- Selected by the Cardinals in the third round (65th overall) of the 2019 NFL Draft, Allen totaled 91 tackles, 11 tackles for loss, 6.0 sacks, 23 QB hits and seven passes defended in 32 games (22 starts) during his first three seasons.
- Posted a career year in 2021, appearing in 15 games (14 starts) and establishing career bests in tackles (48), solo tackles (30), sacks (4.0), QB hits (14), passes defended (4) and fumble recoveries (3). His three fumble recoveries tied for the lead among all NFL defenders last season.
- Scored his first career TD in Week 18 vs. Seattle last season, recovering a Russell Wilson fumble and returning it 16 yards for a TD on the second play from scrimmage.

PRO CAREER:

Selected by the Cardinals in the third round (65th overall) of the 2019 NFL Draft, Allen appeared in 32 games (22 starts) during his first three seasons.

2021: Saw action in 15 games (14 starts) and set career-best marks in tackles (48), solo tackles (30), sacks (4.0), QB hits (14) and passes defended (4); also recorded his first career INT and registered a career-high three fumble recoveries, one of which he returned for a TD ... started at DT for a defense that held the NFL's two-time leading rusher Derrick Henry to 58 yards on 17 attempts (3.4 avg.) @ Ten (9/12) ... registered two tackles (both solo) and a fumble recovery on the final play from scrimmage @ Jax (9/26) ... recorded five tackles (four solo), 1.0 sack, two tackles for loss and one QB hit including a fourth down stop in the fourth quarter to force a 49ers turnover on downs vs. SF (10/10) ... in his return from the Reserve/COVID-19 list, registered six tackles (two solo), 1.0 sack and one QB hit including a goal line stand on third down late in the fourth quarter vs. GB (10/28) ... tallied five tackles (four solo) with one tackle for loss, one QB hit and added a fumble recovery vs. Car (11/14) ... registered five tackles (three solo), one QB hit and one pass defended for a defense that held the Seahawks to just 13 points @ Sea (11/21) ... tallied four tackles, 1.0 sack, one INT and one pass defended @ Chi (12/5); his INT led to a Cardinals TD on the ensuing offensive possession ... registered four tackles (three solo), 1.0 sack, one tackle for loss and two QB hits vs. LAR (12/13) ... recorded three tackles (two solo), two QB hits and recovered a Russell Wilson fumble returning it 16 yards for the first score of the game and his first career TD vs. Sea (1/9/22) ... made four tackles (one solo) in his playoff debut @ LAR (1/17/22).

Appeared in 50 games in four seasons and totaled 199 tackles, 40.5 tackles for loss, 18.5 sacks, 16 passes defended, four fumble recoveries, two INTs and two blocked kicks ... over his final two seasons, had 161 tackles, 30.5 tackles for loss, 12.5 sacks, 12 passes defended, two INTs and two fumble recoveries ... started

all 12 games he played and totaled 61 tackles, a career-high 6.5 sacks, 15 tackles for loss, an INT and a career-high eight passes defended as a senior in 2018 ... earned All-ACC second-team, Pro Football Focus second-team All-America and New England Football Writers All-New England Team honors ... started 13 games, led BC with 6.0 sacks, ranked 10th in school single-season history with 15.5 tackles for loss and finished the year as one of two defensive linemen with 100+ tackles nationally during his junior season in 2017 ... recipient of the 79th annual George 'Bulger' Lowe Award (New England's Heisman Trophy and one of America's oldest college football awards) and was an All-ACC honorable mention selection ... had 36 tackles, 10 tackles for loss, 6.0 sacks, four pass breakups, three QB hurries and two fumble recoveries in 13 games (one start) as a sophomore in 2016 ... played all 12 games as a freshman in 2015.

CARDINALS RETURN TO MEXICO CITY TO FACE 49ERS IN 2022

In May, it was announced that the Cardinals will play the San Francisco 49ers at Estadio Azteca in Mexico City on ESPN's Monday Night Football in a Week 11 matchup on Monday, November 21 at 6:15 PM (Arizona time).

This will be a rematch of the 2005 Cardinals-49ers game at Estadio Azteca which was the NFL's first regular season game held outside the United States. The Cards earned a 31-14 win over the 49ers in that game in front of a then-record crowd of 103,467.

The Cardinals have a long history with international games and have participated in many global "firsts" for the league:

- The franchise played in the first NFL regular season game held outside the United States when they defeated the San Francisco 49ers 31-14 at Estadio Azteca in Mexico City on October 2, 2005.
- The team also played the first NFL game outside of North America on August 16, 1976 against the San Diego Chargers in Tokyo's Korakuen Stadium. The Cardinals won, 20-10.
- The first American football contest played on British soil was a tilt between the Cardinals and Minnesota Vikings in London's Wembley Stadium on August 6, 1983.

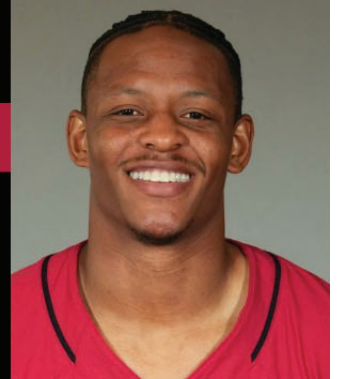

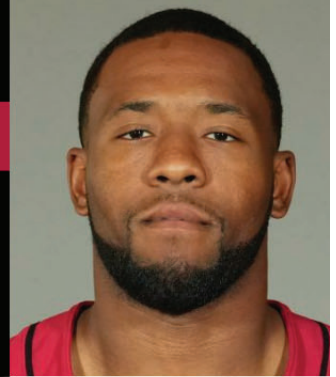

NOTE CARDS

- Selected by the Cardinals in the second round (36th overall) of the 2017 NFL Draft out of Washington and appeared in 78 games (68 starts) during his first five seasons with Arizona.
- Voted a team captain for the second consecutive year and earned his fourth Pro Bowl (third consecutive at safety) berth in 2021 becoming just the fourth player in Cardinals franchise history to receive at least four Pro Bowl nods in his first five NFL seasons. Earned second-team All-Pro honors and was named to the All-NFC team from the PFWA as he set career-best marks in INTs (three) and passes defended (seven).
- Named a team captain, earned first-team All-Pro honors and selected to his third Pro Bowl (second consecutive at safety) in 2020 joining CB Patrick Peterson (4) as the only players in Cardinals history to earn at least three Pro Bowl selections before their 25th birthday. Matched a team high and tied for the NFL lead among DBs with 118 tackles while adding seven tackles for loss, 2.0 sacks, three QB hits, two INTs, six passes defended and a forced fumble.
- Earned his second Pro Bowl nod (first as a safety) in 2019 becoming the first player in franchise history selected to the Pro Bowl as a special teamer and as a position player. Started all 16 games and led all NFL DBs with a career-high 147 tackles (including a league-high 104 solo tackles) and posted seven tackles for loss, six passes defended, six QB hits, a half-sack, a forced fumble and a fumble recovery.
- In 2018, appeared in 14 games (13 starts) and totaled 107 tackles, eight tackles for loss, 2.0 sacks, three QB pressures, four QB hits, two passes defended, a forced fumble and two fumble recoveries (one returned 36 yards for his first career TD); one of just three NFL safeties with 100+ tackles, 2.0+ sacks and 8+ tackles for loss in 2018, according to league statistics.
- Named first-team All-Pro and was voted to the Pro Bowl for his work on special teams as a rookie in 2017 after he led the Cardinals and ranked third in the NFL with 16 special teams tackles. One of just four rookies named to the Pro Bowl in 2017 and became just the fifth Cardinals rookie since the 1970 merger to be named to the Pro Bowl.
- Became the fourth player in Cardinals history to be voted "NFC Defensive Player" of the Month (October, 2020) with 31 tackles, 2.0 sacks, two INTs (90 return yards), three tackles for loss, three QB hits, two passes defended and a forced fumble in three games.
- Named "NFC Defensive Player of the Week" (Week 6, 2020) after posting seven tackles, a sack, his first career INT, a tackle for loss, two QB hits, a pass defended and a forced fumble on Monday Night Football against the Cowboys.
- During a remarkable prep career at Bellevue High School, won five team state titles (three in football, two in track & field) and eight individual state titles in track & field. In football, he played on three consecutive 14-0 teams that won three consecutive 3A state championships.
- Given first name is Bishard. Nicknamed "Budda" by his mother and aunt when he was a child and the name stuck.

PRO CAREER:

The Cardinals acquired Baker in the second round (36th overall) of the 2017 NFL Draft after trading up nine spots (from 45th to 36th) to acquire the University of Washington product. Agreed to terms on a four-year extension on 8/25/20 that will keep him under contract with the Cardinals through the 2024 season.

2021: Named a team captain for the second consecutive season ... earned second-team All-Pro recognition, named to the All-NFC team from the PFWA and selected to his fourth Pro Bowl (third consecutive at safety), becoming just the third player in franchise history named to the Pro Bowl as a safety at least three times ... selected as the Cardinals Art Rooney Sportsmanship Award nominee ... set career-best marks in INTs (three) and passes defended (seven) and totaled 98 tackles (63 solo), 2.0 sacks, six tackles for loss and one fumble recovery while starting in all 17 contests ... recorded eight tackles (five solo) and added one pass defended for a defense that held Tennessee to 248 yards of offense (the second-lowest total in the NFL in Week 1) @ Ten (9/12) ... played every defensive snap and tallied eight tackles (seven solo) with two tackles for loss vs. Min (9/19) ...

tallied eight tackles (five solo) and one fumble recovery for a defense that led the NFL in forced fumbles (nine) and fumble recoveries (five) through Week 4 @ LAR (10/3) ... recorded six tackles (five solo), one INT and one pass defended vs. SF (10/10); his INT in Week 5 was the third of his career, all three coming in a 16-game stretch ... registered seven tackles (two solo), one INT and one pass defended for a defense that held the NFL's 10th-ranked rushing offense to just 39 yards on 11 carries @ SF (11/7) ... registered six tackles (four solo), one INT and one pass defended for a defense whose +112 point differential on the road leads the NFL this season through Week 13 @ Chi (12/5); his INT led to a Cardinals TD on the ensuing offensive possession ... led the team with 13 tackles (seven solo) and added one sack, two tackles for loss, two QB hits and one pass defended vs. Ind (12/25) ... tallied three solo tackles, one sack, one tackle for loss, one QB hit and two passes defended for a defense that held the Cowboys rushing attack to just 45 total yards from scrimmage @ Dal (1/2/22) ... made four tackles (two solo) in his playoff debut @ LAR (1/17/22).

