-21) and Titans (2022). Helped pave the way for Derrick Henry to rush for 1,538 yards in 2022, the second-most in the NFL. Made his first start with Arizona in Week 9 at Cleveland.

**Hjalte Froholdt** – Part of an offensive line that did not allow a sack in Week 2 against the Giants. Has started every game at C in 2023. Has appeared in 45 games (20 starts) in five seasons with NE (2019-20), Cleveland (2021-22) and Arizona (2023). Native of Denmark.

**Will Hernandez** – Part of an offensive line that blocked for 234 yards in Week 15 vs. SF, the most by the team in a single game since 2020. A second-round pick by the Giants in 2018, signed with Arizona as a free agent in the 2022 offseason. Has started all 27 games he has appeared in at RG for AZ.

**D.J. Humphries** – Cardinals first-round pick (24th overall) in 2015 out of Florida, has started all 95 NFL games played, including all 85 at LT since 2016. Longest tenured Cardinal.

**Keith Ismael** – Joined Arizona via waivers on 8/30/23. Appeared in 18 games (five starts) over his first two seasons in the NFL (2020-21) with Washington before spending the 2022 season on the 49ers practice squad. Made his AZ debut in Week 2 vs. NYG. Has seen action in 10 games in 2023.

**Paris Johnson Jr.** – Cardinals first-round pick (6th overall) in 2023 out of Ohio State. Appeared in 31 games (26 starts) for OSU and earned unanimous first-team All-American honors as a junior in 2022. His father, Paris Sr., was a fifth-round pick by AZ in 1999. Has started at RT in every game in 2023.

**Carter O'Donnell** – Has started three games at RG this season. Claimed off of waivers on 9/4/23 after three years (2020-22) with the Colts. Native of Red Deer, Alberta.

Elijah Wilkinson – Prior to Arizona, spent time with Denver (2017-20), Chicago (2021) and Atlanta (2022). Helped block for a 1,000-yard rusher in four of his six seasons in the NFL.

### **SPECIALISTS**

**Aaron Brewer** – Has played 112 games with AZ, the most of any active Cardinal. Entered the league with the Broncos as a rookie free agent and has played 176 regular season and nine playoff games with Denver (2012-15) and Arizona (2016-23).

**Blake Gillikin** – Signed with Arizona on 10/3/23 following two seasons with the Saints (2021-22). Successfully ran for a 10-yard first down on a fake punt in Week 12 vs. the Rams. Has 42 punts for 2,115 yards (50.4 avg.) in 2023. His 50.4 average is the fourth highest in the NFL.

**Matt Prater** – Two-time Pro Bowler (2013, 2016) who ranks second among active NFL players in career points (1,759). Holds the NFL record for FGs of 50+ yards (79). Joined Arizona in 2021 after 14 seasons with the Lions, Broncos and Falcons. Ranks 15th all-time in NFL history in career points and 13th in career FGs (396).

**Naquan Jones** – Joined the Cardinals on 11/10/23 and was promoted to the team's active roster on 12/5/23. Appeared in 32 games (seven starts) and totaled 53 tackles, 3.5 sacks and two passes defensed in three seasons with the Tennessee Titans (2021-23). Made his Cardinals debut last week vs. SF.

**Jonathan Ledbetter** – Originally signed with Miami as a rookie free agent in 2019, has played in 27 games (15 starts) with the Dolphins (2019-20) and Cardinals (2021-23). Has started every game he has appeared in this season and established career highs in tackles (44) and sacks (1.5).

**Roy Lopez** – Made his first start with Arizona in Week 12 vs. the Rams. Has 35 tackles (one for loss) in 10 games since signing with the team on 9/23/23. Tempe, AZ native who spent his first two seasons (2021-22) with the Texans after being selected by Houston in the sixth round in 2021.

**Dante Stills** – Has 42 tackles, 3.5 sacks and 1 FR this season. He is the first Cardinals rookie since 2011 to have 3.5 sacks and 1 FR in his rookie campaign. Cards sixth-round pick in 2023 out of West Virginia. WVU's all-time leader in TFLs (52.5) and a four-time All-Big 12 honoree. Is the fourth member of his family to play in the NFL.

**Kevin Strong** – Five-year NFL veteran who's appeared in 49 games with Detroit (2019-21), Tennessee (2021-22) and Arizona (2023). Has 2.5 sacks in his last nine games after having just one sack in the first 40 games of his career.

### **LINEBACKERS**

**Krys Barnes** – Intercepted Texans QB C.J. Stroud and followed up with a 46-yard return in Week 11 in Houston. Became just the fourth Cardinals LB with an INT return of 45+ yards since 2000. Began his career as an undrafted free agent with Green Bay in 2020 where he spent three seasons (2020-22) before joining the Cardinals in free agency.

**Zaven Collins** – Selected by the Cardinals in the first round (16th overall) in 2021 out of Tulsa. Had an INT and a fumble recovery in Week 1, becoming the first Cardinal to do so in a game since 2016. Has 3.5 sacks this season after switching positions to OLB.

**Victor Dimukeje** – Selected by Arizona in the sixth round (210th overall) in 2021 out of Duke. Has played in all 14 games (four starts) in 2023. After not having a sack in his first two seasons, has 4.0 in 2023.

**Dennis Gardeck** – Named a Pro Bowl alternate (special teams) in 2019 and 2022. Selected as a team captain each of the last four seasons (2020-23). Signed by Arizona as an undrafted free agent out of Sioux Falls in 2018. Leads the team with 5.0 sacks this season.

**Jesse Luketa** – Made the first start of his NFL career at FB in Week 5 vs. Cincinnati. Selected by Arizona in the seventh round (256th overall) in 2022 out of Penn State. A native of Ottawa, Ontario, has seen action in 18 games as a Cardinal.

**BJ Ojulari** – With 1.0 sacks in Week 11 at Houston and 2.0 sacks in Week 10 vs. Atlanta, Ojulari became just the second Cardinals rookie since 2012 to have a sack in back-to-back games. His 4.0 sacks this season are tied for the fifth most among rookies. Cardinals second-round pick in 2023 out of LSU. Brother is New York Giants LB Azeez Ojulari.

**Owen Pappoe** – Cardinals fifth-round pick in 2023 out of Auburn. Started 41 games, had 256 tackles and was a two-time captain for the Tigers. Has seen action in 13 games and has five special teams tackles in 2023.

**Tyreke Smith** – Signed with the team from Seattle's practice squad on 12/15/23. Has appeared in one game and registered one tackle in his NFL career. Originally a fifth-round pick in 2022 out of Ohio State.

Cameron Thomas – A third-round pick (87th overall) out of

San Diego State, played in all 17 games and had 18 tackles and 3.0 sacks as a rookie in 2022. Scored his first career TD when he recovered a QB Sam Howell fumble in Week 1 this season. Brother, Zachary, plays OL for the Rams.

**Ezekiel Turner** – Signed with Arizona as an undrafted rookie free agent out of Washington in 2018. Has blocked two punts and notched 56 special teams tackles in 77 career games. Led the team with nine tackles in Week 4 at San Francisco.

