



# ARIZONA CARDINALS NOTE CARDS

**180** First downs for Cardinals opponents over the last 10 games, the second-fewest first downs allowed in the NFL during that span (Weeks 7-17). Only the Browns (174) have allowed fewer.

**5** Wins at State Farm Stadium for the Cardinals this season. With a win on Sunday, Arizona would earn its sixth home win in 2024. The Cardinals would have six home wins in a season for the seventh time since beginning play at State Farm Stadium and for the first time since 2015. Arizona owns a +44 point margin at home this season.

**3** Cardinals chosen as Pro Bowl alternates in 2024 - KR **DeeJay Dallas**, OL **Paris Johnson Jr.** and K **Chad Ryland**. It marks the first time all three were named alternates.

**212** Points scored this season by two-time Cardinals Girls High School Flag Football Offensive Player of the Year **Samaya Taylor-Jenkins**. After leading the state in points (212) and TDs (35), Taylor-Jenkins has been selected by the Maxwell Club as a finalist for the Girls National Flag Football Player of the Year Award. Taylor-Jenkins helped Hamilton H.S. to a perfect 17-0 record and a 6A State Championship in 2024.

## WITH A WIN...

- Arizona would have two wins against San Francisco in 2024. It would be the first time in team history that the Cardinals twice defeated a team that made the Super Bowl the year prior.
- The Cardinals would double their win total from last season (4 to 8).
- The Cards would improve to 5-1 in their last six home games.
- Arizona would earn its first season sweep of the 49ers since 2021 and their sixth season sweep of San Francisco in the last 10 years (2015-14).
- The Cardinals would improve to 3-3 in divisional games this season.

## MILESTONES WITHIN REACH...

### QB KYLER MURRAY

- With two rushing yards, Murray would join Josh Allen, Russell Wilson and Cam Newton as the only players in NFL history with 19,000+ passing yards and 3,000+ rushing yards in their first six seasons.
- With 50 rushing yards, Murray would reach 600+ rushing yards in a season for the second time in his career (819 in 2020).
- With three TD passes, Murray would have 20 TD passes in 2024. It would be his fourth season with 20+ TD passes, tying Neil Lomax for the most in franchise history. He would also have 15 career outings with 3+ TD passes, matching Lomax for the most such performances in team history.

### TE TREY MCBRIDE

- With three receptions, McBride would pass George Kittle (216 from 2017-19) for the most receptions by a TE in their first three seasons in NFL history.
- With 12 receptions, McBride would break WR DeAndre Hopkins' franchise single-season record for receptions (115 in 2020). McBride would also tie Zach Ertz (116 in 2018 with Philadelphia) for the most receptions in a single season by a TE in NFL history (Las Vegas TE Brock Bowers enters Week 18 with 108 receptions).
- With 125 receiving yards, McBride would break Hall of Famer Jackie Smith's franchise single-season record for receiving yards by a TE (1,205 in 1967). It would also mark his fourth game with 100+ receiving yards this season, matching Smith (4 in 1967) for the most such games in a season by a TE in Cardinals history.

### WR MARVIN HARRISON JR.

- With a TD catch, Harrison would tie Larry Fitzgerald (8 in 2004) and Anquan Boldin (8 in 2003) for the most TD catches in franchise history by a rookie.
- With two catches, Harrison would pass Larry Fitzgerald (57 in 2004) for the second-most catches by a rookie in franchise history (Anquan Boldin - 101 in 2003).
- With 62 receiving yards, Harrison would pass Frank Sanders (883 in 1995) for the second-most receiving yards by a rookie in franchise history (Anquan Boldin - 1,377 in 2003).
- With 78 receiving yards, Harrison would join Anquan Boldin (1,377 in 2003) as the only rookies in franchise history with 900+ receiving yards.

