# **ARIZONA CARDINALS (3-6)** LOS ANGELES RAMS (3-5)

SoFi Stadium | November 13, 2022 | 2:25 PM



#### THIS WEEK'S PREVIEW

Both the Cardinals and Rams enter their Week 10 matchup having lost two straight, making Sunday's contest at SoFi Stadium a pivotal one as both teams fight to stay alive in the division and conference standings

This marks the second of three consecutive divisional matchups for the Cardinals, who have a Monday Night Football showdown with the San Francisco 49ers in Mexico City on deck in Week 11.



The two teams that battled for the NFC West title down to the final week of the 2021 season, both Arizona and L.A. have been battered by injuries and adversity in 2022. Look no further than the offensive lines to see how much turnover has hit the two teams. The Rams have started an NFL-high 11 different players along the O-Line this season while the Cardinals - without starting RG **Will Hernandez** this week - could start their 11<sup>th</sup> different O-Lineman on Sunday.

Arizona's defense was able to slow the Rams passing attack in their Week 3 meeting earlier this season. The Cardinals defense did not allow a passing TD vs. QB Matthew Stafford, one of just two games the signal-caller has been without a TD pass since joining the Rams last season. Arizona also held All-Pro WR Cooper Kupp to season-lows for receptions (4) and receiving yards (44), snapping his NFL-record streak of 15 consecutive games with 90+ receiving yards.

After not facing each other in the previous three meetings (including postseason), the rivalry between Cardinals All-Pro WR **DeAndre Hopkins** and Rams CB **Jalen Ramsey** resumes this week. The duo has faced off 10 times dating back 2016, when both were in the AFC South. Both stars are playing at a high level entering this week's game, with Ramsey among the league leaders in passes defensed (9) and Hopkins putting up 26 receptions for 298 yards and two TDs in just three games played in 2022.

Something to watch for in this one is the Cardinals streak of return TDs of late. Arizona leads the NFL with five return TDs in 2022, including four return TDs in the last four games. On Sunday the Cards face a Rams team that has given up four return TDs so far this season, tied for the most in the NFL.

#### THIS WEEK'S HIGHLIGHTS

- The Cardinals travel to Los Angeles to take on the Rams at SoFi Stadium on Sunday. A win would give Arizona a split of the regular season series vs. the Rams for the second consecutive year.
- In the Week 3 meeting between the two teams earlier this season, Arizona's defense held Rams All-Pro WR Cooper Kupp to just 44 yards on 4 receptions. In 29 games played (regular season and postseason) over the last two years (2021-22), there have been just three games in which Kupp has been held to <u>5 receptions or fewer and all three have come vs. Arizona.</u>
- With a win on Sunday, the Cardinals would improve to 11-3 on the road dating back to last season and 15-7 on the road dating back to 2020
- The Cardinals have an NFL-high five return TDs in 2022, including four (3 INT return, 1 FR) in the last four games. In the last three games, three Arizona players (LBs Zaven Collins and Isaiah Simmons and CB Marco Wilson) have scored their first career TD on INT returns.
- · With starting RG Will Hernandez set to miss his first game of the season on Sunday, Arizona will be starting its 7<sup>th</sup> different O-Line combination, including its 4<sup>th</sup> in the last four games and its 5<sup>th</sup> in the last six games. Arizona has had 10 different players start on the O-Line this season with only the Rams (11) starting more.
- TE Zach Ertz has 46 receptions for 394 yards and four TDs this season. He ranks second among NFL TEs in receptions (Travis Kelce - 57) and is tied for third in TD catches behind only Kelce (7) and Mark Andrews (5).

#### ARIZONA AMONG THE BEST ON THE ROAD

Dating back to the beginning of last season - when Arizona established a fran-chise record with eight road wins - the Cardinals are 10-3 on the road. Their .769 winning percentage in that span is tied for the best in the NFL.

#### BY THE NUMBERS

Cardinals record on the road dating back to last season. Arizona's .769 winning percentage on the road the last two seasons (2022) is tied with Philadelphia for the best in the NFL.

Rushing TDs for RB James Conner in two games (1 regular season; 1 postseason) at SoFi Stadium last year.

Return TDs for the Cardinals this season (3 INT Return, 2 FR). Arizona's five return TDs lead the NFL. The Cardinals have four return TDs in their last four games.

INT return TDs for the Cardinals defense in the last three games. All three came via players who scored their first career TD: Marco Wilson and Isaiah Simmons vs. New Orleans; Zaven Collins vs. Seattle.

Points off turnovers for the Cardinals in 2022. Only New England (75) and Philadelphia (60) have more this season.

Total games missed due to injury/suspension for 25 different Cardinals players so far this season.

Different players who have appeared in at least one game for Arizona in 2022. That total leads the NFL.

Tackles for S Budda Baker last week vs. Seattle It was his third game with double-digit tackles this season, his second in a row and the 21<sup>tt</sup> of his career. Dating back to his rookie season in 2017, Baker's 21 games with 10+ tackles lead all NFL DBs.

Tackles for Baker in 2022. Among NFL DBs, only Chargers S Derwin James, Jr. (72) has more.

Receptions for TE Zach Ertz in 2022. That ranks second among NFL TEs this season behind only Travis Kelce (57). Combined with his 56 receptions with the Cardinals last season, he needs just four more catches to become the first TE in franchise history with multiple seasons of 50+ receptions.

Career TD receptions for WR DeAndre Hopkins, who had his most recent on a 22-yard catch last week vs. Seattle. He now joins Davante Adams (80) and Mike Evans (78) as the only active players with at least 70 TD receptions in their

Consecutive games in which Hopkins has at least one reception, the longest active streak in the NFL. In the Super Bowl era, only three players had a longer streak than Hopkins to open their career.

Career TDs (passing and rushing) for QB Kyler Murray, who surpassed the century mark in Week 8 with three TD passes at Minnesota. In NFL history, only 11 players reached 100 TDs in fewer games than Murray (54): Patrick Mahomes (39), Dan Marino (43), Deshaun Watson (45), Kurt Warner (46), Josh Allen (47), Andrew Luck (49), Daunte Culpepper (50), Johnny Unitas (51) and Matthew Stafford (51), Peyton Manning (53) and Cam Newton (53).

Completion percentage for QB Kyler Murray last week vs. Seattle (25-of-35). It was his 20th career game with a completion percentage of 70+, extending his franchise record (no other player in team history has more than 15).

Combined tackles for LBs Zaven Collins and Isaiah Simmons this season. Simmons and Collins make up the only LB duo in the NFL each with 40+ tackles, 2.0+ sacks and an INT this season. They are also the only LB pair with INT return TDs in 2022.

Players in the NFL who have 5.0+ sacks, 3+ INTs and 7+ forced fumbles over the last three seasons (2020-22): Cards LB Isaiah Simmons.

Tackles for LB Zaven Collins in nine games this season. He had 25 tackles in 17 games as a rookie in 2021.

Arizona's record when leading at halftime under head coach Kliff Kingsbury.

#### WHAT TO LOOK FOR IN WEEK 10

#### WITH A WIN...

- The Cardinals would earn their third road win of the season and improve to 11-3 on the road dating back to 2021.
- Arizona would also improve to 15-7 on the road over the last three seasons (2020-22).
- Arizona would split the regular season series with the Rams for the second consecutive season.
- The Cardinals would earn their second straight regular season win at SoFi Stadium and improve to 2-1 all-time in the regular season at the venue.

#### MILESTONES WITHIN REACH

WR DeAndre Hopkins

- With 1 reception, Hopkins would have at least one catch in 140 consecutive games. That would extend the longest active streak in the NFL.
- With a TD catch, Hopkins would have 11 TD catches in 14 games played dating back to the beginning of last season.
- With 121 receiving yards, Hopkins would have 11,000 receiving yards for his career. At 30 years, 160 days old he would become the fourth-youngest player in NFL history to reach the milestone behind only Calvin Johnson (30 years, 33 days), Larry Fitzgerald (30 years, 85 days) and Antonio Brown (30 years, 159 days). He would also join Julio Jones and DeSean Jackson as the only active players with 11,000+ receiving yards in their career.