In three seasons at Washington, Baker started all 40 games he appeared in and totaled 200 tackles, 13.5 tackles for loss, 4.0 sacks, five INTs, 24 passes defended and three forced fumbles ... a consensus NCAA All-American in 2016, was also a two-time first-team All-Pac-12 selection ... declared for the draft following his junior season ... started all 14 games and led the Huskies with 71 total tackles and 10 tackles for loss, while adding a career-high three sacks with two INTs, eight passes defended and a forced fumble as a junior in 2016 ... named first-team All-American by the Sporting News, Sports Illustrated, Football Writers and FOX Sports ... earned second-team All-American honors from the Associated Press, Football Coaches, CBS Sports and USA Today ... semi-finalist for the Bednarik Award (nation's top defensive player) and Jim Thorpe Award (nation's top defensive back) ... also named second-team Academic All-Pac-12 ... in Washington's College Football Playoff semifinal matchup vs. Alabama had six tackles, a sack, a tackle for loss and a pass defended ... named first-team All-Pac-12 after starting all 12 games he appeared in and recorded 49 tackles, two INTs, 1.5 tackles for loss and a career-high nine passes defended as a sophomore in 2015 ... named honorable mention Academic All-Pac-12 ... as a true freshman in '14, started all 14 games at safety and earned honorable mention All-Pac-12 honors after he recorded a career-high 80 tackles, a sack, an INT, seven passes defended and two forced fumbles ... named freshman All-American by scout.com ... co-winner of the UW's Travis Spring

Associated Press and Seattle Times State Player of the Year in 2013 and the 2013-14 Seattle Times Male Athlete of the Year (all sports) ... also first-team All-State at both DB and all-purpose and was the 3A state Player of the Year ... MaxPreps All-America first-team selection as a senior ... rushed for 101 yards and a score as Bellevue cruised to its sixth straight title with a 52-20 win over Eastside Catholic in the 2013 state title game ... earned MaxPreps Junior All-America first-team honors in 2012 ... scored on a 61-yard run and a 71-yard punt return in the 2012 state championship game ... named to MaxPreps Sophomore All-America second-team in 2011 ... scored on an 89-yard kickoff return in Bellevue's 2011 state title victory over O'Dea ... also an outstanding sprinter on the track team ... as a senior, led Bellevue to the state title, winning the 100 meters, the 200 meters and the 4x100 relay ... won the 3A state title in the 100 meters (10.77), the 4x100 relay (41.63) and the 4x400 relay (3:20.12) while taking third in the long jump (22-08.25) as a junior in 2013, when Bellevue won the team title ... won the 4x100 and the 4x400 and took fourth in the long jump and fifth in the 200 as a sophomore in 2012.

Attended Mexia (TX) High School where he was named first-team All-District 19-3A as a senior and second-team all-district as a junior ... also a Super Cen-Tex player and All-Academic pick ... allowed only one sack in 2006 as a senior in 2016 ... also starred on the basketball team, where he averaged a double-double in his hoops career ... earned undergraduate degree in Economics and a master's in Liberal Studies ... in February 2016, Beachum visited Honduras with partner organization, World Vision; in 2015, World Vision pioneered the Entrepreneurship and Employment with Technology program which gives children a boost with technology skills and new ways of thinking, using STEM education to ensure vulnerable children in the capital city of Tegucigalpa, Honduras are equipped with the skills that will unlock their future.



CARDINALS IN THE COMMUNITY

Offensive lineman Kelvin Beachum is in his third season with the Cardinals after previously playing in New York, Jacksonville and Pittsburgh. One common theme for Beachum throughout his NFL career has been the impact he has made in each community where he lived. That is in addition to the contributions he has made in his home state of Texas as well.

He is a two-time Walter Payton NFL Man of the Year nominee after he was honored by the Cardinals in 2021 following his first selection with the Jets in 2018. He was also the first, four-time NFLPA Community MVP winner (2016-19) and the 2018 United Way Hometown Hero. Beachum currently serves as a task force member for the Players Coalition.

His main area of focus within the Players Coalition is the education pillar with the mission to bridge the technology and resource gap in low-income communities and to help provide access to equitable, educational opportunities for youth in under-resourced schools. Closing the “digital divide” is of particular significance to Beachum and was the topic of an NFL.com op-ed that he penned in which he expressed concern for children of color and students within underserved communities lacking access to the Internet and technology. During the 2021 season, he donated over 40 laptops and tablets to Arizona schools to address those concerns and help bridge that divide. In October of 2021, he announced the NFL's Player Coalition's donation of \$50,000 to help install new internet access points for 25 school campuses in the Ector County Independent School District in West Texas, and in 2020, he made a \$15,000 donation through Donors Choose to fund 34 projects across Arizona school districts to support STEAM education resources, diverse books for classroom libraries and clean water access.

Providing access to clean water has long been an important cause to Beachum, who donated \$10,000 to the United Way of Newark to provide 100,000 water bottles to residents in need following the Newark Water Crisis in 2019. During a November game at MetLife stadium, he organized a 1 for 1 match challenge. For every water bottle sold, one would be donated to the United Way of Greater Newark. The initiative generated a donation of 26,000 water bottles to families with compromised water. This past offseason in honor of World Water Day, Beachum pledged his commitment to help fund the drilling of two wells in Uganda as a means to bring critical resources to communities struggling as water scarcity stretches across Africa.

Beachum is also passionate about ending hunger and addressing food insecurity. A monthly volunteer at the United Food Bank, Beachum hosted an event in May with teammates D.J. Humphries, Dennis Gardeck, Antoine Wesley, Justin Murray and Eric Smith where he partnered with Safeway/Albertsons to pack meals and donate 200,000 meals to the location in Mesa. Beachum hosted a holiday food distribution last season with Gardeck that served 200 Arizona families prior to Thanksgiving.

Working as Ambassador at Large for the Central Texas Food Bank, Beachum created a monthly mobile food pantry to feed families in his hometown of Mexia, and in 2017, helped raise \$100,000 while matching that contribution. In 2019 he hosted a large scale, drive thru food distribution in Mexia in partnership with HEB and the Central Texas Food Bank that fed over 3000 families. Beachum has contributed his time and financial resources to the Houston Food Bank, Pittsburgh Food Bank, Feeding Northeast Florida Food Bank and the Food Bank of New York City (Harlem) in addition to his current work with the United Food Bank in Arizona.

Beachum celebrated World Food Day 2018 with a fan match initiative that raised \$75,000 for several food banks, which helped serve more than 327,000 meals. In 2015, he also partnered with the Bread for the World organization with the goal of ending hunger in the U.S. and around the world by lobbying Congress to improve summer food programs for school children and pass the Global Food Security Act in 2016.

In 2016, Beachum created “Kelvin Konnects,” a STEAM initiative and program designed to increase minority access to careers within the Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts and Mathematics disciplines. As part of that program, “Kelvin Konnects” adopted the Barack Obama Male Leadership Academy in Dallas. This adoption included hosting a speaker series with industry leaders, local and federal elected officials, providing STEAM programming and curriculum support, funding field trips and college visits, and providing teacher development opportunities.

Beachum hosted a free, annual football camp for 500 youth in Mexia, Texas for six consecutive years. Throughout the camp’s duration, he welcomed over 50 current and former NFL athletes to help lead position drills and coach camp participants on the game of football. The camp also provides each child with a backpack full of school supplies.

In 2020, the Beachum family hosted a food and Christmas tree donation for 100 families at Sirrine Elementary School in Chandler, AZ through a partnership with Lowe’s and the United Food Bank. In 2021, he partnered with World Vision to provide 500 backpacks filled with school supplies to Sun Valley Academy in Phoenix.

In his capacity as a professional speaker, Beachum has delivered keynote addresses at the IT Senior Management Forum Conference, Walsh Hunger Summit at the Pro Football Hall of Fame in Canton and Texas Project Lead the Way Summit. He has also contributed to numerous speaker series and panels on topics such as leadership, diversity and inclusion, web3 and crypto, and technology. He currently sits on two Executive Boards at his alma mater, Southern Methodist University (SMU), where he champions diversity within admissions, pioneers inclusion efforts on campus and supports programming, recruitment and mentorship efforts for students and alumni.

PFWA ARIZONA CHAPTER RECOGNIZES MURRAY AND HICKS IN 2021

In 2021, Arizona Cardinals QB **Kyler Murray** and LB **Jordan Hicks** were honored by the Arizona Chapter of the Pro Football Writers of America. Murray received the Lloyd Herberg MVP Award for his outstanding performance this year and Hicks earned the Steve Schoenfeld Good Guy Award for his cooperation and insight in dealing with the media.

The MVP award was named after Lloyd Herberg, former Cardinals beat writer for the Arizona Republic. Herberg covered the Cardinals from 1988, when the team moved to Arizona, until his death in May of 1994. Herberg fought a courageous battle with cancer. The good guy award is named after another former Arizona Republic writer. Schoenfeld covered the Cardinals and the NFL for the Republic from 1988 to 2000. A former national president of the PFWA, Schoenfeld was killed by hit-and-run driver in October of 2000.

NOTE CARDS

- Signed a one-year contract with the Cardinals on 4/13/21 as an unrestricted free agent following four seasons (2017-20) with Pittsburgh. Re-signed with Arizona in March of 2022, agreeing to a three-year contract.
- A two-time Pro Bowl (2018, '21), two-time Player of the Week (Week 8 of 2018; Week 8 of 2019) and one-time Player of the Month (October of 2018) selection.
- Earned Pro Bowl honors for the second time in his career during his inaugural season with Arizona in 2021, becoming just the fifth Cardinals RB to receive Pro Bowl honors during his first season with the team: Ollie Matson (1952), Johnny Roland (1966), Ottis Anderson (1979) and Johnny Johnson (1990).
- Played in 15 games (6 starts) during the regular season in 2021 and finished the year with 752 yards and 15 rushing on 202 rushing attempts while adding 37 receptions for 375 yards and three TDs. Also scored the Cardinals lone TD in the Wild Card matchup.
- His 18 total TDs marked the second-highest single-season total in Cardinals history and ranked third in the NFL in 2021. His 15 rushing TDs also represented the second-highest single-season total in team annals and ranked second in the NFL last season.
- All 18 of his TDs during the 2021 regular season came in his final 13 games played. Had six games with multiple TDs last season, joining RB David Johnson (8 in 2016) as the only players in franchise history to have at least six such performances in a single season.

