Recap

The Cardinals opened the 2021 regular season on the road against the defending AFC South champion Titans, a formidable foe whose offense featured the league's reigning Offensive Player of the Year in RB Derrick Henry and receiving weapons like future Hall of Famer Julio Jones and Pro Bowler A.J. Brown. Arizona responded by delivering its most complete and decisive victory in recent memory. The Cards led 17-0 early and 24-6 at intermission en route to a 38-13 win. There were many stars but the two brightest were LB Chandler Jones and QB Kyle Murray. The monster effort by Jones saw him tie the club's single-game record with 5.0 sacks, 2 of which forced fumbles that led to Cardinal touchdowns. Murray's scintillating play included a career-best 4 touchdown passes and another on the ground; WRs DeAndre Hopkins and Christian Kirk each delivered a pair of highlight-reel scoring grabs. The defensive effort against the league's #2 overall offense of 2020 was stellar, particular in containing Henry who was held to just 58 yards on 17 carries. He was limited to two yards or fewer on 10 of his 17 rush attempts and was stopped for zero or negative yards on six carries.

The game began in a manner that would set the tone for the afternoon. After AZ forced a 3-n-out by the Titans on the game-opening drive, Murray and Hopkins connected on a 38-yard pass on the game's first play. That was followed by a 21-yard A.J. Green catch and a 34-yard Matt Prater FG. Two plays later, Jones bulldozed QB Ryan Tannehill forcing a fumble that DL Corey Peters recovered and took into the end zone but replay ruled him down at the 1. Three plays later on 3rd-n-goal at the 6, Murray extended the play by retreating in the pocket before lofting it to the back of the end zone; there a leaping Hopkins snagged the ball from the air before expertly tapping both feet in bounds. The lead grew from 10 to 17 early in the 2nd when Murray and Hopkins teamed to end a 9-play, 70-yard drive with another TD; this time Hopkins caught a crossing pass, stuck his foot in the ground and wheeled around into the end zone. The Titans got on the scoreboard for the first time on the next drive. With a 1st-n-goal at the 1, they tried two unsuccessful Henry runs before Tannehill scrambled up the middle for a TD but the ensuing PAT try failed. With the lead trimmed to 17-6, the Cards took over at their own 25 with 6:50 left in the first half. Two plays later, they faced a 3rd-n-10 and the specter of turning it back to TEN. But the next play was classic Kyle; after scrambling some 40+ yards in the backfield to elude defenders, he found rookie WR Rondale Moore on an 18-yard completion to extend the drive. Two plays later on 3rd-n-6 he hit Kirk for 22 to the 19. The exclamation point came when the Cards lined up in a MegaWatt package signaling a power run from the 2 but Murray kept it around the right end and ran untouched into the end zone.

The second half began with the Cards up 24-6 but on its 3rd play, Murray was INT'd by S Kevin Byard who returned it to the AZ 32. Two plays later Tannehill hit A.J. Brown on a 13-yard TD pass and it was 24-13 just 2:05 into the 3rd quarter. But AZ failed to surrender momentum; on the next play Murray hit Moore on a short screen that the rookie took 29 yards to the TEN 46. On 3rd-n-3 from the 26, Murray drifted back in the pocket before lofting a pass that fell like a teardrop into the waiting hands of a racing Kirk; that over-the-shoulder TD catch made it 31-13. The next two TEN drives ended in AZ takeaways – an INT of a tipped Tannehill pass by LB Isaiah Simmons and Jones' 5th sack that caused a fumble LB Markus Golden recovered at the TEN 33. Four plays later, Kirk wrestled in a Murray pass just inside the pylon for a TD that provided the game's final score.

Recap

In their 2021 regular season home opener, the Cards improved to 2-0 with a thrilling, roller-coaster ride of a win over Minnesota. The game featured 67 total points, 893 combined net yards of offense and 8 lead changes. In the end, it was decided on a potential lead change that wasn't. With Arizona clinging to a 34-33, Vikings K Greg Joseph lined up for a 37-yard game-winning FG try with :02 left but pushed it wide right as time expired. QB Tyler Murray passed for 400 yards and 3 TDs and added another on the ground. Rookie WR Rondale Moore had 7 catches for 114 yards with a 77-yard TD while TE Maxx Williams had 7 catches for 94 yards, both career bests.

The offensive fireworks began on the game's 2nd offensive play when QB Kirk Cousins found open WR KJ Osborn for a 64-yard TD connection. Later in the first, the Cards tied it when DeAndre Hopkins' 13-yard TD from Murray capped a 9-play, 73-yard drive. The Vikings went back up on the ensuing series — a 9-play, 75-yarder — when Cousins hit WR Adam Thielen in the middle of the end zone with a 7-yard strike. Midway thru the 2nd, Cousins and WR Justin Jefferson hooked up on a 14-yard scoring pass that made it 20-7 after the PAT kick failed. Arizona then went 75 yards in 10 plays on a drive that was jump-started by a Williams catch off a double-ricochet; it ended on Murray's 12-yard TD run that made it 20-14 with 3:15 to go in the half. Another huge play on that drive was a 19-yard completion to Christian Kirk on 3rd-n-16 from the MIN 32. On the first play after the 2:00 warning, DL Corey Peters stuffed RB Dalvin Cook on 3rd-n-1 at the MIN 34 forcing a punt, after which the Cards took over at their own 23. On the very next snap, Murray scrambled to his left before spotting a wide open Moore near the sideline and hit him with a 77-yard TD pass that put AZ up 21-20 with 1:33 to play. With :21 left, Joseph's 52-yard FG put Minnesota back up. Then with :16 to go before halftime, AZ took over at its own 34. After a first Moore catch picked up 4 yards, another gained 18 to the MIN 44 with one tick on the clock. That set-up Matt Prater's 62-yard FG that set a franchise record and put AZ up 24-23 at intermission.

On the 2nd snap of the 3rd quarter, Vikings LB Nick Vigil stepped in front of a Murray pass and returned it 38 yards for a TD that put MIN up 30-24. Murray then went 4-for-4 on the ensuing 75-yard drive and ended it with a 9-yard TD pass to WR AJ Green to reclaim the lead for AZ at 31-30. Early in the 4th, Joseph gave MIN the lead back with his second 52-yard FG of the game. With 6:12 to play in the game and down 2, AZ faced a 4th-n-5 at the MIN 41 and went for it. In the face of a heavy rush, Murray hung in and lofted a pass down the middle that Kirk corralled for a 35-yard gain to the 6. That led to a 27-yard FG from Prater that made it 34-33 with 4:25 left. After the teams traded punts, MIN took over at its own 23 with 2:09 remaining. Cousins moved them to the 19 in 8 plays to set-up the 37-yard try by Joseph that drifted right on the game's final play.

Recap

The Cardinals improved to 3-0 for the first time since 2015 with a 31-19 victory at Jacksonville. The win not only required a gritty 2nd half comeback but also great resilience to shake off a disastrous sequence at the end of the first half. After the Jags led 19-10 late in the 3rd quarter, Arizona scored 21 unanswered thanks to the efficiency of QB Kyle Murray and the opportunism of a defense that forced 3 of its 4 takeaways in the game's final 15.5 minutes. CB Byron Murphy accounted for half of them with a pair of pivotal interceptions, the 2nd of which he returned for a TD late in the 3rd that gave AZ a lead it would never relinquish. Murray finished with 316 passing yards and completed a career-best 82.4% of his passes (28-34) to become the first player in franchise history to eclipse 80% in consecutive games. A pair of Cardinal wide receivers – AJ Green (5-112) and Christian Kirk (7-104) – eclipsed 100 receiving yards while RB James Conner scored on two TD runs that capped lengthy drives.