**Josh Woods** – Has established career highs in games started (7) and tackles (61) this season in addition to registering his first forced fumble, pass defensed and partial sack. Originally an UDFA with the Bears, spent five seasons with Chicago (2019-21) and Detroit (2021-22) before signing with Arizona.

#### **DEFENSIVE BACKS**

**Budda Baker** – Arizona's 2017 second-round pick (36th overall) out of Washington is a five-time Pro Bowler (2017, '19-22), three-time team captain (2020-22) and earned 2020 first-team All-Pro honors. Appeared in his 100th NFL game in Week 12 vs. the Rams.

**Joey Blount** – Signed with the team on 9/18/23 and was promoted to the active roster on 10/3/23. Forced a fumble on special teams in back-to-back games (Weeks 6-7), becoming the first Cardinal in at least the last 20 seasons to do so. Spent his rookie season with Seattle where he signed as an undrafted rookie free agent out of Virginia in 2022.

**Andre Chachere** – Has appeared in all 14 games (four starts) this season where he's had 21 tackles and two passes defensed. San Jose State product who spent the previous two seasons with the Eagles (2021-22).

**Kei'Trel Clark** – Selected by Arizona in the sixth round (180th overall) in 2023 out of Louisville. Had 10 tackles and two passes defensed in Week 3 vs. Dallas joining S Budda Baker as the only Cardinals rookies to have 10+ tackles and two passes defensed in a game since at least 1999.

Antonio Hamilton Sr. – Eight-year NFL veteran. Has appeared in 95 games (15 starts) with the Raiders (2016-17), Giants (2018-19), Chiefs (2020) and Cardinals (2021-23). Had the second INT of his career in Week 11 in Houston after intercepting Texans QB C.J. Stroud.

**Qwuantrezz Knight** – Joined Arizona's active roster on 9/18/23 from San Francisco's practice squad where he spent his rookie season (2022). Finished his college career at UCLA where he earned second-team All-Pac 12 honors in 2021. Has appeared in five games since joining Arizona.

**Starling Thomas V** – Has appeared in nine games (four starts) in '23. Made four tackles (one for loss) and one pass defensed in his first NFL start in Week 7 at Seattle. Signed as an undrafted rookie free agent with Detroit before being claimed off of waivers by Arizona on 8/30/23. Earned first-team All-Conference USA honors as a senior at UAB in 2022.

Jalen Thompson – Selected by Arizona in the fifth-round of the 2019 NFL Supplemental Draft out of Washington State. Had 100+ tackles in each of the last two seasons. Had an INT in back-to-back games after intercepting Matthew Stafford in Week 12 vs. Los Angeles and having an INT and a sack the week before in Houston. He became just the second Cardinals DB to have a sack and an INT in a single game since 2011.

**Garrett Williams** – Intercepted QB Geno Smith in his NFL debut in Week 7 at Seattle. Selected by Arizona in the third round (72nd overall) in 2023 out of Syracuse. Spent four years with the Orange and appeared in 32 games (28 starts) and registered 152 tackles and 27 passes defensed.

**Marco Wilson** – Selected by Arizona in the fourth-round (136th overall) in 2021 out of Florida. Has started 37-of-42 games played. Had two INTs of Buccaneers QB Tom Brady in Week 16 of 2022. Led the team in INTs (3) and passes defensed (10) in 2022.

The Cardinals traveled to Washington to not only open the 2023 regular season but also usher in a new era in team history. It marked the first game under first-year head coach Jonathan Gannon and general manager Monti Ossenfort as well as the Cardinals debut for 22 players, most notably starting QB Joshua Dobbs in his first game action with the club. Playing at times in both brilliant sunshine and a driving rain, Arizona took advantage of six sacks and three takeaways to claim a 16-10 lead early in the third quarter. However, the Commanders converted two second half fumbles into points and emerged with a 20-16 week 1 victory.

Washington opened the scoring on the game's third series when Sam Howell's 8-yard TD pass to WR Brian Robinson put the hosts up 7-0; the drive was aided by two personal fouls flagged against AZ along with a 37-yard defensive pass interference penalty. The Cards answered with their own scoring drive as Dobbs completions to WRs Hollywood Brown and Rondale Moore covered 29 and 31 yards, respectively and set-up Matt Prater's 28-yard FG. LB Zaven Collins halted the next Commanders' drive with an INT off Howell that set the AZ offense up at the Washington 37. The pick led to another Prater FG, this one from 54 yards that made it 7-6. The ensuing drive saw the Commanders' drive with an INT off Howell that set the AZ offense up at the Washington in the first half, the Cardinals' third takeaway of the game put points directly on the scoreboard and put AZ up 13-7; LB Dennis Gardeck chased down Howell deep in Washington territory, forcing a fumble that LB Cameron Thomas scooped up at the 2 and took into the end zone with :55 left in the first half. That was enough time for Washington to move into position for a 30-yard Joey Slye FG that cut Arizona's lead to 13-10 on the last play before intermission.

Arizona got the ball first after halftime and Dobbs completed 7 of 9 passes for 50 yards to set up a 37-yard Prater FG that put AZ up 16-10 early in the third. It remained that way until 90 seconds remained in the quarter when the Cards faced a 3rd-n-15 at their own 35. DE Marcus Sweat hit Dobbs as he was throwing, forcing a fumble that the Commanders recovered at the 29. Six plays later, they faced a 3rd-n-goal at the 6 when Howell scrambled for the go-ahead score. With 4:44 to go and down by one, the Cards had the ball at their own 40 but a mishandled center exchange turned it over to the Commanders, who took over at the AZ22 following an unsportsmanlike penalty. Slye's 33-yard FG put Washington up 20-16 with 2:23 to play. The Cards would get no closer as the ensuing drive ended with an incompletion of 4th down.

Making their regular season home debut, the Cardinals faced the Giants in week 2 at State Farm Stadium in week 2. It was truly a tale of two halves. Behind QB Josh Dobbs and a tenacious defense down four starters (including all-pro safety Budda Baker), Arizona scored 20 points in the opening two quarters while pitching a first half shutout. However, in quarters 3 & 4, the Giants outscored the hosts 31-8 enroute to a 31-28 comeback victory that evened their record at 1-1 and dropped the Cards to 0-2. RB James Conner finished with 106 rushing yards on 23 carries and a TD for the Cardinals. Dobbs was 21 of 31 for 228 yards through the air with a passing TD and another rushing while playing turnover-free football.

The first half was all Arizona, who not only led 20-0 at intermission but held decisive statistical edges in first downs (16-5), total yards (241-81) and time of possession (19:09-10:51). The only Cards possession that didn't produce points was their first on which a deep Dobbs pass to TE Zach Ertz was just inches from a huge gain down the left sideline and Matt Prater's 55-yard FG try was just wide to the left. But after forcing a 3-n-out, RB James Conner capped a 9-play, 86-yard drive with his 4-yard TD run; one of the biggest plays on it was a 21-yard completion to rookie WR Michael Wilson on 3rd-n-7 from the NY 39. A Dennis Gardeck 3rd down sack of Daniel Jones ended the next Giants possession and was followed by another lengthy AZ scoring drive. This one covered 80 yards in 7 plays and put AZ up 10-0 on the first play of the 2nd quarter when Dobbs scrambled 23 yards and bowled over a Giants defender to reach the end zone. The run was a career-long for Dobbs as well as his first career runshing TD. The ensuing Giants series reached the AZ36 but on 2nd-n-8 from there, Jones' pass attempt deflected off the hands of RB Saquon Barkley and was picked off by FS Jalen Thompson. His 35-yard return took it to the NY 34 and led to a 44-yard Prater FG that made it 20-0 with 1:09 remaining in the 2nd quarter. The Giants tried for points before intermission but a Zaven Collins sack effectively ended the half.

