



# ARIZONA CARDINALS NOTE CARDS

- 43** Years that legendary Hall of Fame S Larry Wilson - who passed away on Thursday at the age of 82 - spent with the Cardinals organization. An 8-time Pro Bowl and 5-time 1<sup>st</sup>-team All-Pro, he was a 7<sup>th</sup> round draft pick in 1960 and played 13 seasons with the Cardinals before spending 30 years as a team executive.
- 15** Tackles for S Budda Baker in last week's season-opening victory at San Francisco, a career-high. Baker has 12+ tackles in six of his last 10 games played.
- 2** TD runs of 20+ yards for QB Kyler Murray in his first 17 career games. He joins Baltimore's Lamar Jackson (2) as the only QBs with multiple TD runs of 20+ yards dating back to last season. Between 1970 and 2018, the Cardinals had two total TD runs of 20+ yards by a QB.
- 5** Rushing TDs for RB Kenyan Drake in four games at State Farm Stadium last season. Since being acquired by the Cardinals in a trade with Miami in Week 9 last season, Drake has nine rushing TDs in nine games (139 carries). He had nine rushing TDs in 54 games (333 carries) with the Dolphins.

## WITH A WIN...

- Arizona would start a season 2-0 for the first time since 2015 and for just the sixth time in the last 30 seasons (2015, 2014, 2012, 2008, 1991).
- The Cardinals would improve to 10-5 in regular season home-openers at State Farm Stadium.

## MILESTONES WITHIN REACH...

### WR LARRY FITZGERALD

- With a reception, Fitzgerald would have at least one catch in 245 consecutive games, extending the second-longest streak in NFL history (Jerry Rice - 274).
- With nine receptions, Fitzgerald (647 at State Farm Stadium) would pass Jerry Rice (646 at Candlestick Park) for the most receptions in NFL history at a single stadium.
- With 100 receiving yards, Fitz would have 50 career 100-yard games during the regular season to extend his franchise record. He would have more 100-yard receiving performances than the players in second and third place on the franchise all-time list combined (49).

### LB CHANDLER JONES

- With a sack, Jones would have 4.0 sacks in five career games against Washington. QB Dwayne Haskins Jr. would become the 44th different QB Jones has sacked in his career.
- With two sacks, Jones would have 99.0 sacks for his career and would have 63.0 sacks in just 66 games played with the Cardinals since the team acquired him in a trade in 2016.

### WR DEANDRE HOPKINS

- With a reception, Hopkins would extend his streak to 112 consecutive games with at least one catch. He would have at least one reception in every game played in his NFL career.
- With five receptions, Hopkins would have 5+ catches in 20 consecutive games. He would also establish a new franchise record for receptions in the first two games of a season (19). Anquan Boldin (18) holds the current mark.
- With six catches, Hopkins (20) would set an NFL record for most receptions in a player's first two games with a team. Eric Metcalf (19 with Atl) and Earl Cooper (19 with SF) hold the current record.
- With a TD reception, Hopkins would have 55 career TD catches. That would be the most among active NFL players dating back to his rookie season in 2013.

### QB KYLER MURRAY

- With two TD passes, Murray would have nine career games with multiple TD passes. Despite being just two games into his second season, he would establish a franchise record for most games with multiple TD passes in a player's first two NFL seasons.
- With 85 rushing yards, Murray (176) would pass Michael Vick (175 in 2006) for the most rushing yards by a QB in the first two games of a season in the Super Bowl era.
- With 300 passing yards, Murray would have six 300-yard performances in his career. No other QB in franchise history had more than four games with 300+ passing yards in their first two NFL seasons.

### RB KENYAN DRAKE

- With a rushing TD, Drake would have at least one TD run in five consecutive games to tie the longest streak in franchise history. Five players have accomplished the feat, but none have done so Ottis Anderson in 1983-84.
- With a rushing TD, Drake would have more rushing TDs in 10 games with Arizona (10) than he had in 54 total games with Miami (9).
- With 100+ rushing yards, Drake would surpass 100 yards for the third time in the last five games. It would also give him four 100-yard outings in 10 games with the Cardinals, compared to just two in 54 games with Miami.

## GAME #111 AT STATE FARM STADIUM FOR #11

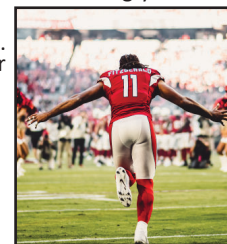
On Sunday, WR **Larry Fitzgerald** will play in his 111<sup>th</sup> career regular season game at State Farm Stadium. In doing so, he will have played in all 15 home-openers and in 111 of the 113 games played at the venue since it opened in 2006.

Fitzgerald has 638 receptions for 7,859 yards and 55 TDs at State Farm Stadium. In NFL history, only WR Jerry Rice had more receptions or receiving yards in a single stadium.

The 11-time Pro Bowler enters Sunday's matchup vs. Washington needing just nine catches to pass Rice for the most catches in a single venue.

## HOPKINS 6 CATCHES FROM HISTORY

Following a momentous outing in his Cardinals debut last week in which he posted a career-high 14 receptions for 151 yards, WR **DeAndre Hopkins** enters Sunday's game needing just six catches to make NFL history.

With six receptions, the three-time 1st-team All-Pro will have more receptions in his first two games with Arizona (20) than any player in NFL history has had in their first two games with a team.

## MURRAY'S PROLIFIC GROUND GAME

After he established a franchise record for rushing yards by a QB as a rookie last season, QB **Kyler Murray** reached 100 rushing yards in the win over San Francisco last week. However, his two kneel downs to end the game took nine yards off his rushing total and dipped it below the century mark.

As it stands, his 91 rushing yards represent the fourth-best single-game total in franchise history by a QB. *Despite having played in just 17 career games, Murray already owns four of the top-eight single-game rushing performances by a QB in franchise history.*