Midway thru the opening quarter, WR Rondale Moore's 27-yard punt return set AZ up at its own 44 and Murray's passing (4-4, 49 yards) moved the Cards to the 1; from there the QB kept it around the left end and ran it in for a TD that made it 7-0. Later in the first, Jacksonville advanced to the AZ 17, but QB Trevor Lawrence's pass attempt was deflected and intercepted by Murphy to end the threat. Late in the 2nd quarter, Lawrence moved the Jags 74 yards in 9 plays and capped the drive with a 12-yard TD pass to WR D.J. Chark in the back corner of the end zone. The TD tied the game at 7 with 0:21 left, but that was enough time for AZ to move to midfield with 2 seconds remaining. K Matt Prater – who previously set the NFL record with a 64-yard FG and the week before made a 62-yarder in a similar situation – was brought on for a 68-yard try. It came up short and WR Jamal Agnew caught it 9 yards deep in the end zone before weaving 109 yards for a TD that put the Jags up 13-7 after the PAT failed.

The opening drive of the 3rd quarter saw the Cards enter Jax territory, but Murray's pass down the deep middle was INT'd by SS Andrew Wingard. A 34-yard Prater FG midway through the quarter pulled AZ to within 3 at 13-10 but the Jags would not go quietly. They answered with an 8-play, 75-yard drive that consisted entirely of runs and RB James Robinson's 4-yard TD made it 19-10 after K Josh Lambo again missed the PAT. The next drive saw Murray completions to Kirk gain 18 and 33 yards and set-up Conner's 4-yard TD run that trimmed the Jags lead to 2 with 1:21 left in the third. Two plays later the Jags ran a flea-flicker on 2nd-n-6 from their own 25. DL J.J. Watt was not fooled and pressured Lawrence who threw off his back foot toward the sideline. Murphy broke on the ball, stepped in front of TE Jacob Hollister at the 29 and raced down the sideline into the end zone for his first NFL touchdown. The score put the Cards up 24-19 with :24 left in the third and they would never look back. After a Jags' 3-n-out, Murray again moved the Cardinals by completing all 5 of his pass attempts, the biggest of which was a 36-yard catch by Green on 3rd-n-9 that moved it to the 15. Three plays later they faced a 4th-n-1 at the 6 with 8:17 to go and leading by just 5. They boldly went for it and Murray's 2-yard run around the right end extended a drive that Conner capped two plays later with a 1-yard TD. The next two Jaguar drives ended with Lawrence sacks/lost fumbles, first when LB Chandler Jones fell on a loose ball and then when LB Jordan Hicks caused a fumble recovered by DL Zach Allen.

Recap

Meeting at SoFi Stadium with matching 3-0 records, the Cardinals hoped to reverse recent history against the Rams, who had won 8 straight in the series. They did just that thanks to a dominating overall effort. QB Kyler Murray was again sensational and completed 24-of-32 passes (75%) for 268 yards and 2 TDs (0 INTs) while the ground game was led by RBs Chase Edmonds (12-120) and James Conner (2 rushing TDs). The defense forced two turnovers that led to AZ touchdowns and kept in check a high-flying LA offense that had been averaging 31.6 points/game. It all added up to a 37-20 win that gave the Cardinals a 4-0 record for the first time since 2012 and 8th time in team history.

The Rams opened the game with a 42-yard FG on the opening drive which was followed by a 3-n-out from AZ. But on the second play of LA's ensuing drive, QB Matthew Stafford threw it deep down the middle where CB Byron Murphy Jr. picked it off at the AZ 13. The Cards moved to the LA 41 and faced a 3rd-n-6 from there when Murray launched a pass down the seam to WR A.J. Green who hauled it in for a 41-yard TD. The Rams responded and reclaimed the lead with a 9-play, 75-yard drive that Stafford ended on his 14-yard scoring pass to WR Van Jefferson. But Murray answered by completing all 7 of his pass attempts on the next drive, the last of which was a 14-yard TD pass in traffic to TE Maxx Williams. The next play from scrimmage saw LB Markus Golden force a RB Sony Michel fumble at the line of scrimmage that S Budda Baker recovered at the LA 25. Five plays later, Conner's 1-yard run made it 21-10 midway thru the second. With 3:22 left before halftime, K Matt Gay's 22-yard FG cut AZ's lead to 21-13 but the Cards were not finished. Murray led a 17-play, 70-yard drive that culminated in Prater's 23-yard FG in the final seconds of the half that made it 24-13.

Prater's 55-yarder capped the opening drive of the third quarter and made it 27-13. It remained that way when Gay missed from 46 yards out on the next drive. Late in the third, a 64-yard, 9-play drive ended with another 1-yard Conner run; the biggest play was a well-executed screen to Maxx Williams that picked up 25 yards to the 8. The next LA drive reached the AZ 1 but the Cards defense stuffed Stafford on a 3rd down sneak and LB Tanner Vallejo knocked down a 4th down pass in the flat to turn it over on downs. Backed up at their own goal-line but leading 34-13 with 12:05 to go, the Cardinals needed to run the ball. They did exactly that - 11 straight times, in fact. The biggest run came on 3rd-n-7 from the AZ 4 when Edmonds ripped off a 54-yard jaunt to the LA 42. The drive - which covered 94 yards and more importantly chewed 8:27 off the clock - ended with Prater's 23-yard FG that made it 37-13. A late Stafford-to-WR Robert Woods TD pass (14 yards) provided the final margin of victory.

Recap

The Cardinals remained the NFL's only undefeated team and improved to 5-0 for the first time since 1974 (5th time ever) with a 17-10 division win over the 49ers at State Farm Stadium. While the offense's gaudy numbers generated most of the attention in the season's first four games, Arizona's defense was clearly the difference in this one. That unit held San Fran scoreless for nearly three quarters and stopped the Niners four times on 4th down throughout the game, including a pivotal goal-line play on 4th-n-1 in the second quarter. As usual when these two teams meet, it was a physical affair and the 49ers were within 3 late before WR DeAndre Hopkins made a series of game-changing plays to secure the victory. He also made history when his first catch of the afternoon gave him the most receptions ever by an NFL player before the age of 30.

San Fran rookie QB Trey Lance made his first career start and on the game-opening drive he marched the 49ers into AZ territory before All-Pro safety Budda Baker's interception halted the threat. Cards QB Kyler Murray then led an 8-play, 66-yard drive completing 3-of-3 passes for 28 yards before rookie WR Rondale Moore's 26-yard run took it to the 1. RB James Conner punched it in from there to put AZ up 7-0. The next San Fran series saw the Niners reach the AZ 34 where they faced a 4th-n-2; they went for it but rookie LB Zaven Collins stopped a Lance run to turn it over on downs. The next 49ers possession was a long one as they moved 93 yards in 12 plays before facing a 4th-n-goal at the 1. On what would be the play of the game, Lance scrambled to his right and angled toward goal-line with a full head of steam; he was met first by LB Isaiah Simmons and then by LB Tanner Vallejo and the collision kept him short of the end zone. On the ensuing series, Moore made an amazing, toe-tapping catch along the Cardinals sideline for a 33-yard gain; that led to a 21-yard Matt Prater FG that gave AZ a 10-0 lead it took into halftime.

