# RDINALS

- Games the Cardinals have played at MetLife Stadium since it opened in 2010 (2012 @ Jets; 2014 and 2019 @ Giants). Arizona will play at MetLife twice in the span of nine games beginning with Sunday's matchup against the Jets (face Giants in Week 14).
- Quarterbacks that lead their team in rushing this season: Arizona's Kyler Murray (265 yards) and Baltimore's Lamar Jackson (235 yards).
- Receiving yards for WR DeAndre Hopkins in two career games against the Jets. In his last visit to MetLife Stadium (12/15/18 with Houston), Hopkins posted 10 receptions for 170 yards and two TDs against the Jets, including a go-ahead 14-yard TD catch with just over 2:00 remaining in the fourth quarter.
- Tackles for S Budda Baker dating back to last season. Despite missing the Cardinals game at Carolina last week, his 175 tackles easily lead all NFL defensive backs dating back to the beginning of 2019. Buffalo S Jordan Poyer ranks second with 141.

# WITH A WIN.

- Arizona would earn its second-ever road win against the Jets and the first since
- The Cardinals would improve to 3-1 all-time at MetLife Stadium.
- Arizona would improve to 3-3 playing East Coast games with a 10:00 AM kickoff (AZ time) under head coach **Kliff Kingsbury**.

# MILESTONES WITHIN REACH...

#### WR LARRY FITZGERALD

- With a reception, Fitzgerald would have at least one catch in 248 consecutive games, extending the second-longest streak in NFL history (Jerry Rice - 274).
- With a TD catch, it would leave the Ravens and Steelers as the only teams Fitzgerald does not have a regular season TD reception against. MetLife Stadium would become the 28<sup>th</sup> different NFL venue in which Fitzgerald has at least one TD reception. In NFL history, only Jerry Rice (33) and Randy Moss (32) would have a TD catch in more different venues.

#### LB CHANDLER JONES

- With a sack, Jones would have 7.0 sacks in eight career games against the Jets. It would also give him 8.0 sacks in six career games at MetLife Stadium, including 5.0 sacks in the last two games.
- With a sack, Jets QB Joe Flacco would become the 44th different QB Jones has sacked in his career.

#### WR DEANDRE HOPKINS

- With a reception, Hopkins would extend his streak to 115 consecutive games with at least one catch. He would have at least one reception in every game played in his NFL career.
- With one receiving yard, Hopkins would reach 9,000 receiving yards for his career. Only three players in NFL history (Randy Moss, Calvin Johnson and Larry Fitzgerald) would have reached 9,000 receiving yards at a younger age than Hopkins (28 years, 127 days on Sunday).
- With five receptions, Hopkins would have 5+ catches in 23 consecutive games, the second-longest streak in NFL history behind Antonio Brown (36 straight).
- With nine catches, Hopkins (48) would establish an NFL record for receptions through the first five games of a season. He would surpass the current mark of 47 (Min WR Adam Thielen-2018; Cin WR T.J. Houshmandzadeh-2007).
- With 100+ receiving yards, Hopkins would have 100+ yards in all three career games played against the Jets and also in all three career games played at MetLife Stadium.

### <u>QB KYLER MURRAY</u>

- With two TD passes, Murray would have multiple TD passes in three consecutive games for the second time in his career (Games 9-11 in 2019).
- With three TD passes, Murray would join Kurt Warner (4 straight in 2007) and Carson Palmer (separate streaks of 3 and 2 games in 2015) as the only Cardinals QBs in the last 30 years with at least three TD passes in back-to-back games.
- With three passes, Murray would have 10 TD passes in 2020. Only two players in franchise history would have more TD passes through the first five games of a season: Charley Johnson (13 in 1965) and Carson Palmer (13 in 2015)
- With a rushing TD, Murray (5) would surpass the number of rushing TDs he had in 16 games last season.
- With both a rushing and passing TD, Murray (4) would join Jim Hart (5 in 1968) as the only players in franchise history to post at least four games with both a passing and rushing TD in a single season.

#### <u>RB CHASE EDMONDS</u>

With a TD (of any kind), Edmonds would have 10 total TDs in 34 career games. Of those 10, four would have come in two games played at MetLife Stadium.

#### **WEEK 5 NOTABLES - AZVSNYJ**

On Sunday, WR DeAndre Hopkins will play his third career game against the Jets. In the previous two, he had a com-inbed 288 yards and four TDs on 15 receptions, averaging 19.2 yards per catch.

Sunday's game will be Hopkins third career outing at MetLife Stadium - and second against the Jets. He had 16 receptions for 286 yards and two TDs in his first two games at the venue.



EDMONDS SHINES NEAR OLD STOMPING GROUNDS

RB Chase Edmonds had a record-setting career at Fordham, whose home games are played at Jack Coffey Field in the Bronx, just 18 miles from MetLife Stadium. In his first and only return to the area as a pro - Week 7 of last season against the Giants - he posted career-highs in scrimmage yards (150), rushing yards (126) and TDs (3). His three rushing TDs covered 20, 20 and 22 yards, becoming just the sixth player in NFL history with three rushing TDs of 20+ yards in a game.