The New York turnaround began on the 3rd quarter's first play from scrimmage when a deep Jones completion to WR Jalin Hyatt covered 58 yards to the AZ17. Two plays later, Jones kept around the left end and scored from 14 yards out. Arizona counterpunched immediately with a 22-yard Conner run on the drive's first play. In all on the drive, Conner ran for 53 of its 75 yards and Dobbs ended it with his 3-yard TD pass to WR Hollywood Brown; a Dobbs run for a 2-point conversion made it 28-7 with 13:43 left in the third quarter. However, the Giants would storm back with consecutive TD drives of 75 and 80 yards, respectively. The first ended on a 1-yard Barkley TD run and he capped the second with his 9-yard catch of a Jones pass that trimmed Arizona's lead to 28-21 midway through the fourth. Following a 3-n-out by the Card's offense, NY moved 64 yards in 6 plays and tied the game on a Jones TD pass of 11 yards to WR Isaiah Hodgins. Now tied at 28 with 4:25 remaining, the Giants again forced an Arizona punt. The ensuing drive started at their own 28 but moved to the AZ20 in 4 plays, setting up a 34-yard Graham Gano FG with 0:19 left that proved to be the game winner.

The Cardinals entered week 3 looking for their first win of the season. Standing in their way was a 2-0 Dallas team that had won its first two games by 60 combined points (40-0 and 30-10), boasted the league's #1 defense, had not committed a turnover and led the NFL in takeaways. But like they had in the season's first two games, Arizona would find itself with a double-digit lead in the second half. This time the Cardinals would not relinquish it. Led by QB Josh Dobbs, the Cardinals offense scored on all five of its first half possessions and finished the day with 400 yards of offense including 222 on the ground. RB James Conner accounted for 116 yards from scrimmage, including 98 on 14 rushes with a TD run. The defense allowed just one TD and three FGs and came up with a huge late takeaway to seal the 28-16 victory. It marked Arizona's first win under the leadership of new GM Monti Ossenfort and head coach Jonathan Gannon as well as the first career win as a starter for Dobbs.

Arizona got the ball first and on the game's second play, Dobbs kept it around the left end on a designed run, gaining 44 yards to the Dallas 29. That rush set-up a 39-yard Matt Prater FG that gave the Cards an early 3-0 lead and marked the first time the Cowboys trailed all season. After a Dallas 3-n-out, Arizona moved 82 yards in 7 plays and Conner ran it in from 5 yards out; a Cowboys penalty on the PAT try resulted in the Cards going for 2 but the run failed and the AZ lead was 9-0. Brandon Aubrey's 49-yard FG on the ensuing Cowboys drive made it 9-3 early in the opening quarter. Arizona then moved 30 yards to the Dallas 45 before hitting on another explosive play. This time WR Rondale Moore lined up in the backfield and took an inside handoff before rocketing down the middle of the field for a 45-yard TD run. Trailing 15-3, Dallas answered with 5:32 remaining in the 2nd quarter when RB Rico Dowdell scored on a 15-yard form Dax Prescott. But with 1:28 left in the half, Prater's 43-yard FG capped a Diag, 50-yard drive that put AZ up 18-10. After the Cardinals defense forced a Dallas punt, AZ took over at its own 31 with :21 left and two timeouts. Dobbs quickly moved the Cards to the DAL44 in 4 plays and as the half expired, Prater tied his own franchise record with a 62-yard FG. The line-drive boot put Arizona up 21-10 at intermission.

Dallas opened the third quarter by driving to the AZ8 before the Cardinals defense forced them to settle for a 27-yard Aubrey FG. It was the first of four straight second half possessions that saw Dallas advance inside the Arizona 10 but they resulted in just six total points (two field goals, turnover on downs and an INT). The following Dallas drive reached the 4 but on 4th-n-3 from there, the Cards forced an incompletion to halt the threat. The Cowboys then advanced to the Arizona 8 but no further and Aubrey's 26-yard FG cut the Cardinals lead to five (21-16) with 9:33 remaining in the 4th quarter. On the very next play from scrimmage, however, Dobbs found rookie WR Michael Wilson wide open downfield and that 69-yard catch-n-run quickly set the offense up at the Dallas 7. Two plays later, Hollywood Brown hauled in a 2-yard TD pass from Dobbs on 3rd-n-goal and the Cards were up 28-16 with 7:22 left. The Cowboys responded by moving to Arizona 5 but Prescott's 3rd-n-goal pass into the middle of the end zone was intercepted by LB Kyzir White. The turnover was Dallas' first of the season and gave the ball back to the Arizona's offense with 3:00 to go. Three Conner runs and a pair of Dobbs QB keepers allowed Arizona to run out the remaining time and secure the upset win.

### WEEK 4 Arizona Cardinals 16, San Francisco 49ers 35 71,521 📕 Levi's Stadium 📕 Oct 1, 2023

On a sunny week 4 afternoon in the Bay Area, the Cardinals faced an undefeated Niners team that was averaging 30 points a game on offense and allowing just 14 on defense. The hosts jumped out early and took a 21-3 lead with 5:22 to play in the second quarter. Arizona would battle back to trim the deficit to 5 at 21-16 late in the third quarter but would pull no closer. The 49ers held just a 33-yard advantage in total net yards (395 to 362), 19 yards in net rushing (124 to 105) and 14 yards in net passing (271 to 257). But San Francisco RB Christian McCaffrey scored four TDs (three on the ground) while QB Brock Purdy completed 20 of 21 passes and recorded both a passing and rushing touchdown. It added up to a 35-16 Niners win that was their 14th consecutive in the regular season. Arizona was led by QB Joshua Dobbs who passed for 265 yards with two TDs and no interceptions. Rookie WR Michael Wilson finished with 76 yards on 7 catches and recorded his first two career TD receptions.

San Francisco claimed a 14-0 lead with McCaffrey TDs on its first two possessions. The first was a 1-yard run that capped an 8-play, 62-yard drive; the other drive went 75 yards in 9 plays and McCaffrey ended by hauling in a backwards pass from Purdy and taking it 18 yards to the end zone. Arizona would draw to within 14-3 when its next drive ended with Matt Prater's 38-yard FG; the key play was Dobbs' 8-yard first down run when the Cards went for it on 4th-n-7 at their own 45. The next series saw San Fran WR Brandon Aiyuk haul in a 42-yard pass between two defenders and that series and FG; the key plays and pulled to within 21-10 when Dobbs and Wilson connected on a 16-yard TD pass with 0:23 left in the second quarter. The drive included another key 4th down conversion, this one on a fake punt on 4th-n-2 at the AZ21 when up-man Ezekiel Turner took a direct snap and picked up the first down.