The third quarter was scoreless until the 1:42 mark when WR Deebo Samuel's 13-yard TD run put the 49ers on the board and pulled them to within 3 at 10-7. On their next possession, San Fran reached the AZ 48, again faced a 4th-n-1, again went for it, and again was turned away. With Lance in shotgun, FB Kyle Juszczyk went in motion and stepped behind the center; he took the snap and tried to sneak it for the first down but DL Zach Allen stuffed him for no gain. Two plays later, though, AZ turned it back on a fumble by RB Chase Edmonds near midfield. Trailing by just 3, the Niners took over at their own 46 with 8:39 to go. Once again, the Cardinals defense rose to the occasion on 4th down. This time it was 4th-n-4 at the AZ 48 when Lance's pass downfield was knocked down at the line by DL JJ Watt. Four plays later from the SF 39, Murray rolled to his left and lofted a cross-field pass that Hopkins lept to snag at the 9 for a 30-yard gain. On the next snap, Murray put it up for Hopkins just inside the goal line and despite tight coverage from CB Josh Norman, Hopkins somehow got both hands on it for a 9-yard TD that made it 17-7. The Niners quickly added a 47-yard Joey Slye FG to pull within 7 with 4:12 to go. The Cards needed a couple first downs to avoid giving the ball back to San Fran and they got them. The first was on an 11-yard catch near the sideline by Hopkins who smartly went down immediately to keep the clock moving. Conner then ripped off runs of 8 and 4 yards that enabled AZ to salt the game away. The victory did come at a cost as several players exited with injuries, most notably TE Maxx Williams who suffered a serious knee injury in the 2nd quarter.

Recap

In the days leading up to their Week 6 showdown vs. the Browns in Cleveland, the Cards were dealt a series of unprecedented and daunting challenges. The team was already without TE Maxx Williams and All-Pro center Rodney Hudson due to injuries suffered in the previous week's game. A series of positive COVID tests then forced several others to miss the game including Pro Bowl pass rusher Chandler Jones and defensive linemen Zach Allen and Corey Peters, not to mention head coach Kliff Kingsbury and QBs coach Cam Turner.

Despite that adversity, the rest of the staff and players banded together and delivered a dominant effort to take down the Browns. Despite missing its play-caller and starting center, the Arizona offense scored on all five of its 1st half possessions to take an early lead and never looked back. The Cards ultimately earned a 37-14 win that topped the team's record to 6-0 – the franchise's best since 1974. The offense was led by QB Kyler Murray, who matched a career-best with four TD passes, including 2 to WR DeAndre Hopkins. Against a Cleveland offense that had been averaging 28.4 points per game, the AZ defense pitched a 2nd half shut-out and sacked QB Baker Mayfield 5 times; LBs Markus Golden and Jordan Hicks each had a pair of sacks while DL J.J. Watt recorded his first as a Cardinal and it also caused a pivotal turnover.

Arizona opened the scoring on its first offensive series. A RB Chase Edmonds run not only converted a 3rd-n-6 but gained 40 yards to the CLE 30. On a subsequent 3rd-n-7, Christian Kirk hauled in a 15-yard reception to the 12 but after an errant snap, the Cards faced a 3rd-n-19 at the 21. Murray bought time in the pocket before firing a strike to Kirk at the left side of the end zone to make it 7-0. The Browns then marched into AZ territory and decided to go for it on 4th-n-3 at the AZ 13; Hicks shot through the middle and sacked Mayfield to turn it over on downs. The Cards then moved 78 yards in 11 plays on a drive aided by 2 pass interference calls against CB Denzel Ward covering Hopkins and a pair of personal fouls by DT Malik Jackson. They hit paydirt on 3rd-n-goal at the 13 when Murray found Hopkins near the 10 and the WR juked 3 defenders en route to the end zone. Two snaps later, Golden sacked Mayfield causing a fumble that DL Michael Dogbe recovered at the CLE 18 and K Matt Prater's subsequent 36-yard FG put AZ up 17-0. On the 3rd play of the ensuing drive, CB Robert Alford intercepted Mayfield and that takeaway also led to a Prater FG, this one a 51-yarder that made it 20-0. With 5:06 to go in the half, the Browns made it 20-7 when WR Donovan Peoples-Jones ended an 8-play, 75-yard drive with his 11-yard TD catch. A 33-yard Hopkins catch on the next possession was instrumental in setting up another Prater FG and that 33-yard kick made it 23-7 with 43 seconds left before intermission. That was enough time for Cleveland to deliver a gut punch; with :03 left and at his own 43, Mayfield heaved a Hail Mary pass and Peoples-Jones came down with it in the end zone to make it 23-14.

But any chance that the Browns had of carrying that momentum in the 2nd half was quickly extinguished by the AZ defense. Cleveland's first series was a 3-n-out that included sacks by both Golden and Hicks. The next one ended when Watt took down Mayfield and forced a fumble that LB Devon Kennard recovered at the AZ 46. After 2 incompletions, a WR AJ Green catch picked up 34 yards on 3rd-n-10 and Murray would end the drive when he found Hopkins all alone in the back of the end zone for a 9-yard TD. Trailing 30-14, the Browns advanced to the AZ 7 with 12:12 left and went for it on 4th-n-4 from there. It again failed, this time when Alford broke up a pass intended for WR Odell Beckham Jr. The Cardinals then moved 79 yards – 40 of which came via 6 RB James Conner runs – before a 14-yard Murray-to-Green TD provided the game's final score.

Recap

The Cardinals remained the NFL's only unbeaten team and improved to 7-0 for just the 2nd time in franchise history (1974) with a 31-5 home victory over the Houston Texans. The defense was exceptional, allowing a season-low 3.3 yards per play, no touchdowns and surrendering just 5 points. LB Markus Golden led that effort with 2.0 sacks and a forced fumble. After a one-week absence due to COVID, head coach Kliff Kingsbury was cleared to return the morning of the game. TE Zach Ertz – acquired via trade 9 days earlier – made his Cardinals debut and finished with 3 catches for 66 yards and a TD. Two of the best Texans ever – WR DeAndre Hopkins & DL JJ Watt – played against their old team for the first time. Hopkins had a game-high 7 catches for 53 yards and a TD while Watt was part of a defense that allowed Houston's offense no deeper than the AZ 35. QB Kyler Murray continued his torrid pace, completing 71.4% of his passes for 261 yards, 3 TDs and a passer rating of 121.3.

The visitors took an early 5-0 lead thanks to a safety and field goal in a 3-minute stretch late in the first quarter before Arizona scored 31 unanswered. With 3:06 to go in the first quarter, a Texans punt backed the Cards up to their own 2. On the first play thereafter, Murray kept it on a designed run. Officials missed an apparent facemask foul on LB Jacob Martin who kept Murray in the end zone for a safety. Houston then took over at its own 40 after the free kick and moved 25 yards before K Ka'imi Fairbairn's 53-yard FG on the first play of the second quarter made it 5-0. The next series saw the Cards offense reach the HOU 24 and on 4th-n-3 from there, Kingsbury chose to go for it. Murray moved the chains with a 14-yard completion to WR Christian Kirk and ultimately ended the drive with a 1-yard TD toss to Hopkins. The ensuing Texans possession reached the AZ 43 before Golden ended it with his sack, forced fumble and fumble recovery near midfield. The Cards soon faced a 3rd-n-23 from the HOU 45 when Murray launched a 41-yard strike down the right sideline to WR A.J. Green at the 4. Two plays later Murray hit Kirk with a 5-yard TD pass that made it 14-5 with 2:45 to go in the half. K Matt Prater's 31-yard FG in the closing seconds of the quarter made it 17-5 at intermission.