- After tearing his MCL during the first game of his junior year at the University of Pittsburgh (2015), attended rehab and began experiencing excessive fatigue and other symptoms, leading doctors to perform a chest x-ray that revealed Hodgkin's Lymphoma. Attended Erie McDowell (Erie, PA) High School where he played RB and saw action on defense ... led the school to the quarterfinals of the PIAA Class AAAA playoffs his senior season after rushing for 1,680 yards and 21 TDs ... as a senior, set a school single-season record with 164 points, including 26 TDs ... also set school records for sacks in a season (12.0 as a senior) and in a career (17.0) ... majored in Administration of Justice.

CARDINALS IN THE COMMUNITY

James Conner began his journey in Arizona in 2021 after spending eight years in the city of Pittsburgh as a Pittsburgh Panther and Pittsburgh Steeler. A published author, Conner's moving story as a cancer survivor has inspired many and created a significant impact in the community.

One of the people inspired by Conner was Carrie Richards, a collaborative practice nurse who became close with Conner while he was undergoing treatment at UPMC Hillman Cancer Center in Pittsburgh. In 2019, Richards was diagnosed with Hodgkin's lymphoma - the same form of cancer Conner was treated for in 2016. In June of 2022, Conner returned to his hometown to present Richards with the 2022 James Conner Courage Award at the 7th annual Dr. Stanley Marks Blood-Cancer Research Foundation Dinner. After Conner was declared cancer free in 2016, Dr. Marks renamed his annual courage award in honor of the former Pitt star.

Last year during training camp with the Cardinals, Conner participated in a zoom meeting with the NFL Flag Football girls team and shared his advice and experience as a professional athlete.

In January of 2021, Conner teamed up with USAA and the Air Force Sergeants Association to award Command Chief Master Sergeant Louis Boykin with a trip to Miami to watch Super Bowl LIV. Conner then met Boykin and other military members in the USAA Salute to Service Lounge during Super Bowl Weekend.

In November of 2020, he donated 200 turkeys to the Second Harvest Food Bank of Northwestern Pennsylvania in his hometown of Erie, PA. He also partnered with Steelers teammates Cameron Heyward, Maurkice Pouncey and JuJu Smith-Schuster to provide local agencies with turkeys and Thanksgiving meals, serving more than 950 families in Pittsburgh, Erie and Long Beach, CA.

In honor of World Cancer Day, Conner visited patients at UPMC Hillman Cancer Center in February of 2020. His goal was a simple one, to encourage and bring hope to patients battling cancer.

In October of 2019, as a frequent participant in the Make-A-Wish Foundation, Conner surprised Andre Jenkins, a 19-year-old undergoing treatment for leukemia with tickets to the Steelers Monday Night Football game.

That same month, Conner was a recipient of the 2019 Ed Block Courage Award, an award voted on by teammates and given to a player who has shown courage either coming back from an injury or a life-altering situation.

- His 635 receptions rank 9th in NFL history among TEs and represent the fourth-highest total in league history by a TE in his first nine seasons behind only Travis Kelce (704), Jason Witten (696) and Tony Gonzalez (648). - The 2021 season marked Ertz's sixth with 70+ receptions. He joined Tony Gonzalez (14), Jason Witten (9), Travis Kelce (7) and Antonio Gates (6) as the only TEs in NFL history with at least six seasons of 70+ receptions.
- The 2021 season was Ertz's seventh with 700 receiving yards. He joined Tony Gonzalez (14), Jason Witten (12), Antonio Gates (10), Shannon Sharpe (9) and Travis Kelce (8) as the only TEs in NFL history with at least seven seasons of 700+ receiving yards.
- In Week 11 of the 2021 season at Seattle, recorded eight receptions for 88 yards and two TDs. It marked just the second time in franchise history a TE had 8+ receptions, 80+ receiving yards and 2+ TD receptions in a game: Jackie Smith (9 for 212 yards and 2 TDs) on 10/13/63 vs. Pittsburgh.
- Playing his first game with the Cardinals in Week 7 vs. Houston last season, Ertz caught three passes for 66 yards, including a career-long 47-yard TD reception. Combined with his five-yard TD catch in Week 6 in his final game with Philadelphia, Ertz became the first player in NFL history to have a TD reception in back-to-back games in a season for two different teams.
- Caught the game-winning touchdown in Super Bowl LII that gave the Eagles a 38-33 lead with just over two minutes left in regulation.
- Ertz's wife, Julie, is a Mesa, AZ native who attended Dobson High School from 2006-2010 before going on to global soccer stardom. She is a member of the U.S. Women's National Team and currently plays for Angel City FC of the National Women's Soccer League.

CARDINALS IN THE COMMUNITY

Tight end Zach Ertz is in his second season with the Cardinals after spending the first nine years of his career with Philadelphia. Since entering the league in 2013, Ertz has made it his mission to give back to the communities in which he has lived and nothing has made that more clear than the creation of the Ertz Family Foundation, established in 2018.

Since Ertz and his wife, Julie, began dating while in college together at Stanford, the pair dreamed of one day creating a foundation that could help people in need. In the spring of 2018, Ertz took a trip to Haiti with his Eagles teammates and it opened his eyes to the plight of the less fortunate and served as a catalyst to launch the family foundation. The mission of the Ertz Family Foundation is to empower others by sharing faith, learning through sports, and advancing education to build supportive communities.

Last year in his first season with the Cardinals, Ertz was named the Week 9 NFLPA MVP after partnering with Arizona food banks to create the "Score More n Feed More" campaign where local food banks received 5,000 meals for every touchdown the team scored through the conclusion of the season. Ertz finished the season donating over 140,000 meals to those in need. In December, he partnered with the Boys and Girls Club of the Valley and took 15 kids on a shopping spree at Dick's Sporting Goods to help celebrate the holiday season.

A cornerstone program of Ertz's foundation was the creation of the House of Hope project. In partnership with Grace Peace Community Fellowship in Philadelphia, the House of Hope was the renovation of a building adjacent to the church with the goal to provide youth a safe place to receive career support, Wi-Fi access, healthy food options, employment support, and financial literacy. The Ertz Family foundation launched a \$900,000 campaign fundraiser to support the required renovations, general operating costs and future programming expenses. Zach and Julie Ertz pledged \$100,000 to fund the Youth Leadership Development Center that is located in the House of Hope.

In March of 2020, Ertz donated \$100,000 to the Philabundance food bank to help those in need during in height of the COVID-19 pandemic. Eagles teammate Jason Kelce also contributed \$25,000 to the cause. Earlier that offseason, the foundation hosted the Paint with the Pros event, a virtual painting session led by former Eagles All-Pro Tra Thomas. Participants took part virtually, using pre-purchased painting canvases and supplies provided by the foundation.

The foundation's first Ertz Par-Tee Golf Tournament and Reception was held in July of 2019. The event raised more than \$400,000 for sports, education, and family enrichment programs. As a part of the "Fund-a-need" campaign, the Ertz's matched every donation made to help total over \$400,000 in proceeds that supported their charity partner, College Is Real. The mission of College is Real is to help students become the first in their families to attend and graduate from college and provides grants to select Philadelphia-area charities offering educational services.

In 2018, the foundation hosted the City of Love Event and Auction Fundraiser. The fundraiser launched the Ertz Family Foundation's City of Love Fund, a grant-making program intended to support local Philadelphia and surrounding area charities that serve youth sports, education and family.

The Ertz Family Foundation officially launched in Pleasanton, CA in July of 2018. The inaugural event was a dinner and silent auction with nearly 200 guests which included family, teammates, and friends from around the sports world.

Cardinals linebacker Dennis Gardeck is a special teams standout, earning Pro Bowl alternate honors in 2019 and serving as a team captain in 2021. With all of his success on the field, he has been just as active in the Valley community, rarely missing an opportunity to participate in school trips, kids camps and hospital visits. His improbable path to the NFL brought him to Arizona in 2018, and since then, he has supported his community with the same passion he brings to the field.

In May, Gardeck along with teammate Devon Kennard held a youth football camp sponsored by Nike at Kennard's former high school (Desert Vista) in Phoenix. Gardeck and Kennard served as team captains and worked with 150 kids ages 7-17 at the camp. They were joined by other Cardinals teammates including J.J. Watt and Zach Ertz.

This past April, Gardeck participated in the team's second annual girls football camp held at State Farm Stadium. The camp presented the opportunity for 125 girls aged 6-12 to learn the basics of flag football in a fun and exciting environment. Gardeck, Big Red, Cardinals Cheerleaders and alumni players led the camp and oversaw football drills.

Earlier in the offseason, Gardeck ran the Cardinals station at the Guardian Games, an event held in conjunction with Special Olympics of Arizona. The concept of the games is to develop a closer relationship between the Special Olympics, law enforcement and Arizona business in a fun format.

In recognition of Women's History Month in March, Gardeck and the Cardinals highlighted local women-owned business through their community spotlight program and provided lunch to each business.

Last November, Gardeck joined teammate Kelvin Beachum in a Thanksgiving event to donate and distribute food to the United Food Banks of Arizona. That same month, Gardeck participated in zoom celebrations with Phoenix Children's Hospital patients who had November birthdays, the third straight year he took part in that program. During training camp, Gardeck also participated in a zoom meeting with NFL Flag Football participants to share his advice and experience as a professional athlete.

During the 2021 offseason, Gardeck hosted a book club in Arizona with students from the Fowler and Madison school districts. As part of the book club, Gardeck conducted Zoom events to discuss the various books with the students.