After forcing a 49ers punt on the opening drive of the third quarter, the Cards took over inside their own 1-yard line. But Dobbs completed 4 of 4 passes for 61 yards and ran twice for 10 yards and capped the 99-yard drive with another TD pass to Wilson, this one from 8 yards away. After the two-point try was unsuccessful, San Fran's lead was just 5 with 4:12 to go in the third. The Niners would produce long TD drives on their next two possessions that combined to chew more than 12 minutes off the clock. Arizona's two fourth quarter drives would penetrate 49ers territory but neither produced points and the Cards fell by a final score of 35-16.

In week 6, the Bengals made just their second-ever visit to State Farm Stadium, facing the Cardinals in a match-up of 1-3 teams. The visitors jumped out to an early 10-0 advantage before Arizona stormed back to lead 14-10 midway though the second. But a huge momentum swing took place late in the second quarter and early in the third. Cincy took advantage of 3 takeaways to outscore AZ 24-6 the rest of the way to earn a 34-20 victory. The Bengals were led by their two best offensive players as WR Ja'Marr Chase had 15 catches for 192 yards and three TDs on passes from QB Joe Burrow who completed 36 of 46 attempts for 317 yards. A Cardinals team that had already been hit hard by injuries suffered two more key ones in the second quarter when both RB James Conner (knee) and S Jalen Thompson (hamstring) exited and did not return.

The Bengals opened the scoring and took a 10-0 lead after their first two offensive possessions. On the first, Burrow completed 7 of 7 passes for 56 yards and ended it when he found Chase in the back of the end zone on 3rd-n-goal from the 2. Cincy's next drive started at the AZ48 after a 28-yard Trenton Irwin punt return. It would advance to the AZ7 and the Bengals had it 1st-n-goal from there. But after a pair of stops, DL Kevin Strong sacked Burrow for a 15-yard loss on 3rd-n-goal and Evan McPherson's 40-yard f6 put Cincinnati up 10-0 late in the first. Cards OB Josh Dobbs then led the Cardinals 75 yards in 9 plays on the ensuing drive and pulled AZ to within 10-7 when he dropped a perfect pass right into the arms of WR Marquise Brown for a 25-yard TD down the right sideline. On that series, Dobbs was 4 for 5 for 67 yards and the only incompletion was an athletic throwaway to avoid a sack. Arizona's defense forced a 3-n-out on the next series when DL Dante Stills sacked Burrow on 3rd down. Greg Dortch's 16-yard punt return and an unnecessary roughness penalty allowed the Cards to start the next drive at the CIN49. On its 2nd play, Conner was initially bottled up before spinning out of trouble, reversing field and picking up 35 yards to the Bengals 14; unfortunately he injured his knee on the play and did not return. That Conner run set up a 2-yard Dobbs TD pass to TE Zach Ertz that put AZ up 14-10 with 8:28 to go in the 2nd quarter. With two minutes to play before halftime the teams traded huge momentum shifts. First, Burrow have dnis offense inside the AZ5 before the Cards turned Cincy away on both 3rd and 4th down Joe Mixon runs from the 1 thanks to tackles by CB Antonio Hamilton and S K'VOn Wallace, respectively. But two plays later, Dobbs threw his first INT of the year (after a franchise record 137 attempts without one) when CB Cam Taylor-Britt snagged the ball at the 11 and returned it for a TD that put the Bengals up 17-14 at halftime.

On the second half's third play from scrimmage, Burrow went deep to Chase and hit him with a 63-yard scoring pass that made it 24-15 just 81 seconds into the 3rd quarter. Midway through the stanza, the Cards moved 75 yards in 11 plays on a TD drive; its final 3 plays were runs by undrafted rookie RB Emair Demarcado - subbing for Conner - that covered 8, 9 and 11 yards, the last of which he took into the end zone for his first career TD. That cut the Cincy lead to 24-20 after the PAT kick failed. On the next drive, the Bengals reached the AZ45 and faced a 3rd-n-7 from three when Wallace intercepted Burrow to get the ball back for the Cardinals offense. On the next play from scrimmage, WR Rondale Moore took a direct snap and raced 41 yards around the left end for a 41-yard gain to the CIN25. Three plays later, AZ went for it on 4th-n-1 at the 16 but were turned away when Dobbs was stopped on a designed run. From there, Cincy moved 83 yards in 15 plays and went up 31-20 when Burrow connected with Chase on their 3rd TD of the game, a 3-yarder in the back of the end zone. On the next play from scrimmage, the Bengals sacked Dobbs forcing a fumble that they recovered at the AZ28. That set-up McPherson's 40-yard FG that provided the game's final points.

Facing the Rams in a week 6 divisional road game, an Arizona team accustomed to missing key players was down two more as RB James Conner and FS Jalen Thompson were out with injuries. Nonetheless, the Cardinals led at halftime after dominating the first opening two quarters. While they held significant statistical advantages in offensive plays (42-20), net rushing yards (103-5), first downs (11-4) and time of possession (20:58-9:02), the Cards only led 9-6 following the field goal-only first half. That was not enough cushion to hold off the host Rams, who scored on their first four drives after intermission (TD, FG, TD, FG) while keeping the Cardinals led Earth and cardinals of the scoreboard and capitalizing on two fourth quarter takeways. It all added up to a 26-9 win for Los Angeles, who 3-3 while dropping AZ to 1-5.

The Cardinals got the ball to start the game and put the first points on the board thanks to a 55-yard Matt Prater field goal. The drive's key play came on the 3rd snap from scrimmage when QB Josh Dobbs scrambled for 24 yards on 3rd-n-10 from the 25. The AZ defense forced a Rams punt on the ensuing series marking the first time all season LA hadn't scored on its opening possession. Arizona then drove from its own 7 to the LA40 but a sack on 3rd-n-2 from there pushed them out of field goal range. Austin Trammell returned the ensuing punt 30 yards to the LA41 and a play later, a Cooper Kupp catch gained 36 yards to the AZ16. The AZ defense held them to a FG try and Brett Maher's 20-yarder tied the game late in the first quarter. LA then forced a Cardinals punt but Trammell lost the ball on a hit by Joey Blount and Bobby Price recovered at the LA17. The takeaway set-up a 32-yardP Prater FG that put the Cards up 6-3 with 12:35 left in the 2nd quarter. The Rams went 3-n-out on the next series thanks to a 3rd down sack from LB Kyzir White and AZ's offense took over at its own 41 after the punt. The Cards reached the LA36 but a sneak on 3rd-n-1 from there was stopped. They went for it on 4th-n-6 after an offensive offside penalty pushed it back 5 but came away empty when Hollywood Brown couldn't get his feet down in bounds on a deep pass down the right sideline. LB Victor Dimukeje's 3rd down sack off Matthew 14 possession. AZ took over at its own 24 with 5:01 in the half and on 3rd-n-13 at the 25, Dobbs again scrambled for a big gain - a 20 yarder to the AZ46. Another Prater FG, this one from 27 yards out, gave the Cards a 9-3 lead with 0:43 left before halftime. On the next play from scrimmage, Stafford hit Kupp with a deep pass down the middle for a gain of 49 yards to the AZ26. That set-up a 35-yard FG that trimmed Arizona's lead to 9-6 at intermission.