After the Texans opened the third quarter with a 3-n-out, Murray would lead another long TD drive. This time he completed 5-of-5 passes for 85 yards, the last of which was a 47-yard catch-and-run by Ertz. It was the TE's longest career touchdown and made him the first player in NFL history with TD receptions in consecutive weeks of a season for different teams. The next series saw Murray's streak of attempts without an INT end at 134 on a pick by S Lonnie Johnson but the defense responded with another 3-n-out. Early in the fourth, the Cards provided the game's final points when RB James Conner capped a 7-play, 63-yard drive with his 18-yard scoring run. That TD took it to 31-5 and made it the first game in NFL history decided by that score.

Recap

On a Thursday night at State Farm Stadium, the Cardinals suffered defeat for the first time after starting the season 7-0 and it came in heartbreaking fashion. With 4:46 to go and leading by 3, the Packers had a 1st-n-goal at the AZ 1-yard line before the AZ defense rose to the occasion and forced them to turn it over on downs. QB Kyle Murray and the Cards offense then moved 94 yards in 11 plays and were at the GB 5 with :15 left. However on 2nd-n-goal from there, a miscommunication between Murray and WR A.J. Green resulted in CB Rasul Douglas' end zone INT that sealed the 24-21 decision and moved the Packers to 7-1 on the season. Green Bay enjoyed a time of possession advantage of over 12 minutes and also benefitted from a 3-0 edge in turnovers, each of which was costly for the Cards.

The game's first big play came from Arizona's offense on its 2nd possession. On 3rd-n-9 from his own 38, Murray connected with WR DeAndre Hopkins on a deep ball down the left sideline that he took into the end zone. However, officials flagged Hopkins for a rare facemask infraction and it resulted in a completion to the GB 21 rather than a TD. That would have to wait until four plays later when RB Chase Edmonds — lined up in Wildcat — took a direct snap and ran for an 11-yard score that made it 7-0. Green Bay answered with a long drive both in terms of plays (14) and time (8:23) and RB Aaron Jones capped it with his game-tying 2-yard TD run early in the 2nd quarter. Later in that quarter, a mishandled punt by WR Rondale Moore gave Green Bay possession at the AZ 3. However the Cardinals defense surrendered zero yards on the next 3 plays and K Mason Crosby's 21-yard FG gave the Packers a 10-7 lead they took into halftime.

On the 3rd play of the 3rd quarter, Green Bay S Henry Black INT'd a Murray pass that deflected off Moore's hand and the Packers offense again benefitted from a short field, this time taking over at the AZ 14. QB Aaron Rodgers converted a 4th-n-3 from the 7 with a 5-yard completion and then put Green Bay up 17-7 with a 2-yard TD toss to WR Randall Cobb. The Cardinals needed to answer, and they did on the next drive as Murray completed 8-of-10 passes for 72 yards. Big plays included his 7-yarder to WR Antoine Wesley 4th-n-4 at the AZ 47 that kept the drive alive, an 11-yarder to Hopkins and a 12-yard catch by TE Zach Ertz that took it to the 2. One play later, RB James Conner punched it in to trim GB's lead to 17-14. The Packers came right back with a 12-play, 91-yard drive and Cobb's 6-yard TD reception on the first play of the 4th quarter made it a 10-point game again. The Cards again narrowed it to 3 thanks to an 11-play, 75-yard drive that Conner ended with his 2nd rushing TD of the game, this one from 9 yards out. Leading 24-21, the Packers took over at their own 25 with 10:45 to go. With 4:46 left, they had advanced to the AZ 3 when a pass interference penalty gave them a 1st-n-goal at the 1. On the next play, Jones was awarded a rushing TD but replay reversed it. Ultimately GB went for it on 4th-n-goal from the 1 and LB Devon Kennard knocked down Rodgers' attempt to give his offense the ball back. AZ took over at its own 1 with 3:23 to play and down 3. A 23-yard completion to Green converted a 3rd-n-10 and was followed by a 29-yard WR Christian Kirk catch to GB's 47. A 22-yard Chase Edmonds reception moved the Cards to the 18 and 3 plays later they were at the 5 before Douglas' takeaway ended it.

Recap

A depleted Cardinals team headed to San Francisco for a Week 9 divisional showdown vs. the 49ers. Arizona was missing its MVP-candidate QB Kyler Murray (ankle) and All-Pro WR DeAndre Hopkins (hamstring) as well as starting WR A.J. Green and three assistants due to COVID. Then on the 1st offensive play of the afternoon, the Cards lost starting RB Chase Edmonds with an ankle injury. Despite all that, they would post a decisive 31-17 road win thanks to an amazing team effort. With back-up QB Colt McCoy under center, the Cards would score on five straight possessions (TD, TD, FG, TD, TD) to build a 31-7 lead. McCoy completed a career-high 84.7% of his 26 passes – the 2nd-best single-game performance in team history – for 249 yards with a TD and no turnovers. RB James Conner gained 173 yards from scrimmage (96 rushing & 77 receiving) and his 3 TDs (2 rushing/1 receiving) gave him an NFL-best 11 for the season. LB Markus Golden notched a career-best 3.0 sacks while LB Chandler Jones became the franchise's all-time leader in career sacks thanks to his takedown of QB Jimmy Garoppolo. AZ enjoyed a 3-0 advantage in takeaways and 13:35 edge in time of possession while out-rushing San Fran 163 yards to 39. The win improved AZ to 8-1, matching the best record in franchise history thru 9 games.

The afternoon's opening series was halted when Golden's 3rd down sack of Garoppolo forced a San Fran punt. The next 49ers possession ended when CB Byron Murphy Jr. tracked down TE George Kittle after a catch and forced a fumble that LB Jordan Hicks recovered at the AZ 43. Nine plays later, Conner capped the 57-yard drive with a 13-yard run around the right side of the line. After a Niners 3-n-out, AZ took over at its own 20. The Cards soon forced a 3rd-n-18 at the 12 when Conner snared a McCoy pass at the line of scrimmage and picked up 21 yards. On the next set of downs, it was 3rd-n-9 and McCoy was sacked but a personal foul extended it. On the next snap, WR Christian Kirk got the ball on a reverse and fired a 33-yard strike that WR Antoine Wesley hauled in at the 1. Conner made it 14-0 with a TD run on the next play. San Fran responded by driving deep to AZ territory when WR Brandon Aiyuk picked up 18 to the 12 but at the end of the play, LB Isaiah Simmons forced a fumble and Hicks again pounced on it at the 7. McCoy then connected with Kirk on a 50-yard completion from the AZ 9 to the SF 41. That drive appeared to reach its conclusion when the Cardinals lost 2 yards on a 3rd-n-18 at the SF 19 but unsportsmanlike conduct fouls between downs by both teams resulted in an AZ first down. That ultimately led to K Matt Prater's 26-yard FG that made it 17-0 with 4:02 to play in the half. San Fran then went on a 9-play, 75-yard drive that ended with a Kittle TD catch (6 yards), making it 17-7 at halftime.

