



ARIZONA CARDINALS NOTE CARDS

185 Receptions for WR Larry Fitzgerald in 30 career games against the Rams. He has more receptions against the Rams than any other player in NFL history has against any single opponent. Fitzgerald also has 2,098 receiving yards, 18 TD receptions and his lone career TD pass against the Rams.

4.96 Rushing average for the Cardinals this season (1,295 rushing yards on 261 attempts). Should that number hold it would represent the highest team rushing average in a season in franchise history. The current record of 4.87 yards/attempt dates back to 1960.

5 Turnovers committed by QB Kyler Murray through his first 11 career games. Murray has thrown just one INT in his last 249 pass attempts dating back to Week 4 vs. Seattle, and has accounted for 13 TDs (10 passing, 3 rushing) in that same span.

6 Games in which the Cardinals have scored 25+ points since the beginning of October (Week 5). Arizona, Baltimore and New Orleans are tied for the most such performances in the NFL during that span.

WITH A WIN...

- The Cardinals would take an 18-17 lead in their series against the Rams since joining the NFC West in 2002.
- **Kyler Murray** would tie the franchise record for wins by a rookie QB (4).

MILESTONES WITHIN REACH...

WR LARRY FITZGERALD

- With a reception, Fitzgerald would have at least one catch in 239 consecutive games, extending the second-longest streak in NFL history (Jerry Rice - 274).
- With a TD reception, Fitzgerald would have 19 career TD catches against both the Rams and 49ers. In NFL history, only Jerry Rice (25 vs. Falcons; 20 vs. Rams) would have more TD receptions against a single opponent.
- With 36 receiving yards, Fitzgerald would pass Andre Johnson (7,776 at NRG Stadium) for the second-most receiving yards in NFL history in a single stadium behind only Jerry Rice (9,403 at Candlestick Park).
- With 100 receiving yards, Fitzgerald would have 50 career 100-yard games during the regular season.

LB CHANDLER JONES

- With a half-sack, Jones would have 13.0 sacks for the third consecutive season. In NFL history, only Reggie White (4 straight) would have had 13.0+ sacks in more consecutive seasons than Jones.
- With a half-sack, Jones would also sit alone in third place on the franchise all-time sacks list with 54.0 sacks in 60 games with the Cardinals.
- With a full sack, Jones would have 13.5 sacks in 2019. Through 12 games, that would put him ahead of his pace in 2017 when he had 13.0 sacks through 12 games on his way to a franchise single-season 17.0 sacks that year.

QB KYLER MURRAY

- With two TD passes, Murray would establish a new franchise record for TD passes by a rookie (16). That would surpass the current record of 15, set by Jake Plummer in 1997.
- With two TD passes, Murray would have multiple TD passes in four consecutive games. The NFL rookie record for consecutive games with multiple TD passes is five.
- With 84 rushing yards, Murray would establish a new franchise record for rushing yards by a QB. The current record of 501 was set by Hall of Famer Charley Trippi in 1951.
- With 300 passing yards, Murray (5) would join Andrew Luck (6 in 2012) as the only two players in NFL history with at least five 300-yard passing performances during their rookie season.

LB TERRELL SUGGS

- With a sack, Suggs would have 139.0 career sacks and pass DeMarcus Ware (138.5) for eighth place on the NFL's all-time sacks list.
- A sack of Rams QB Jared Goff would make him the 77th different QB Suggs has sacked in his career. Suggs would tie Hall of Famer Reggie White (77) and Julius Peppers (77) for the most QBs sacked in a career.

RB DAVID JOHNSON

- With a receiving TD, Johnson would become just the fifth player in NFL history with at least 30 rushing TDs and 15 receiving TDs in his first five seasons. He would join Marcus Allen, Thurman Thomas, Chuck Foreman and Abner Haynes as the only players to accomplish the feat.

LB JORDAN HICKS

- With an INT, Hicks would become just the third Cardinals player in the last 16 seasons with an INT in at least three consecutive games, joining S Antoine Bethea (3 straight in 2017) and CB Patrick Peterson (4 straight in 2012).

JONES HITS GAME #60 WITH ARIZONA

LB **Chandler Jones** will appear in his 60th game with Arizona on Sunday. Despite having played in just 59 games, Jones has 13.0 more sacks than any other player in Cardinals history had in their first 60 games with the team.

Since being acquired by Arizona in a trade with New England prior to the 2016 season, Jones has been one of the NFL's most productive defensive players. Since joining the Cardinals, he leads the NFL in sacks (53.5), ranks second behind LA's Aaron Donald in tackles for loss (63) and second behind Chicago's Khalil Mack with 14 forced fumbles.

Jones and Donald - who will both be on the field at State Farm Stadium on Sunday - are the only players in the NFL that rank in the top-five in sacks, tackles for loss and forced fumbles over the last four seasons (2016-19).

TOTH TO ADMINISTER THE OATH

The Cardinals are hosting their *Salute to Service* game when they face the Rams at State Farm Stadium on Sunday. One member of the team will play a special part in the events taking place at the stadium prior to kickoff.

Following pre-game warmups, Cardinals OL and active duty U.S. Army 1st Lieutenant **Brett Toth** will administer the Oath of Enlistment ceremony to 50 future U.S. Army soldiers from the U.S. Army Phoenix Recruiting Battalion station. Toth, who is presently injured, is also an assistant instructor of Military Science for the ASU ROTC program.



A PAIR OF BREAKOUT SEASONS

LB **Chandler Jones** (tied for NFL lead in sacks and forced fumbles) isn't the only Cardinals player that sits atop the NFL statistical rankings in 2019.

HICKS HAVING CAREER YEAR IN ARIZONA DEBUT

LB **Jordan Hicks** has recorded 111 tackles, 1.5 sacks, 3 INTs, 8 tackles for loss, 6 QB hits, 6 passes defensed and 2 forced fumbles in 2019. His 111 tackles in 2019 led the NFL entering Week 13.

GONZALEZ KICKING HIS WAY TO THE TOP

Entering Week 13, K **Zane Gonzalez** - now in his third season - led the NFL with 26 FGs. He has already surpassed the FG total from his first two seasons combined (24).