The Rams opened the second half with a ground-heavy drive, rushing on its first 10 plays to reach the AZ13; on 3rd-n-9 from there Stafford hit Kupp just inside the right pylon for a TD and LA took its first lead at 13-9. Following a 3-n-out from the Cardinals, the Rams again advanced deep into AZ territory and reached the AZ6 in 6 plays. They would get no further, however, and Maher's 25-yard FG extended the lead to 16-9. Down a TD, Dobbs led the Cards to the LA12 but disaster struck on the first play of the fourth quarter. His pass to Zach Ertz deflected off the TE's hand and was intercepted by LB Christian Rozeboom at the 12. The Rams proceeded to move 88 yards in 12 plays and Williams'5-yard TD run put them up 14 with 8:19 remaining. Arizona's comeback hopes were effectively dashed on the next drive when Dobbs lost the ball while being sacked and LA recovered at the AZ3. That led to Maher's 43-yard FG that provided the game's final points.

The Cardinals (1-5) traveled to Seattle for a week 7 divisional game against the Seahawks (3-2). They were bolstered by the return of all-pro safety Budda Baker, who had missed the previous five games with a hamstring injury, as well as the debut of rookie corner Garrett Williams, who hadn't played since suffering a knee injury the year before in college. Against a Seahawks team that had committed just 3 turnovers all season, Arizona enjoyed a 3-0 edge in takeaways (2 fumble recoveries and an INT). The Cards ran for 127 yards against Seattle's 5th-ranked run defense that had been allowing just 79.2 yards per game, including 58 from undrafted rookie Emari Demercado, who started for the injured James Conner. Unfortunately, AZ would only score 3 points off those 3 takeaways and struggled to find an offensive rhythm in falling 20-10 to the Seahawks.

Seattle's opening drive penetrated Arizona territory thanks in part to a 31-yard completion from Geno Smith to WR Jake Bobo. However, a Zaven Collins sack of Smith pushed them back 10 and helped to force a punt. The next Seahawks series started at their own 39 but they moved 61 yards in 3 plays; an 8-yard completion, a 25-yard Kenneth Walker run and a 28-yard TD reception by rookie WR Jaxon Smith-Njigma for the game's first score. The Cards would then go 3-n-out but on the punt return, Arizona's Joey Blount forced a fumble for the second straight week. This time it was DeeJay Dallas who coughed it up and Dennis Gardeck recovered for the Cardinals at the Seattle 30. The takeaway led to a 44-yard Matt Prater FG that made it 7-3 late in the first quarter. The Cards defense then forced a Seattle punt and following the touchback, the offense took over at the 20. An 18-yard run from Demercado took it to the SEA49. On a 1st-n-10 play from the 20, a Josh Dobbs pass into the end zone was intercepted by Seattle. However, it was wiped off by a roughing the passer penalty that was followed by a tussle involving multiple players from both teams. When the dust settled, there were offsetting personal foul penalties, LT D.J. Humphries was ejected for contact with a game official, and Arizona had it first-and-goal at the Seattle 25. On the next snap, Dobbs kept it around the left end and took it all the way to the end zone. That S-yard zone for the out of bounds. However, it was reversed to a TD after a Seahawks challenge and Seattle led 14-10 with 4:41 to play before halftime. The Cards would move to the Seattle 27 in 10 plays but a holding penalty and sack kept them from getting points in the closing seconds of the first half.

Seattle got the ball first after intermission and in 10 plays reached the AZ 1-yard line where they had it first-and-goal. However, the Arizona D stopped two Walker runs and a short completion on third down forced Seattle to settle for a FG that only increased its lead to 7. It appeared they would add to it on the next series when they reached the AZ16 but on 3rd-n-4 from there, the rookie CB Williams intercepted Smith at the 1. After an Arizona punt, Seattle took over at its own 30 early in the 4th quarter but on the 2nd play of the drive, Smith fumbled a snap and DL Kevin Strong recovered at the SEA34. A high shotgun snap led to a loss of 14 yards on the ensuing drive's second play and the Cards came away without points when Prater's 34-yard FG try was wide left. The Cards defense again stepped up, forcing a 3-n-out thanks in part to a 2nd down sack for minus-6 shared by Strong and Jonathan Ledbetter. After the punt, AZ took over at its own 33 with 9:31 to play and trailing by 7. The drive reached the SEA49 but when a 3rd-n-9 pass was incomplete, AZ sent out its punting unit. Instead of kicking, though, the Cards ran a fake but were unsuccessful when back-up QB Clayton Tune's completion to Michael Wilson only picked up 4 yards. As a result, the Seahawks took over at their own 45 with 4:58 left. They would pick up two first downs and force Arizona to use its remaining timeouts before Jason Myers' 48-yard FG made it a 10-point lead with 2:17 left to effectively seal the game.

In week 8, Baltimore traveled to Arizona for just its second-ever visit to State Farm Stadium. The 5-2 Ravens were coming off a decisive 38-6 win over Detroit in which they scored TDs on 4 of their first 5 drives. The Cardinals were every bit their equal for most of the afternoon and it was a 7-7 game at the two-minute warning of the first half. But a pair of Baltimore interceptions led to TDs and a 21-7 Ravens lead late in the third quarter. Arizona continued to fight and cut the deficit to 7 with a pair of 4th quarter TDs. But the Cards could not complete the comeback and fell to 1-7 on the season.

The Cardinals got the ball to start the game and made it count. They moved 75 yards in 12 plays (9 runs and 3 passes) and QB Josh Dobbs punched it in for a touchdown from a yard away to make it 7-0. It was the first opening drive TD allowed by Baltimore in 16 games. The Ravens offense answered with its own 75-yard drive and Scottsdale native Mark Andrews tied the game when he hauled in a 5-yard TD catch from Lamar Jackson. The ensuing drive saw AZ move to the BAL44 but on both 3rd-n-1 and 4th-n-1 from there, Dobbs' pass attempts were incomplete and the Cards turned it over on downs. The Ravens incompletion after replay review and the Ravens sent out their FG unit. They came away without points, though, as Justin Tucker's 53-yard FG clanked off the left upright giving AZ the ball at its own 43. The Cards advanced to the BAL36 and on 4th-n-1 went for it with an Email Demercado run that was close to a first down. As the sticks approached to measure, an official moved the ball half a yard back and the chard be for WR Michael Wilson instead was intercepted by Ravens safety Brandon Stephenson, giving Baltimore drives and at the 2243 with 1:52 left in the half. Five plays later, RB Gus Edwards ran it in from a yard out and the Ravens led 14-7 at intermission.