The 49ers hoped to carry momentum into the 2nd half as AZ's offense started with the ball. But a 25-yard McCoy completion to Wesley on the first play from scrimmage moved it to the SF 47 and a play later Conner again struck. This time he took a screen pass and raced through the open field for a career-long catch of 45 yards and a TD. After a quick 3-n-out, AZ took over at its own 29. On the first play Conner rushed 35 yards to the SF 36 and 4 McCoy completions and a sneak on 4th-n-1 helped move it to the 21. From there, RB Eno Benjamin scored his 1st NFL TD when he bowled over CB Dre Kirkpatrick near the line of scrimmage and continued on to the end zone. That score made it 31-7 midway thru the third. Aiyuk's TD catch on the next drive and a Robbie Gould FG midway thru the 4th closed it to 31-17 but the Niners would get no closer. With 3:03 to go, S Budda Baker intercepted Garoppolo to effectively secure the victory and a season sweep over the 49ers.

Recap

The 8-1 Cardinals hosted Carolina and the NFL's #2 defense missing two of their biggest offensive weapons. For the 2nd straight game, QB Kyler Murray (ankle) and WR DeAndre Hopkins (hamstring) were out with injuries. The Panthers were also without their #1 QB as Sam Darnold was placed on IR during the week with a shoulder injury. Back-up PJ Walker made the start for a Carolina offense that was also bolstered by the Thursday signing of former QB Cam Newton. Both of them played key roles for the Panthers offense as did RB Christian McCaffrey, who had 23 touches for 161 yards from scrimmage (95 rushing and 66 receiving). Carolina took advantage of early Arizona turnovers, led 23-0 at halftime, and ultimately improved to 5-5 with a 34-10 win.

On the game's third play, the Cards faced a 3rd-n-5 at their own 32 when former Cardinal Haason Reddick got to QB Colt McCoy and forced a fumble that DE Morgan Fox recovered at the AZ 15. Five plays later on 2nd-n-goal from the 2, Newton entered the game for the first time and ran it off the right side for a TD. On the ensuing drive, the Cardinals faced a 4th-and-1 at their own 42 and went for it. For just the 2nd time all season, AZ did not convert on 4th down as McCoy's sneak was stopped short. The Panthers took over at the AZ 41 and 4 plays later again faced a goal to go from the 2. Again, Newton entered and this time tossed a short TD pass to WR Robby Anderson that put Carolina up 14-0. The AZ offense marched to the Carolina 31 on the next drive but CB Donte Jackson made a diving INT that set the Panthers up at their own 34. That led to a 44-yard Zane Gonzalez FG that put Carolina up 17-0 with a minute to go in the first quarter. He added another from 48 yards away early in the 2nd quarter to extend the lead to 20-0. The Cardinals could not capitalize on a 2nd quarter INT from S Jalen Thompson and Gonzalez's 3rd FG of the half – this one from 49 yards as the 2nd quarter expired – made it 23-0 at intermission.

AZ's defense forced a 3-n-out to start the 2nd half and the offense then crossed midfield for the first time on the next drive thanks to consecutive completions of 19 and 21 yards to TE Zach Ertz and RB James Conner, respectively. Matt Prater's 47-yard FG made it 23-3 but the Panthers answered quickly. A 33-yard pass interference penalty moved it to the 20 and RB Chuba Hubbard ran it in from 5 yards out to make it 31-3. McCoy was injured on the next drive (chest) and #3 QB Chris Streveler guided AZ the rest of the way. With 9:19 to play, Cards RB James Conner scored on an 11-yard run to cap an 11-play, 71-yard drive. That made it 31-10 and was Conner's 11th rushing TD of the year. Arizona would not threaten further and a 27-yard Gonzalez FG with 3:36 left provided the game's final points.

Recap

Heading to Seattle for a Week 11 showdown against the Seahawks, the Cardinals were without key offensive weapons Kyler Murray and DeAndre Hopkins for the third straight week. But behind another superb performance from #2 QB Colt McCoy and a stellar defensive performance that held Seattle to 13 total points, Arizona emerged with a 10-point victory. With it, the Cards re-claimed the NFL's best record at 9-2 and improved to 6-0 on the road in 2021. They enjoyed decisive advantages in total yards (413-266), net passing yards (318-180) and time of possession (40:22 to 19:38). McCoy completed 35-of-44 passes for 328 yards with 2 TDs. Both scoring tosses were to TE Zach Ertz who had 8 catches for 88 yards while RB James Conner scored a rushing TD for the 5th straight game with his 12th of the year. LB Chandler Jones recorded 2 of the defense's 4 sacks of Russell Wilson to give him 12.5 in just 6 career games at Lumen Field.

On the game-opening series, consecutive sacks by Jones and LB Isaiah Simmons forced a Seahawks punt after which the AZ offense began at the SEA 18. From there, the Cards moved 82 yards in 16 plays and chewed 9:27 off the 1st quarter clock. McCoy converted 3 first downs and was 7-for-8 passing for 53 yards, capping the drive with a 1-yard shovel pass to Ertz. Midway thru the 2nd, the Seahawks advanced inside the AZ 10 but had to settle for a 27-yard Jason Myers FG that made it 7-3. McCoy and the Cards then launched another lengthy TD drive, this time going 92 yards in 13 plays and again ended it on an Ertz TD. This one was a 2-yard toss from McCoy who was 6-for-7 on the series for 68 yards. Down 13-3 (after the missed PAT), Seattle again advanced into AZ territory thanks largely to a 36-yard Wilson completion to WR Tyler Lockett. The drive would reach the 9 but no further and Myers' 27-yard FG made it 13-6 with 2:40 to go in the half. McCoy moved AZ 54 yards in 9 plays to the SEA 21 but Matt Prater's 39-yard try as the half expired was wide to the left.

Prater soon had another chance on the opening drive of the 3rd quarter and put AZ up 16-6 with his 53-yard FG. The Cards quickly got the ball back after a 3-n-out before Seattle appeared to make a momentum-grabbing play. CB Sidney Jones picked off a 3rd down pass and returned it to the AZ 11 but a replay review ruled the would-be INT hit the ground. After the clubs exchanged punts on the next four series, McCoy marched the Cards into the red zone but they came away empty when Prater's try from 36 was wide left and the AZ lead remained at 10. On the next snap, Wilson and Lockett connected on a 48-yard completion to the AZ 26. Three plays later, RB DeeJay Dallas punched it in from 2 yards out and the Seahawks were within a field goal at 16-13 with 7:05 to go. To the chagrin of the Seahawks and the hostile Lumen Field crowd, McCoy again moved the Cards. Facing a 3rd-n-9 at the SEA 39, he scrambled out of trouble to find Ertz for a 20-yard pick-up to the 19. On the next snap, McCoy gained 11 on a designed QB run up the middle and then appeared to hit WR Christian Kirk in the right side of the end zone for a 4-yard TD. However, replay again intervened to reverse the on-field ruling and the Cards faced a 3rd-n-goal at the 4 with 2:27 to go. S Jamal Adams then interfered with Ertz to give AZ a fresh set of downs. On the next play, Conner sealed the game with his 1-yard TD that made it 23-13 with 2:20 left.

Recap

The Cardinals returned from the bye week to face the Bears on a cold, rainy and windy Sunday afternoon at Soldier Field. Already in possession of the NFL's best record at 9-2, Arizona was bolstered by the return of two offensive stars – QB Kyler Murray and WR DeAndre Hopkins – each of whom missed the previous three games with injuries. While both clearly made their presence felt, the Cardinals defense significantly aided the effort with four INTs off QB Andy Dalton that each led to scores (3 TDs and 1 FG for 23 points). Arizona committed zero turnovers itself and Murray accounted for four total TDs (two passing and two rushing) in leading the Cards to a 33-22 win, their 10th victory of the year. It also improved their road record to 7-0 in 2021 and each was by 10+ points; the Cards joined the 1968 Cowboys as the only teams in NFL history to accomplish that.