- With 1 reception, Ertz would have at least one catch in 116 consecutive games. That would extend the fourth-longest active streak in the NFL
- With 4 receptions, Ertz would have 50 catches in 2022. Combined with his 56 receptions with the Cardinals last season, he would become the first TE in franchise history with multiple seasons of 50+ catches.
- With 4 receptions, Ertz would also have 106 catches as a member of the Cardinals. That would move him into fifth place on the franchise all-time receptions list among TEs.
- With 1 TD catch, Ertz would have at least one TD catch in three consecutive games for just the second time in his career (had a TD catch in four straight games in 2017).

QB Kyler Murray

- With 3+ passing TDs, Murray would have 3+ passing TDs in a game for the 13th time in his career. Only Neil Lomax (15 times in 108 games) and Charley Johnson (14 times in 87 games) would have more such performances.
- With 41 rushing yards, Murray would join Josh Allen, Lamar Jackson, Russell Wilson and Cam Newton as the only QBs in NFL history with 400+ rushing yards in each of their first four seasons.

• With 1.0 sack, Watt would have 5.5 sacks in 2022, his highest single-season total since 2018 (16.0).

ANY PLAYER RETURN TD

- The Cardinals would have six return TDs in 2022. It would mark the first time since 2015 (7) Arizona had at least six return TDs in a single season.
- The Cardinals would have five return TDs in their last five games.

HBO Sports and NFL Films are teamming up to bring fans Hard Knocks In Season: The Arizona Cardinals this fall for an all-access primetime docuseries on

The 18-time Emmy-winning weekly series will deliver its signature all access coverage to document an NFL franchise in-season and in real time, following the Cardinals as the team navigates the challenges of an NFL season and battles to return to the post-season. The series will be available on HBO and to stream on HBO Max during the 2022 NFL season.

*Hard Knocks In Season* debuted last fall with the engaging and eventful drama of the Indianapolis Colts' 2021 regular season journey.

This will mark the Cardinals first appearance as part of the Hard Knocks franchise, which originally launched in 2001.

#### ARIZONA SCORING BIG ON TAKEAWAYS IN 2022


Arizona scored its fifth return TD of the 2022 season last week vs. Seattle when LB Zaven Collins picked off a Geno Smith pass and returned it 30 yards for a TD. It was the first INT - and TD - of Collins' career.

Arizona leads the NFL with five return TDs in 2022. The Cardinals also rank third in the NFL in points off takeaways (52) this season.

Combined with Chris Banjo's fumble return TD at Seattle in Week 6 and two INT return TDs in Week 7 vs. New Orleans, the Cardinals now have four return TDs in the last four games.

Arizona has five total return TDs in 2022. That is the most for the team in a single season since 2015 (7). Only twice in franchise history - 2010 (8) and 1959 (7) - did the Cardinals have more return TDs in the first nine games of a season.

#### **HOPKINS EXCELS IN FIRST THREE GAMES**

In his first three games played this season, WR DeAndre Hopkins has 26 receptions for 298 yards and two TDs.

In his first two games played, Hopkins joined Anquan Boldin (2005) as the only players in franchise history to have 10+ receptions and 100+ receiving yards in back-to-back games.

Hopkins had his biggest game in Week 8 at Minnesota, hauling in 12 receptions for 159 yards and a TD. It was his third career game with 12+ receptions, two of which have come with the Cardinals.

Collins was taken 16<sup>th</sup> overall in the 2021 NFL Draft out of Tulsa and Simmons was taken 8<sup>th</sup> overall in 2020 out of Clemson. The duo have been standouts on the Cardinals defense in 2022.

#### SIMMONS KEEPS ON MAKING PLAYS

In the last five games, LB Isaiah Simmons has 33 tackles, an INT (returned for a TD), 2.0 sacks, a forced fumble, a fumble recovery and four passes defensed.

In Week 8 at Minnesota, he recorded his first sack of the season, forcing a fumble and recovering the loose ball all on the same play. It was his second consecutive game with a takeaway. In Week 7 vs. New Orleans, he had his third career INT when he jumped in front of an Andy Dalton pass and returned the INT 56 yards for his first career TD.



Last week vs. Seattle, Simmons followed up with his second sack of the season, while adding eight tackles, a tackle for loss and a QB hit.

In 2021, Simmons totaled 103 tackles, 7 passes defensed, an INT, 4 forced fumbles, 4 tackles for loss, 4 QB hits and 1.5 sacks. <u>He joined Colts All-Pro LB Darius Leonard as the only players in the NFL last season with 100+ tackles, 4+ forced fumbles and 7+ passes defensed.</u>

#### **CARDS WIN THURSDAY NIGHT SHOOTOUT**

Playing on Thursday Night Football in Week 7 the Cardinals defeated the New Orleans Saints 42-34 at State Farm Stadium.

The combined 76 points made the Cardinals victory over the Saints the highest-scoring Thursday Night game in over five years (since 9/21/17 when the Rams defeated the 49ers 41-39).



The 42 points scored vs. the Saints on Thursday Night Football were the most ever by the Cardinals in a primetime game. The previous high was 40 at Philadelphia (12/20/15) on Sunday Night Football

The contest also marked just the second time in the last 12 seasons (2011-22) that the Cardinals scored 42+ points in a home game. The 42-point performance represents the fourth-best total for the Cardinals in a game at State Farm Stadium (2006-22).

#### **UP NEXT IN PRIMETIME: MEXICO CITY**

The Cardinals are back in primetime next week vs. San Francisco. In Week 11, the Cardinals will take on the 49ers at Estadio Azteca in Mexico City on Monday Night Football.

The contest will serve as a rematch of the 2005 Cardinals-49ers game at Estadio Azteca which was the NFL's first regular season game held outside the United States. The Cardinals earned a 31-14 win over the 49ers in that game in front of a crowd of 103.467.

The Cards have a long history with international games and have participated in many global "firsts" for the league:



- The franchise played in the first NFL regular season game held outside the United States when they defeated the San Francisco 49ers 31-14 at Estadio Azteca in Mexico City on October 2, 2005.
- The team also played the first NFL game outside of North America on August 16, 1976 against the Chargers in Tokyo's Korakuen Stadium. The Cardinals won, 20-10.
- The first American football contest played on British soil was between the Cardinals and Vikings in London's Wembley Stadium on August 6, 1983.

2021 WAS A RECORD-BREAKING YEAR

Arizona's 15 turnovers and four fumbles lost in 2021 both represent the lowest single-season totals in franchise history.

The Cardinals went without a turnover in seven games last season, tied for the most in a single season in franchise history. Only twice in franchise history has that happened, and both seasons have come under Kingsbury.

#### WILSON WINS PLAYER OF THE WEEK

CB **Marco Wilson** was named the "NFC Defensive Player of the Week" for his performance in the 42-34 victory over the New Orleans Saints in Week 7.

It was Wilson's first career "Defensive Player of the Week" selection and he became the 35<sup>th</sup> different player in team history to be named "NFC Defensive Player of the Week.

Wilson recorded his first career INT and first career TD on the same play in the primetime win over New Orleans. With the game tied 14-14 late in the second quarter, Wilson picked off a deflected pass and returned it 38 yards for a TD. That score gave Arizona a 20-14 lead and the Cardinals never trailed again in the game.



Wilson had the only go-ahead defensive TD in the NFL in Week 7.

He finished the game with three tackles, an INT (returned for a TD) and tied his career high with two passes defensed.

Wilson and teammate LB Isaiah Simmons each returned INTs for TDs in the win over the Saints. It was the first time since 2015 that the Cardinals had multiple INT returns for TDs in the same game.

In nine games this season (8 starts), Wilson has recorded 38 tackles, an INT (returned for a TD), five passes defensed, a tackle for loss, a QB hit and a forced fumble.

#### ALLEN CONTINUES HIS RAPID ASCENT

Following a promising 2021 campaign, fourth-year DL Zach Allen is having a breakout season for the Cardinals in 2022.

Through nine games, Allen has totaled 35 tackles, 2.5 sacks, has established career highs with six passes defensed and six tackles for loss, while adding 12 QB hits. Allen's six passes defensed are tied for the most among D-Linemen this season while his 35 tackles are tied for 11<sup>th</sup>.

Against the Panthers in Week 4, Allen had six tackles, a sack, a career-high three passes defensed, two QB hits and a tackle for loss.