In March of 2021, Gardeck participated in the virtual "Read Across America Campaign" with Arizona schools. The presentation involved nearly 750,000 students between the ages of 4-11 in more than 1,800 Arizona elementary schools. Gardeck along with head coach Kliff Kingsbury and other teammates read books by beloved children's author Dr. Seuss. The annual nationwide campaign, aimed to promote literacy among children, coincided with what would have been Dr. Seuss' 117th birthday.

In January of 2021, Gardeck participated in a drive-by birthday party held for a patient at Phoenix Children's Hospital. In November, he hosted a virtual birthday party for patients at PCH and provided Cardinals gear for the participants.

In December of 2018 and 2019, Gardeck delivered stuffed toy dogs to children in the pediatric units throughout Phoenix Children's Hospital as part of the team's annual "Paw Express" event to help spread holiday cheer. He has also participated in team's "Feed the Hungry" program at the Phoenix Rescue Mission, joining team owner Michael Bidwill and Cardinals teammates to serve Thanksgiving dinner to the less fortunate.

Another pillar of Gardeck's giving back is his consistent support and appreciation for military veterans. Gardeck joined Nicole Bidwill, Big Red, Cardinals Cheerleaders and teammates in December of 2018 for the team's annual "Light the House" party hosted by the Cardinals Women's Club to help spread holiday cheer at the Ronald McDonald House. In November of 2019, he returned to the Ronald McDonald House with Big Red and Cardinals Cheerleaders for a "Feed the Families" event hosted by the Cardinals Women's Club.

He joined several teammates to show off their culinary skills during "A Night Out with the Arizona Cardinals" at Sakana Sushi & Grill in Phoenix, an annual event that honors cancer survivors. As part of the NFL's "My Cause, My Cleats" campaign, Gardeck's customized cleats supported the American Cancer Society for two seasons (2018-19) and Phoenix Children's Hospital in 2020.

He has been a regular participant in the team's "Milk and Cookies" program, visiting elementary schools throughout the Valley to promote literacy by reading to children. He also takes part in team kids camps, helping to promote the NFL's "Play 60" campaign to encourage kids get at least 60 minutes of exercise every day.

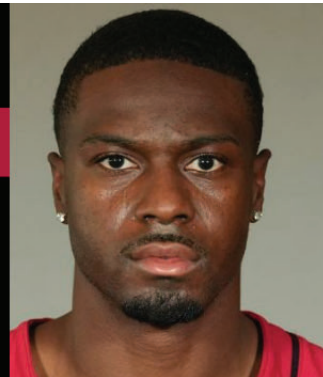

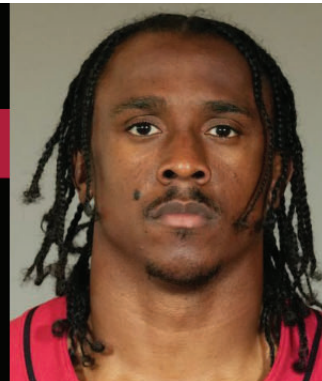

Daniel (Central, SC) High School where he had 57 receptions for 1,266 yards and 18 TDs on offense and 28 INTs (including five returned for TDs) during his prep career ... also returned 11 punts for 289 yards and three TDs, along with two kickoff returns for 119 yards and one TD as a senior ... rated the 12th-best WR in the nation and the state's eighth-best overall prospect by Rivals.com and was the 14th-ranked CB by Scout.com ... Super Prep's sixth-ranked athlete in the state, he received All-State first-team honors from the Charlotte Observer and The State, adding All-Southern honors from the Orlando Sentinel ... finalist for state's "Mr. Football" accolade, he was twice named All-State (defense) by the AP ... participated in the Offense-Defense All American game and the Shrine Bowl ... two-time Seneca Daily Journal Player of the Year and Anderson Independent Player of the Year choice, in addition to receiving Class AAA All-State honors from the High School Sports Report as a junior and senior ... added co-region player of the year recognition as a senior and was a three-time all-region pick ... led D.W. Daniel High to a 37-4 record during his career ... also a four-year starter for the school's basketball team, he earned All-State honors three times and tallied more than 1,300 points, 400 rebounds, 600 assists and 200 steals in his prep career ... led the basketball team to a state title as a senior, the school's first title since 1967 ... his uncle, the late Terry Smith, had 162 receptions as a Clemson Tiger from 1990-93 ... majored in Community Recreation, Sport and Camp Management.

CARDINALS IN THE COMMUNITY

Since entering the NFL in 2013, wide receiver DeAndre Hopkins has served as a tireless advocate for those in need and has participated in a host of events to support local communities – from his hometown in Central, SC to Houston, TX and now in the Valley.

With a passion for youth health and wellness, Hopkins started his inaugural NFL FLAG Football League in 2021, a program that teaches the fundamentals of football through a focused approach to development. The league offers elementary and middle-school boys and girls training tips from Hopkins, access to playing facilities, along with Cardinals and NFL gear and apparel. The league started in December of 2021 and took part throughout the Valley.

In May of 2021, Hopkins announced the creation of "DeAndre's HOP BOX," a cereal that was sold online and in local Fry's grocery stores in Arizona. The proceeds from the cereal went towards Hopkins' nonprofit SM000TH (Speaking Mentally, Outwardly Opening Opportunities Toward Healing) Foundation, which assists survivors of domestic violence.

In January of 2021, Hopkins toured Luke Air Force base in support of the United States Air Force. He received an up-close look at the fighter jets, tried on an 80-pound explosion-proof suit and received an inside look at the technological projects at the base.

In March of 2020 – just a week after being acquired by the Cardinals – Hopkins announced a \$150,000 donation to the Arizona Coronavirus Relief Fund, which was established to provide financial support to multiple organizations dealing with the impact of COVID-19. Money raised by Arizona Relief Fund helped purchase personal protective equipment for medical personnel working with the coronavirus patients; support non-profits that aid the most vulnerable such as food banks, homeless shelters and domestic violence facilities; and provide technology for disadvantaged students needed for online learning.

Having experienced firsthand its devastating effects while growing up in South Carolina, Hopkins has used his platform as an NFL star to serve as an advocate for the victims of domestic violence.

Much of Hopkins advocacy is done through the SM000TH Foundation, established by his mother, Sabrina Greenlee, in 2013. Left blind by a 2002 incident of domestic violence, Greenlee started SM000TH to assist survivors of domestic violence. In addition to providing financial assistance to the foundation, Hopkins also spends time meeting with women his mother mentors and speaking to high school students about his past experiences.





PLAYERS

During his time in Houston, Hopkins was a consistent presence at community events with the Texans, making visits to the Texas Children's Hospital to deliver teddy bears, joining teammate J.J. Watt for the J.J. Watt Charity Softball Classic, taking part in the Texans Champions of Youth Dinner at Steak 48, hosting numerous visits with children through the Make-A-Wish Foundation and working closely with the Boys & Girls Club.

In January of 2019, Hopkins donated his \$29,000 game check from the Texans Wild Card matchup to the family of Jazmine Barnes, a seven-year-old girl who was killed in a drive-by shooting in Houston. Hopkins donation covered the funeral costs and helped bring the perpetrator to justice. In August of that year, Hopkins purchased new football helmets and chinstraps for all the kids playing for youth football teams in Central, SC.

Hopkins joined former Texans teammate Andre Johnson in 2018 to host a special holiday evening for the Madge Bush Transitional Living Center. The pair handed out gifts, interacted with fans and hosted dinner at the Living Center, a charity that provides housing for up to 24 months to sufferers of homelessness or domestic violence, with a focus on single mothers and their children.

Pairing his on-field performance with his charitable giving in 2016, Hopkins donated \$1,000 for every TD scored during the month of October to AVDA-Aid, a charity that assists the victims of domestic violence.

In 2015, Hopkins teamed up with former Daniel (SC) High School and Clemson University teammate Jarvis Jenkins to host the DeAndre Hopkins & Jarvis Jenkins Football Camp. Free for children ages 6-18, the event was held in Central, SC and featured football drills and team-building activities. That was the first in a series of summer camps hosted by Hopkins during his time in the NFL.

In 2014, Hopkins took part in the Texans Care initiative, serving as the spokesman for the Houston Food Bank and Souper Bowl of Caring. Through the initiative, he raised awareness for hunger relief through volunteer activities and nutrition education. Hopkins also visited the Food Bank to meet with children and families and spoke at events to raise awareness for the issue.

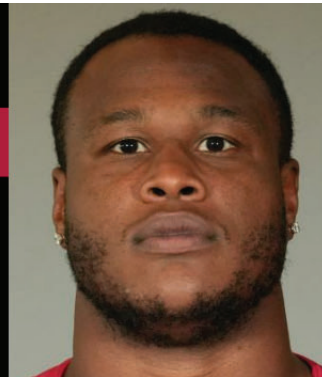

Following a year in 2020 in which he signed a contract extension and had a career-best season, Cardinals Pro Bowl tackle D.J. Humphries decided to honor his grandmother, Elizabeth Ann Means, by creating a foundation in her name in January of 2021. Known fondly as “Pee Wee,” Humphries established “Pee Wee’s House Foundation” in her name to help honor the woman who raised him.

The mission of the foundation is to invest and revive the next generation of youth living in Humphries hometown of Union, SC. The foundation focuses on the importance of holistic nutrition, helping kids choose the best possible career path and teaching financial literacy and money management. The key words to describe the purpose of the foundation are Educate, Empower and Evolve.

Humphries and the foundation have held multiple events in Union to help promote their fresh food initiative by delivering boxes of fresh produce to families throughout the community in need.

In May of 2022, Humphries continued his fight against hunger and partnered with teammate Kelvin Beachum to donate 200,000 meals to the United Food Bank in Mesa. Along with Safeway/Albertsons, the players along with teammates Dennis Gardeck, Antoine Wesley, Justin Murray and Eric Smith packed meals for families in need.

Last July, the foundation hosted a Back to School Carnival that featured a backpack and supply distribution to local students in Union. The free event also included activities like bounce houses, face painting, balloon animals and a rock climbing wall.

KATELYN CLAW NAMED INAUGURAL RECIPIENT OF ADELE HARRIS SCHOLARSHIP

In May of 2021, the Cardinals announced the creation of the “**Adele Harris Scholarship**” to commemorate the 50th anniversary of Harris becoming the first African American female to hold a front office position in the NFL.

