## OLDEST & YOUNGEST TO 100

In 2017 - playing at the age of 34 - **Fitzgerald** tied his career high with 109 receptions. Became the oldest player in NFL history with 100+ receptions in a season.

In 2005 - at the age of 22 - became the youngest player (at the time) in the NFL history to 100+ receptions.

His first and last 100-catch campaigns spanned 13 seasons.

**150** Fitzgerald had 3 games with 150+ yards in the postseason, the most such outings in NFL history.

During the Cards run to Super Bowl XLIII set NFL records for most receiving yards (546) and TD receptions (7) in a single postseason that still stand.

#### HOW THEY GOT WHERE THEY ARE

Of the players who rank in the top-5 in receptions all-time, **Fitzgerald** is the only one who never had 400+ receptions from any single QB.

Of Rice's 1,549 career receptions, 972 (62.8%) came from HOF QBs Joe Montana and Steve Young.

Of Fitzgerald's 1,432 receptions, 345 (24.1%) came from HOF QB Kurt Warner.

Only player in NFL history to average 100+ receiving yards and a TD in every postseason game played (min. 5 games)

### #2 ALL-TIME IN RECEIVING YARDS

Fitzgerald's 17,492 career receiving yards rank second on the NFL's all-time receiving yardage list behind Jerry Rice (22,895). No other player in NFL history is within 1,500 yards of Fitzgerald or Rice on the all-time receiving yardage list.

## A CAREER IN NUMBERS

**8** Seasons with 90+ receptions, the most in NFL history.

**17** Consecutive seasons with 50+ receptions, the longest streak in NFL history. Fitzgerald (17) and Jerry Rice (17) are the only players in NFL history with 17 or more.

**942** Career receiving yards in the postseason, the most in NFL history a player's first 9 career postseason games.

**846** Receptions separating Fitzgerald (1,432) and the player who ranks 2nd in Cardinals history (Anquan Boldin - 586). That difference is greater than the career reception total of 27 of the 35 WRs currently in the Hall of Fame.

**263** Career games played, more than any other WR in NFL history with a single team.

**262** Games with at least one reception. Ended his career with a reception in 256 consecutive games, the second longest streak in NFL history.

**176** Receiving yards in the Cardinals 2015 Divisional round OT win vs. Green Bay. Accounted for all 80 yards on AZ's game-winning TD drive, including a 75-yard catch that led to his 5-yard TD reception two plays later.

**7** Pro Bowls in the 7 seasons in which Kurt Warner and Carson Palmer started at least 10 games for AZ. In those seven seasons, Fitzgerald averaged 99 receptions, 1,219 receiving yards and 10 TDs.

**669** Career receptions at State Farm Stadium, the most by any player in NFL history at one venue.

**4** Games in which he posted 100+ receiving yards during AZ's run to Super Bowl XLIII. Remains the only player in NFL history with 4+ games of 100+ yards in a single postseason.

**42** Different venues in which he had at least one reception (every stadium he appeared in). In NFL history, only Jerry Rice (46) caught a pass in more stadiums.

## MOST SURE-HANDED OF ALL TIME

### 35 DROPS

### FEWEST ALL-TIME (MIN. 1,500 TARGETS)

Fitzgerald recorded more tackles (41) than drops (35) in his career.

Over the course of his career, he dropped just 1.5% of the passes thrown his direction (35 drops on 2,334 targets).

## ALL IN ARIZONA

Fitzgerald had more catches with the Cardinals (1,432) than any other player in NFL history had with a single team.

## A LEGEND IN THE POSTSEASON

In 9 postseason games, Fitzgerald totaled 57 receptions for 942 yards and 10 TDs. Fitzgerald:

- Is the only player in NFL history to average at least 100+ receiving yards and a TD in every postseason game played (min. 5 games).
- Had 5 games with 100+ receiving yards, including an NFL-record 3 outings with 150+ yards.
- One of just eight players in NFL history with 10+ TD receptions in the postseason.
- Only player in NFL history with 4+ 100-yard receiving performances in a single postseason (2008).
- Caught multiple TD passes in 3 of 9 postseason games.

## YOUNGEST AND OLDEST TO 100 RECEPCIONS

In 2005 Fitzgerald tied Steve Smith for the NFL lead with 103 receptions. At the time he was the youngest player in NFL history (22 years, 123 days) to reach 100+ receptions in a season.