### ALLEN JOINS RAMSEY AND HICKS - FACTS ABOUT HIS RECENT PLAY Allen, Rams CB Jalen Ramsey and Vikings LB Jordan Hicks are the only players in the NFL this season with 2.0+ sacks and 6+ passes defensed.

#### ARIZONA'S SWISS ARMY KNIFE

RB Eno Benjamin's third NFL season has been a breakout one for the former ASU standout. It is also one that has seen him do a little of everything for the Cardinals.

Through nine games Benjamin has:

- 299 rushing yards and two TDs on 70 carries (4.3 avg.)

- 24 receptions for 184 yards
  7 kickoff returns for 170 yards
  3 kickoffs for 158 yards (52.7 avg.)

In his second consecutive - and second career - start in place of injured RB James Conner, Benjamin had the most productive game of his career in the Cardinals win over New Orleans in Week 7.

He established career highs for scrimmage yards (113) and rushing yards (92), scored his third career TD and also broke the longest run of his career (45 yards).

**BECOMING A VITAL PIECE:** A 7<sup>th</sup> round (222<sup>nd</sup> overall) selection by the Cardinals in the 2020 NFL Draft, Benjamin's first two NFL seasons (2020-21) consisted of: 9 games played, 116 rushing yards, 1 rushing TD and 160 total scrimmage yards.



His 2022 season has consisted of 9 games played, 299 rushing yards, 2 rushing TDs and 483 scrimmage yards.

The Week 7 matchup vs. the Saints was Benjamin's  $16^{\rm th}$  career game played. Below is a look at how his performance compared to his first 15 games:

- His 92 rushing yards more than doubled his previous high (39 @ SF,
- His second carry of the game covered more yards (45) than he had ever rushed for in an entire game (39 yards).
- His 113 scrimmage yards were 48 more than his previous high (65 @ Sea,
- After posting just one rushing TD in his first 13 career games, Benjamin now has two rushing TDs in his last five games.

#### ENO'S FOOT LEADS TO A RARE FEAT IN CAROLINA

After K Matt Prater was forced from the game in the fourth quarter due to a hip injury, Benjamin added kickoffs to his job duties in Carolina. He kicked off following all three of the Cardinals fourth quarter scoring drives.

<u>Benjamin became the first Cards player in the Super Bowl era to have a rush</u> attempt, reception, a kickoff return and a kickoff in the same game. Prior to Benjamin, the last non-specialist to kick off for the Cardinals was S Pat Till-man on 12/15/01 at the N.Y. Giants. Benjamin and Tillman are the last two <u>Arizona State players drafted by the Cardinals.</u>

#### ARIZONA IS HIGHLY PRODUCTIVE ON THE GROUND

Arizona finished last week's game against the Seahawks with 122 rushing yards on 21 attempts (5.8 avg.).

It was the Cardinals 42<sup>nd</sup> game with 100+ rushing yards under Kliff Kingsbury (2019-22). In that span, only Baltimore (54), Philadelphia (45), Tennessee (43) have more games with 100+ rushina vards.



#### BETMGM SPORTSBOOK OPENS AT STATE FARM STADIUM

In September, the Cardinals and BetMGM debuted the first sportsbook at an NFL stadium. The BetMGM Sportsbook at State Farm Stadium is a two-story, 17,000-square-foot entertainment destination featuring state-of-the-art sports wagering amenities, concert-hosting facilities, a gourmet grille and bar and a variety of screens to watch games.

"We are proud and thrilled to be the NFL's first team to offer its fans this type of unprecedented amenity and innovative experience," Cardinals owner Michael Bidwill said at the opening. "The Bet-MGM Sportsbook at



State Farm Stadium gives us a chance to engage current and potential fans on a year-round basis in a fun, entertaining and responsible way.

Located on The Great Lawn, the BetMGM Sportsbook at State Farm Stadium operates on both event and non-event days, offering guests a massive 265-square-foot video wall, 38 TVs and indoor-and-outdoor dining options.

Throughout the year, the BetMGM Sportsbook at State Farm Stadium also will serve as an outdoor music and comedy concert amphitheater, hosting events for audiences gathered on The Great Lawn.

#### SUPER BOWL RETURNS TO AZ

#### Valley Will Host 4th Super Bowl in February

The final game of the 2022 NFL season will take place in Arizona when State Farm Stadium plays host to Super Bowl LVII on <u>Sunday, February 12, 2023.</u>

It will be the fourth Super Bowl played in the state of Arizona and the third time the nation's most popular sporting event will be played at State Farm Stadium. The Cardinals home venue last staged the mega event when it



hosted Super Bowl XLIX following the 2014 season.

Arizona joins South Florida, New Orleans, Los Angeles and Tampa Bay as the only sites selected to host the Super Bowl at least four times.

ECONOMIC IMPACT: The last time the game was staged in Arizona, it produced a record economic impact for the state. A 2015 study by the Seidman Research Institute, W.P. Carey School of Business at Arizona State University determined that Super Bowl XLIX, the 2015 Pro Bowl and related events produced a gross economic impact of \$719.4 million for the region. That was the largest economic impact of any special event ever held in Arizona. In addition to the games played in Glendale, more than 1 million people visited Verizon Super Bowl Central in downtown Phoenix and more than 500,000 people enjoyed events in downtown Scottsdale.

In a span of just over 26 months in 2015-17, State Farm Stadium hosted a <u>Pro Bowl, Super Bowl, College Football National Championship Game and</u> the NCAA Men's Final Four. It was an unprecedented stretch for a stadium that generated \$1.3 billion in economic impact for the state during that 26-month span.



#### **ELEVATING A FRANCHISE**

The 2022 season is the 16th with owner Michael Bidwill steering the organization. His leadership during that time has been instrumental in transforming the franchise both on and off the field.

- Highlights of Bidwill's tenure:

   Michael continues a tradition of Bidwill ownership of the Cardinals that dates back to his grandfather, Hall of Famer Charles Bidwill, who purchased the team in 1933.
- Of the franchise's seven all-time postseason wins, five have come during Michael's tenure leading the organization. Arizona has played in 10 postseason contests over the last 15 seasons, after having appeared in just seven total playoff games prior.



- Arizona has appeared in the NFC Championship Game twice since 2008 including a victory in the 2008 conference title game that led to the franchise's first-ever Super Bowl appearance (Super Bowl XLIII).
- With an 11-6 record in 2021, the Cardinals reached 11+ wins in a season for the sixth time in franchise history. Three of those six 11-win campaigns came with Michael leading the team: 13 in 2015, 11 in 2014, 11 in 2021.
- Among Bidwill's most substantial accomplishments with the Cardinals is the creation of State Farm Stadium. The world-class venue has proved a critical turning point for the franchise, an economic engine for the state of Arizona, and a crucial resource in the battle against the COVID-19 pandemic.
- At the conclusion of the 2022 season, State Farm Stadium will host Super Bowl LVII – the third Super Bowl held at the venue since it opened in 2006. State Farm Stadium also hosted Super Bowls XLII (following 2007 season) and XLIX (following 2014 season).
- In addition to his role in helping Arizona land three Super Bowls, Michael was also instrumental in getting the 2015 Pro Bowl moved to State Farm Stadium; played a week before Super Bowl XLIX, the two events combined to deliver a record economic impact of \$720 million to the region.
- Since State Farm Stadium opened in 2006, the Cardinals have sold out 159 games at the venue (which is every non-pandemic game played there).
- Beginning this week, the Cardinals will make their first-ever appearance on Hard Knocks, television's most acclaimed sports reality franchise. Arizona will be the second team to be featured on Hard Knocks In Season, which will document the second half of the Cardinals season in real time.
- In January of 2016, the National Football Foundation (NFF) and College Hall of Fame inducted Bidwill and Governor Doug Ducey into the NFF Leadership

Within the National Football League, Bidwill's considerable influence is illustrated by his appointment to a number of notable league committees, including his inclusion on the prestigious Management Council Executive Committee.

In 2021, the league announced that Bidwill would replace Bengals owner Mike

#### REMEMBERING VIOLET BIDWILL

The 2022 season marks the 75th anniversary of the Cardinals historic 1947 season. It was a year in which Violet Bidwill made league history and one that ultimately ended in the team winning an NFL Championship over the Philadelphia Eagles.