In September, **Katelyn Claw** was announced as the inaugural recipient of the award. Claw – a graduate of Monument Valley (Kayenta, AZ) High School in the Navajo Nation – served as manager for the Mustangs football team and plans to pursue a career in sports marketing. A multi-sport athlete and daughter of a high school football coach, she is enrolled in the sports administration program at Fort Lewis College.

“This scholarship serves two main purposes,” said Cardinals owner Michael Bidwill. “It recognizes the valuable role that Adele played within our organization for more than a quarter of a century and also connects her to future generations who aspire to follow in her footsteps. We are grateful for the opportunity to do both of those things.”

Harris spent 26 years in a variety of public and community relations roles within the Cardinals organization before retiring in 2001. A Chicago native, she was raised in St. Louis and joined the Cardinals in 1971 as an assistant in the PR department. She left the club to pursue a degree in business management and returned in 1978 as a publicity assistant.

By 1980, Harris became Director of Community Relations and was instrumental in the team’s civic efforts when it relocated to Arizona in 1988. She played a key role in the formation of Cardinals Charities, which was launched in 1990 as a vehicle to support programs designed to improve the quality of life and enhance opportunities for children, women and minorities in Arizona. Adele passed away in 2007 at the age of 65.

The \$10,000 “Adele Harris Scholarship” will be awarded annually to assist a graduating high school student in the state of Arizona who is pursuing a career in sports.

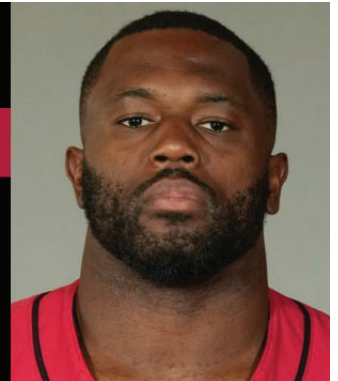

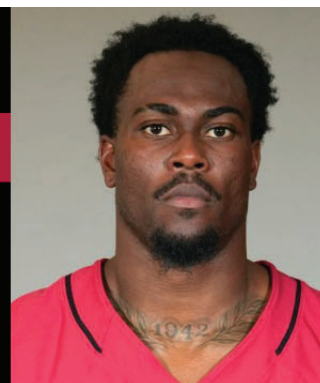

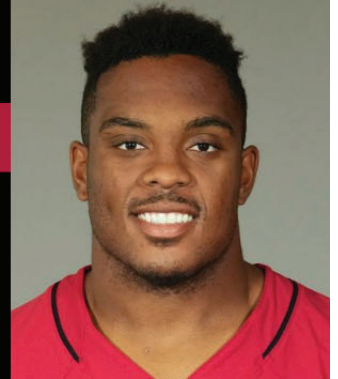

Since entering the league with the Giants as a fifth-round pick in 2014, he has been known for both his on-field performance and community service. He came to the Cardinals from the Lions where he was selected as Detroit's 2019 Walter Payton NFL Man of The Year.

In May, Kennard along with teammate Dennis Gardeck held a youth football camp sponsored by Nike at his former high school (Desert Vista) in Phoenix. Kennard and Gardeck served as team captains and worked with 150 kids ages 7-17 at the camp. They were joined by other Cardinals teammates including J.J. Watt and Zach Ertz.

This past April, Kennard kicked off financial literacy month by teaching a financial education program to teenagers at ICAN Chandler. The program WorldofMoney.org is a leading provider of financial education to underserved youth. ICAN is a free, family-centered youth service in the East Valley providing a full compilation of programs proven effective in equipping youth to achieve personal and academic success by tackling substance abuse, gang involvement and juvenile delinquency.



In recognition of Women's History Month, Kennard and the Cardinals highlighted local women-owned business through their community spotlight program and provided each business with lunch.

In Arizona, Kennard has built on his commitment to student development through the Devon Kennard Scholarship Fund that awards students transitioning to college with scholarships to advance their education. Originally established in 2019 during his time in Detroit, Kennard established the scholarship fund through the Midnight Gold Program, which helps underserved youth transition from high school to college and professional.

Kennard joined the Arizona chapter of the NFL's Fuel Up To Play 60 program upon arriving in the Valley in 2020. As part of the campaign, Kennard has participated in several youth camps to help educate kids on the importance of maintaining healthy eating habits and establishing a positive lifestyle. He originally joined the Fuel Up To Play 60 program when he was with the Lions in 2019.

For the second consecutive December, Kennard partnered with ICAN Chandler and Target to surprise after-school students with \$500 gift cards, books, school supplies and snacks. ICAN selected 10 students with the most success in the classroom and Kennard surprised the kids in person and spent time getting to know each recipient.

In June of 2021, Kennard established his "Reading With DK" campaign in Arizona. The program focuses on motivating kids to pick up a book throughout summer break. Originally established during the 2017 offseason while a member of the Lions, Kennard selects a book and engages children with discussion and questions on his social media accounts. Everybody who participates in the Reading With DK challenge are entered to win autographed gear from Kennard.

He also partnered with Arizona PBS for an eight-part series and nationwide campaign in which Kennard – among other notable figures – encourage people to read by discussing books that have inspired and shaped them.

In February of 2021, Kennard and his father, Derek Kennard Sr., who played five seasons (1986-90) for the Cardinals, participated in a virtual event, "The Power of Mentoring," that was hosted by Big Brothers Big Sisters of Central Arizona in honor of Black History Month.

In May of 2020, as part of the Cardinals Carryout campaign to support local restaurants during the COVID-19 pandemic, Kennard gave back to frontline workers by personally delivering meals to four fire departments in the Valley.

Kennard spent the majority of the 2019 offseason in Phoenix, where he volunteered at the first-annual "Hogs and Dawgs" Lineman Academy. The camp provided high school student athletes from Arizona the opportunity to receive offensive and defensive line coaching from Kennard and his father Derek.

Following the 2018 season, Kennard was instrumental in launching Lions Inspire Change, the team's player-driven social justice initiative. Along with his teammates, Kennard participated in Talk It Up Thursday, an event hosted by the Detroit Police Department and the Men of Courage organization that featured a panel of Lions players and male students to discuss social resiliency and how to succeed.

During his time with the Giants, Kennard was an active volunteer and generous donor for New City Kids, an after-school program for low-income youth who get the chance to explore academics and music in a creative environment. Kennard helped mentor children through the challenges of urban life while developing their skills in the classroom and extracurricular talents. In 2017, he also teamed up with We Are DREAM and visited local New York schools to help kids recognize their potential and realize their dreams.

While attending USC, Kennard began his philanthropic efforts by volunteering to feed the homeless and visiting cancer patients at the children's hospital in LA. In 2012, Kennard and 12 of his USC teammates traveled to Haiti to build homes for families devastated by earthquakes.

A skilled public speaker, Kennard has also delivered keynote addresses at several events on a variety of topics including athletics, work ethic, networking, faith and education. For more information on Kennard's community work, visit www.devonkennard.com.

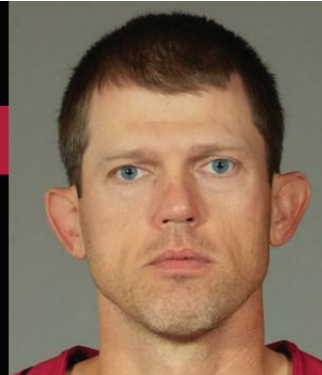

CARDINALS IN THE COMMUNITY

Andy Lee and his wife, Rachel, tragically lost their infant daughter, Madelyn, just eight days after she was born in 2015, and while Madelyn's life was brief, her impact has been immense.

To honor their daughter's memory, the Lee's established Madelyn's Fund, a non-profit designed to support NICU (Neonatal Intensive Care Unit) families through the process, including those who experience the trauma of losing a child. The average NICU daily cost is \$3,500 per infant, so for many, the grief is compounded by financial stress.

Each year, Madelyn's fund hosts a celebrity golf tournament in Charlotte and a Pink Bow Gala to raise money for NICU patients and their families. Lee also has worn custom-designed cleats in support of Madelyn's Fund as part of the NFL's My Cause, My Cleats campaign.

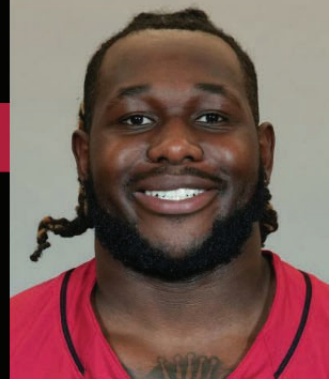

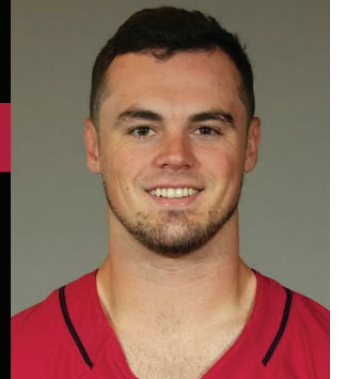

PAT TILLMAN JERSEY PRESENTATION HELD AT STATE FARM STADIUM

In November of 2021, the Cardinals - along with the Pat Tillman Foundation and United Service Organizations (USO) - hosted a ceremony to present Cardinals Legend and U.S. Army Ranger Pat Tillman's jersey prior to their Week 10 matchup vs. the Carolina Panthers at State Farm Stadium.

The jersey was donated to the USO by the NFL and was proudly displayed at the Pat Tillman Memorial USO center at Bagram Airfield, Afghanistan from 2005-21. With the closing of the airfield, the USO transferred the jersey to the Pat Tillman Foundation in Arizona.

Cardinals owner and Pat Tillman Foundation board member Michael Bidwill was on the field for the presentation with several members of the Pat Tillman Foundation. Two of the most recent Tillman Scholars, U.S. Army veteran HyeJung Park (2020) and U.S. Marine Corps veteran Michael Hall (2021), were also recognized during the ceremony.