### S BUDDA BAKER

- With 3+ tackles, Baker would have 158 tackles this season. He would pass LB Ronald McKinnon (157 in 2000) for the most tackles by a Cardinal - regardless of position - since at least 1994 when the stat first became trackable.
- With 10+ tackles, Baker (8) would join Pat Tillman (8 in 2000 w/ AZ) and Eric Weddle (8 in 2008 w/ SD) as the only NFL DBs since at least 2000 to have eight games of double-digit tackles in a season. He would also have double-digit tackles for the 34th time in his career and in 10 of his last 20 games played.

### K CHAD RYLAND

- With 1 point, Ryland would have 100 points in just 13 games played in 2024.

### RB MICHAEL CARTER

- With 70+ rushing yards, Carter would have 70+ rushing yards in back-to-back games for the first time in his career.

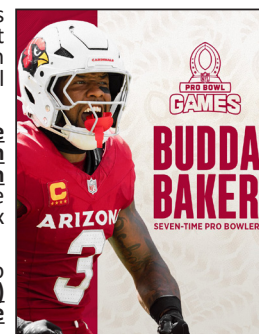
## BAKER NAMED TO SEVENTH PRO BOWL

On Thursday, Cardinals S **Budda Baker** was named as a starter for the NFC squad at the 2025 Pro Bowl. It marks Baker's seventh Pro Bowl selection and sixth consecutive at safety after being chosen as a special teamer during his rookie campaign.

**He is just the second player in Cardinals franchise history to receive at least seven Pro Bowl nods in his first eight NFL seasons joining Patrick Peterson (8).** Baker is also just the second player in franchise history named to the Pro Bowl as a safety at least six times joining Hall of Famer Larry Wilson (8).

Baker is the only safety in the NFL named to the Pro Bowl each of the last six seasons (2019-24). **He (7) joins Jalen Ramsey (7) as the only active DBs in the NFL with at least seven Pro Bowl selections.**

**With one game to play in 2024, Baker's 155 tackles are already the most by an NFL DB in a season since 2000.**



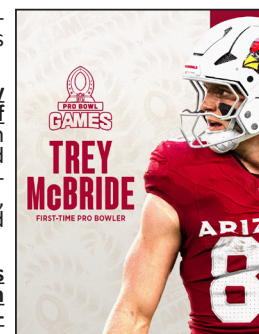
## MCBRIDE'S HISTORIC SEASON WILL END AT THE PRO BOWL

On Thursday, Cardinals TE **Trey McBride** was selected to the NFC squad at the 2025 Pro Bowl. It marks McBride's first Pro Bowl selection.

**He became just the second TE in franchise history to earn Pro Bowl honors and the first since Hall of Famer Jackie Smith in 1970.** McBride is also the sixth Cardinals offensive player since 2000 to be selected to a Pro Bowl within his first three NFL seasons, joining **Kyler Murray (2020-21)**, **David Johnson (2016)**, **Larry Fitzgerald (2005)**, **Anquan Boldin (2003)** and **David Boston (2001)**.

**With one game remaining this season, McBride's 104 receptions rank as the fifth-best single-season total in franchise history as well as ninth-best single-season total in NFL history by a TE.**

**With three catches on Sunday, McBride (214) would have the most receptions in a TE's first three seasons in NFL history passing 49ers TE George Kittle (216).**



## RARE ROOKIE RECEIVER

After a six-catch, 96-yard performance last week in Los Angeles, WR **Marvin Harrison Jr.** has totaled 57 receptions for 822 receiving yards and a team-high seven receiving TDs in 2024. **Heading into Sunday's meeting with the 49ers, Harrison ranks third all-time among Cardinals rookies in all three categories.**

**With a TD catch on Sunday, Harrison would tie Anquan Boldin (8 in 2003) and Larry Fitzgerald (8 in 2004) for the most receiving TDs by a rookie in franchise history. With 2+ catches and 62+ receiving yards, Harrison would rank second all-time among Cardinals rookies in each respective category trailing only Boldin (101 catches for 1,377 yards in 2003).**
