ROTE CAR

Days in between game action for QB Kyler Murray should he play on Sunday vs. Atlanta. Murray last played in a game on December 12, 2022.

Runs of 20+ yards this season for RB James Conner before suffering a knee injury in Week 5 against the Cincinnati Bengals. Despite having missed the last four games, Conner is one run of 20+ yards shy of the most in NFL (Four Players Tied - 6).

Receptions for TE Trey McBride over the last four games. McBride has more than twice as many receptions in his last four games than he did in his first five games of the season (8). His 28 catches this season are the second most on the team trailing only WR Marquise Brown (42).

WITH A WIN...

- The Cardinals would improve to 12-2 at home vs. Atlanta, including a 5-0 mark at State Farm Stadium (including postseason).
- The Cards would improve to 11-7 vs. the NFC South at home since beginning play at State Farm Stadium in 2006 (including postseason).

MILESTONES WITHIN REACH...

QB KYLER MURRAY

- With 152 passing yards, Murray would join Josh Allen, Cam Newton and Russell Wilson as the only QBs in NFL history with 14,000+ passing yards and 2,000+ rushing yards in their first five seasons.
- With a TD pass, Murray would have 85 passing TDs in his career.
- With 3+ TD passes, Murray would have 3+ passing TDs in a game for the 13th time in his career. Only Neil Lomax (15 times in 108 games) and Charley Johnson (14 times in 87 games) would have more such performances.

RB JAMES CONNER

- With a rushing TD, Conner would have 25 rushing TDs as a member of the Cardinals. That would tie Pat Harder (1946-50) for ninth place on the franchise all-time list for career rushing TDs.
- With a TD (of any kind), Conner would have 29 TDs in 34 games with the Cardinals. In franchise history, only RB David Johnson (34) would have more TDs in his first 34 games with the team.
- With a TD (of any kind), Conner would have at least one TD in seven of his last eight home games.

WR MARQUISE BROWN

With a TD reception, Brown would have seven TD receptions in 11 games played at State Farm Stadium since joining the Cardinals last season.

WR RONDALE MOORE

■ With a rushing TD, Moore (1) would become the first Cardinals WR with multiple rushing TDs in a season since WR Bobby Joe Conrad (2) in 1959 and the only WR in the NFL with multiple rushing TDs this season.

WR MICHAEL WILSON

- With a TD reception, Wilson would join John Brown (5), Anquan Boldin (4) and Larry Fitzgerald (3) as the only Cardinals rookie WRs in the last 36 seasons to have 3+TD catches through their first nine games.
- With two TD receptions, Wilson would join Fitzgerald and Boldin as the only rookies in franchise history to have multiple games with two TD catches.

DL DANTE STILLS

- With 1.5 or more sacks, Stills would join Simeon Rice (3 in 1996) and Andre Wadsworth (2 in 1998) as the only players in franchise history with at least two games of multiple sacks in their rookie season.
- With 1.5 or more sacks, Stills would become the first rookie this season with at least two games of multiple sacks.

LB DENNIS GARDECK

- With a sack, Gardeck would establish a franchise record for sacks by a player who entered the league as a rookie free agent. He is currently tied with LB Ronald McKinnon (12.0) for the franchise mark.
- With a sack, Gardeck would have a team-high 5.0 sacks this season.

K MATT PRATER

- With 12 points, Prater would reach 1,737 points in his career and pass Norm Johnson (1,736) for 16th place on the NFL's all-time list for career points.
- With a field goal of 50+ yards, Prater (40 games) would tie K Neil Rackers (16 in 100 games) for the most field goals of 50+ yards in franchise history.

PAIR OF PLAYMAKERS POSSIBLY RETURN

The Cardinals offense could possibly see the return of QB **Kyler Murray** and RB **James Conner** this Sunday when the team is at State Farm Stadium to face the Falcons.

Murray has missed the last 13 games and Conner has missed the last four games while the two have been recovering from knee injuries.

In the duo's 20 games together over the last two seasons, they have combined for 52 total TDs, including 21 on the ground.



Murray and Conner are set to re-join an already formidable run game. <u>Arizona currently ranks fourth in the NFL in yards per carry (4.78) and sixth in rushing yards (1,143) despite missing the two Pro Bowlers for a bulk of 2023.</u>

Both have seen recent success against Atlanta. Conner has totaled 295 scrimmage yards and two TDs in two career games against the Falcons. In Murray's lone meeting with Atlanta, he completed 27-of-37 pass attempts (73.0%) for 340 yards and three TDs en route to his first career home win.

HOME SWEET HOME

WR Marquise Brown has caught a TD pass in each of the Cardinals four home games this season. <u>Brown joins Dolphins WR Tyreek Hill as the only NFL players to have a TD reception in four consecutive home games in 2023.</u>

With a TD reception Sunday vs. Atlanta, <u>Brown would become just the fifth player in franchise history to have a TD catch in at least five consecutive home games</u>. He would be the third player to do so at State Farm Stadium and the second player to do so within a single season (Mal Kutner - 6 games in 1948).

Brown also has 5+ receptions and 50+ receiving yards in three of four games at State Farm Stadium this season. Through nine games, Brown leads the team with 42 receptions for 440 yards and four TDs.

GET TO THE QUARTERBACK

The Cardinals defense has a knack of getting to the quarterback this season.

Arizona's 25 sacks through nine games are tied for the 10th most in the NFL while Atlanta has allowed the seventh-most sacks (27) this season.

LB Josh Woods and DL Leki Fotu split a sack of Browns QB Deshaun Watson last week in Cleveland. Woods became the 12th different member of the Cardinals to record at least a partial sack this season. Only the Ravens (13) and Chiefs (13) have more players with at least a partial sack in 2023.