In 2016 Fitzgerald again led the NFL with 107 catches, **becoming the first player in NFL history to lead the NFL in receptions 11+ years apart.**

In 2017 - playing at the age of 34 - Fitzgerald tied his career high with 109 receptions, **becoming the oldest player in NFL history to record 100+ receptions in a season.**

Fitzgerald had five seasons with 100+ receptions, with the first (2005) and last (2017) covering a span of 13 seasons.

Fitzgerald is one of just five players in NFL history with at least five seasons of 100+ receptions.

## A CAREER FULL OF NFL MILESTONES

Having played his first regular season NFL game just 12 days after his 21<sup>st</sup> birthday, **Fitzgerald** set numerous NFL records as the youngest player in league history to reach various receiving milestones.

Playing until the age of 37, Fitzgerald also set numerous NFL records as the oldest player in league history to achieve various milestones.

**Below is a look at some of the distinctions Fitzgerald held during his record-breaking career:**

- **At 35 years, 114 days old, he became the oldest WR in NFL history to throw a TD pass.**
- **At 34 years old, became the oldest player in NFL history with 100+ receptions in a season (109 in 2017).**
- **Had more receptions in his first 200 career games (1,116) than any player in NFL history.**
- **At 32 years, 97 days old, he became the youngest player in NFL history to reach 1,000 career receptions.**
- **At 31 years, 102 days old, he became the youngest player in NFL history to reach 900 career receptions.**
- **At 30 years, 85 days old, he became the youngest player in NFL history to reach 11,000 receiving yards.**
- **At 30 years, 57 days old, he became the youngest player in NFL history to reach 800 career receptions.**
- **At 29 years, 44 days old, joined Randy Moss (28 years, 314 days) as the only players in NFL history to reach 10,000 career receiving yards before age 30.**
- **At 29 years, 23 days old, became the youngest player in NFL history to reach 700 career receptions.**
- **At 27 years, 110 days old, became the youngest player in NFL history to reach 600 career receptions.**
- **At 26 years, 111 days old, became the youngest player in NFL history to reach 7,000 career receiving yards.**
- **At 22 years, 123 days old, he became the youngest player in NFL history to reach 100+ receptions in a season.**



## AN 11-TIME PRO BOWLER

Fitzgerald was named to the Pro Bowl 11 times in his career. **Among WRs in NFL history only Jerry Rice (13) had more Pro Bowl selections.**

## 256 STRAIGHT WITH A CATCH

Fitzgerald ended his career with at least one reception in 256 consecutive games, **the second-longest streak in NFL history: Jerry Rice (274 straight).**

**His streak of 256 consecutive games with a catch is the longest in NFL history with a single team, and he had at least one catch in 262 of 263 career games played.**

## MAN OF THE YEAR

One of the NFL's most popular athletes during his career, Fitzgerald's playing excellence was matched by his conduct off the field. Below is a look at just a few of the prestigious awards Fitzgerald accumulated during his NFL career.

### Walter Payton NFL Man of the Year

Fitzgerald joined Giants QB Eli Manning as co-winners of the 2016 Walter Payton NFL Man of the Year award, the only league award that recognizes a player's off-the-field community service as well as his playing excellence. Fitzgerald was also one of three finalists for the award – one of the NFL's most prestigious – in 2012.

### Art Rooney Sportsmanship Award

In the lead up to Super Bowl XLIX following the 2014 season, Fitzgerald was named the inaugural winner of the Art Rooney NFL Sportsmanship Award.


Fitzgerald was selected in a vote of his fellow NFL players. The Art Rooney Trophy represents the important role that sportsmanship plays in the game and how NFL players that demonstrate integrity and honor on the field serve as role models for other players at all levels. The award was named in honor of the late founding owner of the Pittsburgh Steelers and Pro Football Hall of Famer Art Rooney, Sr.

### Georgetown Lombardi Award

Fitzgerald was the 2013 recipient of the NFL Players Association Georgetown Lombardi Award, which was established to honor a leader in the sports industry whose life and family have been touched by cancer, and who encourages cancer research, prevention and treatment through awareness and philanthropy.

### Arthur S. Arkush Humanitarian Award

In 2012, Fitzgerald was named the recipient of the 14th Annual Arthur S. Arkush Humanitarian Award by Pro Football Weekly, which is given to the NFL player whose contributions to the community and charitable organizations are especially outstanding.



## THRILLING THE HOME FANS

Fitzgerald provided Cardinals fans with countless memories in the 121 games (regular and postseason) he played at State Farm Stadium.

In 117 regular season games at State Farm Stadium, Fitzgerald totaled 669 receptions, the most in NFL history for a player in a single venue, surpassing the 646 catches Jerry Rice had at Candlestick Park in San Francisco.