The Cardinals suffered a big loss when team owner **Charles W. Bidwill** - having just recently assembled his "Dream Backfield" with the unprecedented signing of All-American running back Charley Trippi - passed away in April. He had run the franchise since purchasing it in 1933 and was credited with pulling the team - and on a larger scale the NFL - through the Great Depression.

#### THE NFL'S FIRST FEMALE OWNER

With the passing of Charles, his wife, Violet Bidwill - while raising the couple's two teen-age sons Stormy (18) and William (16) - took

over as team owner. It was a historic moment, as she became the first female owner in NFL history and one of the first females to serve as a primary owner in <u>professional sports.</u>

"She was a wonderful person and was in a tough situation with losing her husband at a young age," Violet's grandson, current Cardinals owner **Michael Bidwill**, said. "She decided she would take over the family businesses."

"Things worked out well," then-team president Ray Benningsen said of the front office under Violet. "I ran the business end of it, (head coach) Jimmy (Conzelman) ran the team on the field and we both appreciated Vi's (Violet) counsel. I'll tell you one thing. She knew her football and she was a shrewd businesswoman.

"She didn't suffer fools, and she was right there in the meetings with the rest of the owners and held her own," said Michael Bidwill.

Violet Bidwill's first year of ownership saw the franchise win the NFL Champion-ship after defeating the Philadelphia Eagles 28-21 in the Championship Game.

#### KEIM HAS BUILT SOME OF THE BEST

After 14 seasons working within the Cardinals personnel department, Steve Keim was elevated to GM on January 8, 2013.

#### AMONG THE NFL'S BEST IN 2021

In 2021, the Cardinals posted an 11-6 record and secured their first playoff berth since 2015.

In addition to winning 11 games during the regular season, the Cardinals also ranked in the top 10 in both offensive points scored and defensive points allowed per game.

### **CARDINALS HIGHLIGHTS IN KEIM'S TENURE**

- The 2021 season marked the fourth time in his tenure the Cardinals have won 10+ games. That includes the 2015 season when Arizona won a franchise record 13 games and earned its first-ever postseason bye.
- During Keim's tenure, Arizona has established franchise records for wins in a season (13 in 2015), points in a season (489 in 2015), led the NFL in total offense for the first time in team history (#1 in 2015) and led the NFL in sacks for the second time ever (48.0 in 2016).
- Arizona has featured a top-10 defense four times and a top-10 offense four times dating back to Keim's first season as GM. The Cardinals had a top-10 defense in three consecutive seasons (2015-17) for the first time since the 1970 merger. In 2021, Arizona ranked 10<sup>th</sup> in the NFL in offensive points scored (435) and eighth in defensive points allowed (349).
- Selected QB Kyler Murray with the #1 overall pick in the 2019 NFL Draft. Murray was named the 2019 NFL Offensive Rookie of the Year and followed up with Pro Bowl selections in each of the last two years (2020-21), becoming the first QB in team history to earn multiple Pro Bowls in his first three seasons.
- The 2021 free agency period was one of Keim's busiest as GM. The players the Cardinals acquired have a combined 20 Pro Bowl selections and 11 All-Pro nods. Arizona brought in five different Pro Bowlers in the offseason: DL J.J. Watt, WR A.J. Green, OL Rodney Hudson, K Matt Prater and RB James Conner. Conner was selected to the Pro Bowl in 2021.
- Named Sporting News 2014 NFL Executive of the Year and earned back-to-back NFL Executive of the Year honors from Pro Football Talk (2013-14).

#### ARIZONA TRADES FOR ANDERSON

On October 17, the Cardinals acquired WR Robbie Anderson in a trade with the Carolina Panthers.

#### ANDERSON FACT SHEET:

• Is in his seventh NFL season in 2022 and has played in 104 games (85 starts) with Panthers (2020-22), Jets (2016-19) and Cardinals (2022).

- Has 369 receptions for 4,876 yards and 29 TDs since entering the league in 2016 with the Jets as an undrafted rookie free agent.
- Among players who entered the NFL as undrafted free agents, became just the third to begin his career with six consecutive seasons of 40+ receptions and 500+ receiving yards. He joined Wayne Chrebet (1995-2000) and Charley Hennigan (1960-65) as the only players to accomplish the feat.
- One of 10 NFL WRs and the only one on the list who entered the league undrafted who had at least 50 receptions and 750 receiving yards in each of <u>the last four seasons (2018-21)</u>

ADDING (ANOTHER) ONE OF NFL'S TOP DEEP THREATS With WR Marquise Brown out due to a foot injury, Arizona has temporarily lost one of the NFL's top deep threats - while replacing him with another. **Dating** back to his rookie season in 2016, Anderson has 11 TD catches of 40+ yards. Only two players have more such TDs during that span.

#### AZ ACQUIRED DEEP THREAT IN HOLLYWOOD

On the first day of the 2022 NFL Draft, the Cardinals sent their first-round pick (#23 overall) to the Baltimore Ravens in exchange for WR Marquise "Hollywood" **Brown** and the Ravens '22 third-round pick (#100 overall).

Baltimore's first round pick (25th overall) in the 2019 NFL Draft, Brown has 238 receptions for 2,846 yards and 24 TDs in 52 games (47 starts) in his career. The 25-year old set career highs with 91 receptions for 1,008 yards last season while starting all 16 games in which he played.

Has also played in three postseason games and totaled 18 receptions for 322 yards.



Since he entered the league in 2019, only one player in the NFL has more TD receptions of 20+ yards than Brown (13). Only four have more TD catches and 40+ yards than Brown (7).



- BROWN'S TD CONNECTIONS

   Dating back to his two seasons (2017-18) at Oklahoma, Brown has 41 TD receptions, 40 of which have come from three different Heisman Trophy winning QBs (**Kyler Murray**, Baker Mayfield, Lamar Jackson) and the other coming from QB **Trace McSorley** - his former teammate in Baltimore and current teammate with the Cardinals.
- Of his 17 TD receptions at Oklahoma, 11 came from Murray including Brown's first TD with the Sooners (87-yarder from Kyler on 9/16/17 vs. Tulane).
- Brown's 11 TD catches from Murray at Oklahoma averaged 51.0 yards. Only one covered fewer than 20 yards and seven covered 50+ yards.

- After spending his first 10 seasons with the Texans who selected Watt in the first round (11<sup>th</sup> overall) in the 2011 NFL Draft signed a two-year contract with the Cardinals on 3/2/21 as a free agent.

- In response to the devastation in Houston as the result of Hurricane Harvey in 2017, organized what would become the largest crowd-sourced fundraiser in history. Originally set a goal of \$200,000 but within 19 days, more than 200,000 individuals collectively donated \$37 million to the cause. Contributions continued, and the final tally reached \$41.6 million.

In the Week 6 contest at Seattle, both rookies recorded their first career sack. Thomas took down Seahawks QB Geno Smith in the first quarter while Sanders posted his sack in the third quarter.



**Zaven Collins** – Selected by the Cardinals in the first round (16th overall) of the 2021 NFL Draft out of Tulsa. Ranks second on the team with 61 tackles in 2022, adding 2.0 sacks, five tackles for loss, a forced fumble, an INT and three passes defensed. Posted his first career INT and first career TD last week when he returned a Geno Smith INT for a TD.

**Victor Dimukeje** – Selected by Arizona with their first pick of the sixth round (210th overall) of the 2021 NFL Draft out of Duke. Earned All-ACC honors as a junior and senior and named a semifinalist for the 2020 Lott IMPACT Trophy.

**Dennis Gardeck** – Named a Pro Bowl alternate on special teams in 2019 and selected as a team captain each of the last three seasons (2020-22). Signed by Arizona as a rookie free agent out of Sioux Falls in 2018 and has played 64 games in five seasons.

**Markus Golden** – Arizona's 2015 second-round pick (58th overall) out of Missouri has appeared in 103 games for the Cardinals (2015-18; 2020-22) and Giants (2019-20). Led the Arizona defense with 11.0 total sacks during the 2021 season.

**Kamu Grugier-Hill** – Seven-year NFL veteran who posted a career-best 106 tackles season with the Houston Texans in 2021.