On the game's third play from scrimmage, Arizona created its first takeaway when Dalton's 3rd-n-6 pass deflected off WR Jakeem Grant into the hands of Cards S Jalen Thompson, who returned the INT 6 yards to the CHI 28. The Cardinals soon faced a 4th-n-2 at the 20 and decided to go for it. And Murray went for all of it, lofting a pass down the right sideline that Hopkins gathered at the front pylon and somehow managed to tap both feet in bounds. Down 7-0, the Bears moved to the AZ 20 in 9 plays but on 3rd-n-6 from there, TE Cole Kmet could not get a handle on Dalton's pass and the ball bounced in the air. S Budda Baker snatched it and returned the pick 77 yards to the CHI 15. On 3rd-n-goal from the 9, Murray scrambled around the right side for a TD that put AZ up 14-0 with 1:39 to go in the opening quarter. The Bears next drive saw them convert a 4th-n-8 from the AZ 27 with an 11-yard completion to Grant and RB David Montgomery eventually punched it in from a yard out to make it 14-7. The Cards then moved 74 yards in 7 plays on a drive that was dominated by RB James Conner. After rushing 3 times for 31 yards, on 3rd-n-2 from the CHI 23 he stabbed a Murray pass with his left hand near the line of scrimmage, transferred it to his right and raced down the sideline for a TD that gave AZ a 21-7 lead it would take into halftime.

The lead increase to 24-7 on the opening drive of the 3rd quarter thanks to a 33-yard Matt Prater FG that capped a 9-play, 51-yard drive. Chicago trimmed it to 24-14 on its next drive when Montgomery scored again, this time from 2 yards out after a lengthy drive that covered 73 yards in 13 plays and consumed 7:02. P Andy Lee's 58-yard punt pinned the Bears at their own 2 to start the next drive. AZ forced a punt thanks to LB Jordan Hicks' 2nd sack of the day but a roughing the punter call gave the Bears a fresh set of downs. On the next play though, LB Chandler Jones pressured Dalton and deflected a pass that CB Byron Murphy Jr. picked off and returned to the Chicago 12. Murray ran for 9 yards on 1st down and then raced around the right end for 3 yards to claim his 2nd rushing TD of the afternoon. With 2:45 to go, an 8-yard Dalton-to-Grant TD pass and successful two-point conversion provided the game's final points.

Murray reached a host of milestones on the day, including becoming the 4th youngest QB in NFL history to eclipse 10,000 career passing yards. His 2 rushing TDs gave him 20 in his career and made him the fastest player in NFL history (41 games) to have 20+ rushing and 60+ passing TDs.

Recap

In a week 14 Monday night match-up at State Farm Stadium, the 10-2 Cardinals had a chance to clinch a playoff berth when they hosted the 8-4 Rams. But it was the undermanned visitors who left town with a 30-23 win after capitalizing on two Arizona turnovers as well as a pair of key 4th down stops. The Cards fought til the end, recovering an on-side kick to gain one final possession but the comeback came up short. Arizona RB James Conner was exceptional gaining 125 total yards (31 rushing, 94 receiving) and rushing for 2 TDs to give him 14 for the year. WR A.J. Green caught 7 passes for 102 yards and QB Kyler Murray led AZ with 61 rushing yards.

Arizona got the ball first and took a 3-0 lead when K Matt Prater's 53-yard FG capped a 10-play, 40-yard drive. After an LA 3-n-out, the Cards again marched deep into Rams territory. But on 2nd-n-goal from the 4, DT Aaron Donald tipped Murray's pass at the line and LB Ernest Jones intercepted it at the 1. His 31-yard return set the Rams up at their own 32. From there they moved 68 yards in 10 plays and QB Matthew Stafford ended the drive with a 2-yard TD pass to WR Odell Beckham Jr. on 3rd and goal that gave LA a 7-3 lead. It increased to 10-3 on the next Rams possession thanks to a 55-yard Matt Gay FG. The ensuing series saw the Cards again move deep downfield and they ultimately went for it on 4th-n-goal at the 1. RB James Conner punched it in to tie the game at 10 with 3:18 to go in the half. The biggest play of the next drive was a 40-yard Stafford-to-Beckham completion to the AZ 24. It set up Gay's 35-yard FG that made it 13-10 with 0:35 left until halftime. Murray then got the Cards in position for their own FG thanks to 3 runs for 36 yards and Prater tied it as the half expired on his second 53-yard FG of the game.

The opening minutes of the 3rd quarter would prove to be a key critical juncture in the game. On the 3rd play from scrimmage, Stafford connected deep down the field with WR Van Jefferson for a 52-yard TD that made it 20-13. Then two plays later, Murray attempted to loft a pass to TE Zach Ertz but LB Leonard Floyd leapt, batted it in the air and INT'd it to set the Rams up at the AZ 19. They cashed in on the takeaway when Stafford found WR Cooper Kupp for a 4-yard TD that made it 27-13. The ensuing drive saw AZ advance to the LA 14; on 4th-n-2 from there they went for it but came up empty when WR DeAndre Hopkins could not come down with a Murray pass. A DL Zach Allen 3rd down sack of Stafford ended the next LA drive and when the Cards got the ball back they made it count. Murray marched them 73 yards in 6 plays and Conner's 2nd rushing TD of the night – an 8-yard run on a direct snap – made it 27-20 with 13:38 left. Stafford completions of 18 yards to Beckham and 44 yards to Kupp set up a 33-yard FG that put LA back up 10 with 7:20 remaining. Two minutes later, AZ was at the LA 37 and faced a 4th-n-1 but Conner was stopped for no gain and the Cards turned it back to the Rams with 5:17 left. With 2:44 to play, the Cards would get it back at their own 13 following an LA punt. Prater's 49-yard FG with :37 to go left AZ down 7 and in need of an onside kick recovery. They got it when LB Zaven Collins came away with the ball to set the Cards up at their own 48 with :34 on the clock. But penalties and a sack ultimately extinguished the comeback hopes and the Cards ended the game 7 points short.

Recap

Playing on a short week following a Monday night game vs. the Rams, the Cardinals went to Detroit in Week 15 with a perfect 7-0 road record on the season and a chance to clinch a playoff berth. They returned to AZ with a 30-12 loss after falling behind the Lions early and not being able to find a rhythm. Detroit – which was led by RB Craig Reynolds' 112 rushing yards and QB Jared Goff's 3 passing TDs – led 17-0 at halftime and kept the Cardinals out of the end zone until the 4th quarter.

The Lions started their afternoon by taking the opening kickoff and embarking upon a 15-play, 63-yard drive that consumed 8:50 of the first quarter; it ended on a 37-yard Riley Patterson FG. Detroit's on-side attempt on the kickoff that followed was recovered by LB Joe Walker and the Cards offense took over in Lions territory. While they could not capitalize on the field position, the ensuing punt pinned the Lions at their own 7. But Detroit responded by marching to the AZ 37 by the end of the first quarter and struck big on the first play of the second. Goff eluded an AZ blitz before finding WR Amon-Ra St. Brown deep down the left side for a 37-yard TD that made it 10-0. Midway thru the 2nd the Cards reached the DET 44 but a 3rd down sack ended that drive. Just before halftime, they had their deepest penetration of the game to that point and reached the DET 6 but incomplete passes on 3rd and 4th downs turned it over at the 2:00 warning. The Lions then moved to the AZ 22 in 8 plays, aided by two roughing the passer penalties. With 0:19 left, Goff found WR Josh Reynolds down the middle and the TD connection that put the Lions up 17-0 at halftime.

