ARIZONA CARDINALS NOTE CARDS

Regular season wins for the Cardinals in their all-time series against the Eagles which dates back to 1935. Arizona has more wins against Philadelphia than any other NFL franchise. The Cardinals also have a 2-1 record vs. Philadelphia in the postseason.

Arizona's record against teams from the NFC East under head coach **Kliff Kingsbury**. The Cardinals were 1-0 vs. the NFC East in 2019, 4-0 in 2020 and 1-0 in 2021.

Year that the Eagles last won a game in Arizona. That was the final game between the two teams as division rivals in the NFC East. Including postseason, the Cardinals have won six consecutive home games vs. Philadelphia.

Cardinals record in the month of October under **Kingsbury**. Arizona has won eight of its last nine games played in October. In those 15 games, QB **Kyler Murray** has thrown for 3,697 yards, 26 TDs and a 104.4 passer rating while also rushing for 553 yards and five TDs.

WITH A WIN...

- The Cardinals would improve to 7-0 vs. teams from the NFC East under head coach Kliff Kingsbury.
- Arizona would improve to 12-5 in the month of October under Kingsbury.
- Arizona would push its home winning streak vs. the Eagles to six straight (including postseason).
- The Cardinals would improve to 7-2 in their last nine games vs. Philadelphia (including postseason).

MILESTONES WITHIN REACH...

TE ZACH ERTZ

- With 1 reception, Ertz would have at least one catch vs. all 32 NFL franchises. He would join LAC's Gerald Everett as the only active TEs to accomplish the feat.
- With 1 reception, Ertz would have at least one catch in 111 consecutive games. Only three players have longer active streaks: DeAndre Hopkins (136), Travis Kelce (130) and Jarvis Landry (126).
- With 6 receptions, Ertz 663) would pass Hall of Famer Ozzie Newsome (662) for eighth place on the NFL's all-time receptions list among TEs.

QB KYLER MURRAY

- With 3 TDs (passing or rushing), Murray would have 100 career TDs. In NFL history, only seven players would have reached 100 career TDs in fewer games than Murray (51): Patrick Mahomes (39), Dan Marino (43), Deshaun Watson (45), Kurt Warner (46), Josh Allen (47), Andrew Luck (49) and Daunte Culpepper (50).
- With 2+ passing TDs and 1+ rushing TD, Murray would have 11 such outings in his career. In NFL history, only Cam Newton (12) would have more such games in a player's first four seasons.

<u>DL J.J. WATT</u>

- With 1.0 sack, Watt would have 105.0 sacks in his career. It would give him 3.0 sacks in four games played this season and 4.0 sacks in his last six regular season games played.
- With a sack, Eagles QB Jalen Hurts would become the 43rd different QB Watt has sacked in his career.
- With 2.0 sacks, Watt would have 5.0 sacks in his last six regular season games played.

WR MARQUISE BROWN

- With 7+ receptions, Brown would become just the third player in franchise history with 37+ receptions through the first five games of a season: DeAndre Hopkins (45 in 2020) and J.T. Smith (44 in 1989).
- With 100+ receiving yards, Brown would have 100+ receiving yards in a game for the seventh time in his career and for the second time in five games with the Cardinals.

LB DENNIS GARDECK

With 1.0 sack, Gardeck would have 3.0 sacks in two career games vs. the Eagles. It would also give him 9.0 career sacks. The franchise record for sacks by a player who entered the league undrafted is 12.0 (LB Ronald McKinnon).

DL ZACH ALLEN

With 1.0 sack, Allen would have a sack in consecutive games for the third time in his career. All three of those instances would have come in his last 16 games.

<u>LB MARKUS GOLDEN</u>

With 1.0 sack, Golden would have 10.0 sacks in his last 16 games played. It would also give him 4.0 sacks in six career games vs. Philadelphia.

<u>S JALEN THOMPSON</u>

With an INT, Thompson would have six career INTs. He would also have an INT in back-to-back games for the first time in his career.



VIOLET BIDWILL AND THE 1947 CHAMPIONSHIP TEAM

The 2022 season marks the 75th anniversary of the Cardinals historic 1947 season. It was a year in which **Violet Bidwill** made league history and one that ultimately ended in the team winning an NFL Championship over the Eagles.

The Cardinals suffered a significant loss when team owner **Charles W. Bidwill** passed away in April. He had run the franchise since purchasing it in 1933 and was credited with pulling the team - and on a larger scale the NFL - through the Great Depression.

THE NFL'S FIRST FEMALE OWNER With the passing of Charles, his wife, Violet Bidwill - while rais-



ing the couple's two teenage sons Stormy (18) and William (16) - took over as team owner. It was a historic moment, as she became the first female owner in NFL history and one of the first females to serve as a primary owner in professional sports.

Violet Bidwill's first year of ownership saw the franchise win the NFL Championship after defeating the Philadelphia Eagles 28-21 in the Championship Game.

CARDS TAKE DOWN EAGLES IN CHAMPIONSHIP GAME

On December 28, 1947 - playing in front of 30,759 fans at Comiskey Park - the Cardinals defeated the Eagles 28-21 in the NFL Championship Game. The Cardinals led all the way, scoring a TD in every quarter. They held Philadelphia's Steve Van Buren, the league's leading rusher, to 26 yards on the ground while Chicago's **Elmer Angsman** gained a total of 159 yards on the ground. Angsman and **Charley Trippi** each scored a pair of TDs for the Cardinals - including three that covered 40+ yards (44, 70 and 75 yards).

ERTZ FACES THE EAGLES FOR THE FIRST TIME

On Sunday TE **Zach Ertz** will face his former team for the first time. Some highlights from Ertz's tenure with the Eagles:

- Played in 123 games over nine seasons (2013-21).
- Caught the game-winning TD in Super Bowl LII that gave the Eagles a 38-33 lead with just over two minutes left in regulation.

• Set the NFL single-season record for receptions by a TE with 116 catches in 2018. His 116 catches that season remain an Eagles single-season record.

• His 579 receptions rank second on the Eagles all-time receptions list behind only Hall of Famer Harold Carmichael (589).



UP NEXT - IT'S MURRAY VS. ANOTHER SOONER QB

QB Kyler Murray is a combined 4-0 against former Oklahoma QBs Baker Mayfield (3-0) and Jalen Hurts (1-0) during his NFL career.

He earned his third win vs. Mayfield with the Cardinals victory at Carolina last week. On Sunday he will be looking for his second win vs. Hurts.

Murray inherited his starting job at Oklahoma in 2018 following the departure Mayfield. He then passed the starting job to Hurts after leaving for the NFL in 2019.