**Jesse Luketa** – Selected by the Cardinals in the seventh round (256th overall) of the 2022 NFL Draft out of Penn State. A native of Ottawa, Ontario, played four seasons (2018-21) at Penn State and appeared in 46 games.

**Ben Niemann** – Undrafted free agent out of Iowa, signed with Kansas City in 2018 and appeared in 71 games with the Chiefs (2018-21) and Cardinals (2022) and was a member of the Super Bowl LIV championship team.

**Myjai Sanders** – Selected by Arizona with its second pick in the third round (100th overall) of the 2022 NFL Draft out of Cincinnati. Recorded his first career sack in Week 6.

Isaiah Simmons – Named to the 2020 PFWA All-Rookie team after being selected eighth by the Cardinals out of Clemson. One of two NFL players with 100+ tackles, 4+ forced fumbles and 7+ passes defensed last season. Had a 56-yard INT return TD in Week 7 vs. New Orleans and a sack, forced fumble and fumble recovery at Minnesota in Week 8.

**Cameron Thomas** – Arizona's first pick in the third-round (87th overall) of the 2022 NFL Draft out of San Diego State. Like fellow third-round pick Myjai Sanders, recorded his first career sack when he took down Seahawks QB Geno Smith in Week 6.

**Ezekiel Turner** – Signed with Arizona as an undrafted rookie free agent out of Washington in 2018. Has blocked two punts and has 47 special teams tackles in 55 career games.

**Tanner Vallejo** – Buffalo's 2017 sixth-round (195th overall) pick out of Boise State has played 74 games with Buffalo (2017), Cleveland (2018), Washington (2019) and Arizona (2019-22).

#### **DEFENSIVE BACKS**

**Budda Baker** – Arizona's 2017 second-round pick (36th overall) out of Washington is a four-time Pro Bowler (2017, '19-21), three-time team captain (2020-22) and a 2020 first-team All-Pro honors. Leads the team and is second among NFL DBs with 71 tackles in 2022.

Chris Banjo – A former undrafted rookie out of SMU, is in his 10th NFL season in 2022. Has played 124 career games with the Packers (2013-16), Saints (2016-18) and Cardinals (2019-22).

Antonio Hamilton – Seven-year NFL veteran has appeared in 76 games (4 starts) with the Raiders (2016-17), Giants (2018-19), Chiefs (2020) and Cardinals (2021-22). Hauled in his first career NFL INT in Week 7.

**Christian Matthew** – Arizona's first pick in the seventh-round (244th overall) of the 2022 NFL Draft out of Valdosta State becoming the sixth player to be drafted in school history.

**Trayvon Mullen Jr.** – Las Vegas' second round (40th overall) selection of the 2019 NFL Draft and has appeared in 41 games (31 starts) since entering the NFL. Was teammates with Isaiah Simmons at Clemson.

**Byron Murphy Jr.** –Scottsdale native and Arizona's 2019 second-round pick (33rd overall) out of Washington. Has recorded 227 tackles, five INTs and 34 passes defensed in 55 games (47 starts) during his first four NFL seasons.

**Jalen Thompson** – Selected by Arizona in the fifth-round of the 2019 NFL Supplemental Draft out of Washington State. Signed a three-year contract extension in September 2022.

**Marco Wilson** – Selected by Arizona in the fourth-round (136th overall) of the 2021 NFL Draft out of Florida. Has started 22 of 23 games played so far in his NFL career. Posted his first career INT and first career TD in Week 6 vs. New Orleans when he picked off a tipped pass at the Saints 38-yard line and returned it for the score.

The Cardinals opened the 2022 regular season against the Kansas City Chiefs at State Farm Stadium. The contest reunited AZ head coach Kliff Kingsbury with KC quarterback Patrick Mahomes, whom he recruited to Texas Tech and coached for three seasons there. On this particular afternoon, it was the pupil who led his team to victory with an impressive passing effort. The 2018 league MVP threw for 360 yards and 5 touchdowns with no INTs in steering the Chiefs to a 44-21 win. Kansas City jumped out early with TDs on their first three drives and never looked back. Playing without several regular starters – including DE JJ Watt, WR DeAndre Hopkins, G Justin Pugh – the Cards battled and late in the first half had opportunities to make it a one score game but could not take advantage of them. The victory gave the Chiefs their eight consecutive season with a week 1 win while the Cardinals fell in the regular season opener for the first time in four seasons under Kingsbury and QB Kyler Murray.

Kansas City received the opening kickoff and proceeded to move 75 yards in 11 plays as Mahomes capped the drive with a 9-yard TD pass to TE Travis Kelce. The next Chiefs drive was equally effective, covering 86 yards in 7 plays. It ended on a Mahomes shovel pass to RB Clyde Edwards-Helaire for a 3-yard score that made it 14-0 late in the opening quarter. The Cards desperately needed a scoring drive and Murray delivered. He completed 4 of 5 pass attempts on the ensuing series, the biggest of which was a 24-yarder to WR Greg Dortch that moved it to the KC35. Shortly thereafter, Kyler scampered 21 yards up the middle to the 2, setting up James Conner's TD run that cut the lead in half at 14-7 two minutes into the second quarter. The next drive saw the Chiefs move 71 yards in 10 plays before facing a 4th-n-2 at the 4; KC went for it and Edwards-Helaire's 4-yard completion from Mahomes made it 20-7 after the PAT failed. With 1:05 to go in the half, the Chiefs continued to lead by 13 and took over at their own 20. On the first play from scrimmage, Mahomes connected with WR Juju Smith-Schuster before LB Dennis Gardeck forced a fumble that CB Byron Murphy recovered at the KC43 with :58 left. AZ soon faced a 4th-n-2 at the 34 but turned it over on downs when Murray's pass attempt was incomplete. The Chiefs quickly moved into position for a 54-yard FG try from Harrison Butker, who returned to action after exiting the game via cart in the first quarter. The kick was good and Kansas City took a 23-7 lead into the halftime locker room.

Kansas City's opening possession of the second half also resulted in a TD, this one a 1-yard pass from Mahomes to TE Jody Fortson. The Chiefs increased their lead to 37-7 late in the third on Mahomes' fifth TD pass of the day, this one a 2-yarder to WR Mecole Hardman. Early in the fourth, Murray's 2-yard TD pass to new Cardinals WR – and Murray's former Oklahoma teammate – Marquise Brown was followed by a successful two-point toss to TE Zach Ertz that made it 37-15. After a TD run by Chiefs RB Isiah Pacheco capped the next KC possession, Ertz's 6-yard TD catch from Murray provided the game's final score with 5:11 remaining.

# WEEK 2 Arizona Cardinals 29, Las Vegas Raiders 23 (OT) 61,707 Allegiant Stadium Sep 18, 2022

The Cardinals made their first-ever appearance at Allegiant Field for a week 2 showdown with the Raiders and it was one for the ages. Vegas jumped out to a 20-0 halftime lead and led 23-7 after 3 quarters. But the gritty Cardinals battled back. And QB Kyler Murray engineered one of the greatest and most improbable comebacks in franchise history. Arizona would score the game's final 22 points, send the contest to overtime with a TD and 2-point conversion as regulation expired, and win it in the extra period with the longest OT return of a fumble in NFL history. It was the franchise's biggest comeback since 1999 and 5th largest ever; it was also the greatest comeback ever against the Raiders.

While the game ended in thrilling fashion for Arizona, its beginning was inauspicious. The Raiders took the opening kickoff, moved 75 yards in 15 plays and Derek Carr's 1-yard TD pass to WR Davante Adams made it 7-0. The next Vegas drive reached the AZ12 in 8 plays before Daniel Carlson's 32-yard FG made it 10-0. The Raiders increased it to 17-0 on their next possession when Carr capped a 7-play, 59-yard drive with his 3-yard scoring pass to TE Darren Waller. With just over 2 minutes to go in the first half, the Cards faced a 3rd-n-2 at the LV42 when Murray's pass attempt to Hollywood Brown was intercepted by CB Amik Robertson. The return set Vegas up at its own 27 with 1:51 to go. That was enough time to move into position for a 55-yard Carlson FG as the half expired that made it 20-0 at intermission. In their history, the Cardinals were 0-88-1 in games they trailed by 20+ points at halftime.