Pat Tillman was selected by the Cardinals in the seventh round (226th overall) of the 1998 NFL Draft out of Arizona State. He defied odds to become a three-year starting safety and set a franchise single-season record with 224 tackles in 2000. Following the 9/11 terrorist attacks, Tillman turned down a three-year contract and left the Cardinals prior to the 2002 season to enlist in the U.S. Army with his brother, Kevin. He was killed in action on April 22, 2004 in Afghanistan. His jersey #40 became the fifth retired number in team history, and he was inducted into the Cardinals Ring of Honor in 2006.

The Pat Tillman Foundation identifies remarkable veterans and military spouses as the next generation of leaders and helps them scale their impact as they enter their next chapter of service beyond self through academic scholarships, lifelong leadership development, and a global community of peers and supporters.

Attended Allen (TX) High School where he ranked as one of most accomplished Texas high school players ever after leading Allen to three straight state titles while never losing a game as a starting QB (43-0) ... had 14,515 total yards (10,386 passing; 4,129 rushing) and 186 total TDs (117 passing, 69 rushing) ... named the 'Best Texas High School Football Player of All-Time' in a fan poll by Texas High School Football magazine ... as a senior in 2014, earned National Player of the Year honors from Gatorade, Parade and USA Today after completing 278-of-433 pass attempts (64.2%) for 4,713 yards and 54 TDs while rushing for 1,485 yards and 25 TDs ... named Mr. Texas Football Player of the Year in 2014 by Dave Campbell's Texas Football magazine ... completed 207-of-325 passes (63.7%) for 3,669 yards and 46 TDs as a junior while adding another 1,274 yards and 19 scores on ground ... rushed for 1,370 yards and 25 TDs as a sophomore while passing for 2,004 yards and 17 TDs ... also starred on Allen's baseball team and was first player ever selected to play in Under Armour All-American games for both football and baseball ... an outfielder on the Oklahoma baseball team, started 50 of his 51 games for the Sooners in 2018 and hit .296 with 10 home runs, 13 doubles, 47 RBI, 46 runs and 10 stolen bases ... father, Kevin, lettered at Texas A&M from 1983-86 and finished career holding virtually every season and career passing record ... Kevin was also inducted into Texas A&M Athletic Hall of Fame in 1999 and the Cotton Bowl Hall of Fame in 2012 ... Human Relations major ... when the Cardinals selected him the #1 overall pick in the 2019 NFL Draft, Murray became the first Asian-American ever selected #1 overall; Murray is one quarter Korean; his father is African American and his mother, Missy, is half Korean; Kyler's maternal grandmother is from South Korea ... an avid gamer, in 2021 Murray became a member of the FaZe Clan, one of the largest esports gaming organizations in the world; members of the FaZe Clan – which included Kyler – were featured on the cover of Sports Illustrated in 2021 ... also has a passion for playing chess, a game he picked up in fourth grade; was a member of the chess club at Degan Elementary School in Lewisville, TX and in fifth grade, in just his second year playing, Murray became the Degan Elementary chess champion.



CARDINALS IN THE COMMUNITY

Not one to seek recognition for his work in the community, Cardinals Pro Bowl quarterback Kyler Murray has given back and supported those in need both in Arizona and in his home of Texas during his time in the NFL.

This past offseason, Murray took part in a community event and a \$10,000 check presentation to the Arizona Educational Foundation on behalf of Kretschmar, Albertsons and Safeway while also visiting the Boys & Girls Clubs of the Valley for a kids skill camp and another \$10,000 check presentation. The money for the Boys & Girls Clubs of the Valley is helping that organization provide a safe, positive, and fun environment for kids during their time away from school.

In February of 2021, Murray donated 60,000 meals to the North Texas Food Bank after that region's devastating winter storm that caused widespread power outages that resulted in residents not having heat or running water.

During the 2020 season, Murray made a special connection with 12-year old Hector Nahle. Nahle, a youth quarterback from Mexico, was in the middle of being treated for cancer when the pair connected over Instagram with Murray sending a special message that included an autographed game jersey along with the promise to fly Hector and his family to Texas following his recovery.



Murray also served as an active participant during the COVID-19 pandemic of 2020. With schools closing due to the outbreak, he pledged \$25,000 to GENYOUth's COVID-19 Emergency School Nutrition Fund in April of 2020. He also participated in the NFL's Draft-a-Thon along with country music star Blake Shelton and NFL Network host Rich Eisen to raise money for the fund. His generous contributions helped combat hunger by feeding children who depend on school meals, which were able to continue for thousands of students during the pandemic.

In January of 2020, Murray participated in the Twitch Rivals Streamer Bowl along with other NFL players. He finished second in the event and was awarded \$80,000 for the charity of his choice – the Colon Cancer Coalition. Murray also joined Chase Edmonds and Christian Kirk for Twitch Stream Aid 2020 to raise money for charity and support COVID-19 relief efforts in March of 2021.

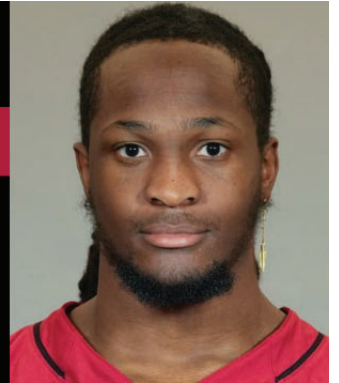

Whitman School of Management.



CARDINALS IN THE COMMUNITY

Since entering the league with the Giants in the first round of the 2013 NFL Draft, offensive lineman Justin Pugh has used his platform to become a positive influence in the community and he has stayed busy in the Arizona community since coming to town in 2018.

In 2020, Pugh was named the Cardinals USAA Salute to Service nominee. The award is given to a player who provides year-round effort to honor, empower and connect with the nation's service members, veterans and their families. As the brother of an active duty United State Air Force service member, supporting the military and first responders has always been close to Pugh's heart. Pugh partnered with Merging Vets and Players, a program designed to address the challenge of transitioning from the battlefield to home by creating an environment where veterans and athletes can share their strength and experience.

Pugh not only donated to the organization but honored them by wearing MVP themed shoes as a part of the NFL's "My Cause, My Cleats" campaign for the fourth consecutive season in 2020. His involvement with the military continued when he joined Cardinals teammates to visit Luke Air Force base as part of the NFL's Salute to Service month in November of 2018. The group from the Cardinals got an up-close look at F-35s and F-16s from the 61st Fight Squadron and visited various personnel stationed on the base.

In the middle of the COVID-19 pandemic in 2020, Pugh served as an ambassador for an initiative involving State Farm and the Arizona Cardinals donating one million meals spread among five local food banks in the Valley:

- Mary's Food Bank
- Vincent DePaul
- United Food Bank
- Phoenix Rescue Mission
- Midwest Food Bank

In 2019, Pugh hosted his second annual holiday party for 100 local youth for a private, advance screening of Spies in Disguise. The group of kids came from Heart for the City AZ, a Phoenix-based nonprofit that works with underprivileged youth to provide wholistic academic, physical, mental and professional programming. In addition to the screening, Pugh provided concessions and surprised the kids with holiday gifts.

During the 2017 NFL Draft, Pugh visited Joint Base McGuire-Dix-Lakehurst in New Jersey to thank members of the military for their service, host a youth football event for their kids and announce the Giants fifth-round pick on television with his brother Michael, who was stationed at the base.

Pugh has also participated in a Pro vs. GI Joe event where players competed in video games against military veterans through the Wounded Warrior Project which works to provide services and programs for wounded service members. On the 15th anniversary of 9/11, Pugh honored first responders by joining firefighters from Engine 34 Ladder 21 for a BBQ dinner at their firehouse in Hell's Kitchen.

Beyond the causes, campaigns and charitable organizations with which Pugh is associated, he hasn't missed the opportunity to impact lives through simple kindness.

While living in Jersey City, he befriended his elderly neighbor, Bill, who had lost his wife, suffered a back injury and fallen behind on his rent. The two developed a special bond, and Pugh's financial assistance prevented Bill from being evicted from his home of more than 30 years. Despite moving to Arizona, Pugh continues to speak with Bill and his son.

Since 2015 he has hosted the annual Pugh Crew Summer Kickoff, a free football camp in his hometown of Bucks County, PA. The camp allows 250 local boys and girls the opportunity to receive instruction from Pugh, other NFL and college players and professional coaches while also developing teambuilding skills, learning how to set goals and building confidence.

During his time in New York, Pugh served as the national spokesperson for Shriners Hospitals for Children and their Game Day for LOVE campaign which supports the life-saving and life-changing care to kids in need of specialized medical care. As part of the campaign, Pugh hosted a viewing party, featuring a raffle and silent auction, in New York City when his alma mater, Syracuse, took on Clemson in 2014. In Week 17 the 2014 season, Pugh hosted three Shriners patients at the Giants home game against the Eagles. The patients and their families were treated to a VIP tour of the stadium and received pregame field passes. Pugh also supported Shriners on the gameshow "Who Wants to be a Millionaire" during their charity week in 2015 and won \$10,000 for the organization, in addition to a \$10,000 check from Pugh directly.

FORMER CARDINALS HEAD ATHLETIC TRAINER HONORED BY PRO FOOTBALL HALL OF FAME

In June of 2022, former Cardinals head athletic trainer John Omohundro was honored by the Pro Football Hall of Fame in Canton, OH as a member of the inaugural “Award of Excellence” Class of 2022.

The “Award of Excellence” is part of the Hall’s effort to recognize outstanding contributions from members of four groups vital to the game’s success on the field and behind the scenes. The honor goes to individuals who have spent their football careers as assistant coaches, athletic trainers, equipment managers and public relations personnel.

Each of the four groups developed its own selection committee and criteria for the award. Those committees each chose five members for the inaugural Class of 2022. The other four athletic trainers joining Omohundro in the inaugural Award of Excellence class were George Anderson (Raiders), Otho Davis (Eagles), Jerry Rhea (Falcons) and Frank Zamberletti (Vikings). The five combined had over 150 years as professional athletic trainers in the NFL.

Recipients of the Awards of Excellence were invited to a special ceremony at the Hall of Fame in Canton, OH and their names were placed on display inside a designated area of the Hall of Fame Museum.

In addition to earning a permanent spot in the Pro Football Hall of Fame, Omohundro and the four other trainers were also named to the inaugural class of the Professional Football Athletic Trainers Society (PFATS) Hall of Fame.