The first five drives of the 3rd quarter ended with punts and neither team crossed midfield. After AZ's defense forced Baltimore's 3rd straight punt, the offense took over at its own 10. But on the next play, Dobbs' pass intended for TE Trey McBride was intercepted along the near sideline by 5 Geno Stone setting the Ravens up at the AZ23. Three plays later, Edwards scored his second rushing TD of the day, this one a 7-yarder that increased Baltimore's lead to 21-7 with :40 to play in the 3rd quarter. The Ravens increased their lead to 24-7 when Tucker ended their next possession with his 48-yard FG. The Cardinals would not go quietly. Dobbs moved the team 75 yards in 10 plays; he was 5-6 passing for 61 yards and ended it with a 17-yard TD pass to McBride on 3rd-n-15. When Dobbs ran the 2-point conversion in himself, the Cards pulled to within 24-15 with 6:32 left. The Ravens would push it back up to 16 points on the next series when Edwards' 3rd TD of the afternoon capped a 9-play, 75-yard drive. With 1:14 remaining, Dobbs hit former Ravens WR Hollywood Brown with a 1-yard touchdown at the end of a 10-play, 75-yard drive and it was 31-21 after the 2-point try failed. A perfect Matt Prater on-side kick led to a Cardinal recovery and with :26 left, Prater's 47-yard FG cut the deficit to 6. However, Baltimore recovered the onside kick attempt this time and the Ravens secaped with the win.

Arizona Cardinals ..... 0 0 0 0 0 Cleveland Browns ..... 0 27 13 7

In week 9 at Cleveland, the Cardinals faced a Browns team featuring the NFL's #1 defense and the return of starting QB Deshaun Watson who was back in the lineup following a shoulder injury. Arizona, meanwhile, was without top RBs James Conner and Emari Demercado as well as starting WR Michael Wilson. And at QB, rookie Clayton Tune made his first career start as the Cardinals waited for the return of Kyler Murray from his major knee injury and had traded Joshua Dobbs earlier in the week. The totality of those circumstances led to a challenging afternoon for the Cardinals. The Arizona defense kept the team in striking distance for much of the afternoon, forcing 3-n-outs on 6 of Cleveland's 14 drives. But the offense struggled to get untracked and the end result was a 27-0 Browns win that improved Cleveland to 5-3 and dropped Arizona to 1-8 for the year.

After the game began with the teams trading punts on the first three possessions, the fourth one saw the Browns reach the AZ36 where they faced a 4th-n-3. They went for it but turned it over on downs when Watson's pass was incomplete. Following an Arizona 3-n-out, Cleveland took over at its own 28 and on the first play of the drive, Watson went deep down the left sideline to WR Amari Cooper for a gain of 58 yards to the AZ14. They would get little more and, thanks in part to a sack of minus-10 by DT Leki Fotu, Cleveland settled for a 30-yard field goal from Dustin Hopkins. Leading 3-0, the Browns then came up with the game's first takeaway on the 3rd play of the next drive when CB Denzel Ward INT'd a Tune pass to give Cleveland possession at the AZ49. Ten plays later – all of them rushes – the Browns faced a 2nd-n-9 at the AZ11. Watson's pass was deflected in the backfield by DE Dante Stills but the ball nicocheted high in the air and some 20 yards downfield where it serendipitously found Cooper in the end zone for a TD. Arizona's biggest play of the half came on the next drive when Tune hit WR Rondale Moore for a 26-yard gain on 3rd-n-5; however side judge Eugene Hall claimed to see offensive pass interference and his flag wiped out the gain. The Browns increased their lead to 13-0 at intermission when Hopkins hit a 45-yard FG as the second quarter expired.

The AZ defense forced a 3-n-out to open the second half but the ensuing Browns punt was downed at the Cards 1. Cleveland would send them 3-n-out but AZ survived the flipping of the field and the offense would get the ball back at its own 20 with 9:38 left in the third, trailing 13-0. On the first snap, Tune was sacked by DT Shelby Harris forcing a fumble that DE Myles Garrett recovered at the AZ11. Two plays later, Watson found TE David Njoku with a 5-yard TD that put the hosts up 20-0. Later in the quarter, the AZ offense advanced to the CLE40 but again turned it over, this time on an INT by LB Sione Takitaki. Cleveland had a chance to extend the lead on the ensuing drive but Hopkins' 48-yard FG try was wide left. However, the Cardinals offense was unable to threaten the rest of the way and Kareem Hunt's 3-yard TD run midway through the 4th provided the game's final points.

WEEK 10 Atlanta Falcons 23, Arizona Cardinals 25 62,861 State Farm Stadium Nov 12, 2023

The Falcons came to Arizona in week 10 with the chance to move to 5-5 and into a first place tie in the AFC South. They faced a 1-8 Cardinals team that was looking to end a 6-game losing streak but was energized by one player's return. QB Kyler Murray was back 335 days after suffering a torn ACL exactly 11 months earlier and was outstanding. He completed 19 of 2 passes for 249 yards and ran 6 times for 33 yards and a TD. Nine of his completions went to TE Trey McBride who gained 131 yards and became the first Cardinals TE in exactly 34 years to top the century mark. In a game where every point mattered, including 51 and 56 yarders by the NFL's all-time leader in 50+ yard FGs. The contest featured 7 total lead changes – 5 in the second half – and a Falcons TD put ATL up 1 with 2:33 to play. But thanks to a dazzling Murray scramble and a deep completion to McBride, the Cardinals were able to win on a Prater walk-off game-winner.

After the teams exchanged 3-n-out drives to open the game, the Cardinals moved into ATL territory on their 2nd possession. A 4-yard James Conner run on 4th-n-1 from the ATL 30 and a diving 19-yard catch by McBride were pivotal but a couple penalties backed them up. However, they came away with points and a 3-0 lead thanks to Prater's 51-yard box. The AZ defense then appeared to stop the Falcons with a knocked down pass on 3rd-n-8 from the ATL 42 but a roughing the passer call by referee Craig Wrolstad extended the drive. Shortly thereafter, QB Taylor Heinicke hit WR Soctty Miller with a 2-yard TD pass on 3rd-n-8 from the ATL 42 but a roughing the passer call by referee Craig Wrolstad extended the drive. Shortly thereafter, QB Taylor Heinicke hit WR Soctty Miller with a 2-yard TD pass on 3rd-n-9a that put ATL up 7-3. On the next play from scrimmage, Murray connected with McBride on a 28-yard pas to start a drive that would reach the ATL28 before Prater's 46-yard FG made it 7-6. The Falcons answered with a 13-play, 75-yard drive that ended on a 5-yard TD run by rookie RB Bijan Robinson. Down 14-6 with 4:07 left in the first half, the Cards took over at their own 25. Consecutive completions of 12 and 28 yards to Rondale Moore and Hollywood Brown quickly moved it to the ATL29. With 0:14 left and no timeouts, AZ faced a 3rd-n-1 at the ATL6 when Murray ran it in for a TD; when the 2-point try was unsuccessful, the Cards trailed 14-12 at thermission.

