



ARIZONA CARDINALS NOTE CARDS

99 Starts for S **Budda Baker** in his career and also career games played for WR **Zach Pascal**. On Sunday in San Francisco, Baker and Pascal will reach 100 career starts and games, respectively.

18 Penalties committed by Arizona so far in 2024, the fewest for the team through the first four games of a season since 2002 (15). Only New England (16) and Las Vegas (17) have been flagged fewer times than the Cardinals this season.

15 Tackles for S **Budda Baker** last Sunday vs. Washington, tying his career high. Baker has totaled 15 tackles in a game three times in his career, with the other two performances coming in wins at Levi's Stadium (10/7/18 and 9/13/20).

305 Rushing yards for RB **James Conner** against the 49ers since joining the Cards in 2021. That is the most of any NFL player when facing SF the last four seasons and over double the next best total (Hou RB Joe Mixon - 145). The 49ers run defense (90.7 ypg) has been the top ranked unit in the NFL during that span.

WITH A WIN...

- The Cardinals would improve to 7-4 all-time at Levi's Stadium. Arizona would have more road wins at the venue than any other team since it opened in 2014.
- Arizona would improve to 2-0 vs. the NFC West in 2024, tying for the NFL lead in division wins (Atlanta and Houston).

MILESTONES WITHIN REACH...

QB KYLER MURRAY

- With a rushing TD, Murray would have 27 rushing TDs as a member of the Cardinals. That would tie Johnny Roland (1966-72) and Elmer Angsman (1946-52) for seventh place on the franchise all-time list for career rushing TDs.
- With 3 passing TDs, Murray would tie Neil Lomax (15 games) for the most games with 3+ passing TDs in franchise history.
- With 359 passing yards, Murray would pass Carson Palmer (16,782) for fourth place on the franchise all-time list for career passing yards.

RB JAMES CONNER

- With a rushing TD, Conner would have 33 rushing TDs with Arizona. That would tie David Johnson and John David Crow for third place on the franchise all-time list for career rushing TDs.
- With 100+ rushing yards, Conner would have eight 100-yard outings as a member of the Cardinals, matching Edgerrin James (2006-08) for the fourth-most games with 100+ rushing yards in franchise history. It would also mark his fifth 100-yard rushing performance in his last seven games.
- With 2 rushing TDs, Conner would have eight games with multiple rushing TDs as a member of the Cardinals. That would tie David Johnson (2015-19) for the most such outings in franchise history.

TE TREY MCBRIDE

- With five receptions, McBride would have 5+ catches in six straight road games. That would mark the longest such streak by a Cardinals TE since at least 1970 and match the longest such streak among NFL TEs over the last five seasons (Jaguars TE Evan Engram - 6 road games in 2023).

WR MARVIN HARRISON JR.

- With a TD reception, Harrison would join Steve Lach (Games 1-4 in 1942) as the only rookies in team history with a TD catch in four consecutive games.
- With 2 TD receptions, Harrison would have six TD receptions in his first five NFL games. That would match the most TD receptions in a player's first five games in NFL history.
- With 100+ receiving yards, Harrison would become just the eighth rookie in franchise history with multiple 100-yard receiving games in a season and first since Anquan Boldin (5) in 2003.

WR MICHAEL WILSON

- With a TD reception, Wilson would have a TD catch in three straight road games dating back to Week 17 of 2023. It would also give him three TD catches in two career games at Levi's Stadium.

S BUDDA BAKER

- With 2 tackles, Baker would have 100 career tackles against the 49ers. He would join Commanders LB Bobby Wagner (116) as the only NFL players with 100+ tackles against San Francisco since Baker entered the league in 2017.
- With a start, Baker would become just the fifth Cardinals DB since at least 1970 to start 100 games (Roger Wehrli - 163 starts, Adrian Wilson - 162, Aeneas Williams - 159, Patrick Peterson - 154).

LB MACK WILSON SR.

- With 1.0 sack, Wilson would have 5.5 sacks in his last 10 games played after having 2.5 sacks in his first 72 games.

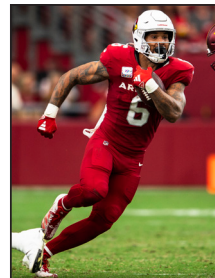
GREAT LAST SIX GAMES FOR #6

RB **James Conner** ran for 104 yards and a TD on 18 carries (5.8 avg.) last Sunday against Washington. **It marked the fourth time in his last six games that he ran for 100+ yards dating back to 2023's Week 17 win at Philly.**

Over his last six games, Conner ranks among the league's best in a number of rushing categories:

- 1st in the NFL in 1st down runs (39)
- 1st in the NFL in games w/ 100+ rushing yards (4)
- t-1st in the NFL in runs of 20+ yards (7)
- 2nd in the NFL in runs of 10+ yards (19)
- 3rd in the NFL in rushing yards (571)
- 3rd in the NFL in rushing yards per game (95.2)
- t-5th in the NFL (min. 60 att.) in rushing average (4.9)
- 6th in the NFL in scrimmage yards (682)
- t-6th in the NFL in rushing TDs (5)

Conner (2 games) and 49ers RB Jordan Mason (2) are the only NFL players with multiple games of 4+ runs of 10+ yards this season.



NO STRANGER TO THE END ZONE

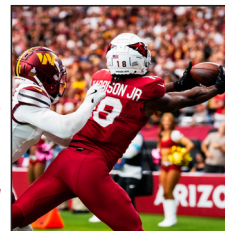
WR **Marvin Harrison Jr.** continued to impress last week vs. the Commanders as he caught five passes for 45 yards and a TD. Through four games, he has 15 catches for 243 yards and four TDs.

Harrison became the first player in franchise history and just the fifth NFL player in the last 40 seasons to have 240+ receiving yards, 15+ catches and 4+ TD catches in his first four games joining Randy Moss (1998), Roy Williams (2004), Calvin Ridley (2018) and Ja'Marr Chase (2021).

With a TD catch on Sunday, Harrison (5) would have the most TD catches through a player's first five games in franchise history.



CREATING NEGATIVE PLAYS IS A POSITIVE

In 2024, the Cardinals defense is tied for fourth in the NFL with 26 run plays of zero or negative yardage while also ranking tied for fifth in the NFL with 24 tackles for loss.

It marks the first time since 2017 that the Cardinals defense had 26+ run plays of zero or negative yardage and 24+ TFLs through the first four games of a season. Tennessee and Denver are the only other teams to do so this season.
