



ARIZONA CARDINALS NOTE CARDS

4 Punts - out of six total - that landed inside the 10-yard line for P **Matt Haack** last week. Making his Cardinals debut - and playing in his first NFL game in 1 year, 21 days - Haack became the first Cards player to land 4+ punts inside the 10 since Dave Zastudil (4) on 9/15/13 vs. Detroit.

17 Takeaways for the Cardinals defense this season (9 INTs, 8 FR). Only five teams have more. Of Arizona's 17 takeaways, 10 have come in the last four games.

80 Completions for QB **Jacoby Brissett** in the last two games (47 vs. SF; 33 vs. Jax). That is the most in franchise history in any two-span, besting the previous mark of 73 by Kurt Warner in 2008.

26 Modern Era Semifinalists for the NFL's Hall of Fame Class of 2026. Among that group is Cardinals WR **Larry Fitzgerald**, who played his entire 17-year career with the Cardinals and ranks #2 in NFL history in career receptions and receiving yards behind only Jerry Rice.

MILESTONE WATCH

WITH A WIN...

- Arizona would take a 12-11 lead in its all-time series vs. Tampa Bay. The Cardinals would earn their first win at Raymond James Stadium since 2013.

MILESTONES WITHIN REACH...

LB JOSH SWEAT

- With 1.0 sack, Sweat would have 10.0 sacks in 2025. He would become just the 14th different player in franchise history - and first since J.J. Watt in 2022 (12.5) - to have 10.0+ sacks in a season.

TE TREY McBRIDE

- With 1 reception, McBride (302) would pass Jimmy Graham (301 from 2010-13) for the most receptions by a TE in his first four seasons in NFL history.
- With 5 receptions, McBride would have 5+ catches for the 14th consecutive game. In NFL history, only Travis Kelce (15 in 2018) would have a longer streak among TEs.
- With 1 TD reception, McBride would have 8 TD catches in 2025. That would tie Doug Marsh (8 in 1983) for the second-highest single season total in franchise history by a TE behind only Hall of Famer Jackie Smith (9 in 1967).
- With 3 receiving yards, McBride would eclipse 80+ receptions and 800+ receiving yards for the third consecutive season. He would join Travis Kelce (2016-24), Jimmy Graham (2011-14), Jason Witten (2007-10), Todd Christensen (1983-86) and Tony Gonzalez (2007-09, 2011-13) as the only TEs in NFL history to have 3+ consecutive seasons with 80+ receptions and 800+ receiving yards.

QB JACOBY BRISSETT

- With 300+ passing yards, Brissett would become the first Cardinals player with 300+ passing yards in three straight games since Carson Palmer (3 straight) in 2017. His three straight games with 300+ passing yards would tie for the second-longest streak in franchise history behind only Kurt Warner (5 straight in 2008).
- With 103 passing yards, Brissett (1,990) would pass Kurt Warner (1,989 in 2005) for the most passing yards by a Cardinals QB in his first seven starts with the team.
- With 1 passing TD, Brissett (12) would pass Jake Plummer (11 in 1997) and Kent Graham (11 in 1996) for the most passing touchdowns in a player's first seven starts with the Cardinals.

WR MICHAEL WILSON

- With 100+ receiving yards, Wilson would become the first Cardinals player with 100+ receiving yards in three consecutive games since WR Larry Fitzgerald (3 straight) accomplished the feat in 2008.
- With 10+ receptions, Wilson would become the first player in Cardinals history to have 10+ receptions in three consecutive games.
- With 8 receptions, Wilson (33) would pass DeAndre Hopkins (32 in Games 1-3 of 2020) for the most receptions in a three-game span by a Cardinals player.

S BUDDA BAKER

- With 5+ tackles, it would be Baker's 30th consecutive game with 5-or-more tackles, the third-longest streak by a DB in NFL history. It is also the second-longest active streak behind only Commanders LB Bobby Wagner (40 games).

