Combined special teams tackles for undrafted rookie LBs Zeke Turner (9) and Dennis Gardeck (4) this season. Turner's nine special teams tackles lead the NFL.

Takeaways for the Cardinals defense (2 INT, 3 FR) in Arizona's 28-18 victory at San Francisco in Week 5. The Cardinals scored 21 of their 28 points off those takeaways, including a fumble recovery by LB Josh Bynes that he returned 23 yards for a TD.

Receiving yards needed by WR Larry Fitzgerald to pass Hall of Fame WR Terrell Owens (15,934) for second place on the NFL's all-time receiving yardage list. Fitzgerald is also 22 receptions shy of passing HOFer Jerry Rice (1,281 with San Francisco) for most receptions in NFL history with a single team.

- The Cardinals would run their winning streak against the 49ers to eight games. That would tie the second-longest winning streak against any single opponent in Cardinals history behind only their nine straight wins vs. the Eagles between 1974-78.
- Combined with their victory over San Francisco in Week 5, a win this week would give the Cardinals their fourth consecutive season sweep of the 49ers.

MILESTONES WITHIN REACH...

WR LARRY FITZGERALD

- With a catch, Fitzgerald would have at least one reception in 218 consecutive games, the second-longest streak in NFL history behind only Jerry Rice (274). He would have at least one catch in all 30 career games against San Francisco.
- With a TD reception, Fitzgerald would have 112 TD catches in his career. He would sit alone in seventh place on the NFL's all-time list for career receiving TDs.
- With a TD reception, Fitzgerald would have 18 career TD catches against the 49ers. He would have more TDs receptions against both the 49ers (18) and Rams (18) than any other active player has against a single opponent.
- With five catches, Fitzgerald would become the first player in NFL history with 170+ receptions against multiple opponents. Fitzgerald has 179 career receptions vs. the Rams.
- With 100 receiving yards, Fitzgerald would have 11 career 100-yard games against the 49ers. That would tie Jerry Rice (11 vs. the Falcons) for the most in NUL bit against the second se NFL history against a single opponent.

RB DAVID JOHNSON

- With a TD (of any kind), Johnson would reach 40 career TDs in 12 fewer games (41) than any other player in franchise history. The current record is 53 games by John David Crow.
- With a TD (of any kind), Johnson would have eight TDs in six career games against the 49ers. He would have twice as many TDs against San Francisco (8) than he does against any other opponent.
- With two TDs (of any kind), Johnson would have multiple TDs in each of his last four games against San Francisco.

DE CHANDLER JONES

- With a sack, Jones would have at least one sack in six consecutive games. That would represent the second-longest streak in franchise history (7, Curtis Greer, 1984-85) and the longest streak in team history in a single season.
- With a sack, Jones would have 35.5 sacks in 40 career games with Arizona. He would have at least one sack in 29 of 40 games with the Cardinals.
- With a sack, Jones would have five sacks in his last five games against San Francisco.

CB PATRICK PETERSON

With an INT, Peterson would have 24 INTs in his career. Only six players in team history would have more. It would give Peterson three INTs this season, and two in the last two games.

WR CHRISTIAN KIRK

With six receptions, Kirk would have 34 receptions in 2018. That would represent the second-highest total in franchise history by a rookie in their first eight career games (48, Anguan Boldin, 2003).

DEFENSE WITH MULTIPLE SACKS

With two sacks, the Cardinals would have mutliple sacks in each of the first eight games of a season for the first time in franchise history.

JONES APPROACHES 40

DE **Chandler Jones** will play his 40th game with the Cardinals on Sunday. As he approaches #40, below are a few of the Arizona highlights for the All-Pro.

Jones has 34.5 sacks in 39 games with Arizona. He already has six more sacks than any other player in Cardinals history had in their first 40 games with the team.

Jones enters Sunday's matchup with at least one sack in each of the last five games. Dating back to the beginning of the 2016 season, an NFL defender has posted a streak of at least five games with a sack 19 separate times. By himself, Jones accounts for 16% of those streaks (3). The only other players with more than one such streak during that span are Khalil Mack (2) and Joey Bosa (2).

After leading the NFL with 17.0 sacks in 2017, Jones is having one of his best all around seasons in 2018. Through the first seven games he has 27 tackles, 6.5 sacks, seven tackles for loss, five passes defensed, three forced fumbles, a fumble recovery, 12 QB pressures and 10 QB hits. According to ESPN Stats & Information Jones leads all NFL defenders distrupted QB dropbacks (10.5) and distrupted dropback percentage (4.0).

His 6.5 sacks rank third in the NFC and are tied for fifth in the NFL in '18.