The Cards got on the board on the opening series of the 2nd half when a heavy dose of runs from RBs Chase Edmonds (3 for 30) and James Conner (3 for 24) helped set up K Matt Prater's 29-yard FG. On the next series, DT Leki Fotu forced a fumble by RB Godwin Igwebuike and CB Byron Murphy Jr. recovered at the AZ 44. However, 2 plays later CB Amani Oruwariye made a diving INT along the sideline and returned it 50 yards to the AZ 6. On the next snap, Goff hit FB Jason Cabinda for a 6-yard TD pass that made it 24-3. The following AZ drive covered 72 yards in 11 plays and Prater's 29-yard FG made it 24-6 with just under 4 minutes to go in the third. But Detroit answered early in the 4th with Patterson's 47-yard FG that increased the lead to 27-6. With 4:40 remaining, Murray ended a 12-play, 87-yard drive with his 26-yard TD completion to WR Christian Kirk. Now down 27-12 after an incompletion on the 2-point try, AZ attempted an onside kick but was unsuccessful. After the Lions recovery, Patterson's 45-yard FG provided the day's final points in the 30-12 contest.

Recap

On a Christmas Saturday night at State Farm Stadium, the Cardinals hosted one of NFL's hottest teams in a nationally-televised tilt. The Indianapolis Colts had won 4 of their last 5 and 7 of their last 9 while the Cards had dropped two straight. In the end, it was the visitors who made more big plays and fewer mistakes to claim the 22-16 win. While the loss kept them from clinching a playoff berth, the Cardinals gained postseason entry the next day thanks to a Vikings loss to the Rams.

The Cards received the night's opening kickoff and QB Kyler Murray completed 5 straight passes to help them move from their own 20 to the Indy 33. However, they came away empty when K Matt Prater's 51-yard try from there was just wide. On the next play, RB Jonathan Taylor ran 43 yards to the AZ 16. Five plays later on 3rd-n-goal from the 1, QB Carson Wentz found WR T.Y. Hilton in the back of the end zone to give the Colts a 7-0 lead. Arizona started the ensuing drive at its own 10 but they would go 90 yards in 7 plays, the biggest of which came on a spectacular Murray run. It covered 57 yards to the IND 2 and set up RB Chase Edmonds' 2-yard TD that made it 7-6 after the PAT was missed. Early in the 2nd quarter, Indy came up short in attempting to increase its lead when K Michael Badgley's 53-yard FG try descended shy of the cross bar. The Cards then advanced to the IND 34 and went for it on 4th-n-6 from there. Murray appeared to connect with TE Zach Ertz on a 17-yard completion to the 17 but the call was reversed after a Colts challenge. LB Chandler Jones seemed to end Indy's next drive with a strip sack and recovery but the play was wiped out by an illegal contact penalty. That possession ultimately ended in a punt, after which AZ took over at its own 8. On 3rd-n-7 from the 11, Murray had to track down an errant snap in the end zone and was flagged for intentional grounding. The resulting safety made it 9-6 with 4:20 to go in the half and Indy got the ball back after the free kick. Three straight WR Michael Pittman catches covered 12, 14 and 7 yards and helped Indy move into position for a 41-yard Badgley FG that made it 12-6 at intermission.

A sack by Cards S Budda Baker ended the Colts first drive of the 2nd half leading to a punt on which AZ executed some skillful deception. While returner Christian Kirk drifted to the left side of the field and drew the coverage that way, the punt actually went to the other side where CB Byron Murphy fielded it and raced 48 yards to the Indy 41. After Edmonds picked up 11 yards on a screen pass and a Murray run gained 7, WR Antoine Wesley hauled in a Murray pass down the left sideline for his first career TD, a 24-yarder that put AZ up 13-12. On the next series, Indy had a 3rd-n-5 at the AZ 35 but Baker tackled Taylor for a 1-yard loss and the Colts went for it on 4th-n-4. The Wentz pass fell incomplete and the Cards offense took over at its own 36. Indy got the ball back after a 3-n-out and soon faced a 3rd-n-4 at its own 31; this time Wentz connected with TE Mo Alie-Cox for a 37-yard catch-n-run to the AZ 32. That led to a 37-yard Badgley FG that put Indy back up 15-13 with :03 left in the 3rd. Arizona then drove to the Indy 23 and had a chance to reclaim the lead but Prater's 41-yard FG try hit the right upright. Completions of 20 yards to Pittman and 31 to Hilton moved Indy deep into AZ territory where they ultimately faced a 3rd-n-9 at the 14. On that play, Wentz found WR Dezmon Patmon in the back of the end zone to give Indy a 22-13 lead with 6:37 to play. Arizona made a 28-yarder with :28 left to trim the deficit to 6 but were not able to recover the ensuing onside kick and the Colts won by that margin.

Recap

The Cardinals went to Dallas in the penultimate game of the regular season to face one of the NFL's hottest teams. The 11-4 Cowboys had won 4 straight and were coming off a 56-14 division-clinching win over Washington. They featured the NFL's #1 offense in terms of yards and points per game and a defense that led the league in takeaways. On top of that, the Cardinals were without 6 starters – 3 on each side of the ball – while looking to snap a 3-game losing streak. Behind an inspired performance in all 3 phases – as well as some strategic sleight of hand – the Cards emerged with a 25-22 victory that gave them a franchise record 8th road win and improved their overall record to 11-5. Led by QB Kyle Murray – who upped his lifetime mark as a starter at AT&T Stadium to 8-0 – the Cardinals offense scored on 5 of its first 6 drives and played turnover-free football. The AZ defense surrendered points on just 1 of Dallas' first 6 possessions and held the Cowboys to 45 rushing yards, including 16 for All-Pro RB Ezekiel Elliott.

After forcing a Dallas punt to begin the game, Arizona opened the scoring on its first series when a 42-yard WR A.J. Green catch down the left sideline helped set-up a 24-yard K Matt Prater FG. Dallas had a chance to even things up on the ensuing drive but K Greg Zuerlein's 43-yard FG try missed to the left. Early in the 2nd, the Cards faced a 4th-n-2 at their own 36 and lined up to punt. But S Chris Banjo took the direct snap and lofted a pass down the middle to 3rd-string RB Jonathan Ward who executed the NFL's catch of the season. Leaving his feet and reaching around the Dallas defender who interfered with him, Ward pinned the ball with one hand against the DB's helmet and somehow controlled it for a 23-yard gain to the DAL 41. The long drive would ultimately reach the 1-yard line where AZ went for it on 4th down. Murray faked a handoff and ran to his left before flipping it to WR Antoine Wesley for a TD. With 1:25 to go in the half, Dallas trimmed the deficit to 10-7 when QB Dak Prescott's 21-yard TD pass to WR Michael Gallup capped an 11-play, 77-yard drive. After the kickoff, AZ took over at its own 25 with 3 timeouts and 85 seconds until halftime. Murray moved the Cards 40 yards into position for a 53-yard Prater FG that made it 13-7 at intermission.