The AZ comeback began on its 2nd offensive series of the 3rd quarter. Murray completed 5 of 7 passes for 66 yards and ended the 79-yard drive with a scoring pass to WR Greg Dortch, a 5-yarder that was his first NFL TD catch. A 47-yard pass interference penalty on the ensuing Vegas possession led to a 25-yard Carlson FG that made it 23-7 late in the 3rd quarter. Two minutes into the 4th, the Cards trailed by 16 but were at the LV11 when they went for it on 4th-n-1. It ended there, though, as Murray's pass was just beyond the reach of TE Zach Ertz. However, 3 straight incompletions led to a punt and more importantly took just 9 seconds off the clock. An 18-yard Dortch punt return set AZ up at its own 46 with 12:07 to play. Murray marched the Cards to the LV25 where they faced a 4th-n-4 midway thru the 4th and down 16. They went for it and converted when Brown made a spectacular 1-handed grab at the 1. A play later, RB Darrel Williams punched it in and the Cards went for 2. What happened on that try was unforgettable and vintage Murray: the 0B kept the pass play alive for 20 seconds, snaking around in the backfield for almost 85 total yards before finally outracing the defense to the pylon for a successful conversion. After another Vegas punt, the Cards took over at their own 27, down 8 with 4:43 to play. Needing to cover 73 yards and another 2-point conversion to force OT, AZ soon faced a 4th-n-1 at the LV43. A Murray scramble picked it up. With :30 left it was 4th-n-4 at the 6 when a defensive holding foul kept the drive going. It set up a 1st-n-goal at the 3 but after 3 incompletions it was 4th-n-goal from there with time for one more shot. Murray again delivered, scrambling to his left and into the end zone to cap the incredible 18-play drive. AZ still needed a 2-point conversion to send the game to OT and a delay penalty pushed the try back to the 7. It didn't matter. Murray fired a dart to WR AJ Green in the back of the end zone and the game was tied.

AZ won the OT coin toss and advanced to the LV37. They went for it on 4th-n-1 from there but Brown could not hold onto a Murray pass down the left side and the Raiders took over. On the edge of FG range, they faced 2nd-n-10 at the AZ39 when Carr hit WR Hunter Renfrow with a short pass but LB Isaiah Simmons dislodged the ball with a devastating hit. CB Byron Murphy scooped the loose ball and returned it 59 yards down the sideline to clinch the amazing comeback victory.

In a match-up of 1-1 teams, the defending Super Bowl champion Rams came to State Farm Stadium and jumped out to an early 13-0 lead, thanks to a pair of field goals and a TD. The Cardinals would respond with the game's next three scores. They were lengthy drives of 19, 17 and 16 plays that produced FGs rather than TDs but it still got AZ to within 4 points late in the third quarter. However, LA's second TD of the day made it 20-9 and the Cards would only be able to close to within 8 before running out of time. QB Kyler Murray set career highs in completions (37) and attempts (58) and his favorite target was Marquise Brown. The WR racked up 140 yards on a career-best 14 receptions, a total that tied the 2nd most in franchise history.

The Rams forced a punt on the Cardinals' game opening drive and LA's Michael Hoecht got a hand on it to set the visitors up at the AZ35. Arizona's defense rose to the challenge and limited the Rams to a 22-yard Matt Gay FG that made it 3-0. Following a 3-n-out from the AZ offense, the Rams took over their own 42. Six plays later they had it at the AZ20 when WR Cooper Kupp went in motion, took a handoff from QB Matthew Stafford and raced around the left end for 20 yards and a TD that made it 10-0. Gay's 40-yard FG capped LA's next drive and put the Rams up 13-0 early in the 2nd quarter. With 11:21 left in the half, AZ took over at its own 30 and down 13-0. The Cards would move 65 yards in 19 plays, converting a pair of 4th downs on a much-needed drive. It would reach the 5 but no further and Matt Prater's 23-yard FG made it 13-3 with 1:51 before halftime. After forcing another 3-n-out by the LA offense, the Cards took over at their own 28 with :48 left in the first half. Murray moved them 47 yards, the biggest chunk of which came on a 30-yard completion to WR Greg Dortch on the last play before Prater's 45-yard FG made it 13-65 at intermission.

Arizona opened the 2nd half by forcing a 3-n-out that included a JJ Watt sack of Stafford. The Cards offense then took over at its own 11 and soon faced a 4th-n-1 at the 20; they went for it and RB James Conner converted. The drive would reach the LA31 and Prater's 3rd straight FG – this one from 49 – made it a 4-point game with 5:10 to go in the Brown LB Zaven Collins and hit Cupp for 11 and the first down. A screen to TE Typer Highee picked up 26 yards and Cam Akers' 14-yard TD run ended the drive to put LA up 20-9 with 16 minutes to play. With 11:30 remaining, the Cards had reached the LA26 where they went for it on 4th-n-4 but Murray's pass attempt to Brown was batted away. Up 11 with 7 minutes to go, the Rams advanced to AZ1 and poised to put the game away; however, S Budda Baker forced an Akers fumble that Jalen Thompson recovered to keep it a 2-possesion game. Murray would move AZ to the LA13 in 16 plays – the longest of which was 14 yards – and Prater's 31-yard FG with 1:07 pulled the Cards to within 8. They would need an onside kick recovery to keep their hopes alive but the Rams dashed them by successfully corralling the kick.

### WEEK 4 Arizona Cardinals 26, Carolina Panthers 16 69,810 Bank of America Stadium Oct 2, 2022

The Cardinals traveled to Carolina for a week 4 match-up of teams desperately trying to even their record at 2-2. Arizona had not won a regular season game there since 2002 and the Panthers had won 6 straight in the series. Through two quarters, it looked like they were on their way to making it 7 and took a 10-3 lead into halftime. But the Cards ran off 23 points in the second half as Kyler Murray threw two TDs and ran for another. The AZ defense, meanwhile, was exceptional throughout; it created three takeaways and generally harassed Panthers QB Baker Mayfield all afternoon while limiting RB Christian McCaffrey to 27 rushing yards on 8 attempts. Leading that effort was DE Zach Allen who had a career-day; he finished with 6 tackles, a sack, three knockdowns, two QB hits and a tackle for loss. All of it added up to a 26-16 win that continued Arizona's success on the road with 10 wins in its last 11 opportunities.

On their first possession of the game, the Panthers were stopped on a 3rd-n-1 Mayfield QB sneak and went for it on 4th-n-inches from their own 39; led by LB Zaven Collins, the Cards D stopped McCaffrey and the offense took over. The Cards reached the Carolina 10 where they faced a 4th-n-1 themselves but WR Rondale Moore was tackled behind the line of scrimmage and the threat was extinguished. The game remained scoreless into the 2nd quarter before the Panthers defense created its first points. On 3rd-n-6 from the AZ31, LB Frankie Luvi intercepted a Murray pass intended for Hollywood Brown and returned it 33 yards for a TD. The next series saw the Cards go for it again on 4th-n-1 - this time from their own 42 – but turned it over on downs when the snap went over Murray's head. That gave it back to the Panthers at the AZ42 with 9:02 to go before halftime but they would soon return it. A fumbled exchange between Mayfield and WR Rashard Higgins was recovered by Aziona LB Ben Niemann at the AZ35. The Cards offense then went 50 yards in 8 plays and pull to within 7-3 on Matt Prater's 33-yard FG with 3:34 left in the 2nd quarter. S Jalen Thompson's INT gave the offense the ball back at the AZ18 with 1:05 to go in the half. After a 3-n-out, Carolina took over at its own 35 with :21 left and advanced to the AZ36 on 4 completions before Eddy Pineiro's 54-yard FG as the half expired made it 10-3.

