



ARIZONA CARDINALS NOTE CARDS

1969 Year the Cardinals first played at Lambeau Field. That is also the last time Arizona played at Green Bay in December. This Sunday the Cardinals will be playing just their seventh-ever game at Lambeau Field.

1 Players in the NFL who have recorded at least 11 sacks in each of the last three seasons: DE Chandler Jones. Combined with his 11.0 sacks in 2016 and 17.0 in 2017, Jones' 11.0 sacks in 2018 make him the first player in Cardinals history with 11.0+ sacks in three different seasons.

14 Special teams tackles (13 solo) for free agent rookie LB Zeke Turner this season. Turner leads the NFL in both special teams tackles (14) and solo special teams tackles (13) in 2018.

115 Consecutive starts for rookie C Mason Cole dating back to his freshman year of high school (53 straight at prep level; 51 straight at Michigan; 11 straight with Arizona). Cole is the only member of the Cards offensive line that has played every snap this season.

WITH A WIN...

- Arizona would have four wins in its last five games against the Packers, including postseason.

MILESTONES WITHIN REACH...

WR LARRY FITZGERALD

- With a catch, Fitzgerald would have at least one reception in 223 consecutive games.
- With four receptions, Fitzgerald would pass Hall of Fame WR Jerry Rice (1,281 with San Francisco) for the most receptions in NFL history with a single team.
- With a TD reception, Fitzgerald would have 116 TD catches in his career - and six in the last six games. Fitzgerald would tie Chargers TE Antonio Gates for sixth place on the NFL's all-time list for career TD receptions.
- With a TD reception, Fitzgerald would have at least one TD catch in all six career games played against Green Bay, including postseason. He would have seven TDs total in those six games.

RB DAVID JOHNSON

- With a TD (of any kind), Johnson would have 42 TDs in his career. Despite playing in just 45 games, Johnson would move into a tie for 10th place on the franchise all-time TD list.
- With two TDs (of any kind), Johnson would have 10+ TDs in a season for the third time in his career. He would join WR Larry Fitzgerald (5) as the only players in franchise history with 10+ TDs in at least three different seasons.
- With two rushing TDs, Johnson would tie Stump Mitchell (32) for fourth place on the franchise all-time list for career rushing TDs.

DE CHANDLER JONES

- With a sack, Jones would have 40 sacks in 44 games with the Cardinals. He would reach 40 sacks in fewer games than any other player in franchise history. Simeon Rice (60 games) holds the current record.
- With a sack of Packers QB Aaron Rodgers, Jones would have a sack of 38 different QBs in his NFL career.
- With 2.0 sacks, Jones would have at least 2.0 sacks in three of the last four games. It would also give him 41.0 sacks as a member of the Cardinals, which would leave him alone in seventh place on the franchise all-time sacks list.

QB JOSH ROSEN

- With two TD passes, Rosen would have 12 TD passes this season. In franchise history only Jake Plummer (15 in 1997) and Sam Etcheverry (14 in 1961) would have more TD passes during their rookie season. It would also give Rosen multiple TD passes in three of his last five starts.
- With three TD passes, Rosen would join Jake Plummer (2 in 1997) as the only rookies in franchise history to throw three-or-more TDs in multiple games.

CB PATRICK PETERSON

- With an INT, Peterson would have 24 INTs in his career. Only six players in team history would have more. It would give Peterson three INTs this season.

DT ROBERT NKEMDICHE

- With a sack, Nkemdiche would have at least one sack in back-to-back games for the first time in his career. It would also give him 3.5 sacks in his last two games - after posting 2.0 sacks total in his first 24 career games.

CARDINALS DEFENSE

- With three sacks, the Cardinals defense would have 40+ sacks through the first 12 games of a season for just the second time in team history (50 in 1966).
- With four sacks, the Cardinals defense would have at least four sacks in five consecutive games. That would tie for the longest such streak in franchise history (AZ had 5 straight with 4+ sacks in 1966 and 1969).

NFL'S SECOND-OLDEST RIVALRY

The second-oldest rivalry in NFL history resumes this week when the Cardinals and Packers meet at Lambeau Field. On Sunday, it will have been exactly 97 years and 13 days since the teams first met. The initial meeting occurred in 1921, Green Bay's first season in the American Professional Football Association.

The Cardinals and Chicago Bears, the league's oldest rivalry, joined the APFA in the inaugural season of 1920.

FIVE GAMES & SIX TOUCHDOWNS

WR Larry Fitzgerald has faced the Packers five times in his career, including postseason. He has at least one TD in all five contests.

The last time Fitzgerald played the Packers was in the Divisional round of the 2015 postseason when he had 176 receiving yards and the game-winning TD in overtime. That yardage total remains a career high (regular or postseason).

FITZGERALD 4 CATCHES FROM RICE

There is only one player in NFL history - Hall of Fame WR Jerry Rice - with more receptions with a single team than Fitzgerald has with the Cardinals. That could change this week. *Fitzgerald (1,278) enters Sunday's game needing four receptions to pass Rice (1,281 with San Francisco) for the most receptions in NFL history with a single team.*

PRESSURE-FILLED DAY AT LAMBEAU

The Arizona and Green Bay defenses are two of the best in the NFL when it comes to pressuring the quarterback. The Cardinals and Packers both entered Week 13 ranked in the top-5 in total sacks this season.

Arizona's defense has recorded at least 4 sacks in four straight games and has 19 sacks total over the last five games. In their last five games, the Packers defense has accumulated 18 sacks.
