



ARIZONA CARDINALS NOTE CARDS

- 50** Days it will have been (on Sunday) since Tampa Bay last played at home. The Bucs last game at Raymond James Stadium was on 9/22/19 vs. the Giants. After hosting the 49ers on Thursday night last week, Arizona has begun a 32-day stretch between home games (next home game is vs. the Rams on 12/1).
- 44.0** Passer rating for Buccaneers QB Jameis Winston in two career games against the Cardinals. Arizona won both games as Winston completed 32-of-62 pass attempts (51.6%) for 304 yards, a TD, a fumble and four INTs (one returned 60 yards for a TD).
- 3** Different players who scored a TD for Arizona last week. None of the three had ever scored for the Cardinals prior to that game. Rookie WRs Andy Isabella and KeeSean Johnson each had their first career TD catch and RB Kenyan Drake - acquired from Miami 72 hours prior to the game - also had a rushing TD.
- 263** Combined distance (in yards) of Arizona's three longest scoring drives vs. SF last week (85, 88 and 90 yds). In their first seven games, the 49ers defense allowed just one scoring drive that covered 80+ yards.

WITH A WIN...

- The Cardinals (4) would surpass their win total from all of last season (3).
- Arizona would run its winning streak against the Buccaneers to four straight. The Cardinals would also improve to 12-9 in their all-time series against Tampa Bay.
- **Kyler Murray** would tie the franchise record for wins by a rookie QB (4) and become the first rookie QB in team history to win three road games in a season.

MILESTONES WITHIN REACH...

WR LARRY FITZGERALD

- With a reception, Fitzgerald would have at least one catch in 237 consecutive games, extending the second-longest streak in NFL history (HOF WR Jerry Rice - 274).
- With a TD reception, Fitzgerald would have six TD catches in his last five games against the Buccaneers. He would have at least one TD catch in each of his last five games against Tampa Bay. Including his two-TD performance in Super Bowl XLIII vs. Pittsburgh following the 2008 season, Fitzgerald would have four TD receptions in four career games at Raymond James Stadium.

LB TERRELL SUGGS

- With a sack, Suggs would have 138.5 career sacks, tying DeMarcus Ware for eighth place on the NFL's all-time sacks list. TB QB Jameis Winston would become the 76th different QB Suggs has sacked in his career. In NFL history, only Reggie White (77) and Julius Peppers (77) would have sacked more QBs.
- With two sacks, Suggs would tie Jason Taylor (139.5) for seventh place on the NFL's all-time sacks list.

LB CHANDLER JONES

- With a sack, Jones would have 10.5 sacks in 2019. He would become the first player in franchise history with 10+ sacks in at least four seasons.
- With a sack, Jones would have 51.5 sacks in 58 games with the Cardinals.
- With 1.5 sacks, Jones would have 11.0 sacks in 2019. That would tie the franchise record for sacks in the first 10 games of a season (11.0 by Freddie Joe Nunn in 1988).

QB KYLER MURRAY

- With 5 completions (no INTs), Murray (177) would establish a new NFL rookie record for consecutive pass attempts without an INT. The current record of 176 is shared by Dak Prescott (2016) and Derek Carr (2014).
- With 319 passing yards, Murray would establish a new franchise single-season record for passing yards by a rookie. The current record of 2,547 yards is held by Matt Leinart (2006).
- With two TD passes, Murray would become the first rookie in franchise history with multiple TD passes in at least five games.

RB DAVID JOHNSON

- With a receiving TD, Johnson would become just the fifth player in NFL history with at least 30 rushing TDs and 15 receiving TDs in his first five seasons. He would join Marcus Allen, Thurman Thomas, Chuck Foreman and Abner Haynes as the only players to accomplish the feat.

RB KENYAN DRAKE

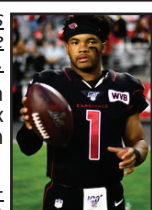
- With 100 rushing yards, Drake would become the first Cardinals player with 100+ yards in each of his first two games with the team since RB Otis Anderson did so in the first two games of his rookie season in 1979.

LB JORDAN HICKS

- With 10 tackles, Hicks would become the first AZ defender to reach 100+ tackles in 10 games or fewer since LB Ronald McKinnon posted 104 tackles through 10 games in 2000. It would also mark his seventh game this season with 10+ tackles. Hicks leads the NFL with six games of 10+ tackles in 2019.

ROOKIE PROTECTS THE BALL

Dating back to Week 4 vs. Seattle, rookie QB **Kyler Murray** has attempted 172 consecutive passes without throwing an INT. He has also run the ball 56 times this season without losing a fumble.



With Murray under center, the Cardinals are currently riding a streak of five consecutive games without a turnover. Arizona's six total games without a turnover this season are tied with Green Bay for the most in the NFL in 2019.

Among QBs who have started at least eight games in 2019, Murray (4) joins Seattle's Russell Wilson (2) and Green Bay's Aaron Rodgers (4) as the only ones with four turnovers or fewer (combined INTs and fumbles lost).

172 AND COUNTING WITHOUT AN INTERCEPTION

Dating back to the first quarter of Week 4, Murray has attempted 172 consecutive pass attempts without an INT. That is easily the longest active streak in the NFL.

BALL SECURITY CRUCIAL THIS WEEK

The Bucs defense ranks in the top-10 with 13 takeaways in 2019. Nearly 30 percent (67) of Tampa's 230 points this season have come as a result of takeaways.

Murray's streak of 172 consecutive pass attempts without an INT is the third-longest for a rookie in NFL history.

AZ'S EFFECTIVE RUSHING ATTACK

Arizona's rushing attack - which ranked #32 in the NFL last season in most statistical categories - has been highly effectively in 2019. The team has done so using players at nearly every skill position. Among the players getting carries this season are 5 RBs, 4 WRs and 1 QB.

Arizona is the only team in the NFL that has had four different players rush for 100+ yards this season: **Kyler Murray** (313), **David Johnson** (300), **Chase Edmonds** (295) and **Kenyan Drake** (110).

The Debut of the David/Kenyan Combo

Drake made his Arizona debut against the 49ers in Week 9 on TNF after the team traded for him on Monday (10/28). Johnson is set to return to the lineup this week after missing most of Week 7 and all of Weeks 8-9 due to injury. In the last full game each RB played (Drake in Week 9 vs. SF; Johnson in Week 6 vs. Atl) they put up a combined 264 yards (144 rushing, 120 receiving) and three total TDs (2 rushing, 1 receiving).