Carolina got the ball to start the 2nd half but on its 3rd play from scrimmage, Allen's 9-yard sack of Mayfield forced a punt. The Cards would then tie the game with a 9-play, 89-yard TD drive. Key plays were a 22-yard reception by TE Zach Ertz and a 37-yard defensive pass interference penalty drawn by WR Marquise Brown. Ertz ended it with a TD pass from Murray on 3rd-n-goal from the 2. After again forcing a Panther punt, the Cards embarked on another long drive, this one consuming 9:26 and extending into the 4th quarter. Matt Prater capped it with his 39-yard FG that gave AZ its first lead at 13-10. On the next play from scrimmage, DE J.J. Watt deflected a Mayfield pass into the air where LB Dennis Gardeck caught it and returned his first career INT 24 yards to the Carolina 5. A play later, Murray ran it in around the right side for a 4-yard TD that made it 20-10 with 10:26 left in the game. Carolina's ensuing series ended when Allen knocked down another Mayfield pass, this time on 4th-n-1 at the CAR 31. Two plays later on 3rd-n-3 from the 23, Murray hit Brown with an over-the-shoulder throw and the WR artfully tapped his toes just inside the end zone. The connection put AZ up 26-10 with 7:37 to play and the game's only other score came on a Mayfield-to-McCaffrey TD pass of 13 yards.

### WEEK 5 Philadelphia Eagles 20, Arizona Cardinals 17 63,919 State Farm Stadium Oct 9, 2022

In week 5, the NFL's only remaining undefeated team came to State Farm Stadium when the 2-2 Cardinals hosted the 4-0 Philadelphia Eagles. The visitors took an early 14-0 but the Cards battled back to tie it at 17 in the 4th. After Philly went up 3 on a go-ahead FG with 1:45 to play, Arizona had a chance to send the game into OT but a 43-yard FG try in the closing seconds was wide right. The Cardinals defense was exceptional holding Philadelphia to a season-low 20 points and just 6 in the second half. Marquise Brown led the Cards with 78 receiving yards on 8 catches with a TD.

The Eagles drew first blood with a TD on their opening offensive possession. Completions of 14 & 10 yards to TE Dallas Goedert were followed by two to WR AJ Brown (15 & 11) that kept the 11-play, 64-yard drive going. QB Jalen Hurts capped it with his 1-yard QB keeper and Philly led 7-0. On the next play from scrimmage, Kyler Murray's pass down the deep middle intended for Brown was intercepted by S CJ Gardner-Johnson, setting the Eagles up at their own 35. However, they would not capitalize as Arizona's defense sent them 3-n-out. Late in the opening quarter, Philly faced a 3rd-n-12 at its own 11 but Hurts found DeVonta Smith for 22 to the 33. A 20-yard connection between those 2 followed and the 16-play, 87-yard drive ultimately concluded with another 1-yard TD sneak. AZ seemed to seize some momentum on the opening play of the next Philly drive when S Jalen Thompson picked a Hurts pass across the middle but replay overturned it. The Cards still sent the Eagles 3-n-out and following the punt took over at their own 43 for their best field position of the day. A 13-yard James Conner run moved it to the 44 and was followed by a 14-yard Brown catch to the PHI32. On 3rd-n-2 from the 25, Murray found Brown in the middle of the field and the speedy WR slipped a tackle before racing into the end zone. AZ forced another Eagles punt and took over at its own 7 with 3:22 to go in the half. Stopped on 3rd down at their own 28, the Cards lined up to punt but ran a fake instead; the snap went to the up-back, RB Darrell Williams, who ran for 7 and picked up the first down. The very lengthy drive (16 plays, 91 yards) took 9:38 off the clock and Matt Amendola's 20-yard FG as the half expired trimmed Philly's lead to 14-10. Amendola was signed during the week as a replacement for the team's regular kicker, Matt Prater (hip).

Philly increased its lead to 17-10 on the opening drive of the 3rd quarter when Cameron Dicker's 42-yard FG capped a 10-play, 51-yard drive. After the teams traded punts, AZ took over at its own 10 in the final minute of the 3rd quarter. Injuries to starting RB James Conner as well as back-ups Darrell Williams and Jonathan Ward, left Eno Benjamin as the Cardinals only available RB. Thanks largely to Murray completing all 6 of his pass attempts on the drive (for 58 yards), AZ reached the PHI11 in 11 plays; from there Benjamin ran it in to tie the game with 9:43 to go in the game. Hurts then led the Eagles into AZ territory and with 4:28 left, they faced 3rd-n-12 at the Cards 36; they picked it up thanks to a 16-yard Hurts-to-Goedert completion. The drive would reach the AZ5 and Dicker's 23-yard FG put Philly up 20-17. After the kickoff, the Cards took over at their own 25 with 1:45 to go and no timeouts. A 15-yard Murray run and 4 completions covered 31 yards, taking the Cards to the PHI34 with :36 left. A Murray burst up the middle appeared to gain 10+ yards on 2nd-n-10 and the Cards stopped the clock with a spike with :22 left. However, officials spotted it as just a 9-yard gain and after the spike it was 4th-n-1 at the 25. AZ sent out the FG unit to tie it but Amendola's 43-yard attempt sailed right.

On a warm, sunny week 6 afternoon in Seattle, the Cardinals faced the Seahawks in a match-up of 2-3 teams that were playing for a share of the division lead. Each team would produce just one touchdown but Seattle complemented theirs with 4 Jason Meyers FGs while the Cardinals turned it over on downs 3 times when going for it on 4th-n-short situations inside the SEA 30. After losing 3 RBs to injury the week before, the Cardinals offense started the game without C Rodney Hudson and soon lost G Justin Pugh to injury. Arizona's defense was again exceptional, limiting Seattle to 19 points and just one touchdown. But that one TD and the 4 FGs were enough for Seattle to secure a 19-9 win on this day to secure the win.

Arizona opened the game by taking the opening kickoff and marching deep into Seattle territory thanks to a pair of big gains on 3rd down. The first came when Kyler Murray converted a 3rd-n-4 from the AZ25 with his 42-yard run to the SEA33. Then on 3rd-6 from the SEA26, a 23-yard catch-and-run by WR Rondale Moore took it to the 3. That set-up Matt Amendola's 23-yard FG that gave Arizona a 3-0 lead and its first opening quarter points of the season. Seattle responded with a FG drive of its own and Jason Myers' 39-yard kick tied the game with 6:41 left in the first quarter; 47 of the drive's 54 yards came on consecutive Kenneth Walker runs of 17 and 34 yards. On the first play of the 2nd quarter, the Cards went for it on 4th-n-4 from the SEA20 but tumed it over on downs when Murray's pass was incomplete. Midway thru the 2nd quarter, Seattle marched to the AZ7 and faced a 3rd-n-2. Dr Rashard Lawrence tackled Walker in the backfield for a 2-yard FG put the Seahawks up 6-3. With 0:55 left in the first half, Seattle took over at its own 32 with one timeout. A 22-yard Marquise Goodwin reception on the drive's first play was followed by Smith's 24-yard scramble to the AZ22 . The Seahawks would reach the 15 but no further and Myers' 3rd FG of the game – this one a 34-yarder – made it 9-3 at intermission.

After forcing a Seattle 3-n-out to open the 3rd quarter, Arizona again advanced deep into Seahawks territory. The biggest plays were a 14-yard Moore reception and a 15-yard Murray run. The Cards faced 4th-n-2 at the 27 and again went for it but under pressure, Murray was forced into an incompletion. Seattle took over from there and received the benefit of a roughing the passer call as well as a defensive holding flag that wiped out a 3rd down stop. Myers' 4th FG of the day (32 yards) would end the drive and put the Seahawks up 12-3 with 4:11 left in the 3rd quarter. On the first play of the next drive, Murray hit Zach Ertz for a 21-yard gain to the SEA43. On 3rd-n-6 from the SEA39, Murray scrambled for the first down but fumbled at the end of the run and Seattle recovered at its own 19. AZ's defense sent the Seahawks 3-n-out, including a sack by rookie LB Myjai Sanders that backed it up to the 10 and forced a Seattle punt from its own end zone. On a frenetic play, LB Ezekiel Turner hit punter Michael Dickson forcing a fumble that S Chris Banjo recovered for a TD. After the PAT kick failed, the Cards trailed 12-9 in the final minute of the 3rd quarter. The Seahawks responded by moving 75 yards in 7 plays and 4th-n-short; this time it was 4th-n-2 at the 23 and SEA ended the threat with a sack. The AZ defense would force 3-n-outs on the next two Seattle possessions but the offense could not take advantage and the game ended in a 19-9 Seahawks win.

