



ARIZONA CARDINALS NOTE CARDS

- 8** Different decades in which **Bill Bidwill** - who passed away on Wednesday at the age of 88 - was affiliated with the Cardinals. Beginning as a ball boy, he served the franchise in countless fashions - public address announcer, ticket promotions, scouting, advertising, public relations and contract negotiator - in his time with the Cardinals.
- 1990** Year that Bidwill founded Cardinals Charities, with a mission to support programs designed to improve the quality of life and enhance opportunities for children, women and minorities in Arizona.
- 3** Super Bowls hosted in the state of Arizona under Bidwill's ownership. Arizona staged its third title game in February of 2015 when Super Bowl XLIX took place, bringing a record \$720 million economic impact to the state.
- 14** Different U.S. presidents who have held office since Bidwill's affiliation with the Cardinals began, dating back to Franklin D. Roosevelt.

WITH A WIN...

- The Cardinals would even their all-time series against the Bengals at six wins apiece. Arizona would have back-to-back wins against Cincinnati and four wins in the last five games against the Bengals.
- Arizona would earn its second all-time win at Paul Brown Stadium (2007) and second victory in the last three trips to the Bengals home field.

MILESTONES WITHIN REACH...

WR LARRY FITZGERALD

- With a reception, Fitzgerald would have at least one catch in 232 consecutive games, extending the second-longest streak in NFL history (HOF WR Jerry Rice - 274).
- With a TD reception, Fitzgerald would have at TD catch in all three career games played at Paul Brown Stadium. It would also give him three TD receptions in four career games against the Bengals.
- With 100 receiving yards, Fitzgerald would have 50 career 100-yard games during the regular season.

LB TERRELL SUGGS

- With a sack, Suggs would have 137.0 career sacks, placing him alone in 11th place on the NFL's all-time sacks list.
- With a sack, Suggs would have 13.5 career sacks against the Bengals. He enters Sunday's game with more sacks against Cincinnati (12.5) than any player in NFL history. It would also give Suggs 7.0 career sacks of Bengals QB Andy Dalton.
- With two sacks, Suggs (138.0) would move past Hall of Fame defenders John Randle (137.5) and Richard Dent (137.5) into ninth place on the NFL's all-time sacks list.

LB CHANDLER JONES

- With a sack, Jones would have 45.0 sacks in 53 games with the Cardinals.
- With 2.0 sacks, Jones would have 46.0 sacks as a member of the Cardinals, passing Eric Swann (45.5) for sixth place on the franchise all-time sacks list.

QB KYLER MURRAY

- With two TD passes, Murray would tie the franchise record for TD passes in a player's first five career games. That record is currently held by John Roach (6, 1959-60).
- With 300+ passing yards, Murray would join Patrick Mahomes (3), Andrew Luck (3), Cam Newton (3) and Kurt Warner (3) as the only players in NFL history with at least three 300-yard passing performances in their first five career games.
- With 18 completions, Murray (124) would establish a new NFL record for completions in a player's first five career games.

RB DAVID JOHNSON

- With a TD (of any kind), Johnson (47) would establish a new franchise record for TDs in a player's first five seasons, surpassing the previous high of 46 by WR Larry Fitzgerald (2004-08).
- With a rushing TD, Johnson would tie John David Crow (33) for third place on the franchise all-time list for career rushing TDs.

LB JORDAN HICKS

- According to official NFL statistics, with two tackles Hicks would become the first Cardinals defender with 50+ tackles through the first five games of a season since LB Ronald McKinnon (51) in 2000.
- With 10+ tackles, Hicks would have at least 10 tackles in five consecutive games for the first time in his career. According to official league statistics, dating back to 1999 no Cardinals defender had 10+ tackles in each of the first three games of a season prior to Hicks, who could extend that record to five straight on Sunday.

CARDINALS/BENGALS - THE HIGHLIGHTS

• Sunday's matchup features two first-time NFL head coaches in **Kliff Kingsbury** and **Zac Taylor**. Both are former college QBs who were named Big 12 Offensive Player of the Year as seniors: Kingsbury at Texas Tech in 2002 and Taylor at Nebraska in 2006. The duo also spent a brief time as teammates with the Winnipeg Blue Bombers of the CFL in 2007.

• LB **Jordan Hicks** - who starred at Lakota West High School in Cincinnati - returns to Ohio leading the NFL with 48 tackles in 2019. Last week vs. Seattle - playing in his 57th career game - Hicks forced two fumbles. The fifth-year pro had just one forced fumble in his first 56 career games.

• Arizona leads the NFL with 10 forced fumbles in 2019. The Cardinals have five "strip-sacks" of opposing QBs this season, which ranks second behind only Houston (7). The Bengals have fumbled nine times this season, which is the fourth-highest total in the NFL. Of those nine fumbles, five have come on strip-sacks of QB Andy Dalton.

• In three career games against Cincinnati, WR **Larry Fitzgerald** has 22 receptions for 288 yards and two TDs. In two games at Paul Brown Stadium, Fitzgerald has 14 receptions for 198 yards and two TDs.

• Sunday's game will mark LB **Terrell Suggs'** 29th career matchup against Cincinnati and his 14th at Paul Brown Stadium.

• The Cardinals have won four consecutive games - and seven of the last nine - against teams from Ohio.



SUGGS ON THE VERGE OF A BIG JUMP

LB **Terrell Suggs** entered this year tied for 13th on the NFL's all-time sacks list. With 3.5 sacks through the first four games, he enters Sunday's contest in Cincinnati tied for 11th. Each sack carries meaning moving forward, as he is primed for a significant move up the all-time list.

2.0 sacks will move him into 9th place
3.0 sacks will move him into 8th place
4.0 sacks will move him into 7th place