DL CALAIS CAMPBELL

- With 1.0 sack, Campbell would have 6.5 sacks in 2025. It would mark the second time in his last six years (6.5 in 2023 w/ Atlanta) Campbell had at least 6.5 sacks in a season.

CB DENZEL BURKE

- With an INT, Burke (3) would become the first Cardinals rookie with at least three INTs in a season since CB Patrick Peterson (4) in 2011.

WR GREG DORTCH

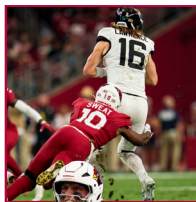
- With a TD reception, Dortch would have a TD catch in three consecutive games and a TD (rushing or receiving) in four straight games for the first time in his career.

BIRDS' EYE VIEW

A RECORD RUN FOR WILSON

WR **Michael Wilson** led the team in receptions (10) and receiving yards (118) for the second week in a row vs. Jacksonville in Week 12. He joined Rams WR Puka Nacua as the only players this season to have consecutive games of 10+ receptions and 100+ receiving yards. Wilson also became just the fourth player in franchise history to have such a streak, joining DeAndre Hopkins (2022), Anquan Boldin (2005) and Larry Centers (1995).

His 25 total receptions in back-to-back games are the third-most in a two-game span this season behind only Bengals WR Ja'Marr Chase (28, in Weeks 7-8 and 26 in Weeks 6-7) and are the most in franchise history in any two-game span, surpassing the previous mark of 24 (Trey McBride - 2024; Anquan Boldin - 2008). Wilson also became the ninth WR in NFL history to post 25+ receptions and 300+ receiving yards in a two-game span.



Over his last four games, LB **Josh Sweat** has recorded 6 tackles, 8 QB hits, 4.0 sacks, 4 tackles for loss, a forced fumble, a fumble recovery and a pass defended. His 9.0 sacks this season exceed his output from all of last season and represent the second-highest single season total of his career behind his 11.0 sacks in 2022. As the Cardinals head to Tampa Bay, Sweat has 2.0 sacks of QB Baker Mayfield in his three career matchups including 1.0 last season when the Eagles played at Raymond James Stadium in Tampa Bay in Week 4.

MCBRIDE CONTINUES TO RISE

TE **Trey McBride** has 80 catches in 2025, tied for the second-most in the NFL behind only 49ers RB Christian McCaffrey (81 in 12 games). He now sits at 301 receptions for his career, tied with Jimmy Graham for the most by a TE in their first four seasons in NFL history. With his next catch, McBride will own the record.

Among tight ends this season, McBride ranks first in receptions (80), receiving yards (797), and first down receptions (44) and is tied for first in touchdown receptions (7). He is one of just seven tight ends who has not dropped a pass this season while being targeted on at least 20% of offensive snaps played. According to Pro Football Focus, he has the highest receiving grade (85.9), and fourth-highest offensive grade (81.2) among tight ends in the NFL this season.

GATHERING WITH GRATITUDE

On Monday, November 24th, the Cardinals hosted their 23rd annual "Feed the Hungry" event at the Phoenix Rescue Mission -- Changing Lives Center where players (TE **Elijah Higgins**, OL **Kelvin Beachum**, **Evan Brown** and **Isaiah Adams**, CB **Garrett Williams**, WR **Greg Dortch**, RB **Michael Carter**, DL **Dante Stills**, QB **Kedon Slovis**, WR **Andre Baccellia**, and TE **Josiah Deguara**) and Cardinals staff members helped serve Thanksgiving dinner to over 150 women and children.

Cardinals' offensive linemen **Kelvin Beachum** and **Paris Johnson Jr.** also hosted a Thanksgiving food distribution event benefiting United Food Bank on Tuesday, November 18. Beachum and Johnson alongside members of the **Cardinals 2025 rookie class** helped distribute holiday food items such as turkeys and produce to more than 250 Mesa Public School families to help them prepare a Thanksgiving meal.