In a Thursday night match-up vs. New Orleans, the Cardinals improved to 3-4 on the season with a 42-34 victory. They trailed 14-6 with 2:30 to play in the 2nd quarter but exploded for 22 points before halftime in a frenetic, game-changing sequence. Two of the three scores came 62 seconds apart on INT return TDs off Andy Dalton, first by CB Marco Wilson and then by LB Isaiah Simmons. Overall the Cards enjoyed a 3-0 advantage in turnovers. The team was also bolstered tremendously by the return of WR DeAndre Hopkins who had 10 receptions for 103 yards in his first action after missing the first 6 games due to suspension. RB Eno Benjamin had the best game of his career, rushing 12 times for 92 yards with a TD as well as a 2-point conversion. QB Kyler Murray was 20-10 passing for 204 yards and ran for 30 yards on 7 carries while playing turnover-free football.

The high-scoring game's point production began early. On the 4th play from scrimmage, Dalton connected down the deep middle with WR Rashid Shaheed for a 53-yard TD. On the ensuing AZ drive, a 31-yard completion to WR Rondale Moore moved it to the N037. That set-up a 50-yard FG by Rodrigo Blankenship in his first attempt while filling in for the injured Matt Prater. Leading 7-3, the Saints advanced to the AZ10 on their next drive but on 3rd-n-8 from there, Dalton's pass was picked off in the end zone by CB Antonio Hamilton. A 17-yard Murray run was followed by a 45-yarder from Benjamin, setting up Blankenship's 28-yard FG that made it 7-6 early in the 2nd quarter. The Saints reponded with a drive that ended on a 3-yard Dalton TD pass to Taysom Hill; it was set-up by a 64-yard catch-n-run from WR Kevin White. Thanks to 6-for-6 passing by Murray, the Cards would move deep into Saints territory on their next drive and went for it on 4th-n-1 at the 4. Murray ran for 2 to the 2 and a play later, rookie RB Keontay Ingram punched it in; that score and Benjamin's run on the 2-point try tied the game at 14 with 2:28 left in the half. On the 2nd play of the ensuing series, Dalton's pass across the middle deflected off the hands WR Marquez Callaway and into the arms of Wilson who raced 38 yards before a leaping dive into the end zone. Now trailing 20-14, the Saints faced a 3rd-n-10 at their own 47. Dalton was pressured by rookie LB Cameron Thomas and his pass down the middle of the field was snared with one hand by Simmons. He returned it 56 yards down the right sideline to complete the pick 6 and the Cards and 28-16 at intermission.

The Saints cut the lead to 28-17 with Will Lutz's FG (25) on their opening possession of the 2nd half. Later in the quarter, the Cards moved 85 yards in 12 plays and took 6:31 off the clock; Murray was 7-8 for 85 yards on the drive and ended it with his 5-yard TD pass to WR Greg Dortch. After Juwan Johnson's 17-yard TD catch from Dalton made it 35-24 with 11:14 to go, the Cards produced another TD drive. The key play was a 15-yard run from Benjamin on 3rd-n-8 from the NO20 and set-up his own 5-yard TD run that made it 42-24 with 6:22 remaining. The Saints would add a late TD and FG but AZ recovered two onside attempts to seal the win.

The 3-4 Cardinals traveled to the Twin Cities to face a 5-1 Vikings team that had won 4 straight and sat comfortably atop the NFC North. Despite at least five key players missing the game with injuries and spotting the hosts an early lead, Arizona came back to take the lead in the second half. However, three turnovers proved costly and the Vikings would emerge with a 34-26 win. WR DeAndre Hopkins was again outstanding, with 12 catches for 159 yards and a remarkable 1-handed TD catch. QB Kyler Murray threw for 326 yards and 3 TDs while WR Rondale Moore gained 92 yards on his 7 receptions that included a 38-yard TD catch. Minnesota was led by RB Dalvin Cook's 111 rushing yards and QB Kirk Cousins threw for a pair of TDs and ran for one.

The Vikings opened the scoring on the game's first drive, marching to the AZ17. On 3rd-n-4 from here, Cousins eluded the rush and scrambled 17 yards for a TD that put the Vikings up 7-0. The Cards quickly made it 7-3 on the next series when Matt Prater's 44-yard FG capped an 8-play, 49-yard drive. The ensuing possession saw Minnesota advance to the AZ38 where they faced a 4rd-n-2; the Vikes went for it but turned it over on downs with an incompletion. They did, however, go up 14-3 the next time they got the ball on an 83-yard drive that Cousins ended with his 1-yard TD pass to TE Johnny Mundt. Down 11 with 3:39 to go in the half, the Cards took over at their own 28 and in 9 plays moved to the MINo. On 3rd-n-2 from there, Murray fired to Hopkins in the end zone and the all-pro WR snared it with just his left hand to make it 14-10 with :47 left in the half. Minnesota would advance to the AZ38 where Greg Joseph attempted a 56-yard FG as time expired but it was blocked by Cards DT Leki Fotu.

On its second series of the 3rd quarter, AZ's offense took over at its own 48 following a Vikings 3-n-out. A 33-yard Hopkins completion from Murray moved it to the 8 and from there a Zach Ertz TD catch-n-run would put the Cards up 17-14 with 9:01 left in the third quarter. The Vikings responded with an 8-play, 75-yard TD drive and went ahead 21-17 following Alexander Mattison's 7-yard scoring run. On 3rd-n-2 from the AZ5, Cousins hit WR KJ Osborn with a TD pass that made it 34-26 with 8:36 left after the PAT kick failed. Down 8, the Cards would possess the ball three more times. On the first, they reached the MIN44 but Murray's pass attempt to Ertz was INT'd by S Camryn Bynum. The next also reached the MIN44 before turning it over on downs. And the final one reached the MIN37 in the final minute but a pair of sacks ended the comeback hopes.

The NFC West-leading Seahawks (5-3) came to Arizona for a showdown with the Cardinals (3-5), who were playing the first of 3 straight division games. It was a back-and-forth contest but after surrendering a pick-6 that put AZ up by 4 in the 3rd quarter, the Seahawks scored TDs on each of their final 3 possessions. That finish allowed them to leave town with a 31-21 victory, their 4th straight victory on the season

Seattle got on the board on the game's first series when Jason Myers' 49-yard FG capped an 8-play, 34-yard drive. The Cardinals answered with their first 1st quarter TD of the season; Kyler Murray ran for 21 on 3rd-n-5 and completed 4 of 4 passes, the last of which was a 22-yard TD completion to WR DeAndre Hopkins down the right sideline. The teams exchanged 3-n-outs before Seattle re-claimed the lead at 17-play, 79-yard possession. The next time the Seahawks got the ball, they advanced to the AZ36 where they went for it on 4th-n-2; there DT Zach Allen sniffed out a Seattle shovel pass and snuffed out the play for a 4-yard loss. Down 3 late in the half, the Cards were threatening at the SEA40 and they went for it on 4th-n-4. Murray scrambled up the middle for 9 but the Seahawks forced the ball out at the end of the run and they recovered at the SEA23. The takeaway allowed Seattle to head to the halftime locker room with a 10-7 lead.

On their 2nd drive of the 3rd quarter, Seattle took over at its own 40. On the first play of that drive, Smith tried to loop a pass into the flat over AZ's Zaven Collins. However, the 2nd year LB stabbed it from the air and returned his first NFL interception 30 yards for a score that put the Cards up 14-10 with 9:18 left in the 3rd. Seattle responded with a 13-play, 75-yard drive and went back ahead when Smith's 3rd-n-6 pass from the 9 found WR Tyler Lockett in the end zone. After forcing an AZ punt, the Seahawks produced another 13-play drive, this one covering 81 yards and ending on Kenneth Walker's 1-yard TD run that made it 24-14 midway through the 4th. The Cards needed a scoring drive and they got it, moving 75 yards in 14 plays. Murray's 6-yard TD pass to TE Zach Ertz made it a 3-point game with 3:32 left. After the kickoff, Seattle took over at its own 15 up 3 with 3:30 to play and AZ holding 3 timeouts. On the first play, though, Smith rolled to his right and found TE Noah Fant with a short pass that he took 51 yards to the AZ31. Four plays later, Walker's 5-yard touchdown run made it 31-21 and effectively put the game out of reach.