Prior to his retirement in the Spring of 2009, Omohundro spent 42 years with the Cardinals organization, including the last 37 years as the team’s head athletic trainer. Including preseason, regular season and postseason, Omohundro worked 838 games over the course of his Cardinals’ employment with his final contest being Super Bowl XLIII in February of 2009.

He joined the Cardinals in 1967 after spending six years in the U.S. Army Reserve as a senior medical specialist. A graduate of the University of Wyoming, Omohundro is a member of the Missouri Sports Hall of Fame.

Omohundro was honored with the Fain-Cain Memorial award during the 2008 offseason by the NFL Teams Physician’s Society, presented to someone who best reflects the virtues of a certified athletic trainer and displays the highest level of professionalism. The Cardinals’ training staff was also named staff of the year in 1993 by PFATS.

CARDINALS HONOR 2021 ARIZONA HIGH SCHOOL AWARD WINNERS

In December of 2021, the Cardinals announced the following awards from the team recognizing the 2021 season of Arizona high school football:

Quarterback **Angel Flores** from Casa Grande High School was named the "Cardinals High School Player of the Year." Flores led the Cougars to the 4A State Championship and finished the year completing 149-of-195 passes for 2,671 yards and 26 touchdowns. He also ran for 1,292 yards and 19 touchdowns this season.

Quarterback **Nicco Marchiol** from Hamilton High School was named the "Cardinals Offensive High School Player of the Year." Marchiol finished the year completing 203-of-273 passes for 2,690 yards and 37 touchdowns.

Defensive end **Russell Davis II** from Hamilton High School was named the "Cardinals High School Defensive Player of the Year." Davis II finished the year with 87 tackles (48 solo), 17.5 sacks (third in the state), 28.5 tackles for loss and two interceptions. His dad, Russell Davis, played six years with the Cardinals (2000-05) and appeared in 79 games.

Kicker/Punter **Grady Gross** from Horizon High School was named the "Cardinals High School Special Teams Player of the Year." Gross averaged 45.7 yards on 40 punts, including 15 inside the 20-yard line. He averaged 69.7 yards on 99 kickoffs and totaled 104 points on the year.

Head Coach **Jake Barro** from Casa Grande High School was named "Cardinals High School Coach of the Year." Barro led Casa Grande to its first ever 4A State Championship and finished with a perfect 14-0 record this season.

Each player winner received a customized jersey and glass trophy while Head Coach Jake Barro was honored with \$2,000 to support his football program and a trophy to commemorate the award.

The awards were selected by a local sports panel consisting of Cardinals defensive lineman Corey Peters, 12 News sports anchor Cameron Cox, former high school football coach Kelly Epley, former 12 News sports anchor Bruce Cooper, high school broadcaster Michael Carotenuto, and Arizona Republic/azcentral.com high school writer Richard Obert.

ARIZONA AND DAYLIGHT SAVING TIME

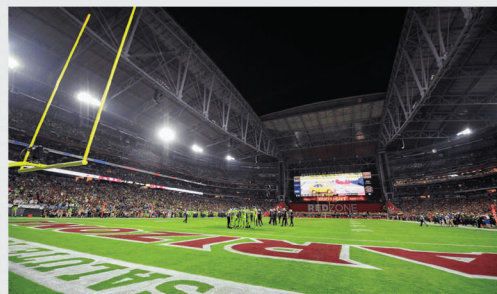
Every year people across the country turn their clocks ahead in the spring and back in the fall, except in Arizona.

Although Arizona stays on standard time throughout the year, never changing its clock forward or back, the time change, or lack thereof, does affect the Cardinals local kickoff times during the season.

In 2022, daylight saving time was observed on the second Sunday in March (March 13) and ends on the first Sunday in November (November 6). When daylight saving time is in effect, Arizona is three hours behind the east coast, making a 4:00 p.m. kickoff in New York a 1:00 p.m. kickoff in Arizona. However, when daylight saving time ends, Arizona is only two hours behind the east coast, making a 4:00 p.m. kickoff in New York a 2:00 p.m. kickoff in Arizona.

In 1967, the Uniform Time Act was instituted, putting the entire country on daylight saving time. After one year, states could opt out, and Arizona went back to standard time and stayed there. Residents and lawmakers of Arizona knew there was an abundance of sunshine and did not see the need to move their clocks ahead in order to save any. The only other state that does not observe Daylight Saving Time is Hawaii.

In May of 2022, the U.S. Senate passed legislation to make daylight savings permanent starting in 2023, ending the twice-annual changing of clocks. The measure needs to be passed through Congress and be signed into law by the President in order for it to take effect.

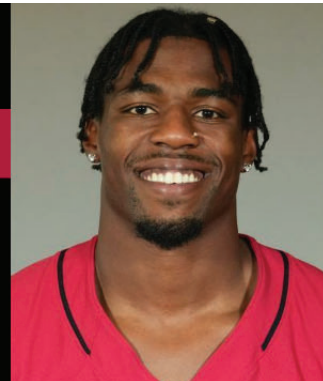

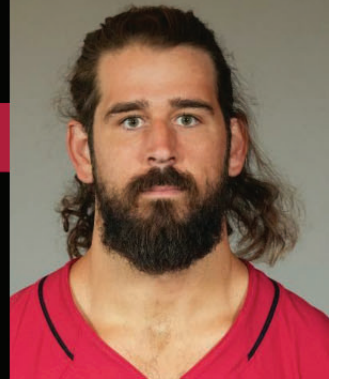

- After spending his first 10 seasons with the Texans – who selected him in the first round (11th overall) in the 2011 NFL Draft – signed a two-year contract with the Cardinals on 3/2/21 as a free agent.
- A five-time 1st-team All-Pro and five-time Pro Bowl selection, was also named the 2017 Walter Payton NFL Man of the Year.
- Has been named NFL Defensive Player of the Year three times (2012, '14-15), tied with Rams DT Aaron Donald and Giants LB Lawrence Taylor for the most in NFL history.
- Along with his brother, T.J. (2021), became the first set of siblings ever to take home NFL Defensive Player of the Year honors.
- In the last 10 years (2012-21), an NFL player has recorded 20.0+ sacks in a season just five times. The Watt brothers – J.J. in 2012 (20.5); 2014 (20.5) and T.J. in 2021 (22.5) – have accounted for three of those campaigns.
- Led the NFL in sacks with 20.5 in 2012 and 17.5 in 2015 and finished second in the league with 20.5 in 2014 and 16.0 in 2018.
- Is the only player in NFL history to have multiple seasons of 20.0 or more sacks (2012, '14) and joins Hall of Famer Reggie White as the only players in NFL history to post three or more seasons with at least 17.5 sacks (2012, '14-15).
- In 135 career games, has totaled 102.0 sacks, 26 forced fumbles, 16 fumble recoveries, 292 QB hits, 177 tackles for loss, 547 tackles (419 solo), two INTs. Also has 6.0 sacks, 10 tackles for loss, 6 passes defended and an INT in eight playoff contests.
- Only 10 players in NFL history had more sacks in their first 135 career games than Watt (102.0).
- His 177 tackles for loss, 292 QB hits, 48 games with multiple tackles for loss and 26 games with 2.0+ sacks lead the NFL since he entered the league in 2011.
- Since entering the NFL in 2011, only Von Miller (115.5), Chandler Jones (107.5) and Cameron Jordan (107.0) have more sacks than Watt (102.0).
- Ranks sixth in NFL history (min. 75 games played) in sacks per game (.756), trailing only brother T.J. Watt (.935), Reggie White (.853), DeMarcus Ware (.778), Chandler Jones (.773) and Aaron Donald (.772).
- Among active NFL defensive linemen, only Seattle's Carlos Dunlap (69) has more career passes defended than Watt (63).
- In the 16 years (2006-21) Pro Football Reference has tracked QB hits, owns the NFL's four highest single-season totals: 51 in 2014, 50 in 2015, 46 in 2013 and 43 in 2012.
- Has scored seven TDs in his career (6 regular season, 1 postseason): Three career receiving TDs, three INT return TDs and a fumble return TD.
- Owns the Texans franchise record for the most career sacks with 101.0.
- After suffering a would-be season-ending shoulder injury in Week 7 of the 2021 season, returned for the team's first playoff berth since 2015, recording three tackles (one solo) and one tackle for loss in the effort.
- In 2020 while starting all 16 games for the seventh time in 10 seasons, Watt became just the fourth player in NFL history to record at least 100.0 career sacks in his first 120 games (Reggie White, Bruce Smith, DeMarcus Ware).
- His six AFC Defensive Player of the Month awards are tied for the most by any defensive player in NFL history (Bruce Smith) while his seven AFC Defensive Player of the Week awards rank second (Aaron Donald - 8) among any active player in the league.
- Wife, Kealia, plays for the Chicago Red Stars of the NWSL and his brothers, Derek (FB) and T.J. (LB), play for the Pittsburgh Steelers.

PRO CAREER:

Originally entered the league as a first-round (11th overall) selection by the Houston Texans in the 2011 NFL Draft. Signed a six-year contract extension with Houston on 9/2/14. Released by Houston on 2/12/21 and signed a two-year contract with the Cardinals on 3/2/21.