After forcing a Falcons 3-n-out to open the 3rd quarter, Arizona moved into position for Prater's 56-yard FG that split the uprights to give the Cards a 15-14 lead. A sack from rookie LB B.J. Ojulari helped send the Atlanta offense off the field on another 3-n-out. But on the first play after the punt, LB Nate Landman intercepted a Murray pass across the middle and returned it 25 yards to the AZ14. The Cards defense rose to the occasion, stopping Atlanta on successive runs before Dennis Gardeck's 3rd down sack forced the Falcons to settle for a 36-yard Younghoe Koo FG. Down 17-15, the Cards got a huge boost from its special teams late in the third when Greg Dortch's 49-yard punt return set the offense up at the ATL21. Murray connected with rookie WR Michael Wilson on a 14-yard completion to the 1 on a play that was initially ruled a TD. No matter, because on the next play back-up QB Clayton Tune came in to sneak it across the goal line and put AZ up 22-17 in the closing seconds of the 3rd quarter. On the ensuing Falcons drive, Heinicke exited with a hamstring injury and Desmond Ridder came on in relief. He led them to the AZ21 where they faced a 4th-n-1 but the AZ defense sent them away by stopping Ridder on a sneak attempt. Atlanta's next possession began at its own 30 with 5:43 to go. After crossing midfield, side judge Frank Steratore gave the Falcons a 32-yard gain to the AZ15 with his defensive pass interference call. Three plays later, Ridder ran it around the left end on 3rd-n-4 from the 9 for a TD. When the 2-point try was unsuccessful, the Falcons led by 1 and the Cards soon took possession at their own 25 with 2:39 left. Murray then took over. On 3rd-n-10 from the AZ42, the QB was pressured in the backfield before circling, dodging and escaping on a spit that picked up 13 officially but actually covered some 74 total yards and reached a top speed of 20.17 mph. One snap later, he and McBride connected for the 8th and final time of the afternoon and it was a big one – a 33-yard completion to ATL 9. Thre

In week 11 at Houston, the Cardinals faced a 5-4 Texans team coming off back-to-back wins and fighting to reach the top spot in the AFC South. The hosts built a 21-10 halftime lead on the strength of three TD passes from QB C.J. Stroud. But the talented rookie signal caller – who entered the game with just two INTs on the season – was picked off three times by the Arizona defense, including twice in the fourth quarter. Cards QB Kyler Murray played his second game after returning from the knee injury that had sidelined him for a year and threw one TD pass while running for another. But despite late opportunities, the Cards could not complete the comeback and Houston would emerge with the 21-16 victory.

The Cardinals struck first in the game - and struck quickly. After advancing past midfield in two plays and a penalty, Murray threw it deep down the middle where WR Rondale Moore hauled it in for a 48-yard touchdown. The ensuing drive saw the Texans move to the AZ15 where they went for it on 4th-n-2; however, LB Kyzir White stopped the Houston run for no gain, resulting in a turnover on downs. The next time the Texans offense took the field they did produce points when Stroud's 3rd-n-6 pass down the middle found TE Dalton Schultz for a 20-yard game-tying TD. The Cards would soon untie it on the next series when Matt Prater's 57-yard FG capped a 9-play, 36-yard drive and put AZ up 10-7 with 1:21 to go in the opening quarter. The Texans would take their first lead of the game on the next drive by moving 75 yards in 10 plays and ending it with RB Devin Singletary's 11-yard TD run. The very next play from scrimmage saw Murray launch it deep down the middle for Hollywood Brown but Texans CB Derek Stingley intercepted it and Houston's offense took over at its own 25. Stroud then led them deep into AZ territory but on 2nd-n-11 from the 12, his pass into the end zone was picked off by Cards S Jalen Thompson. The rays would increase the lead to 21-10 the next time they got the ball; this time Stroud ended the 6-play, 74-yard drive with his 40-yard TD pass to fellow rookie Tank Bell, who made a leaping grab at the right side of the end zone with 0:26 left before intermission.

Leading 21-10, the Texans opened the second half by marching well into AZ territory but they came away pointless when Matt Amendola's 48-yard FG try missed wide to the left. From there, the Cardinals offense went the length of the field and they faced a 4th-n-goal at the 1. On that play, Murray called his own number and outraced defenders to the pylon for the score; when the two-point try was unsuccessful, the Cardinals trailed by 5 with 2:52 remaining in the 3rd quarter. A Dante Stills sack of Stroud on first down was key to forcing a 3-n-out on the next drive after which the Cards took possession at their own 32. They would advance to the HO123 and went for it on 4th-n-3 but a Murray completion to Greg Dortch was just short of the sticks. However, the AZ defense again held and produced a 3-n-out that preceded a bizarre sequence. On the forced punt, officials ruled the ball hit a Cardinals player and Houston recovered. Replays, however, seemed so clearly to show it actually hit a Texan that the AZ offense and HOU defense were on the field waiting for play to resume. To their surprise, referee Alex Kemp emerged to say that the initial ruling of a turnover would stand and the Texans took over at the HO145 but turned it over on an incompletion. The Texans would then advance to the AZ26 but CB Antonio Hamilton stepped in front of a Stroud pass near the sideline. On the Sunday after Thanksgiving, the Cardinals hosted a Rams team that had won 8 straight games in Arizona and was looking for a season sweep. After one quarter, the Cardinals led 8-7 but Los Angeles would score 30 points en route to a 37-14 victory that improved its record to 5-6 while dropping AZ to 2-10. Rams QB Matthew Stafford threw for 4 touchdowns and RB Kyren Williams returned from a 4-week absence to gain 204 total yards and score a pair of TDs.

The Rams came up with the game's first explosive play on its third snap from scrimmage, a 3rd-n-8 from the LA27. On it Stafford hit WR Tutu Atwell deep down the right side with a 42-yard completion to the AZ31. The drive ended four plays later when Stafford found TE Tyler Higbee with a 7-yard touchdown pass. The Cards answered by moving 75 yards in 12 plays, the majority of which were completions by Kyler Murray who was 5 for 7 for 50 yards on the drive. He ended it with a 2-yard run into the end zone, his third consecutive game with a rushing TD after returning from his year-long absence due to a knee injury. A Rams penalty on the PAT led to the Cards going for 2 and they converted on a sneak by back-up QB Clayton Tune. After the teams traded punts, LA took over at its own 48 and moved to the AZ5 before Stafford found Higbee for another TD that made it 14-8 Rams. The next possession saw the visitors move into position for a 50-yard FG try but kicker Lucas Havriski pushed it right and the Cards took over. At the 2:00 warning they faced a 4th-n-2 at the AZ48 and went for it but Murray's pass attempt fell incomplete. The Rams made them pay, moving to the 15 before Stafford's screen pass to Williams resulted in a TD that made it a 21-8 game at halftime.

On LA's first offensive play of the second half, Williams ran for 56 yards to the AZ22 and that led to a 24-yard Havrisik FG that made it 24-8. The Cards had a chance to add to it on the next series but Matt Prater's FG try from 56 yards was a rare miss. The Rams took over at their own 46 and went 54 yards in 13 plays; Williams' 3-yard TD catch from Stafford early in the fourth quarter extended the LA lead to 31-8. RB Royce Freeman ended the next series with a 23-yard TD run to make it 37-8 with 8:19 remaining. With 5:12 left, Murray's 6-yard TD pass to WR Greg Dortch would make it 37-14 and provided the game's final score.

