



ARIZONA CARDINALS NOTE CARDS

4 Strip-sacks for LB **Josh Sweat** in 2025. That total leads the NFL this season and also represents a new career high. He had 5 total strip-sacks in 104 games played in Philadelphia. Sweat's career high for strip-sacks in a single season during his 7 years with the Eagles was 2 in 2020.

50 Receptions for WR **Michael Wilson** in 2025, which is a new career high. He surpassed his previous high of 47 (in 16 games played in 2024). Wilson has also established a career high with 570 receiving yards in 2025, surpassing his previous mark of 565 (2023).

0 Drops for TE **Trey McBride** this season according to PFF. He is one of just 3 TEs (Sam LaPorta and Colston Loveland) to be targeted 40+ times this season and not have a drop.

57 Games played by the Cardinals rookie class this season. They have totaled 114 tackles, 9 TFLs, 2 INTs, 17 PDs, 4 QB hits, 2 FFs, 2 FRs including a fumble recovery TD (DL **Walter Nolen III**), 2.0 sacks, 19 special teams tackles and a blocked PAT.

MILESTONE WATCH

MILESTONES WITHIN REACH...

LB JOSH SWEAT

- With 1.0 sack, Sweat would have 12.0 sacks in 2025. That would establish a new career high for the 8th-year pro (11.0 in 2022 w/ Eagles). It would also give him at least 1.0 sack in 9 of 13 games this season
- With 2.0 sacks, Sweat would have 2.0+ sacks in back-to-back games for the first time in his career. Sweat (4) would also join Simeon Rice (6 in 1999; 4 in 1998), Chander Jones (4 in 2017 & 2019) and Curtis Greer (4 in 1983) as the only players in franchise history to have at least four games with 2.0+ sacks in a single season. He would also tie Curtis Greer (13.0 in 1983) for the most sacks by a Cardinals player in their first 13 games with the franchise.

TE TREY McBRIDE

- With 5 receptions, McBride would have 5+ catches for the 15th consecutive game. That would tie Travis Kelce (15 in 2018) for the longest such streak by a TE in NFL history.
- With 1 TD reception, McBride would have 9 TD catches in 2025. That would tie Hall of Famer Jackie Smith (9 in 1967) for the most TDs by a TE in a single season in franchise history.
- With 2 TD receptions, McBride would become the first Cardinals player with 10+ TD catches in a season since WR Larry Fitzgerald (10) in 2013.
- With 100+ receiving yards, McBride would have 100+ yards in each of his last three games vs. division opponents (127 @ Sea in Week 10; 115 vs. SF in Week 11). It would also give McBride 100+ yards in each of his last two outings vs. the Rams (123 at LAR in Week 17 last season).

QB JACOBY BRISSETT

- With 300+ passing yards, Brissett (4) would join Kurt Warner (5 straight in 2008) as the only players in franchise history with at least four consecutive games with 300+ passing yards.
- With 156 passing yards, Brissett (2,344) would pass Kurt Warner (2,343 in 2005) for the most passing yards by a Cardinals QB in his first eight starts with the team.
- With 2 TD passes, Brissett would have multiple TD passes in seven of eight starts in 2025, a new single-season career high (6 such games in 2019 with IND).

DL CALAIS CAMPBELL

- With 1.0 sack, Campbell would have 6.5 sacks in 2025. It would mark the second time in his last six years (6.5 in 2023 w/ Atlanta) Campbell had at least 6.5 sacks in a season.
- With 2.0 sacks on Sunday, Campbell would reach 14.0 sacks in his career against the Rams - surpassing his previous high total of 13.5 sacks against the Seahawks for the most sacks against one team in his career.

RB ZONOVAN KNIGHT

- With a TD (of any kind), Knight would extend his career high to 6 TDs in 2025. It would also give him at least one TD in four consecutive games.

McBRIDE HONORED BY HALL OF FAME



After catching 8 passes last week at Tampa Bay, TE **Trey McBride** now has 309 receptions for his career. He passed Jimmy Graham (301) for the most catches by a TE in their first four seasons in NFL history. After making history, McBride is being honored at the Pro Football Hall of Fame, which has his game jersey from last week's matchup now on display in Canton.

RECORD RUN FOR McBRIDE

TE **Trey McBride** leads the league in receptions (88), is tied for third in TD receptions (8) and ranks sixth in receiving yards (879). His 88 receptions are the second-most by a TE in the first 12 games of a season in NFL history behind Zach Ertz (93 in 2018). McBride also joined Cooper Kupp (5 catches in all 17 games in 2021) as the only players in the NFL in the last six seasons to have 5+ receptions in each of the first 12 games of a season. Prior to McBride in 2025, no NFL TE had ever started a season with more than seven straight games with 5+ receptions.

Last week vs. Tampa Bay, McBride joined Chiefs TE Travis Kelce (2020) as the only TEs in NFL history to have 80+ receptions, 800+ receiving yards and 8+ TD receptions in the first 12 games of a season. It's also his third consecutive season with 80+ receptions and 800+ receiving yards, making him the sixth TE in NFL history to accomplish the feat in three straight seasons.



Last week's outing in Tampa Bay was QB **Jacoby Brissett's** fourth with 300+ passing yards this season. Despite having started just seven games in 2025, Brissett's four outings with 300+ passing yards are tied for the most in the NFL. The 2025 season marks the first time he has passed for 300+ yards in 4+ games in a single season.

Since Week 6, Brissett ranks first in the NFL in completions (204), passing yards (2,188) and passing first downs (106), is tied for fifth in passing TDs (13) and ranks sixth in completion % (67.8%).

SWEAT'S BEST SEASON YET

In his last five games, LB **Josh Sweat** has posted 10 tackles, 9 QB hits, 6.0 sacks, 5 tackles for loss, 2 forced fumbles a fumble recovery and a pass defended. Sweat is up to 11.0 sacks on the season, matching his career-high for a single season (11.0 in 2022 with Philadelphia). He is the first Cardinals player to reach double-digit sacks in a season since J.J. Watt (12.5) in 2022.

Last week at Tampa Bay, Sweat recorded his third multi-sack game of the season, the most such games by a Cardinals player in their first 12 games with the team. He joined Packers DL Micah Parsons as the only two players in the NFL this season to have 3+ games with two-or-more sacks in their first year with a new team.

WALTER PAYTON MAN OF THE YEAR

On Thursday, OL **Kelvin Beachum** was named the 2025 Cardinals/Walter Payton Man of the Year. It's his third time being nominated for the award after previously being honored by the Cardinals in 2021 and Jets in 2018.

As a winner, Beachum will receive up to a \$40,000 donation to the charity of his choice. He will also wear a Walter Payton NFL Man of the Year helmet decal through the end of the season in recognition of his accomplishments on and off the field.

The 2025 "Walter Payton NFL Man of the Year" will be announced during NFL Honors, an awards special to air on NBC on Thursday, February 5. The winner will receive up to a \$250,000 donation to the charity of his choice.

His 14-year NFL career has been defined by extensive community leadership and championing causes that include hunger relief, clean water access, education equity, and environmental sustainability. He has donated millions of meals to numerous food banks, built clean water wells in Africa, supported classroom and technology access through major donations, and created programs like "Kelvin Connects" to expand STEAM opportunities for youth. Through national partnerships, local volunteerism, and award-winning advocacy, Beachum continues to use his platform to make a broad, lasting impact in Arizona and around the world.