2021: Named a team captain in his first season in Arizona ... after suffering a would-be season-ending shoulder injury in Week 7, Watt returned for the team's first playoff berth since 2015 ... tallied two tackles (both solo), one tackle for loss and a QB hit for a defense that held the NFL's two-time leading rusher Derrick Henry to 58 yards on 17 attempts (3.4 avg.) (9/12); lined up on offense alongside Leki Fotu in the **☒Megawatt☒** package on Kyler Murray's two-yard TD run ... registered two tackles (both solo) for a defense that held the

Vikings to just three second-half points vs. Min (9/19) ... tallied two tackles (one solo) and one tackle for loss for a defense that held the Jaguars to six points on six second half possessions @ Jax (9/26) ... recorded one tackle and two QB hits for a defense that allowed 20 or fewer points in its third game (an NFL-high through Week 4) @ LAR (10/3) ... registered three tackles (all solo), one pass defended and tallied season highs through Week 5 in tackles for loss (two) and QB hits (four) vs. SF (10/10); his pass defense came late in the fourth quarter on a fourth-and-four to force a 49ers turnover on downs (the Cardinals would score the game-clinching TD on the ensuing possession) ... tallied a season-high five tackles (one solo) through Week 6 and added one sack, two QB hits, one pass defended and one forced fumble for a defense that held the NFL's #1 ranked rushing attack (187.6 ypg) to just 73 yards and no TDs on 19 carries (3.8 avg.) @ Cle (10/17); his sack and forced fumble came late in the third quarter with Arizona holding



a 23-14 lead and Cleveland at the AZ 45-yard line, leading to a Cardinals TD on the ensuing offensive possession; the sack was Watt's first of Browns QB Baker Mayfield, who became the 41st different QB Watt has sacked in his career; the sack brought Watt's career total to 102.0 through 134 career games (only seven players in NFL history have had more sacks through their first 134 games); among active NFL players, only Denver LB Von Miller (110.5) has more total sacks; Watt's 102.0 sacks is tied with Cardinals LB Chandler Jones for second-best in the NFL among active players ... recorded one solo tackle and one tackle for loss for a defense that held the Texans to just 42 rushing yards and shut them out in the second-half vs. Hou (10/24) ... inactive (shoulder) vs. Green Bay (10/28) ... placed on injured reserve (shoulder) on 11/6, designated to return on 1/7/22 and activated on 1/17/22 ... in his first action since Week 7, registered three tackles (one solo) and one tackle for loss in his Cardinals playoff debut @ LAR (1/17/22); Watt's three tackles marked his best postseason performance since the 2012 Divisional Playoffs.

COLLEGE:

Played two seasons (2009-10) at the University of Wisconsin after transferring from Central Michigan where he spent the 2007 campaign ... redshirted at Wisconsin in 2008 following the transfer ... started all 26 games he appeared in for the Badgers at strongside DE, recording 106 tackles (74 solo) with 11.5 sacks for a loss of 75 yards, 36.5 tackles for loss and 28 QB pressures ... recovered five fumbles (one at Central Michigan) and caused four others, blocked four kicks and deflected 13 passes in his college career ... as a junior in 2010, was named an All-America first-team selection by The NFL Draft Report, earning second-team honors from the Associated Press and Sports Illustrated and was a consensus All-Big Ten Conference first-team choice ... recipient of the Lott IMPACT Trophy and was also named Lott IMPACT Player of the Week for his performance vs. Ohio State ... started all 13 games in 2010 at strongside defensive end,

finishing second on the team with 62 total tackles while leading the Badgers with 7.0 sacks, finishing third nationally with 21.0 tackles for loss ... blocked three kicks and deflected eight passes and intercepted another for a 15-yard return ... named an All-American and second-team All-Big Ten Conference selection by The NFL Draft Report as a sophomore in 2009, earning All-Big Ten honorable mention from the league's coaches and media and was also chosen Academic All-Big Ten.

PERSONAL:

Full name is Justin James Watt ... attended Pewaukee (WI) High School where he earned first-team All-State, all-conference, all-area and all-county honors as a senior in 2006 when he played tight end and defensive end ... also earned Woodland Conference Player of the Year recognition and was named team MVP that season ... four-year letterman in football while also lettering in basketball, baseball and track and field ... competed in the shot put as a senior, earning first-team All-State honors after capturing the state title at the 2007 WIAA Division II Championship where he set a school record with a throw of 58 feet, 11.5 inches ... grew up playing hockey and played for travel teams that went to Canada and Germany for tournaments ... raised more than \$37 million for Hurricane Harvey relief efforts in Houston following the devastating floods ... founded and serves on the board of directors of the Justin J. Watt Foundation, which provides support to after-school athletic programs around the country ... served as the Grand Marshal of the 2012 Houston Livestock Show and Rodeo and Art Car Parades ... wife, Kealia, plays for the Chicago Red Stars of the National Women's Soccer League (NWSL) ... brothers, Derek (fullback) and T.J. (linebacker) play for the Pittsburgh Steelers ... received an honorary doctorate from the Baylor College of Medicine in May of 2018 for his work in the Houston community ... Life Sciences Communication major at Wisconsin where he earned Academic All-Big 10 Conference honors.

CARDINALS IN THE COMMUNITY

J.J. Watt's personal motto – "Dream Big, Work Hard" – serves as the mission that drives the All-Pro's charitable work in communities throughout the United States. Key among those efforts is supporting under-funded after-school and youth sports programs, to which Watt attributes much of his success.

In addition to his foundation's extensive work, the 2017 NFL Walter Payton NFL Man of the Year award winner is well-known for supporting worthy causes such as food banks, children's hospitals, women's shelters and, most notably, Hurricane Harvey relief.

Justin J Watt Foundation

While still a student-athlete at the University of Wisconsin in 2010, Watt established the Justin J Watt Foundation to provide after-school opportunities to underserved children. Using athletics as a conduit for development, students learn the value of accountability, teamwork, leadership, work ethic and perseverance in a safe and supervised environment with their peers.

The foundation has donated more than \$6.5 million to after-school athletics programs in 38 states and D.C., including eight schools in Arizona – Arizona City Elementary, ASU Prep Academy, Cactus Canyon Junior High, Canon Elementary, Cheatham Elementary, Paseo Pointe Middle School, Pensar Academy and Santa Fe Elementary.

The J.J. Watt Softball Charity Classic, the foundation's flagship event, has raised more than \$4 million in just six games. Most recently held at Houston's Minute Maid Park in 2019, the event pitted Texans offensive players against its defenders.

Hurricane Harvey Relief

While the Texans were on the road for a preseason game in 2017, Hurricane Harvey made landfall in Houston. As the storm wreaked havoc and destruction began to mount, Watt announced a fundraising campaign in a social media video that he posted from a Dallas hotel room.





He set an ambitious goal of \$200,000 and pledged to match the first \$100,000, but within 19 days, more than 200,000 individuals collectively donated \$37 million to the cause, making it the largest crowd-sourced fundraiser in history. Contributions continued, and the final tally reached \$41.6 million, which significantly benefited a large variety of relief efforts throughout the months following the storm.

In the year after Hurricane Harvey, Watt's fundraising supported:

- The cleanup, repair and rebuilding of more than 600 homes.
- The recovery and rebuilding of more than 420 childcare centers and after-school programs, serving more than 16,000 children.
- The distribution of more than 26 million meals to those impacted.
- Physical and mental health services to more than 6,500 individuals.
- The distribution of medicine to more than 10,000 patients.

Other Notable Community Efforts

- **Pat Tillman Foundation:** A long-time fan of Cardinals legend Pat Tillman, Watt had already begun collaborating with the Pat Tillman Foundation before signing with Arizona, and prior to the annual Pat's Run in 2021, Watt held a meet-and-greet with a lucky participant via Zoom. In May, Watt honored Tillman with the JJ IV Valor, his signature shoe from Reebok, which he began designing before he signed with the Cardinals. Reebok pledged \$10 to the Pat Tillman Foundation for each pair of shoes sold up to \$10,000, and Watt announced he would donate all his personal proceeds to the Pat Tillman Foundation.
- **Make-A-Wish:** Watt has become a frequent participant in the Make-A-Wish program, helping grant more than a dozen wishes throughout his career.
- **Houston Food Bank:** Watt and his wife, Kealia, donated \$350,000 to the Houston Food Bank in March of 2020 to assist relief efforts during the COVID-19 pandemic.
- **Hospital Visits:** Throughout his NFL career, Watt has been a regular visitor to children's hospitals in Texas and his home state of Wisconsin. In 2012, he delivered Christmas gifts and caroled with kids at Texas Children's Hospital, and in 2015, he returned dressed as Batman to surprise the young patients. After a 2018 shooting at Santa Fe (TX) High School, Watt met with victims at Clear Lake Regional Medical Center, and after delivering the commencement address at the University of Wisconsin in 2019, he visited children at a hospital in Madison, WI.
- **Mission of the Yahweh:** In December of 2019, the Watt couple delivered iPads, robes, slippers and dinner to Mission of Yahweh, a faith-based shelter that empowers, enriches and restores the lives of homeless women and children while providing outreach services to low-income communities.

RECOGNITION FOR WATT'S COMMUNITY EFFORTS

Walter Payton NFL Man of the Year

Watt was honored with the 2017 Walter Payton NFL Man of the Year award, the only league award that recognizes a player's off-the-field community service as well as his playing excellence.

SI Sportsperson of the Year

Watt joined Astros second baseman José Altuve as co-winners of the 2017 SI Sportsperson of the Year for uplifting the city of Houston after immense devastation caused by Hurricane Harvey. The award is given annually to the athlete or team whose performance that year most embodies the spirit of sportsmanship and achievement.

Honorary Doctorate from the Baylor College of Medicine

In February of 2018, Watt received a Doctor of Humanities in Medicine degree from the Baylor College of Medicine for his role in organizing relief efforts in the wake of Hurricane Harvey.

Big Ten Dungy-Thompson Humanitarian Award

The former Wisconsin Badger earned the 2019 Big Ten Dungy-Thompson Humanitarian Award, which recognizes Big Ten students who have achieved humanitarian success following their academic and athletic careers at a Big Ten university.

Spirit of Bull Community Award

In 2014, Watt received the Spirit of the Bull Community Award, given annually to a Houston Texans player in recognition of his work in the community.

NFLPA Byron 'Whizzer' White Community MVP Finalist

Watt was recognized as a finalist for the 2018 Byron 'Whizzer' White Community MVP award, given annually by the NFLPA to a player who goes above and beyond to perform community service in their team cities and hometowns.

Chad owns All Eyes DB camp, a South Florida-based organization that coaches and trains defensive backs and linebackers ... coached in high school by Patrick Surtain Sr., father of fellow 2021 NFL Draft pick and former high school teammate Patrick Surtain II.

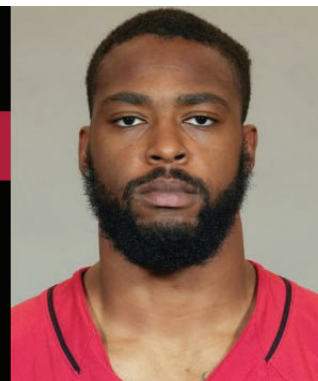