A game that started on a sunny, 57-degree December afternoon in the Steel City was interrupted twice by lengthy weather-related delays. But in between them, the Cardinals made plays in all three phases to earn a 14-point victory over a Steelers team that entered the day with a 7-4 record and had won 3 of its previous 4. Playing against his former squad for the first time, Cardinals RB James Conner ran for 105 yards and a pair of TDs. The Arizona defense kept Pittsburgh out of the end zone for more than 3.5 quarters, allowing just 10 total points on an early field goal and late TD. QB Kyler Murray improved to 2-2 in his four games since returning from injury and again played turnover-free football; 8 of his 13 completions went to TE Trey McBride who finished with 89 yards and a TD. The Cardinals converted on 10 of 17 third downs while limiting Pittsburgh to 4-11. It all added up to a 24-10 road win that upped Arizona's record to 3-10 on the season. At four hours, 18 minutes in duration, it was the longest Cardinals game since at least the Super Bowl era began.

The Steelers got the ball first and opened the game by moving to the AZ11 in 4 plays. However, the Cardinals defense allowed them no further and Chris Boswell's 29-yard field goal made it 3-0. A couple series later, Arizona would tie it thanks to a long kick from Matt Prater, the NFL's all-time leader in FGs of 50+ yards. This one was a 51-yarder that knotted the game at 3. Later, with 12:33 to go in the 2nd quarter, the Steelers took over at their own 20 and chewed 8 minutes off the clock while marching to the AZ3 where they faced 3rd-n-goal. On that play, starting UB Kenny Pickett scrambled to the 1 but injured his ankle and was forced from the game. Back-up Mitch Trubisky entered as the Steelers were for it on 4th-n-goal at the 1. However, RB Najee Harris was stopped by a group led by NT Kevin Strong and the Cards took over at their own 1 with 4:51 remaining in the half. The drive that followed was one to remember. The AZ offense was 0-4 on third downs to that point but would convert all 5 third down chances on this drive. The first was on 3rd-n-3 from the 8 when Murray hit TE Elijah Higgins for a 21-yard completion to the 29. Right before the 2:00 warning, RB Michael Carter converted a 3rd-n-6 from the 5 Murray found McBride for 17 yards and then again for 15 yards on 3rd-n-5 at the 21. On 2nd-n-goal from the 5, Murray found McBride for a TD but the on-field call was surprisingly reversed by replay. No matter because the pair connected again on the next play and this time the TD stood. With 0:15 left in the 2nd quarter, Arizona led 10-3 thanks to the 99-yard TD drive on which Murray was 6-8 for 71 yards including 4 completions to McBride for 49 yards and a TD.

After a lengthy weather delay that extended halftime by more than 30 minutes, Arizona's initial drive ended in a punt on which Blake Gillikin pinned the Steelers at their own 7. Shortly thereafter, the Steelers' first possession ended when Arizona DE Dante Stills recovered a Trubisky fumble at the Pittsburgh 21. The turnover led to a 1-yard TD run by Conner that gave the Cards a 17-3 lead with 7:18 to play in the third quarter. After the PAT, rain and lightning again caused another lengthy delay of about 50 minutes. When play resumed, Pittsburgh would move into position for a 45-yard FG but Boswell missed for just the second time on the season when his attempt was wide to the right. The Cardinals ensuing drive penetrated Pittsburgh territory but Arizona was again forced to punt. And Gillikin again backed up the Steelers of the to the 4. Following a 3-n-out and a Pittsburgh penalty on the AZ punt return, Arizona toxo voer at the PIT33 with 10:36 remaining. A completion of 16 yards to McBride was followed by three straight Conner runs, the last of which was a 9-yard TD jaut that made it 24-3 midway through the fourth quarter. A late Steelers TD made it 24-10 with 4:25 left. But on the next drive, six straight Conner runs gained 50 yards and chewed off enough clock that the Cardinals could kneel down three times to end the game.

## **WEEK 14** San Francisco 49ers 45, Arizona Cardinals 29 63,967 📕 State Farm Stadium 📕 Dec 17, 2023

The Cardinals returned from their bye with a 3-10 record and hosted the NFC's #1 seed, the 10-3 San Francisco 49ers. Arizona outgained the guests in total yards (436 to 406) and time of possession (34:11 to 25:49) while rushing for a season-high 234 yards against the NFL's #1 run defense. And while San Fran edged the Cards in total scores by just one, 6 of the 7 Niners scores were TDs while AZ's 6 came in the form of 3 FGs and 3 TDs. Cards TE Trey McBride had a game-high 10 catches for 102 yards; it marked the 2nd time he eclipsed the century mark on the season and his first catch of the afternoon gave him the franchise's single-season record for receptions by a tight end. AZ native Brock Purdy returned to his hometown for the first time as Niners QB and threw for 4 TDs with no INTs. It all added up to a 45-29 win that clinched the NFC West title for San Francisco while eliminating Arizona from postseason consideration.

The Cardinals got the ball to open the game and made it count. Back-to-back Kyler Murray passes to McBride covered 11 and 38 yards and moved the ball to the SF21. That led to a 2-yard James Conner TD run that capped the 7-play, 75-yard drive. The 49ers responded with their own 75-yard drive, this one consuming 4:07 in 8 plays and ending with Purdy's 12-yard touchdown pass to WR Deebo Samuel that tied it at 7. The ensuing Cardinals drive saw them move to the SF42 where they faced a 4th-n-3; on that play, 49ers CB Charvarious Ward picked off a Murray pass attempt across the middle and he returned it 66 yards for a score. It snapped a streak of 96 straight attempts without an INT for Muray. Early in the second quarter, Matt Prater's 58-yard FG pulled AZ to within 4 points at 14-10. Eight minutes later, his 43-yard mode it a one point game with 6:14 remaining in the first half but with 1:14 to go, RB Christian McCaffrey's 5-yard TD connection with Purdy made it 21-13. The San Francisco D then forced a 3-n-out from the Cardinals but momentum appeared to swing momentum appeared to swing to AZ in a huge way when 49ers returner Ronnie Bell fumbled the ensuing punt and AZ's Joey Blount returned it 12 yards for a TD. However, a replay review negated the score and fumble, ruling Bell's forearm was down. As a result, San Fran entered halftime with a 21-13 lead.

On the 3rd play of the 3rd quarter, San Fran faced a 3rd-n-11 at the AZ24 when Purdy hit TE George Kittle on a 35-yard gain to the AZ41. A play later, he found McCaffrey open down the left sideline for a 41-yard touchdown reception and the Niners led 28-13. Arizona's next drive reached the SF10 but the Cards had to settle for another Prater FG, this one a 28-yarder that made it 28-16. McCaffrey's 3rd TD of the day – a 1-yard run – ended the next SF possession which covered 60 yards in 6 plays, making it 35-16 with 1:08 to play in the third. Emari Demercado's 49-yard TD run gave AZ a jolt with 11:30 left and made it 35-22. But a 19-yard Samuel TD catch from Purdy and a 43-yard Jake Moody FG on the next two drives pushed San Fran further ahead and Murray's 8-yard TD pass to TE Elijah Higgins in the last minute provided the game's final margin of 45-29.