Murray opened the 2nd half by going 7-for-7 passing for 77 yards, the biggest throw of which was a 43-yard WR Christian Kirk connection to the DAL 23. On 3rd-n-6 from the 19, Murray again went the way of Wesley who made a leaping catch inside the left pylon for his 2nd TD of the day. After a Dallas 3-n-out, the Cards again moved inside the Cowboys 10 and faced a 4th-n-5 at the 8. While Prater came out, most of the regular offense – including Murray – stayed on the field and lined up to run a play. The subterfuge forced Dallas to use its 1st time out of the 2nd half – something that would prove critical later in the game – and after it Prater hit the 26-yarder to make it 22-7 with 4:01 to go in the 3rd. Later in the quarter, the Cowboys would take over at the AZ 31 after a Cardinals punt and Prescott capitalized on the fortuitous field position by getting Dallas into the end zone with his 2-yard toss to WR Cedrick Wilson. With 10:30 to go, the Cowboys again had the ball and down by 8 when a scrambling Prescott was tracked down by LB Isaiah Simmons who forced a fumble that LB Dennis Gardeck recovered at the DAL44. Prater's 4th FG of the game – this one from 38 yards – put AZ up 11 with 8:32 to go. Dallas answered by moving 75 yards in 8 plays and Prescott's 2-yard TD to WR Amari Cooper and subsequent 2-point conversion made it a 3-point game with 4:42 to play. Arizona needed its offense to deliver a sustained drive and it did just that. After Murray gained 15 yards on a designed run, he threw for 11 to TE Zach Ertz and RB Chase Edmonds ran for 11 in between which Dallas used its final 2 timeouts to stop the clock. On 1st-n-10 at the DAL 35 with 2:51 to go, Edmonds picked up 6 before going down in bounds and may have fumbled before doing so. However, the on-field official ruled him down and the timeout-less Cowboys had no ability to challenge. The next play saw Murray run for 9 yards to the other side of the 2-minute warning and the Cards could kneel down after that.

Recap

Playing a Week 18 regular season game for the first time, Arizona hosted Seattle with a chance to claim the NFC West crown with a win and Rams loss to the 49ers. While the latter occurred, the Cards could not take care of the former as QB Russell Wilson threw three TD passes and RB Rashaad Penny ran for one to give the visitors a 38-30 win. RB James Conner returned to the lineup and scored a pair of TDs – a 20-yard catch as well as his 15th rushing TD of the year. It was a back-and-forth affair with multiple lead changes but Seattle outscored the Cards 21-6 over the final 17 minutes to earn the victory.

The first score of the game came 12 seconds into it on the second play from scrimmage. LB Chandler Jones sacked Wilson from behind forcing a fumble that DT Zach Allen scooped up and returned 16 yards for his first TD since high school. The Seahawks answered almost as quickly when Wilson and WR Tyler Lockett connected on a 43-yard TD completion less than two-and-a-half minutes later to tie the game. Midway through the opening quarter the Cards offense took over at its own 11 and embarked upon the longest drive of the season in terms of plays (19) and time (10:41). It ended with K Matt Prater's 41-yard FG that made it 10-7 with 11:44 to go in the second quarter. The Seahawks responded with their own long drive – this one 10 plays and 75 yards – and Wilson ended it with another TD pass to Lockett (5 yards). With 1:21 to play in the half, Seattle increased its lead to 17-10 via a 38-yard K Jason Myers FG.

The Cards got the ball first after intermission and made it count. QB Kyle Murray completed all 5 of his pass attempts including a 35-yarder to WR Christian Kirk, a 14-yarder to TE Zach Ertz and finally with a short pass to Conner that he took 20 yards for a game-tying TD. Soon thereafter the Seahawks faced a 3rd-n-7 from their own 28 when S Jalen Thompson INT'd a Wilson pass and returned it 33 yards to the 1. That led to a 1-yard Conner run that put AZ back on top by 7 with 9:25 to go in the third. After trading punts, the Seahawks tied the game again later in the quarter with a 5-play, 72-yard TD drive. A 29-yard Penny run took it to the AZ 25 and on the next play Wilson hit WR Freddie Swain down the left sideline for a TD. On the final play of the quarter, the Cards were lined up to punt it back to Seattle from deep in their own territory but P Andy Lee lost the handle on it and the Seahawks took over at the AZ 10. On 3rd-n-goal from the 4, Wilson ran it in on a scramble to put Seattle back up 31-24 with 13:15 remaining. The ensuing AZ drive reached deep into Seattle territory but the Cards had to settle for a 30-yard Prater FG that narrowed it to 31-27 with 6:14 to go. But on the 3rd play of the Seattle drive that followed, Penny raced 62 yards for a TD that increased the lead to 11 with 4:34 remaining. After a Prater FG with 1:13 left trimmed it to 38-30, the Cards needed an on-side kick recovery to stay alive. They didn't get it and Seattle secured the victory after a series of kneel downs.

Recap

Back in the postseason for the first time since 2015, the 11-6 Cardinals earned a Wild Card berth and traveled to Los Angeles to take on the division champion Rams (12-5). The teams split the regular season series with the road team winning each and were now facing off in the NFL's first-ever Monday night Wild Card contest. Arizona entered the game bolstered by its historic road success in 2021 (8-1 during the regular season) as well as by team captain DL J.J. Watt, whose inspiring comeback saw him return to action following a devastating shoulder injury that kept him out of the final 10 regular season games.

Unlike the regular season, however, this Rams-Cards match-up was dominated by the home team. LA's defense forced 3-n-outs on the first 4 Arizona possessions and in that time its offense found the end zone twice. A defensive score made it 21-0 midway through the 2nd and the Rams ultimately advanced on the strength of a 34-11 victory.

On its second drive of the night, LA produced the game's first points after a 10-play, 52-yard drive that ended on a 4-yard TD pass from Matthew Stafford to WR Odell Beckham Jr. The Rams stretched their lead to 14-0 on their next possession and it was another Stafford-to-Beckham connection that set up the TD. Facing a 3rd-n-2 at the AZ 33, Stafford hit Beckham for a 31-yard gain down the left sideline to the AZ 2. Two snaps later Stafford scored on a QB sneak. On the next Rams possession, Arizona's defense forced a punt that was downed at the AZ 1. A play later, it appeared the Cards had their first big gain of the evening when QB Kyler Murray threw a 22-yard strike to WR A.J. Green down the right sideline. However, following a lengthy review the play was ruled an incompletion, a reversal that proved costly. On the very next play Murray was under heavy pressure in his own EZ and flipped an underhand pass that CB David Long grabbed at the AZ 3 and took to the end zone to give the Rams a 21-0 lead that they took into intermission.

On the opening possession of the 3rd quarter, the Rams drove 75 yards on 8 plays, converting a pair of 3rd down attempts before Stafford connected with WR Cooper Kupp on a 7-yard TD to give LA a 28-0 lead. AZ's best drive of the evening came on the next possession, as Murray went 5-for-5 passing while directing a 12-play, 75-yard drive. After converting on 4th-n-4 from the AZ 44 with a 7-yard run, Murray hit WR Christian Kirk for a 23-yard gain to LA 14. Following a Rams penalty, RB James Conner ran it in from 2 yards out and Murray connected with WR Antoine Wesley on the 2-point try to make it 28-8 late in the 3rd quarter. But that was a close as the Cardinals would get. The Rams answered by going 50 yards in 7 plays, setting up a 37-yard FG by Matt Gay. Down 31-8, AZ looked poised for another TD when Murray connected with Kirk for a 16-yard play to the LAR 11 on 4th-n-10 but a holding penalty wiped out the gain. K Matt Prater then kicked a 55-yard FG – the longest in franchise postseason history – to make it 31-11 with just over 10 minutes remaining. LA was able to put the game away on its next possession, eating 5:52 off the clock with a 9-play drive that provided the game's final points on Gay's 46-yard FG.
